Court sentences man to two-yr RI for issuing threat call to PM and Yogi

Mumbai, Apr 3 (UNI): A local court here on Thursday awarded to two years rigorous imprisonment to a 29-year-old man for making a hoax call to the Mumbai police control room warning of a “threat” to the lives of Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath in 2023.

While convicting the accused the court rejected the defence plea that the accused is mentally unstable and observed that it is clear from the evidence given by the prosecution that the accused tried to disturb social harmony by placing the threats to the main control room.

The court found accused Kamran Khan, guilty under section 505 (2) (statements creating or promoting enmity, hatred or ill-will between classes) and 506 (2) (criminal intimidation) of the Indian Penal Code.

The court also noted that the accused is a habitual offender and had earlier made a similar call claiming threat to life of the Uttar Pradesh CM.

A complaint was filed at Azad Maidan police after a call was received in the Mumbai police’s main control room on November 20, 2023.

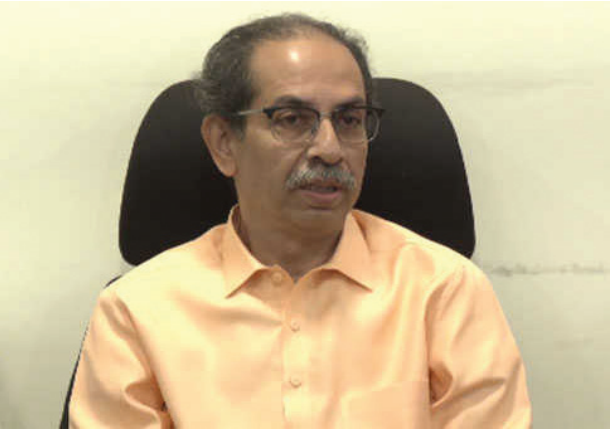
Kenyan woman arrested with drugs at Mumbai airport

Mumbai, April 3 (UNI) : The Customs officers at Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj International Airport, Mumbai have arrested a Kenyan woman national and seized suspected cocaine / methaqualone weighing 1.78 Kg having illicit market value of around Rs 18 crore, officials said here on Thursday.

The passenger was arrested under the Provisions of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substance (NDPS) Act.

According to details, the woman had intended to take the drugs to Delhi, for which the suspect had consented to pay her one lakh Kenyan shillings (approximately Rs 66,000). However, prior to that, she was apprehended.

Sena voted against Waqf Bill to oppose govt "intention to grab land" : Uddhav Thackeray

Mumbai, April 3 : Shiv Sena (UBT) chief Uddhav Thackeray on Thursday said his party voted against the Waqf bill in Parliament to oppose the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP)-led Alliance government’s “ploy” to “grab land and give it to its industrialist friends”.

Addressing a press conference in Mumbai after the Bill was passed in the

Lok Sabha, Sena president Thackeray said, "The concern shown by the BJP and its allies during the discussion on the Waqf Amendment Bill would put Pakistan's founder Muhammad Ali Jinnah to shame."

"The BJP has won a third term at the Centre and things are going well, yet it is raking up Hindu-Muslim issues and if the aim is to appease Muslims, then who left

Hindutva – BJP or us who opposed the bill? How can they blame us?" he remarked.

He said, "On one hand BJP leaders, including Union home minister Amit Shah, made speeches appealing Muslims while advocating the Bill, while on the other they targeted those who voted against the Bill."

"We voted against it to oppose the hypocrisy of BJP and their intentions of land grabbing through this Bill," he said adding, "The BJP should remove colour green from its party flag if it dislikes Muslims."

Thackeray further said Prime Minister Narendra Modi should have informed the country about the economic challenges posed by US tariffs and steps being taken to mitigate it.

Dream of owning houses will be fulfilled under Bandra Smart City Project: Minister Adv. Shelar

Mumbai, April 3 (UNI) : A programme to distribute contract documents of new houses to the residents being rehabilitated under the Slum Rehabilitation Authority in Bandra East was held at the Mumbai Suburban District Collectorate.

House contract documents were distributed to 10 beneficiaries by state Minister Adv. Ashish Shelar. Speaking on the occasion, he said: "It is necessary to preserve the human face while carrying out development works. Therefore, the dream of

owning houses of many families in Gautam Nagar is being fulfilled under the ‘Bandra Smart City Project’ in Bandra East."

District Collector of Mumbai Suburban District Rajendra Kshirsagar, senior officers and employees were present on this occasion.

Adv. Shelar, also known as the Guardian Minister of Mumbai Suburban District, said that this project is being successfully completed with the cooperation of the Maharashtra Chief Minister, Deputy Chief Minister, Housing Minister and concerned officials. Efforts

will be made to ensure that the residents enter their new homes before the Ganpati festival.

Saying that a decision has been taken to hand over 30.16 acres of land owned by the Public Works Department in Bandra East to the High Court, Guardian Minister Adv. Shelar said that the Slum Rehabilitation Authority has made available a total of 144 flats, including 77 flats of Omsai Cooperative Housing Society and 67 flats of Balaji Shop Keepers in Bandra East, after following up with the government.

JD(U) leader Qasim Ansari resigns from party over Waqf Bill

Patna, April 3 (UNI) : Senior JD(U) leader Qasim Ansari on Wednesday resigned from the party in protest against the support extended by JD(U) to ensure the passage of the Waqf Board Amendment Bill in Parliament.

Ansari in his letter to JD(U) President and Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar, expressed his deep anguish over the support extended by the party to the Narendra Modi government in passing of Waqf Board Amendment Bill in the Lok Sabha. Several Muslim leaders and Muslim bodies had requested Chief Minister Kumar to stall the bill in Parliament using his political influence as it was against the interests of Muslim community, he pointed out.

"Despite repeated requests from Muslim leaders and Muslim bodies, Chief Minister Kumar did not yield and supported the bill, which made it easy for the Narendra Modi government to get the bill passed in parliament", Ansari stated. The way senior JD(U) leader and Union Minister Lalan Singh supported the bill on the floor of the House was disturbing and frustrating for the Muslim community, he added. The Muslim community had confidence in Chief Minister Kumar that he was truly a secular, but he proved himself otherwise on the Waqf Bill, he noted. Earlier, several Muslim leaders and Muslim bodies, including All India Muslim Personal Law Board, had urged Chief Minister Kumar to use his political influence to stall the Waqf Board Amendment Bill in Parliament. It was frustrating for them that the Chief Minister preferred to accept the line of the BJP in supporting the Bill in the House, Muslim leaders pointed out.

Carefully examining implications of 27 pc Reciprocal Tariffs announced by US President: Govt

New Delhi, April 3 (UNI) : In a guarded response to the 27 per cent “Reciprocal Tariffs” announced by the US President Donald Trump, the Government on Thursday said it was examining the implications of the various measures/ announcements made by Trump earlier today.

