### Sonia Gandhi's health stable: Sir Ganga Ram Hospital

New Delhi, June 17 (UNI) : The health of Congress Parliamentary Party chairperson Sonia Gandhi is steadily improving, hospital sources said today.

Sources at the Sir Ganga Ram Hospital said that the former Congress president is responding well to treatment for an abdominal infection and is recovering steadily.

The 78-year-old veteran leader was admitted to Sir Ganga Ram Hospital on Sunday night after she complained of abdominal pain. Hospital sources said that she is under medical supervision.

Gandhi had also undergone a medical check-up at the hospital last week.

### GHMC engineer caught accepting Rs 1.2 lakh bribe

Hyderabad, June 17 (UNI) : The Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) on Tuesday caught an Assistant Executive Engineer (AEE) of the Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation (GHMC) red-handed while accepting a bribe of Rs 1.2 lakh.

According to an official statement, B. Swaroopa, AEE of the Kapra Circle-1 office, was caught by the ACB Ranga Reddy Unit this afternoon while receiving the bribe from a complainant.

The bribe was allegedly demanded in exchange for showing official favour — specifically, for writing Measurement Book (MB) entries for work completed by the complainant.

The ACB stated that the accused officer had acted dishonestly and failed to perform her public duty in a proper manner.

The bribe amount was recovered from her possession at the time of the operation.

Swaroopa was being arrested and produced before the First Additional Special Judge for SPE and ACB Cases at Nampally, Hyderabad.

## CM Revanth Reddy initiates comprehensive cow protection policy for Telangana

Hyderabad, June 17 :Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy today directed officials to formulate a comprehensive and culturally sensitive policy for cow protection in the state.

Emphasising the importance of cows in Indian culture and the deep sentiments of devotees, the Chief Minister conducted a review meeting on the issue at his residence here.

To begin the process, the Chief Minister appointed a three-member committee comprising Special Principal Secretary of the Animal Husbandry Department Sabyasachi Ghosh, Principal Secretary of the

Endowments Department Shailaja Ramaiyar, and Secretary of the Agriculture Department Raghunandan Rao.The committee has been tasked with studying cow protection policies implemented in various states and preparing a detailed plan tailored to Telangana's needs.

Expressing concern over the condition of existing cow shelters, the Chief Minister noted that despite large numbers of cows being donated by devotees, many shelters lack the space and facilities needed to care for them properly, often leading to the animals' death.

He proposed the establishment of modern,

well-equipped cow shelters in four key locations across the state — Vemulawada, Yadagirigutta, near Hyderabad city, and near the Animal Husbandry Department University. These shelters will be associated with prominent temples and spread over large areas to accommodate the growing number of cows.

The Chief Minister stressed that special attention must be given to cows donated with devotion and instructed that a cowshed spanning no less than one hundred acres should be established near Vemulawada. Reaffirming his commitment to the

cause, he declared that the state government would not hesitate to allocate the required budget for this purpose.

During the meeting, officials presented an approach paper on the management and development of cow shelters in Telangana. The review was attended by Animal Husbandry Minister Vakiti Srihari, Chief Secretaries to the Chief Minister V Seshadri and Srinivasa Raju, HMDA Commissioner Sarfaraz Ahmed, Animal Husbandry Director Gopi, Ranga Reddy District Collector Narayana Reddy, and other senior officials, an official statement said.

### Phone-tapping was part of political plot by BRS: TPCC chief

Hyderabad, June 17 (UNI) Telangana Pradesh Congress Committee (TPCC) president and MLC Mahesh Kumar Goud made serious allegations against the previous BRS government, calling the phone-tapping scandal a politically motivated conspiracy.

Speaking to the media after appearing before the Jubilee Hills ACP as a witness on Tuesday, Goud stated that his number was among those tapped and he has submitted a detailed statement to the Special Investigation Team (SIT).

"Phone-tapping is an undemocratic act. It was done with the clear intention to eliminate political rivals," said Goud.He revealed that during the 2023 elections, he and then TPCC president Revanth Reddy had filed a formal complaint with the chief secretary against the surveillance activities. According to Goud, over 650 Congress leaders were subjected to illegal phone surveillance, along with leaders from BJP and TDP. He claimed that the 2018 electoral defeat of the Congress was a result of this mass surveillance, alleging that tapping was carried out in every constituency where the party lost.

## Hubballi Division Conducts Intensive Ticket Checking Drive at SSS Hubballi Station



SSS Hubballi station, which handles the highest number of train operations approximately 80 trains every Friday, witnessed a significant boost in ticket sales on the day of the check. A comparative analysis revealed a 20% increase in ticket sales and a 62% rise in the number of passengers compared to the same Friday last year (14.06.2024). Additionally, when

These cow shelters will be established in sizeable areas in the famous temple Vemulawada where the devotees donate calves as part of 'Kode Mokku' ritual, Yadagirigutta, Yenkepally near Hyderabad city and at Animal Husbandry university in the first phase, said

Revanth, who conducted a review on cow protection with the official concerned in the state at his residence here.The CM anguished over the spate of dying of the cows which are donated in large numbers by the devotees to cow shelters due to space constraints and other problems.The CM suggested that special attention should be paid to the protection of Calves donated with utmost devotion by the devotees and instructed the officials to establish Cow Shelters in a sprawling over 100 acres of land at Vemulawada.

