#### **Saving tigers** is protecting soul of forests : Stalin

Chennai, July 29 (UNI) Tamil Nadu Chief Minister M K Stalin today said by saving tigers the soul of forests are protected.

In his message on International Tiger Day, he said "Tamil Nadu roars with pride."

"With 306 tigers as per NTCA, this success rests on the shoulders of our forest staff and antipoaching teams who guard critical habitats across tough terrains", he said.

"To boost forest conservation, 1947 field posts have been filled, forces are being upgraded with modern gear, technology, and dedicated veterinarians", Mr Stalin said. "Habitats are being revived by removing invasives and improving forest health. The

Tamil Nadu Forest and Wildlife Crime Control Bureau (TNWFCCB), specialised unit, has been formed to curb organised wildlife crime", the Chief Minister said in X. "In saving our tigers, we are protecting the soul of our forests", he added.

Hours after the video went viral, the Delhi Police responded, stating that they had investigated the woman featured in the clip. She had initially alleged that "four policemen came to their house, took them away to a secluded place, and demanded Rs 25,000."

However, during questioning, the woman reportedly admitted that a relative of hers — a political worker based in Malda district — had instructed her to make the video. According to the police, the footage was then shared with this relative and later circulated with the intention of defaming the Delhi Police.

"Based on technical and local intelligence, as well as CCTV footage, we have gathered various

pieces of evidence. From this, we have concluded that the story narrated by the woman is baseless," a senior police officer told the

The incident has triggered a political controversy as Leader of the Opposition Suvendu Adhikari announced that an FIR would be filed against Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee, citing the Delhi Police's version of events."I have asked Soumendu (his brother and BJP MP from Kanthi) to file a police complaint," Adhikari said in a press conference today. Taking a swipe at the Chief Minister, he added, "She is spreading false information. She could easily win an international award for spreading rumours."Later in the day, Soumendu Adhikari filed a formal complaint at Delhi's Mandir Marg police station.

#### Bihar state fair authority to manage 'Sitakund Fair'

Patna, July 29 (UNI): Bihar Deputy Chief Minister Samrat Choudhary today said that the historic and mythological monthlong 'Sitakund Fair' in Munger district will now be managed by management of the Bihar State Fair Authority.

Choudhary said that the fair holds significant mythological, religious, social, cultural and tourismrelated importance. Every year, lakhs of devotees from Munger and nearby districts including Bhagalpur, Khagaria, Begusarai, Saharsa, Purnia and Lakhisarai participate in the fair.

He also informed that nearly 5,000 foreign tourists visit the Sitakund temple annually for worship and sightseeing.

The Deputy CM said, historic and mythological Sitakund situated on the banks of the Ganga river, is located in Munger Sadar subdivision, about 8 kilometers from the district Munger headquarters. As per the myth this is the site where Goddess Sita underwent her trial by fire (Agni Pariksha)."

He further added, "The Sitakund Fair begins every year from the date of Maghi Purnima and continues till Phalgun Purnima, spanning approximately one month. Such fairs provide employment opportunities to the local people."

He further informed that the Sitakund site houses kunds (sacred ponds) named after Goddess Sita, Lord Ram, Lakshman, Bharat, and Shatrughna.

#### underway in Assam to clear 3600 hectares of forest land Guwahati, July 29 (UNI) Sources in the forest

**Massive eviction drive** 

: The BJP led government in Assam today started an eviction drive at Rengma forest area near Uriamghat in Assam's Golaghat district, probably the biggest one carried out in recent times, to clear over 3600 acres of forest land which had been under illegal encroachment.

The state government had deployed adequate security personnel including the Assam Police nd the Forest personnel to ensure the eviction process was completed smoothly. About 1000 bulldozers and excavators rolled down the area identified for eviction this morning while thousands of policemen and forest personnel guarded the area.

A senior district administration official said that they have so far cleared only 4.2 hectares of encroached land and added that it will take another few days to clear the entire stretch under illegal encroachment.

"These are all forest land which had been under encroachment. Whatever is done has been done as per the law. The people who had been living in the area illegally had been served with notice and accordingly most of the residents have left the area already," said a senior police official while adding that there were no opposition from the residents on the first day of eviction on Tuesday.

department said that they have been able to demolish close to 300 structures which included residential structures as well as commercial establishments. The drive is likely to resume tomorrow, the sources said.

Some of the residents however, objected to the government move to evict them from the land and said that they have been living there since more than the last 40 years. Interestingly, most of the houses had electricity connections and there were government schools established in the

Some of the locals alleged that they were settled in the area by the earlier governments during the early 1980s to protect Assam's land from encroachment by other states. Rengma forest area located close to the Assam-Nagaland interstate border had the issue of encroachment from neighbouring states.

It may be mentioned here that the Assam government had recently started a series of eviction drives to clear the forest and government lands which had been under illegal encroachment.

Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma visited the Uriamghat area last week and held discussion with the district and police administration over the eviction drives.

Bhubaneswar, July 29 (UNI): In a significant step toward empowering women weavers, the Odisha government, through Mission Shakti, signed a Memorandum Understanding (MoU) today with the Weavers' Service Centre (WSC), Government of India.

