AIADMK stages walk out from TN Assembly

Chennai, April 4 (UNI) : The principal Opposition AIADMK staged a walk out from the Tamil Nadu Assembly on Friday after Speaker M Appavu refused permission to raise issues concerning the law and order situation in the state.

When Leader of the Opposition and AIADMK General Secretary Edappadi K Palaniswami sought to raise the issue, the Speaker refused permission. However, all the AIADMK rose from their seats and insisted that Mr Palaniswami should be allowed to speak on the issue.

After heated arguments and the Speaker denying permission, the AIADMK members staged a noisy walk out amid shouting slogans against the government.

Later, talking to reporters outside the Assembly premises, Mr Palaniswami had a dig at the Speaker for not allowing him to raise the issue and said the law and order had deteriorated in the state.

He also wondered whether a democratic government or autocratic regime was functioning in the State.

Not in race for BJP State Unit Chief post : Annamalai

Chennai, April 4 (UNI) : Tamil Nadu BJP Unit President K Annamalai on Friday said he was not in the race for the post of new President. Talking to reporters here, he said "I am not in the race for the post of BJP State Unit President".

"Let's talk after a new State President was elected", he said, while evading a question on whether he was being replaced because of insistence from the AIADMK, with which the saffron party has been making several efforts to revive the alliance for the 2026 Assembly polls, in a bid to unseat the ruling DMK.

The alliance revival efforts gained momentum after AIADMK General Secretary Edappadi K Palaniswami met Union Home Minister and BJP Poll strategist Amit Shah at Delhi and Mr Shah after the meeting posed that an NDA government would be formed in Tamil Nadu after the 2026 elections, hinting of revival of alliance with the Dravidian major, with which the AIADMK had been stating that would not revive the ties after walking out of NDA ahead of 2024 Lok Sabha polls.

Later, Annamalai, who had of late lowered his criticism against AIADMK after being an acerbic critic, too visited Delhi and met top BJP leaders, triggering speculations about revival of ties, besides change of Leadership at the State Unit.

Reports had been doing the rounds that the BJP Leadership was planning to give him a new post with long term responsibility.

China to impose additional 34 percent tariffs on all US

Beijing, April 4 (UNI) : China will impose additional 34-percent tariffs on all products imported from the United States starting from April 10, the Asian giant's Customs Tariff Commission of the State Council announced Friday. The announcement follows the US decision to impose "reciprocal tariffs" on Chinese exports to the United States, a move that the commission said does not conform to international trade rules, seriously undermines China's legitimate rights and interests, and represents a typical act of unilateral bullying.

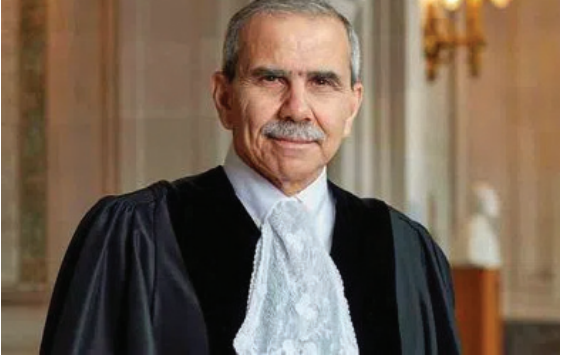
The US move not only harms the interests of the United States itself, but also jeopardizes global economic development and the stability of industrial and supply chains, the commission said in a statement. China urged the US to immediately lift its unilateral tariff measures and resolve trade disputes through consultations on the basis of equality, respect and mutual benefits, according to the statement.

Sensex down over 930 points after imposition of tariffs; About Rs 11 lakh crore lost

Mumbai, April 4 (UNI) : A widespread selling, following imposition of 26 per cent “Reciprocal Tariffs” by the US President Donald Trump, was witnessed in the stock market on Friday as the BSE Sensex suffered a loss of over 930 points to end the day at 75,364.69 and investors losing about Rs 11 lakh crore of wealth in a single day.

The National Stock Exchange (NSE) fell 345.65 points to settle at 22,904.45. The substantial drop in crude prices and significant selling in major

companies like Reliance Industries, Larsen & Toubro and Infosys contributed to the market downturn. The day opened on a negative note at 76,160.09, falling 135 points. It remained negative throughout the session. During the day, it tanked 1055 points 75,240.55, during intra-day trading, before closing at 75,364.69, down 930.67 points from its previous close. Weak global market also contributed to weak sentiments in the Asian bourses. The Foreign Institutional investors

(FIIs) continue to remain net sellers in the cash segment. The FIIs sold equities worth Rs 2,806 crore while the Domestic Institutional Investors (DIIs) bought equities to the tune of Rs 221.47 crore in the last trading session yesterday, according to latest data available. The brokers in the market said the situation in the market continues to be sensitive and asked retail investors to be cautious before taking any decision.

Stocks that were badly hit were Metal by 6.34 per cent, followed by Oil and

Gas and Commodities by 3.89 per cent each. Energy by 3.65 per cent and Reality by 3.61 per cent.

Meanwhile the government maintained that it was analysing the impact of Reciprocal Tariffs and is in discussion with the US authorities in this regard. The mid-cap declined 3.08 per cent and the small cap by 3.43 per cent. In the 30-share BSE Sensex, shares of 22 companies ended in red while that of 8 companies were in green as their prices closed higher over previous close.

Quad nations commit humanitarian assistance of \$20 mn to quake-hit

New Delhi, April 4 (UNI) : The Quad countries of India, Japan, Australia and the US, have so far committed humanitarian assistance estimated at a combined value of over USD 20 million to quake-hit Myanmar.

In a joint statement, the Quad countries said: “Through our funding and bilateral efforts, we are delivering relief supplies, deploying emergency medical teams and supporting humanitarian partners working in Myanmar to provide care for those affected by the earthquake.”

“We extend our deepest sympathies and condolences to the peoples of Myanmar and Thailand following the earthquake that struck central Myanmar on March 28.

“The significant loss of life, injuries, and widespread destruction of infrastructure worsen an already-dire humanitarian situation in Myanmar.

“We welcome recent commitments to temporary, partial ceasefires and call on all parties to implement, extend and broaden these measures, to provide a safe and conducive environment to facilitate timely delivery of life-saving humanitarian assistance throughout Myanmar.

“We welcome the ASEAN Foreign Ministers’ statements of 29 and 30 March, and the support provided by ASEAN and countries in the region to the communities affected.

“The Quad is coordinating efforts to ensure that our response effectively and efficiently distributes assistance and meets the needs of the communities affected.

The Quad’s Humanitarian Assistance and Disaster Relief Partnership has established a coordination group that is collaborating closely with other partners, including the ASEAN Coordinating Centre for Humanitarian Assistance on disaster management.

Cabinet approves four multi-tracking rail projects worth Rs 18,658 crore

New Delhi, April 4 (UNI) : The Union Cabinet has approved four multi-tracking projects across Indian Railways, covering 15 districts in three states - - Maharashtra, Odisha, and Chhattisgarh at a cost of Rs 18,658 crore.

Addressing a press conference here on Friday, Union Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw said the decision was taken at the Cabinet meeting chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Wednesday.

These projects are aimed to ensure seamless and faster transportation of both passengers and goods. These initiatives will improve travel convenience, reduce logistic cost, decrease oil imports and contribute to lower CO2 emissions, supporting sustainable and efficient rail operations, the Minister added.

With approval of these projects, the existing network of the Indian Railways will increase by 1,247 kms.

Vaishnaw said that the projects aim to enhance logistical efficiency by increasing the line capacity along the key routes for coal, iron ore, and other minerals. These improvements will streamline the supply chains, thereby contributing to accelerated economic growth.

“These projects will be completed upto 2030-31 and will generate direct employment for about 379 lakh human-days during construction period,” he said.

These projects include the Sambalpur – Jarapda 3rd and 4th Line, Jharsuguda – Sason 3rd and 4th Line, Kharsia – Naya Raipur – Parmalkasa 5th and 6th Line and Gondia– Balharshah doubling.

The projects are result of PM-Gati Shakti National Master Plan for multi-modal connectivity which have been possible through integrated planning and will provide seamless connectivity for movement of people, goods and services.

With these projects, 19 new stations will be constructed, enhancing connectivity to two aspirational districts -- Gadchiroli and Rajnandgaon.

The multi-tracking project will enhance connectivity to around 3,350 villages and about 47.25 lakh population.

Kharsia – Naya Raipur – Parmalkasa will provide direct connectivity to new areas such as Baloda Bazar.

This will create possibilities for setting up of new industrial units including cement plants in the region.

DRDO & Indian Army conduct four successful flight-tests of Army version of Medium-Range Surface-to-Air Missile

(Standard Post Bureau) New Delhi, April 4 : Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) and the Indian Army conducted four successful flight-tests of the Army version of Medium-Range Surface-to-Air Missile (MRSAM) from DrAPJ Abdul Kalam Island off the coast of Odisha on April 03 & 04, 2025.

The four operational flight-trials were carried out against high-speed aerial targets. The missiles intercepted the aerial targets and destroyed them, registering direct hits. The trials were carried out to intercept four targets at long-range, short-range, high altitude and low altitude, proving the operational capability.

