CM Fadnavis thanks PM Modi on behalf of Mumbaikars for Rana's extradition

Mumbai, April 11 (UNI) : Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis extended thanks to Prime Minister Narendra Modi on behalf of Mumbaikars for the extradition of Tahawwur Rana, key 26/11 terror attacks plotter. Rana was brought to India from the US on Thursday. The Chief Minister said: "I am very happy that Tahawwur Rana, one of the accused and conspirators of the 26/11 Mumbai attacks, has been brought to India. For this, I thank the Prime Minister on behalf of Mumbaikars."

"Kasab was hanged as per the law. But the conspirator was not in our custody. He is now with the NIA and they are investigating the case. If we need any information, we will take it from the NIA and if they need any help, we will provide it through the Mumbai Police," said Fadnavis.

Meanwhile, Deputy Chief Ministers Ajit Pawar said Rana's arrest will be crucial in finding out the "real" mastermind behind the 2008 Mumbai terror attacks.

Railways to introduce 238 new AC trains in Mumbai

Mumbai, April 11 : Railway Minister Ashwini Kumar Vaishnaw on Friday announced that the Railways would introduce 238 new Air-Conditioned suburban trains, designed specifically to cater to the needs of Mumbai's bustling population.

The Railway Minister made the announcement at a press conference in Mumbai on Friday, alongside Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis.

The new Air-Conditioned suburban

trains are expected to revolutionise daily travel for millions of Mumbai's commuters.

Designed with passenger comfort in mind, these trains promise a more reliable and enjoyable travel experience. The Minister emphasised that the upgrades will go a long way in addressing the challenges of overcrowding and discomfort that many face on the city's suburban trains. The Railway Minister also approved a smart card - 'Mumbai One' smart card, which can be used to avail

all public transport in the city. Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis said that the backend work and digital architecture of the card would be done within a month. "Once we have the system architecture in place, we will roll out the Mumbai One card for all Mumbaikars. It will indeed be a game-changer for urban mobility," he said.

Chief Minister Fadnavis said that Railway Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw has given the "green signal to this ambitious initiative, and we are ready to roll out the card".

Varanasi, April 11 (UNI) : Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Friday said the country's identity in the world has changed in the last ten years and today's India is moving ahead with development and heritage.

The PM inaugurated and laid the foundation of 44 development projects worth Rs 3,900 crore for Kashi and Purvanchal from his parliamentary constituency Varanasi.

Addressing a massive public gathering in Mehandiganj, Modi connected with the audience in their local language, Bhojpuri. Repeatedly expressing his deep emotional bond with the city, he said, "Kashi is

He said that the government's motto is 'Sabka Saath, Sabka Vikas', as opposed to the ideology of 'family-first politics'. "Such people are only focused on grabbing power following the principle of 'family's support, family's development'," he said.

Highlighting Varanasi's remarkable transformation over the past decade, the PM said that Kashi has not only preserved its ancient heritage but has also embraced modernity and taken strong steps toward a brighter future. "Kashi is no longer just ancient, it is now progressive too," he said.

He highlighted that the city is positioned at the center of Purvanchal's economic map. "The Kashi

Where has Rs 10,000 cr ELI scheme disappeared?, Rahul slams PM Modi

New Delhi, April 11 (UNI) : Leader of Opposition in the Lok Sabha Rahul Gandhi on Friday slammed Prime Minister Narendra Modi over the 'Employment Linked Incentive' scheme, and asked whether it is "another jumla?" as the government has returned the Rs 10,000 crores allotted to it. Gandhi accused the Modi government of not being serious about creating employment, and of focusing "solely on large corporates and favoring cronies over fair competition".

Taking to his social media handle X, Rahul Gandhi said:

"After the 2024 election, PM Modi announced the 'Employment Linked Incentive' scheme with much fanfare, promising to provide employment to our youth."

He alleged, "It's been nearly a year since announcing the scheme, the government hasn't even defined it, and has returned

the Rs 10,000 crores allotted to it. This shows how serious the PM is about unemployment".

He said, "Jobs can't be created by focusing only on large corporates, promoting cronies over fair-play businesses, prioritising assembly over production, and disregarding India's indigenous skills".

He added that crores of jobs can be generated through significant investment in MSMEs, the creation of fair markets that encourage healthy competition, support for local production networks, and by equipping the youth with the necessary skills.

Expressing concern, Rahul also posed three questions to the Prime Minister:

"Prime Minister ji, you announced ELI with great showmanship - but where has this Rs 10,000 crore scheme disappeared? Have you abandoned our unemployed youth along with your promises?"

Political motive behind bringing Tahawwur Rana to India: Sanjay Raut

Mumbai, April 11 (UNI) : Shiv Sena (UBT) Rajya Sabha MP Sanjay Raut said on Friday that there is "a political motive" behind bringing Tahawwur Rana to India.

"Rana has been brought to India for the Bihar and West Bengal assembly elections," alleged Raut.

Speaking on the Tahawwur Rana case, Raut said that "Rana will be hanged before the Bihar and West Bengal elections and this issue will be used for campaigning before the elections". "All BJP members take decisions based on the timing," said Raut.

"If Rana has been brought to India, the administration and the investigation agencies should be praised, why should BJP take credit for it? The process to bring Rana to India had started during the Congress period, so the ruling party should not take credit," he added.

"Before Rana, Abu Salem was also brought to India through a similar process," Raut indirectly hit out at BJP.

