In a post on X, Mr Stalin he has given a memorandum through Chief Secretary N Muruganandam and it would submitted to Mr Modi by Mr Thennarasu.

In another post, Mr Stalin said he held discussions with Mr Muruganandam via video conferencing today on submitting a memorandum listing out various developmental projects that needs to be implemented and gave the nod for submitting it to Mr Modi during his visit. DMK Lok Sabha MP Ms Kanimozhi and Secretaries of the Chief Minister will be present on the occasion", he added.

## Puducherry to begin simultaneous counselling for NEET, non-NEET courses in August

Puducherry, July 26 (IANS) : In a significant departure from previous years, the Centralised Admission Committee (CENTAC) of the Union Territory of Puducherry will conduct counselling for both NEET and non-NEET courses simultaneously, starting in the first week of August. The move comes in response to increasing pressure to meet the August 14 admission deadline mandated by the All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE) for engineering and allied programmes.Students and parents have expressed concern over the delay in the counselling schedule, prompting CENTAC to streamline the process this year.CENTAC convenor Cheryl Shivan said, "CENTAC is currently awaiting a government notification on the proposed 10 per cent reservation for government school students in non-NEET courses."

While the reservation is already in place for MBBS and other NEET-based programmes, Chief Minister N. Rangasamy had announced in the Legislative Assembly that it would be extended to non-NEET courses as well.

Sources said the proposal is currently being approved by the Cabinet.

The Chief Minister and several ministers have already signed the file, and the remaining approvals are expected soon.

The final clearance from Lt. Governor K. Kailashnathan will be issued via the e-office system, ensuring no delay due to his physical absence.Once the notification is released, the seat matrix for non-NEET courses will be finalised, and the admission process will begin."Given the tight timeline, we will conduct engineering counselling alongside NEET admissions this year," Shivan confirmed.

Traditionally, non-NEET counselling would begin only after MBBS admissions to avoid overlapping and multiple rounds of sliding. However, the time constraints have necessitated a concurrent schedule.The seat matrix for NEET courses is currently being prepared, and the draft merit list will be published on the CENTAC website on August 1.Candidates will have two to three days to raise objections before the final merit list is released. As for non-NEET courses, the merit list is already ready, but the final seat matrix hinges on the government's decision on the 10 per cent quota.

"To save time, we have developed multiple versions of the seat matrix - including options for students who studied in government schools from Classes 1 to 12 or Classes 6 to 9," Shivan added.

## World seeing its growth in India, Centre committed to modernise TN : PM Modi

## Private hospitals using patients as ATM machine: Allahabad High Court

Prayagraj, July 26 (UNI) : The Allahabad High Court has made sharp remarks on private hospitals and nursing homes, saying they use patients as ATM machines to make money.

The court refused to give relief to a doctor accused of medical negligence in a 2008 case, in which a foetus died due to alleged delay in surgery. The order was given by a bench of Justice Prashant Kumar while dismissing the petition of Dr Ashok Kumar Rai of Uttar Pradesh's Deoria district.

A case was registered on July 27, 2007 in which it was alleged that the pregnant wife of the complainant's younger brother was admitted to Dr Rai's nursing home. The family had agreed to a cesarean at 11 am, but the surgery was done at 5:30 pm, by then the fetus had died. It is alleged that when the family objected, the nursing home staff and colleagues beat them up.

The FIR also stated that the doctor took Rs 8,700 and demanded ?10,000 more. The doctor also refused to issue a discharge slip. The doctor moved the High Court seeking quashing of the entire proceedings.

The court after hearing the two sides refused to rely on the report of the medical board as it found that crucial documents such as operation theatre notes were not produced before the board. The court also found that the anaesthetist was called around 3.30 pm, indicating that the hospital lacked preparation and facilities.

"It is a case of pure accident where the doctor admitted the patient and did not perform the operation on time even after taking permission from the patient's family members for the operation as they did not have the requisite doctor (i.e. anaesthetist) to perform the surgery," the judge remarked.

The court cited Supreme Court judgments such as Dr Suresh Gupta vs State of Delhi and Jacob Mathew vs State of Punjab to hold that the protection afforded to doctors applies only when a professional has performed his duty efficiently.

The bench emphasised that criminal liability arises if ordinary care is not exercised by a doctor while treating a patient. The court termed it a "classic" case where the operation was delayed by 4-5 hours without any reason and the post-mortem report cited the cause of death of the foetus as "prolonged labour pain". The court said this fact clearly showed the doctor's intent to deceive the patient.The court also acknowledged that medical professionals should be protected from frivolous suits, but reiterated that this protection would apply only if the medical professional has performed his duty efficiently.

# TEMA India Ltd. Commissions India’s First Private Test Facility for Depleted Heavy Water Upgradation

Mumbai, July 26 : In a significant advancement for India’s nuclear self-reliance, Director - Technical, NPCIL, Mr Rajesh V and Director, Chemical Engineering Group, BARC, Mr K. T. Shenoy inaugurated the country’s first-of-its-kind private test facility for the upgradation of depleted heavy water, commissioned by TEMA India Ltd. This state-of-the-art facility, designed and built by TEMA India’s nuclear vertical under technology transfer from BARC and a Purchase Order from NPCIL, marks a milestone achievement being realised for the first time in the private sector. The development is firmly aligned with the Prime Minister’s Atma-Nirbhar

Bharat initiative.Until now, critical testing infrastructure for heavy water distillation components existed solely within BARC. Speaking at the event, Mr Rajesh V and Shri K. T. Shenoy commended TEMA India’s technical acumen, commitment to quality, and its growing role as a trusted partner in India’s nuclear energy program. The dignitaries also flagged off the first validated consignment of eight Distillation Column sections, comprising activated phosphor bronze modules, critical components for Pressurized Heavy Water Reactors (PHWRs). These modules, having undergone rigorous in-house performance testing, are slated for deployment in key nuclear power projects: RAPP Unit 8, GHAVP Units 1–4, and

KAIGA Units 5 & 6. This initiative exemplifies the spirit of Atma-Nirbhar Bharat, which calls for greater self-reliance in high-tech, strategic sectors. By designing, manufacturing, and validating nuclear components entirely in-house, India reduces reliance on imported equipment and external test infrastructure. It also helps build domestic capability, confidence, and long-term resilience, empowering Indian firms to contribute meaningfully to national energy security goals. The event also included a traditional pooja, tree plantation, and a ceremonial dispatch of the first module shipment, symbolising the entry of India’s private sector into advanced nuclear component validation.