The flight-tests were carried out with the weapon system in operational condition. The performance of the weapon system was validated through the flight data captured by range instruments like radars and



electro-optical tracking systems deployed by Integrated Test Range, Chandipur. The flight tests were carried out in the presence of senior officials from DRDO and the Indian

Army. The trials were carried out by the Indian Army from Eastern and Southern Commands under DRDO guidance. These trials have proven the operational capability of

SC declines petition seeking ban on social media for children below 13

New Delhi, April 4 (UNI) : The Supreme Court on Friday declined to entertain a Writ Petition under Article 32 seeking immediate judicial intervention to regulate and restrict access to social media for children under 13 years of age.

The petition highlighted an unprecedented mental health crisis due to excessive digital exposure and urged the Court to enforce strict age verification mechanisms.

A bench comprising Justice B.R. Gavai and Justice A.G. Masiah observed that the issue falls within the realm of policy-making and directed the petitioners to approach the government instead.

"We are not inclined to entertain this petition," remarked Justice Gavai, emphasizing that such regulatory matters should be addressed by Parliament.

The petition was filed through Advocate-on-Record Mohini Priya. She argued that unrestricted social media access for young children violates their fundamental rights under Article 21, which includes the right to mental well-being, dignity, and healthy development.

The petitioners sought a complete ban on social media for children below 13, citing alarming statistics on rising depression, anxiety, self-harm, and suicide rates among minors due to algorithm-driven addiction.

It also urged the Court to implement mandatory biometric-based age verification for social media platforms, Parental controls and real-time monitoring for children aged 13-18.

The Petitioner urged strict penalties for non-compliance by social media companies. There should be algorithmic safeguards to prevent targeting minors

with addictive content.

During the hearing, the petitioners argued that the Digital Personal Data Protection Act, 2023 (DPDP Act) contains inadequate parental supervision measures, which can be easily bypassed.

They pointed to international precedents in Australia, the UK, and US states like Florida, where governments have enacted laws to protect minors from social media addiction.

However, Justice Gavai reiterated that such matters fall under the government’s purview, allowing the petitioners to make a formal representation to the relevant authorities.

The Court directed that if such a representation is made, it must be considered by the government within eight weeks.

The petition cited multiple studies indicating that Indian children are highly vulnerable to digital exploitation and psychological harm.

30% of India’s social media users are between 4-18 years old.

A Maharashtra-based study found that 17% of children aged 9-17 spend over six hours daily on social media or gaming platforms.

Excessive digital exposure has been linked to declining academic performance, cognitive impairments, and long-term neurodevelopmental issues.

Neurological research referenced in the petition suggested that excessive social media consumption overstimulates dopamine pathways, mimicking substance addiction and increasing anxiety and depression risks.

The Court said that the petitioners have the option to formally present their concerns to the government, which must respond within eight weeks.

Homeopathic doctor caught red-handed accepting bribe

Chandigarh, April 4 (UNI) : The Punjab Vigilance Bureau (VB) on Friday, arrested a private homeopathic doctor Arvind Kumar of Raiya, in Amritsar district, while he was accepting a bribe of Rs 3.50 lakh in Tam Taran.

An official spokesperson of the state VB said the arrest was made following a complaint filed by Ashok Kumar of Patran town in Patiala district.

According to the complaint, Dr Arvind Kumar had initially demanded a bribe of Rs 5 lakh on behalf of Dr Sumit Singh, currently serving as Senior Medical Officer (SMO) at Manawala, Amritsar.

The bribe was allegedly meant to influence Dr Sumit Singh's testimony in favour of the complainant in an ongoing court case. The amount was later negotiated down to Rs 3.50 lakh.

He further informed that the case pertains to a matter registered against Ashok Kumar and others under the PNDT Act and NDPS Act at Patran police station, based on a complaint by Rajesh Kumar.

SMO Sumit Singh is a key witness in this case. The spokesperson added that the after preliminary verification of the complaint, the VB team laid a trap at Tam Taran where Dr. Arvind Kumar was present at the office of "Sarhadi Lok Sewa Samiti," a national-level committee working for the welfare of border area residents, particularly in dowry cases and women's empowerment.

The accused was caught red-handed while accepting the bribe of Rs 3.50 lakh from the complainant in the presence of two official witnesses. Audio recordings submitted as evidence corroborated the bribe demand, leading to the arrest.

In this regard a case under the has been registered against Dr Arvind Kumar at Flying Squad-1, VB police station Punjab at Mohali.

The accused would be produced in the competent court tomorrow. He stated that further investigationis ongoing, and the role of Dr Sumit Singh and any other individuals involved will be thoroughly examined.

Indian Army Field Hospital in Mandalay treats nearly 400 patients, NDRF team recovers 50 bodies

New Delhi, April 4 (UNI) : The Indian Army Field Hospital in quake-hit Mandalay has treated 394 patients so far, including conducting surgeries, while the NDRF team has recovered 50 bodies so far from under the rubble of collapsed buildings.

According to an update by the Ministry of External Affairs on Operation Brahma, a total of 154 patients were treated at the Army Field Hospital today, bringing the total number of patients to 394. This included two major cases of

surgeries and nine minor ones.

The National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) team recovered a total of 15 bodies today, bringing the total number of recovered bodies to 50. They are currently working on two active sites.

“Frequent tremors continue in Mandalay with low intensity below 5 Richter scale quakes. The latest tremor occurred on Thursday evening with a magnitude of 4.2.

The Indian Community members are providing translation volunteers at

the army field hospital, the MEA said.

Myanmar was rocked by a massive 7.7 Richter earthquake on March 28, and several major aftershocks later. The quake, which was centered in Mandalay, has led to over 2,000 deaths so far and caused widespread devastation.

India launched Operation Brahma to help Myanmar, sending HADR - Humanitarian and Disaster Relief supplies like food items, tents, medicines, and also sent the NDRF search and rescue team and the Indian Army field hospital.

Himachal HC slams PWD over unpaved road, initiates contempt

Shimla, April 4 (UNI) : The Himachal Pradesh High Court on Thursday came down heavily on the state Public Works Department (PWD) for failing to fulfill its commitment to pave a crucial road, and ordered contempt proceedings against top officials.

The court found that despite a 2019 assurance to complete the metalling work on the Kelodhar-Siyanj Bagda road by March 2020, the PWD left the project unfinished even after four years.

A bench of Justices Tarlok Singh Chauhan and Sushil Kukreja was hearing a petition by Hem Singh, who sought the widening and paving of the road.

The PWD had earlier submitted a status


report claiming the 11-19 km stretch (Naglog-Balidhar) would be completed by the deadline, leading the court to close the case.

However, when no progress was made, Singh filed a compliance petition, exposing the department’s inaction.

The court slammed the PWD for "willful disregard" of its orders, noting that officials neither completed the work nor sought an extension.

The contractor was fined Rs 20 lakh for delays, but the penalty was never recovered, and the contract was scrapped in March 2020.

Another contractor, assigned the remaining work, also failed, forcing the PWD to cancel the agreement in May 2021.

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PM Modi meets Mohd Yunus in Bangkok, raises safety of Hindus, growing extremism in Bangladesh

Bangkok/New Delhi, April 4 (UNI) : Prime Minister Narendra Modi held talks with Bangladesh Chief Advisor Mohd Yunus in Bangkok today, during which he underlined the need to ensure the safety and security of Hindus in Bangladesh and tackle the growing extremism which is a threat to regional stability.

PM Modi also urged that “rhetoric that vitiates the environment is best avoided”, in reference to the anti-India statements by members of the Yunus regime. And most recently during Chief Advisor Yunus’ visit to Beijing where he positioned Bangladesh as the “guardian of ocean access” for India’s “landlocked” Northeast region.The meeting, that lasted half an hour, marked the first bilateral meeting between the leadership of the two sides since the formation of the army-backed Interim Government in Bangladesh in August last year, after the dismissal of the Sheikh Hasina government. The meeting was held on the sidelines of the BIMSTEC Summit in Bangkok.PM Modi in a post on X said: “Met Mr. Muhammad Yunus, Chief Adviser of the interim government of Bangladesh.”India remains committed to a constructive and people-centric relationship with Bangladesh.“I reiterated India’s support for peace,



stability, inclusivity and democracy in Bangladesh. “Discussed measures to prevent illegal border crossings and expressed our serious concern for the safety and well-being of Hindus and other minorities.”The MEA spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal said in a post:“PM @narendramodi met @ChiefAdviserGOB of Bangladesh on the margins of BIMSTEC Summit today in Bangkok. “PM underlined India’s desire for constructive relations with Bangladesh based on mutual respect and sensitivity. “PM also underlined the need to ensure the safety & security of Hindus in Bangladesh and tackle growing extremism which is a threat to regional stability.

“India will support advancement of the BIMSTEC agenda under Bangladesh’s incoming chairship.”A statement said: Prime Minister Modi reiterated India’s support for a democratic, stable, peaceful, progressive and inclusive Bangladesh. “Enunciating India’s people-centric approach to the relationship, Prime Minister Modi highlighted that cooperation between the two countries has brought tangible benefits to the people of both countries. He underlined India’s desire to forge a positive and constructive relationship with Bangladesh based on pragmatism. Prime Minister Modi “urged that rhetoric that

vitiates the environment is best avoided”. Referring to the border, he said that strict enforcement of the law and prevention of illegal border crossings, especially at night, are necessary for maintaining border security and stability. The bilateral mechanism in this regard could meet as appropriate to review and take forward our ties, he added. Prime Minister Modi underlined India’s concerns related to the safety and security of minorities in Bangladesh, including Hindus, and expressed his expectation that the Government of Bangladesh would ensure their security, including by thoroughly investigating the cases of atrocities committed

against them. This is a concern that India has raised time and again with the Yunus regime, with the latter dismissing it as an exaggerated concern.

