Four injured in fire at Mumbai bakery

Mumbai, April 28 (UNI) : Four people were injured after a fire broke out at a bakery in Byculla area of south Mumbai, officials said on Monday.

According to sources in Fire Brigade, the incident occurred at 5.30 pm at Super Bakery, located on Seth Motishah Lane in Byculla (East).

The fire was confined within the bakery premises and was brought under control and fully extinguished by 6.40 pm, they said.

Four people sustained burn injuries in the incident.

They were identified as Jayesh Parekh (46), Zuber Siddique (25), Jibrail Ahmed (23) and Shahariyar Reisi (36).

The injured were shifted to private Bhatia and Masina Hospitals for medical treatment, while their condition is reported to be stable, the officials added.

Scammer poses as Delhi Crime Branch officer, dupes Mumbai sr citizen of Rs 28 lakhs

Mumbai, April 28 (UNI) : A 77-year-old man was scammed out of Rs 28.7 lakh by a person posing as a Delhi crime branch officer, police said here on Monday.

According to a complaint lodged at the cyber cell of Thane police, the scammer claimed the complainant was implicated in a money laundering case and persuaded him to transfer funds for transaction verification.

The complainant, a Dombivli resident, received a WhatsApp call on April 6 from someone claiming to be a crime branch officer. The caller told him he was linked to a money laundering investigation involving a businessman and was a beneficiary in the case.

The scammer instructed the complainant to share his bank details and transferred Rs 28.7 lakh across multiple accounts between April 6 and 9. After discussing the incident with his daughter, the complainant realised he had been scammed and reported it to the police.

Govt. to lead country due to 'ecosystem' of development: CM

Mumbai, April 28 : Chief Minister Devendra Fadnis on Monday expressed confidence that Maharashtra will lead the country in terms of development due to ongoing large-scale infrastructure development works in the state including roads, railways, bullet trains, waterways as well as port and airport development works.

In an interview with a TV news channel on the sidelines of The India Middle East Europe Economic Corridor Summit - 2025 organised in a hotel here, the Chief Minister said that Maharashtra is a state that is always 'ready' for the

future. In this direction, the work of the Mumbai to Ahmedabad bullet train is going on at a fast pace.

It will be possible to travel by this train by 2028, he said and informed that a bullet train station will be built near Vadhan Port.

Vadhan Port is three times larger than existing Jawaharlal Nehru Port. This port will be connected to Nashik by an access-controlled highway and later connected to the Samruddhi Highway. It has been proposed to build a new international airport near Vadhan Port. Also, the fourth Mumbai will be built in this area. Similarly, a large-scale infrastructure development work is going

on in Mumbai city, which include the coastal road, Atal Setu, various metro line works are prominent examples of this.

He also expressed confidence that due to all these development works, investment in Mumbai will go up to 50 billion dollars.

The projects of Vadhan Port in Palghar district, Navi Mumbai International Airport will be game changers, he noted.

Along with this, the development of new airports in Pune, Shirdi, Nagpur airports, river linking projects, bullet train projects will play an important role. Fadnis also said that the water flowing into the sea from the Western Ghats will be diverted to Ujani dam and dry Marathwada. Therefore, Marathwada will definitely be drought-free in future.

After the Samruddhi Mahamarg, the Shaktipith Mahamarg from Nagpur to Goa will be built in the state.

The Chief Minister said that the state is taking a big leap in 'Ease of Doing Business' to provide facilities to investors and to bring in investment at a faster rate. Maharashtra will be first in 'Ease of Doing Business' in 2029, he added.

India inks deal with France for 26 Rafale-Marine aircraft for Indian Navy

New Delhi, April 28 (UNI) : The prowess of the Indian Navy is set to get a boost as it will be receiving 26 state-of-the-art Rafale fighter planes from France under an Inter-Governmental Agreement (IGA), amidst escalating tensions between India and Pakistan following the Pahalgam terror attack.

The IGA has been signed by Defence Minister Rajnath Singh and Minister of Armed Forces of France Sebastien Lecornu and copies of the agreement along with the pacts on aircraft package, supply protocol and weapons package supply protocol were exchanged by Indian and French officials in the presence of Defence Secretary Rajesh Kumar Singh, here on Monday.

The cost of the 26 Rafale Marine Aircraft (22 Single-Seater and four Twin-Seater) is estimated to be Rs 63,000 crore, although the price was not mentioned in the official statement issued by the Defence Ministry.

The statement said that the IGA includes training, simulator, associated equipment, weapons and performance-based logistics. It also includes additional equipment for the

existing Rafale fleet of the Indian Air Force (IAF).

In line with the government's thrust on 'Aatmanirbhar Bharat', the agreement includes transfer of technology for integration of indigenous weapons in India. It also includes setting up of production facility for Rafale fuselage as well as maintenance, repair and overhaul facilities for aircraft engine, sensors and weapons in India. The deal is expected to generate thousands of jobs and revenue for a large number of MSMEs in setting up, production and running of these facilities. Manufactured by France's Dassault Aviation, the Rafale-Marine is a carrier-borne combat-ready aircraft with proven operational capabilities in maritime environment. The delivery of these aircraft would be completed by 2030, with the crew undergoing training in France and India. Rafale-Marine has commonality with the Rafale being operated by IAF. Its procurement will substantially enhance joint operational capability, besides optimising training and logistics for the aircraft for both Indian Navy and IAF.

Aaditya Thackeray slams proposed Mumbai BEST bus fare hike

Mumbai, April 28 (UNI) : Shiv Sena (UBT) youth president, Aaditya Thackeray, on Monday strongly criticised the Maharashtra government for its proposal to increase fares for the Brihanmumbai Electric Supply and Transport (BEST) bus services. In a post shared on social media platform, he accused the ruling alliance of neglecting crucial transportation service, which serves millions of daily commuters in Mumbai. Aaditya Thackeray highlighted alarming reduction in the size of the BEST bus fleet, pointing out that key routes have been discontinued and the number of buses operating across the city has sharply declined. As a result, many commuters are struggling to find affordable and dependable transportation options, he added. It may be recalled that recently, the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation has approved the proposal for a fare hike, which is awaiting a final nod from the competent authority of the state government.

Cong leaders' statements not party's stance, says Jairam

New Delhi, April 28 (UNI) : The Congress on Monday said that the statements made by some of its leaders regarding the Pahalgam terror attack were their personal views and do not represent the party's official stance.

On his social media handle X, party spokesperson Jairam Ramesh said that only views of Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge, Leader of Opposition in the Lok Sabha Rahul Gandhi and authorised AICC office-bearers "alone represent the position of the INC".

