

Govt committed to end Naxalism: PM Madras High Court stays TN laws on VCs appointment by govt to State-run varsities

New Delhi, May 21 (UNI) : Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Wednesday lauded the security forces for eliminating 27 Naxals in an encounter in Chhattisgarh and reaffirmed the government's commitment to eradicate the menace of Naxalism and ensure a life of peace and progress for the people. Reacting to Union Home Minister Amit Shah's post on X, Modi said, "We are proud of our forces for this momentous success. Our government is committed to eradicating the menace of Maoism and ensuring a life of peace and progress for the people. Describing the killing of 27 dreaded insurgents in Chhattisgarh's Narayanpur as a "historic achievement" in the fight to eliminate Naxalism, Shah had said the government was determined to eliminate Naxalism before March 31 next year.

At least 27 Naxals were killed and several others injured in an encounter with security forces in four different districts of Chhattisgarh on Wednesday, police said.

Chennai, May 21 (UNI) : The Madras High Court on Wednesday evening ordered interim stay on the laws vesting the powers to the Tamil Nadu Government on appointment of Vice-Chancellors (VCs) for state-run Universities.

On a petition filed by a BJP member from Tirunelveli contending that state government appointing VCs contradicts UGC guidelines, a Division Bench comprising Mr Justices G R Swaminathan and

V Lakshmi Narayanan granted the interim stay while rejecting the Tamil Nadu government's submission on hearing the matter without giving time to file its reply. Appearing for the State government, senior counsel and DMK Rajya Sabha MP P Wilson sought to know the need for taking up the matter urgently by the vacation Bench that too at 1800 hrs in the evening.

He also argued that hearing the matter without giving enough time for the government to file its reply was unfair. However, the Bench rejected it and granted the interim stay.

It may be noted that Tamil Nadu Governor R N Ravi did not give his assent to the Bills passed in the State Assembly, that included removing him from the post of de-facto Chancellor of State-run varsities and making the Chief Minister as Chancellor with powers to appoint VCs. Since they was long

delay on the part of Raj Bhavan in giving its assent to the Bills, the Tamil Nadu government moved the Supreme Court against it.

The Apex court had on April 8, using the powers vested with it under Article 142 of the Constitution, delivered a landmark and historic verdict ruling that all the Bills pending with the Governor were deemed to have got his assent.

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KTR accuses Congress Govt of corruption and governance failures

Hyderabad, May 21 (UNI) : BRS Working President K T Rama Rao launched a scathing attack on the Congress government, accusing it of turning governance into a "commission-driven circus" and using notices to former Chief Minister K Chandrashekhar Rao as a diversionary tactic.

Speaking to the media in Nalgonda, KTR alleged that the Congress regime is steeped in corruption, with commissions of 20–30 per cent becoming routine.

“Even their own MLAs and ministers admit that no work happens without commissions,” he said, pointing to a recent protest by contractors at the Deputy CM’s office as evidence of widespread graft.

KTR claimed that the Congress-BJP alliance is conspiring to tarnish the Kaleshwaram Project and

that notices to KCR are part of this political agenda.

He asserted, “Truth and justice will prevail—we have full faith in the judiciary.”

Highlighting governance lapses, KTR cited failures such as the collapse of the Sunkishala retaining wall, the submergence of the Vattem pump house, repeated damage to the Pedda Vagu project, and the government’s inaction in the SLBC tunnel tragedy, where bodies remain unrecovered months later.

He further accused the Congress of using inquiries and committees to avoid delivering on its six electoral guarantees.“We will not stop until every promise is fulfilled—from Rs 2,500 for women to pensions and gold for brides,” KTR declared, warning that continued failures could provoke public revolt.

Saraswati Pushkaram enters 7th day amid devotion and spiritual fervour in Kaleshwaram

Hyderabad, May 21 (UNI) : The sacred Saraswati Pushkaram has entered its seventh day in Kaleshwaram, a revered Trilinga Kshetra known for its spiritual, historical, and natural significance.

Thousands of devotees are continuing to throng the Triveni Sangam—the confluence of the Godavari, Pranahita, and Saraswati rivers—to take holy dips and offer prayers, with the Saraswati Aarti emerging as a key attraction.

The government has also made the divine ritual accessible through live-streaming.Kaleshwaram holds a unique place in

Indian spiritual geography. Here, the Saraswati River—revered as Brahmapatni—joins the Godavari and Pranahita rivers.According to mythology, this site witnessed the simultaneous manifestation of Yama and Shiva in the form of lingams on a single panavatta. The temple town thus symbolises both salvation and judgment, making it one of the most spiritually potent locations in the country.

The presence of Saraswati here is particularly significant. Although the river is believed to have

disappeared due to geological shifts centuries ago, legends state that it still flows underground in Kaleshwaram. This has made the town the only location in southern India where Saraswati Pushkarams are officially observed.It is also one of the few places in the country where Saraswati is worshipped in her form as Maha Saraswati, while her other forms, Gyana Saraswati and Bala Saraswati, are worshipped in Basara and Kashmir respectively.