Prime Minister Modi congratulated Bangladesh on assuming the Chair of BIMSTEC and looked forward to the forum further advancing regional cooperation under its leadership. The leaders agreed to enhance consultations and cooperation to advance regional integration, including under the BIMSTEC framework.

Prime Minister Modi expressed his conviction that all issues of mutual interest between the two countries would continue to be addressed and resolved bilaterally through constructive discussions, in the interest of their long standing and mutually beneficial bilateral relationship.According to Bangladesh news site UNB, the Bangladesh Chief Advisor raised several issues with PM Modi including the extradition of ex-PM Sheikh Hasina, water sharing of common rivers, and border killings.

Briefing the Bangladeshi media, the Chief Adviser's Press Secretary Shafiquel Alam said “All issues of mutual interests were discussed. The meeting was very constructive, productive and fruitful,”according to UNB.

Coinciding Modi's visit, TN govt releases two SL fishermen in goodwill gesture

Chennai, April 4 (UNI) : A couple of hours after Prime Minister Narendra Modi landed in Colombo on a two-day official visit, the Tamil Nadu government late on Friday night released two imprisoned Sri Lankan Fishermen as a goodwill measure and on humanitarian grounds and their boats.This move by the ruling DMK will further cement the fact that the State government will alwayshandle the coastal issues between the two nations on a humanitarian basis, an official release said.The two Lankan fishermen, arrested by the Indian Coast Guard on March 20 this year, were released after following all due procedures initiated by Chief Minister M K Stalin.

Apart from strengthening the harmonic relations between the two Nations, the release of two Lankan fishermen and their boats further showed the government's commitment to protect the rights and livelihood of Tamil Nadu fishermen, who were subjected to frequent arrests by the Lankan Navy. Meanwhile, the Sri Lankan government also released some TN fishermen on goodwill measure coinciding with the visit of Mr Modi, who landed in Colombo this evening, reports said. The release of Lankan fishermen comes a day after Mr Stalin wrote to Mr Modi urging him to take immediate steps to review the Indo-Sri Lankan Agreement at the earliest to retrieve the Katchatheevu Island and the traditional fishing rights of TN fishermen are permanently protected.

ISRO's OCM-3 Satellite Imagery unveils global patterns in Vegetation Dynamics in space

Chennai, April 4 (UNI) : The imageries from ISRO's Ocean Color Monotor-3 (OCM-3) satellite has unveiled global patterns in vegetation dynamics in space.In an update, ISRO said satellites are indispensable in capturing global-scale vegetation patterns, enabling scientists to assess how vegetation growth shifts in response to climate dynamics, environmental changes, and human activities.

Instruments such as NASA's MODIS on Terra and the ISROs EOS-06 OCM-3 payload measure energy across visible and near-infrared regions to derive the Normalized Difference Vegetation Index (NDVI).This index is a crucial tool for understanding how photosynthesis contributes to sequestering carbon dioxide from the atmosphere into biomass and soils, forming a key component of studies on the carbon cycle.

Vegetation maps generated from these satellite observations depict a scale of “greenness” that reflects the vegetation density, type, and overall health. Regions with dense, vigorous growth are rendered in dark green, while areas with sparse vegetation appear in lighter, tan hues, with gray representing zones lacking sufficient data. This colour-coded representation illustrates the year-round lushness near the equator—where conditions such as temperature, rainfall, and sunlight are optimal—and highlights seasonal

fluctuations in vegetation as one moves toward the poles.

Advanced processing techniques have further enhanced the value of these remote sensing observations.

For example, the EOS-06 OCM-3 system operates in Global Area Coverage mode, gathering data at regular cycles and leveraging GPU parallel processing to manage the immense data volume.

By extracting specific spectral bands from Level-1C radiance products, stacking the pixel data, and applying the Maximum Value Composite method, high-resolution NDVI mosaics are generated efficiently, it said.

These products have been validated against established MODIS composites, ensuring that temporal variations and spatial patterns in vegetation are reliably captured.

Integrating these sophisticated NDVI products into visualization portals supports various applications—from academic research to practical resource management. Farmers and forest managers use detailed vegetation maps to monitor the health of croplands and forests.

At the same time, environmental scientists rely on them to analyze broader ecological trends and carbon cycling dynamics. This synergy of advanced satellite technology, high-speed data processing, and detailed mapping deepens our understanding of Earth's ecosystems.

All party meet on NEET on Mar 9 : CM, Stalin

Chennai, April 4 (UNI) : Terming the Centre's refusal to give assent to the Bill adopted in the State Assembly seeking exemption from the purview of NEET exams as a black chapter in Federal history, the Tamil Nadu Government has called for an All party meeting to decide on the next course of action on NEET.

Making an announcement in the State Assembly on Friday, Chief Minister M K Stalin invited floor leaders of all the parties to take part in the meeting. It would be held at the State Secretariat on March nine evening, he said.

While promising that legal experts would be consulted to decide on the next course of legal battle on the issue, Mr Stalin assured that his government would take all legal steps to realise the dream of young medical aspirants and their parents by exempting TN from the purview of NEET and ensuring admissions to UG MBBS courses based on the marks secured in Plus two Board exams.

However, after putting it on hold for a prolonged period, the centre has nixed the NEET Bill.

"I am telling this to this August House with a heavy heart", he said, adding, the Centre refusing nod for the Bill has shattered the dreams of young, poor and rural students aspiring to pursue medicine. "It is a black chapter in the history of Federalism", he said.The Centre's authoritarian attitude disregarding and insulting the dignity of the House, elected by the people, is a black chapter in the history of federalism as enshrined in the Constitution.

Listing out the various steps taken by the government, including formation of a one man commission headed by retired Justice A K Rajan to make recommendations to the state government on medical admissions,Mr Stalin said based on his report, the Assembly twice adopted Resolutions.First on September 13, 2021 and was sent to the Governor for his assent.

CPI-M Congress condemns passage of Waqf Amendment Bill in Par, appeals to secular forces to fight against it

Madurai, April 4 (UNI) : The 24th National Congress of the CPI(M) on Friday adopted a resolution condemning the passage of Waqf (Amendment) Bi, 2025 in Parliament and called upon all the secular forces to fight against this.

A resolution to this effected was adopted at the Congress soon after it was passed by the Parliament this evening, also demanded it complete withdrawal. It said the Bill will lead to increase in clashes among divisive forces and endanger the secular fabric of the country.

It said the Bill would affect the autonomy of the Waqf Boards and went against the interests of the Muslim community.

Citing various clauses in the Bill that affects the interests of Muslims, the resolution appealed to all people having democratic mindset to raise their voice demanding its complete withdrawals to safeguard the secularism and democracy in the country.

Another resolution adopted in the Congress demanded the Union government to immediately conduct the general census and along with it a caste census. It also appealed to all the democratic sections in the country to support and press this demand.

Expressing grave concern that the decadal census, which was due in 2021, has not been held so far, it said the Centre has also not extended the deadline of June 2024 to freeze administrative

boundaries which are necessary to conduct the census as per the administrative boundaries like districts, taluk, block or village levels.

The 2021 census, which should have begun in 2020, is indefinitely delayed. The government had then stated that the census operations can be conducted only after Covid, but even after four years, there are no signs of the census being held.

The data provided by the census enables policy planners and administrators to design policies which cater to different sections of people, it said. Pointing out that from the time of British rule, census has been conducted every ten years without fail, the resolution said even in 1941, during the Second World

War, census was held on a truncated basis. "Census provides not only a population count, but also comprehensive data which includes household data, cultivating classes and agricultural workers in the rural areas. It also provides a picture of the urban-rural population, linguistic-speaking groups and data about Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes", the resolution said.

Apart from the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes who are enumerated in the general census, there is no data on the Other Backward Classes. Hence, it is necessary to have an accurate count of the

various categories of Other Backward Classes, supporting the demand for a caste census.

A caste census will help in understanding the link between caste and socio-economic, educational development, assess the impact of ruling class policies and reservations for the welfare of the backward classes. The reality of SC, ST and certain OBC caste groups who are still denied access to resources and opportunities will come out through the caste census. The bankrupt policies of the ruling classes and their failure in realising social justice will be exposed. By not conducting the census, the one-third reservation for women in Parliament and State Legislatures provided for by the Constitutional amendment has been pushed to a distant future (at least not in 2029)

Accusing the government of not showing any inclination to conduct a census because of its general contempt for statistical surveys conducted on a scientific basis, it said various surveys have either been suppressed or the statistical parameters for the survey altered to distort it.

The census has become a victim of the anti-scientific outlook of the BJP and the Hindutva forces. The data collected in a caste census will expose the inequalities in the caste system and puncture the Sangh Parivar's claims of an over-arching religious identity, it charged.

Direct impact of US tariffs on Indian sectors will largely be neutral

The expected direct impact of US reciprocal tariffs would vary in nature for the sectors in India, with no impact on pharmaceuticals since they are exempt from reciprocal tariffs for now, a report said .

The impact is expected to be largely neutral for electronics, textiles, agricultural products, chemicals, and automobiles and parts.

At the same time, it would be negative for gems and jewellery, according to the report by CareEdge Ratings.

