Man killed by son over petty issue in Pilibhit

Pilibhit (UP), May 28 (UNI) A 40-year-old man was allegedly thrashed by his son with an iron rod and killed by his son in Bisalpur area of Pilibhit district in Uttar Pradesh on Wednesday, police sources said here.

Bisalpur police station in-charge Sanjeev Kumar Shukla said that the accused son Vishal is absconding after the incident, the police is searching for him."Harish, a resident of Purenia Ramgulum village of the area, had a dispute with his son Vishal over something. In an inebriated state, Vishal hit his father several times on the head with an iron rod during the dispute, killing him on the spot," he said.He said that after killing his father, accused Vishal fled from the scene of the incident. "Several police teams have been formed to nab him, which are raiding different places. No clue of the accused has been found yet," he added.

Mumbai Police question actor Dino Morea, his brother once again

Mumbai, May 28 (UNI) : The city police's Economic Offences Wing (EOW) on Wednesday once again questioned Bollywood actor Dino Morea and his brother Santino Morea in the Mumbai multi-crore Mithi River desilting scam, official sources said here.

The actor and his brother were questioned by the Special Investigation Team of the EOW on Monday for nearly eight hours in connection with the case. They were then asked to be present before the investigators on Wednesday.

Following this, both of them appeared before the SIT this afternoon.

Officials said that the Morea brothers are being questioned for their possible links with the firm linked to the Mithi River scam and close links with the arrested accused Ketan Kadam of Vodar India Ltd.The SIT is probing the scam, in which the B r i h a n m u m b a i Municipal Corporation suffered a wrongful loss of more than Rs 50 crore. The Mumbai police's SIT has registered a case against 13 people, including contractors and civic officials, in connection with the scam and initiated searches at the premises of the accused.

Students must work hard till the age of 25 for success: CM

Hyderabad, May 28 : Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy on Wednesday urged students to dedicate themselves to hard work and education until the age of 25 to secure a successful and fulfilling life.

He emphasised that good jobs and a better future can only be achieved through consistent effort and education.

Speaking at the Gurukula Awards function held at Babu Jagjivan Ram Bhavan in Hyderabad on Wednesday, the Chief Minister paid tribute to Telangana stalwart Suravaram Pratap Reddy, noting that Telugu University has been named in his honour to recognise his contributions.

Similarly, a prominent women's university has been named after freedom fighter "Veeranari" Chakali Iamma, highlighting the state's commitment to celebrating those who have fought for the people.

Revanth Reddy underlined that true legacy is built by serving society,



not by one's caste identity. "The Congress is carrying forward the ideals of former Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru and Dr B R Ambedkar, the architect of the Indian Constitution," he said.

He called on Dalits, Tribals, and other weaker sections to abandon feelings of inferiority and embrace self-confidence.

The Chief Minister announced the establishment of Young India Integrated Residential Schools, aimed at empowering underprivileged students to compete at

global standards. "Education is the only way to achieve recognition and upliftment in society," he added.

Lashing out at the previous BRS government, the CM criticised their focus on schemes like goat, sheep, and fish distribution, while neglecting educational empowerment.

He questioned, "Why didn't the BRS take steps to make the weaker sections stakeholders in governance through education? Isn't it true that they played with the lives of unemployed

Govt sanctions Rs 51.53 cr compensation for hailstorm, rain-affected farmers

Hyderabad, May 28 (UNI) In a major relief to farmers affected by hailstorms and unseasonal rains over the past two months, the Telangana State Government has sanctioned Rs 51.528 crore as compensation for crop damage.The decision follows a detailed damage assessment report submitted by the Agriculture Department under the instructions of Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy.

According to Agriculture Minister Tummala Nageswara Rao, officials have identified crop damage across 36,424 acres of paddy, 3,266 acres of maize, 470 acres of jowar, 6,589 acres of horticultural crops, 4,753 acres of cotton, and 477 acres under other crops, including those affected by life-threatening floods. The compensation will benefit 41,361 farmers spread across 29 districts.

Minister Tummala directed officials to coordinate with relevant departments to ensure that the sanctioned funds are credited directly into the accounts of the affected farmers without delay.The government is simultaneously continuing with crop procurement operations and has also initiated a fresh survey to assess additional crop damage in May. The report for this recent period has already been submitted, and the minister confirmed that necessary funds will be sanctioned soon.

Minister reviews welfare and development departments

The meeting focused on development programs, departmental progress, and the implementation of welfare schemes across the joint Khammam district.

The session was attended by MLAs Kunanneni Sambasiva Rao, Koram Kanakaiah, Payam Venkateswarlu, Ramdas Nayak, and Matta Ragamayi, along with

Calling for demand-based execution of development works, she urged officials to implement projects in line with local MLA recommendations and public needs under the Panchayat Raj and Rural Development Department.

In a symbolic gesture to promote trust in public healthcare, Minister Seethakka felicitated District Collector Jitesh V Patil, who recently opted for government healthcare services when his wife delivered at the Palvancha Government Hospital, an official statement said.

Cabinet approves hike in MSP for 14 Kharif crops

New Delhi, May 28 (UNI) : The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs (CCEA) chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Wednesday approved the increase in the Minimum Support Prices (MSP) for 14 Kharif crops for Marketing Season 2025-26.The

government has increased the MSP of Kharif crops for Marketing Season 2025-26, to ensure remunerative prices to the growers for their produce, an official statement said.The highest absolute increase in MSP over the previous year has been recommended for

nigerseed (Rs 820 per quintal) followed by ragi (Rs 596 per quintal), cotton (Rs 589 per quintal) and sesamum (Rs 579 per quintal).The increase in MSP for Kharif crops is in line with the Union Budget 2018-19 announcement of fixing the MSP at a level of

at least 1.5 times of the All-India weighted average cost of production. The expected margin to farmers over their cost of production are estimated to be highest in case of bajra (63%) followed by maize (59%), tur (59%) and urad (53%). For rest of the crops, margin to farmers

over their cost of production is estimated to be at 50%.

