### Newly elected MLCs take oath at Telangana Legislative Council

Hyderabad, April 7 (UNI) : The newly elected Members of the Legislative Council (MLCs) from the Teacher and MLA quotas took oath at the Telangana State Legislative Council on Monday.

Legislative Council Chairman Gutta Sukhender Reddy administered the oath to the new members.

Among those unanimously elected under the MLA quota are Congress leaders Vijayashanti, Addanki Dayakar, and Shankar Nayak, along with Nellikanti Satyam from the CPI and Dasoju Sravan from the BRS.

In the recently held Karimnagar Graduates and Teachers' MLC elections, BJP candidates Anji Reddy and Malka Komaraiah emerged victorious. Additionally, Sripal Reddy, representing the PRTU, won from the Khammam Teachers' constituency.

However, only seven MLCs took the oath on Monday. Sources in the BRS party said that Dasoju Sravan, though elected, will take his oath on another day. The oath-taking ceremony was attended by Minister D Sridhar Babu, Union Minister G Kishan Reddy, Rajya Sabha member Dr K Laxman, MP Rathunandhan Rao, MLCs Avinash Reddy, and others.

### TGSRTC Joint Action Committee to launch strike from May 7 over unmet demands

Hyderabad, April 7 (UNI) : The Joint Action Committee (JAC) of the Telangana State Road Transport Corporation (TGSRTC) has announced its decision to go on strike starting from the midnight of May 6. On Monday, JAC leaders served strike notices to TGSRTC Managing Director V C Sajjanar and the Labour Commissioner, declaring their intention to boycott duties beginning with the first shift on May 7.

In the notice, the JAC leaders demanded the fulfilment of promises made in the Congress party's election manifesto. They also raised serious concerns over the non-payment of salaries to RTC employees, stating that wages have not been disbursed to date.

# Ministers' Committee holds talks on Kancha Gachibowli land issue

Hyderabad, April 7 : A Committee of Ministers constituted by the Telangana government held a meeting on Monday to discuss the ongoing Kancha Gachibowli land issue involving the University of Hyderabad (UoH).

The meeting, held at the Secretariat, was attended by Deputy Chief Minister Mallu Bhatti Vikramarka, Revenue Minister Ponguleti Srinivas Reddy, and IT & Industries Minister D Sridhar Babu, in the presence of AICC Telangana in-charge Meenakshi Natarajan and Congress Working Committee Special Invitee Vamshi Chand Reddy, an official statement said.

Representatives from the University of Hyderabad Teachers Association (UHTA) and civil society groups participated in the meeting, raising urgent demands including the immediate withdrawal of police from the UoH campus, revocation of prohibitory



orders, release of two students in custody, and withdrawal of all recent cases filed against protesting students.

They also called for permission to allow faculty and researchers to conduct a damage and biodiversity assessment of the disputed 400-acre Kancha Gachibowli land before the Central Empowered Committee's visit.

The delegation clarified that the University's Joint Action Committee (JAC) of

would be allowed in the disputed land until further directions from the court.

While expressing openness to visiting the campus, the ministers noted that such a visit could not be scheduled immediately due to the legal sensitivities involved. They invited student representatives for a separate meeting to directly hear their concerns and suggestions.

The government assured that all other suggestions and demands raised during the meeting were taken into consideration and would be addressed in consultation with concerned stakeholders.

UHTA Representatives present included Prof Sowmya Dechamma C.C., Prof Sriparna Das, and Prof Bhangya Bhukya.

Civil Society Members included Vissa Kirankumar (NAPM), V. Sandhya (WTJAC), K. Sajaya (WTJAC), and Imran Siddiqui (CWS-India).

## Rahul Gandhi demands caste census, abrogation of 50 pc reservation limit



Patna, April 7 (UNI) : Top Congress leader Rahul Gandhi on Monday demanded for national-level caste census and abrogation of the fifty percent upper limit of reservation for Scheduled Castes (SCs), Scheduled Tribes (STs), Backwards and other deprived in government services.

Gandhi, while addressing a conference on "save the constitution" here, said that participation of people belonging to SCs, STs, Extremely Backward Classes (EBCs), Backward Classes (BCs), and other deprived classes in top private companies was

negligible even though they were not visible in the list of beneficiaries of loans being given by banks for launching their ventures, he pointed out.

"All wealth of the country is in pockets of top ten to fifteen billionaire and corporate houses and none of them is from SCs, STs, EBCs, Backward Classes (BCs) and other deprived", Congress leader pointed out and said that government of his party in Telangana had conducted caste census and these startling realities came to fore in its report.

Caste census was like a social X-ray and it did not

create any trouble in the society as being advocated by those opposing it, he pointed out.

If X-ray was done to find out any ailment, but it did not harm the body at all, and the same was the case of social social X-ray with society, he stated while proving his point for caste census without creating any trouble.

"Caste census is an exercise which must be carried out at the national level to know the exact condition of all those who lag in tasting the fruits of development, Gandhi said, and demanded that caste census be conducted to bring forward those who lag. He also advocated for the immediate abrogation of the provision of a fifty percent upper limit for reservations in government services, saying it was a fake wall. If Prime Minister Narendra Modi did not remove the fake wall of fifty percent reservation in government services, he would do it, thundered Gandhi.

## LPG price hiked by Rs 50 per cylinder

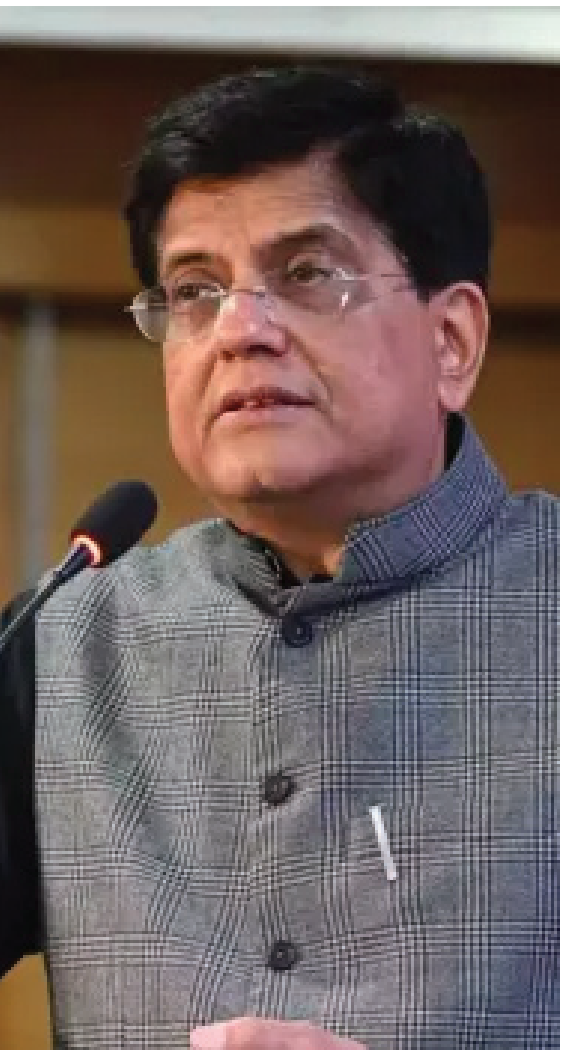
New Delhi, April 7 (IANS) : The price of LPG cylinders has been increased by Rs 50 per 14.2 kg cylinder for both subsidised and non-subsidised consumers with effect from April 8, Petroleum and Natural Gas Minister Hardeep Singh Puri announced on Monday.