The initiative aims to enhance skill development, introduce modern design inputs, and provide access to both national and international markets for women-led weaving enterprises. Speaking on the occasion, Odisha Deputy Chief Minister Pravati Parida said the MoU will support design mentoring, training, and market linkages for weaving-based Self Help Groups (SHGs), helping them adapt to evolving trends in fashion and home décor."This collaboration will help build a sustainable, women-led textile ecosystem and strengthen the textile value chain across Odisha," she said. Parida further

highlighted that the state's traditional weaving sector is witnessing a resurgence, driven by the active participation of women-led SHGs.She reiterated the government's commitment to making SHG members and referenced Prime Minister Narendra Modi's recent mention of Odisha's Santali weaving art from Mayurbhanj and the Sankirtan groups of Keonjhar in his "Mann Ki Baat" radio address. #### **RPF of NFR seizes** contraband ganja and banned drugs worth over Rs 3.67 crore

Siliguri, July 29 (UNI): In special operations against drug peddling and other offences, the Railway Protection Force (RPF) of North East Frontier Railway has seized around 3,706.937 kg contraband Ganja valued at Rs. 3.67 crores and apprehended 126 drug peddlers in connection with the seizures, an official said today.The special operation is a continual process, which has been taken up from the beginning of this year to ensure safe travel for bonafide commuters as well as a crime-free NFR system, the official said. He said during special intensive crackdown against the transhipment of contraband items through railways from July 17-24 the RPF's operations at Agartala, Katihar, Bagdogra, Rangapara North, Lumding and Guwahati railway stations and trains led the jawans to seize 168.67 kgs of Ganja valued over Rs 17 lakh with the arrest of two persons. Additionally, 475 bottles of liquor worth Rs. 1.05 lakhs were confiscated, leading to the arrest of another five persons.In separate actions during the same period, RPF personnel also apprehended seven individuals involved in the theft of passenger belongings and successfully recovered six stolen mobile phones, o-ne laptop and cash worth Rs.

1.19 lakhs from them.

#### Rain might have washed away 4,000 metric tonnes of coal, says Meghalaya Minister Shillong, July 29 (UNI): Meghalaya

Cabinet Minister Kyrmen Shylla has sparked controversy with his suggestion that the vanishing of more than 4,000 metric tonnes of illegally mined coal from two designated depots might be due to getting "washed away due to heavy rainfall".

The 4,000 metric tonnes of coal was dumped at Diengngan village and Rajaju village depots in South West Khasi Hills district following the submission of the 31st interim report by the Justice (Retd) Brojendra Prasad Katakey panel to the Meghalaya High Court last week.On July 25, a division bench of the High Court comprising of Justice Hamarsan Singh Thangkhiew and Justice Wanlura Diengdoh had directed the state government to take strict action against officials under whose watch, coal has been lifted illegally and also to trace the persons involved in lifting the coal.

"Meghalaya receives the highest rainfall. There is a strong possibility that the coal might have been washed away due to the rain," Shylla told reporters.

"If you remember there was an allegation that flooding in Assam was due to the heavy rainfall in Meghalaya and especially in East Jaintia Hills district,

all waters (from the district) flows to Bangladesh. You never know because of the rain the coal might have got washed away," he said. However, the minister

clarified that he does not have sufficient details to ascertain whether the disappearance was due to illegal practices or natural causes. "I cannot blame it solely

on rainfall. It may or may not be the reason. I do not have the full details to ascertain the cause of the disappearance of coal," Shylla stated.

Earlier, the Meghalaya Authority (MBDA) had recorded 1,839.03 MT of coal at a depot in

# **Ahead of Bihar polls, Sahani stakes** claim to 60 seats, deputy CM post

Patna, July 29 (UNI): Vikassheel Insaan Party (VIP) founder Mukesh Sahani has announced that his party will contest 60 seats in the 2025 Bihar Assembly elections and has staked claim to the post of Deputy Chief Minister.

He asserted that VIP holds a decisive vote share across the state and will play a crucial role in determining the next government.

In a post on the social media platform 'X', Sahani declared: "VIP will contest 60 seats in 2025, while candidates from our allied parties will contest the remaining seats."

Popularly known as the 'Son of Mallah', Sahani added: "In 2025, our government will be formed. Tejashwi Yadav will be the next chief minister of Bihar, and the deputy chief minister will be a son of the Mallah from Bihar's Backward Extremely Community.'

During a media interaction, the VIP chief said that this demand is not new but part of the 12-point agenda unanimously

approved by senior party leaders at the National Executive Meeting held in March.

He stated: "Those 12 agendas reflect our party's vision, organisational strength, and electoral strategy. Our leaders and workers have been actively working to implement them on the ground." Sahani reiterated that

# NHRC reviews human rights landscape in Telangana during camp sitting; lauds state's initiatives

Telangana delegation, led by Chief Secretary Ramakrishna Rao, included senior officials from crucial departments such as Home, Women and Child Development, Education, Police, SC Development, Forest, and Agriculture. Discussions focused on systemic challenges related to crimes against women and children, malnutrition. education gaps, SC welfare, LGBTQI+ rights, agrarian distress, and man-animal

conflict.Special Chief Secretary (Home) Ravi Gupta, reaffirmed the State's commitment to rule of law and administrative transparency. Additional DGP(Women Safety & CID) Ms Charu Sinha, detailed initiatives such as expanded SHE Teams, Bharosa Centres, Maithri Clinics for transgender persons, and inclusive employment measures.

Women and Child Development Principal Secretary Smt. # Govt expands fasttrack courts for women's atrocity cases

Mumbai, July 29 (UNI): The Cabinet, chaired by Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis, today approved the creation of dedicated special courts in Gondia, Ratnagiri, and Washim districts to accelerate the resolution of cases involving atrocities against women. This expansion aims to replicate the success of the state's existing network of 27 special courts dedicated to women's atrocity cases, which have demonstrated significant utility by disposing of a substantial backlog. The newly sanctioned courts will focus specifically on ensuring swift justice for female victims. Each of the three courts will be staffed through external mechanisms with five regular positions: one District and Additional Sessions Judge, one Stenographer, one Superintendent, one Senior Clerk, and one Junior Clerk. Additionally, each court will receive two human resource personnel: two Constables. The Cabinet sanctioned an expenditure of Rs 2.39 crore to establish and operationalise these judicial facilities in the designated districts.