# Accident on Mumbai- Pune Expressway leaves one dead, 17 injured

Alibaug, July 26 (UNI) : One person was killed and more than 17 others were injured after a container heading towards Mumbai in the Khandala Ghat area rammed into 15 to 16 vehicles. The Preliminary information said that the container coming from Pune towards Mumbai, lost its brakes on the steep slope of Khandala Ghat. As a result, the driver lost control of the vehicle and it continued moving forward, crashing into multiple vehicles in front of it. The container collided with one vehicle after another over a stretch of one and a half to two kilometers, severely damaging several small vehicles. The local rescue teams and police reached the scene. They rescued the injured from the damaged vehicles and transported them to hospitals in Khopoli and Panvel. One passenger has died in the accident, and several others have sustained serious injuries, police said. Police said that more than 17 people were injured and they have been admitted to the municipal hospital in Khopoli.

Srinagar, July 26 (UNI) : On the Kargil Vijay Diwas anniversary, Army Chief General Upendra Dwivedi said that Operation Sindoor was not just a military action, but a reflection of India’s firm resolve, a clear message and a decisive response to Pakistan. He warned that any attempt to destabilize India would be met with a forceful response.Addressing the 26th Kargil Vijay Diwas celebrations at Drass, Ladakh, the Army Chief said that Operation Sindoor was a continuation of the tradition of Operation Vijay in 1999, which was fought in Kargil. “In 1999, India achieved an unparalleled victory under Operation Vijay, driving out Pakistani soldiers and infiltrators from high-altitude posts, and hoisting the tricolour over the snowy peaks. At that time, we made it clear that no one would be allowed to harm the unity and integrity of India,” the Army Chief said. “Continuing this tradition, even during Operation Sindoor, the Indian Army, with the same courage and determination, targeted terrorist infrastructure in Pakistan and achieved a decisive victory by disrupting their offensive operations,” the Army Chief said.General

Dwivedi said that India gave peace a chance, but Pakistan responded with cowardice, referring to the terrorist attack in Pahalgam. He emphasized that India answered this act of terror with courage and decisive action. “Operation Sindoor was our resolve, our message, and our answer to the cowardly terrorist attack in Pahalgam, which left a deep wound on the entire nation,” he said. “India did not just mourn; but decided to respond decisively.” Detailing the events of the strike, the Army Chief said,“On the night of May 6 and 7, the Indian Army attacked nine high-value terror targets in Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied territory, without harming any innocent civilians. This was not just a response—it was a clear message that those who support terrorism will not be spared.” Highlighting the preparedness and coordination of India’s forces, he said that the Pakistan Army’s response was given a sound, precise, and decisive reply. “Our Army and air defence stood like a wall—unbreachable by drone or missile. All this was accomplished through a whole-of-nation approach, where ground forces, air

forces, and various government, private departments, and NGOs stood together,” he said. General Dwivedi reaffirmed that any force conspiring to harm India's sovereignty, integrity, and people will continue to receive a befitting response in the future too. “This is the new normal of India,” he said. Reaffirming India’s commitment to peace with strength, Army Chief said, “We are peaceful, but not weak. We are determined, vigilant, and always prepared.” On strengthening the Army for the future, General Dwivedi said that today’s Indian Army is not only confronting ongoing challenges but is also evolving into a transformative, modern, and future-ready force. He announced the formation of a new integrated combat formation named ‘Rudra’ All-Arms Brigade, which he said has been sanctioned just a day before.“ This brigade will bring together infantry, mechanized infantry, armoured units, artillery, special forces, and unmanned aerial systems into a single cohesive strike force— supported by integrated logistics and combat support units,” the Army Chief said.

# CM, Bhajan Lal announces renovation of dilapidated school buildings in Rajasthan

Jaipur, Jul 26 (UNI) : Alerted by the tragic deaths of seven children in a ceiling collapse at a government school in Piplodi (Jhalawar), Rajasthan Chief Minister Bhajan Lal Sharma remained in action mode, taking a series of decisions to reinforce dilapidated school buildings across the state. Based on feedback regarding the condition of school buildings and the need for repair or renovation, the Chief Minister held a review meeting via video conferencing with all district collectors on Friday. Following the meeting, Sharma on Saturday announced an augmentation of funds for the repair and renovation of school infrastructure. "The state government has decided to repair or renovate buildings as needed, on a priority basis,"

an official spokesperson said, adding that the Chief Minister had ordered an increase in the quantum of grants and liberalized the norms for sanctioning funds to schools for this purpose. Sharma also announced an increase in the grant limit for repairs to buildings of government establishments, including schools and anganwadi centers, under the Daang, Magra, and Mewat Regional Development Schemes—from 15 per cent to 20 per cent. In addition, all MLAs in the state will now be permitted to allocate funds from the MLALAD scheme for the repair of government institutions, schools, and anganwadis, irrespective of the scheme under which they were originally constructed. They may now earmark up to 20% of their annual allocation for such

repairs.Going beyond party lines, Chief Minister Sharma appealed to all MLAs in Rajasthan to prioritize the repair of school and anganwadi buildings in their recommendations.Meanwhile, a pall of gloom prevailed over Piplodi and the Manohar Thana block of Jhalawar as the cremation of the seven children who died in the school ceiling collapse was carried out by villagers with heavy hearts. Former Chief Minister Vasundhara Raje, whose son Dushyant Singh represents the Jhalawar parliamentary constituency in the Lok Sabha, visited Piplodi and Manohar Thana yesterday evening to offer condolences to the families of the deceased children. She also visited the accident site and hospitals to meet the injured children. The two-time former CM

and former MP from the Jhalawar constituency also met the bereaved families. Grieved by the incident, Raje appealed to everyone—particularly Opposition parties—to refrain from politicizing the tragedy."This is a sad situation. No one should indulge in politics over the deaths of children. There will be many other opportunities for politics," she said.Opposition Congress state president Govind Singh Dotasra echoed similar sentiments. This comes against the backdrop of criticism by some political activists who blamed government apathy and negligence by school staff for the mishap. Many Congress leaders, including Dotasra and members of the PUCL (Rajasthan chapter), even demanded the resignation of Education Minister Madan Dilawar.

# Security forces kill 3 JJMP operatives in Gumla forest

Ranchi, July 26 (UNI) : Three members of the banned Jharkhand Jan Mukti Parishad (JJMP) were killed in an exchange of fire with security forces in the forested area near Lava Dag under Ghaghra police station limits in Gumla district on Saturday morning. According to the police, Superintendent of Police Haris Bin Zama had received intelligence on 25 July regarding the presence of JJMP cadres in the region. The group was reportedly moving through the hilly terrain, allegedly with the intention of executing an attack. Following the input, a joint operation team comprising personnel from the Gumla district police and Jharkhand Jaguar was formed under the leadership of the Sub-Divisional Police Officer, Gumla. In the early hours of 26 July, the team came under fire during a search operation. The police returned fire in what they described as an act of self-defence. Three JJMP operatives were killed in the encounter. One of the deceased has been identified as Dilip Lohra, who, according to police, held the rank of sub-zonal commander within the outfit. The identities of the other two are yet to be confirmed. The security forces recovered one AK-47 rifle and two INSAS rifles from the site. An SLR and a quantity of ammunition were also seized. A search operation is underway in the surrounding areas. The police said the operation involved personnel from Ghaghra, Bishunpur and Gumla police stations along with Jharkhand Jaguar. The district police said further verification and follow-up action are in progress.