During FY24, India’s aggregate merchandise exports to the US stood at \$77.5 billion compared to imports from the US at \$42.2 billion.

Till now, the US had been charging an average tariff of 3.50 per cent on imports of goods from India, which is now being increased uniformly to 27 per cent in the form of reciprocal tariff.

"Reciprocal tariff imposed by US on other nations who are India’s major competitors in most of the above sectors is higher than us -- Vietnam at 46 per cent, Bangladesh at 37 per cent, China at 34 per cent, Taiwan at 32 per cent, Indonesia at 32 per cent and Pakistan at 29 per cent, which augurs well for key export sectors of India," the report said. In electronics, higher reciprocal tariffs on China would mean a neutral impact for India’s electronics exports, it said.

Apart from India, the other major textile exporters to the US are China, Vietnam, Bangladesh, and Turkey.

Except for Turkey, which has a 10 per cent reciprocal tariff, other nations face reciprocal tariffs higher than 26 per cent, which means the impact of reciprocal tariffs on India’s textile sector would be limited.

Additionally, the majority of India’s exports are cotton-based garments and home textile products. India’s self-sufficiency in cotton production should enable it to largely pass on higher reciprocal tariffs, said the report.

India has one of the highest numbers of US FDA-approved manufacturing facilities, which primarily caters to the generic medicine requirements of the US.

"This is crucial for meeting the healthcare needs of its population cost-effectively. Although the pharmaceutical sector is currently exempted from the purview of reciprocal tariffs by the US, with no immediate impact, even if tariffs are imposed, the sector should be well-positioned to pass them on significantly due to its inherent competitive strengths," said the report.

India’s overall exports of agriculture and allied products to the US are not very high.

Although, reciprocal tariff of 26 per cent is imposed vis-a-vis prevailing weighted average tariff of 5.3 per cent, the reciprocal tariff on the other major competing nations (Vietnam, Indonesia, Thailand, Pakistan) on some key agri-exports (sea food, basmati rice) is on the higher side which is expected to negate the impact of tariff imposed by US broadly.

"However, Ecuador, being the second-largest exporter of shrimp to the US, it could result in competitive pricing pressure for Indian shrimp exporters, as the tariff imposed on Ecuador is lower at 10 per cent," the report noted. Overall exports of auto and auto components to the US are very low, and accordingly, the impact of reciprocal tariff is expected to be minimal for the sector as a whole.Additionally, auto component exports to the US are crucial for OEMs in the US, and it may take time for them to replace these with other low-cost, approved vendors from other nations, thereby improving India's ability to mitigate the impact of higher tariffs in the short to medium term, said the report.However, the imposition of high reciprocal tariffs by the US on other competing nations raises the possibility of increased dumping by those nations in India, as well as in other export markets.

Trump’s Tariff Hikes: Impact on India, U.S., and Global Trade

U.S. President Donald Trump has announced a major increase in import tariffs, targeting key industries and trading partners, including India. The move aims to reduce the U.S. trade deficit and promote domestic manufacturing. However, economists warn of rising costs, supply chain disruptions, and a potential global trade war.

India’s High Import Tariffs and Trade Imbalances

India has some of the highest import tariff rates globally, averaging 17%, compared to the U.S.’s 3.3%. While India has gradually lowered its tariffs over the years—down from 125% in 1990-91 to 11.66% in 2024 and expected to decline to 10.65% in 2025—it still imposes high duties on American imports. For example, while the U.S. imposes an average 5% tariff on agricultural products from its “Most Favored Nation” (MFN) partners, India imposes 39% on similar imports. Trump’s “Reciprocal Tariffs” policy is set to match these high duties, affecting trade across multiple sectors.

Pharmaceutical Industry Faces Major Setback

India is the world’s largest supplier of generic medicines, exporting \$12.7 billion worth of pharmaceuticals to the U.S. annually. These generic drugs, which account for over 50% of all such medications sold in the U.S., help American consumers save billions in healthcare costs. If new tariffs are imposed, Indian pharmaceutical firms may struggle in the U.S. market, leading to higher drug prices and potential medicine shortages. While India currently imposes a 10.91% tariff on U.S. pharmaceuticals, the U.S. exports only \$500 million worth of drugs to India, making the impact on American pharmaceutical companies minimal. To avoid damaging trade relations, the Indian Pharmaceutical Alliance (IPA) has proposed a zero-tariff policy on U.S. medicines.

Jewelry and Electronics Exports to Take a Hit

India exports \$11.88 billion worth of gold, silver, and diamond jewelry to the U.S., but Trump plans to impose a 13.32% tariff on these products. This will make jewelry more expensive in the U.S., potentially reducing demand and affecting Indian goldsmiths and jewelers. Similarly, India exports \$14.39 billion worth of mobile phones, telecom equipment, and electronics to the U.S., and new

tariffs—set to rise by 7.24%—could increase the cost of smartphones like iPhones in America. The textile industry, which exports \$4.93 billion worth of goods to the U.S., will also be affected as higher tariffs make Indian garments more expensive for American consumers.

Agricultural Sector Braces for Disruptions

India is the world’s eighth-largest agricultural exporter, sending products like rice, shrimp, honey, black pepper, and castor oil to the U.S., while the U.S. exports almonds, walnuts, pistachios, apples, and lentils to India. Trump’s new tariffs could disrupt this \$2.58 billion trade, particularly in seafood, where Indian shrimp exports may face a 27.83% tariff hike. This could make shrimp more expensive in the U.S. while reducing prices in India, impacting fishermen’s incomes. Similarly, processed foods, sugar, and cocoa could face a 24.99% tariff increase, making Indian food products costlier in the U.S. The dairy sector is also at risk, with a 38.23% tariff hike potentially reducing India’s \$181.49 million dairy exports.

Economic Consequences in the U.S.

While Trump’s tariffs are designed to boost domestic manufacturing and reduce the \$900 billion U.S. trade deficit, experts warn of severe economic consequences. Higher tariffs will raise costs for American consumers and increase manufacturing

expenses for U.S. companies that rely on imported raw materials. Economists estimate that these tariffs could result in the loss of 250,000 U.S. jobs and shrink the economy by 0.6% due to reduced global trade.

Additionally, retaliatory tariffs from other nations could make American products less competitive in global markets, harming U.S. exporters.

Will Tariffs Boost U.S. Manufacturing?

Trump argues that tariffs will force foreign companies to shift production to the U.S., creating jobs. He cited

Hyundai’s recent \$21 billion investment in U.S. manufacturing as an example of how tariffs encourage domestic production.

However, critics warn that retaliatory trade policies could lead to long-term economic damage.

Rising Trade Tensions Between India and the U.S.

India is expected to respond to Trump’s tariffs with its own countermeasures, potentially escalating a trade war between the two nations.

If tensions continue to rise, businesses on both sides will face supply chain

disruptions, consumers will see higher prices, and the global economy could suffer further instability. The world now watches to see if these policies will strengthen domestic economies or trigger a prolonged economic conflict.

In Telangana, Dhyan Foundation gaushala was started in 2014 with a 1000 sft shed,14 km from Yadagirigutta temple gate at Challur village with 8 rescued cows .Today this gaushala on a 7 acre land which is fenced completely and is home for 1400 gauvansh which are saved from slaughter .The requirements of food, shelter, water and medicines are completely taken care by the volunteers of Dhyan Foundation.The major part of finances are also contributed by the volunteers .More than ten labour and two para-vet are appointed and are working for the welfare of these cattle.with six labour quarters ,an office room and medical storage space are built in the premises of gaushala.

Dhyan Foundation gaushala in challur which has more than 12 sheds , 6 water tanks, and more than 15 fodder bays houses Stray, injured, sick and orphaned gauvansh rescued from slaughter, Old and unproductive gauvansh abandoned by villagers and farmers and Male calves abandoned by dairy owners said Harish, a Dhyan Foundation volunteer.

We feed nourishing diet mix of dry fodder, greens,



wheat & rice bran, silage, oil-cakes, mustard oil, dalia and supplements. Medical care is provided by our team of in-house vets and paravets and Love and warmth provided under personal care of our volunteers. Massages and physiotherapy for the weak and injured are also done , Harish added

Plastic removal surgeries for garbage-eating strays and Prosthetic surgery and lifting machines are used for gauvansh with broken limbs. Today it is recognized as one of the top Gaushalas in Telangana.

Dhyan Foundation which has been working aggressively for the cause of rehabilitating cattle rescued from butchers had

found kilos of plastic in the gut of a dead cattle. We had also conducted post-mortem for few rescued cows that suddenly died. The shocking reports revealed a large amount of plastics and nails in the gut of a dead cow which choked it to death.

You would be surprised to know that cattle are exposed to harsh living conditions, rough handling, and often outright abuse and cruelty throughout their short lives. Cattle are routinely castrated, dehorned, and hot-iron branded without anaesthetics. Cattle released on the open range must fend for themselves for several months, often succumbing to weather extremes and other

dangers. Animals transported to feedlots and slaughterhouses are often shocked with electric prods, beaten, kicked, dragged and deprived of food and water for long periods. Overcrowded trucks cause broken limbs; injured and sick animals are routinely dragged out of trucks and onto the kill floor where slaughter techniques remain primitive and brutal . In this conditions we receive gauvansh at gaushala and treatment is done under experienced doctors and volunteer presence said Harish.