# ISRO gearing up for July 30 INDO-US **NISAR** satellite launch starting launch rehearsal

The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) is gearing up for the July 30 evening launch of the Indo-US Earth observation satellite — NASA-ISRO Synthetic Aperture Radar (NISAR) — and has begun launch rehearsals, an official said.

An ISRO official, who did not wish to be named, said that launch rehearsals are currently underway, although the formal countdown is yet to begin.

During the launch rehearsal, ISRO checks out all the rocket systems, stimulates the launch sequence including the fuel loading, countdown and others that includes aborting the launch.

India's Geosynchronous Satellite Launch Vehicle-F16 (GSLV-F16) will lift off at 5.40 pm from the rocket port in Sriharikota, Andhra Pradesh.

Approximately 19 minutes after liftoff, the 420tonne GSLV-F16 — an expendable launch vehicle will deploy the NISAR satellite, which weighs around 2,400 kg, into a 747-km Sun-synchronous orbit (SSO) with an inclination of 98.4 degrees, according to ISRO.

Built at a cost of about USD1.5 billion, NISAR's mission life will be five years and its mission is to observe earth in unprecedented detail.

A retired ISRO chairman clarified that NISAR is intended exclusively for Earth observation and not for strategic or military purposes, despite its sophisticated Synthetic Aperture Radar (SAR) capability, which allows it to image the Earth through clouds.

# Hypospadias - not a simple childhood issue

What is hypospadias? Hypospadias is a birth defect where the opening of the urethra on a male baby's penis is located on the underside instead of at the tip. It occurs in approximately 1 of every 150 to 300 male infants. It is often associated with bending of the penis downwards called chordee in children which also needs to be addressed.

What causes this condition?

The exact cause is unknown, but genetics likely play a role, meaning it can sometimes run in families.

Is it a difficult condition to treat?

Hypospadias can vary in severity, with mild cases requiring less intervention and more severe cases needing more complex surgeries.

How is it diagnosed? It is usually identified at birth by a healthcare professional during a physical examination.

If my child is diagnosed with hypospadias what are the important points to be kept in mind?

Avoid Circumcision: Circumcision is usually not performed at birth for babies with hypospadias, as it may affect the surgical to intervene for this

Check for undescended testes: If a child has associated undescended testes especially on both sides then evaluation for checking the sex of the child in the form of karyotyping needs to be

Emotional support: Parents should be prepared to address emotional concerns related to their child's condition and discuss any anxieties with their healthcare team.

When to see a doctor: If you suspect your newborn son hypospadias, contact your pediatrician or a pediatric urologist immediately.

What is the treatment for this problem?

Most cases require surgical repair to ensure normal urination and sexual function later in life and is typically performed by an experienced pediatric urologist. It is imperative that experience is crucial in managing this condition as an improperly done first surgery can have long-term adverse effects on the quality of life of these children. In fact, we have a term called hypospadias cripples for patients who have multiple failed attempts at repair.

Most boys with hypospadias will need surgery between 6 and 12 months old. However it also depends on the size of the penis as sometimes we need to delay surgery for better growth of the penis before surgery. In some older children testosterone supplementation may be needed prior to surgery to

increase the size of the organ.

Having said that in India, unfortunately we still see adolescents and adults who come to us with the problem as they are undiagnosed at birth or the parents had failed to notice it.

Can you briefly elaborate on the surgery for this condition?

The surgery involves

correction of the bend in the penis if present along with the repositioning the urethral opening to the tip of the penis

Depending on the severity, the procedure may be done in a single stage or in multiple stages

Following surgery what are the points that parents need to understand?

In the immediate postoperative period, careful maintenance of dressing and catheter needs to be done .Any soakage of dressing or blockage of catheter needs to be brought to the attention of the surgeon Follow-up appointments with the urologist are crucial

How long follow-up is needed for children who are operated for hypospadias?

All children with hypospadias needs to be followed up till puberty or longer as the chance of complications increase with duration of follow up.

What are the signs of urinary problem to watch out for in the long term?

Some of the signs are straining to void, thinning of stream, ballooning of urethral tube deviation of stream development of recurrent bending of penis which may need to be addressed surgically.

What other issues that may need to be addressed in children as they grow up into adulthood?

Children with proximal hypospadias can have psychosexual and fertility issues as they grow up due to factors like a small penis especially when they have been operated multiples times and have associated anomalies.

If a child with hypospadias operated in develops childhood problems in adolescence or adulthood whom should you approach? Ideally these children

need to managed by transitional urologist who are adult urologists trained in managing paediatric urological anomalies and are well versed with managing this complex condition in both children and adults. This is an upcoming field of urology which has started gaining traction in the west, which bridges the gap between paediatric and adult urology care as many of these children need lifelong care. We at AINU are in the process of developing a center of excellence for transitional care in the country which is a first if its kind in India to make sure our Indian children with complex anomalies get continuity of care all through their life, like their

western counterparts.

# SC agrees to open court hearing on JSW Steel's review plea in Bhushan Power case

New Delhi, July 29 (UNI) significant development in the Bhushan Power and Steel Limited (BPSL) insolvency case, the Supreme Court allowed JSW Steel's request for an open court hearing of its review petition challenging the apex court's May 2, 2025 verdict, which had rejected its Rs 19,000 crore resolution plan and directed liquidation of BPSL.

A Bench comprising Chief Justice of India (CJI) B.R. Gavai and Justice Satish Chandra Sharma on Monday issued notice on scheduled the matter for hearing on July 31 at 3:00 PM in open court.

"Applications for listing review petitions in open court and applications for oral hearing are allowed. Issue notice," the court ordered.

JSW Steel had filed the review petition on June 25, 2025, along with separate review petitions by the Committee of Creditors (CoC) and the Resolution Professional, contesting the May 2 ruling by a bench comprising Justice Bela M. Trivedi and Justice

the review petitions and Satish Chandra Sharma.