The price increase applies to both Pradhan Mantri Ujjwala Yojana (PMUY) beneficiaries as well as other consumers.

"For PMUY beneficiaries, the price will rise from Rs 500 to Rs 550 per cylinder. For other consumers, it will increase from Rs 803 to Rs 853," the minister said. He added that the revision is subject to the periodic review that takes place every two to three weeks. On April 1, in a relief to people in the new financial year, oil marketing companies had reduced the price of commercial LPG cylinders.

The price of a 19-kg commercial LPG cylinder was cut by Rs 41. In the

national capital, Delhi, the revised retail selling price now stands at Rs 1,762 per cylinder. India imports about 60 per cent of the domestic LPG consumed. Price of LPG in the country is linked to its price in the international market. The number of beneficiaries getting subsidised LPG under the Pradhan Mantri Ujjwala Yojana (PMUY) has gone up to 10.33 crore as on March 1 this year while the total number active domestic LPG consumers in India stands at 32.94 crore, according to information tabled in Parliament in the recently-concluded session. While the average international price of LPG rose by 63 per cent from US\$ 385/MT in July 2023 to US\$ 629/MT in February 2025, the effective price for PMUY consumers for domestic LPG was reduced by 44 per cent from Rs 903 in August 2023 to Rs 503 in February 2025, Minister of State for Petroleum and Natural Gas Suresh Gopi told the Lok Sabha in a written reply.

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## 'Black Monday' on bourses; Investors lose about Rs 12 lakh crore

Mumbai, April 7 (UNI) : Opening after a gap of two days, India's stock market on Monday witnessed a massive crash as the benchmark indices continue to reel under the disastrous impact of US President Donald Trump's 'reciprocal tariffs' announced on April 2. The BSE Sensex dived by over 2226 points or 2.9 percent while the NIFTY saw a steep drop of over 742 points or 3.24 percent, resulting in the erosion of about Rs 12 lakh crore investors' wealth on a single day. This is the worst fall

of the indices in the last 10 months and came amidst the increasing negative sentiment regarding the stock markets because of Trump's decision to impose 26 percent tariffs on Indian imports announced on April 2, which will come into effect from April 9. Trump has also announced 25 percent tariffs on automobiles imported by the US. Such landmark announcements by Trump have shaken not only India but the entire world, with share markets of all major economies witnessing steep fall. These include NIKKEI

of Japan down by 7.83 percent, Hang Seng by 13.22 percent and similar was situation in other global market as well.

The Foreign Institutional Investors (FIIs) continued to sell in the cash segment as they sold equities worth Rs 3,484 crore and the Domestic Institutional Investors (DIIs) too sold equities to the tune of Rs 1,720 crore in the last trading session on Friday.

Commenting on the massive fall in the stock market today, Manish Jain,

Chief Strategy Officer & Director, Mirae Asset Capital Markets said "Uncertainty is the key word here. Don't assume that you know... if we don't know we don't know... So we don't know what comes next and in which area from the US administration (as of now). Currently we are living in an uncertain world, hence traditional technical and fundamental parameters may not be the right model to look at current times unless the word uncertainty is removed from the investors mind.

"Am I comfortable with the valuations at these levels; the answer is YES. Would I take a bet right now, the answer is NO as the uncertainty is really very high. My systematic investment would continue but the lump sum investment would wait. I will get better opportunities in this volatile time," he added.

In the 30-share BSE Sensex, share prices of 29 companies closed in red except for one company that is Hindustan Unilever. All sectors were hit by the negative sentiments today.



Rahul participates in "pad yatra" of Cong in Bihar

Patna, April 7 (UNI) : Top Congress leader Rahul Gandhi on Monday participated in "Palayan Roko Naukari Do" pad yatra (March) in Begusarai to highlight the "failures" of Nitish Kumar government in providing jobs to youths of Bihar and checking migration to other states in search of their livelihood.Gandhi soon after his arrival at Patna airport from New Delhi left for Begusarai for participating in "Palayan Roko Naukari Do".He participated in Pad Yatra in Begusarai where thousands of Congress workers, mostly youths and senior party leaders, accompanied him.

A day before participating in Pad Yatra, Gandhi in a video message had exhorted youths to participate in Pad Yatra in large numbers. He had asked them to be part of Pad Yatra, wearing white T-shirts.Senior Congress leaders including Bihar Pradesh Congress Committee(BPCC) Rajesh Ram, former BPCC Madan Mohan Jha and leaders of youth wing of the party participated in the Pad Yatra. Gandhi is also scheduled to participate in two programmes in Patna during the day.

Pad Yatra was taken out from Bhittharwa under the leadership of firebrand Congress leader Kanhaiya Kumar. Pad Yatra will culminate in Patna on April 11. Congress is trying to connect itself with youths of Bihar for their support in state assembly elections to be held in October-November this year. Issues relating to Jobs for youths and their migration to other states for livelihood, were being raised vigorously in Bihar in election year.

Mamata assures she'll give back jobs to eligible candidates

Kolkata, April 7 (UNI) : West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee on Monday assured that none of the eligible candidates would lose their jobs following the Supreme Court verdict that scrapped the appointments of nearly 26,000 teaching and non-teaching staff in government-run and aided schools.

Addressing a gathering of affected teachers at Netaji Indoor Stadium, Banerjee said the state government would provide alternative arrangements for eligible candidates within a specified timeframe.

“We will seek clarification from the court — what will those who are currently working do? Who will run the schools? No one, neither you nor I, has the right to let someone die of hunger,” said the Chief Minister.

Banerjee said if the jobs are not retained, it is the government's responsibility to provide employment to those who

are eligible.

"It is also the government's duty to ensure that these qualified teachers do not lose their jobs. We will take all necessary alternative steps — and make arrangements so that those who may not retain their current positions do not end up jobless. There will be no break in employment,” she said.The Chief Minister had announced the Netaji In door Stadium meeting on April 3, shortly after the country's apex court invalidated the recruitment process, labelling it "vitated."

