Man, his two children die after jumping off building to escape fire

New Delhi, June 10 (UNI) A 35-year-old man and his two children died after a massive fire broke out in a residential housing society in Dwarka Sector 13 on Tuesday morning.

The three jumped from their top floor flat of the Housing society to save themselves as the building caught fire. However, all three died.

The victims included a ten-year-old boy and a 12-year-old girl. The wife of the 35-year old victim somehow managed to escape the blaze and survived.

Monsoon set to revive by June 13, in Mumbai and other parts of Maharashtra

Mumbai, June 10 (UNI) The India Meteorological Department (IMD) on Tuesday predicted that the monsoon is set to revive by June 13, bringing widespread rain to the maximum city and the surrounding region, including Mumbai and other parts of Maharashtra. Monsoon is not a continuous phenomenon. It includes active and dormant phases. According to the latest weather models, a trough extending from North Tamil Nadu to the South Maharashtra coast through interior Karnataka is strengthening. This system is expected to pull in moisture and trigger rainfall across the peninsular belt. The IMD has accordingly issued alerts for various districts in anticipation of this development.

An orange alert, indicating the possibility of heavy to very heavy rain, was issued for Sindhudurg, Kolhapur and the hilly regions of the Kolhapur Ghats.

Cabinet gives statutory status to State Scheduled Castes Commission

Mumbai, June 10 (UNI) : The state Cabinet, chaired by Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis, on Tuesday gave its approval to give a statutory status to the Maharashtra State Scheduled Castes Commission, on the lines of the central government.

The government established the Scheduled Castes and Tribes Commission in the state in 2005 to effectively implement the principle of social justice.

However, there are two separate commissions functioning in the central government for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes. Since the subjects related to Scheduled Castes

and Scheduled Tribes are different, the Central Tribal Council has recommended the establishment of separate commissions for both. Accordingly, two separate commissions have been established for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in the state, an official statement said here.

In today's Cabinet meeting, the draft bill prepared in connection with giving statutory status to the State Scheduled Castes Commission was approved. A bill in this regard will be brought in the upcoming legislative assembly session.

The Cabinet also gave approval to transfer 27

posts created for this commission to the establishment of the commission.

In another significant decision, the state Cabinet on Tuesday gave its nod for revenue enhancement measures of the State Excise department.

Fadnavis said a secretary-level study group was formed to increase the revenue of this department. This group studied the best practices and policy issues being implemented in other states for increasing liquor production policy, licensing, excise duty and tax collection and submitted its report to the government, he informed. Accordingly, approval was given to the

revised structure of the Excise department and the establishment of an integrated control room of the department.

Through this room, distilleries, liquor factories, wholesalers in the state will be controlled through an AI system, the Chief Minister said. As per the revised structure of the department, a new divisional office will be set up in Mumbai city and one additional superintendent's office each for six districts namely Mumbai suburbs, Thane, Pune, Nashik, Nagpur and Ahilyanagar.

The proposals for increasing revenue of the Excise department were approved in the cabinet meeting.

Fadnavis lists out achievements of Modi govt in last 11 years

Mumbai, June 10 (UNI) : Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis on Tuesday addressed a special press conference here organised to mark the third term of the Narendra Modi government and listed out achievements of the Modi government during last 11 years.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi and India have become a global equation and India's reputation in the world has enhanced due to the Modi government's tenure, he claimed.

In last 11 years, due to various schemes of the Modi government, there has been a radical change in the lives of the poor, women, youth, Dalits, deprived and people from all walks of life in the country, he further claimed while presenting details of the public welfare schemes implemented by the Modi government during the period.

During this period, various development schemes and projects such as railway, infrastructure works, housing for the poor, toilets, free distribution of foodgrains, electrification of lakhs of houses in rural areas, Mudra, Jan Dhan,

Suraksha Bima Yojana, Ayushman Bharat Yojana were implemented across the country, including Maharashtra, he said.

The total value of benefits provided directly into the beneficiaries' accounts by the Modi government so far is around Rs 42 lakh crore, the Chief Minister claimed.

Also, the agriculture sector has seen a five-fold rise in last 10 years, he informed and asserted that 25 crore population came above the poverty line after provision of direct benefits to the deprived people of society. Making a comparison between the UPA government and the Modi government, he claimed that the UPA government beat the odds of Rs 80,000 crore loan waivers, while the Modi government gave Rs 3.7 lakh crore. Under the Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima, insurance claims have been settled and farmers have been given a huge relief, he said. Thus, in last 11 years, the support price of crops, milk production, fish production, ethanol blending has increased,

Israeli national goes missing during trek to Triund in Kàngrà district, search operation on: Police

Dharamshala, June 10 (UNI) : An Israeli national, who went for a trek to Triund in Kangra district of Himachal Pradesh, has gone missing, police said here today.

According to police, the Israeli national was identified as Samuel Vengrinovich, in his mid 30s. He had set out for a trek on June 6 with a group.

When he did not return by nightfall, an intensive search was carried out. However, after failing to locate him, his friend Ediblam, alerted the McLeodganj police on Monday, the police said.

A group of five tourists had come to Himachal Pradesh for a trip, but Samuel got separated during the trek in the hills of Triund and they have not heard from him since then, the group members told the police.

Kangra police said following the report, joint search teams of police, State Disaster Response Force (SDRF) and the District Disaster Management Authority (DDMA) launched extensive operations.

The search and combing operation in Triund, Indrahar Pass, Jot, and other nearby remote areas was in progress, but despite ongoing efforts, no sign of Samuel has been found, so far, the police said.

Eyes filled with tears on seeing Kashmir getting connected with the rail network: Farooq

Srinagar, June 10 (UNI) National Conference President and former Chief Minister of Jammu and Kashmir, Farooq Abdullah, on Tuesday travelled on the recently inaugurated Katra-Srinagar Vande Bharat Express along with other leaders and party MLAs.

After the train ride, an emotional Abdullah said his heart was overwhelmed and his eyes filled with tears on seeing Kashmir finally getting connected with the rail network of the country.

Abdullah boarded the train from Srinagar Railway Station to Katra early Tuesday and expressed his admiration for the train.

"I am very happy to be travelling on this train to Katra. It is one of the biggest benefits for us," said the former Chief Minister.