That ruling held that the CoC had erred in approving the resolution plan, which was found to be in violation of the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code (IBC). The apex court had consequently ordered the liquidation of BPSL.

JSW Steel's resolution plan, offering over Rs19,000 crore to financial creditors, was approved by the National Company Law Tribunal (NCLT) in September 2019 and later upheld by the National Company Law Appellate Tribunal (NCLAT).

#### Putin calls Israeli PM Netanyahu, stresses importance of unity, sovereignty of Syria

Moscow/Jerusalem, July 29 (UNI): Amid the IDF's bombing of Syria following the violence between Druze and Bedouin communities in the southern region of Suwayda, Russian President Vladimir Putin held phone call with Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu, during which he emphasised the importance of supporting the unity, sovereignty, and territorial integrity of Syria, the Kremlin announced yesterday.

"Notably, Vladimir Putin emphasised the importance of supporting the unity, sovereignty, and territorial integrity of the Syrian Arab Republic and reinforcing its internal political stability by respecting the legitimate rights and interests of all the ethnic and confessional communities," the Kremlin said in a statement.

The Russian side indicated its readiness to help find diplomatic solutions regarding the Iranian nuclear program, the Kremlin said.

"The leaders agreed to continue the dialogue on current issues on the international and bilateral agenda," the statement added.

#### **Shooting in New York office** building leaves 5 dead, 6 injured

New York, July 29 (UNI): A gunman killed four people and injured six others on early Monday evening before shooting himself dead inside an office building in Manhattan, New York City.

The 27-year-old gunman named Shane Tamura opened fire around 6 p.m. (2200 GMT) and died from "an apparently self-inflicted injury," CNN reported. The information was later confirmed by Mayor Eric Adams. Earlier, New York Police Commissioner Jessica Tisch said on X, "At this time, the scene has been contained and the lone shooter has been neutralized."

One of the victims was an off-duty New York Police Department officer, while the other three were civilians, local media reported.

The gunman reportedly came from Las Vegas as authorities found a vehicle with Nevada plates registered to Tamura at the scene, with a rifle case inside, according to the New York Post.

The shooter's motive is unclear until now.

#### China welcomes process of improving relations between Russia, US: Foreign Ministry

Beijing, July 29 (UNI): China welcomes the improvement of relations between Russia and the United States, Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesman Guo Jiakun said on Tuesday, commenting on a possible meeting between the Russian and US leaders in Beijing.

"Russia and the United States are permanent members of the UN Security Council and influential powers. China is happy to see the improvement of Russian-US relations, which contributes to stability and peace in the world," Guo told reporters.

#### Over 2,200 people evacuated amid flooding in Myanmar

Yangon, July 29 (UNI): A total of 2,267 people from 461 households were evacuated in four townships of eastern Myanmar's Shan state due to flooding, according to the Myanmar Fire Services Department on Tuesday.

The flooding, caused by mountain runoff triggered by heavy rain early Monday morning, affected Yatsauk, Aungban, Kalaw, and Pindaya townships, an official from the department told Xinhua.

In Pindaya township, six people were killed and three injured as of Tuesday morning, he said.

Rescue teams from the Myanmar Fire Services Department transferred affected residents to monasteries and playgrounds, he said, adding that rescue operations are ongoing.

#### **Rosocomos CEO Dmitry Bakanov** meets with NASA management

Moscow, July 29 (UNI): Roscosmos CEO Dmitry Bakanov has arrived in the United States to meet with NASA management and the crew of the Crew Dragon spacecraft, which includes Russian Oleg Platonov, the state corporation told journalists.

"Dmitry Bakanov arrived in Houston as the head of the Roscosmos delegation to meet with NASA management. This is the first face-to-face meeting of the heads of Russian and US space agencies in eight years," the statement said.

It is noted that first, he and the leadership of the US space agency will visit the structural divisions of the Johnson Space Center and get acquainted with their work. In addition, the Russian delegation plans to visit the Boeing production unit, where reusable manned transport spacecraft CST-100 Starliner is being developed, and hold talks with the management of the company's space program.

"On the eve of the launch of the Crew-11 mission, which is scheduled for July 31, Dmitry Bakanov will meet with the crew of the Crew Dragon spacecraft, which includes Roscosmos cosmonaut Oleg Platonov as part of the cross-flight program. For the Russian, this will be the first flight into space," the Russian space agency added. At the John F. Kennedy Space Center, the head of the state corporation will take part in events related to checking readiness for the launch of the next mission to the International Space Station.

# Syria sends fourth aid convoy to Sweida amid ongoing tensions



Damascus, July 29 (IANS): The Syrian interim authorities, in coordination international organisations and local community partners, dispatched a fourth humanitarian aid convoy on Tuesday from Damascus to the southern Sweida province, according to state media. The convoy, comprising 22 trucks, carried 27,000 litres of fuel, 2,000 food baskets, 2,000 hygiene kits, 10,000 bottles of drinking water, 40 tons of flour, and various medical supplies, the official SANA news agency reported.

The delivery is part of ongoing efforts to support civilian populations in Sweida, which has experienced recent unrest and shortages following clashes and a fragile ceasefire agreement earlier this month. This marks the fourth convoy sent to the province since the agreement was reached.

The aid comes amid reports of protests in parts Sweida, where demonstrators have accused the interim

#### **Direct flights** Pyongyang and **Moscow resume** after years

Pyongyang/Moscow, July 29 (UNI): After years of hiatus, direct flights between Pyongyang and Moscow have resumed due to demand from the Democratic People's Republic of Korea (DPRK) and Russia, the official Korean Central News Agency (KCNA) reported on Tuesday. The first passenger plane flying from Moscow arrived at Pyongyang International Airport on Monday about eight hours after taking off from Russia's Sheremetyevo International Airport. The flight was greeted by a ceremonial water salute at the DPRK airport, said the KCNA report.

