24 shops burn to ashes in massive fire in Bilaspur

Bilaspur, June 4 (UNI) : A massive fire broke out in a market of Bilaspur district in Chhattisgarh at around 3 am on Wednesday, leaving nearly 24 shops in ashes. Upon receiving the distress call, the fire department dispatched a joint team of firefighters to the scene, who are battling to bring the blaze under control.

The narrow alleys in the Shanichari market area are posing a challenge for the firefighters as they struggle to contain the fire. The incident is likely to result in significant losses for the shopkeepers. The fire has destroyed around 24 shops selling oil, cosmetics, and groceries.

The cause of the fire is suspected to be a short circuit. The extent of the damage to the traders is yet to be assessed.

The police have registered a case and launched an investigation into the incident.

Saudi Interior Minister hosts annual Hajj Security Forces ceremony

Mumbai, June 4 (UNI) His Royal Highness Prince Abdulaziz bin Saud bin Naif bin Abdulaziz, Saudi Arabia's Minister of Interior and Chairman of the Supreme Hajj Committee, presided over the Ministry of Interior's annual ceremony honouring the security forces deployed for the Hajj season.

The Saudi Public Relations Agency in Mumbai released details of the event on Wednesday.

The ceremony featured a grand military parade that highlighted the vital contributions of various security sectors involved in the pilgrimage. Attendees witnessed simulations of multiple security scenarios, alongside displays of aerial security units, specialised vehicles and cutting-edge equipment employed during the Hajj.

Lieutenant General Mohammad bin Abdullah Al-Bassami, Chairman of the Hajj Security Committee, underscored in his address that the Kingdom's wise leadership has devoted all necessary resources to serving the Hajj and safeguarding the pilgrims, making it a paramount priority.

Modi, BCCI express grief over RCB stampede; 11 feared dead

New Delhi/Bengaluru, June 4 (UNI) : Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Wednesday expressed deep sorrow over the stampede outside the M Chinnaswamy Stadium here during Royal Challengers Bengaluru's IPL victory celebrations.

"The mishap in Bengaluru is absolutely heartrending. In this tragic hour, my thoughts are with all those who have lost their loved ones. I pray that those who are injured have a speedy recovery," the Prime Minister said in a post on X.

The stampede occurred when thousands of fans gathered outside the stadium in the city's central business district to catch a glimpse of their favourite players and the IPL trophy. A sudden surge in the crowd led to chaos and suffocation, resulting in multiple casualties. At least

11 people are feared dead and over 50 others injured.

Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) Secretary Devajit Saikia said, "Organisers should have planned RCB's IPL-winning celebrations better."

He acknowledged the scale of the celebrations but pointed out a lack of adequate crowd control measures."

Senior Congress leader and MLC BK Hariprasad also expressed anguish over the incident.

"The incident in which more than 11 people, including women, died in a stampede during the RCB cricket team's victory parade in Bengaluru is extremely shocking and regrettable. The condition of some of the injured is serious, and the government should take immediate action to provide them with appropriate

treatment," he said.

However, the state government is yet to confirm the number of deaths in the stampede. Karnataka Deputy Chief Minister DK Shivakumar appealed for calm and said the exact number of casualties was still being ascertained.

The BJP seized on the incident to mount a scathing attack on the Congress government.

Karnataka BJP President Vijayendra Yediyurappa held the administration directly responsible, alleging that it rushed into organising the rally without proper planning and prioritised publicity over safety.

"The state government must take full responsibility," Vijayendra said. "More than 11 people have died, and several others are in critical condition, some in the ICU. This

tragedy is a direct result of the government's negligence." Vijayendra said he had spoken to one of the victims, who claimed there was no police presence or ambulance facility at the venue. "The injured had to rush themselves to Bowring Hospital," he said.

Calling it a "serious lapse," Vijayendra demanded that Chief Minister Siddaramaiah take moral responsibility and refer the matter for a judicial inquiry.

"Let the CM decide who must be held accountable—but it must go before a judicial forum," he asserted.

The incident has sparked widespread public outrage and drawn scrutiny over the state's preparedness for a high-profile public event, with the discrepancy in casualty figures adding to the anxiety.

Siddaramaiah confirms 11 deaths, announces Rs 10L aid

Bengaluru, June 4 (UNI) At least 11 people lost their lives and 33 were injured in a tragic stampede outside the M Chinnaswamy Stadium here on Wednesday, as an overwhelming crowd gathered for Royal Challengers Bengaluru's IPL victory celebrations.

Chief Minister Siddaramaiah expressed deep grief over the incident and announced ₹10 lakh compensation for the families of each of the deceased, all of whom were young men and women.

"No one anticipated this. Neither the Cricket Association nor the government expected such a huge crowd. The stadium can accommodate only 35,000 people, but over two to three lakh fans turned up," Siddaramaiah told reporters, explaining that the rally had to be organised early this morning following last evening's IPL final.

Thousands of jubilant fans had gathered near the gates of the stadium since early morning, hoping to catch a glimpse of their favourite players and the trophy. The situation spiralled out of control when the surging crowd overwhelmed entry points, triggering a deadly stampede.

"Thirty-three people have been injured, with 47 reported to have sustained varying levels of trauma initially. Some were discharged after treatment," the Chief Minister stated, adding that all injured individuals would receive free medical care.

Siddaramaiah assured that those undergoing treatment in both government and private hospitals will have their medical expenses fully borne by the state. "I have spoken with doctors to ensure proper treatment for all the injured," he said.

Odisha Police recovers 3.8 tons of 5 tons of explosives looted by armed Maoists: DGP

Bhubaneswar, June 4 (UNI) The Odisha police have recovered about 3.8 tons out of 5 tons of explosives looted by Maoists on May 27, Odisha DGP Y B Khurania said on Wednesday.

Addressing newsmen here, Khurania said that about 5 tons of explosives were being transported from the explosives warehouse at Bada Gaon Itma to the Banko mine in a truck on May 27 when the armed Maoists looted the explosives at gunpoint.