In the recent years, government has been promoting the cultivation of crops, other than cereals such as pulses and oilseeds, and nutri-cereals or Shree Anna, by offering a higher MSP for these crops.

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Monsoon measures should be improved according to situation and given more impetus

While reviewing the preparedness for the monsoon season, Municipal Commissioner and Administrator Mr. Bhushan Gagrani gave instructions

Mumbai, May 28 : While the pre-monsoon works are going on at a fast pace as per the planning made by the Municipal Corporation, the monsoon has arrived in Mumbai a fortnight earlier than every year. As a result, it is a fact that drain cleaning, roads and other works have also been affected to some extent. However, considering the top priority of civic services and facilities, appropriate improvements should be made in the monsoon measures according to the situation, and the measures should be given maximum speed. Municipal Commissioner and Administrator Mr. Bhushan Gagrani has given instructions that the works should be completed quickly and the system should be kept well-equipped by being vigilant in all the proceedings.

In view of the situation that arose in Mumbai two days ago due to continuous

and heavy rains, Municipal Commissioner and Administrator Mr. Bhushan Gagrani reviewed the monsoon works of the Municipal Corporation today (28th May 2025). At that time, he gave various instructions to the system. Additional Municipal Commissioner (Western Suburbs) Dr. Vipin Sharma, Additional Municipal Commissioner (Projects) Mr. Abhijit Bangar, all concerned Joint Commissioners, Deputy Commissioners, Assistant Commissioners and concerned officers were present in this meeting held at the Municipal Corporation Headquarters.

M u n i c i p a l Commissioner Mr. Gagrani said that this year the monsoon has arrived in Mumbai fifteen days earlier than every year. It is a fact that the heavy rains have affected the work of the Municipal Corporation to some extent. Especially, the work of removing silt from the drains has been

hampered. However, in order to ensure that the speed of the monsoon work does not slow down under any circumstances, appropriate amendments should be made in the previous planning and necessary changes should be adopted. The work of removing silt from the rivers and drains should be completed in the next eight to ten days, the Municipal Commissioner said.

This year, a total of 414 pumping sets have been planned to be installed in low-lying and very low-lying areas as well as in all possible places where water can accumulate during heavy rains. Accordingly, it should be ensured that the process of installing pumping sets (pump sets) has been completed at all places. The process of establishing and commissioning the pumping system should be completed within the next 24 hours. To check that this system is functioning smoothly, it should be

properly tested. Follow-up should be coordinated at the necessary levels to complete the entire process. Letters of acceptance have been given to the contractors to obtain 10 sets of vehicle mounted mobile pumps on lease basis.

These sets will be available within eight days. This system can be used in case of emergency, Mr. Gagrani also mentioned.

He further said that utmost care should be taken to ensure that rainwater does not accumulate in very low-lying and low-lying areas. If water is found accumulating due to heavy rain, efforts should be made to ensure that it is drained quickly.

New places where rainwater accumulates have been found, the Assistant Commissioner of the concerned administrative department and the Deputy Commissioner of the circle should inspect those places.

For waste material collection from May 29th to June 15th Special cleanliness drive : BMC

Mumbai, May 28 : In line with the monsoon activities in Mumbai, the Solid Waste Management Department of the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation will be implementing a special cleanliness drive for waste collection in Mumbai city and suburbs from May 29 to June 15, 2025. Along with this, the campaign will include cleaning before 10 am every day and second sweeping as needed.

As per the directions of Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation Commissioner and Administrator Mr. Bhushan Gagrani, under the guidance of Additional Municipal Corporation Commissioner (City) Dr. (Mrs.) Ashwini Joshi and under the supervision of Deputy Commissioner (Solid Waste Management)

Mr. Kiran Dighavkar, various measures and various activities are being implemented in line with solid waste management.

During the monsoon season, special initiatives are being taken along with regular cleaning to ensure cleanliness in various parts of Mumbai city and suburbs. Against this backdrop, a special cleanliness drive has been undertaken by the Solid Waste Management Department to ensure cleanliness by collecting and cleaning garbage at regular intervals during the monsoon season.

Special emphasis will be placed on collecting items and materials discarded in public places. The main objective of this drive is to ensure that these waste materials carried along with rainwater do not obstruct

the drainage of water.

Instructions have also been given to collect curbstones, paver blocks, debris from project sites, and other leftover materials along with waste materials. Special focus will be given to cleanliness in the area around rivers and drains in this campaign, so that possible obstructions in the flow of rainwater can be removed.

Under this, between May 29 and June 15, 2025, all the administrative divisions (ward) offices of the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation will identify the places where the most garbage accumulates and conduct a thorough cleaning there. This will include cleaning of roads, alleys and gullies, paver blocks, curbstones, drains and watercourse inlet points. Garbage will be

collected using machinery as required to remove footpaths, road waste, waste materials, debris, and unwanted materials.

Along with this, debris and garbage remaining on the plots adjacent to drains and at project sites will be collected and cleaned. Garbage will be collected from all plots (excluding debris) irrespective of ownership.

Meanwhile, the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation is appealing to citizens living in the vicinity of houses, housing societies and other establishments to maintain cleanliness in their respective areas. They are also urged not to litter or create noise in public places and to cooperate with the administration's efforts regarding cleanliness.