Revanth appointed a

three member Official Committee to formulate a Comprehensive Policy for Cow Protection in the state.

The Committee comprising Special Chief Secretary to Animal Husbandry Department Sabyasachi Ghosh, Principal Secretary to Endowments Department Shailaja Ramaiyar and Secretary of the state Agriculture Department Raghunandan Rao, will conduct an in- depth study on the establishment of Cow Shelters (Goshalas) and also visit other states to study the cow protection policies, the CM said.

## Police strengthen fight against human trafficking and child protection

Hyderabad, June 17 (UNI) Safeguarding children, the Hyderabad Police today announced the formal constitution and inauguration of renovated facilities for its Anti-Human Trafficking Unit (AHTU) and Juvenile Bureau (JB) Unit.A Victim Assistance Unit (VAU) was also established in collaboration with the NGO, Prajwala, a release said here.

Speaking on the occasion, Hyderabad Police Commissioner CV Anand said the AHTU has been formally constituted with a sanctioned strength of eight personnel, including one Inspector, two Sub-Inspectors, two head constables and three constables.

"The unit is entrusted with responsibilities aimed at curbing the trafficking of women and children," CV Anand said.

This year, the AHTU conducted raids at various hotspots that resulted in registering 23 cases, rescue of 44 victims, and the arrest of 71 individuals.

The Juvenile Bureau Team, also known as the Special Juvenile Police Unit (SJPU), has been formally constituted with a sanctioned strength of seven personnel.

Based at the Central Crime Station, Hyderabad, the team's primary responsibility is to protect children from atrocities such as child labour, human trafficking, and bonded labour.

## Minister Jupally conducts surprise inspection, stresses food quality in Tourism Plaza

Hyderabad, June 17 (UNI) :Tourism and Culture Minister Jupally Krishna Rao on Tuesday conducted surprise inspections at the Tourism Plaza Hotel in Begumpet, emphasising the need for strict adherence to cleanliness and food quality standards in government-run hotels.

During his early morning visit, the minister thoroughly inspected the restaurant, kitchen, and food items being served. He interacted with tourists and guests having breakfast and personally enquired about the quality and taste of the food.

Speaking to the media afterward, Minister Jupally stated that regular monitoring of facilities and food standards in green hotels would continue. He warned that strict action would be taken against any violation of hygiene or quality guidelines. He asserted that the responsibility of maintaining food quality lies with the hotel management.

The minister added that while increasing government revenue remains a focus, the priority is also on improving the overall experience for tourists by providing better amenities and a cleaner, more pleasant environment. He reiterated the government's commitment to developing green hotels into welcoming spaces for visitors.

## Minister announces two new centres of excellence out of 5 proposed nationwide

Hyderabad, June 17 (UNI): Minister of State (Independent Charge) for Skill Development and Entrepreneurship Jayant Chaudhary has announced the establishment of two new Centres of Excellence — out of the five proposed nationwide — at National Skill Training Institutes (NSTIs) in Hyderabad and Chennai.

These centres will serve as national reference points for high-quality instructor training and specialised skilling aligned with emerging domains, Chaudhary said at the Kaushal Manthan Regional Workshop organised by the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship (MSDE) at Kanha Shanti Vanam, the headquarters of Heartfulness, outskirts of Hyderabad on Monday evening.

"Skill development cannot have prescriptive templates," he said that "We must empower states to craft solutions that are rooted in their local economic contexts and aligned with the aspirations of their youth. Only then can we create meaningful impact and sustained transformation."

Chaudhary underscored the imperative for states to adopt a more strategic, outcome-oriented approach to skill development — one that is deeply aligned with the aspirations of India's youth and the evolving

demands of the economy.

Recognising that quality training is only as strong as the trainers who deliver it, he called for dedicated investments in faculty development— through improved institutional capacity, competitive remuneration, and rigorous pedagogical standards.

He urged states to adopt a decentralised and data-driven planning framework by working closely with district collectors to develop localised skilling plans, informed by granular skill gap assessments conducted in collaboration with expert bodies like the World Bank.

He directed that the CITS (Craft Instructor Training Scheme) certification be made mandatory for all newly recruited instructors, particularly in newly established ITIs across states.

He emphasized that this requirement is critical to ensuring high-quality, standardized instruction across the country.

To uphold instructional excellence and credibility, states were urged to revise their Recruitment Rules (RR) to align with NCVT norms, thereby institutionalizing CITS as a non-negotiable qualification, he said. Uniform enforcement of this standard, the Minister noted, is essential to maintaining parity with national skilling benchmarks and delivering consistent training outcomes across the ecosystem.

He proposed the establishment of a robust grading and assessment framework for state-owned ITIs, to instil a culture of accountability, quality assurance, and performance-driven outcomes.

On the occasion, Chaudhary launched the National Skill Gap Study report—a comprehensive

analysis conducted by the National Council for Applied Economic Research (NCAER).