We help villagers by giving free govar. We also promote organic farming and traditional farming practices and equip and train rural people to produce eco-friendly products from gaumutra and govar as a step towards sustainable living. Foundation has also helped farmers by distributing buffalo's to help them become self sustainable . Many farmers have given letters of appreciation and made videos thanking the foundation and gaushala for the help that they received .

Ashwini Guru Ji believes that "It is the Dharma of every human being to protect & provide for those weaker than them". It is this thought and

According to the BSF we are the ONLY organization that has come forward to transport and rehabilitate the gauvansh rescued from smugglers to the borders by our jawans. We are the ONLY organization in the world with 90% non-milking old and unproductive nandis and gaumata said Harish.

Police file FIR in fake appointment letter case

Shimla, April 4 (UNI) : A case of a fake appointment letter has come forth in Himachal Pradesh's Agriculture Department, with Jogiram Atri, the Under Secretary of Agriculture, filing a complaint at the Chhota Shimla police station.

The police have registered the case and initiated an investigation.

The complainant informed the police that a person named Anish Kumar forged an appointment letter for the position of Junior Office Assistant (JOA) and later presented it before Joint Director Rahul Katoch at the Dharmashala office.

The letter was also verified by a contractor named Amit.

However, upon scrutiny, several irregularities were found. The appointment letter falsely stated that the recruitment was regular, whereas in Himachal Pradesh, all Class-III positions have been filled on a contractual basis since 2003.

The fake appointment letter bore the seal of the Agriculture Directorate and even included forged signatures of the Under Secretary.

At least 12 killed, over 50 injured in Russian ballistic missile attack on Ukraine's Kryvyi Rih

Kiev, April 4 (UNI) : At least 12 people were killed and more than 50 others injured in a Russian ballistic missile attack on central Ukraine's city of Kryvyi Rih on Friday, a local official said. Oleksandr Vilkul, head of the city's defense council, wrote on Telegram that the missile struck a residential area. Among those dead were three children, according to Dnipropetrovsk regional governor Sergii Lysak. The attack damaged high-rise apartment buildings and sparked fires of garages and cars, Lysak said in a statement.

Israeli army killed major Hamas money exchanger in Gaza

Jerusalem, April 4 (UNI) : The Israel Defence Forces (IDF) said in a statement on Friday that it killed Saeed Ahmad Abed Khudari, allegedly a key Hamas money exchanger, in Gaza City. According to the IDF, Khudari, struck and killed on Thursday, was "a key terror financing facilitator within Hamas".

During his role as a money exchanger, Khudari was the head of the Al Wefaq Co. fund, which was declared a terrorist organisation by the Israeli government "due to its involvement in the funnelling of money to terrorist entities," the IDF said.

According to the IDF, Khudari was "involved in numerous financial transfers to Hamas' military wing" over the years, specifically after Oct. 7, 2023.

His involvement increased following the killing of his brother Hamed Khudari in 2019, who had also served as a primary financial conduit for Hamas' military operations, the IDF said. In two other statements on Friday, the IDF said it had killed Mohammed Hassan Mohammed Awad, a senior military commander in the Palestinian Mujahideen Movement, who was allegedly involved in the kidnapping and murder of Israelis, and Mohammed Saleh Mohammed Al-Bardawil, an alleged propaganda and psychological operative in Hamas' military wing.

111 arrested in crackdown on online child sexual exploitation in Japan

Tokyo, April 4 (UNI) : Japan's National Police Agency (NPA) said Friday that a recent nationwide crackdown targeting online child sexual exploitation has resulted in the arrest of 111 individuals aged 14 to 68. The law enforcement operation focusing on offences related to online child pornography and sexual abuse marked Japan's first participation in a coordinated international investigation with five partners, such as Singapore and South Korea.

Among the 111 apprehended were high school teachers, preparatory school lecturers and company employees and teenage students, whose alleged offences included the public display and possession of child pornography.

The NPA said some of the arrests in Japan were made based on information shared through international cooperation, highlighting the effectiveness of cross-border collaboration in tackling online child exploitation.

The international investigation, conducted from Feb. 24 to March 28, led to the arrest of a total of 544 people aged 13 to 68 across Japan and other nations and regions, the NPA said.

'Türkiye wants to negotiate with US to lift additional tariffs'

Ankara, April 4 (UNI) : Turkish Trade Minister Omer Bolat said Friday that Türkiye wants to negotiate with the United States to lift the 10-percent additional tariffs. "Given the 2.4-billion-US dollar surplus in favour of the U.S. in bilateral trade for 2024, we would like to discuss with the US Department of Commerce and Trade Representative the possibility of removing the 10 percent tariffs on Turkish exports," Bolat said in a statement, adding US President Donald Trump has already indicated an openness to negotiations on these tariffs.

He noted that a visit to the United States is planned for May, during which Turkish officials will meet with their US counterparts to negotiate tariff issues.

Bolat said Türkiye would, in the meantime, intensify efforts under its "Distant Countries Strategy" to diversify export markets and attract new investment.

On Wednesday, Trump signed an executive order on the so-called "reciprocal tariffs," imposing a 10-percent "minimum baseline tariff" on all U.S. imports, with higher rates applied to certain trading partners.

UN reaffirms support for Somalia in tackling explosive threats

Mogadishu, April 4 (UNI) : The United Nations (UN) on Friday reaffirmed its commitment to supporting Somalia in the fight against explosive hazards, aiming for a safe and secure future for all citizens.

James Swan, UN secretary-general's special representative for Somalia, said improvised explosive devices (IEDs) continue to pose a significant threat to peace and security across Somalia, with 597 devices causing over 1,400 casualties in 2024.

In a statement issued in Mogadishu, the capital of Somalia, to mark the International Day for Mine Awareness and Assistance in Mine Action, Swan said landmines and improvised explosive devices have disproportionately affected civilian populations.

Chinese scientists develop atoms-thin chips to boost computational power

Shanghai, April 4 (UNI) : As silicon chips approach the limits of their physical scale, scientists are pioneering ultra-thin designs to boost computational performance.

A Chinese research team has developed a semiconductor microprocessor just a few atomic layers thick. The chip, WUJI, is a 32-bit RISC-V processor based on two-dimensional semiconductors.

RISC-V is an architecture known for being free and open-source, and for its design flexibility and low power consumption.

The microprocessor has 5,900 transistors and a complete standard cell library containing 25 types of logic units, and can perform addition and subtraction operations on up to 4.2 billion data points, allowing for the programming of up to 1 billion instructions, according to Zhou Peng at Fudan University.

The 2D logic circuits have been designed in alignment with advances in silicon integrated circuits, as has an optimized process flow, according to the study, the details of which were published in Nature this week.

The research team leveraged innovative AI algorithms to enable precise control from material-growth to integration processes, said Zhou, the paper's corresponding author. The team's approach to manufacturing and design has successfully tackled the major challenges of wafer-scale integration for 2D circuits, resulting in a groundbreaking microprocessor prototype that demonstrates the vast potential of 2D integrated-circuit technology beyond the standard silicon, according to the researchers.

Ukraine's membership not part of peace deal: NATO Chief

Brussels, April 4 (UNI) : NATO Secretary General Mark Rutte clarified here on Friday that Ukraine's potential NATO membership will not be included as part of any peace agreement.

Speaking at a press conference following a NATO foreign ministers meeting, Rutte reaffirmed that member states had agreed at last year's Washington summit that Ukraine's accession to the Alliance is "irreversible."

However, he emphasised that there was never a promise to Ukraine to include NATO membership in any peace deal. The two-day meeting also saw concerns raised over sweeping new US tariffs announced by President Donald Trump. Norway's Foreign Minister Espen Barth Eide warned on Thursday that such tariffs could contradict NATO's founding principles.

Trump extends TikTok ban deadline for another 75 days

Washington, April 4 (UNI) : US President Donald Trump said on social media Friday that he would grant ByteDance an additional 75-day extension to either sell the popular video-sharing app TikTok to a non-Chinese company or risk being banned in the United States. "My Administration has been working very hard on a Deal to SAVE TIKTOK, and we have made tremendous progress," Trump said in a post on Truth Social.

"The Deal requires more work to ensure all necessary approvals are signed, which is why I am signing an Executive Order to keep TikTok up and running for an additional 75 days," Trump said.

"We hope to continue working in Good Faith with China," he continued.

In his first term, Trump signed an executive order



effectively seeking to ban the app in the United States unless ByteDance sold its US operations to an American company, but the order didn't go into effect amid legal challenges.

In April 2024, then US President Joe Biden signed a law that gave ByteDance

270 days to sell TikTok, citing unfounded national security concerns. If the company failed to comply, the law would require app store operators such as Apple and Google to remove TikTok from their platforms starting on Jan. 19, 2025. Trump, who took

office on Jan. 20, previously signed an executive order to delay the TikTok ban by 75 days "to permit my Administration an opportunity to determine the appropriate course of action with respect to TikTok." That extension was set to expire on April 5.

Lebanese PM calls for maximum pressure on Israel to halt attacks on Lebanon

Beirut, April 4 (UNI) : Lebanese Prime Minister Nawaf Salam on Friday called for "maximum pressure on Israel" to halt its ongoing attacks across various regions of Lebanon. In a statement issued by his media office, Salam condemned Israel's latest strike, saying, "Once again, Israel targets the peace of the night, this time in the 'southern capital.'"