He said, "The Congress Working Committee had met on April 24, 2025 and passed a resolution on the brutal terror attack on tourists in Pahalgam two days earlier".

"Thereafter on the evening of April 24 2025, the Congress President and the Leader of the Opposition in the Lok Sabha attended the all-party meeting and put forward the party's views," Ramesh said.

Jairam said, "Some Congress leaders have been speaking to the media. They speak for themselves and do not reflect the INC's views.

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J&K Assembly unanimously passes resolution condemning Pahalgam attack

Jammu, April 28 (UNI) : Jammu and Kashmir Legislative Assembly on Monday passed a resolution condemning the recent heinous terrorist attack at Baisaran in Pahalgam.

The resolution, moved by Deputy Chief Minister Surinder Kumar Choudhary, was put to voice vote by Speaker, Abdul Rahim Rather and subsequently passed unanimously.

The resolution read, “This House unequivocally condemns the heinous, cowardly act that resulted in the loss of innocent lives. Such acts of terror are a direct assault on the ethos of Kashmiriyat, the values enshrined in our Constitution and the spirit of unity, peace and harmony that have long characterized Jammu and Kashmir and our Nation.

"This House stands in full solidarity with the victims and their families. We extend our deepest condolences to those who have suffered irreparable loss and affirm our collective resolve to share in their grief and support them in their hour of need.

"This House salutes the supreme sacrifice of

Shaheed Syed Adil Hussain Shah, who, while bravely attempting to save the tourists, laid down his life. His courage and selflessness embody the true spirit of Kashmir and shall serve as an enduring inspiration for future generations.

"This House commends the people of Jammu & Kashmir for their extraordinary display of unity, compassion and resilience in the aftermath of the attack. The peaceful demonstrations across the towns and villages and the spontaneous outpouring of moral and material support towards the tourists, reaffirm the people’s steadfast commitment to peace, communal harmony and the rule of law.

"This House endorses the diplomatic measures announced by the Union Government on April 23, 2025, after the meeting of the Cabinet Committee on Security." "This House is mindful of the sinister designs behind the selective targeting of the victims of this attack. It appeals to all the sections of the society and in particular the media to not fall victim to this sinister plot by irresponsibly

inflaming passions. The need to remain united in the face of this attempted division cannot be overemphasized.

"This House earnestly appeals to the Governments of all the States and Union Territories of India to ensure the safety, dignity and well-being of Kashmiri students and citizens residing or traveling outside Jammu & Kashmir, taking necessary measures to prevent any incident of harassment, discrimination or intimidation." "This House calls upon all the political parties, religious and community leaders, youth organizations, civil society groups and media houses across the nation to maintain calm, reject violence and divisive rhetoric and work collectively to uphold peace, unity and constitutional values."

The resolution further read, “The Legislative Assembly of Jammu & Kashmir reaffirms its unwavering commitment to foster an environment of peace, development and inclusive prosperity for all its citizens and resolutely defeat the nefarious designs of those who seek to disturb the communal

harmony and progress of the nation and of Jammu and Kashmir.”

Speaking on the resolution, Leader of Opposition Sunil Sharma, while paying homage to the victims of Pahalgam attack, said that J&K is a paradise on earth, where people come to spend joyful moments of their life.

He said that entire humanity has been shattered by this inhuman act and the whole country is in grief and shock.

Sharma said that a united voice in this difficult time is necessary to make these nefarious designs of terrorists unsuccessful.

He further said that no words can compensate for the loss of victim families of this horrible tragedy, but the House wants to convey to the nation that people of Jammu and Kashmir are badly hurt by this inhuman incident and share their sympathies with all the victim families from across the country.

He also said that J&K people have given befitting reply to the terrorists by exhibiting brotherhood and unity while condemning this heinous act.

The Deputy Chief Minister said that J&K

people are short of words to denounce this cowardly act.

He added that Kashmiris are known for hospitality and communal harmony across the country and globe.

Ghulam Ahmad Mir, while condemning the attack, said that people from every walk of life and every corner of J&K showed that these kinds of acts are despicable.

He added that "we need to remain united in this difficult time and send a strong message across the world that we will not let these nefarious designs of terrorists succeed."

Sajad Gani Lone said that people from every area and section condemned this cowardly and brutal act. He added that acceptance of this kind of violence has been completely negated by the people of Kashmir valley. Mohammad Yousuf Tarigami said such a heinous act cannot be explained in words noting that terrorists have no religion.

Delhi court extends Tahawwur Rana's NIA custody by 12 days

New Delhi, April 28 (UNI) : A Delhi court on Monday extended 26/11 Mumbai attacks accused, Tahawwur Rana's National Investigation Agency (NIA) custody by 12 days.

Rana was recently extradited from the United States. NIA Special Judge, Chanderjit Singh, after hearing the plea on behalf of NIA through in-camera proceedings, passed an order, giving the central probe agency Rana's custody for 12 more days.

Rana, a Pakistani-born Canadian National, was brought before the Special Court after completion of his 18-day NIA custody.

The court had earlier dismissed Rana's application seeking permission to talk to his family members. Rana is one of the accused in the November 26, 2008, Mumbai terror attacks chargesheeted by the NIA in 2011 and by the Mumbai Police in 2023. NIA chargesheeted Rana for a larger conspiracy beyond 26/11 Mumbai attacks, whereas Mumbai Police chargesheeted him for his role in the 26/11 terror strike

Akhilesh lacked will to work, power to decide: Aseem Arun

Lucknow, April 28 (UNI) : Uttar Pradesh's Minister of State for Social Welfare (Independent Charge) Aseem Arun on Monday said that the Yogi government's development model embodies 'Sabka Saath, Sabka Vikas'.

In a statement issued here, Arun described Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath's bulldozer as a symbol of both strength and strict governance, enabling rapid infrastructure growth while cracking down on illegal encroachments.

He said that the CM takes decisive, well-thought-out actions, unlike Samajwadi Party (SP) chief Akhilesh Yadav, whom he accused of lacking both the will and strength to govern effectively. He said that the government is working for all religions and castes without favouring any particular community.

Launching a scathing attack on Akhilesh, the Minister highlighted the atrocities faced by deprived sections during his tenure and praised the Yogi government's focus on development and youth welfare. He said Akhilesh's narrow mindset and discriminatory policies led to his ouster by the public.