Devotees, young and old, have been seen bathing in the sacred confluence with chants of

"Hara Hara Mahadeva" echoing across the ghats. The atmosphere has been filled with devotional fervour, as conch shells are blown and prayers are offered to the river goddess and Lord Shiva.

On the seventh day of the festival, tradition holds that charity and good deeds carry special merit. Elders have long maintained that bathing alone does not bring spiritual benefits unless coupled with acts of kindness and giving.

History and local beliefs suggest that donating food, clothing, bedding, or even symbolic homes on this day brings

immense blessings. While the ritual has evolved into a community sentiment over time, its original purpose—cultivating compassion and humanity—remains relevant.The natural landscape of Kaleshwaram enhances the spiritual experience. Unlike the upper reaches of the Godavari, which receive limited inflows, the region sees a significant volume of water due to the confluence with the Pranahita River.

This ensures a consistent water supply for the Pushkaram festivities and reduces the risk of waterborne

diseases. Though the river appears narrow due to wide sandbanks stretching over two to three kilometres, the volume and purity of water make Kaleshwaram an ideal location for such a holy event.With the Telangana state government’s official organisation of the Pushkarams, Kaleshwaram’s spiritual legacy is now receiving broader recognition. As pilgrims continue to flock to the site, Saraswati Pushkaram in Kaleshwaram remains a profound expression of faith, tradition, and community spirit.

BJP slams CM Revanth Reddy’s remarks on national security

Hyderabad, May 21 (UNI) : BJP Legislativ Party leader Eleti Maheshwar Reddy strongly condemned Telangana Chief Minister Revanth Reddy’s remarks, alleging that the Modi-led central government yielded to pressure from former US President Donald Trump in its response to Pakistan.

In a media statement issued on Wednesday, Maheshwar Reddy described the comments as “ignorant, irresponsible,

and bordering on treason.”

He said that the Indian Army’s retaliatory strikes on terrorist camps in Pakistan following the Pulwama and Pahalgam attacks stand as evidence of the Modi government’s firm stance against Pakistan-sponsored terrorism.He accused CM Revanth Reddy of parroting a script written by Congress leader Rahul Gandhi, aimed at appeasing party leadership while undermining national security.Maheshwar Reddy

alleged that Congress leaders, including Rahul Gandhi and Mallikarjun Kharge, have repeatedly made statements in a “pro-Pakistan tone,” which he said reflects the party’s “bankrupt politics.”

He also criticised Congress’s historical handling of Kashmir, blaming leaders like Nehru and Indira Gandhi for past policy failures, and credited the Modi government for decisive actions like the abrogation of Article 370.

Panchayat Secretary caught red-handed while accepting a bribe

Hyderabad, May 21 (UNI) : In another case, the Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) on Wednesday caught a Panchayat Secretary from Gottumukkala Village in Nizamabad district red-handed while allegedly accepting a bribe of Rs 18,000.

The accused officer, Katkam Ganga Mohan, was apprehended around 12 pm when he allegedly demanded and accepted the bribe from a complainant in return for improperly allotting a house number and assessment number to an open plot, bypassing due procedures necessary for further registration.

Initially, the officer had demanded Rs 20,000, which was later negotiated down to Rs 18,000. The tainted amount was recovered from his possession during the trap operation, based on information provided by the complainant.

A chemical test confirmed the presence of the bribe traces on both of the officer’s hands and the left pocket flap of his trousers, which had come into contact with the money. The ACB stated that the officer had acted dishonestly and in violation of his official duties to secure an undue advantage.

The complainant’s identity has been withheld for security reasons.The accused officer was being arrested and produced before the II Additional Special Judge for SPE & ACB Cases, Nampally, Hyderabad.

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Modi Govt committed to total eradication of terrorism: Union Minister Bandi Sanjay

Karimnagar, May 21 (UNI) : Union Minister of State for Home Affairs Bandi Sanjay Kumar on Wednesday said that the Narendra Modi-led central government is firmly committed to eradicating terrorism in all its forms.

He was speaking at an Anti-Terrorism Day rally organised by the Karimnagar District Cricket Association.

Launching the rally by waving the national flag, the Union Minister said the mindset of the people across the country has changed significantly after the Pahalgam incident, with citizens now expressing readiness to support the fight against terrorism alongside the armed forces.

Rainbow Children’s Hospital completes eighth gene therapy for Spinal Muscular Atrophy

Hyderabad, May 21 (UNI) : Rainbow Children’s Hospital (RCH) on Wednesday said it has successfully administered ‘gene therapy’ to a child diagnosed with Spinal Muscular Atrophy (SMA), marking the eighth such treatment carried out at the hospital, a significant milestone in paediatric healthcare.The therapy was administered under the supervision of Dr. Ramesh Konanki, Consultant Pediatric Neurologist, Rainbow Children’s Hospital, Secunderabad, the hospital said in a release here.As part of the treatment

protocol, the child received Zolgensma, a one-time gene therapy specifically developed to treat Spinal Muscular Atrophy (SMA) by replacing the defective SMN1 gene responsible for the condition.

Administered through an adeno-associated viral vector, the therapy enables the production of the SMN protein, which is essential for survival of motor neurons and thus the muscle function.With a cost of around Rs 14 crore per dose, Zolgensma is considered one of the most expensive therapies currently available worldwide.