# Labourer dies in a explosion in Lote MIDC Ratnagiri

Ratnagiri, Jul 26 (UNI) A labourer working in the Vinati Organic company in Lote MIDC of Ratnagiri, was killed today in an explosion which led to break out fire in company. According to police, an explosion occurred at the Vinati Organic company this evening, which lead to a big fire. In this incident a labourer, who identified as Sameer Khedekar of Ghanekunt village near Lote, was killed on the spot.After receiving the information, Lote police and fire-brigade personnel rushed to the spot to contain the fire.Meanwhile, police are also investigating whether security protocols were followed by the company owners.



## CM stresses money influence in politics should be curtailed

Earlier, the Chief Minister conferred S Jaipal Reddy Democracy Award to Mohan Guruswamy, prominent author, thought leader and policy advisor and said that Guruswamy has been an inspiration to many. The CM also gave away various awards for personalities who did remarkable service to the society.

PM Modi’s visit to Maldives, attending the 60th Independence Day celebrations signals reset in bilateral ties

Prime Minister Narendra Modi today attended the 60th Independence Day celebrations of the Maldives as Guest of Honour at the Republic Square. The event included a 21-gun salute, a military drill by the Maldives National Defence Force, parades by the National Cadet Corps, and cultural performances by school children.

PM Modi’s participation, the first by an Indian prime minister at the event, underscored the reset in the bilateral ties. The visit builds on Maldivian President Mohamed Muizzu’s October 2024 India trip, where the Joint Vision for a Comprehensive Economic and Maritime Security Partnership was adopted, indicating a willingness to prioritize cooperation.

PM Modi’s Maldives visit also marks the first by a foreign head of state since President Mohamed Muizzu took office in November 2023.

The two-day state visit of PM Modi is seen as a pivotal moment in resetting the India-Maldives relations strained by earlier tensions. The visit also coincides with the 60th anniversary of diplomatic ties, established in 1965 when India was among the first to recognize Maldives’ independence.

On Friday, on his arrival, PM Modi was received warmly at Velana International Airport by President Muizzu, Foreign Minister Abdulla Khaleel, Defence Minister Ghassan Maumoon, Finance Minister Mohamed Shafeeq, and Minister of Homeland Security Ali Ihusan.

The streets of Malé were adorned with Indian flags and banners along major roads and the Republic Square. The Indian diaspora also made a beeline to have a glimpse of Prime Minister Modi near the airport, waving the Indian Tricolour and chanting “Vande Mataram”. PM Modi posted on X, “A warm welcome in Maldives. Our strong ties will benefit both our peoples.”

The visit has helped address a diplomatic rift from January 2024, when three Maldivian deputy ministers made derogatory remarks about PM Modi’s Lakshadweep visit, triggering a “Boycott Maldives” campaign in India. Indian tourist arrivals dropped 33% in 2024, pushing India from the top tourist market to sixth. Meanwhile, the arrival of Chinese tourists almost tripled, riding on the cozy relation that Muizzu exhibited with the Chinese leadership.

Maldivian President Mohamed Muizzu visited India in October 2024, marking a thaw in the ties. His presidential campaign was based on the “India Out” slogan, demanding zero presence of Indian defence personnel on the island nation. India has since replaced the defence personnel manning the Dornier aircraft, gifted by India, with technical staff.

PM Modi’s presence in the Maldivian capital signals a reset, and renewed cooperation.

The Indian Prime Minister held a series of meetings with senior political leaders across party lines reflecting a close and non-bias intent for improving the relationship. On the first day, PM Modi met Vice-President Hussain Mohamed Latheef to discuss trade, infrastructure, and maritime security. He posted on X, “Met Vice President Uz. Hussain Mohamed Latheef. Our talks covered key aspects of India-Maldives friendship.”

At the President’s Office, he signed the visitors’ book and held a restricted bilateral meeting with President Muizzu. During the meeting, the two leaders reviewed the entire gamut of ties including defence, health, and capacity-building initiatives. This was followed by delegation-level talks which also included External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar, National Security Advisor Ajit Doval, and Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri.

The two sides signed four MoUs and three agreements, including a Rs 4,850 crore (\$565 million) Line of Credit for housing, water, and sanitation projects. PM Modi stated, “India and Maldives share a deep bond as geographical and historical neighbors. Our cooperation in development, defence, and maritime security will grow.”

The two leaders also issued a commemorative stamp marking 60 years of diplomatic ties. PM Modi and President Muizzu also inaugurated a new India-funded Ministry of Defence building in Malé. They virtually handed over 3,300 social housing units in Hulhumale, built under India’s Buyers’ Credit.

The two leaders were together for a tree plantation event, as part of PM Modi’s “Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam”, Plant for Mother initiative. In the same venue, the Prime Minister handed over two BHISHM Health Cubes that will be of great relevance in medical emergencies, especially in remote parts of the country.

PM Modi met former presidents and opposition leaders in Male, cutting across party lines, to discuss mutual interests and regional stability. He met former President Mohamed Nasheed, Speaker Abdul Raheem Abdulla, and leaders across political parties. These meetings helped address the lingering effects of the 2024 controversy and the “India Out” campaign, which Muizzu had initially supported.

## Cambodia calls for immediate-unconditional ceasefire with Thailand at UNSC meeting

Phnom Penh, July 26 (UNI) : Cambodia has called for an unconditional immediate ceasefire during a UN Security Council meeting on its dispute with Thailand, and the UNSC members urged both parties for restraint, Cambodian Permanent Representative to the UN Keo Chhea said."Cambodia asked for immediate ceasefire, unconditionally, and we also call for the peaceful solution of the disputes," Chhea told journalists. "Security Council called for both parties to restrain, maximum restraint and resort to diplomatic solution."

Clashes between the two Southeast Asian nations have resulted in at least 32 fatalities, military and civilian, while forcing nearly 200,000 to flee—each government claims the other fired the first shots. While neither country has declared war, the conflict has severely eroded diplomatic ties, with both Bangkok and Phnom Penh refusing to commit to any sort of dialogue just yet.

