Thunderstorm with lightning, strong winds likely in north coastal AP in next 5 days

Amaravati, June 18 (UNI): Thunderstorms accompanied by lightning are likely to occur at isolated places in North Coastal Andhra Pradesh and Yanam during the next five days, Meteorological Centre said on Wednesday.

In a daily weather report here, it said that strong winds with speeds of 40- 50 kmph are likely to occur at isolated places in Coastal Andhra Pradesh, Yanam and Rayalaseema during the next five days.

Hot and humid conditions are likely to prevail at Isolated places in Coastal Andhra Pradesh, Yanam and Rayalaseema during the same period.

Light to moderate rain or thundershowers are likely to occur at one or two places in coastal Andhra Pradesh, Yanam and Rayalaseema during the next seven days.Rain occurred at one or two places over coastal Andhra Pradesh, Yanam, and Rayalaseema during the last 24 hours, the report added.

Govt unveils Rs 3,000

New Delhi, June 18 (UNI) In a major push towards hassle-free and efficient highway travel, the government on Wednesday announced the launch of a FASTag-based annual pass, priced at Rs 3,000, effective from August 15.The pass, designed exclusively for non-commercial private vehicles such as cars, jeeps, and vans will be valid for one year from the date of activation or up to 200 highway trips, whichever is earlier, Nitin Gadkari, Minister of Road Transport & Highways posted this information on social media platform X.The annual pass will enable seamless movement across National Highways and aims to address longstanding issues at toll plazas, especially those located within a 60 km range, he said. A dedicated link for activation and renewal will soon be made available on the Rajmarg Yatra App as well as on the official websites of National Highways Authority of India (NHAI) and Ministry of Road Transport and Highways (MoRTH). This policy will address the long-standing concerns regarding toll plazas located within a 60 km range and simplify the toll payments through a single, affordable transaction.

School entrance WR announces separate compartment for senior citizens in Mumbai local trains

Mumbai, June 18 : In a relief for the over 50,000 elderly commuters who take the the overcrowded Mumbai local trains every day, the Western Railway today announced the introduction of a dedicated compartment for senior citizens in its suburban trains.

Currently, Mumbai's local trains reserve only 14 seats per train for senior citizens, usually located in the third and twelfth coaches from the Churchgate end. However, with the overwhelming rush during peak hours, accessing these seats is often difficult, forcing many elderly commuters to travel under hazardous conditions."To address this, Western Railway will convert one luggage compartment in each train into a dedicated senior citizen compartment. The plan covers all 105 non-AC local train rakes of WR, including 90 twelve-coach and 15 fifteen-coach trains. These redesigned compartments will feature seating capacity for 13 passengers and standing space for 91, significantly improving accessibility and comfort for older commuters," said an official.

India kicks off IDY celebrations

New Delhi, June 18 (UNI) : As India gears up for the 11th International Day of Yoga (IDY) on June 21, a nationwide wave of yogic celebrations has already gained momentum under the banner of Yoga Maha Kumbh, the Government said today.

A vibrant three-day Yoga Maha Kumbh event has been kick-started from the Heartfulness Meditation Centre in RK Puram here which was organised by the Container Corporation of India (CONCOR) and the Morarji Desai National Institute of Yoga (MDNIY), in collaboration with the Heartfulness Institute.

"The event aims to foster holistic well-being across communities. The program features a series of yoga demonstrations, wellness sessions, and cultural performances, all centered around the themes of mindfulness, health, and community well-being," said a statement from the Ministry said.

Another Yoga Maha Kumbh event began in Ladakh on June 15 in the rarefied air of Ladakh's high-altitude terrain. The International Festival of Yoga and Meditation (IFYM) 2025 in Ladakh has already captivated global and national attention by bringing yoga to awe-inspiring locations such as Pangong Lake (13,000+ ft), Nubra Valley, Sindhu Ghat, and the MIMC Devachan Campus, said the Ministry. Similarly, the second Yoga Maha Kumbh event also started on June 15 in Noida, Uttar Pradesh. Arham Dhyan Yog launched its Yoga Maha Kumbh in Sector 50, Noida, bringing together youth and families for Harit Yoga sessions, essay and debate competitions, and interactive engagements at Ved Van Park, Sector 78. Their upcoming event on 21st June at Shivalik Park in Sector 33A, will align with the nationwide Yoga Sangam celebrations. Arham Dhyan Yog is also conducting parallel sessions globally, further amplifying the IDY 2025 movement, said the statement.

The Court found that first class judicial magistrate Mayank Kumar Pandey, who was in-charge Chief Judicial Magistrate issued notice to Chief Minister Kumar in the case, ignoring legal provisions as available under sections 223 and 226 of BNSS. Accordingly, the entire complaint, proceedings and notice issued to Chief Minister Kumar, stood quashed.Vikash Paswan, a native of Begusarai, had filed a case in the Court of Chief Judicial Magistrate of the district, alleging that Chief Minister Kumar was seen in "Pranam Mudra" and also talking to a person standing next to him when national anthem was played during inauguration of World Cup Sepak Takra on March 20, 2025.