The US President issued an Executive Order on Reciprocal Tariffs imposing additional ad-valorem duties ranging from 10% to 50% on imports from all trading partners. The baseline duty of 10% will be effective from April 05, 2025 and the remaining country specific additional ad-valorem duty will be effective from April 09, 2025. The additional duty on India as per the Executive Order is 27%, the Ministry of Commerce & Industry said in an official statement.

"The Department of Commerce is carefully examining the implications of the various measures / announcements made by the President of the USA. Keeping in view the vision of Viksit Bharat, the Department is engaged with all stakeholders, including Indian industry and exporters, taking feedback of their assessment of the tariffs and assessing the situation," the Ministry stated. The Department is also studying the opportunities that may arise due to this new development in the US trade policy. The Prime Minister of India, Narendra Modi, and the President of USA, Donald Trump have

announced on 13 February 2025 ‘Mission 500’ – aiming to more than double the bilateral trade to USD 500 Billion by 2030. Accordingly, discussions are ongoing between Indian and US trade teams for the expeditious conclusion of a mutually beneficial, multi-sectoral Bilateral Trade Agreement.

These cover a wide range of issues of mutual interest including deepening supply chain integration. The ongoing talks are focused on enabling both nations to grow trade, investments and technology transfers. “We remain in touch with the Trump Administration on these issues and expect to take them forward in the coming days,” the press communique added.

India values its Comprehensive Global Strategic Partnership with the United States and is committed to working closely with the US to implement the India-US ‘Catalysing Opportunities for Military Partnership, Accelerated Commerce & Technology’ (COMPACT) for the 21st century to ensure that our trade ties remain a pillar of mutual prosperity and drive transformative change for the benefit of the people of India and the US.

Meanwhile the Indian stock market reacted negatively to the Reciprocal Tariffs as the BSE Sensex was slumped over 300 points during the intraday and NSE Nifty was also down by about 100 points.

Unseasonal rains, hailstorms lash Nashik district affecting onion, gram, wheat crops, vineyards

Nashik, April 3 (UNI) : Unseasonal rains accompanied by hailstorms lashed some parts of Nashik city and the district on Wednesday evening, affecting crops like wheat, onions, gram and vineyards, that were about to be harvested.

Hailstorms occurred in Shinde Palse and Madsangvi areas. Heavy rains lashed Baglan, Trimbakeshwar and Mahiravani areas and some parts including Panchavati, Indiranagar, Cidco for half an hour to 15 minutes. According to weathermen, the weather changed completely in the last two days. There was a sprinkling of rain in Yeola and Manmad. However, after Wednesday evening, rains covered many parts of the district. Heavy rain accompanied by thunder occurred in the district. The sudden rains took citizens and farmers by

surprise. Tehsildar Shobha Pujari informed that rain along with hailstorms occurred in Shinde Palse and Madsangvi areas. Baglan taluka was lashed by rain for half an hour. The onion crop was damaged.

Some hail fell in the Karanjali valley. Rains also lashed Trimbakeshwar and Mahiravni areas for the second consecutive day. A buffalo belonging to a farmer, Ramchandra Khetade, died after being struck by lightning at Dhondabar in Sinnar taluka.

Water accumulated in low-lying areas in the Nashik city and Nashik Road area. The farmers said that currently, wheat, onion and gram crops are being harvested. There is a possibility of crop diseases also spreading among the vegetables and onions.

The remaining orchards

that were being harvested with the grape harvesting season about to end were hit by unseasonal rains. Grape growers are disappointed as the grass that is grown among the grape vines to keep the plants healthy has been destroyed. Nashik district has been experiencing unseasonal rains for the past two days. However, it was more intense on Wednesday than on Tuesday, and damaged the onion, gram and grape crops to a large extent.

Antapur, Taharabad, Jaykheda, Nampur and other areas of Baglan taluka were lashed by heavy rain for one to one-and-a-half hours on Wednesday evening. In these areas too, farmers expressed fear that the crops like onion, grapes, and pomegranates that are about to be harvested will be hit to a large extent.

Rajya Sabha takes up the Waqf (Amendment) Bill, 2025

New Delhi, April 3 (UNI) :After getting approval from the Lok Sabha, Minority Affairs Minister Kiren Rijiju on Thursday moved The Waqf (Amendment) Bill, 2025 and The Mussalman Wakf (Repeal) Bill, 2024 in the Rajya Sabha, to get its approval. The Bill is aimed at providing transparency in the management of the Waqf properties.

Home Minister Amit Shah and senior Ministers were present at the time of tabling the Bill in the upper house. After moving the Bill, Kiren Rijiju said that the Joint parliamentary Committee (JPC) had a thorough deliberation on

the Bill. He appealed to Congress party and other Opposition parties to support the Waqf Amendment Bill 2025.

Rijiju stated that the new legislation will ensure representation from all Muslim sects -- Shia, Sunni, Bohra, Aghakhani (Ismaili) -- in the Waqf Board, along with members from backward classes, making it more inclusive.

He said that in the proposed Central Waqf Board, out of 22 members, a maximum of four will be non-Muslims, while at least two members will be women. Similarly, in the State Waqf Boards, which will have 11 members, not

more than three will be non-Muslim.

The Minister said that the Waqf Amendment Bill, 2025, will have a new and a beautiful name, which no body will have any objection, and it will be called as "UMEED" (Unified Waqf Management Empowerment Efficiency and Development) Bill.

Alleging that the UPA government engaged in "appeasement politics," Kiren Rijiju stated that just before the Model Code of Conduct came into effect for the 2014 Lok Sabha elections, the then Congress-led UPA government denotified 123

prime properties in the National Capital belonging to the Housing and Urban Affairs Ministry and handed them over to the Delhi Waqf Board.

Kiren Rijiju said that the Muslim community is largely welcoming the bill, and despite some opposition, he invited critics to meet with Muslim delegations who have expressed strong support for the bill.

The Minister said that the Bill was drafted following wide discussions with various stakeholders across the country. He further mentioned that over 280 organisations provided suggestions, and more

Two Naxalites sentenced to life imprisonment in 15-year-old murder case

Sonbhadra (UP), April 3 (UNI) :Two hardcore Naxalites were sentenced to life imprisonment along with a fine of Rs 20,000 each by a local court here on Thursday in a more than 15-year-old murder case in the Kon area of Sonbhadra district in Uttar Pradesh, prosecution sources said here. Prosecution sources said that on December 3, 2009, Ajay Kumar Paswan, a resident of Brahmori village, had reported at Kon police station that there was firing between two Naxalite groups in the inner forest over levy collection and division of money, in which one Naxalite was reported to have been killed. Prosecution sources said that the police recovered the body of Ramvriksh from the crime scene. "During the investigation, the names of hardcore Naxalite Munna Vishwakarma alias Vidrohi alias Ramvriksh and Ajit Kol alias Babbal came to fore," they said. Prosecution sources said that based on evidence available on record, the court of Additional Sessions Judge Jitendra Kumar Dwivedi convicted Naxalites Munna Vishwakarma and Ajit Kol and sentenced them to life imprisonment with a fine of Rs 20,000 each.