The objective of the study was to develop a dynamic framework for skill demand assessment and develop a methodology for conducting demand assessment at the sectoral and state level.

A detailed analysis of seven high growth sectors was also undertaken as a part of the study.

Over 27.8 lakh candidates have been trained under the Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana (PMKVY) across the region since 2015, Under the Jan Shikshan Sansthan scheme, more than 4.85 lakh beneficiaries—over 85 percent women—have been trained, he said.

More than 10 lakh apprentices have been engaged since FY 2018-19 under the National Apprenticeship Promotion Scheme (NAPS), with a DBT disbursement of ?215 crore in the region, he added.

During his visit to the Biochar Center of Excellence at Kanha Shanti Vanam, Chaudhary inaugurated the first Rural Entrepreneurship Training Program on Biochar.

This pioneering initiative aims to equip rural youth with skills across the entire biochar value chain — from biomass conversion and soil applications to farmer outreach and product positioning.

Selected candidates will be commissioned as rural entrepreneurs, with biochar units set up in their villages. Each unit is expected to generate employment for 4–8 people for up to six months annually and become self-sustaining by the second year through biochar sales and carbon credit monetization.

Total area sown under kharif crops crosses 89 lakh hectares so far

The area under the ongoing kharif crop sowing has gone up to 89.29 lakh hectares so far this year compared to 87.81 lakh hectares in the same period last year, data released by the Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare showed.

The increase of 1.48 lakh hectares in sown area in the early part of the season augurs well for higher production, which, in turn, would increase the incomes of farmers and also help to keep food inflation in check.

The official figures show that the area under rice, the sowing of which has just got underway, is 4.53 lakh hectares as on June 13 this year, as compared to 4 lakh hectares during the same period last year.

The area under pulses such as urad and moong has been reported at 3.07 lakh hectares as compared to 2.6 lakh hectares during the same period last year. This increase of 0.49 lakh hectares in the early part of the season is a good beginning, as an increase in the production of pulses plays a key role in controlling inflation.

The area sown under oilseeds as on June 13 this year has also gone up to 2.05 lakh hectares from 1.5 lakh hectares in the same period last year.

The area covered under coarse cereals or millets such as jowar, bajra, and ragi has touched the 5.89 lakh hectare mark so far.

The sown area has gone up in the current season as better monsoon rains have facilitated the sowing in unirrigated areas of the country, which account for close to 50 per cent of the country’s farmland.

The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs, chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, on May 28, approved an increase in the Minimum Support Prices (MSP) for 14 kharif crops for the marketing season 2025-26 to ensure remunerative prices to the growers for their crops and incentivise production.

The highest absolute increase in MSP over the previous year has been recommended for nigerseed (Rs 820 per quintal), followed by ragi (Rs 596 per quintal), cotton (Rs 589 per quintal) and sesamum (Rs 579 per quintal).

The increase in MSP for kharif crops for the 2025-26 marketing season is in line with the policy of fixing the MSP at a level of at least 1.5 times of the all-India weighted average cost of production, The expected margin to farmers over their cost of production are estimated to be highest in case of bajra (63 per cent) followed by maize (59 per cent), tur (59 per cent) and urad (53 per cent ). For the rest of the crops, the margin to farmers over their cost of production is estimated to be at 50 per cent.

The total cost includes all paid out costs such as those incurred on account of hired human labour, bullock labour/machine labour, rent paid for leased in land, expenses incurred on use of material inputs like seeds, fertilisers, manures, irrigation charges, depreciation on implements and farm buildings, interest on working capital, diesel/electricity for operation of pump sets etc., miscellaneous expenses, and imputed value of family labour.

Union Railway Minister Mr Ashwini Vaishnaw today said that Indian Railways has witnessed an unprecedented transformation in the last 11 years under the leadership of Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi. He said that before 2014, Railways remained a victim of neglect for decades, with an annual investment of only ₹ 25-30 thousand crores. But now this investment has increased to ₹ 2.5 lakh crores, which is accelerating the development of railway infrastructure and facilities.

Mr Vaishnaw said, “Legacy problems accumulated in Railways over the years are now being eliminated one by one. Stations, trains, toilets, tracks, cleanliness, technology—every sector has been improved comprehensively. New facilities are being provided to passengers and integrated development is being given priority in collaboration with the industry.”

Speaking at the inauguration of the railway siding facility at Maruti Plant in Manesar, Haryana, Mr. Vaishnav listed the major announcements and achievements

100 new Main Line EMU (MEMU) trains

To upgrade passenger trains, 16 and 20 coach Main Line EMU trains will now be manufactured. Till now, MEMUs were manufactured with 8 or 12 coaches. This project will be implemented in a new factory being started in Kazipet, Telangana. This will provide great relief to short distance travel.

50 new ‘NaMo Bharat’ AC passenger trains

‘NaMo Bharat’ trains have received a great response from the passengers. Now 50 new AC passenger trains will be added. Earlier, two trains were started between Ahmedabad-Bhuj and Patna-Jaynagar. In total, 150 new passenger trains will come into service.

More than 1200 new general coaches



Last year In 2018, keeping in mind the demand of passengers, Railways has added more than 1200 general coaches. This campaign is being run continuously for the last 2.5 years.