Launched by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, the two semi-high-speed trains connecting the Valley with Jammu's Katra town began operations on June 7. Since their inauguration, the trains have gained immense popularity among locals, pilgrims, and tourists, with bookings already at full capacity. Vande Bharat Express trains run between Srinagar and Katra via Banihal six days a

week, except Wednesday.

Abdullah emphasized that the Vande Bharat service offers a much-needed alternative to the Srinagar-Jammu highway, which is often unreliable due to landslides and weather-related disruptions.

"The road gets closed frequently, and airfares shoot up during such times. This train will spare people from those difficulties," he said.

Abdullah also noted that the train service will positively impact the tourism sector and the region's horticulture industry.

J&K Chief Minister Omar Abdullah's sons, Zamir and Zahir, J&K Minister Satish Sharma, Chief Minister's advisor Nasir Aslam Wani, and National Conference Chief Spokesperson and MLA Tanvir Sadiq also accompanied Abdullah on his train ride.

At Katra railway station, Abdullah called the train the biggest gift for the people as it will also strengthen "love and friendship" between the two regions.

He congratulated all the workers and engineers who built the world's highest bridge on the Srinagar-Katra train link.

Bhopal railway division earns Rs 4.60 cr from ticket checking drive in May

Bhopal, June 10 (UNI) The Bhopal railway division of West Central Railway (WCR) earned a revenue of over Rs 4.60 crore from ticket checking drives in May. Bhopal Railway Division spokesperson said that during May, irregularities were found in 64,710 cases, resulting in revenue earnings of Rs 4,60,07,920.

Out of these, 35,075 passengers were found travelling without tickets, and Rs 2,97,08,585 were recovered from them. Additionally, 30,483 passengers were found travelling on improper tickets, and Rs 1,62,55,385 was recovered from them.

As many as 152 cases of passengers carrying unbooked luggage were detected, and Rs 43,950 was recovered from them.

Two labourers killed in train accident in Chhattisgarh

Balod (Chhattisgarh), June 10 (UNI) :Two labourers from Jharkhand, who had come to Dallirajhara, died after being hit by a train in Balod district of Chhattisgarh, while two others were injured. Eleven labourers from Jharkhand were walking on the railway track from Dallirajhara to Kusumkasa. Due to fatigue, five of them sat down on the tracks and fell asleep.

Siddaramaiah advocates new caste survey

New Delhi, June 10 (UNI): Karnataka Chief Minister Siddaramaiah on Tuesday underscored the government's commitment to conducting a fresh caste survey, emphasising its significance in promoting social justice and understanding demographic realities.

Addressing the media after a meeting with the party high command here, Siddaramaiah said, "The last caste survey was conducted in 2015–16. We believe a new survey is necessary to serve a different purpose and adopt a different methodology. This will help us better address the needs

of various communities and ensure equitable development."

He further clarified that the government's support for the caste census stems from the need for accurate data to formulate policies that promote social justice.

Highlighting recent controversies, Siddaramaiah mentioned reports of some organisations and ministers making derogatory remarks about certain castes concerning religious conversions. He assured that the government is committed to respecting all castes and communities and is taking steps to ensure social harmony.

Apart from the caste survey, Siddaramaiah addressed the recent tragic stampede in Bengaluru, which resulted in the loss of eleven lives. He detailed the government's response, including the formation of a judicial commission led by retired Justice Michael Cunha, suspension of five police officers, transfer of intelligence officials, and the relief of a political secretary. "A magisterial inquiry is underway, and we have taken all appropriate measures," he said.

He also urged the public and the media not to politicise the incident, emphasising that the focus

should be on justice and accountability. "The Kumbh Mela tragedy in Haridwar is a separate incident and should be discussed first before addressing this. When people die, we feel sorrow. We should not politicise such tragedies," he added.

Siddaramaiah's statements reflect his government's balanced approach, prioritising social justice through the caste survey while responsibly handling recent tragedies without political sensationalism. His emphasis on data-driven policies aims to promote inclusivity and social harmony across Karnataka.

‘Kangra district administration on alert ahead of monsoon’

Dharamshala, June 10 (UNI) Kangra Deputy Commissioner Hemraj Bairwa said the district administration is fully alert to deal with potential disasters ahead of the monsoon season.

He emphasised that timely weather forecasts will be regularly disseminated to the public to ensure that residents remain aware and prepared in advance.

The officials were directed to clean drains and water channels (kuhls) across all panchayats to prevent water logging during heavy rains.

Instructions have also been issued to prepare a list of landslide-prone roads and areas in advance so that preventive measures can be implemented effectively.

The DC stressed the importance of pre-positioning essential machinery and tools, including JCBs, by departments like Public Works, IPH, and Electricity to respond swiftly during emergencies.

He also instructed the Food and Civil Supplies Department to ensure the advance stocking of essential food items and medicines in remote and inaccessible areas.

Haryana CM praises PM’s 'transformative leadership' over Congress-era's indecisiveness

Chandigarh, Jun 10 (UNI) :Haryana Chief Minister, Nayab Singh Saini, addressing a press conference on the completion of 11 years of the Modi Government, praised Prime Minister Narendra Modi's leadership for "steering the nation from a time of indecision and inefficiency to an era of dynamic governance, national pride, and global recognition".

He described the last 11 years as the most transformative phase of


independent India, where each citizen has felt the presence of a decisive, sensitive, and effective government. "Today's India is led by Vision, Not Vote-Bank Politics," he said.

Saini said, while the previous Congress-led governments were often marked by hesitation, weak decision-making and misplaced priorities, PM Modi gave India a clear vision, a strong direction, and an unwavering commitment to public

Before 2014, "the country was engulfed in an atmosphere of gloom and distrust. Corruption, and ineffective leadership had blocked our progress. Those days were ruled by fear, nepotism, regionalism, and corruption, there was a complete lack of fair governance.

Governor urges Portugal to focus on select sectors to increase trade volume

Mumbai, June 10 (UNI) : Maharashtra Governor C P Radhakrishnan on Tuesday suggested that Portugal should focus on select sectors such as infrastructure, information technology, tourism, and textiles, and make efforts to increase the current trade volume from USD 1.2 billion to at least USD 10 billion.

According to a statement issued by the Governor's house, the suggestion was made during a courtesy meeting between Ambassador of the Republic of Portugal in India, João Manuel Mendes Ribeiro de Almeida, and the Governor of Maharashtra at Raj Bhavan, here.

Stating that Portugal and India share a historical relationship, the Ambassador said Portugal is now focusing on the future and is keen to enhance cooperation with India across various sectors, including

trade.