He described the attack on Sidon, a major city in the south, as a blatant violation of Lebanese sovereignty and a clear breach of UN Security Council Resolution 1701 and the security arrangements aimed at halting hostilities. Salam stressed the need

for "the strongest possible pressure on Israel to compel it to stop its continued attacks, especially on residential areas," emphasizing that "a complete halt to military operations is necessary."

The statement came after an Israeli drone strike at dawn on Friday killed senior Hamas commander Hassan Farhat and two of his children, Hamza and Janan, in his apartment in central Sidon.

The Israeli military claimed responsibility for the assassination, announcing in a statement that it had "eliminated Hassan Farhat, head of Hamas' western sector in Lebanon, in an airstrike on Sidon." Farhat was accused

of involvement in launching rockets toward the northern Israeli city of Safed, which resulted in the death of a female soldier and the injury of several others on Feb. 14, 2024, according to the Israeli statement.

This marks the second assassination of a Hamas leader in Sidon since a ceasefire agreement between Israel and Lebanon took effect in November last year. On Feb. 17, near the northern entrance of the city, an Israeli airstrike killed Mohammad Shaheen, who was identified as head of the operations department of Hamas in Lebanon.

The latest airstrike also followed another Israeli

strike days ago in Beirut's southern suburbs, which killed Hassan Ali Mahmoud Bdeir, an operative affiliated with Hezbollah and Iran's Quds Force. Despite the U.S.- and French-brokered ceasefire effective since Nov. 27, 2024, Israeli forces have periodically carried out strikes inside Lebanon, ranging from machine gun fire and artillery shelling to air raids, some of which have resulted in casualties, according to official Lebanese reports.

Although the agreement stipulated the withdrawal of Israeli forces from Lebanese territory, Israel has maintained a presence on five hilltops along the Lebanese border.

UN calls for urgent action to protect Iraqi children from landmine threats

Baghdad, April 4 (UNI) : The United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) and United Nations Mine Action Service (UNMAS) on Friday jointly called for immediate action to protect Iraqi children from the ongoing landmine threat.

Landmines and explosive remnants of war continue to endanger lives in Iraq, with children among the most vulnerable, according to a joint statement released by the two organizations.

The statement revealed that at least 314 children have been killed or injured by explosive ordnance over the past five years, citing UN official reports.

Iraq still faces significant dangers from explosive ordnance, with more than 2,700 square km of land remaining contaminated, it said.

"These hidden dangers not only endanger lives but

also deprive children of their rights to play, learn, and thrive," UNICEF Representative in Iraq Sandra Latouf said. Pehr Lodhammar, Chief of Mine Action Program of UNMAS in Iraq, said UNMAS is committed to supporting the Iraqi government in addressing the explosive ordnance contamination, according to the statement.

UNMAS "will spare no effort to pave the way for a safe and dignified return of Iraqi displaced people and productive use of the land," Lodhammar was quoted as saying by the statement.

Friday marks the International Day for Mine Awareness and Assistance in Mine Action, a day observed every year on April 4 and established in 2005 by the UN General Assembly to raise awareness and seek assistance for mine action.

Yemeni govt says 70 Houthi militants in Hodeidah killed

ADEN, Yemen, April 4 (UNI) : A US airstrike has killed 70 members of the Houthi militia, including prominent field commanders and experts from Iran's Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC), Yemen's internationally-recognised government announced Friday. The strike, carried out on Tuesday, targeted a Houthi gathering in Al-Fazah, a coastal area in the Red Sea port city of Hodeidah, according to Yemen's Minister of Information Moammar al-Eryani. "A precise air strike by US forces targeted a site used by the Houthis to plan terrorist attacks against commercial vessels and oil tankers in

the Red Sea, Bab al-Mandab Strait, and the Gulf of Aden," al-Eryani said in a statement posted on social media platform X. The minister added that these Houthi attacks posed "a serious threat to international maritime routes and global trade."

Al-Eryani noted that recent weeks have seen a series of concentrated US airstrikes targeting Houthi positions across several Yemeni provinces. These operations have reportedly destroyed military installations, fortifications, weapons depots, and defense systems, resulting in the deaths of hundreds of militants, including high-ranking leaders.

The Yemeni minister claimed those operations have caused "significant confusion" within Houthi ranks, despite the group's attempts to "conceal their human losses and downplay the repercussions of the strikes through a media blackout." He characterised the recent operations as "a major shift in the course of the confrontation" with the Houthis and "a strong message that any threat to regional security and maritime corridors will not go unanswered."

The minister indicated that more details about the US airstrike would be released in the coming days. The Houthi group

has not yet officially responded to the government's claims but has asserted that it launched multiple attacks on the USS Harry S. Truman aircraft carrier in the Red Sea in recent days. The latest such attacks were reported on Friday by Houthi military spokesperson Yahya Sarea in a televised statement. Sarea claimed his group struck the aircraft carrier twice in the past 24 hours with "cruise missiles and drones."

"We are confronting the US aggression against our country and are preparing to confront any potential developments in the coming period," he said.

China adds 11 US firms to unreliable entity list

Beijing, April 4 (UNI) : China has added 11 US firms, including Skydio and BRINC Drones, to its unreliable entity list, the country's commerce ministry announced on Friday. These companies, in disregard of strong opposition from China, have undertaken so-called military technology cooperation with Taiwan, seriously undermining China's national sovereignty, security and development interests, a spokesperson for the Ministry of Commerce said in a statement.

China holds the 11 firms accountable for their unlawful activities, in accordance with relevant laws and regulations, according to the statement.

China always handles issues related to its unreliable entity list prudently, and only targets the very few foreign entities that undermine China's national security, the spokesperson said.

"There is nothing to worry about for honest and law-abiding foreign entities," said the spokesperson. The Chinese government, as always, welcomes companies from all countries to invest and operate in China, and is committed to providing a stable, fair and predictable business environment for foreign enterprises that operate in accordance with laws and regulations, said the spokesperson.

10 killed after landslides bury 2 cars in Indonesia's East Java

Jakarta, April 4 (UNI) : Ten people, occupants of two cars, were killed after landslides hit and buried the vehicles in Indonesia's East Java province, a top rescuer said on Friday.

The incident occurred when the two cars were passing the Pacet-Cangar route in Mojokerto Regency on Thursday, said Nanang Sigit, head of the provincial search and rescue office. "Suddenly, landslides occurred at a side of the route, hitting the two cars and pushing them into a ravine," he told Xinhua.

"One of the cars was found at a depth of about 75 meters and another at a depth of about 50 meters. Both cars were buried under three meters of soil," Sigit said.

Meanwhile, Houthi-run al-Masirah TV reported two overnight US airstrikes on Saada province, the main stronghold of the group in northern Yemen. No casualties were reported.

Tensions between the Houthis and the US military have escalated since Washington launched fresh airstrikes on Yemen on March 15 to deter the Houthi group from attacking commercial vessels and warships in the Red Sea and Gulf of Aden. The Houthis said their attacks aim to press US-backed Israel to stop the offensive against the Gaza Strip and allow humanitarian aid into the Palestinian enclave.

Pickle your Taste buds

The ancient art of preserving food has piqued the interest of foodies worldwide. As kimchis, chutneys and kombucha go mainstream, we find out why the buzz around fermented food -the hottest culinary trend of 2015 -is getting louder.

You probably have fond childhood memories of relishing your granny's homemade achaar and chutneys. Remember the lengths you'd go to, to steal a palmful of murabba? Food, as they say, is the best nostalgia. The world over, food enthusiasts and connoisseurs have realised that a winning dish is one through which people relive their memories. Thus, fermented ingredients have gone high up on a chef's list. Sandor Katz, fermentation revivalist and author of The Art of Fermentation and Wild Fermentation, whose endorsement of fermented ingredients has played a major role in its entry into gourmet restaurant menus, describes these foods as 'the flavourful space between fresh and rotten'. "Though the process has been around for centuries, it is only now that it is being tapped for its full potential. Chefs, home cooks and even supermarkets shelves are looking beyond fermented staples like wine, cheese, bread and yogurt." Its popularity is on the rise also because fermentation increases the shelf life of food, its flavour, causes minimum wastage, is cost-effective and can be easily done at home.

THE INDIAN PICTURE

Touted as the hottest food trend of 2015, cultured foods such as the hugely popular Korean kimchi (made from vegetables), the many varieties of Indian chutney, the German delicacy sauerkraut (sour cabbage), Thai fish sauce nam pla, Jaapanese miso paste (fermented soybeans), Russian kombucha (a fermented drink made with tea) and its milky counterpart kefir, are some traditional dishes that have become mainstream ingredients in sandwiches, rolls,



Restaurant review: Cafe Immigrants

The restaurant, which started off last November, is located in the heart of the city's most hustling and bustling Connaught Place central business district. The moment I entered, I was drawn towards a large collection of photographs mounted on the walls beside the stairs that lead to the restaurant. "We all are immigrants to this world, people keep travelling and the name of the restaurant is inspired from the idea of travelling," its general manager, Pankaj Badola, told us. The interior presents an incomplete rustic look with beautiful posters and photographs - the effect enhanced by huge chandeliers, dim lighting and soft music. There is also an open area for those who would like to dine in fresh air. "There is competition no doubt, but we are sure that we will be a trendsetter in CP with our in-house fusion dishes," Badola asserted. The restaurant is the brainchild of Chef Umesh, who has been in the industry for more than a decade now, is known for his out-of-the-box ideas and who has drawn up the restaurant's menu. "For us, both quality and quantity matter. The menu has been drawn up keeping in mind

the different demands of our customers", Badola said, adding that the restaurant also has a Wi-Fi facility.

