

TDP MPs meet PM Modi, HM Amit Shah; discuss Andhra Pradesh-related issues

New Delhi, Aug 11 (IANS) : Telugu Desam Party (TDP) MPs on Monday called on Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Union Home Minister Amit Shah to discuss key issues concerning Andhra Pradesh.

The TDP MPs led by parliamentary party leader Lavu Sri Krishna Devarayalu along with Civil Aviation Minister K. Ram Mohan Naidu and Union Minister of State for Rural Development and Communications, Chandra Sekhar Pemmasani had separate meetings with the Prime Minister and the Home Minister.

CM describes India's economy as good economy, says will emerge as 3rd biggest

Vijayawada, Aug 11 : Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu today described the Indian economy as a good economy and called upon everyone to have the feeling of ‘nation first’.

The AP Chief Minister made the comments in the backdrop of US President Donal Trump’s comments that India’s economy is a dead economy.

Addressing the ‘Har Har Tiranga’ programme held in Tummalapalli auditorium here on Tuesday, he predicted that India’s economy will emerge as a third biggest economy in the coming years.

“US President Donal

Trump described India’s economy as a dead economy. The future will decide whose economy is a dead economy. India’s economy is not a dead economy but it is a good economy,” Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu asserted.

“By the time we celebrate our 100th Independence Day in 2047, our country will stand as a powerful force in the world. We have set a goal to make Andhra Pradesh the number one state in the country by 2047. During the 11 years of Modi’s rule, the country’s economy, which was ranked at 11th, has risen to 4th place. It will reach the 3rd place by 2028,”

Chandrababu Naidu mentioned.

Naidu felt that hiking tariffs on India by the USA is temporary. Since India’s economy is robust, the world needs the services of Indians. Now the government is striving to build a quantum valley and going forward using available resources, he observed, adding that the aim is to achieve sustainable development.

Tiranga is not limited to hoisting flag on the house but it is to enhance patriotism among people, he said.

Mr.Naidu paid tributes to the national flag designer and freedom fighter Pingali Venkaiah by garlanding the statue.

Rahul Gandhi, INDIA bloc MPs detained during protest march to EC office

Naidu's conspiracies cannot halt YSRCP victory in by-polls: YSRCP

Vijayawada, Aug 11 (UNI) : YSRCP leader and former Minister Velampalli Srinivas lambasted Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu today for orchestrating conspiracies to thwart YSRCP’s win in the Pulivendula and Vontimitta ZPTC elections, asserting that such tactics will ultimately fail.

Speaking to the media at the YSRCP central office in Tadepalli near here, Srinivas declared that Naidu, leveraging police and TDP goons, is desperately attempting to secure a win through undemocratic means, driven by fear of defeat in fair polls.

“Peaceful elections would render TDP’s victory impossible,” he emphasised, highlighting how Naidu’s vendetta is transforming the development-oriented Pulivendula region into a battleground of political grudges.

The former Minister criticised the Naidu-headed coalition government for plunging Andhra Pradesh into chaos worse than Bihar, marked by loot, atrocities and anarchy within just one year.

He pointed out Naidu’s lack of confidence in his governance, leading to the deployment of rowdies and police for voter suppression.

“Hundreds of YSRCP sympathisers and workers face baseless bind-over cases, while TDP goons attack our leaders with impunity,” Srinivas charged, citing the attempted murder of YSRCP MLC Ramesh Yadav and “biased” policing by DIG Koya Praveen, “who acts like a TDP operative.”

He also condemned the filing of false SC/ST atrocity cases against YSRCP members and the relocation of polling booths to curtail voting rights, questioning the Election Commissioner’s silence as evidence of favoritism toward the ruling party.

Govt secures Maratha commander Raghuji Bhosale’s sword



Mumbai, Aug 11 (IANS) : The sword of Raghuji Bhosale, founder of the Nagpur Bhosale dynasty and an important commander in the Maratha army during the reign of Chhatrapati Shahu Maharaj, which the Maharashtra Government won in an auction, was on Monday taken into custody in London by Cultural Affairs Minister Ashish Shelar. This sword will be brought to Mumbai on Monday, 18 August.