Addressing a welcome ceremony, Yun Jong Ho, the DPRK minister of external economic relations, said resuming direct flights between the two capitals marks a rapid development of bilateral ties, the report said. The first return flight to Moscow after years is scheduled for Tuesday. Russia's Ministry of Transport has said that for the time being, direct flights will be offered once a month.Russia's Natural Resources Minister Alexander Kozlov, who traveled on board the first flight to Pyongyang for talks on Russia-DPRK cooperation.

According to the UN, unrest erupted on the evening of July 12 following series of mutual kidnappings that escalated into armed clashes between Druze factions and Bedouin tribes, eventually drawing in Syrian security forces.

The violence quickly spiralled, with reports of extrajudicial executions and looting. Graphic footage circulated widely on social media, fueling sectarian tensions and the spread of disinformation.

Although active fighting has largely subsided, Pedersen warned that the situation "remains tense and volatile." Civilians have borne the brunt of the violence, with hundreds reportedly killed and widespread accounts of abuses committed by both state and non-state actors. "I condemn the appalling violations committed against civilians and combatants in Sweida. I also condemn Israel's intervention," Pedersen said, referring to recent Israeli airstrikes near Sweida and Damascus that reportedly resulted in civilian and military casualties.

#### Regional army commanders of Thailand-Cambodia confirm ceasefire on border areas

Bangkok/Phnom Penh, July 29 (UNI) Regional army commanders of Thailand and Cambodia met today morning in border areas, discussing implementation of the ceasefire reached a day earlier, both confirmed.

Thai spokesperson Winthai Suvaree confirmed today that regional commanders of both countries held meetings earlier in the day and agreed to a ceasefire and a freeze on troop movements ahead of the General Border Committee (GBC) meeting scheduled for August 5.

The spokesperson added that a ceasefire had already been in effect along the Thai-Cambodian border before the meetings.

Meanwhile, Cambodian Ministry of National Defence's Spokesperson, Lieutenant General Maly Socheata, in a press briefing today said that the commanders of Cambodian military region 5 and the Thai military region 1 held a meeting for more than 10 minutes."Both sides agreed to respect the ceasefire and stop increasing the number of troops in order to avoid confrontation and tension," she said.

"They also agreed to reconnect communication and provide information to each other."

The exchange of gunfire Cambodian and Thai soldiers over disputed border areas began on July 24, and a ceasefire was reached on July 28.

# **US** uses Iranian nuclear program as excuse for confrontation: **Supreme Leader**

Tehran, July 29 (UNI): Tehran's nuclear program and uranium enrichment are just an excuse for the United States to target Iran, Iranian Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei said on Tuesday.

"All their talk about nuclear issues, [uranium] enrichment, human rights, and such things are nothing but excuses. What upsets them is the fact that the Islamic Republic is able to produce new ideas in the various fields of science and knowledge – be it in the humanities, technical sciences, or religious sciences" Khamenei said.

Iran and the US have held five rounds of Omanmediated talks on the nuclear program. The sixth round was scheduled for June 15, but the Israeli attack on Iran and the US bombing of Iranian nuclear sites scrapped those plans.

Manila, July 29 (UNI): A passenger bus rolled off a highway in Bohol province in central Philippines on Tuesday morning, injuring 15 Filipinos, police said.

Police said the crash occurred before 9 a.m. local time while the bus was negotiating a sharp curve along a highway in Bilar town.

Emergency workers rushed to the scene and transported the injured to local hospitals. The cause of the crash remains under investigation. However, an initial report revealed that the driver had lost control of the vehicle.

# Thailand accuses Cambodia of violating hours-old ceasefire

Bangkok, July 29 (UNI) : Cambodia is violating the ceasefire on a large scale, Thailand has reported this to the witnesses of the agreements, Malaysia, the United States and China, Thai Acting Prime Minister Phumtham Wechayachai said today.

"Cambodian troops are violating the ceasefire regime on a large scale and systematically. We have reported this to the countries that witnessed yesterday's agreements

with Cambodia — Malaysia, as the ASEAN chair, the United States and China," the official told reporters.

Wechayachai has also asked evacuated Thai citizens not to leave shelters or return to their homes in the border zone until authorities issue a special announcement.

Meanwhile, the Cambodian Defense Ministry denies violating the ceasefire agreement, ministry spokeswoman Lt. Gen. Maly Socheata said. "We strongly reject

the claims made by the Thai military spokesperson, who alleged gunfire exchanges and violations of the ceasefire agreement. Cambodian forces have strictly implemented, and will continue to strictly implement, the army command's instructions and the ceasefire agreement, which took effect at midnight," the spokeswoman was quoted as saying by the Khmer Times newspaper.

Border tensions between Thailand and Cambodia escalated into an armed conflict on July 24. Civilian casualties were reported on both sides. The incident followed a clash on May 28 between Thai and Cambodian military personnel in a disputed neutral zone, which left a Cambodian soldier dead. Some 140,000 people have been evacuated from the

conflict zone on the Thai side since July 24.

On Monday, ceasefire negotiations between Thai Acting Prime Minister Phumtham Wechayachai and Cambodian Prime Minister Hun Manet took place in Kuala Lumpur, mediated by Malaysian Prime Minister Anwar Ibrahim. Following the talks, the Malaysian leader said that the parties had agreed to establish a ceasefire starting at midnight.

# Transnistrian Prez Krasnoselsky expresses gratitude to Russian peacekeeping forces

Tiraspol/Moscow, July 29 (UNI) Transnistrian President Vadim Krasnoselsky has expressed his gratitude to Russia for its peacekeeping operations in the separatist state and advocated for Moscow's continued

"In today's context, it is critically important that the ongoing peacekeeping operation continues and its remains unchanged," Krasnoselsky said in his address, dedicated to the anniversary of the deployment of the Russian peacekeeping forces in Transnistria.