I took a table beside the window that gave a panoramic view of the crowded Connaught Place and a host of sky-scrappers.

The menu appeared never-ending, with a wide range of dishes from Ukraine to Vietnam - and crossing all over India. Interestingly, ghee (clarified butter) cans served as cutlery holders to give a traditional



touch. As I sat, I was welcomed with a paan (betel leaf)-flavoured cocktail - a drink with a strong taste of paan, mixed with dry red chillies and gulkand (rose petal jam) that left a sweet-tangy taste in mouth. Next came in Laksa - a traditional Vietnamese spicy noodle soup accompanied by a green mango chutney. Next, there was grilled chicken with aam papad, an amalgamation of a sticky Indian savoury with chicken cooked in the western style. However, it was the starters menu that amazed me with its

variety. From New Orleans southern fried chicken to mutton gulouti kebab, from a Vietnamese fish delicacy to Maharashtrian Koliwada fish fingers - the spectrum will leave you spoilt for choices. I was served Koliwada fish fingers as Badola suggested. Made from authentic Koliwada spices from Maharashtra, the fish was well marinated with the dominating taste being of the Koliwada masala. Taking care of my craving for more starters, I was presented with butter pepper garlic prawn. The prawn pieces, deeply coated with butter with a hint of black pepper, melted in the mouth the moment I gulped them. With a heavy heart, I had to stop eating the prawn dish to make way for the main course. The menu left me bewildered about what to choose from the main course. I ended up with the Cafe Immigrants speciality - khichdi served with bacon and Chicken A la Kiev, a Ukrainian dish made of fried chicken stuffed with loads of butter and garlic. The khichdi, a traditional Indian delicacy, was cooked with a lot of spices that left a rich flavour in the mouth. For dessert came the Chawanprash smoothie - a 'hatke' preparation made of the Chawanprash health supplement and mint, along with a cookie and vanilla ice-cream. Veggies won't be disappointed as the menu offers a long list of dishes like matar aur khajoor ka shammi kebab, charmoula mushrooms in white garlic sauce and methi cottage cheese with parantha to choose from. Timings: 12 noon to 11.30 pm Meal for two: Rs.2,500 Location: B block, Connaught Place

Snacking on these foods also means you don't need to pop probiotic pills, as the former contain triple the amount of bacteria. And above all,

you can go back to your childhood memories by just 'pickling' your tongue! **FERMENTATION FESTIVALS AROUND THE WORLD** Every year, to celebrate the benefits of fermented foods, world-class fermenting artisans and enthusiasts come together to set up festivals. Boston Ferments in New England, Santa Barbara Fermentation Festival in California, Fermentation Fest in Wisconsin, Ganggyeong Fermented Seafood Festival in Korea, are among the dozen festivals that were held in 2014. From holding workshops on how to master fermentation to having a market that sells homemade samples of cultured foods and drinks, these festivals give you a low-down on everything fermented. **BOTTLE-FERMENTED COCKTAILS** Bartenders and mixologists are using everything from champagne yeast to koji, a fungus used to make miso and sake, to ferment cocktail ingredients and make bottle-fermented drinks. A tricky process, this technique involves adding yeast to mixed cocktails, then bottling them and letting them sit for a spell. Openers and bowlers give LSG first home win

Lucknow, April 4 (IANS) : Half-centuries from Aiden Markram and Mitchell Marsh along with Digvesh Rath, Shardul Thakur and Avesh Khan holding their nerve while taking a wicket each helped Lucknow Super Giants register their first home win of IPL 2025 after edging Mumbai Indians by 12 runs at the BRSABV Ekana Cricket Stadium on Friday.

On a black soil pitch, Marsh capitalised on pace-on deliveries to hit 60 off 31 balls, his third fifty of the competition. After his fall, Markram stepped up to smash 53 off 38 balls, while Miller brought out the big hits in a 14-ball 27 and ensure LSG posted a 200-plus total for the second time. For MI, who conceded 69 runs in power-play, Hardik Pandya led the way with the ball by picking up 5-36, his first five-for in T20 cricket. The MI skipper used the conditions very well by relying more on his slower balls to get his scalps and become the first-ever IPL captain to take a fiver. In reply, Suryakumar Yadav and Naman Dhir hit 67 and 46 respectively to keep MI in the hunt of an uphill chase. But with Suryakumar falling in the 17th over and Tilak Varma enduring a horror time with the bat, it meant that LSG's bowlers were able to keep

things under control, especially by sticking to the wide-ball plan in the death overs, and helped the side get their sixth win over a formidable MI outfit in the IPL. Inserted into batting first, Marsh was quick off the blocks by punching Trent Boult for four and got a lucky reprieve when his edge was found by the pacer, but MI never appealed. He then hammered Deepak Chahar for three boundaries, before lofting Boult over mid-off for six and inner-edging off him for four more.

Marsh's superb march continued as he hammered

and cut off Mitchell Santner for two boundaries, before lofting and pulling Ashwani Kumar for six and four before a brace got him his fifty in 27 balls. Marsh's onslaught continued as he clubbed and punched Ashwani for two more fours as LSG ended power-play at 69/0. But against the run of play, MI broke the 77-run opening stand when Marsh looked to drive off Vignesh Puthur, but gave a simple catch back to the leg-spinner and fall for 60. Pandya struck in his first over as Nicholas Pooran couldn't get on top of a slower bouncer and top-edge was caught by short

fine leg for 12.

He came back to fox Rishabh Pant with an off-cutter and leading edge on an early flick was caught by diving mid-off, sending the LSG skipper back for just two. Amidst all this, Markram stepped up to keep LSG afloat with his sixes over long-on and boundaries over the off-side, while Ayush Badoni got a move on by lofting, sweeping and cutting Santner for a hat-trick of fours.

After hitting a four off Ashwani through an expansive scoop, Badoni tried repeating the shot on the next ball, but he

couldn't adjust for the slowness of the delivery and was caught behind by Ryan Rickelton for a 19-ball 30. Markram continued to hold the innings together by reaching his fifty in 34 balls, before being undone by yet another off-cutter from Pandya and holed out to long-off for 53. Though Abdul Samad pulled to long-on off Boult, Miller hit two fours and a six in his late knock to take LSG past 200, before he and Akash Deep were dismissed by Pandya, who is now second-highest wicket-taker with eight scalps in the tournament.

LSG's defence began on a bright note as Akash Deep struck on his fourth ball by having Will Jacks pulling straight to deep backward square leg for five. Thakur was next to strike by dismissing Ryan Rickelton in the same fashion for 10.

Dhir injected some momentum through ruthless counter-attack against Akash – pulling for his four and two sixes, before glancing to get another boundary in a 21-run fourth over, as MI eventually ended power-play at 64/2. The duo took a boundary each off both Akash and Ravi Bishnoi, before Rathi castled Dhir for 46 right after the first time out ended.

Hitesh storms into World Boxing Cup final

Foz do Iguaçu (Brazil), Apr 4 (UNI) : Indian boxer Hitesh produced a clinical performance to outclass Paris 2024 Olympian Makan Traore of France 5-0 and entered the final of the men's 70kg category at the World Boxing Cup Brazil 2025 here on Thursday.

Displaying sound tactical discipline, the reigning national champion became the first Indian pugilist to reach the final in the inaugural edition of this year's World Boxing Cup series. Hitesh will now face England's Odel Kamara in the gold medal bout.

The Indian boxer began cautiously, employing a counter-attacking strategy that helped him dictate the pace of the semi-final bout. Despite a penalty in the final round, the judges unanimously awarded Hitesh a 5-0 victory.

Among other Indian boxers, Jadumani Singh Mandengbam fought valiantly but lost 2-3 in a split decision to former Asian U-22 champion Asilbek Jalilov of Uzbekistan in the 50kg semi-final. In the 90kg and 60kg categories, Vishal and Sachin went down to Uzbekistan's Turabek Khabibullaev and Poland's Pawel Brach respectively.

More than 130 boxers from 19 countries, including several Olympians, are taking part in the World Boxing Cup Brazil 2025 — the first of three international events scheduled for the year. While competitions are being held in both men's and women's categories, India is fielding a squad only in the 10 men's weight divisions.

The next two legs of the World Boxing Cup will be held in Kazakhstan (June-July) and India (November). Ranking points earned in each event will determine qualification for the season-ending World Boxing Cup Finals.

BWF to test scoring system in global badminton events

Beijing, April 4 (UNI) : The World Badminton Federation (BWF) will test a new 3x15 scoring system across 10 international tournaments starting May 2025, the governing body announced Thursday.

Under the trial rules, matches will be played as best-of-three games, with each game won by the first player to reach 15 points. If tied at 14-14, a player must secure a two-point lead, with games capped at 21 points.

The trials, spanning Grade 3 tournaments in Mexico, Venezuela, Czech Republic, Northern Mariana Islands, Malaysia, Peru, Uganda, Australia, Vietnam and China, aim to assess whether the shorter format enhances match intensity and reduces injury risks while maintaining spectator appeal.

The BWF Council will review data and stakeholder feedback before voting on a permanent change at its 2026 Annual General Meeting.