Study shows ageing can reduce effectiveness of CAR-T cell cancer therapy

Age-related decline in the immune system can have a measurable impact on CAR-T cell therapy -- one of the most advanced forms of cancer immunotherapy, according to a study.

CAR-T therapy works by engineering a patient's T cells to recognise and destroy cancer cells.

The study led by Swiss researchers found that CAR-T cells from aged mice had poor mitochondrial function, lower "stemness," and reduced antitumour activity.

It was due to a drop in levels of nicotinamide adenine dinucleotide (NAD) -- a molecule essential for cellular energy and metabolism of mitochondria, said the team from the University of Lausanne (UNIL), the Lausanne University Hospital (CHUV), the Geneva University Hospitals (HUG) and the Ecole Polytechnique Fédérale de Lausanne (EPFL).

"CAR-T cells from older individuals are metabolically impaired and significantly less effective. What's exciting is that we were able to rejuvenate these aged cells by restoring their NAD levels -- reviving their antitumour function in preclinical models," said Dr. Helen Carrasco Hope.

"Our findings strengthen the growing recognition that ageing fundamentally reshapes immune cell function and metabolism.

"They highlight the urgent need to model age more accurately in preclinical studies so that therapies are developed with the real-world cancer population in mind -- where most patients are older adults," Hope said. For the study, published in the journal Nature Cancer, the team used NAD-boosting compounds currently under clinical investigation for other conditions, demonstrating that this approach is translatable and potentially applicable in humans.

"This is a major step toward personalised and age-conscious immunotherapy," said senior author Dr. Nicola Vannini. "By correcting age-related metabolic defects, we could improve outcomes for a large segment of cancer patients."

The study adds to a growing body of work showing that age is not just a chronological number, but a biological factor that can shape therapy response. The researchers called for age to be systematically considered in the development and evaluation of cell-based immunotherapies.

Responding to media queries, the official spokesperson of India's Ministry of External Affairs, Randhir Jaiswal, said it has become "second nature for Pakistan to blame India for all its internal issues," but this attempt to "hoodwink the world is doomed to fail".

Five people, including three students, were killed and several others injured when terrorists attacked a school bus in Khuzdar district of southwestern Pakistan's Balochistan province earlier in the day. Jaiswal said India consoles the loss of lives in all such incidents. "India rejects the baseless allegations made by Pakistan regarding Indian involvement with the incident in Khuzdar earlier today. India condoles the loss of lives in all such incidents." However, in order to divert attention from its reputation as the global epicenter of terrorism and to hide its own gross failings, it has become second nature for Pakistan to blame India for all its internal issues. This attempt to hoodwink the world is doomed to fail," Jaiswal added.

Cong to hold Jai Hind meetings nationwide from May 24-31

New Delhi, May 21 (UNI) The Congress on Wednesday announced that the party will organise Jai Hind meetings across the country from May 24 to 31, to salute the valour of the Armed Forces during Operation Sindoor.

Addressing a press conference here, Congress leaders Col Rohit Chaudhry along with Wing Commander Anuma Acharya (Retd) asked the government to tell the people of the country as to how the Pahalgam terror attack happened and how India launched Operation Sindoor.

Giving information about the Jai Hind meeting, Col Rohit said, "In the first phase, 16 cities have been selected where 'Jai Hind' meetings will be held. In these meetings, we will salute the bravery of our soldiers".

"The country has been going through a very difficult phase for almost a

month. From April 22 itself, the Congress party has given full support to the government and we have told the government that we will stand firmly with you in every strong action taken against Pakistan," he said.

He emphasised that the grand old party fully supported Operation Sindoor launched by the government.

He praised the armed forces for destroying several terror hubs in Pakistan and Pakistan-Occupied Jammu and Kashmir.

Raising question on the announcement of ceasefire, the Army veteran said, "We were winning, our army was foiling Pakistan's drones, missiles and all other types of attacks...It was the fourth day of the battle, but suddenly in the evening a ceasefire was announced".

Alleging that the ceasefire was announced from American soil, which was a matter of shame for all, Col Rohit said, "The country was united in this entire situation, but the government imposed a ceasefire on us".

He said, "In my career, I have never seen terrorists kill people one by one, find a safe route to escape and then escape".

He alleged that it was "a huge failure of security, a failure of the Home Ministry".

Moreover, Anuma Acharya slammed Prime Minister Narendra Modi for calling a meeting of NDA Chief Ministers on May 25.

"Regarding PM Modi's meeting with NDA Chief Ministers on 25th, we want to ask what crimes did the Opposition Chief Ministers commit, why were they not called in this meeting? Our demand is that all the Chief Ministers of the country should be included in this meeting," she said.

She also questioned the absence of the Prime Minister in both the All-party meeting.

Stalin to attend Niti Aayog meet in Delhi, slams EPS for attributing motives

Chennai, May 21 (UNI) : After boycotting the last meeting citing neglect of the State by the Centre, Tamil Nadu Chief Minister will be visiting Delhi to take part in the Niti Aayog meeting on May 24, even as he slammed Opposition AIADMK leader Edappadi K Palaniswami attributing motives to the visit.