Banerjee had then affirmed the state's commitment to exploring all legal avenues, including seeking a modification of the judgment, to protect the interests of the affected.

“While we are bound by the ruling of the Supreme Court, we are taking proactive steps to ensure the situation is handled with utmost care and fairness. We will explore all possible legal

avenues, including seeking modifications of the judgment and other relief to provide justice to those who have been affected,” the Chief Minister told the gathering at the stadium.

Raising her voice against the SC order, Banerjee said, “Do not think that we have accepted this [decision]. Our heart is also aching because of your (the affected teachers) grief.

It is because of this, they might put me in jail for saying this, but I don't care. We are supposed to stand by their (the affected teachers) side. We cannot deny the responsibility to restore their dignity and respect that they deserve,” she said.

Taking a dig at the opposition and alleging a "larger conspiracy" to break the state's education system, the Chief Minister said, “The Supreme Court didn't cancel NEET (the all India medical entrance examination) and here with a single scratch of a pen they cancelled the entire selection process.

Govt hikes excise duty on diesel, petrol; No impact on retail prices

New Delhi, April 7 (UNI) : The government on Monday hiked excise duty by Rs 2 each on diesel and petrol but it will have no impact on retail prices for consumers.

The increase in excise duty was announced even as global crude prices remained in downward spiral touching \$60 a barrel.

“PSU Oil Marketing Companies have informed that there will no increase in retail prices of petrol and diesel, subsequent to the increase effected in Excise Duty Rates today,” Ministry of Petroleum and Natural Gas said in a post on social media “X”.

The excise duty has been hiked in case of Petrol to Rs 13 a litre and Diesel Rs 10 a litre, according to an official notification by the Department of Revenue, Ministry of Finance, dated April 7, 2025.

Annual average retail selling prices (RSP) of petrol and diesel have significantly risen over the past ten years.

As per official data, average RSP of petrol and diesel in Delhi in 2024-25 (till January 30, 2025) stood at Rs 94.73 and Rs 87.63 respectively, significantly higher from 61.59 and Rs 47.01 in 2015-16.

The recent decline in global crude price could be attributed to ongoing tariff war and mounting pressure on some of the major economies.The Opposition Congress hit at the government saying that the price of crude oil has fallen to its lowest level in the last four years but consumers have been deprived of any relief.

"We are a country that believes that bilaterally we can work together with countries which have fair trade practices," Goyal said at India Global Forum.

He further said that Indian industry is very competent and can beat any competition in the world if everybody sticks to the rules of the game.

"I have no hesitation in saying that bilaterally we have a lot of elbow room in working with developed countries and countries where we find equal opportunities to do business," the Minister said.Goyal also took a swipe at the Congress-led UPA government for bulging trade deficit with China.Speaking to reporters, the Minister said that when Atal Bihari Vajpayee laid down the

office in 2004, the India-China trade deficit was at a certain level, and in the 10 years of the UPA government it surged.

"We wonder what that MoU that was signed by Mr Rahul Gandhi in China with the Communist Party of China, after which tariffs were brought down very significantly on products which China massively dumped into India, which killed many of our Indian manufacturing ecosystem and made us dependent on China. The country is still today suffering from that 10 years of mismanagement of the economy," he said.

Mob Burns Down BJP Minority Morcha President’s House

Imphal, April 7 (Waari Singbul Network): Tensions erupted in Manipur's Thoubal district late Sunday night as an angry mob vandalized and set ablaze the residence of Md Asker Ali, the president of the BJP Minority Morcha in Manipur, over his public support for the recently passed Waqf (Amendment) Bill, 2025. The violent incident, which took place around 9 PM in Lilong Sambru Makhong, a Muslim-majority area, has underscored the deep discontent among the state's Muslim community following the bill's passage in the Indian Parliament last week.

According to police reports, a crowd estimated at 7,000 to 8,000 individuals, armed with sticks, stones, and lathis, stormed Ali's home, first ransacking the property before setting it on fire. Security forces rushed to the scene, firing several rounds into the air to disperse the mob and bring the situation under control. No casualties were reported, but the house suffered extensive damage. The attack came hours after widespread protests swept through the Imphal Valley, with over 5,000 people rallying against the bill in Lilong and clashing with security personnel in areas like Irong Chesaba.

The unrest was triggered by a social media post Ali made on Saturday, in which he expressed support for the Waqf (Amendment) Bill, stating, “Do not do politics on Waqf Amendment Bill. Welcome Bill. We support WAB.” The bill, passed by the Lok Sabha on Thursday and the Rajya Sabha in the early hours of Friday after heated debates, aims to reform the management of Waqf properties across India. It has been hailed by the BJP-led government as a step toward transparency and efficiency but has faced fierce opposition from Muslim organizations and political rivals, who argue it encroaches on minority rights and religious autonomy.

Facing a fierce backlash, Ali, a known loyalist of former Chief Minister N Biren Singh, issued a public apology on social media late Sunday night. In a video statement, he said, “My name is Mohmad Asker Ali from Lilong



Sambrumakhong. I tender my sincere apology for sharing different videos on my Facebook account and making comments about my support for the passing of the Waqf Amendment Bill in Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha. I tender my apology to all my Muslim brethren and Meitei Pangal community for hurting their sentiment. I'm further adding that now I don't support the Bill and ask for its repeal immediately.”The retraction marked a sharp U-turn from his earlier stance, reflecting the intensity of the public outrage.

“In response to the escalating violence, the Thoubal District Magistrate, A. Subhash Singh, imposed an indefinite curfew across the Lilong Assembly constituency on Monday under Section 163 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS), 2023. The order bans gatherings of five or more people and prohibits the carrying of firearms, swords, sticks, stones, or other lethal weapons. The magistrate cited a report from the Superintendent of Police, which highlighted the sensitive nature of the situation and the risk of further disturbances threatening public peace.

The violence in Lilong is part of a broader wave of protests across Manipur's Muslim-dominated areas, including Kshatri Awang Leikai, Kairang Muslim, Kiyamgei Muslim, and Sora, where demonstrators

have condemned the bill as an assault on constitutional values and Muslim religious rights. The Meitei Pangal community, which constitutes about 8.4% of Manipur's population, has been particularly vocal in its opposition. Security has been bolstered across the Imphal Valley, with additional forces deployed to prevent further unrest.“

The Waqf (Amendment) Bill, now an Act following President Droupadi Murmu's assent on Saturday, seeks to streamline the administration of Waqf properties—assets donated by Muslims for religious or charitable purposes—by enhancing transparency and coordination with local authorities. However, critics, including opposition leaders and Muslim groups, argue that provisions such as the inclusion of non-Muslims in Waqf boards and the centralization of property registration undermine the community's autonomy.

