Woman’s body found in a suitcase near railway stn

Mumbai, April 17 (UNI) : The decomposed body of a woman was found inside a suitcase near the Monkey Hill area on the Mumbai-Pune railway route lying close to railway tracks, official said on Thursday.

The suitcase was first spotted by a passenger on a train travelling from Mumbai to Pune. As the train passed the Monkey Hill point, the commuter noticed the oddly placed suitcase near the tracks and alerted the railway police.

Upon reaching police took possession of the bag and discovered the woman’s body in a severely decomposed state, raising suspicions of foul play.

A panchnama was conducted at the site and the body was sent for a post-mortem. Further investigations are going on.

‘Wage revision issues of striking powerloom weavers will be redressed’

Chennai, April 17 (UNI) : The Tami Nadu government would take necessary steps to address the wage revision issue of striking powerloom weavers in Coimbatore and Tiruppur districts, Minister for Handlooms and Textiles R.Gandhi told the Tamil Nadu Assembly on Thursday.

Replying to a Special Calling Attention motion given notice of AIADMK General Secretary and by Leader of the Opposition Edappadi K. Palaniswami seeking the Government’s immediate intervention as the weavers were on an indefinite strike since March 19, the Minister listed out the steps taken by the DMK regime after it came to power in May 2021 and promised to redress their grievances. Intervening,

Finance Minister Thangam Thennarasu said the State government has clearly understood the importance of the issue and will take urgent steps to resolve the impasse.

Earlier, moving the motion,the AIADMK leader said about 1.5 lakh job working powerloom units are operating on a wage basis in these two districts, and that since January 2024, they have been demanding an increase in wages.

Bringing Waqf Amendement Act is to end sufferings of women, especially widows: PM



New Delhi, April 17 (UNI) : Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Thursday defended the Waqf Amendement Act, saying that one of the key drivers behind bringing the Act was that most of the sufferers of the prevalent system were women, especially widows.

Interacting with a delegation of Dawoodi Bohra community members at his residence here, Modi mentioned that extensive efforts over many years went into bringing the Act to fruition, an official statement said.

He also spoke about difficulties faced by people due to Waqf.

Modi said when work towards bringing about the Waqf Amendement Act started, one of the first people he discussed this with was Syedna Mufaddal Saifuddin, who was instrumental in giving detailed comments about various nitty-gritties of the Act.The Prime Minister recalled his strong bond with members of the Dawoodi Bohra community. He praised the tradition of the community of working towards social welfare, which he has seen over the years.

He also brought out the special contribution of the community towards bringing about the Act.

The delegation of the Dawoodi Bohra community meanwhile narrated their struggles and shared stories of how properties belonging to members of their community were wrongfully claimed by Waqf. They

thanked the Prime Minister for bringing about the Waqf Amendement Act and said it was a long pending demand.

They spoke about the Prime Minister’s long-standing special connection with the Dawoodi Bohra community, and the positive work done by him.

Speaking about the benefit of the Act for their community, they said that the Prime Minister has brought this Act not only for minorities but for minority within minorities.

Waqf matter: Supreme Court orders interim status quo till May 5

New Delhi, April 17 (UNI) : In a significant development, the Supreme Court on Thursday issued an interim order, directing status quo in relation to the functionality of the Waqf Boards till the next hearing on May 5.

A three-judge Bench of the top court, led by Chief Justice of India Justice Sanjiv Khanna recorded the Centre’s assurance that no fresh appointments will be made to the Waqf Boards or the Central and State Waqf Councils under Sections 9 and 14 of the Act while the matter is sub-judice.

The Bench, also comprising Justice Sanjay Kumar and Justice K.V. Viswanathan, was hearing a bunch of petitions filed by various groups and individuals against the Waqf (Amendment) Act, 2025 passed by Parliament earlier this month.

The court made it clear that the “status quo must be maintained” in light of the wide-reaching implications of the new law.

“We do not want the position to change,” observed CJI Khanna, adding “The situation prevailing today should continue, so as to not upset the rights of parties.”

The Court directed the Union of India and Waqf Boards to file their responses within seven days, and rejoinders by petitioners within five days thereafter.

In the interim, the following directions have been passed:

- No appointments to Waqf Boards or Councils under Sections 9 and 14.
- No denotification of Waqf properties, including Waqf by user
- The situation regarding registered Waqf properties under the 1995 Act shall remain undisturbed. The matter

Stalin flays Centre for undermining States, calls for renewed push for State autonomy

Chennai, April 17 (UNI) : Tamil Nadu Chief Minister and DMK President M.K. Stalin on Monday the slammed the BJP-led government at the Centre for undermining the States and systematically eroding their powers by taking control of subjects listed in the Concurrent List over the past ten years.

In a strongly worded letter titled "Why is State Autonomy Necessary?" in a Tamil daily, Mr Stalin voiced his deep concern over what he described as an alarming centralisation of power.

Alleging that the Centre was attempting to turn state governments into powerless administrative units that merely execute instructions from New Delhi, he said the BJP government wants to reduce state governments to rubber stamps—entities without legislative authority, incapable of independent decision-making.

Over the past decade, many subjects that were once shared between the Centre and the states have been snatched and effectively brought under exclusive control of the Centre, he added.

Mr Stalin compared the current situation with the past era of former Chief Minister and DMK Patriarch M Karunanidhi, who had advocated for protecting state autonomy all through his public life.