The video, which quickly went viral, prompted the Commission to step in. The incident, which occurred in Raipur Gujran village, shows a man Gurjeet Singh and an

Kupwara boy once near detention under PSA, shines in NEET exams

Srinagar, June 18 (UNI) A year ago, 23 year-old Zubair's future seemed all but sealed. With a Public Safety Act (PSA) dossier ready against his name, the young boy from Kupwara district of Jammu and Kashmir stood on the edge. But hard work and a few helping hands had something else in store.

The boy in the recently declared NEET-UG results excelled and scored 535 marks. He is in all possibility to make a career in medicine.

The Peoples Conference Chairman and MLA Sajad Lone said that all should rejoice Zubair's success as it is a victory of the concepts of love and compassion.

"...Zuber has excelled

academically. But Zuber is much more than a young boy who has cracked NEET. The life of Zuber is a story. And I too am a part of that story. And I share a special bond with him. From depths of despair a year who back Zuber has bounced

back and will soon embark on a career in medicine," Lone said in a post on X.

"An year back Zuber was all set to be booked under the PSA. The dossier was ready. His family approached me. He is a couple of years older than my children. I don't know what happened. But I was convinced that Zubair has to be saved. I was convinced that Zubair is special and can deliver academically and move on to have an excellent career.

I believed that Zubair deserves a chance," he added.The PSA allows detention without trial for up to two years.

Lone said he approached SSP Kupwara was very apprehensive.

"I volunteered to personally guarantee his conduct. We talked so many times over phone and the conversation would end with disagreements. I still remember I got a call from the SSP Kupwara. He said he had given it a thought and that he too is convinced that Zubair needs to be given a chance. And congratulations to SSP Kupwara. His decision to release Zubair means he has added a doctor to the society," MLA Lone said.

Air India to cut international flights on wide body aircraft by 15 pc

Air India said it has decided to reduce its international services on wide-body aircraft by 15 per cent for the next few weeks. The cuts will be implemented between now and June 20, and will continue thereafter, until at least mid-July.

"This effectively adds to our reserve aircraft availability to take care of any unplanned disruptions," said the airline, as it remains in mourning on the tragic loss of 241 passengers and crew members aboard flight AI 171.

The decision is taken "to ensure stability of our operations, better efficiency and to minimise inconvenience to passengers".

"Air India apologises to the passengers affected due to these curtailments, and will inform them in advance and make its best efforts to accommodate them on alternate flights. Passengers will also be offered a choice to reschedule their travel without any cost or to be given full refund, as per their choice. The revised schedule of our international services effective from 20 June, 2025 will be shared shortly," the airline explained.

It said that the curtailments are a painful measure to take, but are necessary following a devastating event which we are still working through and an unusual combination of external events.

"It is done to restore operational stability, and to minimise last-minute inconvenience to passengers. With the continued support of our passengers, the regulatory authorities, Ministry of Civil Aviation and India at large, we will come out stronger through this tragic incident and reestablish the confidence of our passengers and all stakeholders in our services, at the earliest.," Air India noted. In coordination with the Ministry of Civil Aviation and the Government of Gujarat, Air India is putting all possible efforts to support the family members of the deceased and the injured. The investigating authorities are also continuing their efforts to find out the reasons for the accident. The DGCA had mandated 'Enhanced Safety Inspection' across Air India's Boeing 787-8/9 aircraft fleet. Out of total 33 aircraft, inspections have now been completed on 26 and these have been cleared for service, while inspection of the remainder will be complete in the coming days. The fact that 26 aircraft have been cleared gives reassurance in the safety measures and procedures that we follow, said Air India." As a matter of added precaution, Air India will also undertake enhanced safety checks on its Boeing 777 fleet and, going forward, we will continue to cooperate with the authorities, viz AAIB, DGCA, MoCA to ensure the safety of our passengers, our crew and our aircraft, which remains our highest priority," it added.

Benign tumours do not spread and are usually curable, while malignant tumours can grow rapidly, spread to other parts, and may return even after treatment.

The location of the tumour plays a major role in determining the outcome of treatment.

To know the exact nature of the tumour, doctors need to examine a sample of the tissue under

assistance have improved outcomes significantly. Neuronavigation helps guide the surgeon in realtime during the operation, allowing for safer and more complete tumour removal. Intraoperative nerve monitoring helps prevent damage to important nerves during surgery, while microscopes offer a clearer view of delicate areas in the brain.

Brain tumours can present a range of symptoms such as early headaches, morning blurring of vision, vomiting

that brings temporary relief from headache, changes in vision, hearing problems, difficulty walking, weakness on one side of the body, and seizures. Early diagnosis using MRI and PET CT scans can significantly improve the chances of a successful outcome. Once the tumour is surgically removed, the next steps depend on the biopsy report. If the tumour is benign, no further treatment may be needed. However, if the tumour is malignant, the patient may require additional treatment such as chemotherapy or radiotherapy. In some cases, repeat surgeries may also be necessary.