Tewari seeks withdrawal of exorbitant hike in house tax

Chandigarh, Apr 3 (UNI) Senior Congress leader and Chandigarh MP Manish Tewari on Thursday demanded withdrawal of the exorbitant hike in the house tax and collector rates for registering property here.

Tewari noted that the whopping hike in the house tax rates and collector rates for the sale and purchase of property was apparently done to meet the municipal expenses of the city that is supposedly bankrupt .

He said the Chandigarh Municipal Corporation (CMC) should get 30 percent of the total grant the Union Territory gets out of the union budget according to the formula evolved by the Delhi Finance Commission.

He said, this year Rs 6100 crore had been allocated to the UT. So, going by the calculation, the CMC should get between Rs 1700 to Rs 1800 crore to meet its various expenses. However, CMC gets only about Rs 570-580 crore, which is far less than the 30 percent recommended by the Delhi Finance Commission and the 15th Finance Commission for inter-Se devolution of resources between states and their respective Urban Local bodies.

Tewari said all the revenue generating departments are with the Chandigarh Administration while all departments which require substantial expenditure are with the CMC.

Asserting that the exorbitant hike must be withdrawn immediately, he said, it will put the residents of Chandigarh under extra financial burden, who are already reeling under financial strain due to high cost of living and rising prices of essential commodities. Moreover, he pointed out, most of the Chandigarh residents are working class people like employees or retired people, who cannot afford the additional burden that has been imposed on them by way of exorbitant house tax and extra collector rates.

SC Commission intervention resolves cheque bounce case against student's father

Chandigarh, Apr 3 (UNI) Following the intervention of Punjab State Scheduled Castes Commission (PSSCC) Chairman Jasvir Singh Garhi, a college management has withdrawn its cheque bounce case against a student's father.

Garhi said here on Thursday that Ramanjit Singh, son of Balwinder Kumar from Janta Nagar (Dhuri), filed a complaint with the PSSCC on March 25, stating that Ramanjit had enrolled for BTech Civil Engineering at Gurukul Vidyapeeth Institute of Engineering and Technology (Banur), attending regularly through the third semester. However, due to his father's surgery, he was unable to take his fourth semester examinations.

As per the complaint, the college administration never issued any formal

notification regarding his absence during the fourth semester yet continued to collect fees from Ramanjit Singh until 2018 (through the eighth semester).

Subsequently, Ramanjit Singh visited the campus multiple times in 2022 to retrieve his academic documents but was consistently denied access. When he approached Gurukul Director Manmohan Garg to collect his records, Ramanjit Singh was subjected to verbal abuse and threats.

The college management then initiated legal proceedings over a bounced cheque that Ramanjit's father had provided as security. Court proceedings commenced with a verdict expected on April two. Seeking justice, Ramanjit Singh appealed to the Commission for assistance.

SC upholds decision nullifying Bengal SSC teacher recruitment

New Delhi, Apr 3 (UNI) The Supreme Court on Thursday upheld the cancellation of the selection process for school teachers in West Bengal, ruling that even untainted candidates could not retain their appointments as it violated Articles 14 and 16 of the Constitution.

Delivering its judgment on the State of West Bengal's challenge to the Calcutta High Court's ruling, the Supreme Court declared the recruitment process of the State Level Selection Test-2016 (SLST) in West Bengal government-sponsored and aided schools null and void. The Bench, comprising Chief Justice of India (CJI) Sanjiv Khanna and Justice Sanjay Kumar, observed, "Manipulations and frauds on a large scale coupled with attempts to cover up have tainted the selection process beyond repair... the credibility and legitimacy of the selection are denuded." The Court upheld the Calcutta High Court's decision, reaffirming that appointments made through the tainted recruitment process could not be allowed to stand. The Bench stated, "We find no valid ground or reason to interfere with the directions of the High Court that services of tainted candidates must be terminated, and they will be required to refund any salaries they had received since the appointments are a result of fraud, which amounts to cheating. Therefore, we see no justification to alter this direction." Previously, the Court had

classified the categories of the parties involved in matters related to the appointments of approximately 25,000 school teachers by the West Bengal School Service Commission (WBSSC). The State of West Bengal had challenged the Calcutta High Court's ruling, which declared the SLST-2016 recruitment process null and void and ordered the cancellation of all appointments made through it. On July 16, 2024, a Bench comprising then-Chief Justice DY Chandrachud, Justice

JB Pardiwala, and Justice Manoj Misra had ordered, "No counter affidavit has been filed till date.

Govt capex, private investment to drive India’s growth in FY 26

The Indian economy is expected to clock 6.5 per cent growth in 2025-26, driven by government investment in big infrastructure projects, and an acceleration in private investment during the year, according to the latest EY Economy Watch report.

The report highlights the importance of government expenditure on infrastructure expansion, which has a relatively larger multiplier, while pointing out that India is also likely to benefit from the expected lower global energy prices.

It is also expected that the RBI’s policy interest rate may be lowered by another 50-75 basis points during the course of FY26. This may be facilitated by a lower trajectory of CPI inflation, which has already fallen below 4 per cent in February 2025. This has happened for the first time since August 2024. As a result, private investment may also start picking up, the report observed.

On the global front, the report observed that the OECD, in its Interim Economic Outlook, projected global growth to slow to 3.1 per cent in 2025 from 3.2 per cent in 2024, with growth in the US economy moderating to 2.2 per cent from 2.8 per cent. The likelihood of the US economy going into a short-term economic slowdown, if not an outright recession, is quite strong. This is likely due to the anticipated negative effect on aggregate demand of recent US government spending cuts and employee salary reductions. As cost-cutting measures take effect, particularly the expected fall in energy prices, both domestically within the US and globally, the US economy is likely to start to gradually improve.

The Indian economy has already been facing significant uncertainties on account of the global slowdown and supply chain disruptions. Their impact on India’s export prospects may remain unpredictable until the mutual tariff levels settle down. A suitable policy for the Indian economy may be for the government to continue to rely on infrastructure expansion, the EY report observes.

EY India’s Chief Policy Advisor, D.K. Srivastava, said India’s changing demographic structure, with a rising working-age population, could drive a virtuous cycle of growth, employment, savings, and investment.

To capitalise on this, India may need to gradually increase spending on health, education, and infrastructure while ensuring adequate funding for low-income states through equalisation transfers.

Varanasi, April 3 (UNI) :Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath on Thursday emphasised the timely completion of all preparations for Prime Minister Narendra Modi's upcoming visit to his parliamentary constituency Varanasi.