Recalling the SP chief's tenure between 2012 to 2017, he said atrocities against Scheduled Castes and Backward Classes under the SP government are still fresh in public memory. He accused Akhilesh of insulting Baba Saheb Bhimrao Ambedkar by changing the name of a medical college in Kannauj and rejecting a statue of

Lord Buddha.

Arun also alleged that Akhilesh disrespected Mahamaya by defacing a district named after her. He demanded that Akhilesh explain his intentions to the public and apologise.

He said Akhilesh is now trying to mislead the SC and the poor, but the public will not be deceived. He also pointed out that Akhilesh had halted scholarships for SC children, which the Yogi government later restored.

The Minister pointed out that the unemployment rate, which stood at 13–14 percent during the SP regime, has dropped to 3 percent under the Yogi government. He said the government not only provided government jobs but also promoted youth entrepreneurship through interest-free loans under programs like 'CM Yuva'.

H i g h l i g h t i n g transparency in police recruitment, he said that during Akhilesh's tenure, corruption marred recruitment, citing the example where 56 out of 86 UPPCS candidates came from a single caste. In contrast, he said, recruitment under the Yogi government are fair and transparent, with the recent PCS J exam completed in a record eight months. Arun said that under the leadership of Prime Minister Modi and CM Yogi, UP is on the path of rapid development, working for all sections of society without vote-bank considerations. He asserted that UP will play a key role in making India the world's third-largest economy.

More than 50 taken ill after consuming stale food in Mahoba

Mahoba (UP), April 28 (UNI) : More than 50 people were taken ill after consuming stale food at a wedding ceremony in the Mahobakanth area of Mahoba district here in Uttar Pradesh on Monday, a police officer said here. Deputy Superintendent of Police (DSP) Harshita Gangwar said that there was a marriage function in the Satura village in Sandeep's family.

"Apart from his relatives, people from the village were also invited. It is being said that after the ceremony, the invitees suddenly started complaining of vomiting and diarrhoea," she said.

She said that the villagers were informed about the matter through the police dialling 112. "A team of the Health Department, along with doctors led by administrative officials, reached the spot and started treating the victims," she said. The DSP said that more than 50 people, including small children and women, have fallen ill in the incident. "They are being treated properly by a team of doctors. A team of doctors has also been called from Mahoba headquarters," she said. Kulpahad's Sub Divisional Magistrate Anurag Prasad is present at the spot and is constantly monitoring the situation. The doctors have said that the condition of all the victims is out of danger.

Woman killed for dowry in Pilibhit

Pilibhit (UP), April 28 (UNI) : A woman was murdered allegedly for failing the dowry demand of her in-laws in Barkheda area of Pilibhit district here in Uttar Pradesh on Monday, police sources said here.

Police sources said that Deepmala, a resident of Bahadurpur village under Barkheda police station area, was married to Munendra, a resident of Chathiya village, in November 2023. "Deepmala's family has alleged that dowry was given as per the capacity in the marriage. Despite this, the in-laws used to harass Deepmala continuously when the additional demand of gold chain and car was not met," they said.

Police sources said that the family alleged that the in-laws first poisoned Deepmala and hanged her. "When her condition deteriorated, she was admitted to a private hospital in the city where she died during treatment," they said.

SC slams Centre over delay in cashless treatment scheme for road accident victims

New Delhi, April 28 (UNI) : The Supreme Court on Monday came down heavily on the Centre for the delay in implementing a cashless treatment scheme for motor accident victims, questioning the government's seriousness towards the welfare of the common man.

"You are constructing huge highways, but people are dying there because of lack of facilities," the Court observed.

A bench, comprising Justices Abhay S Oka and Ujjal Bhuyan, expressed displeasure that despite its January eight order, the Centre had neither complied with the directive nor sought an extension of time.

The Court noted that although Section 164A of the Motor Vehicles Act, which mandates interim relief to accident victims, came into force on April one, 2022, the government had not yet framed the necessary scheme.

"You are in contempt. You have not bothered to seek extension of time. What is this going on? You tell us when will you frame the scheme? You don't care for your own statutes. This is one of the welfare provisions. Three years have passed since this provision came into place. Are you really working for the welfare of the common man?" the bench asked sharply.

Questioning the Ministry of Road Transport further, the Court remarked, "Can you be so casual? Are you not serious about this provision? People are dying in road accidents. You are constructing huge highways, but there is no

facility for timely treatment. There is no scheme for golden hour treatment. What is the use of constructing so many highways?"

The golden hour, as defined under Section 2(12-A) of the Motor Vehicles Act, 1988, refers to the critical one-hour period following a traumatic injury when timely medical intervention can save lives.

Summoning the Secretary of the Ministry of Road Transport, the Court sought an explanation for the delay. The Secretary informed the bench that although a draft scheme was prepared, progress was stalled due to objections raised by the General Insurance Council (GIC), which insisted on verifying insurance policy details before proceeding with treatment.

Recording the Centre's submission, the Court noted that the scheme would be notified within a week and directed that it be placed on record by May nine. The matter has been posted for further hearing on May 13.

Earlier, on January eight, the Apex Court had directed the Centre to formulate a scheme to provide cashless medical treatment to motor accident victims during the golden hour period.

Referring to Section 162(2) of the Motor Vehicles Act, the Court had emphasized that delays caused by financial or procedural hurdles often cost precious lives and that the Centre had a statutory obligation to frame the scheme to protect the Right to Life under Article 21 of the Constitution.

Sultanpur, April 28 (UNI) : Two persons, including a to-be bride, were killed and two others injured when the balcony of door of a house collapsed in Atrauli area of Hardoi district in Uttar Pradesh on Monday.

Police sources here said that Parshuram, a resident of Singhpur village under Atrauli police station area, was to get his daughter Anjani (30) married on April 30.

"On Monday morning when Anjani, Geeta Devi, her son Subhash, along with their relative Sapna were discussing preparation near the door of their house at 9 am," they said. The sources said that during this, the balcony of the door collapsed suddenly and all four were buried under the debris. "Hearing the noise, the people of the area rushed to the spot and removed the debris and taken everyone out.