Amrit Bharat Station Scheme

So far, work of 1300 Amrit Bharat stations has been approved. Out of these, 103 stations have been completed recently and the Prime Minister inaugurated it from Bikaner. 100 more stations will be completed by December 2025 and 500 more stations by the year 2026.

Improvement in ticketing system

To prevent misuse of bots in Tatkal ticket booking, only KYC verified passengers will get the facility of online booking from July 1. ID will also be mandatory on window booking.

Innovation in chart publishing

Bikaner Division has started publishing the chart 24 hours in advance (earlier it was 4 hours in advance) as an innovative initiative. This has reduced

uncertainty among the passengers and is facilitating them in making better plans.

Extension of Vande Bharat and Amrit Bharat trains

The number of Amrit Bharat Express trains will soon increase by 6 more. 50 more trains are under construction. Vande Bharat trains are also being extended to new routes.

Freight Corridors and Freight Services

India now ranks second in the world in both freight and passenger traffic. Last year, 7.2 billion passengers travelled by rail and 1617 million tonnes of goods were carried. The freight corridor is now fully operational and about 400 freight trains are running on it every day.

Railway Infrastructure Makeover in Haryana

Mr Vaishnav informed that before 2014, Haryana used to get an allocation of just ₹ 315 crore, which has now increased to ₹ 3416 crore. In Haryana:

Congress doing vote bank politics over caste census: BJP

New Delhi, June 17 (UNI) : Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) MP and spokesperson Sudhanshu Trivedi on Tuesday criticised the Congress party, asserting that it has been engaging in vote bank politics under the guise of reservation policies.

At the same time, he emphasised that under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, the government is committed to ensuring dignity and upliftment for all castes through the conduct of a comprehensive caste census.

“Under the leadership of PM Modi, the cabinet has decided to conduct the census. In the press release, it was clearly stated that, for the first time in the history of independent India, a social, economic survey, and caste census will be carried out along with the national census,” Trivedi stated during a press conference here.

He further highlighted that the NDA government stands for ‘Sabka Saath Sabka Vikas’ (inclusive development), contrasting it with the Congress party’s approach.

The BJP spokesperson accused the Congress of neglecting important issues such as Operation Sadbhav and the Citizenship Amendment Act (CAA), and criticised their opposition to the caste census. “The Congress party has a habit of overlooking crucial matters. They are spreading false claims about the caste census and attempting to divert attention from the genuine goal of ensuring social justice,” he added.

Trivedi raised concerns over Congress’ alleged efforts to manipulate reservation policies, citing examples from Karnataka, Telangana, and West Bengal. “I want to ask the Congress party what they

have to say about the people of the minority community, the castes, that they have tried to include in such a large number in Karnataka and Telangana, about which the court has also commented? After all, whose part do you want to take?

“The West Bengal government has included a large number of Muslim community members in OBC lists, with reports indicating that 73 out of 91 castes are from the Muslim community. Such practices reflect vote bank politics aimed at undermining the share of backward classes,” he stated. He further sought to clarify that the ongoing survey in Telangana is not a full caste census but merely a social and economic survey. “The notification of the caste census is issued by the central government. States can only conduct surveys, not full censuses,” Trivedi explained. He alleged that Congress kept power within one family and failed to support real economic development even though it ruled India for decades. “The Congress is busy in destructive policy. Wherever the Congress came in power, the fiscal position of that state has deteriorated because of their ‘khata khat’ model of engaging in expenditure spree,” Trivedi said referring to Telangana Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy’s acknowledgment of the state’s precarious fiscal position.

Addressing the upcoming population census scheduled to begin in March 2027, he said it will be a comprehensive drive to be conducted in two phases, gathering demographic, socio-economic, and cultural details of every individual besides collecting data on housing conditions, assets, and amenities.

AICTE Launches Industry Fellowship Programme to Strengthen Industry-Academia Collaboration and Upskill Faculty for Viksit Bharat @2047

In a landmark initiative aimed at transforming technical education in India, the All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE) today launched the AICTE Industry Fellowship Programme (AIFP) — a pioneering scheme designed to immerse faculty members from technical institutions into real-world industrial environments. This move is a decisive step toward bridging the long-standing gap between academia and industry, ensuring that technical education in India remains current, practical, and globally competitive.

The programme was officially inaugurated by Prof. T.G. Sitharam, Chairman, AICTE, in the presence of AICTE Vice Chairman Dr. Abhay Jere and Member Secretary Prof. Rajive Kumar. The scheme



supports the national development vision of Viksit Bharat @2047, preparing faculty—and by extension, students—for the future economy through practical skill-building, contemporary exposure, and collaboration.

While India boasts one of the largest networks of technical institutions globally, a persistent

challenge has been the limited exposure of faculty to real-time industrial practices and emerging technologies. This often results in outdated teaching methods and a disconnect between what students learn and what industries require.

“We cannot expect our students to be industry-ready if our faculty themselves are not

equipped with industry-relevant knowledge,” said Prof. T.G. Sitharam, while launching the programme. “Through this fellowship, faculty members will become active participants in the industrial ecosystem, gaining insight, expertise, and confidence to transform the way they teach. This is a vital step in creating national resources that are fit for the future”,

he added.