During a review meeting with public representatives and officials at the Circuit House auditorium, the CM directed the officials to ensure that all projects scheduled for inauguration and foundation-laying by the PM are fully prepared. He took note of land subsidence incidents at Namo Ghat and directed officials to conduct a quality inspection and ensure immediate repairs.

He also directed them to develop a concrete action plan for the beautification of the Varuna Riverfront and complete the work without delay.

Yogi first visited Mehandi Ganj in Raja Talab, the proposed venue for PM Modi's public event. He emphasised the need for robust security and timely completion of all arrangements.

He said, "No visitor should face any inconvenience at the venue. Ensure proper drinking water, shade, mobile toilets and ORS packets."

In the meeting, Commissioner Kaushal Raj Sharma made a presentation on the preparations for the arrival of the PM. Along with this, information was also given about the development projects to be inaugurated and foundation stone laid by the PM.

Police Commissioner Mohit Agarwal gave information about the preparations of the police for the arrival of the PM. The CM was also informed about the progress of all the campaigns including cow smuggling, verification of illegal auto-e-rickshaw drivers, campaign against

loudspeakers, CCTV campaign, Operation Chakravyuh, foot patrol, night patrol, implementation of three new laws, cyber crime.

Yogi directed the authorities to intensify foot patrols to prevent chain snatching, robbery and crimes against women. He emphasised the need for a complete crackdown on cow smuggling by targeting key offenders. Besides, he ordered swift action to curb incidents of love jihad and forced conversions while ensuring revenue disputes are resolved promptly based on merit.

He reviewed progress on projects at Harishchandra and Manikarnika ghats, stressing their completion before the monsoon. He suggested promoting the use of cow dung cakes for cremation and warned against unnecessary design changes in ongoing projects after DPR.

During the review, officials informed CM Yogi that under the Jal Jeevan Mission, tap water supply had reached 211 village panchayats in the district. He directed them to expedite the remaining work and ensure every household receives a water connection soon.

The CM expressed displeasure over the Chief Engineer of Jal Jeevan Mission for not providing proper information regarding the drinking water connection of houses and warned officials to come to the meeting with complete information in the future. He emphasised the need to identify a suitable location for the expansion of the National Forensic University campus. He also stressed the importance of running regular cleanliness drives in both urban and rural areas, ensuring public participation, and enforcing a complete ban on single-use plastic. "This should be conducted as a full-fledged campaign," he directed.

Male Infertility on the Rise:

Dr. Saroja Koppala also highlighted an important concern, men over the age of 40 planning for children should be aware that age can impact sperm quality and affect the health of their offspring. Moreover, abnormal semen parameters

may also indicate that there may be an underlying Co morbidities.

Shifting Trends in Infertility:

Dr. Hima Deepthi, Fertility Specialist at Nova IVF Fertility, Banjara Hills, highlighted the changing patterns in infertility cases. A decade ago, infertility was mostly linked to PCOS, endometriosis, and poor egg reserve. However, today we are seeing more couples delaying parenthood, with many

women planning pregnancies in their late 30s and even early 40s, she noted.

One of the most notable shifts is the increasing awareness and demand for egg freezing. "We now receive 50-100 egg freezing queries a year, a number that was almost negligible just a few years ago. Many unmarried women in their early 30s are coming forward to understand more about egg freezing," Dr. Hima Deepthi added.

The fertility experts at the conference emphasized that fertility planning should not be left until later years. If couples wish to plan children at a later stage, they should consider freezing their eggs, sperm, or embryos to preserve their fertility options. They also urged both men and women to adopt healthier lifestyles, undergo fertility screening, and seek medical

guidance sooner if they face difficulties in conceiving.

The event was graced by Chief guests, Honorary Treasurer at FIGO (International Federation of Gynecology and Obstetrics),– Dr Shantha Kumari, Dr Manjula Rao, Secretary, OGS (Obstetric & Gynaecological Society of Hyderabad (OGSH)). 43 individuals face punishment for fatal coal mine accident in China's Heilongjiang

Harbin, April 3 (UNI) : A total of 43 individuals should be punished for their roles in a deadly coal mine accident and subsequent cover-up in northeast China's Heilongjiang Province, an investigation report revealed Thursday.The accident occurred on Dec. 20, 2023, in the Kunyuan coal mine in the city of Jixi, leaving 12 dead and 13 others injured.

The accident resulted from illegal mining using improper equipment with damaged wires, which snapped under overload conditions while workers illegally rode cargo trains, according to the report released by the investigation team organized by the provincial government.

Following the accident, the mine operator deliberately concealed it, hid the victims' bodies, and destroyed evidence instead of reporting promptly. Emergency response was also mishandled, it added. The report revealed that judicial authorities as well as discipline inspection and supervision bodies have taken action against 14 individuals, while 29 others face recommended Party disciplinary or administrative penalties.

Magnitude 5.9 earthquake strikes Indonesia's North Maluku

Jakarta, April 3 (UNI) : An earthquake measuring 5.9 on the Richter scale struck off Indonesia's eastern North Maluku province early Thursday, without triggering large waves, the country's Meteorology, Climatology, and Geophysics Agency reported.

The agency initially recorded the magnitude at 6.0 before revising it.The quake occurred at 04:03 a.m. Jakarta time Thursday (2103 GMT), with the epicenter located 121 km southwest of Loloda sub-district in North Halmahera Regency, at a depth of 42 km beneath the seafloor.The tremors were recorded at intensity levels II to III on the Modified Mercalli Intensity (MMI) scale in Ternate City and West Halmahera Regency. They were also felt in the neighboring province of North Sulawesi, where Manado and Bitung experienced shaking of similar intensity.

The agency did not issue a tsunami warning, as the earthquake did not have the potential to generate large waves.A 4.9-magnitude aftershock followed at 04:31 a.m.Indonesia, an archipelagic nation, is highly earthquake-prone due to its location along the seismically active "Pacific Ring of Fire."

Italian PM criticizes US decision to impose tariffs on EU

Rome, April 3 (UNI) : Italian Prime Minister Giorgia Meloni on Wednesday night criticized U.S. President Donald Trump's decision to impose tariffs on the EU, calling it "a mistake that benefits no one."

She said that Italy will work to reach an agreement with the United States to prevent a trade war that could weaken the West in favor of other global players.

"We will do everything we can to reach an agreement with the United States to avert a trade war, which would inevitably weaken the West and strengthen other global actors," Meloni said.

"In any case, as always, we will act in the interests of Italy and its economy, while also coordinating with our European partners," she added.

Amid widespread opposition, Trump on Wednesday signed an executive order on the so-called "reciprocal tariffs," imposing a 10-percent "minimum baseline tariff" and higher rates on certain trading partners.