As Manipur grapples with this latest bout of unrest, the incident highlights the contentious fallout of the Waqf (Amendment) Act and its polarizing impact on India's Muslim communities, particularly in sensitive regions like Manipur. Authorities remain on high alert, with senior officials closely monitoring the situation to restore calm in the volatile Lilong constituency.“//

Two arrested under NDPS Act, contraband seized in Himachal

Dharamshala, April 7 (UNI) : Two persons were arrested under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act after police recovered 194 grams of charas from their possession at Draman in Himachal Pradesh, police said here on Monday.Kangra district superintendent of police Shalini Agnihotri told UNI that police caught two persons identified as Rakesh Kumar, resident of Lehsui Tehsil Churah District Chamba and Nitish Thakur, resident of Padwan Tehsil Paddar District Mandi.The two were picked up after the police found them moving suspiciously at Draman near HDFC Bank and recovered 194 gras of charas from their possession following a search.

President Murmu, Portuguese President launch postage stamps marking 50 years of diplomatic ties

Lisbon/New Delhi, April 7 (UNI) : President Droupadi Murmu, who is on a two-day state visit to Portugal, on Monday held talks with President Marcelo Rebelo de Sousa and the two leaders also graced the launch of postage stamps commemorating 50 years of diplomatic relations between the two countries.

The President's House said in posts on X:

“President Droupadi Murmu held extensive discussions with President Marcelo Rebelo de Sousa of Portugal. The two leaders discussed various aspects of India-Portugal relations, as well as global and regional issues of

shared interest.“Both leaders agreed that the bilateral relationship is based on mutual trust, understanding and cooperation on important issues, including at the multilateral level. They agreed to further strengthen the long-standing ties in several areas including trade and investment, IT, renewable energy and connectivity.

“President Droupadi Murmu and President Marcelo Rebelo de Sousa of Portugal graced the launch of postage stamps commemorating 50 years of diplomatic relations between the two countries.

Later, President Murmu visited the Church of Santa Maria and laid a wreath at the tomb of Luis Vaz de Camoes – the national poet of Portugal. She also visited the Monastery of Jerónimos – a masterpiece of 16th-century architecture in Portugal.

Opposition slams Omar Abdullah for welcoming Rijiju after Waqf Bill push

Srinagar, April 7 (UNI) : Opposition leaders in Kashmir on Monday slammed J&K Chief Minister Omar Abdullah for according a welcome to Union Minister for Parliamentary and Minority Affairs Kiren Rijiju in Srinagar, despite that he introduced the controversial Waqf Bill in Parliament last week, which was subsequently passed by a majority vote.

Rijiju and Omar on Monday enjoyed a

morning walk together in the iconic Tulip Garden in Srinagar, nestled in the foothills of the Zabarwan range overlooking Dal Lake.

“A refreshing morning walk amid the vibrant hues of the Tulip Garden in Srinagar, Jammu & Kashmir, with Hon'ble CM Shri @OmarAbdullah ji, and also glad to meet Dr Farooq Abdullah sahab. Nature at its finest & conversations filled with warmth & vision, a truly

special morning,” Rijiju posted on X, while sharing pictures and video of the walk alongside Omar.

However, this didn't go well with the Opposition leaders.

“What's left to say when the Chief Minister of India's only Muslim majority state gives a red carpet welcome to the BJP Minister who introduced the Waqf bill meant to disempower & debilitate Muslims? Stands in stark

contrast to Tamil Nadu CM, who showed spine by swiftly introducing a resolution against Waqf bill,” Peoples Democratic Party leader Iltija Mufti said on X.

Her party leader, Rafique Rather said that the people who should have been received with protests and black flags over the Waqf Bill were given a red carpet reception by those claiming to represent the sentiments of the people.

Hyderabad, April 7 :Union Minister of State (Independent Charge) for Science & Technology, Dr. Jitendra Singh, commended the pivotal role played by Hyderabad-based CSIR institutes in advancing drug discovery, genetic diagnostics, and the development of cost-effective Active Pharmaceutical Ingredients (APIs).The Minister conducted a review meeting with the directors of three premier CSIR laboratories in Hyderabad recently to assess recent scientific contributions.

The meeting was attended by Dr D Srinivasa Reddy, Director of CSIR-Indian Institute of Chemical Technology (CSIR-IICT), Dr Prakash Kumar, Director of CSIR-National Geophysical Research Institute (CSIR-NGRI), and Dr Vinay Nandicoori, Director of CSIR-Centre for Cellular and Molecular Biology (CSIR-CCMB).The session provided a



platform to showcase significant achievements and strategic research outcomes from each institution, an official statement said on Monday. Dr Srinivasa Reddy highlighted CSIR-IICT’s key initiatives in the pharmaceutical and chemical sectors, including the development of safer agrochemicals and novel industrial catalysts. He also showcased innovations such as compostable plastics in collaboration with

GreenWorksBio and Hydrazine Hydrate production with Gujarat Alkalies and Chemicals Ltd (GACL). In sustainability, the institute’s Anaerobic Gas Lift Reactor (AGR) technology was noted for its efficiency in converting biodegradable waste into biogas and bio-manure. Dr Vinay Nandicoori shared CSIR-CCMB’s achievements in genetic research, notably being the first Indian institute to develop DNA fingerprinting technology.

He detailed the institute’s contributions during the COVID-19 pandemic, including indigenous diagnostics and mRNA vaccine development. The institute’s efforts in addressing sickle cell anemia through affordable diagnostics, establishing a national rare disease registry, and nurturing over 160 biotech startups through its Atal Incubation Centre were also highlighted.In the field of earth sciences, Dr Prakash Kumar presented CSIR-

NGRI’s work in seismic hazard mapping and resource exploration. He emphasized the development of India’s first strain map for earthquake vulnerability and ongoing seismic profiling projects in central India. NGRI’s initiatives in geothermal energy, especially in Ladakh and Chhattisgarh, were recognized as critical for the nation’s clean energy goals.Dr Jitendra Singh praised the institutes for their contributions to national missions and scientific advancement under the patronage of Prime Minister Narendra Modi. He underscored the importance of leveraging science and innovation for addressing societal challenges and achieving India’s vision of a self-reliant knowledge economy. The Minister also announced that Hyderabad-based CSIR labs will host the Startup Conclave 2025, providing a platform for emerging innovators in science and technology.

international standards and the establishment of a dedicated AI university to train the youth and create employment opportunities. He noted that Hyderabad is rapidly becoming a hub for Global Capability Centres (GCCs), with 70 centres across IT, hospitality, and other sectors launched in the past year alone.The minister emphasised efforts to decentralise industrial growth by encouraging investors to expand into cities like Warangal and Karimnagar, rather than concentrating solely in Hyderabad. He urged the delegation to inform industrialists about the opportunities available in Telangana.Minister Sridhar Babu also expressed the state’s willingness to collaborate with the Singapore government on technology, skill development, and other sectors, an official statement said.