NHAI to start trial run of underpasses on Dwarka Expressway from today

New Delhi, May 28 (UNI) : To enhance traffic flow and decongest the Delhi-Gurugram section of NH 48, the National Highways Authority of India (NHAI) will begin trial run of the tunnel and underpasses on the Delhi section of Dwarka Expressway from Thursday.

The trial run will take place from 12 noon to 3 pm every day, an official statement said.

This will mark a significant step toward enhancing mobility and reducing congestion in Delhi NCR. The

underpasses opened for the trial run will include a shallow tunnel connecting Dwarka/Yashobhumi to Airport through Airport Underpasses and vice versa.

Further, users can also ply towards Gurugram (towards Sirhaul) from Dwarka/Yashobhumi through shallow tunnel and right turn underpass.

Moreover, a combination of airport underpasses along with right turn underpass can be used from Terminal 3 to Gurugram (towards Sirhaul).

The trial period will help NHAI to monitor and evaluate traffic patterns, safety measures, and infrastructure efficiency to ensure seamless integration into the city's transport network.

The tunnel will have a height restriction of vehicles up to 4.5 metres and slow-moving vehicles like two wheelers, three wheelers and vehicles carrying flammable materials like oil tankers will not be allowed inside the tunnel and underpasses. The tunnel is likely to be fully operational from June

5. The tunnel has been built using advanced engineering and safety features. It is equipped with CCTV surveillance, a dedicated control room, and emergency exits to ensure commuter safety and efficiency.

The tunnel's strategic location and layout will benefit large number of daily commuters and reduce the burden on surface roads and reduce congestion by connecting Dwarka Expressway to the Indira Gandhi International (IGI) Airport.

No breach of UNESCO Heritage norms: Supreme Court

New Delhi, May 28 (UNI): The Supreme Court on Wednesday upheld the Punjab and Haryana High Court's orders directing the construction of a verandah outside Courtroom No 1 and the eco-friendly redevelopment of the kutchra parking area within the High Court premises. The apex court rejected objections raised by the Chandigarh administration, ruling that the proposed works do not violate UNESCO guidelines applicable to heritage sites.

A bench, comprising Justices Vikram Nath and Sandeep Mehta, observed that the verandah's design, aligned with those outside Courtrooms 2 to 9, is consistent with the architectural character of the High Court building and does not compromise its World Heritage Site status. "We find that the High Court's directive for verandah

construction is appropriate and in conformity with the existing design elements. It does not breach UNESCO heritage norms," the Supreme Court held.

The bench added that the Chandigarh administration may still seek ex post facto approval from concerned heritage authorities as a precautionary step.

The Court also endorsed the High Court's decisions dated February 7 and 21, 2025, which directed the placement of green paver blocks and tree plantations in the kutchra parking area.

The goal, the Court said, is to maximize vehicle capacity, create shaded parking, and boost the site's green cover.

To ensure effective execution, the Court directed the High Court administration to consult landscaping experts and monitor the process through a designated committee.

36 held guilty in Panwari case, sentence to be announced on May 30

Agra (UP), May 28 (UNI) : A special court here on Wednesday held 36 accused guilty and acquitted 15 giving the benefit of doubt in the almost 34 years old infamous Panwari case of Agra district here in Uttar Pradesh, prosecution sources said here.

Prosecution sources said that the court of SC-ST Judge Pushkar Upadhyay has fixed May 30 as the next date to pronounce the quantum of punishment.

Prosecution sources said in the year 1990, violence broke out in Panwari village over the marriage procession of the daughter of a SC family. "Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) MLA Chaudhary

Babulal was also made an accused in this case, but he was acquitted by the MP-MLA court in the year 2022. The hearing on the remaining accused went on in the SC-ST Special Court," they said.

Prosecution sources said The incident is of June 21, 1990. "Mundra, daughter of Chokhelal Jatav, a resident of Panwari village under Sikandra police station, was getting married. Ramdin's baraat came from Nagla Padma of Sadar," they said.

Prosecution sources said members of the Jat community opposed the marriage procession. "Due to this the baraat could not be held. On the second day, the wedding procession was being taken out in the

presence of the police administration officials. Then a crowd of 5,000-6,000 people stopped the wedding procession from taking place," they said.

Prosecution sources said the police used force to stop the crowd and even had to open fire. "Soni Ram Jat died due to bullet injuries. After this the accused attacked the settlement of Dalits. Many people were left in a dying condition. The situation became such that the entire settlement of 150 families had to be evacuated," they said.

Prosecution sources said after the incident, violence broke out from village to city. "Jats from nearby areas attacked the villages of Jatavs.

HP High Court raps govt over lack of medical staff in tribal Chamba

Shimla, May 28 (UNI) The Himachal Pradesh High Court came down heavily on the state government on Wednesday for the acute shortage of medical staff in Civil Hospital Bharmaur and several Community and Primary Health Centres in the tribal region of Chamba district.

While hearing a civil writ petition filed by Dr. Janak Raj, Justice Ajay Mohan Goel directed the Secretary (Health) to ensure at least 50% of the sanctioned posts are filled at the earliest. The court noted with concern that out of 65 sanctioned posts at Civil Hospital Bharmaur, 35 are vacant.

Only two medical officers have been posted against 11 sanctioned positions since September 2023. The lone post of Dental Surgeon has been lying vacant since 2021, and the post of Chief Pharmacist has remained unfilled since 2016. Additionally, three posts each of Pharmacist and Winter Pharmacist, along with six posts of Staff Nurse, are vacant.

The petitioner, represented by Advocate Suman Thakur, highlighted the grim scenario in not only Civil Hospital Bharmaur but also CHC Holi, PHC Garola, PHC Mandha, and PHC Jagat.