The armed Maoists intercepted a truck carrying

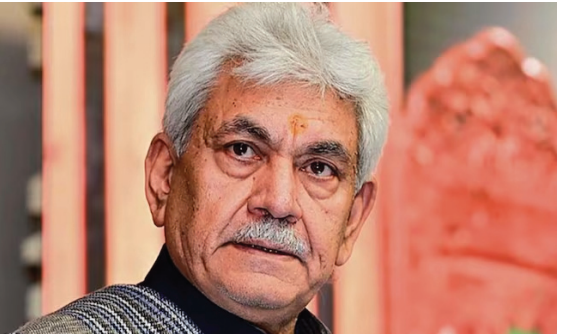


President Murmu confers armed forces with distinguished

CID arrests key accused in Rs 792 cr Falcon Scam

Hyderabad, June 4 (UNI) : The CID team investigating the Falcon case pertaining to Capital Protection Force Pvt Ltd (operating under Falcon Invoice Discounting) successfully arrested Sandeep Kumar, one of the main accused in the Rs 792 crore scam, police here on Wednesday.

In continuation to the seven accused arrested earlier, the key accused Sandeep Kumar, Operations Head and younger brother of A-2 Amardeep (Chairman, Managing Director and Partner) of the company, was arrested along with his accomplice Ravi Kumar in Hyderabad on Tuesday, said Shikha Goel, IPS, Director General, CID, TG, Hyderabad, in a release here.

The case pertains to 'Criminal Breach of Trust, Cheating and Criminal

Conspiracy'. The accused cheated the depositors, by developing Falcon Invoice Discounting Application (www.falconsgroup.com), and created fake deals on the name of reputed MNCs, induced the depositors on the pretext of high interest rates with short term plans and collected about Rs.4,215 Crores from 7,056 depositors. As per initial estimates about 4,065 victims were cheated to the tune of Rs.792 Crores.

On the complaints of victims, three cases were registered earlier as U/ Secs.316(2I), 318(4), 6I(2I) of BNS and Section 5 of TSPDEF Act, 1999 at EOW PS Cyberabad and transferred to CID, Telangana, Hyderabad for further investigation in March 2025. Additionally, eight more cases have been

registered against the accused company and its Directors across India in six states (Karnataka, Maharashtra, West Bengal, Rajasthan, AP and Delhi).

The arrested accused are -- Sandeep Kumar, Operations Head of Capital Protection Force Pvt. Ltd; Ravi Kumar, an Electrician (both native of Bihar). Sandeep Kumar had fled to Dubai after the case was registered. Investigation revealed that he returned to India via Nepal through the Nepal-India border illegally.

He resettled his and his brother's family at Danapur, Patna.

On information when the CID team went to Bihar, he escaped while his father and wife were arrested.

Hyderabad. He was given shelter by Ravi Kumar (cousin and accomplice).

On credible information both were arrested in Hyderabad on Tuesday.

Besides 14 property documents worth Rs.10 Crore, the CID seized three luxury cars worth Rs 2.5 crores from the accused.

The accused Sandeep Kumar, was actively involved with the main accused. Amar Deep Kumar, and other accused persons to attract depositors and cheated the gullible victims.

The accused Sandeep Kumar diverted the funds of Falcon for an amount of Rs.8,45,09,270 to his personal accounts and his company.

He fled to UAE along with the accused Yogendra Singh, CEO of Falcon Invoice Discounting Company.

Through the deployment of cutting-edge anti-BOT systems and integration with a leading Content Delivery Network (CDN) service provider, the Railways has significantly curbed unauthorised automated bookings by unscrupulous agents and improved the access of the web site to the genuine users.

The new system has

effectively mitigated all bot traffic, which peaks during the first five minutes of Tatkal. Bot traffic accounts for up to 50% of overall login attempts during this period. This enhancement ensures better accessibility for genuine users. Additionally, 2.5 crore suspected user IDs have been deactivated for booking tickets. A landmark achievement was recorded on May 22, 2025, with the highest-ever per-minute booking of 31,814 tickets, showcasing the robustness and scalability of the upgraded platform.

To further enhance fairness and efficiency, new user protocols have been

introduced. Users not authenticated via Aadhaar can book Opening ARP, Tatkal or Premium Tatkal tickets only after 3 days of registration, while Aadhaar-verified users can book tickets without delay. ‘2,000 FB accounts commenting on Assam election being probed’

Guwahati, June 4 (UNI) The Assam police is investigating about 2,000 Facebook accounts, commenting on Assam elections, which are being handled from Pakistan and Bangladesh.

Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma said this on Wednesday in Guwahati while interacting with newsmen. “We have asked the Special Branch of the Assam police to look into it,” he said.

Sarma’s revelation assumes significance as the state is going to elections early next year.

He said that the ISI of Pakistan wants a particular candidate to win in Assam elections slated for next year. “The numbers of fictitious accounts will increase as elections draw near, ISI wants a particular candidate to win and details I will give on September 10. Around

2,000 Facebook accounts have penetrated,” he said.

“If people see the comments, it becomes clear that these are not people from Assam. A call centre is set up in Kolkata, 2,000 accounts belonging to a particular community have sprung up in a day. As these things are under my observation and by September Assam politics will be interesting and I will be able to spell out more things,” he added.

Sarma said the Assam Government recently pushed back several Bangladeshi nationals.

It may be mentioned here that the Assam Chief Minister had recently opposed the inclusion of Lok Sabha MP Gaurav Gogoi in the all-party delegation to be sent to different countries to explain India’s stance on terrorism.

Sikkim govt planning to evacuate stranded tourists by road

Gangtok, June 4 (UNI) The Sikkim government is planning to evacuate the stranded tourists from 9,000 ft high Lachen to safer places in phases by road since the flying of helicopters is dangerous due to the prevailing weather conditions and continuous rain, sources said on Wednesday.

Only 33 stranded tourists were airlifted, and two attempts to airlift further failed.

“As part of the ongoing rescue and evacuation operations, two helicopters have been stationed at Pakyong Airport since June 3. So far, one successful sortie has been conducted, during which 33 stranded tourists were safely airlifted.”

However, due to poor weather conditions, subsequent flights have not been possible. On two separate attempts, the

helicopters had to return mid way. If the weather remains unfavorable in the coming days, we will be moving forward with Plan B: Ground Transshipment,” a government communique said this evening.

Under Plan B, the transshipment operation (Lachen to Chungthang – 28 km) in north Sikkim. There are 4/5 critical block points between Lachen and Chungthang, including damaged sections and collapsed bridges. These areas require crossing on foot and temporary arrangements to ensure safe passage, the communique said.

From the Lachen side, teams comprising the local public, Indian Army, NDRF, and GREF are actively working to construct footpaths and temporary wooden bridges to make the road safe for the stranded tourists.