Anti-Child Marriage Squads on Alert mode in CS district

Chhatrapati Sambhajanagar, April 28 (UNI) : Chhatrapati Sambhajanagar district administration has alerted government agencies at the district, taluka and village levels to prevent child marriages on the auspicious occasion of Akshaya Tritiya on April 30, a top official said on Monday. Collector and magistrate Dileep Swami said many marriages take place on this auspicious day. The possibility of child marriage cannot be ruled out. For this, he has ordered the government

agencies at the district, taluka and village levels to be alert. In an official press release, the collector said considering the prevalence of child marriage in Chhatrapati Sambhajanagar district, a District Action Team has been formed to eliminate the practice. The action team has prepared an action plan, and work to prevent child marriage is underway in the district on a large scale in coordination with all the departments concerned. A total of 88 child

marriages have been stopped by this action team from April 1, 2024 till date. Four cases have been registered. As per the directions of the National Commission for Protection of Child Rights, New Delhi, various awareness campaigns are being conducted in the district to create awareness among the general public about the Child Marriage Prohibition Act, 2006 and to ensure that children are not deprived of their rights at a young age. According to the Child

Marriage Prohibition Act, 2006, if a girl is married when she is under 18 years of age and the boy is under 21 years of age, such a marriage is considered a child marriage. If such a marriage is done, the organizer is liable to a fine of one lakh rupees and imprisonment for up to two years, or both. If any child marriage is taking place or is about to take place anywhere in the district, citizens should call the Child Help Line 1098 and 112 to report such information, the release added.

Gorhe takes serious note of alleged atrocities on minor girls in Sangli ashram school

Pune, April 28 (UNI) : Deputy Chair of Maharashtra Legislative Council, Dr Neelam Gorhe, has taken a serious note of shocking incident of alleged atrocities on minor girls in an ashram school being run by the Social Welfare Department in Sangli district. On Monday, she submitted a detailed

information to the Chief Secretary of the state, Director General of Police, Social Welfare Commissioner and Superintendent of Police of Sangli district, demanding immediate strict action against the culprits. She said that a case came to light on April 26, in which the school principal is facing serious allegations

of atrocities on minor girls. Dr Gorhe has demanded strict action against the principal and implementation of speedy justice process. She has asked for immediate suspension of the employees, who helped or participated in the incident. Additionally, she has also directed to file separate cases and take strict action

against those who tried to suppress the incident. She said that the need to constitute a special advisory committee for counselling, legal aid and rehabilitation of the victim students and to take measures for security in all ashram schools and submit its report. Dr Gorhe suggested that regular inquiry and monitoring campaigns should be conducted for the safety of the girl students.

Fadnavis clarifies on fire at ED office in Mumbai

Mumbai, April 28 (UNI) : A day after incident of fire was reported in Enforcement Directorate (ED) office in city, Maharashtra Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis said on Monday that all papers and documents kept in that office are safe. He clarified that even though fire broke out in ED office, all the documents there are safe. Fadnavis said, "I spoke to ED officials in Mumbai and they told me that every paper in the office is safe." "There is also mirror imaging storage of those documents. No paper in the office has been damaged due to this fire," he added.

Written exam of Maharashtra Health University from May 3

Nashik, April 28 (UNI) : The written examination of Maharashtra University of Health Sciences for the fifth phase of the winter session-2024 and the first phase of the summer session-2025 will be conducted from May 3-17. There will be 46 examination centres across the state of Maharashtra. The examinations of degree and postgraduate courses will be conducted for Third MBBS (I), Third MBBS (II), (OLD/CBME-2019) of the degree course as well as Ayurveda, Unani, Homeopathy postgraduate courses. A total of approximately 2,722 students will be admitted from all over Maharashtra. The question paper will be sent online. Examination Controller Dr. Sandeep Kadu clarified that after the examination is over, the answer sheets will be scanned at the respective examination centres on the same day and evaluated online at the central assessment centres.

Father dies of heart attack while celebrating daughter's UPSC success

Mumbai, April 28 (UNI) : A retired extension officer of a local Panchayat Samiti in Maharashtra died of a heart attack while celebrating his daughter's success in the prestigious UPSC (Union Public Service Commission) examination at Vagad (Ijara) in Mahagaon taluka of Yavatmal district, the family sources of the officer said here on Monday. According to details, as officer Prahlad Khandare's daughter, Mohini, had obtained an impressive rank in UPSC results, the family, along with neighbours, relatives and well-wishers, were gathered at their house to mark this proud moment. During celebration, Khandare was visibly emotional and overjoyed at his daughter's success, which had fulfilled a long-cherished dream of the family. As the celebrations were underway, he suddenly collapsed. Family members, relatives and neighbours rushed him to a nearby medical facility, but he was declared dead on arrival.


MPCC chief demands probe in MHT-CET exam irregularities

Mumbai, April 28 (UNI) : Raising issue of alleged irregularities in the state-level common entrance test (MHT-CET) conducted by the State Common Entrance Test Cell on April 27 (Sunday), Maharashtra Pradesh Congress Committee president, Harshvardhan Sapkal, on Monday demanded that the government should carry out investigation in the said irregularities. In a letter to Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis, he said that irregularities during the examination have caused concern among students and parents alike. Students have complained that at the exam centre in Ahilyanagar district, 20 to 25 questions in the 50-mark Mathematics paper had incorrect answer options, he said and pointed that in some cases, all four given options were

wrong. When students complained about this at the exam centre, their grievances were ignored. Similar complaints have been reported from other examination centres across the state while at some centres there were server outages, but satisfactory responses were not provided by the examination authorities, he mentioned. This examination being crucial for engineering admissions, Sapkal said that the state government must take this issue seriously and take strict action against those responsible and demanded that students be awarded marks for these erroneous questions. Institutions that cannot properly prepare papers or organise examinations should never be entrusted with such tasks again and should be blacklisted, he added.

Govt to establish Tourism Security Force

Mumbai, Apr 28 (UNI) : Following the terror attack on tourists in Pahalgam of Jammu & Kashmir, the state government on Monday announced to establish a 'Maharashtra Tourism Security Force (Tourism Mitra)', which will be tasked with the safety of tourists visiting the state. State Tourism Minister Shambhuraj Desai said, "This force will be deployed for the safety of tourists. The personnel will undergo special training so that they can guide and protect tourists." He also said that the Tourism Security Force will be launched on a pilot basis during the Mahabaleshwar Festival in Satara to be held from May one to four. "A large number of tourists from across India and foreign countries come to Maharashtra to visit various destinations, hence, security of the tourists is our priority," he added.

India reduced poverty levels with targeted welfare schemes, economic reforms

India has made substantial strides in reducing poverty levels with targeted welfare schemes, and economic reforms, according to the latest report by the World Bank.

In its Spring 2025 Poverty and Equity Brief, the World Bank acknowledged India's decisive fight against poverty. According to the report, India has lifted 171 million people out of extreme poverty.

“This achievement is a testament to the Government of India’s commitment to inclusive development, focusing on both rural and urban areas. Through targeted welfare schemes, economic reforms, and increased access to essential services, India has made substantial strides in reducing poverty levels,” the report said.