If the tariffs were imposed, the EU will face a 20-percent tariff, according to Trump's executive order.

Canada to respond to US import tariffs with countermeasures :PM

Ottawa, April 3 (UNI) : Canada will respond to US import tariffs with countermeasures, Canadian Prime Minister Mark Carney said.

"We're gonna fight these tariffs with countermeasures," Carney told reporters.

The White House said in a statement on Wednesday the United States will impose a 10 percent tariff on all foreign imports starting April 5, with higher tariffs for countries with which the US has the largest trade deficits starting April 9.

Israel's industry body warns of US tariffs' impact on trade

Jerusalem, April 3 (UNI) : The Manufacturers Association of Israel (MAI) on Thursday voiced concern over US President Donald Trump's decision to impose a 17 percent tariff on Israeli goods, calling it a "worrying step for Israeli exporters."

Trump announced the levies Wednesday as part of his "reciprocal tariffs" policy, though Israel had lifted all tariffs on US imports a day earlier.

Expressing surprise in a statement, the industry body said that 99 percent of US goods entering Israel were already tariff-free before the policy shift. It warned that the new policy could harm Israel's economic stability, deter foreign investment, and weaken Israeli companies' competitiveness in the US market.

"This worrying step could harm jobs in Israel and reduce activity in the American market," it added.

The association called the decision a setback in trade and investment relations and voiced hope that the move would be short-lived.

It pledged to work with Israel's finance and economy ministries to reverse the policy while exploring alternative strategies, including seeking new markets and engaging US decision-makers.

‘Death toll from Myanmar earthquake rises to 3,085’



Beijing, April 3 (UNI) : The death toll from the earthquake in Myanmar has risen to 3,085, Xinhua reported, citing the information team of the country's State Administration Council.

A total of 4,715 were injured, and 341 people are missing, the report said.

A 7.7-magnitude earthquake struck Myanmar on March 28, with tremors felt in Bangladesh, India, Laos, China and Thailand. The quake damaged underground oil pipelines, local authorities said the next day, adding that power lines had also been cut and oil tankers were arriving on

the country's shores to ease fuel shortages. A number of countries, including Russia and Belarus, have been assisting Myanmar with relief efforts, including by sending rescue teams.

Previous reports put the death toll from the earthquake at 2,886.

Pak resumes deportation of Afghan nationals after Eid extension

Peshawar, April 3 (UNI) : Pakistani authorities have begun the second phase of deportation of Afghan refugees in the city of Peshawar, in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province, following the expiration of a government deadline for Afghan Citizen Card (ACC) holders to leave the country voluntarily.

While the government had set the deadline to March 31, refusing any extension calls from the international community, Islamabad had extended the deadline by two days.

“Although the deadline was March 31, the provincial government exte-nded it till April 2 keeping in view Eidul Fitr. Now, phase 2 will begin from (Thursday) and we have established camps, one each at Landi Kotal and Nasir Bagh Road,” a senior official from Afghan Commi-ssionate in Peshawar told Dawn.

The two-day Eid relaxation apparently caused some confusion amongst officials, with some sources suggesting a further extension.

Law enforcement authorities also confirmed an extension of the deadline, though an official in the country’s interior ministry denied any such reports.

According to official statistics, a total of 69,494 families — including 473,397 individuals, of which 157,513 were men, 111,381 were women and 197,821 children — have been sent back to Afghanistan since September 2023.

The ongoing

deportation process of Afghan nationals in Pakistan remains a highly controversial and contentious issue, as the UNHCR has called for better treatment of refugees by Pakistani authorities, while the Taliban has criticised Islamabad for its continued harassment and mistreatment of Afghan nationals, as many individuals with legal visas have been subject to forced deportations.The situation has further put a socio-economic burden on Afghanistan, as Kabul faces increasing difficulty in accommodating the new migrants due to lack of infrastructure, healthcare, basic housing, and employment amongst other problems, further exacerbating the deteriorating situation of the migrants.

WHO faces 2.5 bln USD funding gap as US announcing withdrawal

Geneva, April 3 (UNI) : The World Health Organization (WHO) is facing a budget gap of 1.9 billion U.S. dollars for 2026 and 2027, along with a 600-million-dollar deficit through 2025, according to media reports on Wednesday.

Health Policy Watch, a non-profit independent global health news outlet, reported that the 1.9-billion-dollar funding gap accounts for nearly 45 percent of its already slashed budget for the two-year period until 2027.

The report, citing WHO officials at a Tuesday meeting, said the United States owes WHO 260 million dollars in dues for

2024 and 2025. Raul Thomas, WHO's assistant director general of business operations, revealed at the meeting that the outgoing administration of U.S. President Joe Biden never paid the U.S. 2024 dues of 130 million dollars owed before leaving office.

Speaking to WHO staff via Zoom at the meeting, Director General Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus forecasted staff reductions. "Starting with senior leadership, but will reflect all levels and regions," he was quoted as saying.

"Everything is on the table, including merging

divisions, departments and units, and relocating functions," Tedros added.

Following the U.S. decision to withdraw from the WHO, the organization reduced its 2026-2027 budget from 5.3 billion dollars to 4.2 billion dollars.

WHO data showed that the U.S. share of the organization's regular budget for the 2024-2025 period was assessed at 22 percent, the highest among all members.

On Jan. 20, U.S. President Donald Trump signed an executive order shortly after his inauguration to withdraw the country from the WHO, which will only take effect after a one-year noticeperiod.

Ecuador says US tariffs to hurt key exports

Quito, April 3 (UNI) : Ecuador's main export industry group warned Wednesday that new US tariffs will significantly affect the country's exports of agricultural goods, notably banana, shrimp and cocoa.

The Trump administration's plan to impose a 10 percent tariff on imports from over 180 countries starting April 5 threatens Ecuador's key exports, which currently enter the United States tariff-free, said the Ecuadorian Federation of Exporters (Fedexpor).

The group said the impact is

compounded by Ecuador's lack of a trade agreement with the United States, which is a gap that leaves Ecuador at a competitive disadvantage compared to regional exporters with preferential access.

"The absence of a trade deal with the US puts Ecuadorian exports in a weaker position under this new tariff regime," it said in a statement.

Fedexpor and the Ecuadorian-American Chamber of Commerce said they have opened diplomatic and technical discussions with US trade officials to explore options to limit the damage.

Japan seriously concerned US reciprocal tariffs not in compliance with WTO rules

Tokyo, April 3 (UNI) : Japan's Chief Cabinet Secretary Yoshimasa Hayashi on Thursday expressed "serious concern" about the US decision to impose reciprocal tariffs, questioning its compliance with World Trade Organization rules and a bilateral trade agreement.

At a press conference, he said that Tokyo has strongly urged Washington to retract its decision to slap a 24 percent levy on Japanese products as part of the reciprocal tariffs.