Ludhiana West by-election: One nomination filed on 3rd day

Chandigarh, May 28 (UNI) One candidate filed his nomination papers for the 64-Ludhiana West seat of the Punjab Assembly on the third day of filing of nominations on Wednesday.

Punjab's Chief Electoral Officer (CEO), Sabin C, informed that an independent candidate, Baldev Raj Katna (Debi), submitted his nomination for the 64-Ludhiana West seat today.

Notably, the last date for filing nominations is June two and the scrutiny of nomination papers will take place on June three. The final date for withdrawal of nominations is June five.

Voting will take place on June 19, and the results will be declared on June 23, after the counting of votes.

Youth lives should shine, state GDP should rise: Dy CM

Hyderabad, May 28 (UNI) : Deputy Chief Minister Bhatti Vikramarka Mallu on Wednesday emphasised the state government's commitment to youth empowerment, asserting that the Rajiv Yuva Vikasam scheme aims to bring light into the lives of lakhs of young people and significantly boost the state's GDP through widespread economic participation.

Speaking via video conference with district collectors, along with Minister Ponnamp Prabhakar, the Deputy CM reviewed the implementation status of the scheme and issued several key directives.

Bhatti Vikramarka noted that, unlike earlier efforts, which he described as superficial, Rajiv Yuva Vikasam reflects the true intent of a people's

government. With an investment of Rs 8,000 crore, the scheme is designed to provide employment to five lakh youth and unlock the vast potential of Telangana's human resources.

future expansion. Reflecting on the challenges faced by Telangana's youth over the past decade, Bhatti Vikramarka said the new initiative is a direct response to that disillusionment. Similarly, selections under the BC Corporation must reflect the proportion of the BC population, with appropriate safeguards in place. The meeting was attended by Chief Secretary Ramakrishna Rao, Social Welfare Principal Secretary Sridhar, BC Welfare Commissioner Sridhar, and other senior officials, an official statement said.

India's first National Paper Expo 'PAPEXPO 2025' to kick off in Hyd from June 6

Hyderabad, May 28 (UNI) : India's first dedicated paper industry exhibition, PAPEXPO 2025, will be held from June 6 to 8 at HITEX Exhibition Centre, Madhapur, bringing together major players across the paper manufacturing, printing, packaging, and recycling sectors.

Organised by the Paper Foundation, the expo aims to promote eco-friendly practices in the paper industry and dispel common myths around paper consumption and deforestation. The event will be inaugurated by industry leaders including Dr Ajay Satia of Satia Industries, Mr Soumyajit Mukherjee of Emami Paper Mills, Dr Suresh Kumar Singhal of FTCCI, and Mr Nataraj of the Indian Institute of Packaging.

Speaking at a press conference on Wednesday, Nirmal Kuhad, CEO of Papyrus Expo LLP, said that over 100 exhibitors from India and abroad will participate, showcasing innovations across the paper value chain. The event is supported by industry bodies including the Indian Institute of Packaging (IIP), IPPTA, and FPTA, and is expected to attract more than 15,000 visitors.

B R Rao, President of the Paper Foundation, highlighted the industry's sustainability, noting that over 80 per cent of paper in India is produced using recycled materials and agro-residue, with no dependence on forest timber. He emphasised that PAPEXPO aims to foster awareness, collaboration, and responsible paper usage in line with India's Atma Nirbhar Bharat mission.

Dayaker Reddy, COO of Papyrus Expo LLP, added that the expo will include technical seminars with experts addressing key issues and innovations in the paper industry. Exhibitors will represent segments such as pulp and paper production, packaging, printing, machinery, and trading, with strong representation from major paper-producing states like Maharashtra, Gujarat, Tamil Nadu, and West Bengal. Delegations are also expected from Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, Odisha, and other states, ensuring a pan-India presence. India's per capita paper consumption stands at only 15–16 kg, well below the global average of 57 kg. The Paper Foundation aims to address this gap by promoting paper as a biodegradable, recyclable, and sustainable alternative to plastic. The industry is also seeking policy support from the Telangana Government, including the creation of a dedicated Paper Industrial Park and improved infrastructure.

PAPEXPO is poised to become a biennial flagship event for the industry, promoting innovation, sustainability, and global partnerships.

Centre has spent Rs 11 L cr in Telangana since 2014: Sarangula

Hyderabad, May 28 (UNI) : BJP spokesperson Amarnath Sarangula on Wednesday stated that since 2014, the Narendra Modi-led central government has spent approximately Rs 11 lakh crore on the development of Telangana.

Addressing the media at the BJP state office in Nampally, he alleged that despite the Centre's consistent cooperation over the past 16 months, several key infrastructure projects remain stalled due to the Telangana government's failure to contribute its share or complete necessary land acquisition.

He recalled that when Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy met Prime Minister Narendra Modi in February 2024, the Prime Minister

had given him specific directions to expedite work on pending projects.

However, Sarangula said there has been little progress on this front. He highlighted that significant funds are pending for various development initiatives—Rs 32,797 crore for improving mobile connectivity in Naxal-affected areas, Rs 18,189 crore for critical irrigation projects including the Devadula Lift Irrigation, SRSP Stage-2, and Rajiv Bheema Lift Irrigation, and Rs 1,366 crore for AIIMS Bibinagar.

He also pointed out delays in railway infrastructure with Rs 3,113 crore each sanctioned for the Manoharabad-Kothapalli and Kazipet-Vijayawada lines.

Amarnath claimed that

development works worth over Rs 71,000 crore have been halted due to the inaction of the state government. He mentioned that in April, BJP state president G Kishan Reddy had written to the Chief Minister, drawing attention to the delay in land acquisition and other state-level obstacles affecting national highway projects.