In this context, he said, Portugal is also interested in signing a memorandum of understanding with Maharashtra.

The Ambassador mentioned that this year holds special significance for both India and Portugal, as it marks the 50th anniversary of the re-establishment of diplomatic relations between the two nations.

He informed that efforts are underway to strengthen bilateral cooperation in areas such as trade, tourism, textiles and information technology.

He told the Governor that he was meeting over 100 business representatives in Mumbai.

The Ambassador also informed that around 1.25 lakh Indians reside in Portugal and that they had integrated well into Portuguese society.

He said Indians possess a wide range of skills and added that Portugal currently has a growing need for skilled manpower.

Doctors body condemns public suspension of Goa hospital CMO by Health Minister

Mumbai, June 10 (UNI) : Maharashtra Senior Resident Doctors' Association (MSRDA), a body of the state doctors, wrote to Prime Minister Narendra Modi, condemning the public suspension of the Chief Medical Officer (CMO) at Goa Medical College and Hospital (GMCH) by the state's Health Minister Vishwajit Rane, according to a statement issued here on Tuesday.

The incident occurred on June seven, when the Health Minister reportedly suspended the CMO in full public view, allegedly without prior inquiry or explanation, but the suspension was later reversed by the Chief Minister, the Association described the incident as a serious affront to the dignity and morale of medical professionals nationwide.

In a powerful show of solidarity and a strongly worded letter to the Prime Minister, MSRDA stated: "This episode is not merely a bureaucratic misstep; it is emblematic of a disturbing trend where doctors are made scapegoats for administrative or political gain."The Association recalled similar past incidents, including the assault on junior doctors in Kolkata in 2019 and other instances of verbal and physical abuse of medical personnel across the country, as part of a growing pattern of mistreatment.

MNS stages protest over train tragedy

Mumbai, June 10 (UNI) The Maharashtra Navnirman Sena (MNS) led by Raj Thackeray launched a protest rally on Tuesday against the railway administration, demanding urgent safety measures and the removal of platform stalls that allegedly contribute to chaotic congestion.

The protest came a day after the death of four passengers lost their lives falling from an overcrowded local train near Mumbra station in Maharashtra.

MNS Thane district president Avinash Jadhav along with hundreds of party workers marched from Gaondevi area to Thane railway station, shouting slogans against what they termed the "negligent and insensitive" attitude of the railway authorities.

The demonstration was heavily guarded by police to prevent any law and order disruption.

The party highlighted that the curve near Mumbra station, where Monday's fatal incident occurred, had already been flagged as dangerous three months ago by an MNS worker from Titwala. "Despite repeated warnings, no action was taken," said Jadhav, accusing the railway administration of criminal negligence.

J J Hospital MBBS student commits suicide

Mumbai, June 10 (UNI) A 22-year-old third-year MBBS student from government-run Grant Medical College and Sir JJ Hospital committed suicide, police said on Tuesday, adding primary investigations suggested that he was under depression.

According to police, Rohan Ramfer Prajapati allegedly hanged himself from the ceiling fan of his hostel room in the Sir JJ Hospital premises on Sunday night, and the incident came to the fore when his roommate, Ritesh Vishwakarma, came to the hostel room around 10.50pm the same day.Prajapati was rushed to the hospital's emergency section, but was declared dead.While talking to UNI, an official of JJ Marg police station said that the body of Parjapati was handed over to his parents and the investigation was going on.Sources said that parents of Parjapati were facing financial problems, which led to his depression, and he took the extreme step.

NCP (SP) leaders Satyajitsinh Patankar, Vaibhav Patil join BJP

Mumbai, June 10 (UNI) In a setback to NCP (SP) ahead of upcoming local body elections in the state, Sharad Pawar's trusted aide and former minister Vikramsinh Patankar's son, Satyajitsinh Patankar, and former mayor of Vita, Vaibhav Patil, joined the Bharatiya Janata Party along with office bearers here on Tuesday.

They were welcomed in the party-fold by BJP state working president Ravindra Chavan and Education Minister Chandrakant Patil.

Speaking on the occasion, Chavan said that the party will get strength in Satara and Sangli districts following the entry of both Patankar and Patil, who contested the assembly elections on NCP ticket in 2024 and 2019.

Patankar and Patil have supported BJP to fulfil the dream of Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis of a developed India and a developed Maharashtra, he added.

Centre, State govt working on master plan to avoid Thane train tragedy like incidents in future: CM

Mumbai, June 10 (UNI) : A day after the tragic incident near the Mumbra railway station, which resulted in the loss of four lives due to overcrowding on local trains, taking lessons from it the central and the state governments are working on a master plan with adequate measures to avoid mishaps on suburban trains and ensure passenger safety, said Maharashtra Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis on Tuesday.

The Chief Minister has admitted that the delay in completion of Metro railways has proved detrimental in decongesting crowded local trains.

"Railway Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw held two-hour-long discussion with me post incident on Monday.

We deliberated on effective measures to address the problems of overcrowding in local trains during the peak hours," the CM told reporters here as part of a media interaction

Bombay High Court to begin live streaming shortly

Mumbai, June 10 (UNI) : Chief Justice of the Bombay High Court, Alok Aradhe, announced on Tuesday that live streaming of court proceedings will soon commence from five designated benches.

The decision follows a resolution passed by the full court and aims to boost judicial transparency and public access to court hearings while the technical preparations for streaming are currently underway.

The announcement came during a hearing before a bench of Chief Justice Aradhe and Justice Sandeep V Marne, after Advocate Mathews J Nedumpara mentioned a public interest litigation (PIL) seeking live streaming of court proceedings.

Adv Subhash Jha, appearing for Nedumpara, pressed for an urgent hearing, stressing the need for audio-visual infrastructure not just in the High Court but also in subordinate courts.

Jha remarked that such technology was already in use across lower courts in Delhi and added, "It is no rocket science in today's time."

Responding to the submissions, Chief Justice Aradhe said, "We have made substantial progress. The Full Court has passed a resolution for the live streaming of certain courts. Technical arrangements are being made. First five courts will be live."

Is analysing Trump's Presidency challenge for strategic observers?

US President Donald Trump in his second term is beginning to attract criticism on three counts- his pursuit of the idea of ‘America First’ was pushing the US towards ‘isolationism’, his focus on tariffs was adding to his image as a ‘business leader’ rather than a ‘statesman’ and his Presidency was getting marked for ‘anti-liberalism’ that ran counter to the historical American legacy.