Solapur Division of Central Railway to Observe International Level Crossings Awareness Day on 5th June

Solapur , June 4 : Solapur Division of Central Railway will actively participate in the observance of International Level Crossings Awareness Day (ILCAD) on 5th June 2025, as part of a global initiative by the International Union of Railways (UIC). The objective of ILCAD is to improve awareness and enhance safety at level crossings, thereby preventing accidents and saving lives.

In line with Indian Railways’ commitment to safety and public awareness, a series of educational and outreach activities have been planned across the Solapur Division to sensitise road users on the do’s and don’ts while crossing level crossings.

Key Safety Guidelines for the Public at Railway Crossings:

- Stop vehicles near the gate signal, not too close to the gate boom. Always halt on the left side to allow smooth passage for oncoming traffic once the gate reopens.
- Never attempt to pass under or around the gate boom after it has been lowered. A train may be approaching, and no vehicle or person can withstand its momentum.
- Do not try to exit the crossing once

the gate is closed, even if the train hasn’t arrived yet. Such actions can result in fatal accidents and disrupt gate operations.

- Reduce speed well in advance of the speed breaker near railway gates. Failure to do so may cause collisions with the gate and endanger both the vehicle and railway property.
- Respect the authority of the gateman. When the gate is closed, railway operations take precedence. Arguing or obstructing gate staff is a punishable offense.
- Ensure the vehicle height does not exceed 4.5 meters when crossing electrified tracks. Overheight vehicles risk contact with high-voltage 25,000-volt overhead equipment, which can lead to catastrophic fires and loss.

Solapur Division appeals to all road users to strictly adhere to safety guidelines at level crossings. Your cooperation is essential to avoid accidents and ensure safe coexistence between road and rail traffic.

Let us join hands to spread awareness and make our rail crossings safer for everyone.

SC rejects Waqf Board's claim over Shahdara property, notes existence of gurdwara

New Delhi, June 4 (UNI) The Supreme Court on Wednesday dismissed a plea filed by the Delhi Waqf Board asserting rights over a property in Shahdara, observing that a fully functioning Gurudwara exists on the disputed site.

A bench of justices Sanjay Karol and Satish Chandra Sharma refused to entertain the Waqf Board’s special leave petition challenging a 2010 Delhi High Court judgment, which had set aside the Board’s claim over the property.

The case dates back to the 1980s when the Delhi Waqf Board filed a suit for possession of a mosque allegedly located at village Oldanpur, Shahdara, against Hira Singh (now

deceased). The board contended that the property was a Waqf property, dedicated and used for religious purposes since time immemorial.

However, the defendant disputed the claim, arguing that the suit was time-barred and asserting that the property had been sold to him by Mohd. Ahsaan in 1953. He further claimed the premises had been functioning as a gurdwara, under the management of a Gurdwara committee, since before Independence.

The trial court ruled in favour of the Waqf Board, a decision upheld by the first appellate court in 1989. However, the Delhi High Court reversed the findings in 2010, holding that the

board had failed to establish that the property was waqf. The High Court observed: “Neither the permanent dedication/user since time immemorial of the suit property as a waqf property has been proved and nor does the documentary evidence come to his aid... Defendant was admittedly in occupation of this property since 1947-48.”

Unhappy with the verdict, the board approached the Supreme Court in 2012. On Wednesday, senior advocate Sanjoy Ghose, appearing for the board, argued, “The lower courts have held that a mosque was there. Now, some kind of gurdwara is there.” Justice Satish

Chandra Sharma responded firmly, “Not ‘some kind of’ - a properly functioning gurdwara. Once there is a gurdwara, let it be. A religious structure is already functioning there. You should yourself relinquish that claim.”

Justice Sharma, addressing his companion on the Bench, Justice Karol, remarked: “Arrey, azaadi ke pehle ka Gurudwara hai...”

The court then proceeded to summarily dismiss the petition, concluding: “Sorry, sorry... Dismissed.” With that, the Supreme Court ended the decades-old litigation, affirming the High Court’s judgment and putting a quietus to the Waqf Board’s claim over the site.

Large language models can accurately predict plant gene functions

Large language models (LLMs), when trained on extensive plant genomic data, can accurately predict gene functions and regulatory elements, researchers said .

By leveraging the structural parallels between genomic sequences and natural language, these AI-driven models can decode complex genetic information, offering unprecedented insights into plant biology.

This advancement holds promise for accelerating crop improvement, enhancing biodiversity conservation, and bolstering food security in the face of global challenges, said the study published in Tropical Plants journal.

Traditionally, plant genomics has grappled with the intricacies of vast and complex datasets, often limited by the specificity of traditional machine learning models and the scarcity of annotated data.

While LLMs have revolutionised fields like natural language processing, their application in plant genomics remained nascent. The primary hurdle has been adapting these models to interpret the unique "language" of plant genomes, which differ significantly from human linguistic patterns.

In this study, researchers explored the potential of LLMs in plant genomics.

By drawing parallels between the structures of natural language and genomic sequences, the study highlights how LLMs can be trained to understand and predict gene functions, regulatory elements, and expression patterns in plants.

The research discusses various LLM architectures, including encoder-only models like DNABERT, decoder-only models such as DNAGPT, and encoder-decoder models like ENBED.

The team employed a methodology that involved pre-training LLMs on vast datasets of plant genomic sequences, followed by fine-tuning with specific annotated data to enhance accuracy.

By treating DNA sequences akin to linguistic sentences, the models could identify patterns and relationships within the genetic code.

These models have shown promise in tasks like promoter prediction, enhancer identification, and gene expression analysis.

Notably, plant-specific models like AgroNT and FloraBERT have been developed, demonstrating improved performance in annotating plant genomes and predicting tissue-specific gene expression.

However, the study also notes that most existing LLMs are trained on animal or microbial data, which often lack comprehensive genomic annotations, showcasing the versatility and robustness of LLMs in diverse plant species.

In summary, this study underscores the immense potential of integrating artificial intelligence, particularly large language models, into plant genomics research.

The study was conducted by Meiling Zou, Haiwei Chai and Zhiqiang Xia’s team from Hainan University.

School kids Growing up too fast?