The Transnistrian leader recalled that 33 years ago, the deployment of Russian peacekeepers stopped the bloodshed "unleashed by the Moldovan leadership during their armed attack on the Transnistrian people."

Krasnoselsky added that Tiraspol remains committed to resolving the conflict exclusively through peaceful means and emphasised the need for mutual respect and constructive cooperation with Moldova.

"I am deeply convinced that Russia, as the guarantor of peace on the Dnister, has always upheld and continues to uphold the inviolability of the previously reached agreements underpinning the current peacekeeping format. Transnistrians are grateful to the Russian Federation for its contribution strengthening security and stability," Krasnoselsky said.

Deputy Russian Foreign Minister Mikhail Galuzin also congratulated the peacekeepers in Transnistria on the operation's 33rd anniversary, saying they had laid the groundwork for a peaceful settlement.

The official added that collective peacekeeping operation that launched on July 29, 1992 and included Russia, Moldova, and Transnistria remains "unique and relevant to this day."

Transnistria, where 60% of residents are ethnic Russians and Ukrainians, sought independence from Moldova before the USSR's collapse, fearing Moldova would join Romania amid nationalist sentiments.

In 1992, after Moldova's failed attempt to resolve the issue by force, Transnistria became a territory beyond Chisinau's control.

This year marks the 33rd anniversary of the start of the peacekeeping mission. Russian military personnel, alongside Transnistrian and Moldovan military observers, maintain peace in the conflict zone.

(UNI): The United States is experiencing a gradual increase in inflation pressures, International Monetary Fund (IMF) Economic Counsellor Pierre-Olivier Gourinchas said on Tuesday. "While global inflation

continues to decline, the latest price data suggests that inflation pressures are building gradually in the US," Gourinchas told reporters.He pointed out that US import prices in dollars have remained largely unchanged or even increased in 2025. That means that the cost of tariffs will be borne by US retailers and customers as firms start to pass through higher costs into their prices, Gourinchas added.

in travel value," he said, adding that the government is also providing 200 units of free electricity, which is benefiting lakhs of families.

Prabhakar highlighted the government's steps towards improving livelihoods. "We are implementing the Rythu Bharosa scheme, have implemented farmer loan waivers, and given a Rs 500 bonus to Sanna Vadla farmers," he said.

The Indiramma housing scheme for the poor is being revived with a new approach—homes will be constructed closer to where beneficiaries live, unlike earlier projects like Kollur, which are located far from the city and lack connectivity. Touching upon welfare distribution, the minister said that the

government is in the process of distributing around 50,000 newly verified ration cards in 15 Assembly constituencies of Hyderabad.

"After 10 years of delay, we've ensured ration cards are granted based on eligibility, not politics. We've also enabled 2.8 lakh families to receive 6 kg of fine rice and added 1.5 lakh new families to the ration list," he stated.

Emphasising urban development, Prabhakar said the government is building flyovers, underpasses, sewage treatment plants, and parks and upgrading drainage systems across the city.

"No new water source has been added to Hyderabad since the formation of Telangana, except the Krishna and Godavari water brought during the Congress regime. Now, the second phase of the Godavari project is underway to bring 15 TMC of water," he said. The minister also

underlined efforts to make Hyderabad greener and cleaner. "We've allowed only EV, CNG, and LPG autos within the Ring Road and are transitioning RTC buses to electric. We're promoting water harvesting to increase underground water and combat pollution," he added.

Regarding upcoming Jubilee Hills byelection, Prabhakar affirmed that the Congress will field a candidate from within the constituency. "We will not import party nominates, all leaders will work unitedly. A survey will determine the best candidate based on local support," he said. "We have already Secunderabad Cantonment and we will win Jubilee Hills too."He appealed to the voters to bless the Congress party and support the government's efforts in resolving public issues and ensuring development. "We are here to correct a decade of neglect. Let us hoist the Congress flag once again in Jubilee Hills," he said.

# Over 34k cases pending with NHRC; Chairperson highlights initiatives, urges deeper collaboration with civil society and media

Hyderabad, July 29 (UNI): National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) Chairperson Justice V Ramasubramanian on Tuesday revealed that over 34,685 cases are currently with the pending Commission.

Addressing a press conference at the Dr. MCR Human Resource Development Institute in Hyderabad during the Commission's two-day camp sitting, Justice Ramasubramanian said the NHRC has been actively taking suo motu cognizance of human rights violations across the country.

"In 2021, we took up 17 such cases. The number rose to 60 in 2022, 107 in 2023, and 105 already in

2024. By mid-2025, it has already crossed 50," he said.During the camp sitting in Hyderabad, the NHRC disposed of 87 cases through two division benches and a full commission session, including 36 and 51 cases respectively by the benches and 19 by the full panel. He highlighted that the Commission had issued orders for compensation in custodial death cases, with most payments already made, and others expected within four weeks.

"In Telangana, only 780 cases are pending with us, including four cases of police custody deaths and 30 judicial custody deaths," Justice Ramasubramanian noted. The Commission

also held extensive interactions with state officials, including the Chief Secretary, DGP, and other department heads, to review issues related to women child welfare, education infrastructure, SC/ST welfare, and support for disabled persons. The NHRC asked the Telangana government to submit status reports on multiple matters.In a post-lunch session, NHRC members met with NGOs, human rights activists, and civil society members, encouraging them to submit written recommendations on ways to improve the rights and quality of life for marginalized and vulnerable communities. J u s t i c e

emphasised the crucial role of the media, saying, "We monitor newspapers and social media closely. Whenever we come across incidents like custodial deaths, deaths from falling into open drains, or suicides due to negligence in schools or hostels, we act. Media helps us read society's pulse.'