In a statement here on Wednesday, Mr Stalin said he was going to Delhi to secure the state's rights.

Stating that he stood firm in his principles, Mr Stalin asserted that he would fight and secure the due funds for the state from the Centre.

He said the State government has filed a petition in the Supreme Court to secure the state's rights and against the Centre's refusal to release Rs 2,152 crore due funds to TN under the SSA scheme for the school education sector as the state rejected the NEP-2020, which envisaged implementation of the three-language formula and imposition of Hindi, as against the long followed two-language policy in the State.

Taking a dig at Mr

Palaniswami for attributing motives to his Delhi visit, Mr Stalin said he would remain ideologically firm and fight for the rights of the state.

Seeking to know why his visit to Delhi pains Mr Palaniswami, who is also the AIADMK General Secretary and the Leader of the Opposition in the State Assembly, the Chief Minister said "from Sasikala to Amit Shah, the person may change, but his (Palaniswami) habit of crawling and prostrating under the table has never changed."

"Even before the saliva on the tongue that declared that there was no alliance with the BJP, could dry, Mr Palaniswami, who had transformed into 'Pulikesi' (a comic Tamil movie character) after a single raid and rushed to wave the white flag, has no shame in accusing me of surrendering", Mr Stalin, said, strongly reacting to his criticisms.

"This hand of Stalin is one that holds the red-black flag of the DMK. The hand lifted by Perarignar (DMK stalwart and late CM C N Annadurai). The hand

that walked holding Kalaignar's (DMK Leader and late CM Karunanidhi's) hand. I will always hold the flag for rights. I will never crawl," he said.

"Even today, I have filed a case in the Supreme Court for the rights of Tamil Nadu," Stalin said and asserted that "I will stand firm in my principles. I will fight and secure Tamil Nadu's rightful share of funds".

Mr Palaniswami has criticised Mr Stalin's decision to attend the NITI Aayog meeting in Delhi and alleged that it was intended for personal gain rather than for the larger welfare of Tamil Nadu.

He questioned the sudden change in his stance and recalled that Mr Stalin had earlier boycotted the NITI Aayog meetings in protest against the Union Government's alleged neglect of Tamil Nadu.

Hinting at the recent Enforcement Directorate raids which had unearthed Rs 1,000 crore irregularities in the state-owned TASMAR, the Opposition leader questioned the timing of the CM's visit to the National Capital.

Youth Cong files FIR against Amit Malviya, Arnab Goswami

New Delhi, May 21 (UNI) : The Indian Youth Congress (IYC) on Wednesday said it has lodged an FIR against BJP leader Amit Malviya and journalist Arnab Goswami under non-bailable sections for allegedly defaming leader of Opposition in Lok Sabha Rahul Gandhi and "conspiring" to link the Congress to Turkey.

Youth Congress national spokesperson Varun Pandey said that the FIR was lodged on the instructions of the organisation's in-charge Krishna Allavar, Youth Congress president Uday Bhanu Chib and legal department national chairman Rupesh Bhadoria.

After the registration of the FIR, Chib and Bhadoria alleged malicious attempt to defame the Congress."This FIR sends a clear message that any attempt to spread fake news against the party or its leadership will be met with a strong legal and political response," he said.The FIR charges the two with spreading fake news, inciting hatred and endangering national security.

Five killed, six hurt in bus-tempo van smash

Chennai, May 21 (UNI) : Five people were killed and six others were injured when the tempo van in which they were travelling collided with a Tamil Nadu State Express Transport Corporation (TNSETC) bus at Chengipatti village in Thanjavur district of Tamil Nadu on Wednesday night.

Police said the accident occurred at an overbridge on the Thanjavur- Trichy National Highway. While four people were killed on the spot, another person died on way to the hospital, where the injured were admitted for treatment.The tempo, which was completely damaged in the accident, was coming from Karnataka and was heading towards Thanjavur, while the TNSETC bus was proceeding to Trichy when the mishap occurred.

SC steps in to ensure protection for domestic violence victims

New Delhi, May 21 (UNI) In a landmark move aimed at strengthening the enforcement of the Protection of Women from Domestic Violence Act, 2005, the Supreme Court on Tuesday (May 20) issued a slew of directions to the Central Government, States and Union Territories to ensure full and effective implementation of the law.

A bench, comprising Justices B V Nagarathna and Satish Chandra Sharma, passed the order while hearing a plea filed by the NGO, We the Women of India.

The Court expressed serious concern over the continued gaps in implementing the DV Act and said that it was time the law be translated into "real and accessible support" for aggrieved women.

Pak High Commission official in New Delhi declared personal non grata

New Delhi, May 21 (UNI) India on Wednesday declared a Pakistani High Commission official here as "persona non grata" for indulging in activities not in keeping with his official status. In a media release, the Ministry of External Affairs said the official has been asked to leave India within 24 hours.