The US administration's tariff plan could have a "big negative impact" on the global economy and the multilateral trade system, Hayashi said.

Meanwhile, Japanese Minister of Economy, Trade and Industry Yoji Muto said he told US Commerce Secretary Howard Lutnick during an online meeting earlier in the day that the new tariff move is regrettable and will make it difficult for companies to invest in the U.S. market and hurt the US economy.

Muto added that Tokyo will continue to request exemptions from US tariffs.

Nepal seeking to cooperate with Russia in energy sector

Kathmandu, April 3 (UNI) : Nepalese Minister for Energy, Water Resources, and Irrigation Deepak Khadka expressed hope for cooperation with Russia in the energy sector at a meeting with Russian Ambassador to Nepal Aleksei Novikov, Nepalese media reported.

Khadka noted Nepal's goal to generate 28,500 megawatts of electricity by 2035 and expressed hope for cooperation with Russia in achieving this goal, The Himalayan Times newspaper reported on Wednesday.

The minister invited Russian companies to invest in Nepal's power transmission infrastructure, energy storage, smart grids and green energy, the report added.Novikov, in turn, reportedly said that Russian business is interested in expanding investments in Nepal's energy and hydropower sectors. The ambassador also invited the minister to attend the Nevsky International Ecological Congress next month, the St. Petersburg International Economic Forum in June and the Russian Energy Week in October.

China strongly opposes US tariffs, will take countermeasures - Commerce Ministry

Beijing, April 3 (UNI) : China strongly opposes the US tariffs and will take countermeasures to protect its rights and interests, the Chinese Commerce Ministry said on Thursday. "China strongly opposes this and will take countermeasures to protect its rights and interests," the ministry said in a statement.

The new US tariffs ignore the balance of interests achieved over many years of multilateral trade negotiations, the statement read, adding that the measures are based on subjective unilateral assessments, which "does not comply with the rules of international trade and seriously damages the legitimate rights and interests of the parties involved."

"The Chinese side calls on the US to immediately lift unilateral tariff measures

and properly resolve differences with trading partners through equal dialogue," the statement said.

On Wednesday, US President Donald Trump announced the introduction of reciprocal tariffs on imports from other countries. The base rate will be 10%, but as Trump noted, the US will charge approximately half of the tariffs that other countries impose on American goods. Later, the White House said that the US will impose a 10% tariff on all foreign imports on April 5, while higher tariffs for countries with the largest trade deficits will take effect on April 9.

Later, US Treasury Secretary Scott Bessent said that the new tariffs on Chinese imports are added to the previously existing measures and now reach 54%.

Canada says to fight US tariffs with countermeasures

Ottawa, April 3 (UNI) : Canadian Prime Minister Mark Carney said Wednesday that Canada will fight U.S. tariffs with countermeasures.

The prime minister promised to act with purpose and force to counter U.S. President Donald Trump's auto tariffs and bring in support for impacted workers.

"In a crisis, it's important to come together and it's essential to act with purpose and with force," Carney said, adding that Canada's strategic sectors, like pharmaceuticals, lumber and semiconductors, are facing the U.S. potential threat.

Carney said that he will speak with provincial and territorial premiers Thursday morning and detailed countermeasures are expected to be announced then.

Canada escaped Trump's reciprocal global tariffs, but a 25 percent tariff on foreign-made cars and light trucks will come into effect at midnight. Duties on several Canadian goods, including non-compliant CUSMA (Canada-United States-Mexico Agreement) products, aluminum and steel, remain in place.Dan Kelly, president and CEO of the Canadian Federation of Independent Business, said on the social platform X that U.S. tariffs on Canada are "as clear as mud."

"I can't believe the whole world is trying to learn where their economies are headed by straining to see a stupid chart held by the President," Kelly said.

According to a new survey by his organization, the widespread business disruption caused by U.S.-Canada tariffs is leading Canadian small business owners to shift their suppliers and investments to domestic and international markets other than the United States.

The survey found that a third of business owners have already shifted to suppliers or markets within Canada, 27 percent plan to increase their investment in Canada, and the other third intend to reduce efforts in the United States over the next six months.

Flavio Volpe, president of the Automotive Parts Manufacturers' Association and a member of the Prime Minister's Council on Canada-U.S. Relations, said the auto tariff package will shut down the auto sector in the United States and Canada.

"Canadians sighing with relief for not being on this list should remember we still have border tariffs of 25 percent, auto tariffs of 25 percent and steel and aluminum tariffs of 25 percent. Like dodging a bullet into the path of a tank," Volpe said on his X account.Drew Dilkens, mayor of Windsor, the auto capital of Canada in the province of Ontario, said that with thousands and thousands of jobs at stake, he's worried about how hard his city could be hit.

Australian PM calls Trump's 10 pc tariffs completely ‘unwarranted’

Canberra, April 3 (UNI) : Australian Prime Minister Anthony Albanese called the 10% tariffs imposed by US President Donald Trump on Canberra "completely unjustified."

"For Australia these tariffs are not unexpected, but let me be clear: they are totally unwarranted. President Trump refers to

reciprocal tariffs. A reciprocal tariff would be zero, not 10%. The administration's tariffs have no basis in logic and are going against the basis of a two nations' partnership. This is not the act of a friend," Albanese said on Wednesday.

The prime minister also added that his government

would not seek to introduce reciprocal tariffs.

On Wednesday, Trump announced the introduction of reciprocal tariffs on imports from other countries. The base rate will be 10%, but as Trump noted, the US will charge approximately half of the tariffs that other countries impose on American goods.

He said all citizens aged 50 years and above can avail from this scheme and it will be open to people of all castes, religions, income groups, and regions. Residents from both cities and villages of Punjab can benefit from the initiative.

The objective of this journey is to showcase the state's rich spiritual, religious, and cultural heritage by covering major religious sites.He also said that, throughout the journey, spiritual discourses and devotional singing (satsang and kirtan) will be organised. At the end of the pilgrimage, prasad will be distributed to all travellers.

A budget of Rs 100 crore has been allocated for this scheme, and if necessary, it will be further increased.

"Shri Keshab Mahanta, Assam's Minister for Revenue, Disaster Management, IT, Science, Technology, and Climate Change, along with Dr V Narayanan, Secretary, Department of Space, and Chairman, ISRO, undertook a reconnaissance visit to the proposed site for the project," ISRO said on X on Thursday. The multi-



purpose facility will play a crucial role in bolstering India's space capabilities, while also serving as a centre for research and technological

advancements, ISRO said. "Shri Mahanta assured full cooperation from the state government and proposed the establishment of a space

museum in the region to benefit students and the public," it added. Dr Narayanan welcomed the proposal and assured ISRO's support in the endeavour.