Does President Trump have the intellectual brilliance of a kind that enabled a leader to give the impression of his being ‘unpredictable’, ‘arbitrary’ and even terse to the point of sounding ‘offensive’ whereas in reality there was a ‘method in his madness’ as he towed a singular path for rectifying governance, controlling financial profligacy and not letting the world take the US for granted? Trump certainly would not like the US to lose the tag of being the first superpower. He has shrewdly identified the world problems that came in the way of American supremacy and has unwaveringly gone tough on them. These are Islamic Terrorism, a determined China trying to get the better of other countries through investment and trade to take the economic route to becoming the second superpower and the undue advantage friendly countries took of the US while projecting the latter as the leader of the Free World.

That President Donald Trump is willing to put all his energy into revolutionising America, is seen in his engagement in an astonishingly wide range of international crises and negotiations in Europe, Asia and the Middle East. In his time the White House is pivoting many crucial diplomatic initiatives. He is catalysing many negotiations and has not done too badly in sorting out things because of his willingness to do a course correction if the move ran into a dead end. Some of this was evident after he advanced the claim that he had brought about a ceasefire between India and Pakistan when the two countries were in the midst of a military confrontation following the terrorist attack at Pahalgam.

In his innate desire to take credit for finding geopolitical solutions he even talked of mediating between India and Pakistan on the issue of Kashmir but quickly realised that the suggestion was going to create a huge problem for India-US relations. He therefore lost no time in stating that the two countries should talk to each other directly.

Trump Administration cannot be faulted for taking interest in the matter of India-Pak military confrontation after a desperate Pakistan had approached it in the wake of damage inflicted by India on several Pak air bases during the escalating situation. India’s acceptance of a plea for ceasefire made by Pak at DGMO level, can also not be interpreted as a sign of weakness of any sort. Operation Sindoor was meant to make punitive strikes at as many as nine terrorist bases beyond LoC and inside Pakistan identified by our Intelligence. A failed attempt of the Pak army subsequently, to make a drone attack on India invited a deadlier missile strike on the leading air bases of Pakistan, pushing the Pakistan army into a situation where it was driven to call for a halt on the military operations.

The response from India can be said to have added to our credentials as a responsible peace-loving nation. Modi government’s claim that Operation Sindoor was a success stands to reason- the political slugfest resulting from it at home can be seen, to an extent, as a manifestation of our domestic politics.

Trump’s approach to foreign policy seems to be flawed for the reason that it did not get all its components right. ‘Making America Great Again’ (MAGA) depended as much on the military and technological might of the US together with its economic power gained largely through trade, as on the ‘patterns of interdependence’ that strengthened America. Trump has apparently given total attention to the first two at the cost of the last prerequisite of US strength being sustained by its links with the democracies of Europe and Asia.

President Trumps’s idea of withdrawing from international institutions and forums promoting liberal values in pursuit of ‘America First’ doctrine, may yield short-term financial gains but they would undermine the cause of US supremacy as the leader of the democratic world.

If all that Trump was doing was only a series of immediate moves meant to correct the trade deficit and inject cost-effectiveness in governance and USAID projects, this could be understood. But there should be no doubt in his mind that MAGA in the long term would rest essentially on a willing acceptance of the US as a repository of human and democratic values, by others- in contrast to the rising autocratic regimes. Trump’s handling of the world’s trouble spots including the Middle East where Israel’s military offensive in Gaza had raised serious humanitarian concerns, can be said to be upfront and even astute. His methods are direct- his focus has always been on his personal role in driving diplomatic initiatives- and they indicate his strong political will and determination to pursue what he thought was good for America’s economy and business.

What causes heart failure?

There are several causes. The most common include coronary artery disease, high blood pressure, previous heart attacks, heart valve diseases, and certain infections or genetic conditions that weaken the heart muscle.

What are the early symptoms I should watch out for?

Common symptoms include shortness of breath, fatigue, swelling in the legs or ankles, rapid heartbeat, persistent coughing, and difficulty lying flat due to breathlessness. These symptoms often worsen over time if left untreated.

How is heart failure diagnosed?

We start with a physical exam and medical history, followed by tests like ECG

(electrocardiogram), echocardiogram, chest X-ray, blood tests (including BNP), and sometimes cardiac MRI or stress tests. These help us assess heart function and determine the type and severity of heart failure.

Can heart failure be cured?

While heart failure often cannot be completely cured, it can be managed very effectively. With proper treatment and lifestyle changes, many people live long and active lives.

What are the main treatment options?

Treatment typically includes medications, lifestyle modifications, and in some cases, device implantations or surgery. The goal is to improve symptoms, slow disease progression, and reduce hospitalisations.

What kind of medications are usually

prescribed?

Common medications include ACE inhibitors, beta-blockers, diuretics, ARBs (angiotensin receptor blockers), ARNI (angiotensin receptor neprilysin inhibitors), aldosterone antagonists, and SGLT2 inhibitors. Each plays a role in improving heart function and controlling symptoms.

Are there any lifestyle changes I should make?

Yes, and they’re very important. Reduce salt intake, manage fluid intake, avoid alcohol and smoking, monitor weight daily, exercise regularly (as advised), and control blood pressure and diabetes. Following a heart-healthy diet is also crucial.

What about devices? When are they needed?

When medications aren’t enough or if the heart rhythm is affected, we may recommend devices

like pacemakers, implantable cardioverter-defibrillators (ICDs), or cardiac resynchronization therapy (CRT). These help regulate heartbeat and improve heart function.

Is surgery ever required for heart failure?

Sometimes. If heart failure is due to valve disease, valve repair or replacement might be necessary. In severe cases, especially when other treatments have failed, a heart transplant or a left ventricular assist device (LVAD) may be considered.

Are there any risks associated with device implantation?

Like any medical procedure, device implantation carries risks such as infection, bleeding, or device malfunction. However, for many patients, the benefits significantly outweigh the risks, especially when managed by experienced medical teams.

Sole aim of terrorism is to spread fear and destabilise societies: Nityanand Rai

New Delhi, June 10 (UNI) : Union Minister of State for Home Affairs Nityanand Rai said on Tuesday that the sole aim of terrorism is to spread fear and destabilise societies across the world and therefore it must be decisively defeated.

Speaking at the 23rd NSG International Seminar here, he said that terrorism has become the most serious threat to global peace, development, and human rights.