## Thailand, Cambodia agree to immediately meet for ceasefire talks : Donald Trump

Washington, July 26 (UNI) : US President Donald Trump said on Saturday that his telephone diplomacy led to Thailand and Cambodia agreeing to meet immediately to work out a ceasefire and ultimately a peace deal.

"I just had a very good call with the Prime Minister of Cambodia, and informed him of my discussions with Thailand, and its Acting Prime Minister. Both Parties are looking for an immediate Ceasefire and Peace... They have agreed to immediately meet and quickly work out a Ceasefire and, ultimately, PEACE!" he wrote on Truth Social.

Trump said that the prime ministers were looking to get back to the "trading table" with the United States, which he said was "inappropriate to do until such time as the fighting STOPS." "When all is done, and Peace is at hand, I look forward to concluding our Trading Agreements with both!" Trump said.

## Torrential rains kill 266 in Pakistan in past one month

Islamabad, July 26 (UNI) : Torrential monsoon rain-related incidents have killed 266 people and injured 633 others across Pakistan over the past 30 days, according to data released by the National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) yesterday.

According to the NDMA's latest situation report, no new fatalities were recorded in the past 24 hours, while five injuries were reported. The data covers the period from June 26 to July 25.

Punjab reported the highest number of casualties, with 144 people killed and 493 injured. In the northwestern Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province, 63 people were reported dead and 79 others injured.

Sindh recorded over 25 fatalities and 40 injuries. Meanwhile, 16 deaths and four injuries were reported from Balochistan.

Gilgit-Baltistan and Islamabad reported eight fatalities, while two lost their lives in POK.

Children accounted for a significant proportion of the fatalities nationwide, with 126 reported dead and 209 injured, according to the breakdown provided by the NDMA. Authorities have warned of further rainfall in various regions and are coordinating with provincial governments to carry out relief operations and monitor vulnerable areas amid ongoing rainfall.

## 536 schools in Cambodian border areas closed due to clashes with Thailand

Phnom Penh, July 26 (UNI) : Cambodia said on Saturday that a total of 536 schools in border provinces have been shut down due to an ongoing border conflict between Cambodian and Thai soldiers.

"The closure has affected 130,000 students and teachers," the Ministry of Education, Youth and Sport said in a post on its official Facebook page.Armed clashes between Cambodian and Thai soldiers over disputed border areas broke out on Thursday.

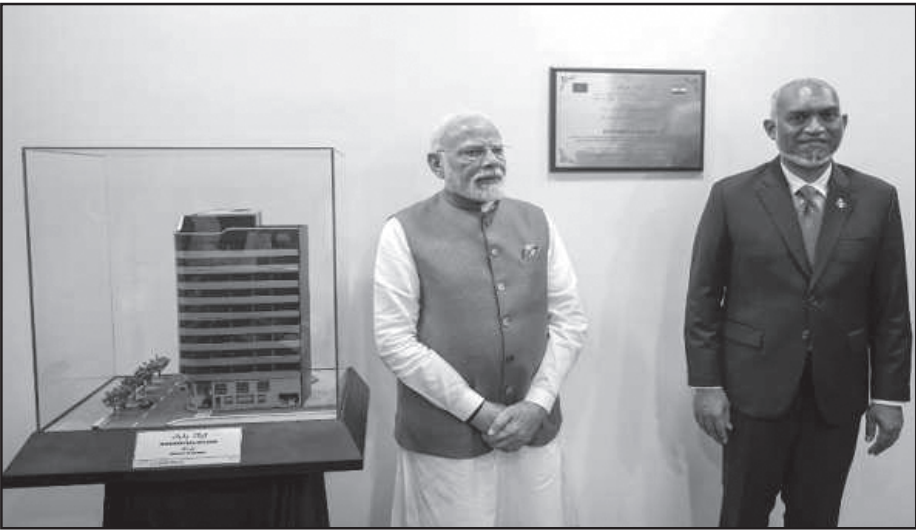
## Japan’s ruling LDP collects enough signatures to discuss accountability of PM Shigeru Ishiba after recent electoral loss

Tokyo, July 26 (UNI) : Japan's ruling Liberal Democratic Party (LDP) has collected enough signatures to call a general meeting that will hold Prime Minister Shigeru Ishiba accountable for the party's recent crushing election loss, local media reported.

LDP rules stipulate that a general meeting be convened within seven days if more than one-third of its parliamentary members request it.

The required number of signatures has been met, Jiji Press reported yesterday, citing an LDP member who leads the signature campaign. Hiroyoshi Sasagawa, a member of the former LDP faction led by former LDP Secretary-General Toshimitsu Motegi, said that he would decide when to submit the signatures after looking at Ishiba's response at a less formal meeting of party lawmakers on July 27 to discuss the outcome of Sunday's House of Councillors election.In a landmark political setback, Japan's ruling coalition has lost its majority in the 248-member upper chamber in Sunday's race. The defeat follows a similar outcome in the 2024 House of Representatives election, leaving the ruling bloc a minority in both chambers of the parliament, a historic first since the LDP's founding in 1955.

# PM Modi, Maldivian President inaugurate MoD building in Male; India delivers two advanced portable hospital units



Male/New Delhi, July 25 (UNI) : Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Maldivian President Mohamed Muizzu today jointly inaugurated the state-of-the-art Ministry of Defence (MoD) building of Maldives in Male.

Overlooking the Indian Ocean, the eleven-storey building is a symbol of the strong and long-standing defence and security cooperation between the two countries, a statement said.The MoD building has been constructed with India's financial assistance and will contribute towards enhancing the capabilities of the defence and law enforcement authorities of Maldives.Following the inauguration of the Dhoshimeynaa Building, the two leaders viewed a model of the building, and learned about its functions and services.Construction

of the building began on 19 February, 2014. The facility will primarily house the Coast Guard division of the Defence Ministry.

India has also formally delivered two advanced portable hospital units to the Maldives, marking a significant enhancement of the island nation's emergency medical response capacity and

reaffirming New Delhi's commitment to regional health cooperation.

Referred to as 'Arogya Maitri Health Cubes', the modular platforms are regarded as the world's first fully transportable hospitals. Each unit includes an intensive care unit (ICU), operation theatre, blood diagnostic equipment, X-ray machine,

and power generator, configured to provide critical care for up to 200 individuals over a 72-hour period.Engineered for maximum mobility, the systems can be deployed by helicopter to remote areas and achieve full operational readiness in just 12 minutes. Supplementary kits and medicines allow

customisation for varied scenarios, supporting a range of emergency situations.Enhancing this capability is the BHISHM app, a digital tool designed to facilitate configuration and monitor equipment inventories. The Maldives Emergency Medical Service, operating under the Ministry of Health, will oversee the integration of the new facilities into Maldives' emergency response framework.