“Back then, only a few powers were taken away. But today, the Centre is attempting to completely paralyse the states,” he said, adding, the present situation is far worse and required immediate attention.

Reiterating his party’s longstanding position, Stalin declared that protecting the rights and powers of state governments is at the core of the DMK’s ideology.

“Our call for state autonomy is not just political rhetoric—it is a fight to protect the livelihood, identity, and dignity of the people,” he asserted.

TN Cabinet accords nod for important projects, policies like Spacetech to attract investments : Minister

Chennai, April 17 (UNI) : The Tamil Nadu Cabinet under the charimanship of Chief Minister M K Stalin met on Thursday evening and gave the nod for important projects and policies, including the emerging SpaceTech policy to take the state to the next step towards economic development, in which TN is ranked Numero Uno in the country.

Talking to reporters after the meeting, Industries Minister TRB Raaja said the Cabinet gave its nod for important policies.

Stating that TN was number one in economic development, he said to take it to next level, there was need for development and growth in advanced new and emerging sectors like SpaceTech.With a view to taking SpaceTech sector to the next level, the Cabinet gave its nod for the new SpaceTech policy-2025 under which the State has targetted to attract Rs 10,000 crore investment in the next five years and generate employment for a minimum of 10,000 people to improve their talent and create a skilled workforce.

With these goals on mind the attention will be mainly on Manufacturing Centres and production, but this time the Chief Minister stressed the need for devoting more attention on the emerging Spacetech sector.Asserting that Mr Stalin had given a big fillip to ensure that Tamil Nadu remained at the top at India level, nay global level, the Cabinet has given its approval for the new SpaceTech policy, the Minister said.Apart from encouraging StartUps with Rs 25 crore, he said the meeting felt that SpaceTech developments are progressing at a rapid speed, besides promoting the AI-influenced technology in the State.

He said the SpaceTech policy was designed to promote more Startups in this sector while offering 50 per cent subsidy by the government itself for getting patents.Moreover, the policy will ensure a special package for an investment in excess of Rs 300 crore,

Permission for tree felling and commencement of work (Working Permission) for Provision of 3rd line between Kalyan- Kasara Railway Project.

This Public notice is issued subsequent to the Chief Conservator of Forests (T), Thane's Working Permission Letter bearing Ref. No.: Desk-10/FC/Proposal No.67/16-17/Outward No. 282/24-25 dated 04/12/2024 for the construction of **3rd line between Kalyan- Kasara Railway Project** in regard to commencement of works and tree felling on 16.5480 Ha forest land within Project alignment granted under following terms and conditions:

1. This permission is limited to carrying out works within the proposed diversion area under the project. It is valid for one year, i.e., until 04.12.2025, and will automatically stand cancelled effective 05.12.2025.

2. The said permission is limited to felling of 1046 trees in an area of 16.5480 Ha. proposed under the project. The project authority should ensure that the minimum number of trees are felled under the proposal.

3. As per Central Government "In principle" Approval, Condition No. 2 , the demarcation of the proposed area is to be carried out under the supervision of the Forest Department at the expense of the Project Authority. In this regard, the project authority has paid an amount of Rs. 84,83,150/- to the Deputy Conservator of Forests, Shahapur and an amount of Rs. 4,57,000/- to the Deputy Conservator of Forests, Thane with a total amount of Rs. 89,40,150/-.

4. The Deputy Conservator of Forests, Shahapur has certified to fell 921 trees in Shahapur forest division and 125 tree in Thane forest division, with a total of 1046 trees to be felled. As per Central Government "In principle" Approval, Condition No.9, the project authority will take care that minimum trees are felled in the proposed area. In this regard, the project authority has paid an amount of Rs. 21,83,387/- to the Deputy Conservator of Forests, Shahapur and an amount of Rs. 11,93,963/- to the Deputy Conservator of Forests, Thane, for a total amount of Rs. 33,76,350/-.

5. As per Central Government "In principle" Approval Condition no. 11, the Forest Rights Act, 2006 certificate from the District Collector, Thane has been submitted by the project authority. The project authority will be responsible for providing rehabilitation/compensation as per the rules for any lease holders/eligible plot holders etc. in the forest area under the proposal. The project agency has submitted an undertaking in this regard.

6. As per Central Government "In principle" Approval Condition No. 14, the project authority is required to obtain necessary environmental clearance, if applicable for the project. The project authority has submitted an undertaking in this regard.

7. Till the Proj ect receives Final approval from the Central Government and Final transfer order from the State Government, the concerned Deputy Conservator of Forests, Shahapur will ensure that the project authority strictly complies with all the conditions within 6 months from the date of receipt of in-principle/due approval and will submit a report in this regard from time to time.

8. Before commencing work in the proposed area, the project authority must inform the concerned Deputy Conservator of Forests, Shahapur. The concerned Deputy Conservator of Forests, Shahapur should check for any violation of FC act, if any while the work is in progress. Also, in case of violation, action should be taken as per the prevailing law.

9. While carrying out works in the forest area under the project, care should be taken to ensure that the natural water courses, rivers, and streams are not blocked, nor are the passageways of wild animals blocked.

10. The project has not received Final approval from the Central Government and Final transfer order from the State Government. Till the time, the terms and conditions while granting the said order/approval will remain binding on the project authority.

11. The Deputy Conservator of Forests, Shahapur will be responsible for the fulfilment of the Undertaking given by the project authority within the prescribed time period in respect of Conditions No. 1, 8, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21 and 22 of the Central Government In-Principle Approval Letter.