The AICTE Industry Fellowship Programme is set to roll out its pilot phase in 2025–26, selecting 350 faculty members from AICTE-approved institutions for full-time industry immersion. Building on its initial success, the programme aims to scale up and train 1,500 faculty members annually over the next three to five years.

Each fellowship will span a period of 6 to 12 months, allowing faculty to work closely with leading industries across priority sectors.

To ensure robust financial support, AICTE will provide a monthly fellowship of ₹75,000, while participating industries will contribute a minimum of ₹25,000 per month. Additionally, the fellows will continue to receive their

regular salary from their parent academic institutions, making the AIFP one of the most financially attractive and secure fellowship models in the country for faculty upskilling.

“We often talk about industry-academia linkages, but these have largely remained transactional or formal. With this programme, we’re initiating deep, long-term collaboration,” said Dr. Abhay Jere, Vice Chairman, AICTE. “Our goal is to emotionally integrate faculty with the industry—so that they return with a mission, not just experience.”

The AICTE Industry Fellowship Programme has been strategically designed to address three core challenges currently facing India’s technical education ecosystem.



Israel says killed Iran's military chief in strike on Tehran

Jerusalem, June 17 (UNI) The Israeli military said on Tuesday that it has killed Ali Shadmani, Iran's wartime chief of staff and one of the Islamic Republic's most senior military figures, in an overnight airstrike on a command centre in central Tehran.

The strike was carried out by the Israeli Air Force following "precise intelligence" and a "sudden opportunity," the military said in a statement.

Shadmani, described by the Israeli military as the top operational commander of the Iranian armed forces and a close associate of supreme leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei, had commanded both the Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps and the Iranian army.

He was appointed to lead Iran's armed forces at the start of the ongoing five-day warfare after Israel assassinated his predecessor, Alaa Ali Rashid, in an earlier strike that started the current fighting.His killing "adds to a series of eliminations targeting Iran's most senior military leadership and disrupts the chain of command," the Israeli military said.

12 killed in bus-truck collision in KwaZulu-Natal Province

Johannesburg, June 17 (UNI) : A bus and a truck collided head-on on the R34 near Vryheid, South Africa's KwaZulu-Natal Province, on Monday, resulting in the death of 12 people, said a KwaZulu-Natal provincial government official on Tuesday.

Siboniso Duma, member of the Executive Council for Transport and Human Settlements in the KwaZulu-Natal Province, said the accident occurred around midnight on Monday.He confirmed that ten people died at the scene, while another ten were seriously injured and taken to nearby hospitals. Two more victims later succumbed to their injuries in the hospital.

"Based on the report from the Road Traffic Inspectorate, after the head-on collision, the truck struck the side of the bus," said Duma.He said an investigation was underway to determine the cause of the collision.

Open AI receives \$200 mil contract from US Defence Dept for prototype intel bot

San Francisco, June 17 (UNI) : The US based generative AI giant OpenAI has received a \$200 million contract from the US Department of Defence to develop a prototype artificial intelligence tool to perform national security tasks, the department said.

"OpenAI Public Sector LLC, San Francisco, California, has been awarded a fixed amount, prototype, other transaction agreement (HQ0883-25-9-0012) with a value of \$200,000,000."Under this award, the performer will develop prototype frontier AI capabilities to address critical national security challenges in both warfighting and enterprise domains," the department said in a statement on Monday. The development of the AI toll should be completed in July 2026, the statement read.

Iran launched over 700 drones at Israel since start of true promise 3

Tehran, June 17 (UNI) Iran has conducted over 700 retaliatory drone attacks against Israel since the beginning of Operation True Promise 3, the Fars news agency reported on Tuesday.

Earlier in the day, Iran started a new missile attack on Israel, the news agency reported.

In the early hours on Friday, Israel launched an operation against Iran, accusing it of running a secret military nuclear program that allegedly approached the point of no return. Among the targets of aerial bombing and sabotage raids were nuclear facilities, senior military officials, nuclear scientists, air bases, air defences, and surface-to-surface missiles.

Iran's Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei called the attack a crime and threatened Israel with a "bitter and terrible fate." Iran retaliated by launching Operation True Promise 3 on Friday evening that hit military targets inside Israel.Israel said that more than 20 people were killed and over 600 injured by Iranian strikes. Iran said more than 220 died and more than 1,200 were injured.

China makes substantial strides in combating desertification, says govt

Beijing, June 17 (UNI) : China has made substantial strides in combating desertification, with 365 million mu (about 24.3 million hectares) of desertified areas turned into green land since 2012, data from the National Forestry and Grassland Administration showed Tuesday.About 27.94 million mu of land has been put under protection against desertification over the past 13 years, said the administration on the World Day to Combat Desertification and Drought, which falls on June 17 each year.Official data also showed that from 2000 to 2019, the total amount of wind-eroded soil in the country's major deserts and sandy land has declined by about 40%, and China is the first nation to achieve zero growth in land degradation.