India's assistance to the Maldivian health sector has long reflected a sustained and multifaceted approach. Support has extended to the training of medical personnel, development of urban and atoll-based health infrastructure, and provision of emergency resources, including the expedited supply of Covid-19 vaccines during the pandemic.

# Iranian exiled crown prince Reza Pahlavi says over 50,000 govt officials have joined him to topple Islamic regime

Tehran, July 26 (UNI) : At least 50,000 officials from within Iran's government and military have registered with a secure opposition platform aimed at toppling the Islamic Republic, according to Reza Pahlavi, the exiled son of Iran's last monarch.

Pahlavi, the son of Iran's last monarch overthrown in the 1979 revolution, has long positioned himself as a potential transitional figure in a post-theocratic regime in Iran launched the platform last month, offering defectors from all branches of service- from politics to law and military - a channel to connect and coordinate and formulate strategies for the ouster of the theocratic regime.

Speaking to Politico, he said the figure — though still under verification — points to a growing movement from within Iran's own power structures, who are now seeking regime change.

“These are not just

numbers — they are signals,” Pahlavi said. “We are prioritising key figures in the military and intelligence community. Every week, more join. It's a rigorous process, but the response has been tremendous.”“We estimate over 50,000 so far — and that number continues to grow each week,” he said.

“It's a complex process of verification, but the signals we're receiving are clear. We're prioritising engagement with key individuals in the military and security forces.”

Pahlavi also confirmed that a separate site will soon be launched for ordinary citizens to register their support for the opposition campaign.

The interview comes ahead of a major opposition summit in Munich today, where the exiled crown prince will convene more than 500 exiled dissidents, including activists, artists, intellectuals, and former athletes.He called the event as one of the most diverse

gatherings of Iranian opposition groups outside the country since the revolution.“This conference is about unity,” he said. “It shows the emergence of a broad, committed coalition working toward a democratic, secular Iran.”

Participants in the event titled ‘Convention of National Cooperation’ have endorsed three core principles: preserving Iran's territorial integrity, ensuring equal rights and freedoms for all citizens, and establishing a clear separation between religion and state.Despite his attempts at projecting himself as a transitional figure should the Islamic Republic collapse, Pahlavi has received a lot of criticism over the years, owing to his perceived failure to unite the fractured opposition during his decades abroad, while some also view his royal heritage as a liability in the establishment of a democratic Iran.

Built upon China's open-source foundation models with deep scientific customisation, ScienceOne integrates a suite of proprietary models developed for common scientific data types, while incorporating domain-specialised tools such as AlphaFold and MatterGen.

It demonstrates systematic mastery of core principles, laws, and specialised knowledge across fundamental disciplines including mathematics, physics, chemistry, astronomy, earth science and biology.Evaluations have confirmed its state-of-the-art performance in mathematics, physics, chemistry, materials science and biology, with leading capabilities in scientific tool invocation and reasoning.

ScienceOne further attained excellent results in Humanity's Last Exam (HLE).Based on ScienceOne, the research team also developed two scientific intelligent agents. One is designed to assist researchers in thoroughly reading articles, writing reviews, and evaluating research topics and technical pathways.

## At least 8 killed, 13 wounded in "terror" attack in SE Iran

Tehran, July 26 (UNI) : At least eight people, namely five civilians and three assailants, were killed and 13 others were injured in a "terrorist" attack Saturday morning on the building of the justice department in Iran's southeastern city of Zahedan, the capital of Sistan and Baluchestan province, the semi-official Tasnim news agency reported.Responsibility for the attack has been claimed by Jaish al-Zulm, designated by Iran as a terrorist group, the report said.It added that upon entering the justice department's premises, the "terrorists" opened fire on the people there, stressing that the casualties could further increase.

Iran's Islamic Revolution Guards Corps (IRGC) said in a statement published on its official news outlet Sepah News that its ground forces managed to kill three of the "terrorists."The IRGC added that some of those injured in the attack were in critical condition, giving the assurance that security forces had the situation under control.In remarks to Tasnim, Mohammad-Hassan Mohammadi, head of Zahedan University of Medical Sciences, said all the wounded were transferred to nearby hospitals.Provincial authorities have called on people to stay away from the justice department and the surrounding areas.

Jaish al-Zulm has been involved in many deadly attacks against Iranian security forces and civilians in recent years.

## Russian official says Moscow ready to meet any NATO military encroachment on Kaliningrad with immediate response

Moscow, July 26 (UNI) :Any military encroachment on Russia's Kaliningrad Region will be met with an immediate response using all available forces and means, as provided for by the military doctrine and the principles of Russia's state policy on nuclear deterrence, Russian presidential aide Nikolai Patrushev told Sputnik.

Earlier this month, Gen. Christopher T. Donahue, commanding general of US Army Europe and Africa, said that NATO had sufficient capabilities to neutralise Russia's Kaliningrad region in case of a conflict and had already developed a corresponding plan."We have long been aware of western plans concerning Kaliningrad. I can comment on them in the only possible way. The Kaliningrad region is an integral part of Russia and any military encroachment on it will be met with an immediate and crushing response using all the forces and means at our disposal, as provided for by the military doctrine and the principles of state policy in the area of nuclear deterrence.

## Recipe: Tandoori pomfret

Tandoori Pomfret is a delicious fish delight. Here the exotic flavors of spices all wrapped in the fish and then grill in the oven. Resulting really juicy and scrumptious grilled fish.



### Ingredients:

8 Pomfret fish  
1/4 tsp Turmeric powder  
2 tbsp Red chilli powder  
1 tsp Garam masala powder  
1/2 tsp Carom seeds/ ajwain  
1 tbsp Roasted gram flour/ Besan  
1/2 cup Hung Curd  
Salt to taste  
4 tbsp Mustard oil  
Juice of 1 lemon  
2 tbsp Coriander paste  
1 tsp Ginger-garlic paste

### Directions:

1. Trim tails, fins and other unnecessary things. Then wash it thoroughly.
2. Make incisions on a clean fish. Keep it aside.
3. In a bowl, add all the ingredients mentioned in the ingredient list. Adjust the amount of besan and yogurt to get a nice thick paste.
4. Apply this marinade to the fish on both sides very well.
5. Keep it for at least 30 minutes in the fridge.
6. Preheat the oven to 180 Degree Celsius (356 Degree Fahrenheit).
7. Grease the pan or rack. Place the fish on grill rack and cook it for 15-20 minutes until golden brown.
8. Serve with Onion rings and lemon.