Congress chief demands SIT enquiry, culpable homicide case over pregnant woman's death

Pune, April 11 (UNI) : Maharashtra Pradesh Congress Committee president Harshvardhan Sapkal today demanded that a case of culpable homicide be registered against the medical director and board of trustees of Dinanath Mangeshkar Hospital in Pune and a SIT inquiry ordered, after the hospital refused treatment to a pregnant woman resulting in her death.

Addressing a press conference here today,

Sapkal said that the Dinanath Mangeshkar Hospital in Pune denied treatment to seven-month pregnant Tanisha Bhise for money which resulted in her death. Efforts are being made to save the culprits of the Dinanath Mangeshkar Hospital, he alleged.

The board of directors of this hospital should be dismissed and the government should take over the hospital, he said.

He demanded that a SIT inquiry should be

conducted into the entire matter by retired judges.

Sapkal went to Phulewada in Pune today to pay homage on the occasion of Mahatma Jyotiba Phule Jayanti and later met the Bhise family to offer condolences.

He further said that Lata Mangeshkar's magical voice enchanted everyone, but now the Mangeshkar hospital incident that has happened is very bad.

India gifts six school buses to Sao Tome and Principe



New Delhi, April 11 (UNI) : India has gifted six school buses to the Democratic Republic of Sao Tome and Principe, an island country in the Gulf of Guinea, off the western equatorial coast of Central Africa.

In a ceremony held in Sao Tome on April 10, these buses were handed over to Isabel Maria Correia Viegas de Abreu, Minister of Education, Culture, Science and Higher Education of Sao Tome and Principe by Deepak Miglani, Ambassador of India, a

statement said.

India's gift is in response to the request received from the Government of Sao Tome and Principe, seeking India's assistance in making school education more accessible.

This assistance will reinforce the school transport fleet of Sao Tome and Principe, and provide safer commute for students and reduce education costs for families and facilitate their access to school education.

Earlier, in January 2025,

the Government of India sent a consignment of medical supplies, comprising essential and life-saving medicines to buttress the healthcare sector of Sao Tome and Principe.

India and Sao Tome and Principe enjoy close and friendly relations and are diversifying their bilateral cooperation. The gift of school buses to the friendly people of Sao Tome and Principe is part of India's development assistance to the Global South, the statement added.

"Now Kejriwal and his gang have taken over the Punjab government and

distributed all the portfolios among themselves. Public money is also being looted to fill the coffers of the Aam Aadmi Party," he alleged.

Demanding the immediate arrest of the culprit in the latest case, he said the Union Government should review the law and order situation of the border State to ensure anti-national elements do not take advantage of the situation.

He said that Chief Minister Mann should either resign immediately from his post or should start paying attention towards Punjab, whose responsibility Punjabis have bestowed on him.

"J&K's moment to support Muslims nationwide lost forever: Sajad Lone

Srinagar, April 11 (UNI) : Peoples Conference President and Handwara MLA Sajad Lone on Friday launched a sharp attack on the National Conference (NC), accusing it of sabotaging a crucial discussion on the Waqf bill during the last three days of the Assembly session.

In a sharply worded statement, Lone alleged that the NC, despite having a brute majority, chose to indulge in "chaos and theatrics" instead of fulfilling its responsibility to oppose what he termed interference in Muslim religious affairs.

He criticized the NC for bringing an adjournment motion on the Waqf Bill and then refusing to back a no-confidence motion against the Speaker for not allowing a debate. "NC

brings in an adjournment motion on Waqf and the Speaker, who incidentally is an NC member and is the Speaker at the pleasure of these very members, refuses to allow any discussion and says it is sub judice. The tiny Kashmir-based opposition proposes a no-confidence motion against the Speaker in reaction to his refusal to allow any discussion of any sort on the Waqf bill. The same shouting NC brigade refuses to support the no-confidence motion," Lone said. He added that NC has the majority and, by this majority has a Chief Minister, a Speaker, and a Cabinet. "They run the government, they enjoy all the perks of power. The onus of discussing Waqf was on the majority. Is it the speaker's fault? But is the

speaker bigger than the Waqf bill. They could have removed him and gotten a new speaker who would facilitate the discussion on Waqf. So is this majority only to enjoy power? Is this majority not to be used when a powerful message has to be sent, that we are Muslims and will not accept any interference in our religious affairs. Being in power does not mean enjoying power alone. It comes with a set of responsibilities. So NC is okay with enjoying power but is not willing to fulfill its responsibilities," he added

"As much as you use noise as a weapon, the truth stares in our faces. NC sabotaged the Wakf discussion. And used noise and bedlam to camouflage the mother of all betrayals.

Amid Waqf Act row, Mirwaiz Umar placed under house arrest

Srinagar, April 11 (UNI) : Amid the outrage over the Waqf Act, Hurriyat Conference chairman and Kashmir's chief cleric Mirwaiz Umar Farooq on Friday said that he was placed under house arrest again and not allowed to offer the congregational prayers at Jamia Masjid here. Mirwaiz said the restriction is both heartbreaking and outrageous.

"Yet again, this Friday put under house arrest and barred from offering prayers at Jama Masjid. It's is both heartbreaking and outrageous that authorities continue to trample on my basic religious rights — at their will," he said in a post in X. Mirwaiz also shared a video of police deployed outside his Nagin residence, suggesting restrictions on his movement.

The police have not reacted to the claim. House

detention of Mirwaiz is common in Kashmir, but the police rarely admit to such action.