According to him, Telangana had just 2,500 km of national highways before 2014, but in the last 11 years, the Modi government has doubled this through investments exceeding Rs 1.2 lakh crore. Despite this, he said 16 national highway projects covering 691 km and valued at Rs 12,619 crore remain incomplete due to the state's failure to provide land. He emphasised that 32

out of 33 districts in Telangana now have national highway connectivity, crediting Prime Minister Modi for this achievement.

On railway development, he stated that although the Centre is investing ₹80,000 crore in projects, including the modernisation of 40 Amrit stations and works at Cherlapalli, Kazipet, and Secunderabad, progress is hampered due to the lack of approach roads and land from the state government.

He cited delays in the Manoharabad-Kothapalli railway line, where Rs 511.2 crore of the state's share remains pending, and similar issues affecting the Bhadrachalam-Kovvur line due to incomplete land acquisition.

In the healthcare sector,

he said that although Rs 1,366 crore has been sanctioned for AIIMS Bibinagar and other medical institutions, the state's failure to allocate land and share costs has stalled these projects.

He criticised the government for neglecting projects that would have provided vital rail connectivity to backward regions and the Sri Ramachandraswamy temple in Bhadrachalam.

Amarnath further accused the state government of missing out on central funds by not implementing necessary reforms. He said that under the SASCI scheme, the 2025 Union Budget had proposed Rs 1.5 lakh crore in interest-free loans for states carrying out citizen-centric reforms.

Female representation in tech contractual workforce surges to 14 pc in 2024

Gender representation within India’s contractual tech workforce within non-tech sectors has undergone a complex evolution, finds a report.

The report by TeamLease Digital, a specialised staffing firm in India, showed that in 2020 female representation for tech roles in non-tech sectors stood at a mere 1.90 per cent. However, by 2023 and 2024, this reached 11.8 per cent and 14 per cent, respectively, indicating a slow but encouraging shift in traditionally male-dominated roles.

“The significant rise in female representation in tech roles within non-tech sectors from 1.90 per cent in 2020 to 14 per cent in 2024 reflects a promising shift towards inclusivity. However, persistent gaps in technical skill representation and leadership roles highlight the need for targeted interventions,” said Neeti Sharma, CEO of TeamLease Digital.

India Inc.’s journey towards gender parity has seen gradual progress, extending even to traditionally male-dominated technology roles in non-tech sectors.

The comprehensive analysis showed that female representation surged from 9.51 per cent in 2020 to 27.98 per cent in 2024, reflecting growing momentum for diversity in a space long dominated by men.

This shift underscores the increasing recognition of women’s contributions to tech roles across non-tech domains and the growing appreciation for diversity in innovation-driven functions.Despite the progress, female representation in contractual tech roles remains uneven across non-tech industries.

While sectors such as BFSI (46.88 per cent women) and life sciences and healthcare (29.58 per cent women) have embraced gender parity, others, such as manufacturing and engineering (4.82 per cent women) and energy (6.25 per cent women), lag.

This imbalance is largely attributed to rigid hiring practices, cultural stereotypes, and limited skilling pathways for women in core technical functions.

Another concerning statistic is the low representation of women in senior roles - a mere 3.35 per cent. Women in mid-level roles comprise 4.07 per cent, while those in entry-level roles make up 3.03 per cent. This signals a major discrepancy as male dominance considerably surges, and women continue to face challenges in ascending to leadership roles.

However, between 2023 and 2024, there has been a noteworthy increase in female representation in mid and senior levels, going from 4.98 per cent in 2023 to 5.14 per cent in 2024 in mid-level roles. Similarly, female representation in senior positions increased from 3.95 per cent in 2023 to 4.86 per cent in 2024, a gradual shift in gender parity, with greater female representation, said the report, based on a quantitative research approach, analysing a proprietary dataset of 13,000 associates.

“Now, it’s time for organisations to encourage equitable resources for women, address industry-specific barriers, and empower women to represent a larger portion of the workforce. By doing so, companies can unlock diverse talent pools, driving innovation and sustainable growth across India’s workforce,” Sharma said.

Settlement of Ukraine conflict 'very complicated', admits Russian Ambassador

Russia's Ambassador to India, Denis Alipov on Wednesday admitted that the settlement of the Ukraine conflict remains "very complicated" and the focus should rather be on ending the war instead of initiating short ceasefires. Accusing Kyiv of repeatedly violating ceasefires, the Russian diplomat cited the recent exchange of prisoners as a positive development. At the same time, he made it clear that a ceasefire alone would not bring peace in Ukraine.

In an exclusive interview with the IANS, Alipov also spoke on several other issues, including India's decisive Operation Sindoor and successful use of Russian equipment, especially the S-400 air defence system and highly effective 'Made in India' BrahMos missiles.

Excerpts: IANS: What was your first reaction after the April 22 Pahalgam terror attack?

Denis Alipov: It was a heinous crime, an outrageous attack that happened on April 22 and it was widely condemned. The support of India was expressed by all Russia, including President Putin who responded immediately upon learning about the tragedy and sent a special message to Prime Minister Modi expressing our sympathies while stating that we expect that the culprits will be identified, tracked and punished. And that was something that India eventually did. We have always stated that there cannot be any double standards on terrorism, be it a trans-border one or of any other kind. We have always stood by the side of each other on this. Last year, India also immediately



expressed support for Russia after the big terror attack on one of the shopping malls in Moscow. We also coordinate with each other at the UN. Russia has supported a draft convention that India proposed to counter terrorism which needs to be adopted, as soon as possible

IANS: What has been your assessment of Operation Sindoor and the performance of S-400 and other Russian equipment used by India?

Denis Alipov: From what we know, India has clearly stated the goals and undertook actions after having identified the targets and the terrorists it promised to do. As far as we know, during the operation, the S-400 system was used and the BrahMos missiles were engaged. Judging by the reports available, the performance of these weapons was exemplary.