"It is our experience that to completely defeat terrorism, we need more than just military action. Global cooperation is essential. Countries must come together, share intelligence, and expose the motives and mechanisms of terrorists to dismantle their networks effectively," Rai said.

Highlighting the cross-border nature of terrorism, the Minister noted that it is not confined to the geographical boundaries of any one nation. "The challenge is national, regional, and global. Anyone who does not oppose terrorism is also a party to it," he warned.

Rai further asserted that terrorism should be recognised as a universal threat, regardless of where it strikes — be it India, Israel, the United States, or Europe. "If the global community truly wishes to defeat terrorism, it must identify and confront all its manifestations without bias or exception," he added.

Reaffirming India’s unwavering commitment to

the global fight against terrorism, Rai said, "India, as a responsible democratic nation and is fully committed to cooperating in global anti-terrorism efforts—whether under the framework of the United Nations, through bilateral engagements, or other international initiatives."

"India has always been a strong partner in the fight against terrorism and will continue to play this role with full determination," he added.

Describing the National Security Guard (NSG) as a strong pillar of national and internal security, Rai said the organisation has made the country proud on numerous occasions—whether in combating terrorism, handling plane hijackings, or assisting citizens during natural calamities.

He further added that they have faced every challenge with unwavering determination. On the occasion, Memorandum of Understanding between NSG and state police forces was signed and the annual magazine of the organisation titled Bombshell was also released. The goal of the strikes has been achieved. All designated facilities have been hit," the ministry said in a statement.

South Korea to sign K2 tanks export deal with Poland: Media

Seoul, June 10 (UNI) : South Korea was expected to sign an export deal of K2 tanks worth about 6 billion U.S. dollars with Poland in late June, Yonhap news agency said Tuesday, citing multiple government sources.The deal, which would be the country's biggest single arms export contract, will be inked in Poland late this month.

Under the contract, Poland will be supplied with a total of 180 K2 tanks including 117 units manufactured by South Korean defense company Hyundai Rotem and 63 units produced by Poland's state-owned PGZ.

The Asian country signed the first export deal with Poland in 2022 to supply the first batch of 180 K2 tanks.In the same year, South Korea inked a series of deals with Poland to export K2 tanks, K9 self-propelled howitzers and FA-50 light attack aircraft.

Bolivian ex-president Morales under investigation for alleged electoral sabotage

La Paz, June 10 (UNI) : Bolivian legal authority opened an investigation of former President Evo Morales on Monday on alleged electoral sabotage in connection to ongoing protests demanding that he be allowed to run for reelection.

Attorney General Roger Mariaca told a press conference Monday that the Public Prosecutor's Office has decided to address a complaint filed by the Justice Ministry against Morales for certain criminal offenses.

The complaint accuses Morales of "terrorism," obstructing the electoral process, disobeying constitutional resolutions, disrupting public services, and destroying state property, among other crimes, linked to road blockades that paralyzed key regions of the country last week.

The government said it has evidence showing that the former president ordered his supporters to "encircle towns" after electoral authorities rejected his bid to run for a fourth term in the general elections on August 17.

Since last week, roadblocks put up at some 20 critical transportation points across the country have been concentrated mainly in Cochabamba department. Clashes and shortages of supplies have been reported in the affected areas.

The prosecutor said the roadblocks violate fundamental rights and endanger the lives of Bolivians.

The Public Prosecutor's Office has ordered the tactical withdrawal of its prosecutors to safer areas within that region, as they continue to operate in coordination with the police.

Washington, D.C. in preparation for military parade

New York, June 10 (UNI) : The capital city of the United States is gearing up for Saturday's military parade to honor the 250th birthday of the Army and the 79th birthday of President Donald Trump.

"We're preparing for an enormous turnout," Matt McCool of the Secret Service's Washington Field office, was quoted on Monday by The Associated Press as saying. More than 18 miles of "anti-scale fencing" would be erected and "multiple drones" would be in the air, according to the officer. The entire District of Columbia is normally a no-fly zone for drones.Army officials have estimated around 200,000 attendees for the evening military parade, and McCool said he was prepared for "hundreds of thousands" of people.

A total of 175 magnetometers would be used at security checkpoints controlling access to the daytime birthday festival and the nighttime parade. Metropolitan Police Department chief Pamela Smith predicted major impacts to traffic and advised attendees to arrive early and consider forgoing cars for the Metro.

The military parade has been designated a National Special Security Event, similar to a presidential inauguration or state funeral. That status is reserved for events that draw large crowds and potential mass protests. It calls for an enhanced degree of high-level coordination among D.C. officials, the Federal Bureau of Investigation, Capitol Police and Washington's National Guard contingent, with the Secret Service taking the lead.The Army birthday celebration had already been planned for months. But earlier this spring, Trump announced his intention to transform the event, which coincides with his 79th birthday, into a massive military parade complete with 60-ton M1 Abrams battle tanks and Paladin self-propelled howitzers rolling through the city streets.

Death toll from school shooting in Austria preliminarily rises to 11



Vienna, June 10 (UNI) : The death toll from the school shooting in Austria's Graz has preliminarily risen to 11, AUF1 broadcaster reported on Tuesday. Earlier in the day, media reports

indicated that eight people were killed, with many people seriously injured, including the attacker.

As a 16-year-old schoolgirl told AUF1 that the death toll has risen to 11, an ambulance worker

informed her.All the seriously injured are being transported to nearby hospitals by a rescue helicopter, and, according to the police, the perpetrator was allegedly a victim of bullying, the broadcaster reported.

10 people, mostly students, killed in mass shooting in Austrian school, several injured

Graz, June 10 (UNI) : At least 10 people, mostly students, were killed and several were badly injured in a shooting incident in a secondary school in the Austrian city of Graz. The suspected shooter reportedly committed suicide later in one of the school's toilets.

As per The New York Times, Austria's elite COBRA police forces along with a police helicopter, arrived at the crime scene after shots were reported.

The mayor of Graz, Elke Kahr, said that the suspected shooter, several students and another adult, thought to be a teacher, were among the fatalities in the attack, the deadliest in Austria's postwar history.

The Austrian Press Agency reported that as many as 30 people were injured.

According to preliminary reports, the perpetrator was a 22-year-old ex-student who had

described himself as a victim of bullying in the past.He reportedly fired shots in two classrooms, using a pistol and a shotgun, killing and injuring multiple pupils and teachers. The dead reportedly included seven pupils and one adult. The incident occurred at about 10am local time (0900 BST).