Meanwhile, the Imams and members of the Mutahida Majlis-e-Ulema (MMU), J&K's largest religious representative body, read out the resolution prepared by the council against the Waqf Act in major mosque, khanqahs, shrines, and Imambaras throughout the Kashmir Valley, Chenab region, Jammu, Leh, and Kargil. MMU said Waqf Amendment Act 2025 was categorically rejected across Jammu & Kashmir, with a strong demand for its immediate withdrawal.

In the resolution MMU expressed serious concern over several provisions of the amended Waqf Act, warning that the changes threaten the religious and community-centric character of Waqf institutions in India.

"The new legislation introduces significant changes in the management and supervision of Waqf properties, and many feel that it may diminish the role and authority of the Muslim community in overseeing its religious endowments, which have traditionally been managed in accordance with Islamic principles," the resolution read. The MMU in its resolution reaffirmed its full support to the All India Muslim Personal Law Board (AIMPLB) and will stand by the Board in whatever course of action it deems appropriate to address the issues arising from the new law. The MMU also called upon the Muslim community to remain united, aware, and engaged, and to support all peaceful and lawful efforts for the protection and proper functioning of our religious institutions and endowments.

About half of aspirational districts witness sharp drop in multi-dimensional poverty

Nealy half of aspirational districts in the country have seen a quicker drop in multi-dimensional poverty levels, with Madhya Pradesh, Andhra Pradesh, Assam and Tamil Nadu leading the pack.

According to data from Niti Aayog’s ‘Multidimensional Poverty Index 2023,’ 46 per cent of the 106 aspirational districts have witnessed a drop in multidimensional poverty.

Traditionally, poverty has been measured by assessing monetary resources available for an individual or household. The Multidimensional Poverty Index (MPI) is now considered as a more direct and comprehensive measure of people’s deprivation and poverty.

It captures and reveals the outcome of economic growth and development, income and its distribution and various development initiatives of the State.

Besides, it has been globally realised that non-monetary measures complement monetary measures to capture diverse dimensions of poverty.

This granular approach proves essential in India’s diverse context, enabling targeted interventions to address acute poverty and uphold the principle of inclusivity, ensuring that “no one is left behind.”

According to Prime Minister Narendra Modi, some of the aspirational districts had done better than national and state average.

“Earlier, the government had announced 100 districts as backward, many of them in the Northeast and tribal belts. We changed this approach and called them aspirational and implemented schemes in mission mode. Reputed institutions and journals have praised India's aspirational districts move,” PM Modi said during an event in the national capital this week.

Meanwhile, an SBI Research report earlier this year showed that India's rural poverty ratio has registered a dramatic decline to 4.86 per cent in the financial year 2023-24 from 25.7 per cent in 2011-12 while urban poverty has fallen to 4.09 per cent from 4.6 per cent during this period.

"At an aggregate level, we believe poverty rates in India could now be in the range of 4 per cent-4.5 per cent with almost minimal existence of extreme poverty," the report said.

The sharp decline in the rural poverty ratio is on account of higher consumption growth in the lowest 0-5 per cent decile with significant government support.

Better Infrastructure, Better Technology, Better Trains – Indian Railways Set to boost better services in Mumbai suburban network

In a media interaction on the theme Themed “Better Infrastructure, Better Technology, Better Trains” held today in Mumbai, Chief Minister of Maharashtra, Shri Devendra Fadnavis and the Union Minister of Railways, Information & Broadcasting and Electronics and IT, Shri Ashwini Vaishnaw jointly addressed the press to highlight the transformative progress in railway infrastructure across Maharashtra. Indian Railways’ commitment to modernization, improved commuter experience, and enhanced regional connectivity, with a special focus on the Mumbai Suburban Railway Network.

Better Infrastructure: Union Minister Shri Vaishnaw emphasized that infrastructure development is the cornerstone for increasing suburban services. Projects worth nearly ₹17,000 crore, covering more than 300 kilometers of new lines, are currently underway at a rapid pace. These initiatives aim to decongest existing lines, improve service frequency, and cater to the ever-growing demand of Mumbai’s suburban commuters.

Better Technology: Shri Vaishnaw announced the upcoming launch of Kavach 5.0, a state-of-the-art safety and signaling system tailored for the suburban section. Kavach 5.0 is expected to significantly reduce the inter-train headway, enabling more trains to run safely and efficiently.



Better Trains: In a major upgrade to passenger comfort, the Union Minister revealed that 238 new Air-Conditioned suburban rakes will soon be introduced. These rakes have been uniquely designed keeping in mind the needs of Mumbai’s commuters, promising a more comfortable and reliable travel experience.

Maharashtra CM Shri Fadnavis also elaborated that Mumbai One Card, will soon be launched, which is a single and all integrated card set to transform public transport across MMR region for passengers traveling in suburban trains, metro rails, mono-rail, BEST buses, etc.

Together this infrastructure, technology, and rolling stock advancements are expected to increase the number of suburban services,

dramatically improving daily transit for millions of Mumbaikars.

First Indian Institute of Creative Technology, an institute of National Importance in creative sphere will come up at Mumbai and this will be transformative for Indian Creative industry to make it a world class infrastructure hub.

Strategic Rail Projects in Maharashtra:

A major announcement during the interaction was the doubling of the Gondia–Ballarshah railway line, a 240 km strategic corridor with an investment of ₹4,819 crore. This key project connects Vidarbha and Marathwada, easing congestion and enabling faster passenger and freight movement. It will also strengthen Maharashtra’s rail links with Andhra Pradesh and

Chhattisgarh, boosting regional trade and integration.