IANS: The BrahMos missiles also proved to be quite effective during Operation Sindoor ...

Denis Alipov: We have a joint venture for designing and producing these weapons. We are very satisfied with the results of this collaboration. It has very promising prospects and we wish to expand on that track, as on many others that we have discussed and are in the pipeline or are being

implemented already.

IANS: Prime Minister Narendra Modi has clearly emerged as one of the strongest leaders in the world, his discussions with President Vladimir Putin are also quite significant given the current circumstances .

Denis Alipov: I don't think there is anybody, anywhere in the world that doubts the credentials of Prime Minister Modi. His strong leadership is steering the country to global prominence. Both India and Russia stand for a multipolar world order without any global power or a group of countries dominating that order. They stand for an equal international relationship. This has been reinstated in the conversation President Vladimir Putin and Prime Minister Modi had on May 5.

IANS: President Putin is due to visit India soon, have any dates been finalised? It is expected that Russian Foreign Minister Sergei Lavrov will also be in New Delhi, next month ...

Denis Alipov: The interaction between the foreign ministers is very intense. There will be visits of Russian officials to India and there is going to be high-level visits of Indian officials to Russia, this year. The leaders will also meet and have an extensive agenda for discussion, as we have always done because our relations are very diversified. The dates

will be announced in due course by both sides as soon as the details are finalised.

IANS: How realistic is the chance of having a ceasefire between Russia and Ukraine?

Denis Alipov: The settlement of the Ukraine conflict is very complicated. It has deep roots, very serious causes, which need to be addressed. Ceasefire, per say, will not bring peace in Ukraine. Russia has several times initiated, proposed a ceasefire. We honoured those short ceasefires. We initiated and the Ukrainian side always violated. We are not at all sure that an extended ceasefire will succeed. But we are prepared to speak on ceasefire as a part of a broader settlement within the negotiations which we have always proposed. Actually, it was a good development that the Ukrainian side accepted our initiative and recently resumed the round of negotiations that happened in Turkey after almost three years. It went well. We agreed on a large exchange of prisoners, which has been completed. Hopefully, the next round will also happen soon. This is something that needs to be in focus -- the negotiations on the end of the war and not only on ceasefire. Ceasefire can be an element of these negotiations, but ceasefire, per se, will not bring peace in Ukraine.

IANS: Lastly, have there been any talks about India acquiring more S-400s?

Denis Alipov: Our discussion on this particular topic, as on many others, is ongoing. It is a continuous one, but it would be incorrect for me and also premature to speak about the results of it at the moment.

Op Sindoor was necessary, precisely targeted, not call for war: Tharoor

New Delhi, May 28 (UNI) In a powerful statement underscoring India's measured response to terrorism, Congress MP Shashi Tharoor, while strongly defending ‘Operation Sindoor’ emphasised that the mission was “necessary and precisely targeted” and “not a call for war”.Shashi Tharoor leads an Indian leaders’ delegation to various countries to educate them about Operation Sindoor and India’s strong message of zero-tolerance against terrorism.Citing the harrowing plight of 26 women whose “Sindoor” (vermillopn) was wiped off from their foreheads by terrorists, Tharoor said, “India’s response was carefully, precisely and calibrated strikes on terror bases—avoiding civilian, military, or government targets entirely”.

He said, “These terrorists came and wiped the Sindoor off their foreheads. Infact there were some women who cried and asked the terrorists "kill me too" and they said No! Go back and tell what happened to you.”Drawing an emotional parallel between the colour of “Sindoor” and the blood of the terrorists, Tharoor said, “We heard that cry and India decided that the colour of the Sindoor, the vermilion colour on the forehead of our women also match the colour of the blood of the killers, the perpetrators, the attackers”.

Emphasising India’s commitment to restraint, Tharoor said, “Even when we conducted those attacks on nine terror bases, our government said very clearly, without any doubt we are not looking, for any escalation.”

He highlighted that no Pakistani military, government, or civilian targets were struck. “These were carefully, precisely, calibrated strikes. We hit only terror bases. We did not hit any military facility of Pakistan, no government facilities, no civilian homes. Very precise targeting meant that even within the compounds of Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) and Jaish-e-Mohammed (JeM) with specific buildings and we did so at night between 1:05 and 1:30 AM. Why, because we did not want to have too much of collateral damage”.Meanwhile, senior Congress leader Udit Raj took a dig at Shashi Tharoor by calling him as “spokesperson of BJP”.He said, “My dear Shashi Tharoor, Alas! I could prevail upon PM Modi to declare you as super spokesperson of BJP, even declaring as foreign minister before landing in India”.On his social media handle X, Udit Raj asked Tharoor how he could “dismiss the proud legacy of the Congress by saying that before PM Modi, India never crossed LOC and International border.”Udit Raj said, “In 1965 Indian Army entered Pakistan at multiple points, which completely surprised the Pakistanis in the Lahore sector. In 1971, India tore Pakistan in two pieces and during UPA Govt several surgical strikes were unleashed but drum beating was not done to encash politically.

Doha, May 28 (UNI) : Petra Sorling was re-elected president of the International Table Tennis Federation (ITTF) at the Annual General Meeting (AGM) here, the ITTF announced on its official website on Tuesday.

The Swede received 104 votes, narrowly defeating the other candidate, Khalil Al-Mohannadi of Qatar, who received 102.

According to the ITTF

website, the AGM had to be suspended after it was disrupted by outsiders. As a result, it will need to be reconvened specifically for the election of vice presidents, with Sorling expected to announce the new date in due course.