12. The project authority is to abide by any terms and conditions for the development and conservation of forests and wildlife, as may be imposed by the Ministry of Environment and Forests, from time to time.

13. In case of non-compliance with any of the above conditions, specific action should be taken as per paragraph 1.21 of the Handbook issued by the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, New Delhi, under the Van (Sanrakshan & Samvardhan) Adhiniyam, 1980.

India saved Rs 3.48 lakh crore as DBT cut leakages in last 10 years

India's Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT) system has resulted in cumulative savings of Rs 3.48 lakh crore through a reduction in leakages that were taking place earlier, and a 16-fold expansion in beneficiary coverage from 11 crore to 176 crore since its launch by Prime Minister Narendra Modi-led government, according to a report released.

Since the money goes directly into the bank accounts of beneficiaries the leakage as been curbed which has resulted in a halving of subsidy allocations from 16 per cent to 9 per cent of total expenditure.

"The DBT has redefined welfare delivery by enhancing transparency, curbing leakages, and ensuring precise fund distribution," the study states.

This policy document evaluates a decade of data (2009–2024) to assess DBT's impact on budgetary efficiency, subsidy rationalization, and social outcomes.

The newly developed Welfare Efficiency Index (WEI), which quantifies fiscal and social gains, surged from 0.32 in 2014 to 0.91 in 2023, underscoring systemic improvements, the policy document states. According to the document, despite a rise in welfare budgets from Rs 2.1 lakh crore in 2009–10 to Rs 8.5 lakh crore in 2023–24, subsidy allocations declined proportionally, reflecting DBT-driven efficiency.

It points out that food subsidies accounted for 53 per cent of total savings (Rs 1.85 lakh crore), while programs like MGNREGS and PM-KISAN achieved 98 per cent timely wage transfers and Rs 22,106 crore in savings, respectively. Aadhaar-linked authentication eliminated ghost beneficiaries, enabling coverage expansion without proportional fiscal expenditure. The study employs a mixed-methods approach, synthesizing Union Budget data, DBT portal records, and secondary sources. Analytical tools include correlation analysis, Granger causality tests, and the WEI—a composite metric weighting DBT savings of 50 per cent, subsidy reduction of 30 per cent, and beneficiary growth of 20 per cent.

The policy recommendations emanating from the study include expansion of DBT coverage through the transition of remaining subsidy-based schemes to direct benefit transfer. It also recommends the strengthening of digital infrastructure and the prioritisation of rural and semi-urban banking access to bridge inclusion gaps.

Besides, the study has come out in favour of leveraging advanced analytics with the integration of AI-driven fraud detection to further minimize leakages.

It also recommends the need to improve grievance redressal through the establishment of robust mechanisms to address exclusion. "Contrary to critiques of reduced welfare spending, DBT has optimized resource utilization, enabling broader beneficiary reach with lower fiscal outlays. By replacing inefficient subsidies with targeted transfers, India has achieved measurable gains in welfare efficiency," the report states. Future efforts must focus on scaling up DBT's reach, harnessing technology, and sustaining inclusive growth to ensure equitable welfare governance, the report concludes.

Lucknow, April 17 (UNI) : In a bid to create awareness regarding the newly passed Waqf (Amendment) Act among the public, the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) will launch Waqf Reform Public Awareness Campaign in the entire state from April 20.

State president Bhupendra Singh Chaudhary and general secretary (Organisation) Dharampal Singh held a meeting through virtual medium on Thursday and discussed with the party officials regarding the campaign.

During the meeting state president Chaudhary said the Waqf Amendment Act 2024 neither abolishes any law nor takes away anyone's rights, it is just an amendment which will make the process of Waqf Board more transparent and equitable.

He said the central government under the

leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi has taken the step to ensure the rights of poor Muslims, women and people of other religions. "But the opposition parties are continuously creating an atmosphere of lies and confusion due to vote bank politics. We have to go among the public and expose the lies being spread by the opposition regarding the Waqf (Amendment) Act," he said.

General secretary Dharampal Singh discussed in detail the action plan prepared by the party in the context of the Waqf Reform Public Awareness Campaign from April 20. He said a state level workshop has been organised in the capital Lucknow on April 19.

He said workshops will be organised on Jan Jagran Abhiyan at all the 6 organisational areas of the state between April 20 to 21

and at the district/metropolitan level on April 23 and 24.

Singh said that the opposition parties are facing problems due to the Waqf Amendment Act 2025.

"Because with this amendment the whole system will become transparent. The common poor Muslim will start getting the benefit of the Waqf money," he said.

He said the opposition leaders are now continuously working to mislead the Muslims and we should not let the opposition's conspiracy succeed.

The state general secretary said, "Under the Waqf Reform Public Awareness Campaign, we have to go to town halls, citizen dialogues, dialogues with Muslim scholars, among women, youth and various sections of the society and explain in detail about this Act."

Taiwan detects 34 aircraft, 6 vessels of Chinese army in 24 hours : Defense Ministry

Beijing, April 17 (UNI) : The Taiwanese Defense Ministry said on Thursday that they had detected 34 aircraft and 6 vessels of the Chinese People's Liberation Army (PLA) over the past 24 hours.