This major infrastructure push was announced on April 7, 2025, when the Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs, chaired by the Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi, had approved four projects of Ministry of Railways with total cost of Rs. 18,658 crore (approx.).

Mr Vaishnaw stated today that this transformative project is set to play a pivotal role in enhancing passenger and freight connectivity between northern and southern India. A New Breakthrough in Cancer Treatment!

A major step forward has been taken in the battle against cancer. A new revolutionary approach has emerged — Dendritic Cell Therapy (DCT). This treatment involves extracting dendritic cells from the patient’s blood, concentrating them, and injecting them back into the body.

These dendritic cells activate the body’s T-cells, which are natural cancer fighters. They help detect and destroy cancer or bacteria-related cells throughout the body.

Though it falls under immunotherapy, this method is significantly different from existing ones, according to Dr. Sadat A. Ali, an

orthopedic surgeon and professor of regenerative medicine at Stem Cells Regenerative and Research Labs in Hyderabad, where this therapy is being offered.

Cancer has become increasingly widespread in India. As per WHO statistics, over 1.4 million new cases were reported in 2022 alone, with nearly 900,000 deaths. DCT provides new hope in this context. Not only do dendritic cells directly attack cancer cells, but they also awaken dormant T-cells to fight more effectively.“

India already offers several treatments for cancer, such as chemotherapy and monoclonal antibody therapy. When combined

with DCT, these treatments become more potent, leading to faster cancer reduction. While DCT was discovered in the 19th century, it received approval from the US FDA in 2010. It has shown significant success, particularly in treating metastatic prostate cancer, where cancer spreads from the prostate to other parts of the body.

“Compared to traditional treatments, DCT is far more effective and has minimal side effects. Patients undergoing this therapy have shown significant improvement in both life expectancy and quality of life. It can reduce the tumor burden by over 65%. When administered

in the early stages, DCT can reduce the chances of metastasis by four to five times more than other treatments. Scientifically, it’s proven to boost the effectiveness of chemo and radiotherapy by two to three times.

The process involves collecting 5-10 mL of blood from the patient, along with tissue samples from the tumor. These samples are processed in the lab for 5-7 days to produce around 10 million dendritic cells. These are then injected under the skin, into the muscles, nerves, or directly into the tumor. Initial results are visible within the first three months, with full results taking around 6 to 9 months.

Currently, there are very few labs offering this treatment in India. For the southern states — Telangana, Andhra Pradesh, and Karnataka — the only available lab is in Hyderabad. Established in 1999 in collaboration with the U.S. Consultancy for Applied Research in Illinois, the lab provides injections once every two weeks (3-4 doses) or a set of 10 injections every 3-4 weeks.

This cutting-edge therapy offers hope where traditional treatments fall short — and all at a significantly more affordable cost compared to other regions.

Researchers develop blood test method for early detection of Parkinson's disease

Jerusalem, April 11 (UNI) : Israeli researchers have developed a new RNA-based blood test for detecting Parkinson's disease long before symptoms emerge, the Hebrew University of Jerusalem (HU) said in a statement on Friday.Parkinson's is often diagnosed only after significant brain damage has occurred, when most relevant neurons are already lost, underscoring the need for early detection.

The new method, detailed in Nature Aging, measures specific RNA fragments in the blood. It focuses on two key biomarkers: a repetitive RNA sequence that accumulates in Parkinson's patients, and mitochondrial RNA, which declines as the disease progresses.By measuring the ratio between these fragments, the test can identify the disease in its early stages. In experiments, the test successfully distinguished pre-symptomatic Parkinson's patients from healthy controls with an accuracy of 86 percent, outperforming current diagnostic methods.Notably, the study also found that levels of the first type of fragments drop after deep brain stimulation, linking them to disease mechanisms and treatment responses.

The researchers said that this discovery paves the way for early interventions and treatments that could change the course of the disease, potentially improving patient outcomes through timely diagnosis and care.

Sri Lankan think tank suggests global response to Trump's reciprocal tariffs

Colombo, April 11 (UNI) : A Sri Lankan think tank, Verite Research, has suggested a global response to Trump's reciprocal tariffs Instead of individual countries rallying against the move.

It urged the Sri Lankan Government and the world for a multilateral 'Cooperative Common Response' to the US tariff hike to stop further damage to the rules-based trade order in the world.“As countries line up to negotiate bilaterally with the United States on exceptional arrangements, to mitigate the individual country impact of the unilateral action, Verité Research.. is calling its government and the world to forge a multilateral approach instead,” it said in a statement, according to EconomyNext.Earlier, Trump had imposed a 44 percent reciprocal tariff on Sri Lanka, on which he announced a 90-day pause on Wednesday.

Türkiye urges immediate halt to Israeli attacks, supports Gaza reconstruction

Ankara, April 11 (UNI) : Turkish Foreign Minister Hakan Fidan on Friday called for an immediate cessation of Israeli military operations, emphasising the necessity of a permanent ceasefire and the reconstruction of Gaza."We reject any plan to force Palestinians to leave their homeland. We support the plan for the reconstruction of Gaza adopted by the Arab League," he said.

The Turkish foreign minister made the remarks during a joint press conference following a meeting of the Organization of Islamic Cooperation and Arab League Ministerial Committee, held on the sideline of the Antalya Diplomacy Forum (ADF).