"The Government of India has declared a Pakistani official, working at the Pakistan High Commission in New Delhi, persona non grata for indulging in activities not in keeping with his official status in India. The official has been asked to leave India within 24 hours," the media release said. India also issued a demarche to the Charge d' Affaires of the Pakistan High Commission here asking him to "strictly ensure that none of the Pakistani diplomats

or officials in India misuse their privileges and status in any manner". The latest development in the already embittered relations between the two neighbouring countries comes around a week after they declared one official of each other "persona non grata".

On May 13 night, an official in the Pakistani High Commission in New Delhi was declared "persona non grata by India after being found involved in spying activities.

The official was ordered to leave India within 24 hours.

A little later, Pakistan, in a tit-for-tat move, did the same with regard to an official of the Indian High Commission in Islamabad, accusing him of engaging in activities incompatible with his privileged status. The official was directed to leave Pakistan within 24 hours.

Three children drowns in river, TN CM announces solatium

Chennai, May 21 (UNI) : Three children were drowned in a river while having a bath at Arasur village in Villupuram district of Tamil Nadu on Wednesday evening.

Police said the deceased were identified as Sivasankari (18), her younger sister Abhinaya (14) and Rajesh (13).

While Sivasankar and Abhinaya were

daughters of Palani, Rajesh was the son of Rajendran.

All the three hailed from Arasur village. Chief Minister M K Stalin expressed deep anguish and grief over their deaths and announced a solatium of Rs three each to their parents from the Chief Minister's Public Relief Fund.

the Bills terming it as 'illegal', the Apex Court also fixed time frame for the President and the Governors to give their assent to the Bills.

Armed with the Apex Court order, the Tamil Nadu government notified all the 10 Acts in the gazette. It was for the first time in the history the Bills have become Laws without the assent of either the President or the Governor.

The Apex Court order was welcomed by almost all parties in the State, barring the BJP.

Making a Statement in the Tamil Nadu Assembly soon after the verdict was pronounced, Chief Minister and DMK President M K Stalin termed the order against the Governor withholding assent to the Bills passed in the House as a historic verdict for all states and a victory for state autonomy and federalism.

He said this verdict was not only a major victory for Tamil Nadu but a victory for all state governments in the country. The Tamil Nadu government fought for upholding DMK's lifeline of State autonomy and federal principles. "Tamil Nadu will fight...Tamil Nadu will win", he said.

Observing that Tamil Nadu has got a historic verdict from the Supreme Court, he said the Governor has returned several Bills passed in the State Assembly without giving his assent. "When they are

passed again in the House for the second time and forwarded to him for his assent, the Governor ought to have given his assent as mandated by the Constitution. But Mr Ravi did not give his assent, delayed it and also said he has powers".

When the Tamil Nadu government moved the Supreme Court against this, the Apex Court accepted the genuine arguments of Tamil Nadu and declared that the Governor's action in not giving assent to the Bills as illegal and erroneous in law and that the Bills are ought have been received the assent.

"It's a historic verdict", he said, and also thanked the members of various parties who spoke in the House hailing the Apex Court verdict and the efforts taken by the DMK government in upholding autonomy and federalism.

In a landmark ruling, the Supreme Court held that Tamil Nadu Governor Ravi's decision to withhold assent from ten re-enacted bills and reserve them for the President was "illegal, erroneous in law, and liable to be set aside."

A Bench comprising Justices J.B. Pardiwala and R. Mahadevan ruled that the Governor failed to act in good faith, especially since the bills had been pending with him--the oldest since January 2020--and were reserved for Presidential consideration only after the Assembly re-

enacted them following the Court's verdict in the Punjab Governor's case.

The verdict had clarified that Governors cannot indefinitely sit on legislation passed by the State Assemblies.

The Court declared that the ten bills are deemed assented by Governor after their second passage by the State Assembly.

Any action taken by the President on these bills was also declared non-est in law (was set aside), the Apex Court ruled.

Following the Supreme Court order, Leaders of all the alliance parties of the DMK, including the Congress, VCK, MDMK, the Left Parties and other partners hailed the verdict condoning the Governor's action and stepped up their demand for his recall.

They said the Governor should no longer continue in Office after being indicted by the Supreme Court, which had ruled that all the Bills pending before him deemed to have received his assent.

They demanded that the Governor should either be recalled, ousted or resign from the post. It may be recalled as the Governor and the Governor has been having differences of opinion of several issues, political parties leaders had earlier also demanded his recall and the DMK also adopted a resolution demanding abolishing the post of Governor at its Legal Wing meet.

Djokovic has taken a wildcard into the Geneva Open - one of the final tournaments before the French Open - as he looks to find more rhythm on the court, the BBC reported. The French Open starts on Sunday, with Djokovic seeking a standalone record 25th Grand Slam title. On his time working with Murray, Djokovic said, "We felt like we couldn't get more out of that partnership on the court, and that's all there is to it. "My respect towards Andy remains the same, even more actually, I got to know him as a person. "I think he has a brilliant tennis IQ, he has a very rare mind of a champion that obviously has achieved what he has achieved, and he sees the game incredibly well."Djokovic has yet to win a match on clay this year, having suffered early exits in Monte Carlo and Madrid before skipping the Italian Open. Lifting the title in Geneva would make Djokovic just the third man in the Open era to win 100 ATP singles titles - as well as be a welcome boost before Roland Garros. Djokovic is joined in Geneva by Dusan Vemic, who was previously part of his team, and assistant coach and analyst Boris Bosnjakovic. "At the moment, I'm not in need of a coach," Djokovic said. "I don't need to rush in any context. I feel comfortable with the people around me.