The continuation of the election must take place no later than November 2025 to comply with the ITTF Constitution, which stipulates a four-year term for the Executive Board.

Meanwhile, hosts for the ITTF World Table Tennis Championships between 2027 and 2029 were selected during the AGM.

Astana, Kazakhstan, will host the 2027 World Table Tennis Championships, while the team championships in 2028 will be held in Fukuoka, Japan. Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, will host the 2029 edition of the sport's most prestigious event.

Bopanna and Pavlashek won 71 per cent of their second serve points and captured 44 receiving points overall, which proved decisive in the end.

Paris, May 28 (UNI) : In a major upset on the clay courts of Roland Garros, Portuguese tennis player Nuno Borges stunned seventh seed Casper Ruud to secure a spot in the third round of the French Open.

Borges, ranked World No. 42, overcame a shaky start to defeat Ruud 2-6, 6-4, 6-1, 6-0 in a match that lasted nearly three hours.

Ruud began strongly, dominating the first set with powerful baseline play and precise shot-making. However, Borges gradually found his rhythm, using his deft touch and consistent groundstrokes to turn the tide. After clinching the second set 6-4, Borges delivered an emphatic performance in the final two sets, breaking Ruud's serve multiple times and sealing the victory with an impressive 6-1, 6-0 scoreline. The Norwegian, who came into the tournament as one of the favourites to contend for the title, appeared to be battling an injury during the latter stages of the match. Observers noted Ruud's reduced movement and visible discomfort, particularly on his left leg, which seemed to affect his ability to chase down balls.

Helmet grab sparks chaos in Emerging match

Dhaka, May 28 (UNI) : The four-day match between the South Africa Emerging Team and Bangladesh Emerging Team was marred by an ugly on-field scuffle on Wednesday, with South African pacer Tshepo Ntuli physically tugging at the helmet of Bangladeshi batsman Ripon Mondol, twice, even as the umpire tried to intervene.

As he walked over to his batting partner Mehidy Hasan, Ripon appeared to exchange glances with the bowler. Ntuli then charged at him, leading to a heated confrontation. The two players initially shoved each other before Ntuli grabbed Ripon's helmet. On-field umpire Kamruzzaman stepped in to separate them, but Ntuli

Swiatek crushes Raducanu after tough year

Paris, May 28 (UNI) Iga Swiatek silenced any doubts about her form and focus with a commanding 6-1, 6-2 demolition of Britain's Emma Raducanu on Wednesday, extending her unbeaten streak at the French Open to 23 matches and making a resounding statement after a turbulent year on and off the court.

The World No.5, playing under her lowest Grand Slam seeding since 2022, showed no signs of rust on Court Philippe-Chatrier as she delivered a performance worthy of her title as the "Queen of Clay." The dominant win comes on the back of a challenging year that included a one-month suspension for a doping violation and the personal loss of her grandfather ahead of the Madrid Masters. Despite not having reached a final since last year's triumph in Paris, Swiatek appeared firmly in control from the outset, brushing aside the British No.2 in just 79 minutes to book her place in the third round for the seventh consecutive year.

Raducanu, currently ranked 41 in the world and making only her second French Open appearance since debuting in 2022, showed flashes of aggression early on but failed to capitalise on four break point chances. She has now lost all five meetings against Swiatek without claiming a set. Swiatek struck 31 winners to Raducanu's eight and converted four breaks of serve while saving all break points against her. The gap in class and consistency was evident throughout, with the Polish star sealing the first set in 35 minutes with an ace and continuing to dominate the second with powerful groundstrokes and relentless pressure.

Raducanu, who missed last year's edition due to injury, now exits in the second round again, continuing her search for stability on clay.

For Swiatek, however, the win was about far more than progression to the next round — it was a reminder to the field that, despite personal trials and a recent drop in ranking, she remains the standard-bearer at Roland Garros. With four titles already to her name in Paris, the 22-year-old looks poised for a fifth as she rediscovers the form and fire that once made her nearly untouchable on red dirt.

India to host Asian Weightlifting Championships after 44 years

Ahmedabad, May 28 (UNI) : In a major boost to Indian sport, Ahmedabad will host the 2026 Asian Weightlifting Championships, marking the country's return as host of the prestigious continental event after a gap of 44 years, the Asian Weightlifting Federation (AWF) announced on Wednesday.

The last time India played host was in 1982, when the event was held in

New Delhi alongside the Asian Games. Since its inception in 1957, the continental championship has largely eluded Indian soil, making the 2026 edition a historic comeback for Indian weightlifting on the Asian stage.

The tournament, scheduled from April 1 to 10 next year, was initially allotted to Gandhinagar, Gujarat, at the AWF Congress held in 2024 in Tashkent, Uzbekistan.

However, the venue has now been shifted to Ahmedabad, which is expected to provide enhanced infrastructure and greater logistical support.

This will also be the first Asian Championships to be held under the new weight categories introduced by the International Weightlifting Federation (IWF), marking a new era for the sport globally. The revised bodyweight

divisions come into effect post-Paris 2024 and are expected to reshape the competitive field.

India's recent performances have shown promising signs. At the 2024 edition held in Jiangshan, China, the country fielded a new-look squad. Seram Nirupama Devi, a former Asian youth medallist and National Games champion, impressed in the women's 64kg division with a fourth-

form throughout the tournament. The veteran batsman has amassed over 600 runs at an average of 60.20, striking consistently to keep RCB in commanding positions. His eight fifties, including one in the last game, highlight his dominance. Supporting Kohli is Jitesh Sharma, whose blistering unbeaten 85 off just 33 balls in the last game exemplifies his match-winning potential. Mayank Agarwal and Romario Shepherd have also stepped up, bringing valuable depth and flexibility. Punjab Kings, however, cannot be underestimated. The team finished top of the league standings with nine wins from 14 matches, their best campaign since 2014. Their batting is balanced and resilient, featuring a potent opening pair in Prabhsimran Singh and Priyansh Arya, who have laid solid foundations time and again.