"Israel's attacks must be halted without delay. We discussed steps toward achieving a lasting peace and a two-state solution. A permanent ceasefire should be established promptly," he added.

Fidan expressed Türkiye's support for the ceasefire negotiations led by Qatar, Egypt, and the United States, and endorsed the Gaza reconstruction plan approved by the Arab League.

Themed "Reclaiming Diplomacy in a Fragmented World," the fourth edition of the ADF kicked off in Türkiye's resort city Antalya on Friday.

More than 20 heads of state and government and over 50 foreign ministers were expected to attend the three-day gathering, the Anadolu Agency reported.

China approves its first gene therapy for rare disease hemophilia B

Shanghai, April 11 (UNI) : China has approved its first gene therapy for hemophilia B, an inherited bleeding disorder caused by the deficiency of the clotting protein factor IX (FIX).

The National Medical Products Administration has officially approved BBM-H901 (Dalnacogene Ponparvovec Injection) for the treatment of adult patients with moderate to severe hemophilia B, Belief BioMed and Takeda China jointly announced on Friday.The new gene therapy is developed and manufactured by Belief BioMed, a pharmaceutical company based in Shanghai. Takeda China is responsible for its commercialization in the Chinese mainland, Hong Kong and Macao.This is the first hemophilia B gene therapy drug and the first recombinant adeno-associated virus (rAAV) vector gene therapy drug developed and manufactured in Asia, marking a new milestone in China's gene therapy industry, according to the Shanghai Medical Products Administration and Shanghai Municipal Commission of Science and Technology.

"As the first hemophilia B gene therapy drug independently developed in China, BBM-H901 will provide a new treatment option for hemophilia B patients, which is expected to provide patients with an innovative treatment solution and help them return to a normal life," said Xiao Xiao, co-founder, chairman and chief science officer of Belief BioMed.

US, China trade war escalates, Beijing ups retaliatory tariffs to 125 pc

London/Beijing, April 11 (UNI) : Stock markets in Europe were trading down Friday morning after China hiked its retaliatory tariffs on the United States to 125% from 84%.

China said Friday it was raising tariffs on US goods to 125%, the latest development in the escalating trade war between the two countries.

It said the higher tariffs would take effect on Saturday."The US alternately raising abnormally high tariffs on

China has become a numbers game, which has no practical economic significance, and will become a joke in the history of the world economy," a Commerce Ministry spokesman said in a statement."If the U.S. insists on continuing to substantially infringe on China's interests, China will resolutely counter and fight to the end."

Chinese President Xi Jinping struck a defiant tone in his first public comments on the trade war,

saying his nation was “not afraid”.Europe’s benchmark Stoxx 600 index opened higher but was trading down 0.9% by 4.40 a.m.ET, while France’s CAC 40 index and Germany’s DAX index were down 0.9% and 1.2% respectively, CNN reported.

London’s FTSE 100 was trading down 0.2%.

President Donald Trump’s universal tariffs on China now total 145%. Notably, President Trump did not include a 20% tariff tied to the country’s role in

fentanyl production in his announcement on Wednesday.China's Commerce Ministry said on Friday that it had filed another complaint with the World Trade Organization over US tariffs.

"On 10 April, the United States issued the Executive Order, announcing a further increase of the so-called 'reciprocal tariff' on Chinese products. China filed a WTO complaint against United States' latest tariff measures," a statement from China's mission said.

New study reveals accelerated warming trend on Tibetan Plateau

Beijing, April 11 (UNI) : Chinese researchers have revealed that the Tibetan Plateau is expected to experience accelerated warming in the next 10 years, according to the Institute of Atmospheric Physics (IAP) under the Chinese Academy of Sciences.

While traditional climate projections can highlight long-term trends, the temperature changes on the Tibetan Plateau over the next decade remain highly uncertain due to substantial internal climate variability.However, the new study utilising decadal climate prediction -- an emerging tool that combines the initial state of the climate system with external forcing -- suggests improved accuracy in regional climate forecasts.

The researchers from the IAP analysed advanced international decadal prediction systems to assess the predictability of temperature changes on the Tibetan Plateau.

Their findings indicate that between 2025 and 2032, the region's annual mean temperature will rise by 0.98 degrees Celsius compared to the 1991-2020 baseline. This warming rate is 1.75 times faster than the observed increase from 2016 to 2023.Using the Open Global Glacier Model (OGGM), the researchers simulated the impact of accelerated warming on the Tibetan Plateau glaciers. The results suggest that the warming is projected to reduce glaciervolumebyapproximately 1.4 percent, leading to faster melt rates that threaten water security for hundreds of millions across Asia.

Indian electricity supply to Bangladesh increases following rising public demand

Dhaka/New Delhi, April 11 (UNI) : The supply of Indian electricity to Bangladesh has increased rapidly, following increasing demand in the country. Currently, 17.13% of the total electricity produced in Bangladesh is coming from India, with the majority of it being supplied by the Adani Group.

Asked about importing electricity from India, Bangladesh's Power Development Board (PDB) member (Production) Zahirul Islam said: “April and May are summer and irrigation seasons, making electricity supply a major challenge for us during this time. We try to increase production from every possible source. The increase in electricity supply from India is also for the same reason. As demand has risen, the supply has increased,” the Dhaka Tribune reported.

He added: “Electricity

import from India depends on the contract... As long as the electricity is available under the agreement and we need it, we will ask for it. Besides this, there are plans to increase production at several other power plants.”