## Recipe: Stuffed tomatoes

A low-cal vegan option that pleases the palate as well  
Preparation time: 15mins  
Cooking time: 15 mins  
Serves: 4

### Ingredients:

4 medium sized tomatoes  
200g boiled potatoes  
100g paneer (cottage cheese)  
1 tbsp desi ghee (clarified butter)  
1 tsp finely chopped green chilies  
1 tsp finely chopped coriander leaves  
½ tsp amchur powder (dry mango powder)  
½ tsp black pepper powder  
1 tsp sendha namak ( rock salt)

### Recipe Method:

Cut off the top of the tomatoes and scoop out the seeds and pulp to get a cavity. Set aside.  
Grate the paneer and the boiled potatoes. Mix in all the other ingredients. Heat the ghee in a pan and add the mixture. Saute for 3-4 minutes stirring continuously. Cool the mixture and stuff in the tomatoes. Grill or bake in a preheated oven at 200 degree centigrade for 10mins. Alternatively you can shallow fry in 1 tbsp till the tomatoes are cooked but firm.

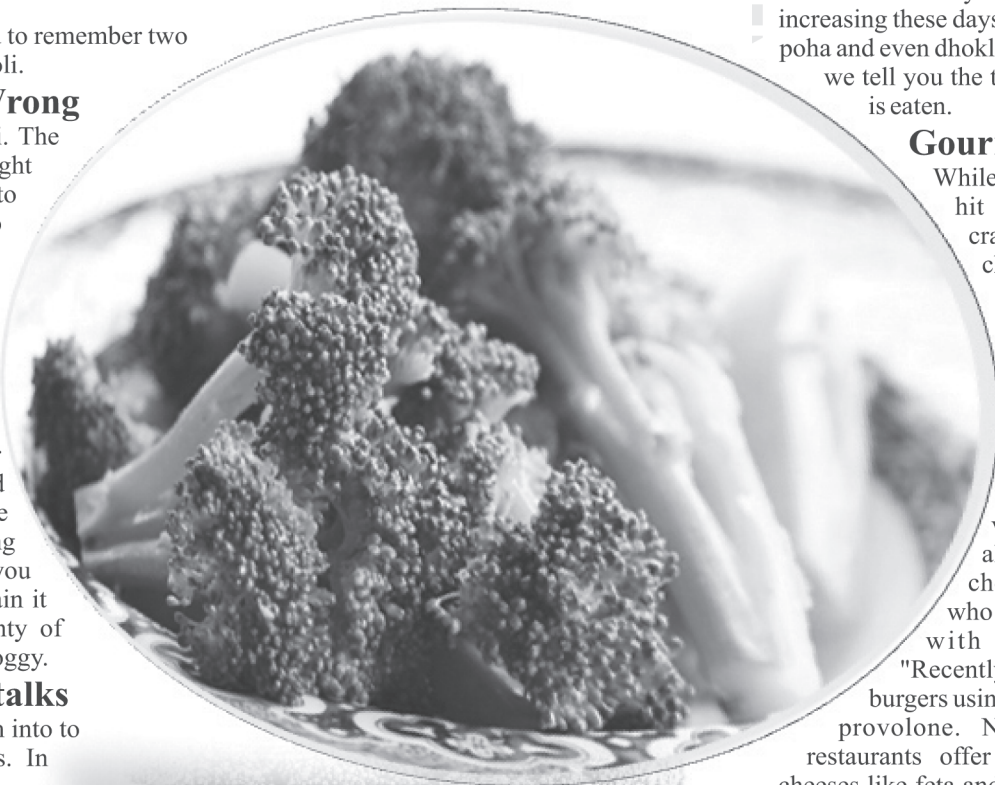
As a beginner you just need to remember two things while tackling broccoli.

1. Dress them with some fresh lemon juice, salt and olive oil. Make sure that it is cooked soft.

actual taste of your cheese. Some cheese already have underlying onion and garlic flavours, it is not advisable to go overboard with the tastes. -Spicy food: Again, a strong spicy taste

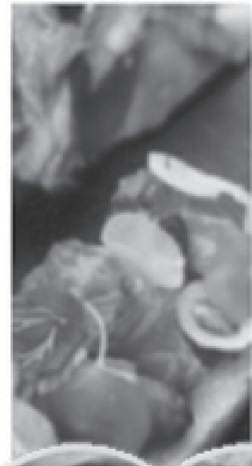

Uganda coach Byekwaso optimistic ahead of African Nations Championship

Kampala, July 25 (UNI) : Uganda coach Morley Byekwaso has said his team is well-prepared ahead of the CAF African Nations Championship (CHAN).

Uganda, Kenya and Tanzania will co-host the tournament for players featuring in their respective domestic leagues from August 2 to 30.

Uganda opens its Group C campaign in the CHAN competition against 2023 finalists Algeria at the Mandela National Stadium in Kampala. Byekwaso made it clear that playing in the same group alongside Algeria, South Africa, Guinea and Niger would represent a tricky task.

"We know what to expect but we must treat every match like a final because the first task is to ensure we make it out of the group and qualify for the knockout stage," Byekwaso explained.

The coach also called upon Ugandan fans to come in large numbers to cheer the team on."Support from the fans will mean a lot for the team," he said.

Barcelona squad departs late for Japan, South Korea

Madrid, July 25 (UNI) : Barcelona's squad has traveled to Asia for a three-match tour of Japan and South Korea with a 24-hour delay after resolving contract problems with the tour promoters.

Shillong Lajong thrash Malaysian Armed Forces 6-0



Shillong, July 26 (IANS) : Shillong Lajong FC kicked off their Durand Cup 2025 campaign in emphatic style, cruising to a 6-0 victory over Malaysia's Armed Forces Football Team in the opening Group E clash on Saturday. Led by braces from Everbrightson Sana and Phrangki Buam, the young Shillong side delivered a commanding performance, with substitutes Treimiki Lamurong and Deibormame Tongper also getting on the scoresheet.

Right from the start, Shillong took control of proceedings with quick passing and relentless pressing. Their dominance paid off in the 12th minute when Sana rose above the Malaysian defense to head home a pinpoint cross from Rudra Ved. The move

originated from a well-worked free-kick routine initiated by Sheen Stevenson, setting the tone for what would be a one-sided contest.

Malaysia had a rare chance to level the score in the first half through Mohamad Syamim Yusoff, who attempted a volley after a clearance from Shillong keeper Siwel Rymbai, but the effort flew just wide. That was as close as the visitors would get, as Shillong maintained their grip on the game.

The second half began with a flurry of goals. Phrangki Buam doubled the lead in the 47th minute, guiding in another precise free-kick delivery from Stevenson. Barely two minutes later, Buam struck again, this time calmly

slotting in a through ball after a slick attacking move to make it 3-0. Sana completed his brace in the 66th minute, turning sharply in the box before finishing clinically past the Malaysian goalkeeper. The fifth goal came courtesy of substitute Treimiki Lamurong, who curled in a stunning strike from the edge of the area in the 73rd minute. In the dying moments of the match, Shillong added a final flourish. Deibormame Tongper, another substitute, finished off a neat attacking play to round off the scoring at 6-0.