Under China's Three-North Shelterbelt Forest Program (TSFP), the world's largest afforestation program launched in 1978 to tackle desertification in northwestern, northern and northeastern parts of the country. As a result, a total of 480 million mu of forests have been planted and preserved, and 1.28 billion mu of degraded grasslands have been restored. In regions covered by the TSFP, the forest coverage ratio has risen from 5.05 percent in 1977 to 13.84% today, with 61% of soil erosion areas effectively controlled and 450 million mu of farmland protected. China is also actively fulfilling its commitments under the United Nations Convention to Combat Desertification (UNCCD).

G7 leaders support Israel, criticise Iran for being principal source of terror



Alberta (Canada), June 17 (UNI) : Leaders of G-7 countries on Tuesday strongly criticised Iran for 'being the principal source of regional instability and terror,' making it clear that Iran can never have a nuclear weapon, and affirmed that Israel has a right to defend itself.

The G-7 leaders also reiterated their commitment to peace and stability in the

Middle East.'We, the leaders of the G7, reiterate our commitment to peace and stability in the Middle East. In this context, we affirm that Israel has a right to defend itself. We reiterate our support for the security of Israel,' The G-7 leaders said in a statement on the recent developments between Israel and Iran.

The leaders affirmed the importance of protection of

civilians and urged that the resolution of the Iranian crisis leads to a broader de-escalation of hostilities in the Middle East, including a ceasefire in Gaza.

The statement said the G-7 'will remain vigilant' to the implications for international energy markets and stand ready to coordinate, including with like-minded partners, to safeguard market stability.

Netanyahu says war against Iran has ignited a ‘light to freedom’ for Iranians

Tel Aviv/Tehran, June 17 (UNI): Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu has called Israel's ongoing war with Iran a campaign to rid the country of its "evil rulers", stating that the regime's days were numbered, and "a light" to "freedom" has been lit.

"A light has been lit — carry it to freedom," Netanyahu told Iran International.

Netanyahu said Israel's military campaign against Iran is giving its people a chance to topple the Islamic Republic, adding that the ruling system's days were numbered.

"This is the time," he said. "Your hour of freedom is near — it's happening now."Calling the regime an enduring threat against Israel with its nuclear weapons ambitions and ballistic missile programmes, he said that the "tyrants of Iran" would stop at nothing short of the complete destruction of the Jewish state.Stating that Iran's project for Israel's

destruction was to be carried out in two stages, he said "One is to rush forward with their nuclear programme to develop atomic bombs to destroy Israel."Second, they've programmed to build a vast missile, ballistic missile arsenal ... Each missile carrying a one-ton payload, just slamming into our cities, killing our women, our children."

"They were going to build 20,000 of these," he added.Netanyahu called Israel's ongoing campaign as both a defensive war and an opportunity for the leadership in Tehran to be overthrown.

"This is evil against good, and it's time for good people to stand up with the good, the good people of Iran, and good people everywhere against this madness foisted on all of us by this radical tyranny. It's about to end."

He went to add that while Tehran feared Israel, its biggest fear was its own people, due to the regime's massive unpopularity in

US, UK sign trade deal at G7 summit

Alberta, June 17 (UNI) : US President Donald Trump and British Prime Minister Keir Starmer signed a trade deal at the G7 summit in Canada. "We signed it and it's done," Trump said.

Starmer noted that the deal would implement bilateral agreements on auto tariffs and aerospace.

The White House issued an executive order on Monday to implement the general terms of the trade deal announced on May 8.The United States will establish an annual tariff-rate quota of 100,000 automobiles, allowing a 10% tariff for imports within the quota, according to the order.Meanwhile, imports of automobiles exceeding the given quota shall be subject to the 25% tariff imposed by the

proclamation on adjusting imports of automobiles and parts on March 26.

However, the American imports of Britain-made automotive parts for use in British automobiles would be subject to a 10% tariff rather than the 25% tariffs imposed by the above-mentioned proclamation.

Moreover, the United States decided to exempt British civil aircraft from the application of steel and aluminium proclamations issued on March 8 and an executive order released on April 2.Trump directed U.S. secretary of commerce to design and establish a tariff-rate quota for aluminium and steel articles and derivative articles made in Britain in the future.Vietnam bars government employees from establishing or m a n a g i n g

the country.

"These dictators in Iran, sure they fear us — but they fear you, the people of Iran, even more," he said. "They understand that 80 per cent of Iranians despise them."

Netanyahu said Israel's precision targeting had already knocked out key parts of Iran's nuclear infrastructure and missile production capabilities.

"(We) knocked out their chief nuclear team, their nuclear sites... we're knocking out their ballistic missile production," he said. "We still have a way to go, but we'll finish it."

Netanyahu said Iran could be made "great again" and that Iran's people were its future.

"I believe in you. I respect you. I admire you. I know your achievements. I know your potential. I know that Iran can be great again. It was a great civilisation, and this theological thuggery that has kidnapped your country, will not stand for long, and you are the future, not them."

businessesHanoi, June 17 (UNI) Vietnam's National Assembly on Tuesday passed amendments to the Law on Enterprises, stipulating that civil servants and public employees are not allowed to establish, contribute capital to, or manage businesses, the Vietnam News Agency reported.According to the report, the exceptions of this revised law will apply only in cases permitted by legal provisions on science, technology, innovation, and national digital transformation. Under the 2020 version of the Law on Enterprises, public employees were allowed to contribute capital to but prohibited from establishing or managing enterprises. The amended Law on Enterprises will take effect on July 1, 2025.