Electricity exports by India to Bangladesh had reduced recently, particularly by the Adani Group which cut off half its supply to Dhaka due to non-payment of its long-pending dues. However, Bangladesh has managed to clear the payments.

According to the website of the Power Grid Company of Bangladesh (PGCB), on Monday at 1pm, 1303 megawatts of electricity came from Adani, 907 megawatts via the Bheramara HVDC, and 42 megawatts through Tripura.However, during peak hours at night, the amount of electricity imported increases further.

Nepali authorities in fix over four disowned Bhutanese refugees

Kathmandu/Thimphu, April 11 (UNI) : Authorities in Kathmandu are in a fix

regarding what to do about four Bhutanese nationals who have been left stranded in Nepal after being disowned by Thimphu.The four refugees had earlier left for the US via Nepal but were then deported back to Bhutan where the Thimphu authorities expelled them from the country.

As per The Kathmandu Post, the now detained Bhutanese nationals had crossed the Indian border via Jaigaon and Siliguri and sneaked into Nepal, where the immigration authorities detained them in the Jhapa

district under the tenets of immigration law.

While officials had expected the Nepali Prime Minister to raise the issue of the refugees with his Bhutanese counterpart Tshering Tobay on the sidelines of the BIMSTEC meeting in Thailand, “they did not touch on this issue,” said one Nepali official who was part of the prime minister’s delegation in Bangkok. “Perhaps as this matter is in a nascent phase, it didn’t surface in the meeting.”

The topic has already become a hot issue for the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the Ministry of Home Affairs in Kathmandu. The

four Bhutanese nations were part of a 10-member group which left the country and headed off to Nepal via India, to go to the US.However, all 10 were deported by the US for unknown reasons. The issue has now come under the radar of the Global Campaign for the Release of Political Prisoners in Bhutan (GCRPPB), a Bhutanese human rights group. The organisation expressed deep concern over the forced deportation of 10 Bhutanese refugees from the United States, calling it a case of renewed statelessness and a humanitarian crisis.

Israel orders evacuations in Gaza City amid military operations

Jerusalem, April 11 (UNI) : The Israel Defence Forces (IDF) on Friday issued an urgent evacuation order for residents in several neighborhoods of eastern Gaza City as military operations intensified in the area. In a message posted on social media X, IDF Arabic language spokesperson Avichay Adraee called on civilians to move westward for their safety."The IDF is working intensively in your areas to destroy terrorist infrastructure," he wrote. "For your safety, you must evacuate immediately to the known shelter centers in western Gaza City."

Meanwhile, the IDF said in a statement that it had

killed Hamas militant Ahmad Iyad Muhammad Farhat during a recent operation in Tel al-Sultan refugee camp in Rafah, southern Gaza Strip.

According to the IDF, Farhat was the head of sniper operations for Hamas' Tel al-Sultan Battalion and was responsible for organising and carrying out attacks on Israeli forces.

The IDF also reported additional operations since Thursday across the southern and northern Gaza Strip, in which several Hamas militants were killed.

The military added that it had dismantled Hamas' military infrastructure and neutralised booby-trapped buildings during these efforts.

BGB writes to BSF requesting flag meeting for release of two Bangladeshi nationals

Dhaka, April 11 (UNI) : The Border Guard Bangladesh (BGB) has written to the Border Security Force (BSF) requesting a flag meeting for the release of two Bangladeshi nationals, who were detained along the Nagorvita border under Baliadangi upazila of Thakurgaon.The two detainees, Md Abdul Hamid, 38, of Moshaldangi Coloni village, and Md. Ibrahim, 45, are both residents of Kherbari village in the same upazila.Lt Col Tanjir Ahmed, commanding officer of the 50 Thakurgaon Border, BGB, told The Daily Star that that the two individuals were apprehended by patrolling members of the Tingaon BSF camp in the morning around 500 yards inside Indian territory, near Pillar No 376/4-S, on charges of intrusion.

Following the incident, BGB officials have sent a letter requesting a flag meeting to negotiate the return of the Bangladeshis.The issue of border security between the bodies has been a contentious one, as the BSF has repeatedly arrested Bangladeshi nationals who have been involved in drug or human trafficking, cattle smuggling, robbery, assault, arms smuggling, and even carrying out attacks against BSF officials when stopped.

'Kiev carries out 5 strikes on Russian Energy Facilities in past day'

Moscow, April 11 (UNI) : Kiev has carried out five attacks on Russian energy facilities over the past day, the Russian Defence Ministry said on Friday."The Kiev regime, in violation of the Russian-US agreements on the cessation of strikes on energy facilities for 30 days starting March 18 this year, continued unilateral attacks on the Russian energy infrastructure. Over the past day, the Ukrainian armed forces have carried out five attacks on Russian energy facilities," the ministry said in a statement.

Energy facilities in Bryansk, Kursk, Zaporizhzhya regions and in the Lugansk People's Republic (LPR) were attacked by the Ukrainian armed forces, the ministry said.

originally evicted from Bhutan in the 1990s, had been legally resettled in the US under the UNHCR resettlement programme. Despite this, they were forcibly removed and sent to Bhutan, arriving at Paro Airport on March 27, 2025,” a statement by the GCRPPB said.

Govinda Prasad Rijal, director general of the Department of Immigration, told the Post that an investigation over the detention of the former Bhutanese refugees continues.