Mumbai Indians crush DC to seal playoff spot

Mumbai, May 21 (UNI) Riding on a Suryakumar Yadav masterclass and a clinical bowling performance led by Mitchell Santner and Jasprit Bumrah, Mumbai Indians stormed into the IPL 2025 playoffs with a comprehensive 59-run victory over Delhi Capitals at the Wankhede Stadium on Wednesday, . Chasing 181 for victory, Delhi never really got going and were bundled out for 121 in 18.2 overs. The final blow came from Bumrah, whose inch-perfect yorker uprooted Mustafizur Rahman's middle stump to seal the game and MI’s place in the playoffs. It was a fitting end to a ruthless bowling display. Earlier, Suryakumar's sublime unbeaten 73 off 43 balls and a blistering late cameo by Naman Dhir (24* off 8) powered Mumbai to 180 for 5 after being sent in to bat. MI recovered from early setbacks — Rohit Sharma fell cheaply, and after promising starts from Ryan Rickelton (25) and Will Jacks (21), the innings was anchored by Suryakumar's class and innovation. His knock was studded with 7 fours and 4 sixes, highlighted by a lofted six over extra cover to bring up his fifty. Dhir provided the late fireworks in the 19th over,

slapping Mukesh Kumar over extra cover and launching a towering six over midwicket, pushing MI to a defendable total. In reply, Delhi's innings never gained traction. They lost wickets in a heap, with both openers KL Rahul and Faf du Plessis dismissed inside three overs — Rahul caught behind off Trent Boult for 11 and du Plessis mistiming a lofted shot off Deepak Chahar for 6. Abishek Porel was bamboozled by Will Jacks' drift and turn, stumped for 6. Vipraj Nigam (20 off 11) briefly lifted hopes with a flurry of boundaries, including a six over cover and a deft third-man touch, but was undone by Santner’s variations, caught and bowled attempting a backfoot punch. Santner, who bowled beautifully throughout, also dismissed Sameer Rizvi (39), Ashutosh Sharma (18) and stifled DC’s middle order with remarkable control. Rizvi's dismissal marked the beginning of the end — a tossed-up delivery that dipped and turned, bowling him through the sweep shot. Ashutosh was next, lured out by flight and stumped. Madhav Tiwari and Kuldeep Yadav followed quickly, both bowled — one by a Jasprit Bumrah special that dipped

sharply, and the other caught trying to hit Karn Sharma out of trouble. Tristan Stubbs fell lbw to Bumrah, wasting a review, and with wickets tumbling regularly, the result was inevitable. Boult (4-0-29-1), Santner (4-0-11-3), and Bumrah (3.2-0-12-3) were exceptional, while Karn Sharma chipped in with one wicket. The fielding was equally sharp, with substitute Raj Bawa taking a fine catch at long-on. For Delhi, the loss ended their playoff hopes. Only Sameer Rizvi showed resistance, but lacked support from the rest of the batting order. Mukesh Kumar (2/48) and Kuldeep Yadav (1/22) were the only bowlers who made some impact. Mumbai Indians’ emphatic victory not only propelled them into the final four but sent a strong warning to their rivals. With form and momentum on their side, the five-time champions appear to have peaked at the right time. Path now clear for Nepal to chase T20 World Cup dream

Kathmandu, May 21 (UNI) Nepal captain Indu Barma is excited about what lies ahead after her side won through to the ICC Women's T20 World Cup Global Qualifier for the first time. Nepal finished second at the recent ICC Women's T20 World Cup Asia Qualifier and are now just one step away from featuring at next year's ICC Women's T20 World Cup in England. The Asian side will now take part in the Global Qualifier tournament later this year or in early 2026, with the top four teams from that event winning a spot at the 20-over showcase in England in the middle of next year. Nepal will have their work cut out to progress from the Global Qualifier, with higher-ranked teams Bangladesh, Scotland and Thailand and up-and-coming nation USA their opponents that are already confirmed and a further five countries still yet to join them in a 10-team event that will finalise the makeup of the next edition of the Women's T20 World Cup. But Nepal have already upset the odds by defeating a higher-ranked team in the UAE at the Asian Qualifier to ensure they progressed to the Global Qualifier and Barma believes the recent showing in Thailand displays what her side are capable of, an

ICC report said. “Global Qualifier is a historic achievement that has also opened doors for other opportunities,” Barma said in a video published by Hamrokhelkud.com. “We are in a happy mood. The win has inspired us. It has shown that women’s cricket in Nepal deserves more investment and support from the agencies concerned,” she said. Nepal’s efforts in Thailand at the Asian Qualifier won praise from a host of sources, with Prime Minister KP Sharma Oli passing on his congratulations shortly after the achievement. “A historic achievement for Nepal in women’s cricket... This is a moment of pride for Nepal,” Oli wrote on social media. “Congratulations and best wishes.” Former Nepal men’s skipper Paras Khadka also showed his appreciation of the side’s efforts and in particular those of Barma following her Player of the Match performance in the decisive Super Three fixture against the UAE. "Wow. Skipper leading from the front," Khadka wrote. "Amazing commitment from our women's cricket team to make to the World Cup qualifiers."Congratulations girls. You have made Nepal proud."