At least 15 killed, 75 injured in major Russian attack on Ukraine

Kiev, June 17 (UNI) At least 15 people were killed and 75 others injured in Russian missile and drone strikes on Ukraine overnight Tuesday, Ukrainian Interior Minister Ihor Klymenko said in a statement.

The capital Kiev was hit hardest in the attack, where a ballistic missile struck a nine-story apartment building, killing 14 people and injuring 60 others, the Interfax-Ukraine news agency cited the minister as saying.

In the southern city of Odesa, one person was killed and 10 others injured. Casualties were also reported in the Kiev and Chernihiv regions.

Tymur Tkachenko, head of the Kiev City Military Administration, said Russia launched a total of 175 drones, along with more than 14 cruise missiles and two ballistic missiles at the capital, hitting residential areas.

The Interior Ministry said that 27 locations in Kiev, including apartment buildings, educational institutions and critical infrastructure facilities, were under attack overnight.Search and rescue operations are ongoing at the sites of the strikes, the State Service for Emergencies said

Trump warns Iranians to leave Tehran amid escalating tensions

Washington/Tel Aviv/Tehran, June 17 (UNI) :US President Donald Trump has called for a mass exodus in the Iranian capital, as Israel's war with Iran has entered its fifth day, with massive strikes being carried out by Tel Aviv against Tehran.

"Iran should have signed the 'deal' I told them to sign. What a shame, and waste of human life. Simply stated, IRAN CAN NOT HAVE A NUCLEAR WEAPON. I said it over and over again!" Trump said in a post on Truth Social, according to Iran International.

"Everyone should immediately evacuate Tehran!" he added.

"AMERICA FIRST means many GREAT things, including the fact that, IRAN CAN NOT HAVE A NUCLEAR WEAPON. MAKE AMERICA GREAT AGAIN!!!"

Trump's post and announcement came after Israel struck Iran's state-run IRIB media agency during a live broadcast, after 8 Israeli citizens were killed in

UN General Assembly declares Dec 4 as int'l day against unilateral coercive measures

United Nations, June 17 (UNI) : The General Assembly on Monday adopted a resolution to proclaim Dec 4 every year as the International Day Against Unilateral Coercive Measures.

The resolution urges states to refrain from adopting, promulgating and applying any unilateral economic, financial or trade measures not in accordance with international law and the UN Charter that impede or undermine the full achievement of economic and social development, particularly in developing countries.

It expresses the conviction that the establishment of the International Day will complement ongoing efforts aimed at raising global awareness of the adverse effects of unilateral coercive measures and promote greater international cooperation and solidarity among nations in addressing the consequences of such measures.

The resolution was adopted with 116 votes in favor, 51 against, and 6 abstentions. Global North countries, including EU states and Australia, Britain,

Canada, Japan, the United States, voted against it.

The resolution requests the UN secretary-general to take the necessary measures and arrangements for the United Nations to commemorate and promote the International Day, including as part of global efforts to raise awareness about the negative impact of unilateral coercive measures not in accordance with international law and the UN Charter.

The resolution invites all UN member states and observers, organizations of the UN system and other international and regional organisations, as well as civil society, individuals and other relevant stakeholders to observe the International Day and to raise awareness of the negative impacts of unilateral coercive measures not in accordance with international law and the UN Charter, particularly for developing countries.

It requests the president of the General Assembly to organise, on an annual basis and starting from 2025, an informal plenary meeting of the assembly to commemorate and promote the International Day.

"Iran is not winning this war, and they should talk, and they should talk immediately before it's too late," Trump told reporters at the beginning of a meeting with Canadian Prime Minister Mark Carney on the sidelines of the G7 summit.

Typhoon Wutip leaves 7 dead in central Vietnam

Hanoi, June 17 (UNI) :Heavy rains and flooding triggered by Typhoon Wutip have left seven people dead and caused extensive agricultural and property damage in central Vietnam, the Vietnam News Agency reported Tuesday.

Four deaths were reported in Quang Binh

province and three in Quang Tri province, while one person was injured in Quang Tri, according to the Department of Dike Management and Natural Disaster Prevention.

According to reports, floods have submerged more than 33,000 hectares of rice fields, along with

thousands of hectares of aquaculture ponds, while eight ships have been sunk or damaged.

Local authorities have visited affected families and mobilized emergency forces to support recovery efforts and help residents resume normal life, the report said.

# Real Madrid prepares for 2025 Club World Cup debut

Miami, June 17 (UNI) Expectations are high ahead of Real Madrid's debut at the 2025 FIFA Club World Cup, as they face Al Hilal at Hard Rock Stadium here on Wednesday.

The match marks Xabi Alonso's first official game as Real Madrid head coach. Although the former Madrid midfielder and ex-Bayer Leverkusen boss has had just over a week with the squad, all eyes will be on what early changes he has implemented.