False flattery at work can ruin your Career

Sycophancy may get you noticed but it will do no wonders for your career in the long run. ?



leaders realise their mistake and take corrective actions, or become hugely unpopular and ineffective in the organisation." Harvey Deutschendorf, author of 'The Other Kind of Smart: Simple Ways to Boost Your Emotional Intelligence for Greater Personal Effectiveness and Success' tells us why professionals adopt sycophancy, "People may have started out with the notion that talent and abilities will be recognised when it comes to promotions, but then they witnessed others who they see as less capable but more pleasing to their superiors being chosen above them. As a result of observing this, they may have come to see sycophancy as being the path of least resistance and the easiest way to get ahead."

Undeserved promotions are the most critical consequence of sycophantic employees. Vivian Fernandes, HR head, Opus Consulting, explains, "As bosses, it may sometimes be difficult to see the right picture immediately, but with experience, it becomes easy to understand who is a sycophant and who the real hard workers are. If an organisation has clearly chartered out the parameters KRAs for promotions and does stringent reference checks, such situations of unwarranted promotions can be avoided." Rajiv Burman, managing partner, Lighthouse Partners gives some tips on dealing with sycophantic peers, so as to not let them dictate one's behaviour or career: Firstly, it is important to recognise that there is no point in talking to the sycophantic peers as they behave in the manner that they do because they think it gets them brownie points from the boss. The best step is to talk to your boss in a non-confrontational way with facts and figures about your performance and express your disappointment that a lesser deserving peer has been given preferential treatment. If this does not work, then seek a meeting with the skip-level boss; if this too fails, then talk to the HR manager. If none of these measures bring favourable results, then it is best to look for another job. Thus, it is important for an organisation to encourage a merit-based culture, rather than sycophancy among their employees.

Every workplace has its share of sycophantic employees; these are the people who use tools like flattery, deference and obsequiousness towards their superiors to accelerate their careers. They build a special relationship with their bosses and utilise the same to create an unwarranted, elevated place for themselves in the organisation. Udit Mittal, MD, Unison International tells us the potential effects on one's career if one is surrounded by sycophantic peers, "Being surrounded by sycophants might bring negative effects to one's career because there is a possibility of remaining unnoticed by seniors in the bleak environment created by flattery. Sycophancy creates emotional disturbances and eventually affects performance." As bosses, it is important for professionals to not be susceptible to sycophancy from their juniors. Chitbhanu Nagri, global head HR, Tavant Technologies, explains, "For leaders who want to achieve overnight success, sycophants act like 'fuel to fire'; they create an illusion of grandeur and make them believe that everything is hale and hearty. Leaders rationalise this as the organisational sentiment, get defensive when they hear divergent views and ultimately, the ones with differing views either distance themselves or move on to take up other opportunities. Sycophants can use this opportunity to get a larger share of the pie. However, reality catches up soon; either the

Lethargic employees can not only affect a team's output, but also individual attitudes towards work. Lalitha balsubramanian shares tips on how leaders can re-align the focus of such workers and improve their performance



Very often, employees have to endure colleagues who spend time lazing around or talking endlessly on their cell phones during office hours.

Besides being a source of irritation, their laziness could sometimes dampen the congenial atmosphere at the workplace.

Impact on team

Additionally, such workers can make an otherwise efficient team under perform. Says Kala R, an employee with a leading financial consultancy firm, "In processes where projects are supposed to be completed by a team, the major pre-requisites for success is teamwork, cooperation and mutual understanding between colleagues, and shirking any of these responsibilities by even one member can cause the project to fail."

It is usually the team leader who bears the brunt of the issue, as such problems may not be as easily solvable as lodging a complaint with the senior management. Such exercises tend to create a sense of apprehension among team members and dampens the cordial atmosphere at the office. So, how do you deal with such colleagues?

Key concerns

Advisees K Ramakrishnan, vice president, Hazira Central Services, Larsen & Toubro Ltd, "It is imperative to communicate to the employee that the interest of the organisation is paramount. Arranging a meeting with the employee and senior members of the group is one of the best ways to deal with such a situation. He she must be given appropriate feedback about how their attitude is impacting the team's efficiency. It is also equally important to assure the employee of any help they may require." However VR Ganapathi, retired senior manager, Andhra Bank, offers a counter view, "Many a time, a colleague could face genuine issues in executing the tasks entrusted to him/her. Many are hesitant to express their discomfort in the presence of other team members. Hence, confronting such workers should be

done in private and steps should be taken to either clear their doubts and apprehensions while also allowing them to switch to other projects if the scope to do so exists."

Remotivate the employee

Ganapathi says, "A good way to realign an employee's focus towards work is by illustrating the achievements of the organisation's top executives who have reached their present positions through sheer hard work. This could motivate the reluctant worker to show renewed interest at work."

However, most efforts to remotivate employees who give into laziness crash when one fails to gauge the worker's response to such initiatives. Even a slight change in their attitude or productivity can signal success. According to Ramakrishnan, "If the member does step up and do a good job, the leader must recognise his/her efforts. A positive response is often appreciated and acts as a motivator. A weekly or monthly review of his/her work could further improve a lazy worker's performance."

Lend them a ear

Many a time, those who work sincerely, suddenly start showing signs of negligence. However, it may not be advisable to dismiss their under productivity as laziness. Personal issues, such as caring for ailing parents or tending to their own health problems are often a cause for an apparent disenchantment from work. V a r u n Chakaravathy (2/22) and Harshit Rana (2/16) offered excellent support to Narine, while Moeen Ali and Vaibhav Arora chipped in with a wicket each.