This comprehensive victory not only gives Shillong Lajong the perfect start to their Durand Cup campaign but also sends a strong message to the rest of the teams in Group E.

Meghalaya convenes NE inter-state coordination meeting in Shillong

Shillong, July 25 (UNI) : In a significant step toward hosting the 39th National Games in 2027, the Meghalaya government convened a preparatory meeting today in Shillong, bringing together Sports Ministers, senior bureaucrats, and representatives from respective States Olympic Associations from all the North Eastern States.

He added, "I believe that we are fully equipped to host the National Games and we are seeking to foster participation from all the North Eastern states."

Arunachal Pradesh Sports & Youth Affairs Minister, Kento Jini thanked the Meghalaya government for making the other state governments in the region for making us a part of the discussion regarding preparation for hosting the 39th National Games in 2027. "All the northeastern states should cooperate and support in hosting the Games. This is the right time to demonstrate that we are not lagging behind in anything- be it infrastructure, or sporting talent," Jini said.

M e g h a l a y a Commissioner & Secretary, Sports & Youth Affairs, Dr. Vijay Kumar D presented an overview of the state's preparedness, including investments in sports

infrastructure, training centres, hostels, equipment and other athlete support systems.

A major agenda point of the meeting was the proposed distribution of specific sports disciplines across North Eastern States, fostering a shared sense of ownership and integrated development of sports. "The move aims to leverage existing capacities while building new ones, ensuring legacy infrastructure in multiple states even beyond the Games," a Sports official said. Representatives from every state appreciated Meghalaya's overall development and promotion of Sports and showed complete support to the state's roadmap for hosting the 39th National Games, 2027. Meghalaya's preparation for the National Games includes the development of sports infrastructure, healthcare facilities, accommodation and overall nurturing of sports talent.

Over Rs 1500 crore has been invested to develop sports infrastructure across all districts of the state.

With over 10,000 athletes expected to compete across more than thirty disciplines, the 39th National Games will be the largest sporting event ever hosted in Meghalaya.

In his concluding remarks, Warjri emphasised that with collective cooperation, "we can showcase a spirit of unity by successfully hosting this major event."

China sweeps team golds in artistic swimming at World Aquatics Championships

Singapore, July 25 (UNI) : China won the World Aquatics Championships team acrobatic title in artistic swimming today, concluding its campaign with gold medals in all three team events. Performing a routine titled "Soul of the Terracotta Army", the Chinese squad topped the preliminary round with 225.7993 points and carried that momentum into the final, where they scored 229.0186 points to secure the gold. The team finished ahead of Neutral Athletes B (NAB) and Spain. It marked China's fourth gold medal in artistic swimming, with the country sweeping all three team gold medals in this tournament.

"Although we won three gold medals in the team events, I don't think that means we're absolutely dominant," said China's head coach Zhang Xiaohuan. "We're still in the process of exploration. We're also learning from our competitors. There is, in fact, a lot of confusion and anxiety throughout this journey." "Deep down, I have greater expectations in the new Olympic cycle and with the new lineup. I believe this Championships still marked a significant breakthrough for us - the gold medal in the women's solo event was the first in our history, something we had never achieved before," Zhang added.

Earlier on Friday, Spain's Iris Tio Casas and Dennis Gonzalez Boneu scored 323.8563 to win the mixed duet free event gold medal, followed by neutral athletes Aleksandr Maltsev and Olesia Platonova, with only 0.4125 points behind.

Britain's Isabelle Thorpe and Ranjuo Tomblin took the bronze.

"It's the best world championships ever," Tio Casas said. "We are happy that we can finish the season with a happy ending. Probably a lot of people in Spain will see this and we can be an example for little kids." The 22-year-old Spaniard completed golden hat-trick in this tournament. The high diving preliminaries also concluded, with Rhiannan Iffland and Constantin Popovici topping the women's and men's fields respectively.

Shi, An reach badminton China Open semifinals

Changzhou (China), July 25 (UNI) : Home favorite Shi Yuqi and South Korea's world No. 1 An Se-young continued their strong form at badminton's China Open today, advancing to the men's and women's singles semifinals respectively.

Third seed Shi overcame compatriot Li Shifeng in a dramatic three-game battle, winning 15-21, 21-15, 21-11.

Shi revealed he had briefly considered withdrawing due to an injury sustained early in the decider.

"But I didn't want to let the spectators down, and the injury wasn't that serious, so I decided to keep playing," he added.

Li described Shi as "stronger, faster, and more skilful at the net than I am",

India fight back after early collapse, trail Eng by 137

Manchester, July 26 (UNI) : Shubman Gill and KL Rahul led a determined Indian fightback with an unbroken 173-run partnership after England posted a formidable 669 on Day 4 of the fourth Test at Old Trafford.

At stumps, India had reached 174 for 2, still trailing by 137 runs, but with a renewed sense of control after a disastrous start to their second innings. Earlier in the day, England captain Ben Stokes stole the spotlight with a majestic 141, resuming from his overnight score and pushing England's total beyond India's reach. His innings, laced with 11 boundaries and three sixes, was a mix of elegance and aggression.

After reaching his 14th Test century, Stokes removed his helmet and pointed skyward in an emotional tribute to his late father. He found brief support from Brydon Carse, who struck a breezy 47 off 54 balls. The pair added crucial lower-order runs before Ravindra Jadeja cleaned up the tail, while Jasprit Bumrah struck with a low delivery to dismiss Liam Dawson.

India's reply began in shambles. Both openers, Yashasvi Jaiswal and debutant Sai Sudharsan, were dismissed for ducks

within the first three overs. With the score at 1 for 2, England sensed a rapid collapse, but what followed was a display of grit and composure from KL Rahul and Shubman Gill. The duo saw through a hostile period before lunch and then slowly wrested momentum away from England.

Gill was the first to counterattack, playing with flair and confidence. He lofted a superb drive over mid-off against Jofra Archer and pierced the gaps with ease on either side of the wicket. His innings was not without fortune, on 25, he edged Brydon Carse to backward point, only to be dropped by Liam Dawson.

Making the most of the reprieve, Gill reached his eighth Test fifty in the 29th over with a flick for three off Joe Root, bringing up the landmark in just 77 balls.

England unsuccessfully reviewed twice for LBWs against Gill, with both reviews going against them.

Rahul, at the other end, played the role of anchor with measured strokeplay. He brought up his half-century in 141 balls, guiding a delivery from Dawson past slip in the 42nd over. He was particularly effective off the back foot, cutting and punching the ball between point and third man with precision. He also

pulled Archer in front of square and threaded boundaries through gaps against Chris Woakes with finesse. Rahul grew in confidence as the innings progressed, finishing the day unbeaten on 87.