Jamshedpur FC, FC Goa seal National Championship berths

Mumbai, Apr 4 (UNI) FC Goa & Jamshedpur FC became the first two teams in the Reliance Foundation Development League (RFDL) 2024-25 season to book their place in the National Championship at the Reliance Corporate Park here on Friday. FC Goa started their National Group Stage campaign with back-to-back losses against Diamond Harbour FC and NorthEast United FC. However, they made a remarkable turnaround in the third game, defeating Jamshedpur FC 3-0 and following it up with another convincing win over East Bengal FC. Coming into the game against Kickstart FC, the Gaurs direly needed three points to ensure qualification to the next stage of the competition.

They started the game on the front foot and broke the deadlock in the 11th minute. Malsawmtluanga's corner was improperly cleared by the Kickstart FC defence and Prachit Gaonkar drove it inside the box first time as the ball landed in Vellington Fernandes' feet and the midfielder made no mistake in scoring from close range.

FC Goa received a much-required boost in the game with the lead and showed more intent going forward. On the other hand, Kickstart pushed for an equalizer but couldn't quite find a proper breakthrough.

The scoreline remained as FC Goa looked all set to pick up the three points and in came Lalthangliana to seal the deal for his side with a second goal in the dying seconds of the game. The midfielder was left unmarked in the attacking third and he went on to dribble and score with a clean strike to make it 2-0, marking a superb comeback from the Gaurs in the competition.

FC Goa's win also meant Jamshedpur FC, at 9 points, made the cut for the National Championship, regardless of their result against Diamond Harbour, as the two sides now await their semi-final opponents from Group B.

In the other match, NorthEast United FC ended their RFDL 2024-25 campaign with a 2-0 win over East Bengal FC. Gunleiba Wangkheirakpam opened the scoring for the Highlanders with an acrobatic effort off the rebound, after the East Bengal goalkeeper spilled Huidrom Thoi Singh's attempt from outside the box.

The Red & Gold Brigade had a fair share of chances to level the scores but lacked finishing in the final third.

In the end, Fredy Chawngthansanga put the game to bed in the 90th minute scoring NorthEast United's second goal. The midfielder was left unmarked inside the box and he made the most out of a perfectly-lobbed pass from Gunleiba, to latch the ball into the bottom right corner.

Saptak Talwar bags maiden title at Adani Invitational Golf Championship 2025

Greater Noida, April 4 (UNI) : Saptak Talwar of Greater Noida ended a long wait for his maiden title after he outshined his nearest rivals at his home course with a flawless final round of five-under 67 at the Rs 1.5 crore Adani Invitational Golf Championship 2025 played at the Jaypee Greens Golf & Spa Resort here on Friday. The 26-year-old Saptak's (67-72-69-67) superb last round effort lifted him two spots from his overnight third position. Talwar, who studied at Sacred Heart University in Connecticut, USA, before turning professional, picked up the winning cheque worth Rs 22,50,000 that propelled him from seventh to fourth position in the PGTI Order of Merit.

Overnight joint leaders Arjun Prasad (68-69-69-70) of Delhi and Chandigarh's Yuvraj Sandhu (70-67-69-71) finished second and third at 12-under 276 and 11-under 277, respectively.

Saptak Talwar, who was two off the lead at the start of round four, enjoyed a hot start on Friday as he capitalized with birdies on the first two par-5s, the second and fourth holes. Saptak then added two more birdies on the fifth and 10th using his wedges to great effect. He narrowly missed a five-foot eagle putt on the par-5 12th, where he picked up his fifth birdie of the day. Talwar, who had made three three-putts for bogeys earlier in the week, then saw it home with pars on the last six holes. He made a crucial par save from eight feet on the 16th that helped keep his card bogey-free and gave him the momentum towards the end.

At around 1:30 PM in Rameswaram, he will lay the foundation stone and dedicate to the nation various rail and road projects worth over Rs 8,300 crore in Tamil Nadu. He will also address the gathering on the occasion.

Prime Minister will inaugurate the New Pamban Rail Bridge and flag off Rameswaram-Tambaram (Chennai) new train service. The bridge carries a deep cultural significance. According to the Ramayana, the construction of Ram Setu was initiated from



Dhanushkodi near Rameswaram.

The Bridge, linking Rameswaram to the mainland, stands as a remarkable feat of Indian engineering on the global stage. It is built at a cost of over Rs 550 crore. It is 2.08 km in length, features 99 spans and a 72.5-metre vertical lift span that rises up to a height of 17 metres, facilitating smooth movement of ships while ensuring seamless train operations.

Constructed with stainless steel reinforcement, high-grade protective paint, and fully welded joints, the bridge

boasts increased durability and reduced maintenance needs. It is designed for dual rail tracks to accommodate future demands. A special polysiloxane coating protects it from corrosion, ensuring longevity in the harsh marine environment.

Prime Minister will lay the foundation stone and dedicate to the nation various rail and road projects worth over Rs 8,300 crore in Tamil Nadu. These projects include foundation stone for four-laning of 28 Km long Walajapet – Ranipet section of NH-40 and dedication to the Nation of

4-laned 29 Km long Viluppuram – Puducherry section of NH-332; 57 Km long Poondiyanuppam – Sattanathapuram section of NH-32 and 48 Km long Cholakuram – Thanjavur section of NH-36. The passengers can lodge/register their complaints through the following modes available under Rail Madad App viz. official Social Media handles, Helpline No. 139, Centralized Public Grievance Redressal and Monitoring System (CPGRAMS), Mobile App, Web, SMS, E-Mail, etc.

According to a press release issued by Chief Public Relations Officer of Western Railway, Mr Vineet Abhishek, utmost priority is always given by WR for the disposal of grievances which are received on daily basis at different public grievance platforms of Rail Madad App and are closely monitored at various levels by senior railway officers. Due to these sustained efforts, Western Railway has been able to redress the grievances at a quicker pace and this has helped WR to secure the top position amongst all Zonal Railways with the Grievance Redressal Efficiency Index (GREI) score of 0.96 for the year 2023 - 24.

Mr Vineet further informed that Western Railway is at the Numero Uno position in IR for the past five years with regards to Grievance Redressal Efficiency Index (GREI). WR's share of Rail Madad complaints over Indian Railways (IR) was 4.97% till February 2025 as compared to 8.29% in April 2024, which is an immense reduction of 40%. Although the geographic

domain of WR encompasses passengers who are more aware and demanding, it has one of the least numbers of complaints per million passengers. The grievances have diminished from 219 per million passengers in April 2024 to 141 in February 2025, which is a reduction of 36%. WR's GREI score during the last 5 years, i.e. in 2022 – 23, 2021 – 22, 2020 – 21, 2019 – 20, 2018 – 19 was 0.95, 0.92, 0.99, 0.73 & 0.90 respectively. The average disposal/pendency time of WR is also one of the least in IR and at the same time, excellent feedback has been one of the highest in IR.

Mr Vineet stated that Western Railway has set up a "War Room" for the Rail Madad service at all the six divisions which monitors and responds to passenger complaints or issues on realtime basis. Western Railway handled more than 1170 million passengers with almost 47120 complaints in the year 2023 which is just 0.0040% of total passengers carried by WR. In the year 2024, this has reduced to 0.0033 % of total passengers by handling around 1247 million passengers and 41680 complaints. WR conducts regular checks & inspections at stations & trains based on the grievances and complaints received. Many 'commissionerates' of land mafias formed in UP under BJP: Akhilesh

Lucknow, April 4 (UNI) : Samajwadi Party (SP) President Akhilesh Yadav on Friday alleged that not only in Gorakhpur, Ayodhya, Lucknow or Kanpur, but in reality, many 'commissionerates' of land mafia have been formed under the rule of the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) in the entire Uttar

Pradesh. In a statement issued here, Akhilesh said that permanent land mafia protected, sponsored, and nurtured by the BJP are active on charitable land or ponds, while temporary land mafia are doing illegal work in broad daylight in illegal mining or deforestation. "Records of illegal occupation of land

are being made in the rule of 'Bharatiya Zameen Party'," he alleged. He said that the BJP is the biggest land mafia party. "Corruption in land is at its peak. BJP people are engaged in buying, selling, and occupying land at various places. In connivance with the officials, BJP people are engaged in occupying

the lands of farmers, poor people, as well as all government lands," he said.

The SP chief claimed that in Ayodhya, the BJP government gave the acquired land to its close ones. "A lot of land of farmers and traders was snatched away, and they were not even given proper compensation," he said.

He said that the people of the state are troubled by the highhandedness and anarchy of the BJP. "Farmers and the poor are not getting justice. The future of the youth is in the dark. Every section of society is troubled and miserable. The BJP government is doing anti-constitutional work," he said.

Badal seeks central probe into attack on Ambedkar statues, temples

Chandigarh, Apr 4 (UNI) Senior Shiromani Akali Dal (SAD) leader and Bhindranagar MP Harsimrat Kaur Badal on Friday sought a central probe into recent attempts to destabilise peace in Punjab and instigate communal violence by targeting statues of Babsaheb B R Ambedkar as well as temples.

Talking on this subject in parliament, Badal said it was condemnable that the

statues of Babasaheb Ambedkar had been targeted three times in the last three months but the Aam Aadmi Party government had failed to either protect them or ensure exemplary punishment for the perpetrators.

Asserting that this was being done under a design, she said a bomb was hurled at the Thakurdwara in Amritsar indicating that a wider conspiracy was at work to create a communal divide in the State.