In response, KKR raced to the target in just 10.1 overs. After Quinton de Kock (23) gave a brisk start, Narine tore into the CSK bowling, treating the Chepauk crowd to a six-laden spectacle. His dismissal in the eighth over did little to slow down the charge, as skipper Ajinkya Rahane (20 not out) and Rinku Singh (15 not out) completed the formalities with ease.

Kartal watched GB's triumph against France in last year's qualifiers from

afar, having spent three months out with a health issue.However, she has risen up the rankings in the past 12 months, clinching her first WTA title on the clay, she played confidently in a first set that saw seven breaks of serve in 10 games, adjusting well to Niemeier's pace.

Teenagers die as fans & police clash in Chile

Rio De Janeiro, April 11 (UNI) : Two teenagers died following confrontation between fans and police before Chilean club Colo Colo's game against Brazilian side Fortaleza in the Copa Libertadores.

The deaths occurred following fighting after police blocked about 100 fans as they tried to enter the Monumental Stadium in Santiago, the BBC reported.

"What is known is that one of the fences crushed these two and an investigation is under way into whether a police car was involved in the death," said local prosecutor Francisco Morales.

Local media have said the victims were aged 13 and 18.Police general Alex Bahamondes said a police officer had been charged in the case and that "statements are being taken regarding the events".

The group match in the Copa Libertadores did start but was later cancelled.

Udayan Mane builds two-shot lead at Indorama Ventures Open Golf Championship

Ahmedabad, April 11 (UNI) : Olympian Udayan Mane shot a resolute four-under 68 to build a two-shot lead at a total of 14-under 202 after round three at Indorama Ventures Open Golf Championship being played at the Kalhaar Blues & Greens Golf Club here on Friday.

Pune-based Mane (69-65-68), a winner of 12 titles and former PGTI Order of Merit champion, was rock-solid as he extended his lead by one shot despite conceding an early double-bogey. The 34-year-old, who also pocketed an eagle, five birdies and a bogey on day three, is now well-placed to end an over three-year-long victory-

drought.

Bengaluru’s Khalin Joshi (70-65-69), another former PGTI No. 1 and winner of six titles who grew up playing junior and amateur golf alongside Udayan, struck a 69 featuring four birdies and a bogey on the penultimate day to continue in second place and keep hopes alive of ending his winless streak that has lasted over two years.

Faridabad’s Abhinav Lohan (68) ended the day in third place at nine-under 207 while Chandigarh’s Angad Cheema (70) was a further shot back in fourth position.

Ahmedabad’s Varun Parikh carded a 69 to

occupy tied eighth place at five-under 211.

The swirling wind troubled Udayan Mane early on as he dropped a double-bogey on the second hole. Mane then picked up five birdies till the 12th hole thanks to his outstanding drives and tee shots as well as a 30-feet conversion on the seventh.

AIFF bids for hosting AFC Asian Cup 2031 in India

Kuala Lumpur, April 11 (UNI) : In a significant development for Indian football, the All India Football Federation (AIFF) has officially submitted its bid to host the AFC Asian Cup 2031, joining six other contenders in a record-breaking response to the Asian

Football Confederation's (AFC) call for Expressions of Interest (EoI).The AFC, which confirmed receiving seven EoIs by the March 31 deadline, described the unprecedented number as the highest ever in the tournament's modern history. The announcement was made during the 6th AFC Executive Committee meeting chaired by AFC President Shaikh Salman bin Ebrahim Al Khalifa in Kuala Lumpur on the eve of the 35th AFC Congress.

Alongside India, six other bidders have submitted Expressions of Interest to host the AFC Asian Cup 2031, including Football Australia, the Football Association of Indonesia, Korea Football Association, Kuwait Football Association, United Arab Emirates Football Association, and a joint bid from the Kyrgyz Football Union, Tajikistan

Football Federation, and Uzbekistan Football Association.

Salman praised the Member Associations for their enthusiastic participation, calling it a reflection of the growing stature of Asia's premier men's football competition.

"The AFC Asian Cup is undoubtedly one of the greatest success stories and the last edition in Qatar firmly cemented Asia's flagship as one of the best football competitions in the world," he said.

"The record number of bids that we have received is further testament to the stature and appeal of the AFC Asian Cup, and on behalf of the AFC Executive Committee, I would like to put on record our sincere appreciation to all our MAs for outlining their ambition to extend and expand on our proud legacy."

The 18th edition of the tournament, held in Qatar, broke spectatorship records at FIFA World Cup-standard venues and generated a staggering 7.9 billion digital impressions. Broadcast in over 160 countries by 60 partners, the event underscored the AFC Asian Cup's global appeal.India's bid, if

successful, will mark a historic milestone for the country's football journey. The AIFF has been actively working to raise the sport's profile domestically through infrastructure upgrades, grassroots development and international exposure.

Salman said that hosting the tournament offers both tangible and intangible benefits, from infrastructure and organisational growth to enhancing technical standards and positioning the host nation as a global sporting destination.

"The unprecedented level of interest we have witnessed reflects both the high ambitions of the AFC's Member Associations and their increasing confidence in their own capacities and capabilities to host a tournament as significant as the AFC Asian Cup," he added.With Saudi Arabia already confirmed to host the 2027 edition, the decision on the 2031 host is expected to further reinforce Asia's footballing rise. The AFC will now coordinate with the bidding Member Associations to facilitate the submission of necessary documentation as per established timelines.