The third-wicket stand steadily gained substance, reaching 100 in 230 balls and later touching 150 in 327 deliveries.

At tea, India had progressed to 86 for 2, and they continued to defy England's attack with a mixture of caution and counterpunching flair. Both batsmen exploited the gaps and capitalised on any lapse in line or length from the bowlers.

Rahul opened the face and guided Woakes between slip and gully for four, then cut him through point in the same over. Gill glanced Dawson fine past short fine leg for another boundary and punished an overpitched ball from Archer through covers.

Late in the day, Rahul dispatched a full toss from Root through mid-off for a boundary, a fitting end to a day of quiet Indian dominance after a nightmarish start. India had scored 150 in 54.4 overs with 9 extras, and the partnership between Gill and Rahul had not only steadied the innings but had also kept the contest alive heading into Day 5.

Joe Root's masterclass put England in command

Manchester, July 25 (UNI) : Joe Root led England's charge with a majestic 150 as the hosts closed Day 3 at a dominant 544 for 7 in 135 overs, taking a commanding 186-run lead over India's first-innings 358 in the ongoing Test at Old Trafford today.

Resuming the day at 225 for 2, Root and Ollie Pope (71) steadily built England's innings, frustrating the Indian bowlers with measured resistance. The duo's 113-run partnership set the tone, as Root calmly moved to his 38th Test century with a gentle glance to the fine leg boundary off debutant Anshul Kamboj. It was a knock that combined patience and panache, highlighted by reverse sweeps, late cuts, and elegant drives. Root brought up his 150 in 248 deliveries (14x4), drawing a loud cheer from the spectators. But his splendid innings ended at 150 when Ravindra Jadeja produced a sharply turning delivery that beat the bat and saw him stumped by substitute keeper Dhruv Jurel.

Captain Ben Stokes was equally impactful. After his five-wicket haul earlier in the match, he brought up his 36th Test 50, showcasing his all-round dominance. Stokes muscled boundaries through pulls

and reverse sweeps and took charge against both pace and spin. He eventually retired hurt on 66 at 491/4 but returned later in the day and remained unbeaten on 77 by stumps. Jamie Smith's brief cameo of 9 ended when Jasprit Bumrah finally found reward for his effort, getting Smith caught behind off a delivery that straightened and induced an edge. Jurel, again impressive behind the stumps, took a sharp low catch diving forward.

Liam Dawson added late momentum with aggressive stroke play, including a pair of well-timed boundaries, one via a pull off Bumrah and another thumped straight down the ground off Washington Sundar. However, wickets began to fall as India finally saw some return for their toil. Chris Woakes became Siraj's first scalp of the innings when a low ball sneaked under the bat to hit the stumps, a just reward for the pacer who had bowled without luck all day.

Earlier, India had lost a review against Root in the morning and missed a runout opportunity, which proved costly as Root built his imposing innings. England's innings was peppered with quality strokes and decisive running between the wickets.

Mariska Tunjung 21-19, 21-18. Women's doubles top seeds Liu Shengshu and Tan Ning beat fellow Chinese pair Li Yijing and Luo Xumin 21-13, 17-21, 21-16 after a grueling 69-minute battle.

South Korea's Kim Hye-jeong and Kong Hee-yong also booked a semifinal spot, rallying to beat

teammates Baek Ha-na and Lee So-hee 6-21, 22-20, 21-12. In the men's doubles, China's fifth seeds Liang Weikeng and Wang Chang eliminated South Korea's Kang Min-hyuk and Kim Dong-ju 21-16, 22-20. They will compete with Indonesian duo Fajar Alfian and Muhammad Shohibul Fikri in the semifinals.

The Commission has observed that the contents, if true, raise a serious violation of human rights of the victim, the statement

said. The media report, published on July 15 had said that the victim was about 18 feet down when the soil suddenly caved in, completely burying him under it. Other labourers managed to escape. The police, along with Civil Defence personnel, reached the spot and took the victim out after an effort of about six to seven hours.

# Railways to operate special trains to cater to the needs of passengers during Ganesh Utsav-2025

Mumbai, July 26 : Indian Railways have decided to operate Special trains to cater to the needs of passengers during Ganesh Utsav-2025. The halts of Ganpati Special trains serving over Konkan Railway have been planned at Kolad, Indapur, Mangaon, Goregaon Road, Veer, Sape Warmne, Karanjadi, Vinhere, Diwankhavati, Kalambani Budruk, Khed, Anjani, Chiplun, Kamathe, Sawarda, Aravali Road, Sangameshwar Road, Ratnagiri, Adavali, Vilavade, Rajapur Road, Vaibhavwadi Road, Nandgaon Road,

Kankavali, Sindhudurg, Kudal, Zarap, Sawantwadi Road, Madure, Thivim, Karmali, Madgaon Jn, Karwar, Gokama Road, Kumta, Murdeshwar, Mookambika Road, Kundapura, Udupi, Mulki and Surathkal.

Railways operates special trains to supplement the availability of accommodation in regular train services and to cater to the extra rush of passengers during peak seasons, festivals, special events etc., subject to traffic justification, operational feasibility, availability of resources, etc. The loads of existing services are also

augmented this way.

This apart, tatkal ticket booking system has been modified for bringing about ease of access and transparency and to curb the potential malpractices by unscrupulous elements. With effect from 01-07-2025, authorized ticketing agents of Railways are not allowed to book opening day Tatkal tickets during the first thirty minutes for air-conditioned (AC) as well as non-AC Classes, that is, they shall not be allowed to book opening day Tatkal tickets from 10:00 hours to 10:30 hours for AC Classes and from 11:00 hours to 11:30 hours for non-AC Classes. Railway Protection Force

(RPF) has also taken certain steps to curb black marketing of Tatkal reservations. Firstly, regular drives are conducted by RPF against persons/agencies found involved in unauthorized carrying on of business of procuring and supplying of railway tickets. The offenders are booked under section 143 of the Railways Act. Cases having wider ramifications and involving ingredients of other offences are dealt in coordination with other law enforcement agencies like Police & CBI. RPF conducts regular checks in mass contact areas such as Passenger Reservation System (PRS) centers,

Booking Offices, Platforms, Trains etc. to prevent unauthorized ticketing activities including the use of scripting software. Such checks are also intensified during peak period like festivals, holidays etc.

General public are also educated through Public Address System and media, not to buy tickets from unscrupulous elements and consequences of buying tickets from these sources.

This was stated by the Union Minister of Railways, Information & Broadcasting and Electronics & Information Technology Mr Ashwini Vaishnaw in reply to an unstarred question in the Rajya Sabha today.