Life was all rosy for 13-year-old Chitra studying in a reputed school in Mumbai until she laid eyes on a magazine brought in by her senior school-mate Aman who was 15-years-old. Excited and titilated by the explicit visual content - she soon developed a habit to drool over the magazine with her school friend on a daily basis. In no time, this habit took a physical turn and one fine day the two youngsters decided to experiment with sex out of sheer curiosity. Tragedy struck as Chitra got pregnant at the age of 13 and Aman could never come out of the guilt. This real-life instance shared by the principal of a reputed school from Mumbai on conditions of anonymity reveals the grave side effects associated with young school children indulging in reading pornography. Be it the curiosity to watch porn, getting a taste of alcohol or enjoying the ecstasy of drugs - modern school kids are choosing to live life in the fast lane...so unaware of the speed breakers and dead ends that lie ahead.

Dr. Samir Parikh, chief psychiatrist, Max Healthcare, who recently conducted a survey in Delhi reveals, "26 percent of the boys surveyed fell in the moderate category and 21 percent fell in the high category when it came to talks about visiting porn sites, being a common conversation in schools. Among girls, 24 percent fell in the moderate category and 5 percent in the high category."

Though figures of drug addiction in schools were comparatively lower, but it was quite prominent as these young party animals often hit night clubs and pubs to enjoy themselves.

Moving away from the national Capital the scene was equally disappointing in other parts of the country as well. Pramod

Sharma, Principal of Mayo College, Ajmer reveals, "Being a residential school, Internet access is quite controlled and well monitored at our institution. Also, we have installed special software which blocks certain sites, but still on a number of occasions we have found kids receiving porn stuff on their E-mails."

Ritu Nanda, a clinical psychologist and

of anonymity, a teacher from a Delhi-based girl's government school reveals, "It was a shock to find a girl showing a sleazy MMS to her friends, especially when we knew that her parents barely managed a square meal a day for their family. On enquiring we got to know that it was gifted to her by her boyfriend. Not just this, girls as young as 11 and 12 proudly boast about their boyfriends to their classmates." The reasons for this forward behaviour in school children experts say can be blamed on an easy access

counselor, Delhi Public School, Bhopal, narrates a different saga of addiction, which is governed by the availability of addictive. "Fortunately, we have not received any complaints of drug addiction, but instances of alcohol addiction have come to our notice, since it is easily available in comparison to drugs."

Taking the availability clause further, Ritu adds, "The main aim of school kids is to experience a feeling of high and if they do not get access to drugs and alcohol, a lot of them resort to other readily available options like inhaling petrol and even thinner, which they get along with the white corrective fluid or in the form of nail polish remover. When inhaled in abundance, fumes from petrol or the thinner leaves them hallucinating and in a state of ecstasy."

Usha Reddy, principal, Meridian School, Hyderabad shares some confessions made by adolescent kids in a 'Closed Box Session', which is an adolescent counseling session that is held in the school. "One of the kids said, 'I have done it thrice with my friend and now I can't study for my exams'. Another one who came for help expressed his guilt saying, 'I am bad as I watch bad things on my computer, I don't want to see them, but I cannot control my urges,'" reveals Usha.

The biggest shock comes from the fact reveal ation that these honest confessions were from kids who were all under 15 years of age. And the fact that some of them couldn't even put their actions into words was enough to reveal their maturity levels

Even kids studying in government schools are displaying promiscuous behavior. On conditions

to technology like mobile phones as well as the Internet being readily used mainly to complete school projects, untapped access and lack of control over children's Internet-habits by their busy parents.

Also, excess exposure to an overwhelming party culture and availability of easy money opens the door for many bad habits. "They want to try something new, cool and happening and unfortunately these addictions act as magnet to their wants. Then comes peer pressure and the need of social recognition combined with little knowledge that ends up proving dangerous for them," explains Ritu.

Meghna Manchanda, mother to a 12-year-old Samir says, "My husband and I are not at all Internet savvy. Even for our requirements we depend upon our son. On one such day when he was opening a site many pornographic pictures started popping up and on being asking, my son told us that he has become an online member to one such site. Though we couldn't stop him from using the Internet, after that they we as parents became extra vigilant."

Experts tag such promiscuous behaviour as the 'Gang-age', when doing everything in groups and gangs is considered uber cool!

Usha explains, "More than displaying a cool quotient, it is about creating a comfort zone of their own. When one child goes to a porn site accidentally or intentionally, mixed feelings of excitement and guilt start groping their mind. Excitement makes them visit the sites again, while the feeling of guilt makes them spill the beans in their peer group proving that 'it's not just me but every one who's indulging in the same behaviour.'" In today's scenario, trying to shield a child from such addictions seems absolutely impossible to many parents. So what's the way to help them to keep off the porn addiction?

1. The right way is to counsel your child well in advance so that there's a proper time for everything and getting into such habits in their age will only defocus them," advises Reddy.

2. Most children maintain these habits in seclusion which bears testimony to the constant guilt that grows inside them. So inculcate a habit in them of not doing anything in the world that they feel ashamed of telling their parents. Open the doors of communication. "Yelling, scolding and public insult can spoil things further, instead counsel them by telling them the pros and cons of every little step they take in their life," advises Reddy.

3. "Cutting upon their pocket money is not the solution. Instead develop a mutual trust between you and your kid. Make him spend the pocket money as he likes and in return he should give you an account of every single rupee he's splurged," suggests Veena Venugopal, vice principal, Abhayasa Residential Pub School.

4. Keeping a constant check on kids is nearly impossible for parents in a modern context. But they should ensure that the computer is in a common room rather than in kids' room. Also, the time of accessing the Internet should be fixed and surprise visits into the room must be maintained so that the youngster is not indulging in net surfing without the fear of supervision.

5. Software that can bar certain sites (containing adult content) can also be installed on machines at home as well as in schools.

The influences that work on a young mind in today's modern context is not easy to monitor, but being cautious as parents helps to keep your child safe from harm.

Step-parenting tips

Being a step-parent is a tough ask. But, you can easily work your way around to having a happy family if you follow a few basic rules.

The first is and the most important rule is to never put your wife/husband in an awkward situation, where they end up having to choose between you or the children. This will bring in immediate dislike from the children towards you, especially if your spouse ends up choosing you over them. Accept your step-children with all their shortcomings. Remember, they are looking for a mentor, a guiding light from you. They are having as tough a chance when it comes to accepting the new surroundings at home as you are. Give them reassurance and reinforcements.

In the case of becoming a stepfather, remember that you need to be the strong supportive figure. They need to know that they can trust you. As for stepmothers, you will have to be their emotional anchor.



Is summer a ‘fur’nace for your pets?