Ninety minutes later police said there was "no further danger" after a major security operation involving special forces and police helicopters.

The Austrian Chancellor, Christian Stocker, condemning the incident wrote on X "The shooting rampage at a school in Graz is a national tragedy that has deeply shaken our entire country."

Austria's President, Alexander Van der Bellen, said: "What happened today ... strikes our country at the heart. These were young people who had their whole lives ahead of

them. A teacher who accompanied them on their journey."Families gathered at a nearby sports hall where crisis intervention teams were on hand. The area around the school was cordoned off and public transport was diverted, with all streets surrounding the school guarded by armed officers.

A spokesperson for the Austrian Red Cross told the public broadcaster ORF that more than 160 responders were at the scene, including emergency doctors and paramedics. Two information points were available for the school's students and relatives.

Austria last experienced a major mass attack such as this more than a decade ago, when a Bosnian man killed three people and wounded about three dozen others after driving a car into crowds on the streets of the city and then attacking bystanders with a knife.

Israel deports Swedish campaigner Greta Thunberg a day after her detention

Tel Aviv, June 10 (UNI) : Israeli authorities deported Swedish climate campaigner Greta Thunberg on Tuesday, a day after she and 11 other activists were detained by Israeli forces while attempting to breach the naval blockade on the Gaza Strip aboard an aid boat.

"Greta Thunberg just departed Israel on a flight to Sweden (via France)," the Israeli Foreign Ministry wrote on social media platform X. The ministry

released two photos of her, one boarding the plane with her hands behind her back and another seated inside.State broadcaster Kan reported that Thunberg, 22, and other activists were taken to Ben Gurion Airport for deportation.According to the report, Thunberg was seated "in a back seat without the ability to recline."

Israeli Interior Minister Moshe Arbel confirmed several activists were taken

to the airport for deportation, and said he had "instructed that all 12 participants in the flotilla be returned to their countries of origin." "Israel will not allow its sovereignty to be harmed through protest flotilla provocations at its borders," Arbel said in a statement.

The Foreign Ministry said activists who agreed to sign documents stating they voluntarily agree to leave Israel were expected to leave the country by

Russian authorities in coordination with Abkhazia nab Ukrainian agent, claims FSB

Moscow/Sokhumi, June 10 (UNI) The Russian special forces in coordination with Abkhazia have reportedly detained a Ukrainian agent who planned to commit a terrorist attack at the Sokhumi airport, claimed the Kremlin's premier intelligence agency - the Federal Security Service (FSB). "The Federal Security

Service of Russia, in cooperation with the State Security Service of the Republic of Abkhazia ... has thwarted the illegal activity of a Russian citizen, born in 1980, carried out on the instructions of the Ukrainian special service. "In order to carry out this criminal plot, the defendant proactively planned to hand over to

the enemy the blueprints of ... (the Sokhumi airport) and the adjacent closed parking lot used to receive official international delegations.

"He also reported that this could be used to commit an act of sabotage and terrorism by planting explosives on its premises," the FSB said in a statement, according to Sputnik.

Trump's travel ban takes effect amid growing chaos over immigration enforcement

Houston, June 10 (UNI) An extensive travel ban issued by U.S. President Donald Trump took effect on Monday amid growing chaos over the Trump administration's immigration enforcement.

Over the weekend, protesters clashed and faced off with National Guard troops in downtown Los Angeles during the demonstrations against immigration raids that swept across California.

In New York City, demonstrators occupied the Trump Tower on Monday, demanding the release of immigrants detained in recent raids. Police arrested at least 20 of them after a standoff lasting about 20 minutes, local media reported.

Trump signed a proclamation last week, fully banning the entry of nationals from 12 countries, namely Afghanistan, Chad, the Republic of the Congo, Equatorial Guinea, Eritrea, Haiti, Iran, Libya, Myanmar, Somalia, Sudan and Yemen, citing national security risks.

According to a release by the White House, these countries were found "to be deficient with regards to screening and vetting and determined to pose a very high risk to the United States."Meanwhile, the proclamation partially restricts the entry of nationals from seven countries Burundi, Cuba, Laos, Sierra Leone, Togo, Turkmenistan and Venezuela.

"The restrictions and limitations imposed by the Proclamation are necessary to garner cooperation from foreign governments, enforce our immigration laws, and advance other important foreign policy, national security, and counter terrorism objectives," the White House said.

Australia raises shooting of reporter in LA with U.S.

Canberra, June 10 (UNI) : Australian Prime Minister Anthony Albanese says his government has spoken with the U.S. administration about the shooting of an Australian reporter with rubber bullets in Los Angeles.

Television news reporter Lauren Tomasi was covering the ongoing protests in Los Angeles for Australia's Nine Network News on Sunday local time when she was shot in the leg with a rubber bullet fired by a police officer in the city's downtown district.

Albanese on Tuesday described the footage of the incident, which was published by Nine and showed the officer taking aim towards Tomasi and firing, as "horrific."

"I spoke with Lauren this morning. She's going OK. She's pretty resilient," he said.

"We have already raised these issues with the U.S. administration. We don't find it acceptable that it occurred. And we think that the role of the media is particularly important."

Albanese's comments came during a major speech to the National Press Club in Canberra in which he laid

out his Labor Party government's agenda following May's general election.

Albanese said on Tuesday that the policies that Labor took to the election would be the "foundation" of its second term but not the "limit" of the party's vision.

"The way we deal with big challenges and opportunities from our first term, from economic growth and productivity to the energy transition, will continue to evolve," he said.He announced that the government will convene experts, trade unions and business leaders in Canberra in August to brainstorm ideas to stimulate economic growth and productivity.

Albanese said that he wanted the dialogue to produce "concrete and tangible action" that would lead to long-term and lasting change.

The prime minister previously announced that the new term of the federal parliament will formally be opened on July 22 and that Labor's first priority will be legislation to deliver its pledge to cut student loan debts by 20 percent.

Mexican President open to meeting Trump at G7

Mexico City, June 10 (UNI) Mexican President Claudia Sheinbaum confirmed Monday she will attend the Group of Seven (G7) summit in Canada and expects a meeting with her U.S. counterpart Donald Trump.

At a daily press conference, Sheinbaum said Secretary of Foreign Affairs Juan Ramon de la Fuente is finalizing her bilateral meeting agenda with participating leaders.