He cited a few recent cases, including one involving a juvenile wrongfully jailed for 40 days, for which compensation was awarded, and mass food poisoning cases in schools, which are under scrutiny. The Chairperson also mentioned a noteworthy intervention, where the NHRC helped trace and rescue a kidnapped girl from Bihar, who was found in Rajasthan about to be trafficked across the border.

Addressing concerns about India's ranking in global human freedom indices, Justice Ramasubramanian acknowledged disparities in such rankings and said the Commission regularly engages with state governments to improve policy implementation."We are not just here to speak. We're here to listen—to the media, to activists, and to those who face rights violations. collaboration is key to real change," he added.

# RTI Commission launches dist. tour

He noted that out of 29 departments in the state, 15 currently have no pending cases commendable achievement.

He revealed that over 18,000 RTI cases remain pending across the state, largely due to past delays information dissemination. "Our goal is to resolve all pending cases by August and ensure that 30 key departments are cleared of backlogs within

two months," he said. Reddy stressed that

applications must not be rejected without valid reasons and urged departments to set up citizen information boards in every government office.

He also stated that RTI is implemented in 136 countries and is vital for both transparency and accountability in a democracy. "Only when complete information is provided to citizens can we achieve real public accountability," he added.

The conference also featured sessions from other commissioners who elaborated on key sections of the RTI Act and shared practical guidance with PIOs.

#### India women's team clubbed with best **Asian teams**

Sydney, July 29 (UNI)

The Indian women's football team has been drawn into a formidable Group C alongside continental heavyweights Japan, Vietnam and Chinese Taipei for the AFC Women's Asian Cup 2026, to be held in Australia from March 1 to 21. The draw ceremony, conducted at the Sydney Town Hall, saw Indian midfielder Sangita Basfore, who netted twice in India's final qualifier against Thailand, serve as one of the three draw assistants, along with Australia's Tameka Yallop and Korea Republic's Jeon Yugyeong.Placed in Pot 4 prior to the draw, based on the latest FIFA rankings released on June 12, India (world No. 70) face a daunting group stage. Japan, Asia's highestranked team at world No. 7, are joined by Vietnam (No. 37) and Chinese Taipei (No. 42) in Group C.

Twelve teams have been split into three groups of four for the group stage of the 21st edition of Asia's premier women's football tournament, the oldest of its kind on the continent. The top two teams from each group and the two best third-placed sides will qualify for the quarterfinals.

India booked their spot in the tournament by topping Group B in the AFC Women's Asian Cup Qualifiers, registering victories over Thailand, Iraq, Timor-Leste Mongolia. This will mark India's first full-fledged appearance in the tournament since 2003. The Blue Tigresses did feature in the 2022 edition as hosts but were forced to withdraw following a COVID-19 outbreak in the squad. Historically, India's best performances in the tournament came in the early 1980s, when they finished runners-up in 1980 and 1983, and secured a

third-place finish in 1981. Australia, as hosts, and the top three teams from the 2022 edition -- China, South Korea and Japan -- received automatic qualification.The 2026 tournament will be hosted across three cities -- Sydney, Perth and Gold Coast. Defending champions China, who have won a record nine titles, will look to extend their dominance on the continental stage.

# **Jamshedpur beat Indian Army 1-0** to top Group C

Jamshedpur, July 29 (UNI) Sanan Mohammed's 52nd-minute strike handed Jamshedpur FC a gritty 1-0 win over Indian Army FT in their Group C clash at the 134th Indian Oil Durand Cup here at the JRD Tata Sports Complex today.

This marked Jamshedpur's second consecutive victory in the group stage, taking them to six points from two matches and putting them firmly at the top of the group, with a place in the knockout stage now within touching distance. # On the Rails to Safety: RPF's Relentless **Fight Against Human Trafficking**

It was an ordinary afternoon at New Jalpaiguri Railway Station on July 21, 2025. The bustle of trains, announcements, rushing passengers belied a dark undercurrent that too often hides in plain sight human trafficking. girls, confused and unsure of their journey's purpose, were being transported by two individuals — Jitendra Kumar Paswan and Chandrima Kar — who claimed they were escorting the girls to work in motor parts and mobile phone companies in Bengaluru. To avoid detection, the girls had been spread across various coaches. Upon inquiry, the girls could not provide details about their travel or employment, and even their parents were unaware of the specifics. Their coach and berth numbers had been scrawled in ink on their hands — a chilling reminder of how systemized such crimes have become. The traffickers failed to produce any valid documentation or give credible explanations. Following due process, both accused were arrested under relevant provisions of law relating to trafficking of children, and the rescued girls were released after verification.

Behind this success was not just a team of officers, but a vigilant security ecosystem determined to ensure that the vast Indian Railway network — the lifeline of the country — is not allowed to become a conduit for human exploitation.

The RPF's Expanding Role in Safeguarding Lives For the RPF, this was

just another day of silent, determined service. Among its many responsibilities ensuring passenger safety, protecting railway property, and maintaining order one role has gained

human trafficking.

Indian Railways, with its 13,000 trains, 7,500 stations, and an estimated 23 million passengers daily, is an artery of movement that connects remote corners of India to urban hubs. But what makes it a boon for mobility also attracts malefactors unscrupulous elements exploit affordability, reach, and anonymity of the railway system to smuggle their victims. Women and children, particularly from marginalized regions, are targeted with false promises of jobs, education, or marriage, and pushed into child labour, prostitution and begging.

The RPF has grown into a pivotal force in ensuring that traffickers do not misuse this public infrastructure. Through sustained intelligencebased operations and coordination with Civil Police, NGOs, and other agencies, RPF has positioned itself as a key stakeholder in the national fight against human trafficking.