It noted a sharp reduction in extreme poverty in both rural and urban areas in the country.

While extreme poverty fell from 18.4 per cent in 2011-12 to 2.8 per cent in 2022-23 in rural areas, urban centres saw a reduction of extreme poverty from 10.7 per cent to 1.1 per cent over the same period.

The gap between rural and urban poverty shrunk from 7.7 percentage points to 1.7 percentage points, with an annual decline rate of 16 per cent between 2011-12 and 2022-23.

Notably, India also made strong gains in reducing poverty at the lower-middle-income level.

Rural poverty declined from 69 per cent to 32.5 per cent, while urban poverty dropped from 43.5 per cent to 17.2 per cent.

The rural-urban poverty gap narrowed from 25 to 15 percentage points, with a 7 per cent annual decline between 2011-12 and 2022-23.

The report also noted the role of the five most populous states -- Uttar Pradesh, Maharashtra, Bihar, West Bengal, and Madhya Pradesh -- in reducing extreme poverty.

In 2011-12, these states represented 65 per cent of India’s extreme poor. By 2022-23, these contributed to two-thirds of the overall decline in extreme poverty.

In addition, the report stated a rise in employment, especially among women, and a reduction in multidimensional poverty, pointing to broader improvements in living standards.

The Poverty and Equity Briefs from the World Bank highlight trends in poverty, shared prosperity, and inequality for over 100 developing countries.

Published twice a year for the Spring and Annual Meetings of the World Bank Group and the International Monetary Fund, these briefs offer a snapshot of a country’s poverty and inequality context, ensuring poverty reduction remains a global priority.

Advancements in Endoscopic Microsurgery and CyberKnife Radiosurgery for Brain Tumors

SC backs Allahabad HC's order in Shahi Idgah-Krishna Janmabhoomi case

New Delhi, April 28 (UNI) : The Supreme Court on Monday observed that the Allahabad High Court’s order allowing the Hindu side to amend their plaint and add the Archaeological Survey of India (ASI) as a party in the Shahi Idgah-Krishna Janmabhoomi dispute is prima facie correct. A Bench comprising Chief Justice of India (CJI) Sanjiv Khanna and Justice PV Sanjay Kumar made the remarks while hearing the appeal filed by the Muslim side challenging the High Court’s decision.

"One thing is clear. The amendment to the original plaint by the Hindu plaintiffs has to be allowed," the Bench remarked during the proceedings.

The Hindu parties had approached the High Court seeking to amend their original suit by claiming that the disputed structure was a protected monument under the ASI and, therefore, the protection under the Places of Worship (Special Provisions) Act, 1991 would not apply.

Consequently, they argued, the structure cannot continue as a mosque. They also sought to make ASI a party to the suit, which the High Court permitted in March 2024. The Muslim side then approached the Supreme Court against this order. Earlier, on April 4, the apex court had issued notice to the Hindu side on this appeal.

When the matter was taken up for hearing today, the Court observed that the Muslim side’s plea appeared "misconceived," with the Bench remarking, "This plea is absolutely wrong. The High Court should have allowed the amendment to add the parties to the suit."

The Court, however, granted time to the Muslim side to file their written statement and deferred further hearing.

In their plea before the High Court, the Hindu side asserted that a 1920 notification issued by the Lieutenant Governor of the United Province had declared the structure a protected monument under Section 3 of the Ancient Monument Preservation Act.

They argued that because of this historical status, the Places of Worship Act, 1991, which protects the status of religious places as they existed on August 15, 1947, would not apply. The Muslim side opposed the amendments, arguing that the Hindu plaintiffs were attempting to "wriggle out" of the bar imposed by the Places of Worship Act by introducing new claims. "The proposed amendments show that the Plaintiffs are attempting to negate the defence taken by the defendant that the suit is barred by the Places of Worship Act, 1991," they argued.

The Allahabad High Court on March 5 allowed the amendment and the addition of ASI as a party, prompting the appeal before the Supreme Court. The original dispute traces back to a civil suit filed by the Hindu side claiming that the Shahi Idgah mosque was constructed on the Krishna Janmabhoomi land. The suit was filed on behalf of the deity Bhagwan Shri Krishna Virajman and some Hindu devotees seeking removal of the mosque.

Housewife’s Death Gives new Life to Three Individuals

In an inspiring act of humanity, the family of a housewife, who passed away unexpectedly, donated her organs, giving new life to three individuals. Their courageous decision, made in the face of immense personal grief, has become a beacon of hope for many.

Kattike Narsibai (55), a resident of Bonkuru village in Gadwal district, Telangana, suffered a sudden and severe headache on April 25 and collapsed at home. She was rushed to a nearby hospital, where she fell into a coma. For advanced treatment, she was later shifted to KIMS Hospital in Kurnool.

After conducting thorough examinations, doctors at KIMS diagnosed a critical hemorrhage on the right side of her brain. Despite their relentless efforts to save her, she was declared brain dead on Saturday.

Following this, Dr. Rambabu and his team from AP Jeevandan, along with organ donation coordinators at KIMS Hospital, sensitized Narsibai’s family members about the significance of organ donation. With the wholehearted consent of her husband, son, and



other family members, her liver and both kidneys were donated, offering a second chance at life to three critically ill patients. Speaking on the occasion, her husband and son expressed pride in their decision. "Even though we have lost the pillar of our family, it brings us comfort and pride that she continues to live on through others," they said emotionally.

The donated organs were swiftly transported to the recipients through a specially arranged Green Channel, with the cooperation of AP Jeevandan, Dr. Rambabu’s team, and the Kurnool district police department. AP Jeevandan committee members appreciated the family’s noble gesture, emphasizing that such acts of compassion have the power to transform lives and inspire communities.

Russia allocates \$2mIn to UN Refugee Agency : Diplomat

United Nations, April 28 (UNI) : Russia contributed \$2 million to the UN Refugee Agency (UNHCR) last week, Russian Deputy Ambassador to the United Nations Maria Zabolotskaya said on Monday.

"Last week, Russia managed to allocate \$2 million to support the activities of UNHCR," Zabolotskaya said during a UN Security Council meeting on refugees.

Zabolotskaya also recalled that approximately 5 million Ukrainians have left for Russia after Ukraine started shelling Donbas residential areas. The diplomat also called for accountability for migrants deaths in the Mediterranean Sea, which she said has turned into a "mass grave."