# Dy CM orders immediate withdrawal of cases against HCU students

Hyderabad, April 7 (UNI) :Deputy Chief Minister Bhatti Vikramarka Mallu has directed police officials to immediately withdraw the cases registered against students of Hyderabad Central University (HCU).

The decision was taken during a meeting held at the Dr B R Ambedkar Secretariat on Monday, following discussions with Ministers Dudilla Sridhar Babu and Ponguleti Srinivas Reddy—members of the sub-committee engaged with the HCU Teachers Association and civil society representatives.

Emphasising the need for swift action, the Deputy CM specifically instructed officials to initiate the withdrawal of cases against two students currently in judicial remand.

Addressing media here on Monday, TPCC spokesperson Syed Nizamuddin said the Bill "threatens" religious autonomy and minority rights, and pledged that Congress would challenge it in the Supreme Court

and launch a grassroots campaign against it. He criticised the BJP-led Centre for pushing the Bill through Parliament without meaningful debate, and highlighted senior leader Sonia Gandhi’s late-night vote

against it as a symbol of Congress’s commitment. Nizamuddin argued that the Bill violates Article 26 of the Constitution by infringing on the rights of religious communities to manage their affairs.

Hyderabad, April 7 (UNI) :The Hyderabad Police have arrested three individuals for illegally procuring and selling steroids worth Rs 1.8 lakh. Acting on credible information, the Commissioner’s Task Force, South West Zone team, along with Humayun Nagar Police, apprehended Mohd Nazeer (47), the main supplier and owner of a supplement store in Yakatpura; R. Sanjeev (28),

a sub-supplier and supplement store owner in Gowlipura; and Imran Khan (40), an unemployed former gym trainer from Hakeempet, a police statement said on Monday. The trio was involved in the illegal sale of steroid injections, tablets, and capsules commonly used for bodybuilding, without valid medical prescriptions or licenses.Imran Khan was first caught near Soma Tailor, NMDC Road,

Mehdipatnam, while in possession of steroid vials. His confession led police to Sanjeev’s store, and later to Nazeer, from whom a large quantity of banned substances was seized.The confiscated material includes various growth hormone vials, capsules, and injectable steroids. Police noted that these substances are in high demand among youth seeking quick muscle gains, despite serious associated health risks.

# Telangana a role model in uplifting underprivileged: Seethakka at national meet

# Women own 39.2 pc of all bank accounts in India, highest in rural areas

Women own 39.2 per cent of all bank accounts and contribute to 39.7 per cent of total deposits in India and their participation is highest in rural areas, where they make up 42.2 per cent of account holders, the government data showed.

There is rise in demat account over the years, indicating growing participation in the stock market.

From March 31, 2021, to November 30, 2024, the total number of demat accounts increased from 33.26 million to 143.02 million, marking more than a fourfold rise. Male account holders have consistently outnumbered female account holders, but female participation has also shown a growing trend.

The number of male accounts rose from 26.59 million in 2021 to 115.31 million in 2024, while female accounts increased from 6.67 million to 27.71 million during the same period, according to the publication titled “Women and Men in India 2024: Selected Indicators and Data”, released by the Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation (MoSPI). “Rising percentage of female-headed proprietary establishments across manufacturing, trade, and other services sectors over the years 2021-22, 2022-23 and 2023-24 has been observed,” according to the data. Over the years, there has been an increase in the number of startups recognised by DPIIT with at least one-woman director, reflecting a positive trend in female entrepreneurship. The total number of such startups rose from 1,943 in 2017 to 17,405 in 2024.

The total number of electors increased from 173.2 million in 1952 to 978 million in 2024, with a notable rise in female voter registration. Female voter turnout varied over the years, reaching 67.2 per cent in 2019 but slightly declining to 65.8 per cent in 2024. The gender gap in voting has narrowed, with female turnout surpassing male turnout in 2024. The primary and higher secondary levels have consistently high gender parity index (GPI), indicating strong female enrolment. Upper primary and elementary levels saw fluctuations but remained close to parity. “The labour force participation rate (LPFR) in usual status for ages 15 years and above has improved from 49.8 per cent (2017-18) to 60.1 per cent (2023-24),” showed the data.

# The new Pamban Bridge to Rameswaram brings technology and tradition together: PM Modi

“I feel blessed to have prayed at the Ramanathaswamy temple today”, said Shri Modi, adding that on this special day, he had the opportunity to hand over development projects worth ₹8,300 crore. He stressed that these rail and road projects will significantly boost connectivity in Tamil Nadu. He congratulated the people in Tamil Nadu for these transformative initiatives.

Noting that Rameswaram is the land of Bharat Ratna Dr. Kalam,



whose life demonstrated how science and spirituality complement each other, the Prime Minister said, “the new Pamban bridge to Rameswaram symbolizes the union of technology and tradition”. He emphasized that a town thousands of years old is now connected by a 21st-century engineering marvel. He expressed gratitude to the engineers and workers for their dedication and hard work. ### 3 killed in Israeli drone strikes on South Lebanon

Beirut, April 7 (UNI) : Three people were killed on Monday in two Israeli drone strikes on southern Lebanon, according to Lebanese sources.

In one strike targeting the Dardara road, "two Syrian nationals riding a motorcycle were killed, and a Lebanese citizen was injured," Lebanon's official National News Agency reported.

A Lebanese security source told Xinhua that two air-to-ground missiles were fired at a civilian Rapid-type vehicle and a motorcycle on the road.

The Syrian nationals were identified as Shawakh Mohammad Al-Taha and Hammoud Khalaf Al-Qash, and the Lebanese, critically injured, was identified as Alaa Nasser, the source said.

Another Israeli drone strike launched earlier in the day on the village of Taybeh killed one person, according to Lebanon's Health Ministry.

Since Nov. 27, 2024, a ceasefire agreement between Lebanon's Hezbollah and Israel has been in effect, putting an end to more than a year of hostilities triggered by the war in Gaza.

Despite the agreement, the Israeli military occasionally carries out strikes in Lebanon, claiming that the operations target Hezbollah "threats."

### Syrian leader appoints new central bank governor

Damascus, April 7 (UNI) : Syria's leader Ahmed al-Sharaa on Monday appointed Abdelkader Husrieh as the country's new central bank governor, according to a decree published by state media.

The appointment was followed by an official swearing-in ceremony at the Presidential Palace in Damascus, marking the beginning of Husrieh's tenure at the helm of the war-torn nation's monetary institution.Husrieh, a Syrian economist with a background in public policy and reform, is best known for his work in financial consultation and international economic affairs.Husrieh holds a PhD in finance from Britain's Durham University, an executive MBA and bachelor's degree in business administration from the American University of Beirut, and a law degree from Damascus University. In 2012, Husrieh was elected chair of the Finance Commission of the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies.