The summer sun is brutal for our furry and feathered companions too. Here are some pointers on what to do for your pets as the weather starts hotting up.

Did you know that dogs and cats don't sweat, but instead pant to release heat? Veterinary surgeon Dr Afzal H Mohamed says, "Dogs and cats have sweat glands, but they are poorly developed and are of no use in thermoregulation."

Outdoor vs indoor

Contrary to popular opinion, indoor pets don't need to be kept in an air conditioned environment all the time. This actually reduces their tolerance to heat. "Even long-haired breeds don't necessarily need an air conditioner on all the time," says Dr Afzal. "If they have

been bred for generations in a tropical climate, they are probably well-adapted to the heat. It depends on how the individual dog or cat is raised."

Moreover, dogs adapted to living outdoors will do fine outside as long as they have shady spots to sleep in and access to water at all times, he adds.

Shedding in summer

We look for thin, comfortable clothes to wear during summer. Imagine having a fur coat on all the time! No wonder our pets want to shed all that hair...

"Most breeds have a soft undercoat and a fairly coarse overcoat. The undercoat grows out during the cooler months — this is what is shed during summer," says veterinarian Dr Priyadarshini Govind. "A good 10 to 15 minutes of brushing every day helps to bring the shedding under control."

An ice cube a day

Dogs and cats go through some minor changes in their eating patterns. "They may prefer to eat during the cooler parts of the day, like in the early morning and late evening," says Dr Priya. "Ensure they have fresh water easily available - especially if you're giving them mainly dry food (kibbles)."

But what about pets that are poor water drinkers? "A bowl of chicken soup, chilled butter milk or tender coconut water is an alternative," she says. "You can also freeze these into ice cubes and offer these as a treat during the day."

Travelling by car

Sure, your dog loves to come along on a

drive! But summers mean you have to be extra careful about taking your pets out on that joyride. Dr Afzal warns, "Under NO circumstances should a dog or cat be left in an exposed parked car for even a short while. If parked in the shade, keep the air conditioner running and roll down the windows a couple of inches."

Be a Good Samaritan



If you think summer is hard on your pets, imagine the animals - dogs, cats, birds, cows - who live off our streets. Here are two simple things you could do:

1. Keep a big bowl of fresh water outside your house / shop / office and try to ensure it is filled at all times. Cement water bowls can be put up in street corners for this purpose.

2. Dogs often take shelter from the sun under parked cars. Always look under your vehicle before you start.

Warning signs of heat stress "Heat stroke is an emergency!" says Dr Afzal. Watch out for these signs:

- Dullness

- Constant panting
 - Dry nose
 - Glazed eyes
 - Vomiting
 - Fast heart rate
 - Weakness progressing to depression
 - Blindness
 - Inco-ordination while walking
 - Collapse
 - Seizures
 - Coma
- If you suspect heat stress/heat stroke:
- Move your pet immediately to a cool environment (air conditioned)
 - Wet it with room-temperature water
 - Place under a fan to increase convective heat loss
 - You may also need to hurry to your veterinarian as soon as possible.
- Summer's also not a good time for you to consider mating your pet. Dr Priya says, "I generally discourage my clients from breeding in the summer due to the stress of the heat that makes it very difficult for both the mother and puppies. Pregnant dogs can go into abortion if they have the slightest of heat stress."
- Tips:**
- Walk your dog in the early morning or late evening, never in the afternoon
 - Never leave your pet unattended in a car
 - Ensure there is always plenty of fresh water available
 - Ensure there is plenty of shade available

Blaze destroys multiple warehouses in Thane's Diva area

No casualties were reported in that blaze either, and authorities have launched an inquiry to determine its cause.

New Delhi, June 4 (UNI) : The President of the Supreme Court Bar Association (SCBA), Senior Advocate Vikas Singh, has written to Chief Justice of India BR Gavai raising concerns over the Supreme Court Advocates-on-Record Association (SCAORA) allegedly acting beyond its mandate.

In his letter, Singh stated that the intention behind placing the concerns on record was to ensure that there remains a unified voice within the Bar on issues relating to Supreme Court lawyers.

"I am placing these concerns on record to set the matter straight and to ensure that the functioning of this institution remains cohesive, disciplined, and free from unnecessary overlaps or conflicts, particularly in matters concerning the general interests of the Bar or the infrastructure of the Supreme Court." The letter alleged that the SCAORA has recently taken positions on issues that fall under the exclusive domain of the SCBA. It stated that the SCBA alone represents the interests of all categories of lawyers practising in the Supreme Court. The letter highlighted that SCBA currently has 22,734 members, including 10,013 permanent and 12,309 temporary members, as well

as 906 Senior Advocates, AoRs, and about 19,000 non-AoR practitioners. It added that while there are 3,786 registered AoRs with the Supreme Court, only about 3,000 are members of SCAORA.

Singh referred to a communication issued by SCAORA on June 2, 2025, to the Secretary General of the Supreme Court regarding biometric entry for lawyers. The letter alleged that the issue was presented as one concerning the entire Bar, which Singh objected to. "There is absolutely no question of members of the Bar voluntarily offering such extensive personal information to the Registry of the Supreme Court. If, on the other hand, there is any mandate from the Supreme Court for security reasons, upon discussion with the SCBA, the Bar would, of course, fully cooperate."

The letter stated that the existing proximity card system for lawyers was functioning efficiently and raised concerns about data privacy in the context of biometric data collection.

Singh also referred to the Supreme Court's decision in the Supreme Court Bar Assn. v. B.D. Kaushik, stating that the Court has recognised SCBA as the only association representing all members of the Supreme Court Bar, including Senior Advocates, Advocates, and AoRs.

BMC prepares for Eid al-Adha as over 1.5 lakh animals arrive at Deonar

Mumbai, June 4 : With only days remaining for Eid al-Adha, the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC) is making extensive preparations at the Deonar abattoir, Asia's largest slaughterhouse, as over 1.5 lakh animals, including goats and 8,000 buffaloes, have already arrived at the facility.

Thousands of traders from Rajasthan, Gujarat, Uttar Pradesh, and other states began bringing their livestock nearly 15 days ahead of the festival, which is slated for June 7 this year.

The BMC has set up elaborate arrangements to accommodate the animals and ensure smooth operations during the busy period. Over 500 security and sanitation personnel will be deployed at the abattoir, which spans 77,580 square meters.