Captain Shreyas Iyer has been the calm anchor in the middle order, scoring over 500 runs at an impressive strike rate of 172. The contributions from Marcus Stoinis, Josh Inglis, and Shashank Singh in the late overs have often turned tight matches in Punjab's favour.

Punjab's bowling has been effective, led by Arshdeep Singh, who tops their wicket charts with 18 scalps. However, the absence of pace spearhead Marco Jansen due to international commitments poses a challenge. Kyle Jamieson is expected to shoulder additional responsibility, although his economy rate has been a concern.

RCB eye final as dangerous Hazlewood

Chandigarh, May 28 (UNI) : Royal Challengers Bengaluru (RCB) have received a timely boost ahead of the IPL 2025 Qualifier 1 clash against Punjab Kings here on Friday, with the return of their crucial overseas stars Josh Hazlewood and Tim David, a development that could prove decisive in the high-stakes encounter at the Maharaja Yadavindra Singh Cricket Stadium, Mullanpur.

The playoffs always bring a different intensity, and RCB's strengthening bowling attack and finishing power with Hazlewood and David back in the fray significantly ups their chances of toppling a strong Punjab Kings side, who have been one of the most consistent teams throughout the season.

Hazlewood, the leading wicket-taker for RCB this season with 18 wickets from 10 matches, brings experience, discipline, and control to the pace attack. His ability to contain runs and pick crucial wickets in the middle overs will be vital in curbing Punjab's deep batting lineup. Royal Challengers Bengaluru's batting is anchored by the imperious Virat Kohli, who has been in scintillating

Pradhan urges Yadav to facilitate expansion and upgradation of Sambalpur Zoo

Bhubaneswar, May 28 (UNI) : Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan on Wednesday urged Union Minister for Environment, Forests and Climate Change, Bhupender Yadav, to facilitate the proposed expansion and upgradation of Sambalpur Zoo.

During a meeting with Yadav in New Delhi, Pradhan highlighted that in 2023, the Central Zoo Authority (CZA) designated the facility as the “Sambalpur Zoo and Conservation Centre”.

Established in 1980, the zoo has grown from a modest deer park into a vital hub for wildlife conservation and public education.

Currently spread across 13 hectares within the Motijharan Reserve Forest, the zoo houses 333 animals belonging to 15 species, including leopards, bears, pythons, and peacocks.

Pradhan pointed out that in 2022, the Zoo Evaluation Committee recommended upgrading Sambalpur Zoo to a “Medium Zoo” category. This recommendation included the addition of approximately 18 to 20 hectares of adjacent land, also part of the Motijharan Reserve Forest.

The proposed expansion will support the introduction of new species and the development of educational and research infrastructure. These plans align with the zoo’s approved master plan for 2023–24, which envisions housing 48 species.

With approval from the Central Zoo Authority, the zoo has already carried out a successful animal exchange program with Nandankanan Zoo and a translocation initiative in partnership with Debrigarh Sanctuary.

To further its mission of wildlife conservation and public education, Pradhan said the zoo is planning several new attractions.

Cabinet approves two multitracking projects across Indian Railways in Maharashtra and Madhya Pradesh

Hyderabad, May 28 : Initiatives will improve travel convenience, reduce logistic cost, decrease oil imports and contribute to lower CO2 emissions, supporting sustainable and efficient rail operations

To enhance line capacity, the Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs chaired by the Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi today approved two multitracking projects across Indian Railways to ensure seamless and faster transportation of both passengers and goods.

These projects include:

1. Ratlam- Nagda 3rd and 4th line

2. W a r d h a - Balharshah 4th line

The total estimated cost of the projects is Rs 3,399 crore (approx.) and will be completed upto 2029-30.

The projects are result of PM-Gati Shakti National Master Plan for multi-modal connectivity which have been possible through integrated planning and will provide seamless connectivity for movement of people, goods and services.

The two projects covering four Districts across the states of

Maharashtra, and Madhya Pradesh, will increase the existing network of Indian Railways by about 176 Kms.

The proposed multi-tracking project will enhance connectivity to approx. 784 villages, which are having a population of about 19.74 lakh.

These are essential routes for transportation of commodities such as coal, cement, clinker, gypsum, fly ash, containers, agriculture commodities, and Petroleum products etc. The capacity augmentation works will result in additional freight traffic of magnitude 18.40 MTPA (Million Tonnes Per Annum). The Railways being environment friendly and energy efficient mode of transportation, will help both in achieving climate goals and minimizing logistics cost of the country, reduce oil import (20 Crore Litres) and lower CO2 emissions (99 Crore Kg) which is equivalent to plantation of 4 Crore trees.

The projects will also generate direct employment for about 74 lakh human-days during construction.

These initiatives will improve travel convenience, reduce

logistic cost, decrease oil imports and contribute to lower CO2 emissions, supporting sustainable and efficient rail operations. The projects would also enhance logistical efficiency by augmenting line capacity along critical routes for transportation of containers, coal, cement, agricultural commodities, and other goods. These improvements are expected to optimize supply chains, thereby facilitating accelerated economic growth.

The increased line capacity will significantly enhance mobility, resulting in improved operational efficiency and service reliability for Indian Railways. These multi-tracking proposals are poised to streamline operations and alleviate congestion. The projects are in line with the Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi’s Vision of a New India which will make people of the region “Atmanirbhar” by way of c o m p r e h e n s i v e development in the area which will enhance their employment/ self-employment opportunities.