The UNHCR was established in 1950 by the UN General Assembly to help people worldwide who lost their homes after World War II. It provides assistance to rebuild refugees' lives and is a strong advocate for rights protections.

31 civilians killed by paramilitary forces in Sudan's Omdurman: Volunteer groups

Khartoum, April 28 (UNI) : At least 31 civilians were killed by the paramilitary Rapid Support Forces (RSF) in Omdurman, north of the Sudanese capital Khartoum, volunteer groups reported on Sunday.

"An RSF force carried out a horrific massacre, executing 31 people from the Al-Salha area, including underage children, in the deadliest documented mass killing the area has ever witnessed," the Sudanese Doctors Network, a volunteer group, said in a statement.

"We consider this mass execution a war crime and a crime against humanity. We call on the international community to act urgently to save the remaining civilians and to open safe corridors to allow them to leave Al-Salha, which is home to thousands of unarmed civilians," it added.

Meanwhile, the Central Resistance Committees of Al-Salha, another volunteer group, also reported the killing, saying that the militia abducted unarmed civilians from the area and executed them.

"Available data suggests that the number of civilians killed exceeds 30," the group noted.

The Emergency Lawyers Initiative, a third volunteer group, also condemned the killing, calling it "a brutal crime and a grave violation of all international conventions, amounting to war crimes and crimes against humanity."

Videos shared by soldiers wearing RSF uniforms showed detainees sitting on the ground before being shot. In the footage, one soldier was heard saying, "We will leave no prisoners anymore."

The RSF currently controls the Al-Salha area, situated in southern Omdurman, which has seen frequent clashes between the Sudanese Armed Forces (SAF) and the RSF. The RSF has not yet responded to the allegations.

Sudan has been mired in conflict between the SAF and RSF since mid-April 2023, a war that has resulted in tens of thousands of deaths, with the exact toll unknown.

The International Organisation for Migration estimates that the conflict has displaced over 15 million people, both within Sudan and abroad.

2 terrorists killed in SW Pakistan security operation

Islamabad, April 28 (UNI) : Two terrorists were killed during a security operation in Pakistan's southwest Balochistan province, the Counter-Terrorism Department (CTD) said on Monday.

The operation was conducted in Derakshan area of the provincial capital Quetta, a CTD official told Xinhua. An exchange of gunfire took place during the operation, in which one terrorist was shot dead by security forces, while the other detonated an explosive device, killing himself, the official said.

Following the encounter, CTD personnel recovered a suicide vest and a large cache of weapons from the scene.

The official said the terrorists were planning major attacks in the province, but swift and timely action by CTD forces foiled their plot.

Bessent says US may clinch first trade deal with India

Washington, April 28 (UNI) : One of the first US trade agreements may be with India, Treasury Secretary Scott Bessent said on Monday.

"I would guess that India would be one of the first trade deals we would sign," Bessent told CNBC.

He recalled that US Vice President JD Vance visited India last week and talked about substantial progress in the talks.

Bessent also pointed out that the US has very good negotiations with other partners in Asia.

"I have mentioned that the negotiations with the Republic of Korea have gone very well, and I think we've had some very substantial negotiations with our Japanese allies," he added.

Vance said on Tuesday that the US and India had finalized the terms of reference for the trade negotiations, adding that very good progress had been made during his talks with Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

Vance also said that in February, US President Donald Trump and Modi announced plans to more than double bilateral trade to \$500 billion by the end of the decade.

Philippines raises alert on volcano southeast of Manila

Manila, April 28 (UNI) : Philippine authorities on Monday raised the alert level for Mount Bulusan after the volcano in Sorsogon province, southeast of Manila, spewed a dark plume 4.5 km into the sky.

The Philippine Institute of Volcanology and Seismology raised the alert level from zero to one on a scale of five, or from normal to low-level unrest, after a phreatic eruption occurred at 4:36 a.m. local time, which lasted 24 minutes.

"The event produced a bent plume that rose 4.5 km above the crater before drifting west to southwest," the institute said in an advisory, adding that ashes blanketed villages around the volcano.

The institute said the volcano produced "rumbling sounds" approximately 15 minutes before the eruption.

The institute warned of "chances of phreatic eruptions," urging villagers to be vigilant and prohibiting them from entering the 4 km danger zone of the volcano.

The institute also advised pilots and civil aviation authorities to avoid flying close to the volcano's summit.

There are 24 active volcanoes in the Philippines. Aside from Mount Bulusan, Mount Mayon in Albay province and Taal volcano near Manila are on alert level 1, while Mount Kanlaon is on alert level 3, or magmatic unrest, meaning there's an increased chance of a hazardous eruption, including explosive activity, lava flows, and pyroclastic density currents. Located in the Pacific "Ring of Fire" region, the Philippines is prone to volcanic eruptions, earthquakes, and powerful typhoons.

Boat crash in U.S. Florida leaves 1 dead, 12 injured

New York, April 28 (UNI) : A private boat crashed into a ferry in the U.S. state of Florida on Sunday night, leaving one dead and 12 others injured.

The Clearwater Police Department confirmed the death of one person from the ferry, which had more than 40 people on board at the time of the collision.

"All of the injuries are from the ferry. The boat that struck the ferry fled the scene," said local police in a social media post.

The ferry came to rest on a sandbar just south of the Memorial Causeway bridge, and all patients and passengers have been evacuated, according to the post. The local fire department declared it a mass casualty incident due to the number of injuries, prompting multiple trauma alerts and the airlifting of two seriously injured individuals by helicopter.

The U.S. Coast Guard and Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission will handle the crash investigation, said the Clearwater Police Department.

43 Palestinians killed in Israeli attacks across Gaza: Civil Defence

Gaza, April 28 (UNI) : At least 43 Palestinians were killed in Israeli attacks across the Gaza Strip, the enclave's Civil Defence said on Sunday.

Civil Defence spokesperson Mahmoud Basal told Xinhua that eight people, including three children and a woman, were killed when Israeli aircraft struck a tent housing displaced persons near Hamad City, northwest of Khan Younis, in the southern Gaza Strip.

In another attack, an Israeli airstrike killed five Palestinians and wounded several others, some seriously, in Deir-al-Balah in central Gaza, Basal added.

He also reported that six people were killed and 20 others injured in an Israeli airstrike on a cafe near the entrance to the Nuseirat and Bureij refugee camps in



the central Gaza Strip.

Basal said that at least four children were killed in an Israeli drone attack on a gathering of children in the town of al-Zawayda in the central Gaza Strip.

Eight people, including three children, were killed when Israeli aircraft targeted a gathering of Palestinians in the Tuffah

neighborhood, northeast of Gaza City.