34 ST students from Tripura accused of submitting false IT certificate for scholarship

Agartala, April 3 (UNI) : Tripura Tribal Welfare department has issued show cause notices to 34 students for submitting false income tax certificate to avail scholarship and asked them to explain why FIRs should not be lodged against them for alleged forgery.

Show cause has given 15 days time to submit their responses after they were allegedly found to have applied for ST Post-Matric Scholarship for 2023-24 through the

National Scholarship Portal (NSP) using fake income certificates, said Director of Tripura Tribal Welfare Department Subhasish Das.

It has been revealed from the inquiries conducted by competent administrative authorities that 34 students had applied for ST Post-Matric Scholarship for 2023-24 through the NSP, uploading fake income certificates. The production of such fake income certificates to

usurp scholarship grants constitutes misappropriation of public money, document forgery, and defrauding, Das stated.

"It amounts to a criminal offence; and therefore, the accused students are hereby asked to show cause as to why FIRs shall not be lodged against them for having submitted fake income certificates through the NSP with the motive of falsely establishing their claims for ST Post-Matric

Scholarship", the notice reads.

Their reply, if any in defence, shall reach the undersigned in writing no later than the 16th April, 2025, failing which actions shall ensue against them ex parte, it stated, adding that among the accused students, 3 were from Gomati, 4 from Khowai, 8 from West Tripura, 13 from Sepahijala, 2 are from Dhalai, one each from North and Unakoti districts and two from South Tripura.

APP arrests 2,619, seizes contraband worth Rs 75 crore in 5 yrs

Itanagar, April 3 (UNI) : In its resolute fight against the narcotics menace, the Arunachal Pradesh Police (APP) has arrested 2,619 individuals (including 534 since launch of Operation Dawn in November 2023), and seized contraband worth Rs 75 crore over the past 5 years.

This crackdown is part of the state's intensified war against drugs, aimed at dismantling drug networks and ensuring a drug-free society.

"Since 2019, the sustained efforts of the Arunachal Pradesh Police in tackling drug-related crimes have resulted in the registration of 1,452 cases and the arrest of 2,619 individuals. A total of 18,600 kilograms of psychotropic substances valued at Rs 75 crores have been seized," a police spokesperson said on Thursday.

Additionally, law enforcement authorities have destroyed 56,654.69 acres of illicit opium poppy plantations and eradicated 1,723.271 acres of cannabis cultivation, dealing a major blow to the drug trade in the region, he said.

The officer further said that the ongoing fight against narcotics witnessed a significant boost with the launch of 'Operation Dawn' on 8th November 2023. Since its initiation, the operation has led to the registration of 354 cases, arrest of 534 individuals, and the seizure of 9,557 kilograms of narcotic substances, with an estimated market value of Rs 38 crore.

"The Arunachal Pradesh Police remains committed to its mission of making the state drug-free and crime-free with unwavering support from the government and the citizens," the spokesperson said, adding that authorities vowed to sustain their crackdown on drug cartels and strengthen enforcement efforts.

Waqf Amendment Bill to manage and prevent misuse of properties: Jaiswal

Patna, April 3 (UNI) : BJP state President Dilip Jaiswal said that the Waqf Amendment Bill is for efficient management and prevention of misuse of properties.

Jaiswal told news persons here on Thursday that the poor and backward Muslims were not getting benefits of the Waqf properties and the income of the properties was also constantly declining due to mismanagement.

Referring to the Sachhar Committee report, he said that the committee had also stressed the need for efficient management of the Waqf properties. He said that once this bill becomes law, there will be financial transparency, and revenue will also increase, which will reduce dependence on government assistance.

Exotic animals worth Rs 1.3 crore seized

Aizawl, April 3 (UNI) : Mizoram's Environment, Forests & Climate Change Department, along with the Assam Rifles, seized a consignment of exotic animals worth approximately Rs 1.3 crore at Zokhawthar village on Wednesday. The animals were being smuggled from Myanmar, officials of the Champhai Forest Division said.

Among the seized animals were one albino Burmese python, 27 African spurred tortoises, and three Patagonian maras. Six people, including a Myanmar national, were arrested in connection with the smuggling. The officials identified the accused as Thawnsuangmuang of Khawmawi in Myanmar's Chin State and five others—Jessie Lalnunmawia, Biakhzapianga, Lalzuitluangi, Denga, and Lalhmangaihthanga, all residents of Zokhawthar.

They were booked under relevant sections of the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972, and produced before the Champhai Judicial District court, which remanded them to judicial custody and sent them to Champhai district jail the same day. Meanwhile, in a separate case, officials from the Wildlife Division of neighbouring Khawzawl district recently arrested Biakhchungnunga of Khawzawl town for poaching a barking deer and a rufous-throated partridge on March 26. He was also charged under the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972, and later produced before a district court in Champhai, which ordered his remand to Champhai district jail. Authorities have stepped up vigilance along Mizoram's border with Myanmar, as exotic wildlife smuggling has been on the rise in recent months.

Governor constitutes all-party panel on railway connectivity

Shillong, April 3 (UNI) : Meghalaya Governor Chandrashekhar H. Vijayashankar has constituted an all-party committee to discuss matters related to railway connectivity in the State.

The all-party committees would comprise recognized and registered political parties and would be headed by the Chief Minister Conrad Sangma or by a Cabinet Minister.

Chief Secretary Donald Philips Wahlang said the term of reference of the Committee is to examine and find solutions, ways and means to bring about the introduction and construction of railways in Meghalaya.

He said the Committee will assess the cost-benefit analysis of

introduction of railways in the State.

"The committee will seek the views of all stakeholders concerned and submit the recommendation to the state government," Wahlang said.

Political parties have been requested to depute two representatives. Moreover, government departments related to the matter shall be invited during deliberation to be held by the Committees.

Railways have been opposed in Meghalaya by various pressure groups, including the influential Khasi Students' Union, claiming it would encourage influx.

"Unless ILP (Inner Line Permit) is

implemented in Meghalaya we at the KSU will continue to oppose tooth and nail against railway project in Khasi-Jaintia Hills region," KSU President, Lambokstar Mangar said, adding that the KSU will discuss railways only after the central government approves ILP for Meghalaya.

ILP is a special permit required by residents of other regions of the country to enter Arunachal Pradesh, Nagaland, Mizoram, and Manipur.

On December 19, 2019, the Meghalaya Assembly had unanimously adopted a resolution urging the central government to introduce the ILP regime into the state by including

Meghalaya in the preamble of the Bengal Eastern Frontier Regulations, 1873.

Several proposed railway projects in the Khasi-Jaintia Hills region of Meghalaya, including the goods train rail line project from Assam's Tetelia to Byrnihat area in Meghalaya's Ri-Bhoi district, the ambitious 108 km Byrnihat-Shillong rail network, has remained a non-starter.