"34 PLA aircraft, 6 PLAN vessels and 2 official ships operating around Taiwan were detected up until 6 a.m. today [22:00 GMT on Wednesday]," the ministry said. The ministry noted that 14 out of 34 Chinese aircraft crossed the median line and entered Taiwan's Air Defense Identification Zone.Taiwan has been governed independently of mainland China since 1949. Beijing views the island as its province, while Taiwan, a territory with its own elected government, maintains that it is an autonomous country, although it has stopped short of declaring independence. Beijing opposes any official contacts by foreign states with Taipei and considers Chinese sovereignty over the island indisputable.

EU expects Trump-Meloni meeting to clear US tariffs demands : Reports

Moscow, April 17 (UNI) : European Union (EU) trade negotiators hope that Italian Prime Minister Giorgia Meloni's trip to Washington and her meeting with US President Donald Trump can shed light on the US tariffs demands, The Financial Times reported on Thursday. The bloc's negotiators reportedly complained that they had not been provided with US demands and are now hoping that Meloni's trip will bring some clarity, the paper said.

At the same time, Italy's former ambassador to NATO, Stefano Stefanini, believes that Meloni "has an advantage on the EU mediators" as she is talking to "the decider," and is on good terms with Trump.

Unnamed diplomats from four EU states told the paper that Italy's soft stance on reciprocal tariffs is criticized by some member states, but pointed out that Meloni's good relationship with Trump can be valuable.The Italian prime minister publicly supported Brussels' offer to drop all tariffs on industrial goods if Washington does the same, however the diplomats briefed on the talks reportedly said that the US was not interested in reducing the tariffs and that the declared 10% tariff rate is likely to stay.

Meloni and Trump are going to meet in Washington on Thursday. Earlier this week, Politico reported that the Italian prime minister would seek to achieve some concessions from Trump. However, if she fails it might undermine her authority in the EU.

The base tariff rate was established at 10%, with higher rates applied to 57 countries based on the US trade deficit with each specific nation. Türkiye conducts anti-drug operation, detaining 525 suspects: minister

Ankara, April 17 (UNI) : Turkish authorities on Thursday detained 525 individuals in an anti-narcotics operation in the capital Ankara, marking "the largest drug crackdown" in the nation's history, according to Turkish Interior Minister Ali Yerlikaya.

The operation, which began early Thursday, targeted over 625 locations across the capital. It involved 4,768 police officers, 1,461 teams, 40 specially trained detector dogs, four unmanned aerial vehicles, and air support elements, Yerlikaya said on social media platform X.

The operation was the culmination of six months of technical and physical surveillance, he said, adding, "Our target in the operation was street dealers, who sell drugs in neighborhoods and streets through internet-based communication platforms."The operation came one day after a Europe-wide crackdown, coordinated by Türkiye, on international drug and money laundering networks, which resulted in over 230 arrests and the seizure of 400 million U.S. dollars in assets across several countries, including the Netherlands, Germany, Spain, Belgium, and Türkiye.

Russia removes Afghan Taliban from list of terrorist organisations

Moscow/Kabul, April 17 (UNI) : Russia today officially lifted its two-decade old ban on the Afghan Taliban, removing the group from its list of designated terrorist organisations.

The move, confirmed by Russian state media on Thursday, marks a significant shift in Moscow's diplomatic posture toward the de facto rulers of Afghanistan.Russia's Supreme Court on Thursday removed the Taliban's designation as a "terrorist organisation", a symbolic gesture aimed at building friendly ties with Afghanistan's rulers.

The Islamist group seized power in Afghanistan in August 2021, after American forces pulled out.

The Russian Supreme Court's decision to lift the ban, imposed in 2003, takes effect immediately and paves the way for broader engagement between the Kremlin and the Taliban.

Although no country has formally recognised the Taliban-led government since it seized power in

704 climbers permitted to climb Nepal peaks this spring



Kathmandu, April 17 (UNI) : Nepal has issued permits to 704 climbers, including 156 females, for ascending 21 mountains in the country during the spring climbing season which runs through May, an official said on Thursday.

Among them, 253 males and 58 females were

allowed to scale Mount Qomolangma, the world's tallest peak at 8,848.86 meters, which straddles Nepal and China.

"We have been receiving applications daily, mainly for Mount Qomolangma," Liladhar Awasthi, director at the Department of Tourism, told Xinhua.Nepal has earned

3.84 million U.S. dollars in revenues by issuing the permits, with 3.38 million dollars from Mount Qomolangma alone.The Nepali government is to raise foreign nationals' climbing fee for Mount Qomolangma from 5,500 dollars to 7,500 dollars from September 1,when the autumn climbing season starts.

Trump says ‘big progress’ made in trade talks with Japan

Washington, April 17 (UNI) : US President Donald Trump said that "big progress" had been made in trade talks with the Japanese delegation at the White House.

"A Great Honor to have just met with the Japanese Delegation on Trade. Big Progress!" Trump said on Truth Social.

Japan was among the 15 countries with which the US could quickly sign new contracts.

Meanwhile, Japanese Prime Minister Shigeru Ishiba has called the talks "constructive and honest," but expressed doubt that further discussions will be easy.

"I have just received a report from Economic Revitalization Minister

Ryosei Akazawa who is currently in Washington ... For 50 minutes with President Trump, and then for 75 minutes, in other words for quite a long time there was a constructive and honest discussion with US Treasury Secretary Scott Bessent, US trade representative Jamieson Greer, [US] Secretary of Commerce Howard Lutnick. There are still differences in the positions of Japan and the US," Ishiba told reporters.