At least 12 Palestinians were killed in Israeli air and artillery attacks on several homes in the Shuja'iyya, al-Zeitoun, and al-Tuffah neighborhoods, east of Gaza City, according to Basal.

The Israeli army has not commented on these

incidents yet. Since Israel resumed its military campaign in Gaza on March 18, at least 2,151 Palestinians have been killed and 5,598 others injured, bringing the overall death toll in Gaza since the war began in October 2023 to 52,243, with 117,639 people injured, according to health authorities in Gaza on Sunday.

Death toll from Iran's port blast reaches 65

Tehran, April 28 (UNI) :

The death toll from a huge blast and the subsequent fire at Shahid Rajaei Port in the southern Iranian province of Hormozgan on Saturday has reached 65, with over 1,200 others injured, the semi-official Mehr news agency reported Monday, citing the provincial governor.

The fire has been completely contained, while the rescue and relief operations were still ongoing, Mohammad

Ashouri Taziani told Mehr.

Earlier in the day, Iran's Interior Minister Eskandar Momeni identified "certain negligence" as one of the reasons behind the deadly explosion in the provincial capital Bandar Abbas, where this port, the country's largest maritime hub, is located.

He made the remarks in an interview with state-run IRIB TV, elaborating on the ongoing investigations to determine the cause of the incident. Momeni said that

during an earlier meeting held in Bandar Abbas to discuss the explosion's cause, several individuals whose negligence had been confirmed were summoned.

He noted that a failure to observe safety regulations and passive defense measures properly contributed to the disaster, urging the relevant authorities and investigative committee to accelerate efforts to determine the full cause

accurately.

Following the deadly blast, Hossein Sajedinia, head of Iran's National Disaster Management Organization, told the IRIB on Sunday that some of the containers at the port contained flammable materials, such as pitch, and some others carried chemicals.

Despite the incident, the port's wharfs have resumed operations and cargo handling, according to the official news agency IRNA.

11 confirmed dead in Vancouver festival on Beirut's southern suburbs

Ottawa, April 28 (UNI) : A total of 11 people have been confirmed dead after a driver drove into a crowd at a street festival in Vancouver, Canada, on Saturday evening, said the police on Sunday. The Vancouver police said in a news conference that the number of dead could rise as dozens more are injured, some seriously. Interim Vancouver Police Chief Steve Rai said the victims include both male and female, with "very young people" among the dead.

The driver does have a significant history of interactions with police and with "health-care professionals related to mental health," Rai said.

"This is the darkest day in Vancouver's history," said Rai. The tragedy happened shortly after 8 p.m. (0300 GMT) near East 43rd Avenue and Fraser Street where the Lapu Lapu Day Block Party was going on.

Local media reported that a black SUV struck individuals who were either walking or waiting near food trucks, leaving multiple victims lying on the ground.

The suspect, a 30-year-old Vancouver man, was arrested at the scene. An investigation is ongoing.

Canadian Prime Minister Mark Carney expressed his shock, saying in his social media account: "I am devastated to hear about the horrific events at the Lapu Lapu festival in Vancouver earlier this evening. We are monitoring the situation closely." Vancouver Mayor Ken Sim said: "I am shocked and deeply saddened by the horrific incident at today's Lapu Lapu Day event. We will work to provide more information as soon as we can." Named after a Filipino indigenous leader who fought against Spanish colonization in the 16th century, Lapu Lapu Day was officially recognized by the province of British Columbia in 2023 and is widely celebrated by the Filipino community in the province, where Vancouver is the largest city.

Israel rejects proposal for 5-yr truce with Hamas: state media

Jerusalem, April 28 (UNI) : Israel has rejected a proposal for a five-year ceasefire with Hamas, under which all Israeli hostages still held in Gaza would have been released, Israel's state-owned broadcaster Kan reported Monday. A senior Israeli official told local media that Israel "has officially rejected the proposal," according to Kan. "Some ideas are being floated by certain Arab states, such as

a five-year halt to the war," the official said. "There is no chance we will agree to a 'hudna' (a temporary truce) with Hamas that would only allow it to rearm, recover, and continue its war against the State of Israel with even greater force." On Saturday, a Hamas delegation led by senior leader Khalil al-Hayya agreed in Cairo to release all Israeli hostages in exchange for a five-year truce, according to an

Egyptian security source.

The last exchange of Israeli hostages and Palestinian detainees took place under a ceasefire that came into effect in January. Israel ended the ceasefire in March after about two months and resumed its deadly offensive in the Palestinian enclave. The renewed Israeli attacks have so far killed 2,222 Palestinians and injured 5,751 others, Gaza health authorities said Monday.

Lightning strikes kill 9 in Bangladesh

Dhaka, April 28 (UNI) : A series of lightning strikes in parts of Bangladesh killed nine people on Monday, media reports said.

Four deaths were reported in different areas of Cumilla district, three in Kishorganj district and one each in Sunamganj and Netrokona districts from dawn until noon on Monday amid heavy rain.

The majority of the lightning fatalities occurred in rural areas where people were working on their farmlands, Xinhua news reported.

Death due to lightning strikes is common in the densely populated South Asian country during this time of a year, as the weather changes from the dry season to the rainy summer season. The Bangladeshi government in 2016 declared it as a national disaster.

A total of 297 people including 242 men and 55 women died due to lightning strikes during the February-September period in 2024, Save the Society and Thunderstorm Awareness Forum (SSTF), a local organization, announced the death toll last October.

Experts claim that the surge in lightning strike deaths is attributable to climate change, which made the country more vulnerable to the impacts.

Israeli forces carry out airstrike on Beirut's southern suburbs

Beirut/Jerusalem, April 28 (UNI) : Israeli forces carried out on Sunday an airstrike on a building in Hadath area in Beirut's southern suburbs.

The "powerful strike" targeted "infrastructure where Hezbollah had stored precision missiles," Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu and Defence Minister Israel Katz said in a joint statement.

The missiles, according to the Israeli leaders, posed a "significant threat" to Israel's security.

Lebanon's National News Agency reported that Israeli warplanes launched three missiles, destroying a hangar and causing damage to nearby buildings and vehicles. No casualties from the strike have been reported yet.

In their statement, Netanyahu and Katz emphasized that Israel would not tolerate Hezbollah strengthening its capabilities or posing a

threat to the country from anywhere in Lebanon. They also held the Lebanese government responsible for preventing such threats, saying it "bears direct responsibility" for Hezbollah's armament.