With the help of modern technology, brain tumour surgeries have become safer and more effective. Today, most patients recover well and are discharged within 4–5 days of surgery. The key to success lies in early detection and timely medical attention. 

SC grants protection to minor girl forced into marriage, issues notice to Bihar, Delhi police

New Delhi, June 18 (UNI): The Supreme Court on Wednesday stepped in to protect a 16year-old girl from Bihar who alleged she was forcibly married to a man twice her age and subjected to repeated

abuse. The court directed both the Bihar Director General of Police and the Delhi Police Commissioner to ensure her safety, along with that of her friend who helped her escape the marriage and now faces kidnapping charges.

The petition revealed that her husband made public threats to kill her, reportedly saying he would "happily go to jail" for it.

Her mother subsequently filed a kidnapping case against her friend at Piplawan Naubatpur Police Station in Patna, allegedly concealing the fact that the girl had been married off. The petition

emphasised the urgency of the situation fearing that she would be killed if apprehended or forced to return. She urged the Court to protect her from police action until the matter is fully adjudicated. Taking note of the

threat to the minor's life, the Supreme Court ordered both Bihar and Delhi Police to provide the girl and her friend with emergency contact

numbers for immediate assistance and to ensure their security. The court also directed

the police chiefs to submit a status report before the next hearing and issued notices to the girl's mother and the civil contractor husband, who have been named as parties in the case.

The matter is scheduled for further hearing in July.

Electors to get EPICs within 15 days of update in electoral rolls: ECI

Chandigarh, June 18 (UNI) To ensure faster delivery of Photo Identity Cards (EPICs) to the electors, the Election Commission of India (ECI) has introduced a new Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) enabling the delivery of EPICs within 15 days of an update in the electoral rolls, including new enrolment of an elector change in any or particulars of an existing elector.

The initiative is in line with the various measures being undertaken by the ECI for the convenience of electors as envisaged by the Chief Election Commissioner, Gyanesh Kumar along with Election Commissioners Dr. Sukhbir Singh Sandhu and Dr. Vivek Joshi, a release said.

The new system will ensure real-time tracking of each stage right from the EPIC generation by the Electoral Registration Officer (ERO) till the delivery of EPIC to the elector through the Department of Posts (DoP).

Electors will also receive notifications via SMS at each stage, keeping them informed about the status of their EPICs.

For this purpose, ECI has introduced a dedicated IT module on its recently launched ECINet platform. The new IT platform will replace the existing process by re-engineering the current system and streamlining the workflow.

DoP's Application Programme Interface (API) will be integrated with the ECINet for seamless delivery. This initiative aims to enhance service delivery while maintaining data security.

Raipur, June 18 (UNI) In a significant move, the Cabinet meeting chaired by Chhattisgarh Chief Minister Vishnu Dev Sai on Wednesday took several important decisions promoting Scheduled Tribes and Scheduled Castes, renewable energy, and wildlife conservation, including tiger protection and eco-tourism.

Chhattisgarh cabinet okays

The Cabinet approved providing state scholarships and stipends to students from the Dihari Korwa, Baghel Kshatri, Sansari Oraon, Pabiya/Pawiya/Pawiya Samaj, and Domra castes, treating them at par with Scheduled Tribes and Scheduled Castes, respectively. These students will also be eligible for admission to hostels and ashrams.

The Cabinet also decided to promote renewable energy and provide financial assistance to electricity consumers by implementing the Pradhan Mantri Surya Ghar Muft Bijli Yojana. Under this scheme, the state government will provide additional financial assistance to households for installing solar rooftop plants, over and above the central financial assistance. The target is to install 60,000 solar power plants in 2025-26 and 70,000 in 2026-27, with a financial outlay of Rs 180 crore and Rs 210 crore, respectively. To promote wildlife conservation and ecotourism, the Cabinet decided to establish the Chhattisgarh Tiger Foundation Society, which will work under the Wildlife Protection Act, 1972. The society will be selffinanced and will raise funds from individuals and institutions. It will be directly involved in tiger and wildlife conservation activities, promote eco-tourism, and provide employment opportunities to local communities.

The Cabinet also approved the merger of Vivekananda Institute of Social Health Welfare and Services, Chhattisgarh (VISHWAS) with Ramakrishna Mission Ashram Narayanpur. Additionally, 100 acres of land will be provided free of cost to the Horticulture Department for establishing a College of Horticulture (Horticulture University) in Bemetara district.

The Jashpur district's self-help groups' herbal and mahua tea products, marketed under the 'Jashpur' brand, will be transferred to the state government or Chhattisgarh State Industrial Development Corporation (CSIDC) to provide a wider market and boost marketing.