His appointment comes amid ongoing economic reforms under the new transitional government, which has pledged to stabilise the Syrian currency and restore confidence in state institutions following more than a decade of conflict and financial turmoil.

### Kazakhstan, UK discuss energy and water cooperation in Asia

Almaty, April 7 (UNI) : Kazakh Energy Minister Yerlan Akkenzhenov met with British Ambassador to Kazakhstan Kathy Leach on Monday to discuss key areas of bilateral cooperation and shared priorities in the energy sector, according to the Kazakh government's press service.

During the meeting, the parties focused on issues related to the development of energy infrastructure and a sustainable energy transition in line with global climate goals. Special attention was given to the reliability of energy resource supplies and regional cooperation.Akkenzhenov noted that Kazakhstan and the UK have strong potential for joint work in green technologies and investments, which would benefit both nations.

The two sides further discussed the importance of regional cooperation on water and energy programs to support sustainable development in Central Asia.

### General strike staged across West Bank against Israeli assaults on Gaza

Ramallah/Gaza, April 7 (UNI) : A general strike took place across the West Bank on Monday against ongoing Israeli assaults on the Gaza Strip.

Shops, markets, schools, universities, banks, and public offices have been closed, and transportation lines have been stopped due to the strike called by Palestinian factions.

In the central West Bank city of Ramallah, hundreds of Palestinians took to the streets to condemn the Israeli "crimes" in Gaza, waving the Palestinian flag and chanting slogans demanding an end to the Israeli assaults as they marched through the streets of the city center.The strike aims to condemn the Israeli assaults on the Palestinian enclave, which have "killed and destroyed Gaza, with American complicity and support," and to urge the international community to fulfill its obligations, Issam Bakr, coordinator of the Palestinian National and Islamic Forces in Ramallah, told Xinhua.

Protests against Israel have also been staged outside the West Bank by those in solidarity with the Palestinians, Bakr said. According to the Palestinian official news agency Wafa, such protests were organized in Tunisia, Jordan, Syria, and Lebanon.

According to Gaza-based health authorities, 56 people were killed and 137 others injured in the past 24 hours, bringing the total number of fatalities and injuries to 1,391 and 3,434, respectively, since Israel ended the January ceasefire and resumed strikes across Gaza on March 18.The overall death toll in Gaza has reached 50,752, with 115,475 others injured since the very beginning of the Israeli military operations in the enclave on Oct. 7, 2023, the health authorities reported.

In addition, the Israeli strikes further strained Gaza's health system. According to a statement by Gaza health authorities on Monday, 37 percent of medicines and 59 percent of medical supplies are out of stock in the strip.

### 6 kids in ICU as E. coli infection spreads in Latvia

Riga, April 7 (UNI) : An outbreak of E. coli in Latvia has affected dozens, mostly children, with six currently in intensive care at the Children's Clinical University Hospital, local media reported Monday.

Since the outbreak began, 30 children have been hospitalised at the Children's Clinical University Hospital, 14 of whom have since recovered and been discharged, LETA news agency said, quoting the hospital representatives.In total, 57 E. coli cases have been confirmed in the country, including seven in adults.

The Centre for Disease Prevention and Control (CDC) said it is investigating multiple possible sources of the outbreak. Epidemiologists are working closely with affected schools, preschools, and general practitioners monitoring severe intestinal symptoms.

Early findings suggest at least two sources of infection. The Health Ministry reported that sequencing of patient samples shows multiple strains of the bacteria from different origins.The CDC is also coordinating with the European Centre for Disease Prevention and Control (ECDC) to guide containment measures.

## Bangladesh Election Commission prepares draft of new electoral code of conduct

Dhaka, April 7 (UNI) : The Bangladesh Election Commission has prepared the draft of the electoral code of conduct, to ensure a level playing field for future elections. However, the draft was prepared without consultation with any political parties.

The draft committee conducted a meeting in the EC building's capital in Agargaon, after which the Election Commissioner Md Anwarul Islam Sarkar spoke to the press, apprising them of the developments.

"We will sit with various stakeholders on this later. The situation will guide us on what needs to be done," he said when asked whether political parties' opinions were taken regarding the election code of conduct, according to The Daily Star.The Election Commissioner added "The draft of the code of conduct is nearly finalised. ## Yemen's Houthis say attacked military target in Tel Aviv, 2 U.S. warships in Red Sea

Sanaa, April 7 (UNI) : Yemen's Houthi group said on Monday it has launched a drone attack on a "military target" in Israel's Tel Aviv and fired cruise missiles at two U.S. warships in the Red Sea.

"We carried out an operation against a military target in Tel Aviv, using a Jaffa drone," Houthi military spokesperson Yahya Sarea said in a televised statement aired by Houthi-run al-Masirah TV.

## Australian opposition abandons election promise to ban work from home

Canberra, April 7 (UNI) : Australia's opposition party has abandoned its plan to end work-from-home arrangements for public servants and cut 41,000 bureaucracy jobs, in a major policy reversal ahead of the general elections.

Peter Dutton, leader of the opposition Coalition, announced the policy shift on Monday, admitting the party "made a mistake" and "got it wrong" with the plan that had proved unpopular with voters.

He said that a Coalition government will not change current flexible working arrangements, including work-from-home policies, for federal public servants.

Instead of cutting 41,000 public service jobs to reduce government spending, Dutton said that a Coalition government would reduce the public service workforce over five years through hiring freezes and not always replacing workers who retire or resign.

The governing Labor Party, led by Prime Minister Anthony Albanese, had repeatedly described Dutton's plan to cut the public service workforce as "Trumpian" and warned it could leave welfare

When asked about any significant changes made in the election code of conduct, EC Islam said "We have incorporated almost all the proposals of the Election Reform Commission into the draft."

Refraining from sharing any more details due to the draft having not yet been finalised, he said that the new guidelines were aimed at keeping election spending to a minimum while allowing campaigns to be conducted in an orderly manner.

"We want a code of conduct that reflects an attitude where all candidates can equally engage in campaigning,

Albanese said on Monday that the ability to work from home was beneficial for Australian families.

If neither Labor nor the Coalition wins 76 seats in their own right at the election -- an eventuality known as a 'hung parliament' -- both parties will enter negotiations with minor parties and independents for their support to form a minority government.

## Three confirmed dead in Sunday's helicopter crash in Japan



Tokyo, April 7 (UNI) : Three people have been confirmed dead after a medical transport helicopter crashed off Nagasaki Prefecture in southwestern Japan on Sunday, local media reported.

The death of an 86-year-old female patient, one of six people on board, was confirmed on the day of the incident, while a 68-year-old male family member accompanying her and a 34-year-old male doctor were pronounced dead on

Monday, Kyodo News reported, citing the coast guard.The emergency medical service helicopter took off from Tsushima Airport in Nagasaki Prefecture at 1.30 p.m. local time Sunday to transport a patient to a hospital in Fukuoka Prefecture. It was scheduled to arrive at 2.15 p.m. local time, but disappeared.