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Champions Trophy 2025 sets new broadcast records

Dubai, May 21 (UNI) : The ICC Men’s Champions Trophy 2025 was the most viewed Champions Trophy ever, recording a growth over the 2017 edition. The 2025 edition, played in Pakistan and the United Arab Emirates, saw 368 billion global viewing minutes, a remarkable 19 percent increase from the previous tournament held in England and Wales in 2017. The premium event that saw participation from eight international teams drew 308 million global viewing minutes per over, the most ever for an ICC event. Under the captaincy of Rohit Sharma, India won the trophy on the back of an unbeaten run

throughout the tournament. They beat the ICC Men’s Cricket World Cup champions Australia in the semi-final before defeating New Zealand in the grand finale. The final against the Black Caps on March 9 was the most-watched Champions Trophy fixture ever, with 65.3 billion live viewing minutes globally, overtaking the record set during the 2017 final by a whopping 52.1 percent, an ICC report said. It was also the third-most watched game in any ICC event globally by live watch time. In India too, it was the third-most watched ICC game ever, sitting behind the 2023 Cricket

World Cup semi-final and final, both of which featured India. ICC Chair Jay Shah regarded the Champions Trophy’s success as a marker of the game’s global growth. “We are delighted to share that the ICC Champions Trophy 2025 has achieved record-breaking global viewership,” Shah said. “Making it the most-watched edition of the tournament to date," he said. “These remarkable numbers reflect the growing global appeal of the game and the strength of our partnerships,” Shah added. The tournament also broke broadcast records in prominent cricketing

territories, including Australia, India and Pakistan, and also made waves in up-and-coming markets. “We are especially grateful for the continued innovation and investment by the JioStar network in India which delivered live coverage across 29 unique broadcast feeds in nine languages, an effort that played a significant role in reaching new audiences and deepening fan engagement,” Shah said regarding the coverage in India. With the return of the award-winning Indian Sign Language feed and Audio Descriptive Commentary, coverage in India across the JioStar network featured a

range of inclusive innovations designed to ensure all fans could enjoy the unrivalled drama of the Champions Trophy, culminating in it becoming the most watched Champions Trophy ever in the country. The tournament became the most watched Champions Trophy in Australia too, with the overall viewing hours going up by 65 percent compared to the previous edition. With enhanced coverage featuring the introduction of a Hindi language feed, Amazon Prime Video witnessed the highest viewership of any ICC event shown exclusively on the platform. reaching the semi-finals of the Taipei Open earlier this month. However, it was a disappointing outing in mixed doubles for Indian pairs. Ashith Surya-Amrutha Pramuthesh were ousted by top seeds Jiang Zhenbang-Wei Yaxin of China 12-21, 10-21, while Rohan Kapoor-Ruthvika Gadde lost 10-21, 14-21 to fourth seeds Guo Xinwa-Chen Fanghui.

PV Sindhu crashes out of Malaysia Masters

Bukit Jalil (Malaysia), May 21 (UNI) : India's star shuttler and two-time Olympic medallist PV Sindhu suffered an early exit from the Malaysia Masters 2025 badminton tournament after a first-round defeat to Vietnam’s Nguy?n Th?y Linh at the Axiata Arena, KL Sports City, here on Wednesday. Sindhu, currently ranked world No. 16, went down 11-21, 21-14, 15-21 in

a match lasting 63 minutes. Despite a fighting comeback in the second game, the Indian ace failed to maintain momentum in the decider. This was Nguy?n Th?y Linh’s second victory over Sindhu in four meetings. Sindhu’s early elimination adds to a string of disappointing performances this season, with her best result being a quarterfinal finish at the

India Open in January. In contrast, Indian men’s singles players enjoyed a successful day. World No. 35 HS Prannoy came from behind to stun fifth seed Kenta Nishimoto of Japan 19-21, 21-17, 21-16, while former world No. 1 Kidambi Srikanth (WR 65) defeated sixth seed Lu Guangzu of China 23-21, 13-21, 21-11 to book his place in the second round.

The biggest upset of the day came courtesy of Sathish Karunakaran, who beat third seed and world championships bronze medallist Chou Tien-chen of Chinese Taipei 21-13, 21-14 in a commanding display. Youngster Ayush Shetty added to India’s success with a 20-22, 21-10, 21-8 win over Canada’s Brian Yang. Shetty had recently made headlines by

Further at around 11:00 AM, Prime Minister will inaugurate the redeveloped Deshnoke Station under the Amrit Bharat Station Scheme and flag-off Bikaner-Mumbai express train. Thereafter, he will lay the foundation stone, inaugurate and dedicate to the nation multiple development projects worth over Rs 26,000 crore and also address a public function in Palana.