During talks, Trump spoke about the position of the US in the global economy, while Akazawa expressed regret over US tariffs and explained what impact they would have on the Japanese industry, investment and jobs, asking

to revise the tariffs, Ishiba added.At the same time, the Japanese prime minister expressed doubt that further negotiations would be easy and said that he intended to travel to the US for a personal meeting with Trump.

Meanwhile, Akazawa said that he expects the second round of talks to take place later in April. The minister also said that both parties agreed to strive for reaching an agreement as soon as possible.On April 2, Trump announced reciprocal tariffs on imports from other countries. The baseline rate was set at 10%. A number of countries were hit with increased rates, which were later lowered to 10% for 90 days to facilitate trade negotiations.

Trade war with US may cost Germany \$330bln by 2028 : Reports

Washington, April 17 (UNI) : The trade war initiated by US President Donald Trump could cost Germany 290 billion euros (\$330 billion) by 2028, equivalent to an annual loss of 1.6% of the country's GDP, the Handelsblatt newspaper reported, citing a study by the German Economic Institute (IW).

At the same time, the US tariffs could cost the entire European Union 1.1 trillion

euros between 2025 and 2028, the report said on Wednesday. The tariffs will hit developing countries and countries with transition economies even harder, for which the IW predicts a "dramatic decline in growth rates," the report read.On April 2, Trump signed an executive order that implemented reciprocal tariffs on imports from various countries. The base tariff rate was established at 10%, with higher rates

applied to 57 countries based on the US trade deficit with each specific nation.On April 9, Trump declared that a baseline tariff of 10% would be imposed for 90 days on over 75 countries that had not retaliated and had requested negotiations, except for China.

California leads US states in challenging Trump administration's social security cuts

Sacramento, US, April 17 (UNI) : California, along with a coalition of 21 other US states, is challenging the federal government's sweeping changes to the Social Security Administration (SSA), arguing that the cuts harm millions of Americans who rely on the programme for basic income and essential services.

California Attorney General Rob Bonta, along with 21 other state attorneys general, filed a legal brief in the case 'American Association of People with Disabilities v. Duke', arguing that the Trump administration's

abrupt policy changes and staffing cuts at the SSA are causing serious disruptions and delays for people trying to access their benefits.

The coalition highlighted that these changes are especially harmful to older adults and people with disabilities, who depend on Social Security to pay rent, buy food, and afford medicine.

The administration of President Donald Trump has mandated a reduction of SSA staff from approximately 57,000 to 50,000 employees, a cut of more than 12 percent. Many of these reductions are

expected through buyouts and early retirements, though layoffs are also anticipated.Additionally, the administration plans to close six of 10 regional offices and consolidate dozens of field offices, shifting more services online or to automated phone systems. Critics argue these moves will make it more difficult for people to get the assistance they need.

"These actions threaten the roughly 6.3 million Californians who receive critical Social Security benefits, more than any other state in the nation," said Senator Alex Padilla

Iran, US to hold second round of indirect talks in Rome: Official

Tehran, April 17 (UNI) : Rome will be the venue for the second round of indirect negotiations between Tehran and Washington, Iran's Deputy Foreign Minister Kazem Gharibabadi has said.

"Up to this point that we are speaking, we have received no new request from the other side for changing the location of the negotiations and Rome will be the venue for the second round," Gharibabadi said in a live televised interview on Wednesday.

The location of the talks was not a sensitive issue for the Iranian side. "We should concentrate on the main content and job," he said.

Regardless of the negotiations' venue, Oman will continue to facilitate and mediate them, the official added.

Iranian Foreign Minister Seyed Abbas Araghchi met with US special presidential envoy Steve Witkoff in Oman's capital Muscat on Saturday over Tehran's

nuclear program, with both sides describing the meeting as "constructive".

The talks in Muscat followed US President Donald Trump's statement in early March that he had sent a letter to Iranian leaders, delivered through the United Arab Emirates, proposing negotiations on Iran's nuclear programme. Iran later agreed on indirect talks.

Iran signed a nuclear deal in July 2015 with six major countries -- Britain, China, France, Germany, Russia and the United States. Under the deal, Tehran agreed to limit its nuclear activities in exchange for sanctions relief.However, Trump unilaterally pulled his country out of the deal in May 2018 during his first term and reimposed sanctions on Iran, prompting Tehran to scale back its commitments under the deal. Since then, efforts to revive the nuclear agreement have made little progress.

NKorean defense ministry threatens to raise 'level of danger' for US over provocations

Pyongyang, April 17 (UNI) : North Korea will respond to Washington's provocative deployment of strategic bombers over the Korean Peninsula by raising the "level of danger" to the United States, the state-run Korean Central News Agency (KCNA) reported on Thursday, citing the North Korean Defense Ministry.

On Tuesday, the Yonhap news agency reported, citing the South Korean Defense Ministry, that Washington and Seoul conducted a joint air force exercise over the Korean Peninsula, involving a US B-1B strategic bomber and F-35A and F-16 fighter jets from both countries.

A statement of the defense ministry's spokesperson, titled "The US reckless bluffing military demonstration is a futile act of increasing the security threat to its mainland only," criticized the participation of a US B-1B strategic bomber in the recent drill, calling it a blatant threat to Pyongyang's security and "a grave provocation that raises the military tension in the region to an extreme dangerous level." "The DPRK [North Korea] will exercise the overwhelming deterrence and continue to make the US recognize that its unannounced deployment of strategic means is a reckless and unnecessary abuse of strength, and get the US realize by itself that the higher the level of provocation against the DPRK is, the greater the level of danger returning to the US will be," the statement was quoted by the KCNA.