"I have decided I am going to the G7," said Sheinbaum, adding that "it is very likely" she will meet with Trump, their first meeting since she took office.

Though the two leaders have yet to meet in person, they have held six phone calls to address the bilateral relationship amid tensions over tariffs, crime and immigration.

Before the summit, Sheinbaum will meet with U.S. Deputy Secretary of State Christopher Landau on Wednesday to discuss bilateral ties and U.S. Secretary of State Marco Rubio's upcoming visit to Mexico.

Iran-US to hold nuclear deal talks round 6 in Muscat Sunday

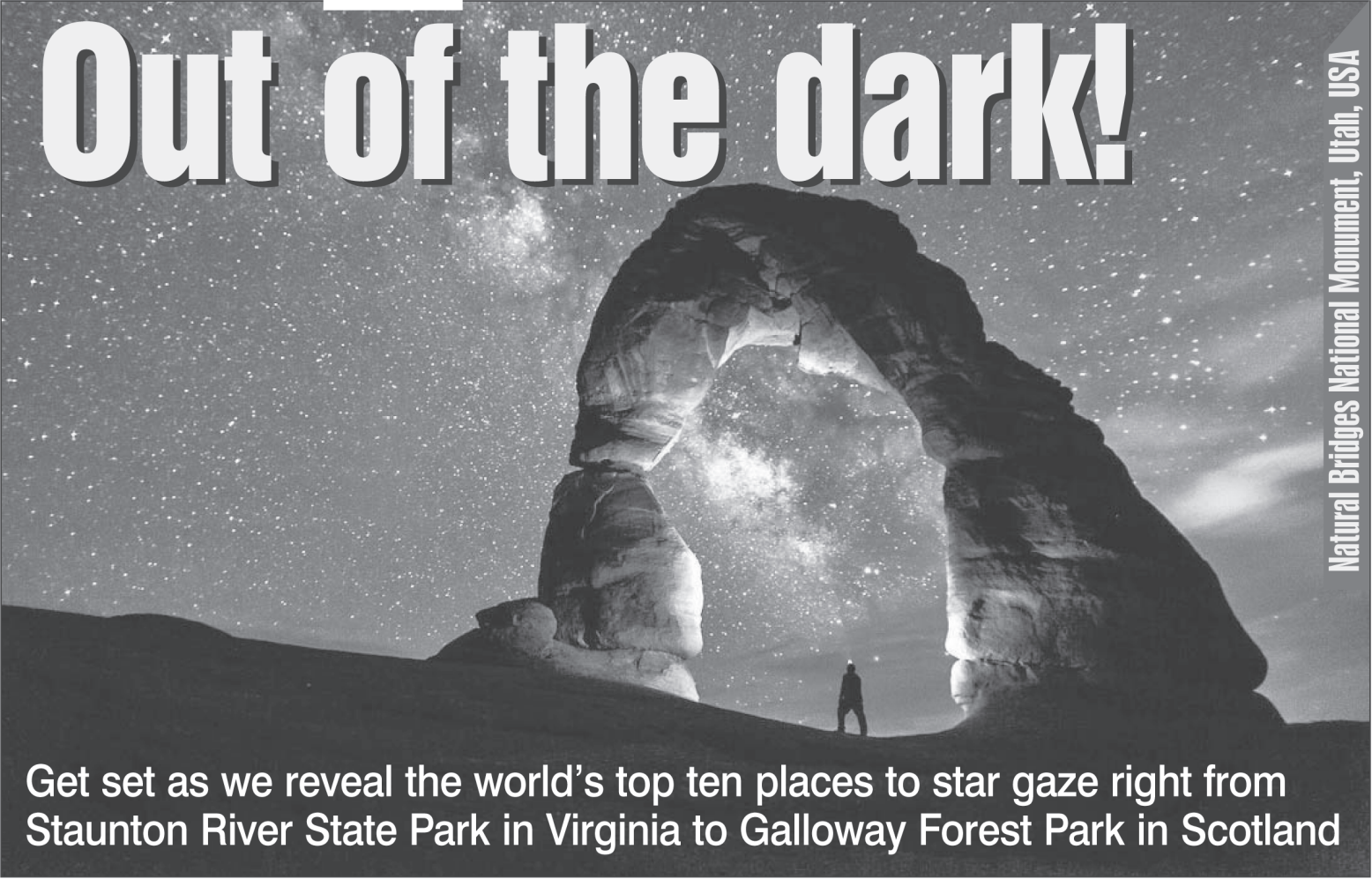
Tehran/Washington/Muscat, June 10 (UNI) The sixth round of indirect nuclear talks between Tehran and Washington are scheduled to take place in Oman on Sunday, said Iran's Foreign Ministry Tuesday.Iran and the United States have held five rounds of talks so far, three of which were held in Muscat and two in Rome since the beginning of Tehran's talks with the US on coming to a possible deal on its nuclear programme and the lifting of sanctions.

The fifth round was held on May 23 in Rome. In late May, the United States presented a proposal to Tehran through Oman for a potential nuclear deal with Iran.

While both sides have acknowledged

some progress, a decisive breakthrough has yet to be achieved, due to disagreements on uranium enrichment. While Iran views it as critical to its programme, the US is staunchly against any uranium enrichment on Iranian soil.

Amid the ongoing negotiations, the US has called for the dismantling of all Iranian infrastructure built for the process, while Iran has denied American demands, insisting the programme will continue.Iran's Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei said he does not expect talks with the US to yield results and asserted that Iran "needs no one's permission" to enrich uranium, reports Turkish agency Anadolu Ajansi.