Currently only Garo Hills in western part of Meghalaya has a rail network connecting Assam with Mendipathar in North Garo Hills district.

The Chief Minister had informed the Assembly recently that due to the

opposition and stalled project the central government has asked for a refund of Rs. 209.37 crore that was sanctioned for land compensation for introducing the railway network in Khasi-Jaintia Hills.

Moreover, Sangma had said that the state government would like to "carry the people along in such an important decision" of laying a railway network in Khasi-Jaintia Hills region.

Noting that the state government "strongly feels" that there is a "need for the railways from the economic perspective of transportation," the Chief Minister said, railways would lead to more economic development allowing better prices of goods.

Sequeira fires Huracan past Corinthians in Copa Sudamericana



Rio De Janeiro, April 3 (UNI) : Leonardo Sequeira scored twice as Argentina's Huracan secured a 2-1 away win over Brazilian side Corinthians in their Copa Sudamericana group stage opener.

The visitor took the lead on Wednesday when Sequeira latched onto Leonardo Gil's set piece with a header into the bottom-left corner.

Midfielder Raniele put the host on level terms by nodding home following Andre Carrillo's corner. Sequeira restored

Huracan's advantage with a low left-footed shot that left goalkeeper Matheus Donelli with no chance.

Corinthians controlled 71 percent of possession and completed more than twice as many passes as the Buenos Aires outfit but lacked incisiveness in the final third.

Meanwhile, Peru's Melgar recovered from a two-goal deficit to salvage a 3-3 home draw against Brazilian side Vasco da Gama.Former Liverpool and Barcelona playmaker Philippe Coutinho opened

the scoring for Vasco with a long-range effort, but Gregorio Rodriguez equalized with a 39th-minute header.Argentine forward Pablo Vegetti appeared to give Vasco an insurmountable lead with goals either side of halftime, before Facundo Casto and Kenji Cabrera struck late to earn their team a valuable point.Also on Wednesday, America de Cali won 3-1 at Racing CM, Vitoria was held to a 1-1 home drawby Universidad Catolica, and Gremio prevailed 2-1 at Sportivo Luqueno.

Stuttgart powers past Leipzig to reach German Cup final

Berlin, April 3 (UNI) : VfB Stuttgart will meet third-tier side Arminia Bielefeld in the German Cup final after a 3-1 victory over RB Leipzig.

The home team started strong and took the lead in the fifth minute on Wednesday when a poorly cleared corner kick fell to Angelo Stiller at the edge of the box.

The midfielder then unleashed a stunning volley that went under the crossbar. Ermedin Demirovic nearly doubled the lead shortly afterward, but his shot was saved by Leipzig goalkeeper Maarten Vandevoort.

Leipzig began to find its rhythm and created several opportunities, with Lois Openda and Xavi Simons testing Stuttgart goalkeeper Alexander Nubel, who remained solid throughout the first half to maintain his team's narrow lead.

Nick Woltemade capitalized on a defensive mix-up by David Raum, finishing with a low shot into the bottom corner to give Stuttgart a 2-0 lead in the 57th minute.

Leipzig responded quickly through Benjamin Sesko, who scored from close range after a scramble in the area to reduce the deficit five minutes later.

The game intensified as Leipzig pushed for an equalizer, but Stuttgart scored again to secure its place in the final. A 73rd-minute corner kick found Woltemade at the near post, and his flick-on was headed over the line by Jamie Leweling."We supported each other at the right moments and made the most of our chances," said Stuttgart head coach Sebastian Hoenes.

"I have to take my hat off to the team, especially after Leipzig pulled one back. They remained dangerous, but we held on until the end. Reaching the final in Berlin is a dream, now we want even more."

Resurgent Mumbai Indians face familiar foe

Lucknow, April 3 (UNI) : Mumbai Indians will enter the 16th IPL 2025 match against Lucknow Super Giants on Friday with renewed confidence after a dominant win over Kolkata Knight Riders. This rise reflects India's growing emphasis on modernizing Railway infrastructure to meet increasing passenger demand.

The Indian Railways has three coach manufacturing units in the country – Integral Coach Factory (ICF) at Chennai, Tamil Nadu, Rail Coach Factory (RCF) at Kapurthala, Punjaband Modern Coach Factory (MCF) at Rae Bareli, Uttar Pradesh.

The Integral Coach Factory (ICF), the premier passenger coach producing unit of Indian Railways in Chennai, surpassed its previous production records for the year 2024-25, as it rolled out 3,007 coaches.

Growth in Domestic Manufacturing

Coach production in India has expanded substantially over the years. Between 2004 and 2014, Indian Railways manufactured less than 3,300 coaches on an

On that day, soon after the farmer leaders' meeting with the Central as well as Punjab ministers at Chandigarh, Dallewal and KMM leader Sarvan Singh Pandher and other farmers were detained.Later, police also cleared the protest sites.

SKM and KMM were agitating at Khanauri and Shambhu borders since February 2024 after the Haryana government stopped them from going to New Delhi by sealing the borders.

Their demands include a law to guarantee minimum support price on their produce.

Take care of electrical safety while using a cooler Mahavitaran's appeal

Kalyan/Bhandup, April 3 : With the increase in temperature, the use of coolers has started on a large scale. However, if precautions are not taken, accidents are possible. For this, Mahavitaran has appealed to citizens to take precautions for electrical safety while using coolers.

Always use a three-pin plug for coolers. Before filling water in the cooler, turn off the power supply of the cooler and remove the plug so that the cooler has no connection with electricity. After filling the water, insert the plug pin and turn on the switch. After that, do not touch any part of the cooler. The connection and wiring of the cooler should be checked by an authorized craftsman. Check the earthing. If the earthing is proper, there is no leakage current. If water is coming from the pump, turn off the power supply and touch the cooler only after that. Never touch the cooler with wet hands.“

Children should always be kept at a safe distance from the cooler and care should be taken to ensure that they do not play near the cooler. To prevent electric current from flowing through the iron exterior of the cooler, the cooler should be connected directly to the ground; so that if electric current flows through the iron exterior of the cooler, it does not get shocked. An electric circuit should be used that keeps the water pump in the cooler on for 5 minutes and off for 10 minutes. This also saves electricity.

If the wire connected to the cooler plug is broken or worn out, it should be replaced with another one. Often, due to the depth of the water, the water is not drawn even after starting the pump and the pump becomes air-locked. In such cases, priming is necessary.

Delhi court dismisses defamation case filed against ex-CM Atishi Marlena, AAP MP Sanjay Singh

New Delhi, April 3 (UNI) :A court here on Thursday dismissed a defamation case filed against former Delhi chief minister Atishi Marlena and AAP MPs Sanjay Singh. After hearing arguments of both sides, Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate (ACJM) Paras Dalal said, "Since no prima facie offence has been made out from the complaint of facts, this court declines to take cognizance of the offence.