Temporary sheds and shelters have been erected to house the animals, while two health centers and three ambulances for humans, along with two first aid centers for animals, have been arranged on-site.

To manage the large influx, 109 designated

facilities across Mumbai have been earmarked for the religious slaughter of goats, while buffalo slaughter is permitted only within the Deonar premises. The ritual slaughter is expected to take place from June 7 to June 9, following traditional customs.

Kaleem Pasha Pathan, general manager of the Deonar abattoir, explained that the registration of traders and management of animal movement has been digitized through a QR code system. While 1.5 lakh goats and 8,000 buffaloes have arrived so far, an additional 20,000 to 30,000 animals are expected in the coming days, depending on market demand.

The BMC has also allocated four vehicles specifically for the transportation and disposal of deceased animals. To maintain cleanliness, 300 sanitation workers will operate in three shifts, supported by pickup vans, JCBs, and dumpers. Security measures include over 200 personnel working in two shifts, CCTV surveillance, and the installation of seven hand-metal and door-metal

detectors.

Strict action will be taken against unauthorized slaughter outside the abattoir, with dedicated monitoring teams deployed across the city's eastern and western suburbs and the island city division to enforce compliance.

Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis, while chairing a high-level law and order meeting at Mumbai's Sahyadri Guest House on Monday evening in connection with Eid al-Adha celebrations, directed senior officials to maintain communal harmony and ensure the peaceful conduct of the festival across the state.

This directive came in the wake of recent discussions surrounding animal sacrifice and the closure of cattle markets in certain regions.

The Deonar abattoir experiences peak footfall of up to 1.5 lakh people daily during the festival, underscoring the importance of the BMC's comprehensive preparations to ensure a safe, orderly, and hygienic environment for the religious celebrations.

Three arrested in fake gold scam

Mumbai, June 4 (UNI) : Three people were arrested by BKC police station on Wednesday for their alleged involvement in a fake gold scam, where a man was duped of Rs two lakh.

The accused allegedly created a bogus Instagram account offering imported gold at discounted rates and lured unsuspecting buyers with the promise of profitable deals, officials said here.

The accused were arrested near CST Road in Kalina, Santacruz East, after police laid a trap based on specific inputs.

A case was registered at BKC police station under Sections 318(4) and 3(5) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS). During the investigation, police used technical surveillance and local sources to track the suspects.

Further investigation revealed that the suspects have cases of cheating registered against them in Maharashtra and Gujarat.

also supplied its copy to the Jail Authorities on the direction of the Court.

Tahawwur Rana, 64, a Pakistani-origin Canadian businessman, is allegedly a close associate of 26/11 Mumbai terror attacks main conspirator David Coleman Headley alias Daood Gilani, a US citizen. The court had earlier also dismissed the application of Rana seeking to talk with his family members.

A group of 10 Pakistani terrorists went on a rampage in Mumbai in November 2008, carrying out a coordinated attack on a railway station, two luxury

hotels and a Jewish centre, after they sneaked into Mumbai using the sea route in the Arabian Sea. About 166 people were killed due in this assault.

Rana is accused of conspiring with Headley and operatives of designated terrorist organisations to carry out the three-day terror siege of India's financial capital.

The US Supreme Court last month dismissed the review petition of Rana, a key accused in the 2008 terror attacks, against his extradition and cleared the way for his transfer to Indian custody.

SPP in Mumbai's Kukreja murder case not paid his fees

Mumbai, June 4 (UNI) Mumbai's special public prosecutor Pradeep Gharat, hired to represent the police in the Jhanvi Kukreja murder case, on Wednesday claimed that neither the state government nor the police has paid him his legal fees since 2021 when the trial began.

As per the prosecution, 19-year-old Kukreja was assaulted by her boyfriend, Shree Jogdhankar, 23, and his friend, Diya Padalkar, 19, on the night of December 31, 2020, during the New Year party on the rooftop of the eight-floor building in a city suburb.

Talking to UNI, Gharat said he was appointed SPP in 2021 and since then he has been representing the Mumbai police and the

prosecution, but so far he has not received any payment for his services.

He said he has written thrice to the police in-charge handling the matter and has also sent messages, but has not received any response.

On Tuesday he moved an application in the court seeking permission to withdraw himself from the case, but the court turned down his plea saying that the trial was at a crucial juncture and that the court cannot allow such a plea by the prosecution.

However, the court directed the police to consider the SPP's request expeditiously.

The case is posted for hearing on June 16 for further proceedings.

Indian Women's Hockey Team to open their Asia Cup 2025 campaign against Thailand



New Delhi, June 4 (UNI) The Indian Women's Hockey Team is set to kick off their Women's Asia Cup 2025 campaign against Thailand on September 5.

The Indian Team has been placed in Pool B, alongside defending Asia Cup champions Japan, Thailand, and Singapore, while Pool A consists of hosts China, Korea, Malaysia, and Chinese Taipei.

The tournament is set to take place in Hangzhou, China, from September 5 to 14.

Team India, which claimed the Bronze medal in the previous edition, will be eyeing the top podium finish this time. A victory not only brings continental glory but also guarantees a direct qualification to the 2026 Women's FIH Hockey World Cup, as the Asia Cup champions earn an automatic berth in the prestigious quadrennial event.

Speaking on the tournament, India Captain Salima Tete said, "We are excited to begin our campaign in the Women's

Asia Cup. Being placed in Pool B alongside defending champions Japan will test our skills and character from the very start. However, facing them in the pool stage will be a great opportunity to measure ourselves early in the tournament. Our focus will be on playing smart, disciplined hockey and taking it one match at a time. The ultimate goal is to lift the trophy and earn a direct spot in the 2026 Women's FIH Hockey World Cup."

Echoing Salima's sentiments, Vice Captain Navneet Kaur said, "It will be a challenging tournament with Asia's top teams competing with each other, but we see it as a chance to bring out our best right from the first whistle. We've been training with intensity and purpose, and we will aim to execute our plans on the field during the tournament. Playing against Japan in the group stage gives us an early look at high-pressure hockey, which can only help us grow stronger as a unit. We're determined to make

this Asia Cup campaign count and make the country proud."

Notably, the Indian Women's Hockey Team last won the Asia Cup back in 2017, when they defeated China in the Final to lift the title.

The phrase — which had long been a hopeful chant among RCB supporters — has now become a triumphant anthem for a team that finally ended its 18-year wait for an IPL crown.