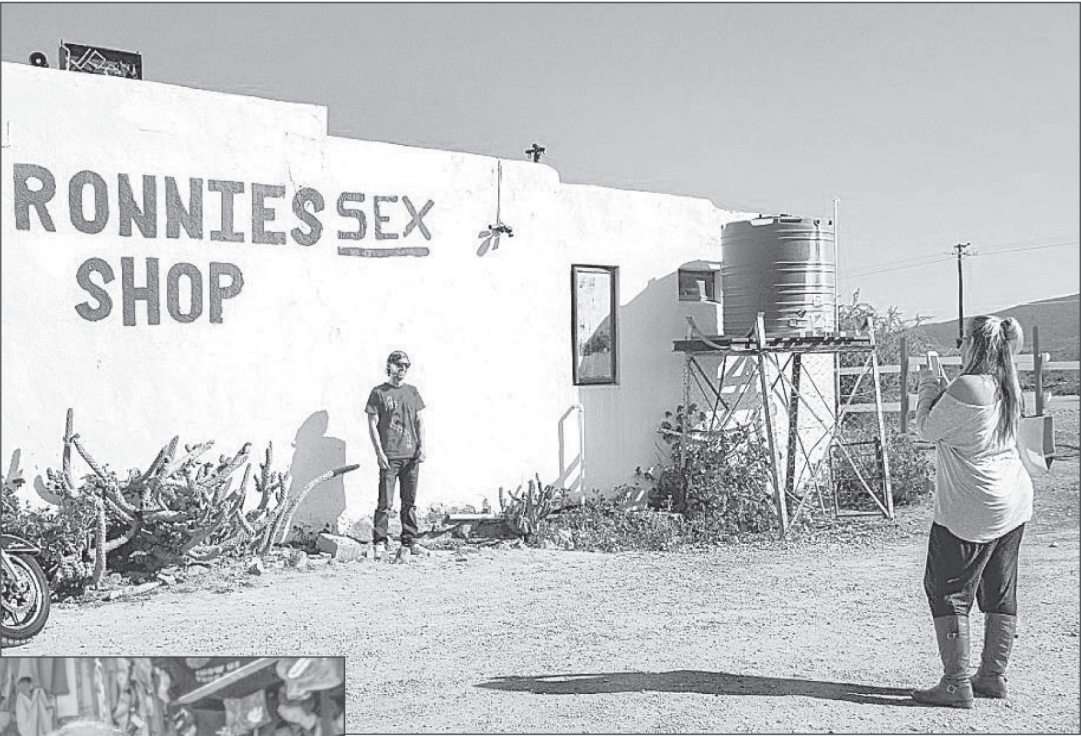
The shop is actually a small bar originally called Ronnies Shop, and it has become a legendary pit stop on a remote stretch of the R62 after the owner's friends

India suffered narrow defeat to Hong Kong in Asian Cup Qualifiers

Kowloon (Hong Kong), June 10 (UNI) : The Indian national football team fell to a 1-0 defeat against Hong Kong in the AFC Asian Cup Qualifiers at Kai Tak Stadium here on Tuesday.

A stoppage-time penalty from Stefan Pereira secured all three points for the hosts.

India's head coach Manolo Marquez made three changes to the starting lineup from the previous friendly against Thailand.

Suresh Singh Wangjam came in for Ayush Dev Chhetri in central midfield, while Brandon Fernandes and Lallianzuala Chhangte replaced Sunil Chhetri and Manvir Singh, respectively. Ashique Kuruniyan was deployed up front.

With both teams having dropped points in their opening fixtures, they approached the game with urgency and attacking intent. The early stages saw end-to-end action, but neither side could carve out a clear-cut chance.

In the 25th minute, Hong Kong's Raphael Lee tested Vishal Kaith with a long-range effort, but the Indian goalkeeper stood firm. Liston Colaco



responded with a strike from distance at the other end, which the opposition keeper comfortably collected. Anwar Ali made a crucial intervention around the half-hour mark, timing his tackle perfectly at the edge of the box to deny a dangerous Hong Kong move. Had he missed, it could have spelled trouble for the Blue Tigers — and him.

India's best chance of the half came in the 35th minute when Brandon Fernandes won possession near the halfway line. He released Liston Colaco, who threaded a sharp through-ball to Ashique. However, the forward couldn't keep his shot on

target from close range.

Hong Kong came close just before the break when Juninho attempted a quick free-kick to catch India off guard, but the Indian defence reacted well to avert the threat. The teams headed into half-time with the score still goalless.

Five minutes into the second half, Ashique had another opportunity, but his half-turn shot went wide. In the 57th minute, Ashique, who appeared to be in some discomfort, was replaced by Sunil Chhetri, while Naorem Mahesh Singh came on for Brandon Fernandes.

A few minutes later, Wangjam lost the ball in a dangerous area, allowing

Manuel Rodriguez a chance on goal, but his effort was tipped over the bar by Kaith for a corner.

In the 80th minute, Mahesh and Chhetri combined well, with the latter playing a through ball to Liston Colaco, who fired his effort wide. Moments later, Lallianzuala Chhangte made a driving run and set up Chhetri, whose attempt was blocked for a corner by Leon Jones.

The decisive moment came in the first minute of added time when Kaith conceded a penalty. Pereira stepped up, and his shot clipped the inside of the post before rolling into the net — his strike ultimately sealing the win for Hong Kong.

Australia to start her grass-court season on a high.

Queen's has been a mainstay on the men's calendar and a WTA 500 event has been added this year in an attempt to raise the profile of the women's game and increase the visibility of the sport.

Come Sunday, the trophy will finally have a new name on it, with world number seven Zheng Qinwen, Australian Open champion Madison Keys and 2022 Wimbledon winner Elena Rybakina among the top seeds competing in the capital, the BBC reported.

Fellow Briton Jodie Burrage missed the chance to set up a meeting with doubles partner Kartal in the second round as she lost 6-4 3-6 6-4 to eighth

seed Amanda Anisimova.

World number 162 Burrage started well but struggled in an error-strewn second set, before battling back from 3-0 down in the decider.

However, mistakes at crucial moments allowed world number 15 Anisimova to regain her advantage and ultimately serve out the match.

Meanwhile, British pair Katie Boulter and Emma Raducanu overcame China's Jiang Zinyu and Wu Fang-hsien 6-4 6-2 on their maiden outing as a doubles partnership on a packed Court One.

It could be an all-British affair in the quarter-finals should Britons Burrage and Kartal overcome top seeds Lyudmyla Kichenok and Erin Routliffe on Tuesday.

Britain's Kartal has enjoyed a remarkable rise in

the past 12 months, moving from outside the top 250 to a career-high of 50 in the world.

Cheered on by a packed partisan crowd, Kartal dominated the opening set against Kasatkina before the Australian bounced back in the second set to level proceedings.

But it was an impressive response from the Briton, who beamed after slamming down a forehand winner to seal victory.

"The nerves hit me a little but to be able to play on this court with you guys cheering me on it was a super special moment," said Kartal.

"The last few months I've played bigger tournaments so I'm handling the bigger occasions better." But I'm going at my own pace in this crazy sport."