In line with his commitment to constantly improve and enhance the rail infrastructure in the country, Prime Minister will inaugurate 103 redeveloped Amrit Stations in 86 districts across 18 States and Union Territories of India developed at a cost of over Rs 1,100 crore. Over 1,300 stations are being redeveloped with modern facilities, designed to reflect regional architecture and enhance passenger amenities under the Amrit Bharat Station Scheme. Deshnoke railway station, serving pilgrims and tourists visiting the Karni Mata Temple among others, is inspired with temple



architecture and arch and column theme. Begumpet railway station in Telangana is inspired by the architecture of the Kakatiya empire. Thawe station in Bihar incorporates various murals and art works representing Maa Thawewali, one of the 52 Shakti Peethas and depicting Madhubani paintings. Dakor station in Gujarat is inspired by Ranchhodrai Ji Maharaj. The redeveloped Amrit stations across India integrate modern infrastructure with cultural heritage, passenger-centric amenities including those for Divyangjan and sustainable practices to enhance the travel experience.

Indian Railway is marching towards 100% electrification of its network, making railway

operations more efficient and environment friendly. Supreme Court grants interim bail to Ashoka University Prof Ali Khan Mahmudabad

New Delhi, May 21(UNI) : The Supreme Court on Wednesday granted interim bail to Ali Khan Mahmudabad, an Associate Professor at Ashoka University, in a case related to his Facebook post on Operation Sindoor, India's military response to the Pahalgam terror attack.

A Bench comprising Justice Surya Kant and Justice N. Kotiswar Singh passed the order while hearing Mahmudabad's plea challenging his arrest and custody.

Although the Court refused to stay the ongoing investigations or the two FIRs filed by Haryana Police, it directed his release on interim bail.

“We direct that the petitioner be released on interim bail subject to furnishing of bail bonds to the satisfaction of the Chief Judicial Magistrate (CJM), Sonapat. There shall be only one set of bail bonds for both FIRs,” the Bench ordered.

The Court, however, imposed strict restrictions on Mahmudabad during the bail period directing that he must not publish any online articles, posts, or deliver speeches on the issues related to this case.

He is restrained from making any comment on India's recent security crisis or the counter-terror operations and he is required to surrender his passport.

Significantly, the Court also replaced the Haryana Police with a Special

Investigation Team (SIT) to conduct the probe. The SIT will be headed by an Inspector General of Police and must include three IPS officers, none of whom shall be from Haryana or Delhi. One member of the SIT must be a woman officer.

“Having regard to the contents of the two alleged online posts, we are not inclined to stay the investigation at this stage. However, to ensure an impartial probe, we direct the DGP, Haryana to constitute a SIT of officers outside Haryana and Delhi,” the Court stated.

During the hearing, the Bench took serious note of the language used in Mahmudabad's Facebook post, observing that it could carry dual meanings and potentially be interpreted as insensitive during a national crisis.

“It is unfortunate when free speech is used in a manner that may humiliate or cause discomfort to others. Choice of words matters,” Justice Kant observed.

The Court questioned whether the post sought cheap popularity at a time of national distress, even as Senior Advocate Kapil Sibal, representing Mahmudabad, defended it as a patriotic and anti-war message, concluding with “Jai Hind.”“Everyone has the right to free speech, but also a duty to use it

responsibly. Rights cannot exist in a vacuum devoid of duties,” Justice Kant remarked, characterizing some portions of the post as “dog-whistling.”

Mahmudabad was arrested by Haryana Police on May 18 in Delhi and remanded to two days of police custody. The action stemmed from two FIRs filed over his Facebook remarks on Operation Sindoor, in which he criticized Pakistan-sponsored terrorism, denounced war, and urged right-wing supporters to also speak out against mob lynching and property demolitions in India.

One of the FIRs was based on a complaint by Yogesh Jatheri, and includes charges under the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS), including, Section 196 (promoting hatred), Section 197 (assertions prejudicial to national integration), Section 152 (endangering the sovereignty and integrity of India), and Section 299 (culpable homicide).

The second FIR followed a complaint by Haryana Women's Commission Chairperson Renu Bhatia, alleging the post was insulting to women officers in the Armed Forces. Charges include, Section 353 (public mischief), Section 79 (insult to modesty), Section 152 (again).

The Commission had also issued a show-cause notice, accusing Mahmudabad of promoting communal disharmony and disrespecting women officers like Colonel Sofiya Qureshi, who led India's media briefing on Operation Sindoor.

Mahmudabad, in response, stated that the Women's Commission had misconstrued his remarks, which, in his view, praised the officers but also demanded that the empowerment of women reflect in ground realities and institutional practices.

The Court pressed the Additional Solicitor General S.V. Raju, representing the State of Haryana, to identify specific content where Mahmudabad allegedly insulted women officers.

“The FIR claims insult to women army officers. Where is the line that crosses the threshold? Show us,” the Bench insisted.

Raju acknowledged that the content needed to be examined more closely and agreed to place relevant material before the Court. With the SIT now in charge of the probe and Mahmudabad out on interim bail, the matter will continue before the Supreme Court, which will assess whether the charges merit further legal action, or whether Mahmudabad's statements fall within the ambit of protected free speech.