Similar exercises are conducted on a regular basis, which indicates that the US is practicing "tactics and procedures for attacking" North Korea, as well as "completing preparations for going into real action at any time," the spokesperson said, warning that such actions would have serious negative consequences for the US security as well.

Afghan police destroy 3 drug labs, discover over 1,100 kg illicit drugs

Kabul, April 17 (UNI) : Afghan security forces have smashed three clandestine drug processing labs and discovered over 1,100 kg of illicit drugs in western Afghanistan's Ghor province, the office of the Deputy Minister of Interior for Counter-Narcotics said in a statement on Thursday.

Units of counter-narcotic police launched separate operations on the outskirts of the Ahmadkhail district of Ghor province, destroying the three drug processing labs and discovering 1,119 kg of illicit drugs, the statement asserted.The statement added that the drugs were used in manufacturing heroin.Security personnel have arrested three people on charges of smuggling 20 kg of illegal drugs of the opium type in northern Badakhshan province, the ministry said in a separate statement.The Afghan interim government has stepped up its crackdown on illicit drugs and those involved in the business, vowing to fight the menace until the country is free from poppy cultivation and substances used in the manufacturing of heroin.

Iranian FM says to discuss US-Iranian talks with Russian side

Tehran, April 17 (UNI) : Iranian Foreign Minister Abbas Araghchi said on Thursday that he plans to discuss the US-Iranian talks on Tehran's nuclear program with the Russian side during his visit to Moscow."This visit has several purposes ... First, the trip was planned to deliver a written message from the Supreme Leader of Iran [Ali Khamenei] to Russian President [Vladimir Putin]. At the same time ... we will discuss the indirect talks that have taken place between Iran and the United States," Araghchi's office quoted him as saying.

Khamenei's message to Putin concerns developments in the world and the Middle East, the minister said earlier.

Over 5,500 Afghan refugees return from Pak, Iran in single day

Kabul, April 17 (UNI) : A total of 1,072 Afghan families comprising 5,671 people returned to their homeland from neighbouring Iran and Pakistan on Wednesday, Afghanistan's High Commission for Addressing Returnees Problems said in a statement Thursday.

According to the statement, the refugees returned home via the Torkham border crossing in eastern Nangarhar province, the Spin Boldak border crossing in southern Kandahar province, and the Islam Qala border point in western Herat province.

Reportedly, about seven million Afghan refugees, most of whom are undocumented migrants, are currently living abroad, with most living in Afghanistan's neighbouring Pakistan and Iran.

The Afghan interim government has been repeatedly calling upon Afghan refugees to end living abroad as refugees and return home to contribute to the rebuilding of their war-torn homeland.

China to allow full foreign ownership of e-commerce businesses

China will allow full foreign ownership of some e-commerce businesses, aiming to encourage foreign investment and the development and competitiveness of the industry, the ministry of Industry and Information Technology said.

The move, effective immediately, will apply to "online data handling and trade handling services", the ministry said in a statement on its website. It was not immediately clear how this would affect e-commerce



companies already operating in China.

China's e-commerce industry has been booming, with companies like Alibaba Group Holding Ltd and JD.com Inc benefitting from a rising middle class with more disposable income.

Other players include US online retailer Amazon.com Inc, Vipshop Holdings Ltd and US supermarket chain Wal Mart Stores Inc, through its stake in shopping site Yihaodian.

Allowing full foreign ownership "supports our country's e-commerce development, encourages and brings in the active participation of foreign investment, and further excites market competition," the ministry said.

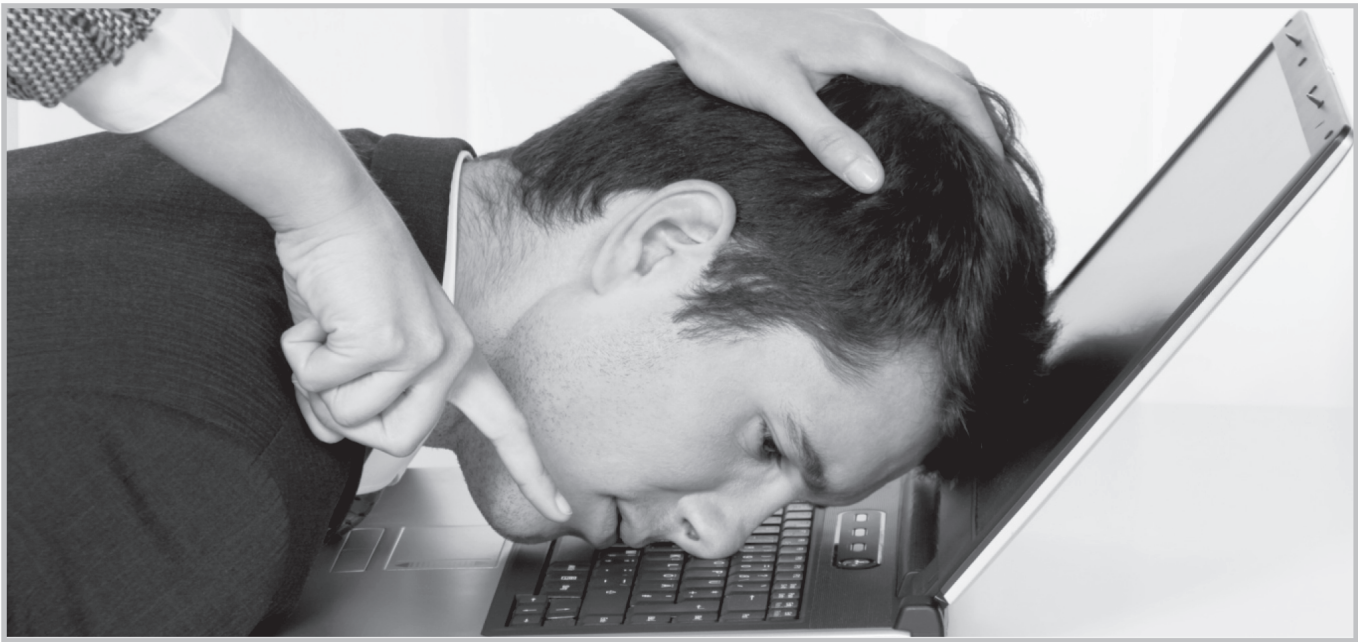
In recent years, the government has lent its support to the industry by keeping taxes low and loosening restrictions on cross-border trade, among other concessions.