At about 5.05 p.m. local time, a coast guard boat found the missing helicopter floating upside

down and rescued three people alive and conscious. The other three passengers were also retrieved but later confirmed dead, the report said.The helicopter is believed to have struck trouble when its tracker stopped moving around 1.43 p.m. local time, the report added.Local authorities took measures to prevent the helicopter from sinking and monitored it while working to determine the cause of the accident.

## ‘At least 25 Palestinians killed in Israeli strikes across Gaza’

Gaza, April 7 (UNI) : At least 25 Palestinians were killed on Monday in Israeli strikes across the Gaza Strip, local Civil Defence said.Mahmoud Basal, spokesperson for the Civil Defence in Gaza, said two Palestinians, including a journalist, were killed and nine other journalists injured when an Israeli airstrike targeted a press tent near the Nasser Medical Complex in Khan Younis, southern Gaza.

According to Basal, among the injured was journalist Hassan Aslih, who was in critical condition. In an earlier press statement, the Israeli army identified Aslih as a Hamas member who posed as a journalist, accusing him of participating in the Oct. 7, 2023, attack and disseminating footage of the assault on social media.

### Appoints new ambassador to China

Kiev, April 7 (UNI) : Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky has signed a decree to appoint Oleksandr Nechytailo as Ukraine's new ambassador to China, the presidential press service reported Monday.Nechytailo, 51, a veteran diplomat, will replace Pavlo Riabikin, who was appointed as Ukraine's ambassador to China in April 2023.

## Iran seeks to negotiate only if U.S. proves it: President

Tehran, April 7 (UNI) : Iran seeks to negotiate only if the United States stops being "dishonorable" and proves that it also wants to negotiate, Iranian President Masoud Pezeshkian said here recently.

Commenting on the possibility of indirect negotiations between Iran and the United States on the nuclear issue, Pezeshkian said Sunday night that Iran believes in negotiations, but not with one that is as "dishonorable" as the United States, which has placed Iran "under all-out pressure" and is threatening Iran every day, according to a statement published by Pezeshkian's office on Monday.

"We will negotiate with the entire world and do not want to fight with anybody. However, we will not acquiesce to being dishonored and will not negotiate at any price," he said. "They (the United States) should also prove they want to negotiate."

Iran does not want to make "unpeaceful" uses of its nuclear capabilities, he noted.

Meanwhile, Iranian Foreign Ministry spokesperson Esmaeil Baghaei said here Monday that Iran is ready for any event to unfold and is militarily capable enough to stand against any "aggression or attack."

Answering a question about Iran's scenarios facing a potential U.S. attack, Baghaei said Iran will definitely give a "decisive, immediate, and all-out response" if threats against Iran were carried out.

He also called on the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) to fulfill its responsibilities regarding the constant threats uttered by the United States and Israel against Iran's "peaceful" nuclear facilities.The issue will be discussed during an upcoming visit by IAEA Director General Rafael Grossi to Tehran, he added.

The winners of the Kalinga Super Cup 2025 will qualify for the 2025-26 AFC Champions League Two Preliminary Round. East Bengal FC are the defending champions, having beaten Odisha FC in the 2024 final in

Known for his impeccable control and late swing, the 34-year-old continues to be a reliable spearhead for Hyderabad in the ongoing season. With the record now in his grasp, Bhuvneshwar has further solidified his legacy as one of the finest fast bowlers in IPL history.

Mumbai, April 7 (UNI) : Star Indian batsman Virat Kohli on Monday became the first Indian and only the fifth cricketer in the world to score 13,000 runs in Men's T20 cricket, reaching the milestone during his 386th innings.

The 36-year-old Kohli reached the milestone upon scoring his 17th run in the match against Mumbai Indians. With this, he entered an elite club of T20 run-scorers, led by West Indies great Chris Gayle, who sits atop the list with 14,562 runs in 381 innings.

Others ahead of Kohli in the all-time T20 run-scorers list include England's Alex Hales (13,610 in 474 innings), Pakistan's Shoaib Malik (13,557 in 487 innings), and West Indies all-rounder Kieron Pollard (13,537 in 594 innings).

Kohli's achievement is even more significant as he has become the second-fastest to reach the 13,000-run mark in terms of innings taken, behind only Gayle.

Known for his consistency and class across formats, Kohli continues to be a mainstay for Royal Challengers Bengaluru in the IPL and remains one of the most dependable batters in world cricket.

# G D Birla Badminton: Priya downs Namita in a thriller for title

Mumbai, April 7 (UNI) : Second seed Priya Ambekar, MCF had a fight on her hands against top seed Namita Mehta-Vijayakar, JVPG, Juhu but kept her composure in the decider to score an upset win in an entertaining match that went the distance and lift the women's 45 singles title in the G D Birla Memorial Masters Inter-Club Badminton Tournament, co-hosted by Bombay Gymkhana and promoted by Badminton Gurukul.

An easy 21-11 first game win for Namita was no indication of the fight to come from Priya, who won the second game 21-16 and then fought tooth and nail for every point in the decider and closed the match in her favour 22-20.

Glory eluded top seeds Ayaz Bilawala and Rajesh D'Souza of Bombay Gymkhana who were upset in the 110+ men's doubles final by Prashant Mukherjee and Vilas Kuvale, RTISC, Ulwe. Mukherjee and Kuvale prevailed 14-21, 21-19, 21-16.

The Men's 45 singles semi-finals featured an upset win for Sachin Bharati, who got the better of second seed Gautam Lad 21-11, 16-21, 21-19. He will take on top seed Rajan Samant in the final, who cruised to a 21-12, 21-16 win over Prashant Shah.

Bombay Gym A and MIG Cricket Club kept their hopes alive in the Elite Cup of the Team Championships by entering the semi-finals with contrasting wins. While Bombay Gym blanked CCI 2-0, MIG Cricket Club had to beat back a challenge from MCA before winning 2-1.

# Krunal cripples MI as RCB conquer Fortress Wankhede

Mumbai, April 7 (UNI) : A resurgent Royal Challengers Bangalore finally broke their 10-year Wankhede hoodoo on Monday night, scripting a 12-run win over Mumbai Indians in a thrilling, high-scoring IPL clash.

But more than the result, it was the sensational four-wicket haul from Krunal Pandya and clutch performances from Josh Hazlewood and Yash Dayal that stole the spotlight in a tense chase that saw MI fall agonisingly short despite a valiant blitz from their middle order.

Chasing a steep 221, MI's innings mirrored a classic T20 rollercoaster — fast starts, blistering boundaries, wickets in clumps, and the ever-present hope of a last-over miracle.