Ahead of the strike, Israeli Army Spokesperson Avichay Adraee issued an urgent evacuation warning via social media for residents of Beirut's southern suburbs, particularly in the Hadath district. "For your safety and the safety of your families, you are urged to immediately evacuate these buildings and move at least 300 meters away, as indicated on the map," Adraee said.

Lebanese President Joseph Aoun condemned the strike, saying that "the United States and France, as guarantors of the cessation of hostilities agreement, must assume their responsibilities and compel Israel to immediately cease its attacks."

"Israel's continued undermining of stability will exacerbate tensions and expose the region to real dangers that threaten its security and stability," he warned, adding that the frequent Israeli attacks "on Lebanon's sovereignty and territorial integrity are unacceptable under any pretext."

Despite a ceasefire that took effect on Nov. 27, 2024, aimed at ending 14 months of cross-border hostilities between Israel and Hezbollah, Israeli strikes have continued in southern Lebanon and the Bekaa Valley. According to Lebanon's state-run National News Agency, Israeli bombings and shootings have killed 149 people in Lebanon since the truce, while the United Nations reported on April 15 that 71 of the dead were civilians.

17 terrorists killed in military operation

Islamabad, April 28 (UNI) : Seventeen terrorists were killed in an operation in Pakistan's northwest Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province, the military said in a statement on Monday. According to the Inter-Services Public Relations (ISPR), the military's media wing, the operation was conducted on Sunday night in the Hassan Khel area of North Waziristan district.

It followed a series of successful counter-insurgency actions by security forces between April 25 and 27, during which 54 terrorists who attempted to infiltrate Pakistan from Afghanistan were killed.

During the operation, 17 more terrorists were killed, the ISPR said, adding that a large quantity of weapons, ammunition, and explosives was recovered from the scene.

The number of terrorists killed in the three-day anti-infiltration operation has risen to 71, it added.

Designing homes the Feng Shui Way



When it comes to locating plots, buildings, orienting homes, placing decor and even planning gardens the first thing which would come to our mind is unhindered flow of energy and a feel good factor.

Jamshedpur FC beat NorthEast United in Kalinga Super Cup quarter-finals after sudden death

Bhubaneswar, April 28 (UNI) : Jamshedpur FC secured a hard-fought semi-final spot in Kalinga Super Cup 2025 after edging NorthEast United FC 5-4 in a dramatic quarter-final penalty-shootout at the Kalinga Stadium here.

The match had ended in a stalemate after regulation time, forcing a nervy penalty shootout that went into sudden death on Sunday Night.

Khalid Jamil's men showed great composure under pressure, even after Jordan Murray and Stephen Eze missed during the initial set of five penalties. NorthEast United had their own share of troubles, with Guillermo Fernandez and Michel Zabaco missing their early attempts.

Despite rallying to tie the shootout at 3-3, NorthEast faltered in sudden death when Asheer Akhtar skied his shot, while Ashutosh Mehta and Lazar Cirkovic converted for



Jamshedpur.

The win sets up a semi-final clash between Jamshedpur FC and Mumbai City FC on April 30, at 8 pm IST.

The match itself was a tactical battle, with both coaches adopting a cautious approach from the outset. With attacking threats such as Alaaeddine Ajaraie, Nestor Albiach, and Guillermo Fernandez for NorthEast, and Javier

Hernandez Gonzalez, Javier Siverio and Jordan Murray for Jamshedpur, defensive discipline was paramount.

The first half saw few clear-cut chances as both sides focussed on closing down space and maintaining shape. The first notable opportunity came for NorthEast United in the 15th minute, when Ajaraie's thunderous free-kick from 32 yards was palmed away by Albino Gomes, ensuring

the scores stayed level.

Jamshedpur also had their moments, with Hernandez and Siverio linking up well, but they failed to seriously trouble Gurmeet Singh in the NorthEast goal.

The pattern continued in the second half, with both teams struggling to break down stubborn defences. Jithin MS came closest for NorthEast with a well-struck volley from 21

yards that whistled just past the post, while Siverio and Murray were repeatedly denied by Gurmeet's safe handling.

Djokovic faces new reality after Madrid exit

Madrid, April 28 (UNI) : Novak Djokovic says he is facing up to a "new reality" after losing his opening match for the second successive tournament.

The Serb, seeking a fourth Madrid Open title, was beaten 6-3 6-4 by Italian Matteo Arnaldi.

Djokovic made his Madrid debut in 2006 and won the tournament in 2011, 2016 and 2019.

However, he said does not yet know if he will play again in Madrid following Saturday's loss to a player ranked 44 in the world, the BBC reported. When asked if it was his final match there, he said: "I'm not sure if I will come back. So, I don't know.

"I mean, I'll come back, maybe not as a player. I hope it's not, but it could be." Djokovic said his "level of tennis is not where I would like it to be", and added: "I lost to a better player.

"I've had a few of these this year where I lose in the first round, unfortunately."

It was a third consecutive defeat for the 24-time Grand Slam winner, who is seeking a 100th career title.

He also lost in his opening match in Monte Carlo this month, after being beaten in the Miami Masters final in March.

"It's a kind of new reality for me, I have to say," he said.

"You know, trying to win a match or two, not really thinking about getting far in the tournament." "It's a completely different feeling from what I had in 20-plus years of professional tennis, so it's kind of a challenge for me mentally to really face these kind of sensations on the court, going out early now regularly in the tournaments.

"But that's, I guess, the circle of life and the career. Eventually it was going to happen."

Addressing a press conference organised at the party's state office, Akhilesh said that SP MP Ramji Lal Suman was attacked because he was going to Sunhara village in Bulandshahr to raise his voice against those who are crushing Dalits. Where the Dalits were brutally trampled several times by the ruling party's people, in which a Dalit woman died. "Many people were brutally crushed. The attack on Ramji Lal Suman is a challenge to the government and law and order," he said. He alleged that the attack on Ramji Lal Suman was done to intimidate

SP. "The attackers have the support of the government and the DGP, but the Samajwadi people are neither going to be scared of the attack nor are they going to be scared of anyone's threats. Those who are threatening us or Ramji Lal Suman, they are not challenging us but the Chief Minister, DGP and those in uniform," he said. The SP chief said, "They are flouting the law and order of the state. We are people who believe in law, the Constitution and democracy, those who are challenging us should come and talk with an open mind. Discuss openly. We are ready to talk with an open mind." He alleged that some people in the BJP government have a free hand, they are openly flouting the law and order. "They do not fear the law because from top to bottom in power, people of their own caste are in power.