E-commerce and the internet sector more broadly have been shining stars for Chinese industry.

Companies including Alibaba, social networking and online entertainment firm Tencent Holdings Ltd and search leader Baidu Inc account for hundreds of billions of dollars in stock market capitalization.

Their success comes as the world's second-largest economy grows at its slowest pace in three decades and Beijing looks to catalyze a shift away from a dependence on manufacturing and towards higher-value services.

MI survive late wobble to seal win over SRH

Mumbai, April 17 (UNI) : Mumbai Indians overcame late drama to notch their third win of IPL 2025, defeating Sunrisers Hyderabad by four wickets in a pulsating Match 33 at the Wankhede Stadium here on Thursday.

Chasing a target of 163, the hosts reached 166/6 in 18.1 overs, thanks to blistering cameos and a reverse-swept boundary from Tilak Varma to finish the job.

Having opted to bowl first, MI found themselves on the back foot early as SRH raced to 59 for no loss. Abhishek Sharma set the tone with a fluent 40 off 28 balls before Hardik Pandya broke the stand. From there, SRH’s momentum stuttered despite Travis Head’s gritty 28 and Nitish Reddy’s brief resistance. Will Jacks turned the screws in the middle overs with a double strike, dismissing Head and Ishan Kishan.

SRH were struggling at 113/4 until Heinrich Klaasen hammered 22 off one Deepak Chahar over, lifting them past 140. But it was the 26 runs off the final nine deliveries – including two sixes from Aniket Verma and one from skipper Pat Cummins – that gave SRH a competitive 162/5. Jasprit Bumrah (1/21) and Jacks (2/14) were the standouts with the ball.

In reply, Mumbai’s start was typically aggressive. Ryan Rickelton (31 off 23) set the early pace with four boundaries off Eshan Malinga in the sixth over, but fell soon after to Harshal Patel. Rohit Sharma looked in sublime touch, smoking three sixes – including a signature pull off Mohammad Shami – before falling to a mistimed drive straight to Head at cover.

Jacks (36 off 26) and Suryakumar Yadav (26 off 15) kept the innings on course with an exhibition of fearless strokeplay. SKY delighted the spectators with two sixes, including a slog sweep and a scoop, but perished attempting to finish the game early. Jacks too fell to Pat Cummins in a bid to accelerate.

The late chase took a dramatic turn when Hardik Pandya (21 off 9), after clubbing two fours and a six, holed out at deep midwicket off Malinga in the 18th over.

Naman Dhir followed two balls later in bizarre fashion – adjudged LBW, he reviewed the decision but was already walking back before the third umpire confirmed three reds, leaving spectators confused and booing. Even Mitchell Santner, sent in next, was briefly stopped from taking guard as the umpire awaited review confirmation.

Despite the chaos, Tilak Varma held his nerve. With one needed, he reverse-swept Zeeshan Ansari past short third for four, sealing victory with 11 balls to spare. He remained unbeaten on 21 off 17.

Cummins (3/26) was Hyderabad’s best bowler and nearly turned the tide single-handedly. Malinga also picked two wickets late but couldn’t prevent MI from registering their second consecutive win.

Wang beats Harimoto in comeback thriller

Macao, April 17 (UNI) : China’s Wang Manyu staged an incredible comeback to defeat Japan’s Miwa Harimoto 4-3 at the ITTF Men’s and Women’s World Cup Macao 2025 on Thursday, adding excitement to the first-day knockout stage.

World No. 2 Wang rallied from a 1-3 deficit, winning three consecutive sets to end the Macao World Cup journey of 16-year-old Harimoto.

In the deciding game, Wang saw her first match point saved, and after a tense 10-10 tie, won two straight points to clinch the victory. "My form is better than in the group stage after today’s match. I’ll give it my all for the matches ahead and fight for every point," Wang said in the mixed zone afterward. On the men’s side, world No. 2 Wang Chuqin won against Kanak Jha of the United States 4-1, going to face Germany’s Benedikt Duda, who came through a seven-game match. In the morning matches, world No. 1 Lin Shidong faced a tough battle against Swedish player Anton Kallberg, ultimately winning 4-3 after seven games (13-11, 11-5, 12-14, 9-11, 9-11, 11-7, 11-8). "At 8-all in the deciding game, I was focused on taking the initiative on my serve. In particular, at the 9-8 point, I had a lot of determination," Lin said. Defending women’s champion Sun Yingsha of China cruised to a dominant straight-game victory over Austria’s Sofia Polcanova, posting scores of 11-3, 11-4, 15-13, and 11-9.