"This is not just for the players or someone like me who has been here for 18 years," Kohli said, his voice emotional. "This is for all of you — the people of this wonderful city, who have supported RCB through all these years."

The scenes at the stadium were jubilant, with fans waving flags, chanting team slogans and cheering for their heroes as the RCB squad displayed the coveted trophy.

Kohli, who has been the face of the franchise since 2008, was at the centre of the celebrations — a fitting image for a player whose loyalty and passion have defined the spirit of RCB.

Vijay Mallya hails Virat Kohli's 18-year loyalty

Spain beat England to qualify for Nations League finals

Barcelona, June 4 (UNI) : Two second-half goals from substitute Claudia Pina saw Spain overturn a 1-0 halftime deficit to beat England 2-1 in Group C of the UEFA Women's Nations League.

The victory secures Spain's place in the competition's finals in late October, while dashing England's hopes of progression.

England needed a win to advance to the finals and was on track at halftime, but Pina's introduction turned the 2023 World Cup final rematch on its head, as she worked space to score with a left-foot shot to level things up in the 60th minute just after coming on as a substitute on Tuesday. A draw would have been enough for Spain to qualify, but the Barcelona forward ended any doubts with 20 minutes left to play, cutting inside and scoring with a 25-meter shot that went in off the inside of the post.

After Pina's double, Spain controlled the ball and England was never able to get the possession they needed to try to get

back into the match.

Spain started the game strongly and England goalkeeper Hannah Hampton - who looks set to be first choice in the upcoming European Championship after Mary Earps' retirement - made a fine reflex stop to deny Esther Gonzalez after a corner had dropped invitingly for the Spain forward. Gonzalez forced another chance moments later, pressuring Leah Williamson into an error, but chipping wide with Hampton stranded off her line.

Spain was quick and aggressive and England was unable to get out of their half until the 22nd minute. Salma Paralluelo slipped under a challenge and Niamh Charles slid a fine pass in for Alessia Russo to get in behind the Spain defense and put the ball past Cata Coll to put England ahead. Charles and England had a big let-off moments later when the left-back seemed to handle in the area, but the referee failed to see it and there was no VAR to correct the decision.

RCB's triumphant return marred by stampede

Bengaluru, June 4 (UNI) : A bittersweet blend of jubilation and sorrow swept across Bengaluru on Wednesday as Royal Challengers Bengaluru (RCB) returned home with their maiden IPL title, even as a tragic stampede outside the M Chinnaswamy Stadium earlier in the day claimed 11 lives.

The stampede occurred outside the stadium prior to the event, leaving 11 dead and 33 injured, chief minister Siddaramiah said.

While no reference was made to the incident during the felicitation or fan interaction, it is believed the players were unaware of the unfolding tragedy at the time. Thousands of jubilant fans had gathered near the

gates of the stadium since early morning, hoping to catch a glimpse of their favourite players and the trophy. The situation spiralled out of control when the surging crowd overwhelmed entry points, triggering a deadly stampede.

"Thirty-three people have been injured, with 47 reported to have sustained varying levels of trauma initially. Some were discharged after treatment," the Chief Minister stated, adding that all injured individuals would receive free medical care. The city had erupted in celebration as the newly-crowned champions were felicitated by the Karnataka government at the Vidhana Soudha. Chief Minister

Siddaramaiah received the long-awaited trophy celebration. Inside a packed stadium, RCB players took centre stage atop the gallery, proudly flaunting the golden IPL trophy. Addressing the thunderous fans, Kohli declared: "It's no more 'Ee Salaa Cup Namde', it's 'Ee Salaa Cup Namdu'. We have done it — not just for the players or someone like me who has been here 18 years, but for all of you, the people of this

wonderful city."

The team then took a victory lap, with Rajat Patidar, Krunal Pandya, Dinesh Karthik and others joining in the celebrations. Police personnel and organisers worked to manage the surging crowd and enthusiastic camerapersons. The open-top bus parade from Vidhana Soudha to the stadium, originally scheduled as part of the victory procession, was shelved due to security

reasons.

RCB's maiden title win ends an 18-year wait and marks a crowning moment for both the franchise and star batsman Kohli, who has remained a loyal servant of the team since the IPL's inception in 2008. But as the fireworks lit up the sky and chants of "RCB" echoed through the night, Bengaluru remained painfully aware of the human cost that marred what should have been a wholly joyous homecoming.

World Aquatics

adopts bylaw against doping enablers

Geneva, June 4 (UNI) : World Aquatics has adopted a new bylaw aimed at protecting sport from doping, swimming's global governing body has announced following a meeting in Lausanne, Switzerland. "Under the new Bylaw, individuals who support, endorse, or participate in sporting events that embrace the use of scientific advancements or other practices that may include prohibited substances and/or prohibited methods will not be eligible to hold positions with World Aquatics or to participate in any World Aquatics competitions, events, or other activities," World Aquatics said in a statement on Tuesday.

Teenager Roman earns Chile call-up

Santiago, June 4 (UNI) : Uncapped Atletico Mineiro teenager Ivan Roman has been drafted into Chile's squad for World Cup qualifiers against Argentina and Bolivia, the Chilean football association said.

The 18-year-old replaces 36 year-old Universidad de Chile midfielder Charles Aranguiz, who was cut from the squad due to a leg muscle injury.

Roman, who has represented Chile at youth level, has had limited opportunities at Atletico Mineiro with just two league appearances since joining the Brazilian top flight club in February.

Chile will meet Argentina in Santiago on June 5 and Bolivia in El Alto five days later.

The Roja is currently last in the 10-team South American group and is seeking to win both matches to have an outside chance of securing a berth at next year's World Cup in the United States, Mexico and Canada.

Brazil feeling Ancelotti effect

Rio De Janeiro, June 4 (UNI) : Defender Marquinhos has praised the early impact of Carlo Ancelotti on Brazil's national team, expressing confidence that the newly appointed manager can inject a spark into the squad as it prepares for crucial World Cup qualifiers. Ancelotti, who officially took charge last week after leaving Real Madrid, will lead Brazil for the first time on Thursday when the Selecao confronts Ecuador in Guayaquil.

Five days later, Brazil will host Paraguay in Sao Paulo. Wins in both matches will all but secure the five-time world champion a place at the 2026 FIFA World Cup in the United States, Mexico and Canada. Brazil currently sits fourth in South America's qualifying standings, with the top six teams earning

direct entry. "The expectations, desire and ambition are the best possible," Marquinhos told a news conference from Brazil's training base in Teresopolis, near Rio de Janeiro, on Tuesday.