It all began with Rohit Sharma showing flashes of vintage form, whipping Bhuvneshwar Kumar for a six and two crisp boundaries inside the opening over.

Debutant Ryan Rickelton joined the fun, unfurling glorious drives and timing the ball sweetly to take 13 runs off Bhuvi's first. The pair quickly propelled MI to 31/0 by the end of the second over.



However, RCB struck early blows to halt the momentum. Yash Dayal cleaned up Rohit with a searing inswinger that crashed into leg stump (17 off 9), and Hazlewood pinned Rickelton LBW (17 off 10) after a successful review — the delivery jaggling in just enough to catch him in front.

Suryakumar Yadav threatened to take the game away with his trademark flair, peppering the off-side with boundaries off Krunal and Hazlewood. But just when MI seemed to be stabilising, SKY was undone by a slower one from Dayal, holing out to Livingstone for 28 (26), leaving MI wobbling at 99/4 in the 12th over. The stage

was then set for the Pandya brothers. Tilak Varma and Hardik Pandya launched an onslaught, smashing 63 runs in just 25 balls between overs 13 to 17. Hardik, in particular, was unstoppable — smashing Hazlewood for two colossal sixes and a four in the 14th over, and Krunal for back-to-back sixes to bring up a 50-run stand in no time.

He raced to 42 off just 15 balls, threatening to single-handedly tilt the game MI's way.

At the other end, Tilak Varma brought up his first fifty of the season (56 off 29) with a series of sweeps and reverse-hits, including a six and a four off Suyash Sharma. With 41 needed off the final three overs, MI

faint MI hopes with a lucky edge for four, but was then caught by Yash Dayal at fine leg trying to scoop a low full-toss — Krunal sealing his four-wicket haul. He capped it off by rapping Bumrah on the pads with a ball drifting in, and RCB players erupted in joy as Wankhede fell silent.

Krunal's spell read 4-0-30-4, a career-best effort under lights and pressure.

A ferocious exhibition of strokeplay from skipper Rajat Patidar and veteran Virat Kohli propelled Royal Challengers Bangalore (RCB) to a formidable 221 for 5 against Mumbai Indians (MI) in Match 20 of IPL 2025 at the Wankhede Stadium on Monday.

Opting to bowl first, MI struck early as Trent Boult removed Philip Salt for 4 in the first over.

However, Kohli and Devdutt Padikkal counter-attacked with a 91-run stand that firmly swung momentum in RCB's favour. Kohli, in vintage touch, unfurled a series of crisp strokes including a heave off Jasprit Bumrah for a 78-metre six.

He raised his half-century in just 29 balls with a slogsweep for an 80m six off Vignesh Puthur, finishing with 67 off 42 balls (8x4, 2x6).

# EC of AIFF formed eight-member task force to discuss MRA

New Delhi, April 7 (UNI) : The All India Football Federation's Executive Committee met at the Football House on Monday, to discuss the Master Rights Agreement (MRA) proposal given to the federation by Football Sports Development Ltd.

AIFF President Kalyan Chaubey chaired the meeting, which was attended by Vice President NA Haris, Treasurer Kipa Ajay, Deputy Secretary General Satyanarayan M, along with members Arif Ali, GP Palguna, Lalnghinglova Hmar, Menla Ethenpa, Mohan Lal, Neibou Sekhose, Syed Husnain Naqvi, Syed Imtiaz Hussain, Valanka Alemao, Vijay Bali, Thongam Tababi Devi, Pinky Bompal Magar, Shabbir Ali, Bhaichung Bhutia, and Climax Lawrence.

The committee deliberated in detail about the MRA, and decided to form an eight-member task force to look into the MRA negotiations with FSDL. The task force will consist of the AIFF President, Vice President, Treasurer, Secretary General, Deputy Secretary General,

Chairperson and Deputy Chairperson of the Finance Committee, and the Chairperson of the League Committee.

Arjuna awardee Subrata Paul, the Director of National Teams, submitted a report on India's 'AFC Asian Cup 2027' Final Round Qualifier against Bangladesh held on March 25, 2025 at Shillong.

The committee proposed a set of communications guidelines be set for all AIFF affairs, including national teams.

The house further proposed to appoint a spokesperson, who would be authorised to issue statements on behalf of the AIFF, the AIFF sources said.

Chaubey proposed that two renowned coaches — Bimal Ghosh and Armando Colaco — who were recently conferred with the Dronacharya Award, be nominated as advisors to the AIFF President.

Ghosh and Colaco, in coordination with Technical Director Syed Sabir Pasha, National Teams Director Subrata Paul, Technical Committee Chairperson IM Vijayan, Padmashree

Awardee, and Deputy Chairperson Shabbir Ali, Major Dhyanchand Awardee, will support the chief coaches of the men's and women's national teams across all age categories.

They will coordinate with the coaches on matters such as the requirement for the duration of camps, scouting, and exposure matches for the respective teams. The aforementioned task force will also submit a quarterly report on the same to the AIFF.

The Executive Committee suggested that a Normalisation Committee be formed that will expedite the conduct of elections in the Jammu & Kashmir Football Association and the Tamil Nadu Football Association.

The committee proposed the formation of a four-member task force, consisting of DIG CISF Jitender Rana, IPS, Secretary, Services Sports Control Board, Varun Singh, Secretary, Railway Sports Promotion Board, Prem Chand Lochab, and Dronacharya awardee Bimal Ghosh, former coach of Air India.

The Fiji Pharmaceutical & Biomedical Services had received 3,000 units of saline solution last week and another 4,200 units is yet to be cleared by the Fiji Procurement Office.

The Ministry said it is optimistic that the current supply of IV fluids is sufficient to meet the surge in dengue fever cases.

# Congress slams Modi govt’s 'silence' on market crash amid US tariff war

New Delhi, April 7 (UNI) : Expressing concern over the stock market crash following US President Donald Trump’s imposition of tariffs, the Congress party on Monday questioned the Modi government’s “conspicuous silence” on addressing the fallout of the ongoing trade war.

In a video message on

X, Congress spokesperson Supriya Shrinate said, “Indian stock markets opened at the lowest level since Covid happened in 2020.”

She said, “Within the first five minutes, 19 lakh crore worth of market cap had been eroded. Helpless investors have nowhere to turn to Mr Modi and Mr Shah, who were openly

advocating and giving stock market tips, are mum”. She claimed that the tariff imposed by President Trump on India will devastate the country’s economy and job creation.

She said, “Countries all over the world, including China, EU, France, Spain, Britain, Brazil, Canada and Australia, have spoken

against this tariff and have even promised help for their industries and companies that will be at the receiving end of the tariff imposed. But no such word of assurance, no word of protest from the Indian government.”

“Mr. Modi, staying conspicuously silent is no longer an option,” she added.