No cuts to Afghanistan Cricket Board funding planned by ICC



Kabul, April 17 (UNI) : The Afghanistan Cricket Board will not see any of its funding from the International Cricket Council cut or diverted to its exiled women’s cricketers. An initiative to support the displaced Afghan players was announced by the ICC following its board meeting in Zimbabwe last weekend. However, as reported by ESPN Cricinfo, cricket’s

global governing body will not reduce or siphon off money earmarked for the ACB, even though part of the criteria for full membership of the ICC is to support women’s cricket, the BBC reported. The ICC will support the Afghan women through a separate funding mechanism, while the ACB will continue to receive a payment believed to be in the region of £13m per year. All of that funding

will go towards men’s cricket in Afghanistan, with women’s sport outlawed in the country since the Taliban returned to power in 2021. The ACB is the only full ICC member not to field a women’s team.

Instead, Afghanistan’s women’s cricketers will be funded by the ICC in conjunction with the England and Wales Cricket Board (ECB), Cricket Australia and the Board of

Control for Cricket in India (BCCI). An Afghanistan Women’s XI played an exhibition match in Melbourne in January and want to be recognised as a refugee team.

But the ICC is understood to have acknowledged that the prospect of Afghanistan’s women playing official international matches in the near future is a distant one as it would need to be sanctioned by the ACB.

Afghanistan’s women have been promised a robust high-performance programme offering "advanced coaching, world-class facilities and tailored mentorship" which the ICC hopes will "help them reach their full potential". Afghanistan’s men’s team have retained their Test status, reached the semi-finals of last year’s T20 World Cup and participated in the Champions Trophy earlier this year.

South Africa make change to squad

Cape Town, April 17 (UNI) : South Africa have made a late adjustment to their squad for the upcoming Women’s ODI tri-series in Sri Lanka, after batting all-rounder Anneke Bosch was ruled out due to illness. 31-year-old Bosch has been ruled out of the Proteas Women’s upcoming ODI tri-series against Sri Lanka and India, with top-order batter Lara Goodall set to take her spot in the squad. The change sees the batter brought in as cover ahead of the team’s departure to Colombo on April 22. Skipper Laura Wolvaardt will lead a blend of experience and uncapped talent, with the likes of Chloe Tryon, Ayabonga Khaka, Suné Luus, and Nonkululeko Mlaba forming the core of the squad.

Three players have also earned their first call-ups to the senior national team. Ministry of External Affairs spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal, answering questions on the issue, said at a briefing:

"How can anything foreign be in a jugular vein? This is a union territory of India. Its only relationship

with Pakistan is the vacation of illegally occupied territories by that country." His statement comes after the Pakistan army chief General Asim Munir described Kashmir as Pakistan's "jugular vein". Addressing the Pakistani diaspora at an event, Munir told them that they were the country's ambassadors and must not forget that they belong to a "superior ideology and culture". "You should definitely tell Pakistan's story to your children. Our

forefathers thought that we are different from the Hindus in every aspect of life. Our religions, our customs, traditions, thoughts and ambitions are different. That was the foundation of the two-nation theory that was laid," Munir said.

Speaking about Kashmir, Munir said, "Our stance is absolutely clear, it was our jugular vein, it will be our jugular vein, we will not forget it. We will not leave our Kashmiri brothers in their heroic struggle."

Yogi slams opposition over 'silence' on Murshidabad

Lucknow, April 17 (UNI) : Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath on Thursday severely criticised opposition parties over their “silence” on recent incidents in Murshidabad in West Bengal following violent protests against the Waqf Act and other communal incidents in Bangladesh.

While speaking at an event titled 'Uttar Pradesh: Towards a Glorious Century' at Indira Gandhi Pratishthan here, the CM said that the Opposition's “lack of response” has completely exposed their double standards.

He hit out at opposition for issues such as corruption, casteism and mafia rule during previous regimes. “The people who were

involved in scams and built hotels in London using public money are the ones who looted the state and divided people along caste lines,” he said.

"Those who built their political empires on corruption, casteism, mafia power and dynastic politics are now silent on incidents like Murshidabad," said the Chief Minister.

Highlighting the progress made under his leadership in UP, he said infrastructure development and the elimination of mafia rule were the thrust areas of the BJP rule. The state is much safer and more peaceful, he added.

The CM alluded to the years when he alleged mafias

controlled districts. “They took government contracts, caused riots and harassed women and businessmen. People were scared during festivals. Today, festivals in UP are celebrated peacefully and with grandeur,” Yogi said.

Speaking about healthcare, Yogi pointed out his government's successful fight against encephalitis in eastern UP.

"Over the past 40 years, the disease claimed the lives of nearly 50,000 children, mostly from minority communities, but no leader ever showed concern," he said.

"The opposition never cared about encephalitis because

children are not vote banks."

The CM noted the shift from 'one district, one mafia' to 'one district, one medical college', highlighting the state's improved health services.

He mentioned the Purvanchal Expressway project as an example of efficient governance. He said that the project was launched in 2016 without proper planning and was full of irregularities, but his government cancelled and redesigned it, completing the project for Rs 11,800 crore instead of the earlier Rs 15,200 crore.

Highlighting UP's rapid development, he said the state now has some of the best