"The new manager has already shown the strength he has and what he can do in football, the intelligence he has. That's what the national team needs."

The 31-year-old said the squad had already begun to respond to the Italian's leadership and charisma.

"You can see already that Carlo brings a certain energy," the former Corinthians and Roma player said. "There is a feeling of something new and that something is coming. This short period before the [2026] World Cup is going to be very important." But it's just a

start and we know that everything will depend on what we do on the pitch. When we start winning we can also get the fans and the press on our side and everything will be easier. Hopefully this good energy can help us to get the job done on the pitch."

Marquinhos arrived in Brazil less than three days after captaining Paris Saint-Germain to its first-ever UEFA Champions League title with a 5-0 victory over Inter Milan at Allianz Arena in Munich. "My voice is coming back a little now. But these were days and nights of great emotion," he said. "I think it's worth mentioning that Paris believed in a project for 12 years, even back when it seemed distant. Having managed to achieve a goal in such a way was very special. Being part of that was gratifying."

Thereafter, he will lay the foundation stone, inaugurate and dedicate to the nation multiple development projects worth over Rs 46,000 crore at Katra.

Chenab and Anji rail bridges The architectural marvel Chenab Rail Bridge, situated at a height of 359 meters above the river, is the world's highest railway arch bridge. It is a 1,315-metre-long steel arch bridge engineered to withstand seismic and wind conditions. A key impact of the bridge will be in enhancing connectivity between Jammu and Srinagar. Through Vande

Bharat train moving on the bridge, it will take just about 3 hours to travel between Katra and Srinagar, reducing existing travel time by 2-3 hours. The Anji Bridge is India’s first cable-stayed rail bridge that will serve the nation in a challenging terrain. Connectivity projects and other development initiatives Prime Minister will also dedicate Udhampur-Srinagar-Baramulla Rail Link (USBRL) project to the nation. The 272 km long USBRL project, constructed worth around Rs 43,780 crore includes 36 tunnels (spanning 119 km) and 943 bridges. The project establishes all-weather, seamless rail connectivity between the Kashmir Valley and the rest of the country aiming to transform regional mobility and driving socio-economic integration. Prime Minister will also flag off two Vande Bharat Express trains from Shri Mata Vaishno Devi Katra to Srinagar and back. They will offer a swift, comfortable, and reliable

travel option for residents, tourists, pilgrims among others. In a major boost to last mile connectivity especially in border areas, Prime Minister will lay the foundation stone and inaugurate various road projects. He will lay the foundation stone of road widening project from Rafiabad to Kupwara on National Highway-701 and the construction of Shopian bypass road on NH-444 worth over Rs 1,952 crore. He will also inaugurate two flyover projects at Sangrama Junction on National Highway-1 in Srinagar and at Bemina Junction on National Highway-44. These projects will ease traffic congestion and enhance traffic flow for the commuters. Prime Minister will also lay the foundation stone of Shri Mata Vaishno Devi Institute of Medical Excellence in Katra worth over Rs 350 crore. It will be the first medical college in Reasi district contributing substantially to the healthcare infrastructure in the region.

Sajad Lone accuses NC of 'only going after Kashmiris'

The Chief Minister said that such an attitude is "unwarranted and undesirable," adding that it is not in the country's interest.

He said for the first time in world history, a government is sending its nominees across the globe to tell everyone that they have emerged victorious in a war. Mann said there is no need to tell anyone about the victory as the triumph is self-speaking.

Minister of Railways Approved the Project of Miraj Chord Line at Cost of Rs 128.78 Crores

Mumbai, June 4 : In a major step towards enhancing rail connectivity and freight movement efficiency, the Minister of Railways, Shri Ashwini Vaishnaw, has approved the sanction of the Miraj Chord Line (1.73 km) project under Central Railway at an estimated cost of Rs 128.78 crores. This strategic initiative, proposed under the umbrella of Multi tracking/Flyover/Bypass Line Capacity Augmentation, aims to significantly ease train operations at Miraj Junction, a key interchange point connecting routes such as Miraj–Pune, Miraj–Kolhapur, Miraj–Pandharpur, and Miraj–Londa. Currently, trains arriving from Kurduwadi or Hubballi and heading towards Kolhapur experience an average detention time of 120 minutes due to engine or brakevan reversal at Miraj. The proposed chord line will remove these operational delays, thereby improving network efficiency. This is a significant step forward in strengthening the railway infrastructure in Western Maharashtra and will pave the way for more efficient goods and passenger train operations in the region. This fulfils long standing demand of Passenger for speedier travel from Miraj to Kolhapur.

non-AC category, from 24 May to 2 June, an average of 118,567 tickets were booked online daily. Of these, 4,724 tickets — about 4% — were booked within the first minute, while 20,786 tickets — about 17.5% — were booked in the second minute. Approximately 66.4% of tickets were sold within the first 10 minutes after the window opened. Additionally, approximately 84.02% of tickets were sold within the first hour of the window opening, with the remaining tickets sold over the next 10 hours. This clearly shows that Tatkal tickets are made available to passengers through the online system, and around 12% of Tatkal tickets are still booked 8 to 10 hours after the window opens. The railways have launched a campaign

against the use of automated tools to book tickets online, employing artificial intelligence for this effort. Through special monitoring efforts, the railways have deactivated and blocked over 24 million users in the past six months. Additionally, around 2 million other accounts have been flagged as suspicious and are under investigation based on their Aadhaar and other documents. Currently, there are more than 130 million active subscribers on the IRCTC website, of which only 12 million are Aadhaar-verified. IRCTC has decided to conduct special verification for all accounts that are not authenticated with Aadhaar. Accounts found to be suspicious will be closed. The railways aim to ensure that genuine passengers receive all type of Tatkal tickets. Account holders who link their accounts with Aadhaar will get priority booking during the first 10 minutes of Tatkal ticket sales. Even authorized IRCTC agents are not allowed to book tickets within the first 10 minutes of the Tatkal window opening. Therefore, it has become necessary to verify your IRCTC account through Aadhaar. The Railways is planning to make the Tatkal ticketing process more robust by making some of the rules more stringent, like only Aadhar verified accounts will be allowed to book online Tatkal tickets, Aadhar based OTP authentication shall also be required for booking. Sources said that counter based tatkal ticket may also be booked after Aadhar verification to control malpractices.