Under former coach Carlo Ancelotti, Real Madrid covered among the least distance on the pitch and rarely applied a high press, instead relying on the pace of Kylian Mbappe, Vinicius Jr. and Rodrygo to hit on the break.

Alonso favored a high-pressing style at Leverkusen, with his players disrupting opponents' buildup from the back. Whether he can instill that mentality in Madrid after only a few sessions, particularly in Miami's heat, remains to be seen. At Leverkusen, Alonso frequently deployed a back three with attacking full-backs. It is unclear if he will adopt a similar system with Madrid.

The arrival of Trent Alexander-Arnold from Liverpool supports the use of wing-backs, and the England international appears poised to make his Real Madrid debut, along with Dean Huijsen, who signed from Bournemouth. Huijsen impressed during the recent international break. His height and composure on the ball offer Madrid added flexibility, and it's easy to envision Mbappe and Vinicius exploiting gaps behind Al Hilal's defense as Huijsen delivers long passes from deep.

Vinicius remains under scrutiny following a disappointing domestic campaign, while Alonso must also finalize his central midfield pairing, likely Fede Valverde and possibly Dani Ceballos.

Al Hilal's lineup features several players familiar to Spanish fans, including former Barcelona and Manchester City defender Joao Cancelo, forward Malcom, and former Atletico Madrid left-back Renan Lodi.

With a sell-out crowd expected, the match promises to provide a strong benchmark of the Saudi League's level against one of Europe's top clubs.

## Naushad Moosa's U23 boys all set for Tajikistan test on June 18

Dushanbe, June 17 (UNI) : The India U23 men's team have arrived in Tajikistan to play two friendly matches against the hosts and Kyrgyz Republic.

The Blue Colts will first take on Tajikistan on Wednesday at the Hisor Central Stadium.

Led by head coach Naushad Moosa, the India U23s had been camping in Kolkata since June 1 before travelling to the Central Asian nation. After landing in the capital Dushanbe on Monday evening, Moosa's 23-member squad had a mobility session on Tuesday morning and will hold a 90-minute training session in the evening.

On June 21, India will meet Kyrgyz Republic in the second game.

"The boys are very eager for tomorrow. I've been talking to them about how important these games will be for us," said Moosa, for whom it's his second tour with the U23 team, after coaching them in two friendlies against Malaysia in Kuala Lumpur last year.

For the Blue Colts, these matches in Tajikistan are part of their preparations for the AFC U23 Asian Cup 2026 Qualifiers that will be held in September. India will face Bahrain, Qatar and Brunei Darussalam as they aim to qualify for the U23 continental event for the first time. Despite Dushanbe being located 700 metres above sea level, the weather is hot at this time of the year, soaring to almost 40 degrees during the day. What the Blue Colts mainly have to adjust to is the artificial turf surface of the Hisor Central Stadium, located 25 kilometres from the city of Dushanbe.

It was Nepal's turn to match the lofty six-ball score set, with Rohit Paudel and Dipendra Singh Airee combining with 17 between them, capped off with an Airee six to trigger unprecedented scenes in the international game, an ICC report said.

Eventually, it was the Dutch to hold their nerve, with Zach Lion-Cachet's spin taking two wickets and ending Nepal's third crack at breaking the deadlock, with the Dutch youngster also at the other end for Michael Levitt's six to finally finish proceedings.

The Portuguese side was reduced to 10 men in the 72nd minute when Andrea Belotti was shown a straight red card for catching Costa with a boot to the head. Despite the numerical disadvantage, Benfica pushed for an equalizer and the Lisbon-based club was rewarded as Otamendi met Orkun Kokcu's corner with a thumping header.

# Ronaldo loan move to Al-Hilal counter intuitive

Riyadh (Saudi Arabia), June 17 (UNI) : The chief executive of Saudi Pro League club Al-Hilal said that a loan move for Cristiano Ronaldo before the Club World Cup would have been "completely counter-intuitive" because he played for their "biggest opponent" Al-Nassr.

Al-Hilal were linked with a possible deal for the 40-year-old Portugal forward after Fifa introduced an additional transfer window earlier this month because of the revamped tournament.

Both rival Riyadh clubs are controlled by the country's Public Investment Fund (PIF), and Ronaldo is out of contract at Al-Nassr at the end of June.

But when asked if they came close to a move for the forward, Esteve Calzada told BBC Sport: "We normally don't comment on players' situations, particularly because our name is always put out there, when a player or an agent wants to negotiate a

better deal with his club, or is trying to move out.

"It's been a very weird transfer window, it's a very short period of time.

"You don't want to take a decision thinking about this tournament that then you have to carry on with for the next two or three years.

"As much as I respect Ronaldo as a huge player, as we all recognise he is, it's certainly completely counter-intuitive that you bring the biggest player of your biggest opponent to play with you.

"Even more when it's only for three to four weeks.

"We've been trying to see if we can reinforce the team. But some players were with a mindset of 'holidays already', some players were sometimes just asking for too much money, and we're aware that our team is extremely competitive.

"We'll go into the traditional transfer window after the tournament still with the biggest ambitions to see if we can reinforce the team even more."