From Policing to Protection: Building a Trafficking-Free Network

The RPF's proactive role in combating trafficking did not emerge overnight. Its evolution has been strategic, structured, and committed.

This transformation began with Operation Nanhe Farishtey, launched in 2020, with a mission to

or trapped in exploitative conditions. While initially focused on minors, the operation opened a window into the broader machinery of trafficking leading to a deeper institutional focus on dismantling networks that target not only children, but women and other vulnerable adults as well.

Nanhe Farishtey became a defining intervention, saving more than 64,000 children — 43,493 boys and 20411 girls — many from the grips of child labour, organized begging rings, and forced servitude during last four and a half years. After rescue, the children are produced before **Child** Welfare Committees (CWCs) for reintegration or safe institutional care, with crucial support from Child Help Desks (CHDs) and **District Child Protection** Units (DCPUs). These interventions have been operationalized at 135 major railway stations, with plans to scale it up further.

Building on its success, the RPF formally launched **Operation AAHT (Action** Against Human Trafficking) in 2022, creating **750 Anti-Human Trafficking Units (AHTUs)** across the Indian Railways network.

These units conduct intelligence-based drives, surveillance operations, and coordinated rescues with NGOs and local police. Strategic MoUs were

signed with the National **Commission for Women** and Aarambh India (an NGO), enabling capacityreal-time building, information exchange, and structured rehabilitation support.

Strategic Intelligence and Technological Edge: **Detection Dynamics** 

The battle against trafficking is no longer just about vigilance; it is about precision, prediction, and integration. RPF's **detection** dynamics now involve a multi-pronged, techenabled strategy that combines human intelligence with digital surveillance.

Frontline railway workers — ticket examiners, porters, onboard housekeeping staff — are increasing prominence over rescue children who were sensitized and trained to The RPF, in alignment with the last decade: preventing lost, abandoned, runaway, spot red flags. Simultaneously, analytics backed CCTV surveillance and AIpowered facial recognition systems (FRS) help identify traffickers and potential victims based on movement patterns and known databases. The use of social and digital media **platforms** has further added a modern edge to detection. Cases reported through platforms like Twitter, WhatsApp helplines, and even crowd-sourced alerts have led to rescues. This evolving surveillance ecosystem ensures that traffickers no longer operate with impunity, even in the busiest and most chaotic transit points.

> Rescues, Arrests, and Reforms: Measurable

Progress, Real Lives In 54 months between 2021 and mid-2025, **2,912** human trafficking victims were rescued by RPF, including over 2,600 minors and 264 adults. In this same period, 701 traffickers were arrested. The force has also played a crucial role in identifying illegal immigrants from Bangladesh and Myanmar, many of whom were victims of trafficking rings that promised work or refuge. Over 580 such cases were detected between 2022 and 2024. These numbers are not merely statistical milestones; they represent dismantled networks, broken chains exploitation, and lives

restored to safety.

But rescue is only part of the equation. RPF ensures that victims are counselled, supported, and rehabilitated through coordinated action with NGOs, CWCs, and shelter homes. From **Muzaffarpur** to Secunderabad, Katihar to Ajmer, known trafficking have been disrupted. Trains such as Gorakhpur-Secunderabad Express, Rajendranagar-Ajmer Express, and New Jalpaiguri-Amritsar Express have become focal points for surveillance.

Prevention as the First Line of Defence

While rescue and prosecution are vital, prevention remains the cornerstone of an effective anti-trafficking strategy. broader government initiatives, has deployed a public outreach and awareness campaign across the railway

ecosystem. From **short street plays** at railway stations, to posters, banners, and standees, to broadcast messages via public address systems and rail display networks, the aim is to make every passenger a stakeholder in vigilance. Slogans such as "Stop *Trafficking: Because Every* Child Deserves to Be Free" are more than words they are part of a cultural shift to recognize and report exploitation.

Moreover, community engagement — through social media campaigns, school outreach, and partnerships with civil society — is being mainstreamed into the preventive framework. The integration of helplines like 1098 and 112 ensures that reports can be swiftly acted upon.

Together, these efforts are reshaping stations into zones of safety — spaces where traffickers are no longer invisible, and victims are never alone.

Holding the Line, Together

On this World Day Against Trafficking in Persons, the story of the 56 girls rescued at New Jalpaiguri is not an exception — it is a reflection of a nationwide, relentless effort to combat one of humanity's gravest crimes.

#### Eleven integrated aquaparks approved under **PMMSY: Govt**

New Delhi, July 29 (UNI) Aiming to bolster the aquaculture infrastructure in the country, the Ministry of Fisheries, Animal **Husbandry and Dairying** has sanctioned the development of 11 Integrated aquaparks across 11 states, the Government informed Lok Sabha today.

The aquapark project has a total outlay of Rs 682.60 crore and comes under the central flagship Pradhan Mantri Matsya Sampada Yojana (PMMSY), The aquaparks have been envisioned as holistic hubs that will provide end-to-end support across the aquaculture value chain, said Union Minister of State, Ministry of Fisheries, Animal Husbandry and Dairying, George Kurian, in a written reply today.

According to official data, Andhra Pradesh will set up one aquapark at a cost of Rs 88.08 crore while Arunachal Pradesh and Nagaland have received approvals for projects costing Rs 43.59 crore and Rs 42.35 crore respectively.

Other states that will host integrated aquaparks include Assam (Rs 32.97 crore), Chhattisgarh (Rs 37.11 crore), Haryana (Rs 98.90 crore), Madhya Pradesh (Rs 25.00 crore), Odisha (Rs 100.00 crore), Tamil Nadu (Rs 127.71 crore), Tripura (Rs 42.40 crore), and Uttarakhand (Rs 44.50 crore).