The ‘Firangi’ sword is remarkable for several reasons. Most medieval Maratha weapons lacked decorative embellishment or inscriptions of their makers or owners. This sword is a rare exception, bearing both intricate ornamentation and the owner’s name. The presence of its European-made blade further points

to the flourishing international arms trade in 18th-century India.

News of this historic sword going up for auction broke unexpectedly on 28 April 2025, creating a wave of interest across Maharashtra.

As soon as Minister Shelar learned of it, he immediately discussed the matter with Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis and initiated planning to ensure the sword came into the government’s possession.

By contacting the Indian Embassy and working late into the night, Fadnavis and Shelar established a network for the necessary coordination.

Following the CM’s instructions, the minister swiftly engaged an intermediary through whom the state government

participated in the auction and won the bid, said the release issued by the Minister’s office.

On Monday, in London, Shelar met in person with the intermediary who had secured the sword on behalf of the Maharashtra government, completed the legal formalities, and took possession of the sword.

This marks the first time that the State has acquired a historic artefact from abroad through an auction.

Calling it a witness to many glorious feats, Shelar expressed his honour at having the privilege of bringing such a priceless piece into Maharashtra’s custody, describing it as a historic victory for the entire state.

After completing all legal formalities, the sword will arrive at Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj

International Airport, Mumbai, at 10 am on Monday, 18 August.

In the presence of Minister Shelar, a bike rally will escort the sword with great fanfare to PL Deshpande Kala Academy, Dadar. On the same day, the programme ‘Gad Garjana’ will be held in the presence of dignitaries.

Raghuji Bhosale I (1695-February 14, 1755) was the founder of the Nagpur Bhosale dynasty and a prominent commander in the Maratha army during Chhatrapati Shahu Maharaj’s reign.

Recognised as one of the most daring Maratha commanders of the 18th century, Raghuji Bhosale’s Nagpur kingdom was rich in iron and copper deposits, used not only for manufacturing goods but also for crafting weapons.

HMPL's subsidiary Quippo Oil & Gas Infrastructure secures Rs 280.1 cr Oil India Limited's order

Mumbai, Aug 11 (UNI) Hazoor Multi Projects Ltd. (HMPL), one of India’s fastest-growing infrastructure and engineering has announced that its recently acquired subsidiary, Quippo Oil & Gas Infrastructure Ltd., has been awarded a contract valued at Rs. 280.1 Crore by Oil India Limited, a Maharatna Public Sector Undertaking (PSU), according to a statement issued here on Monday. The contract

involves the charter hire of one drilling rig, reinforcing Quippo’s credentials in the upstream oil and gas services domain and marking HMPL’s bold entry into India’s upstream energy services sector-positioning the company to play a long-term role in the country’s energy infrastructure development. This Oil India Order is more than a business win-it signals HMPL’s strategic shift from a pure-play EPC operator to an

integrated platform capable of executing in capital-intensive, high-barrier industries. The acquisition of Quippo was a deliberate, fundamentals-driven step aligned with national energy priorities, aimed at unlocking value in sectors characterised by recurring revenues, limited competition, and policy-driven tailwinds.

Pradhan said, “The country is watching those who work against the Constitution, led by Rahul Gandhi. The Opposition repeatedly raises doubts over EVMs, spreads lies, and tries to undermine faith in the election process. This is a deliberate strategy to spread unrest in the country.”

The senior BJP leader also urged the Opposition to raise their concerns in Parliament instead of taking out marches on the streets. He pointed out that even during discussions on Operation Sindoor in Parliament, the Opposition and Congress lacked a solid agenda. He accused them of diverting public attention from real issues.

The Union Minister explained that SIR is not a new process but a regular exercise by the Election Commission across all states to update and organise the voter list. He said, “The Opposition has no clear policy; they are only playing politics.” He also accused Congress of lying on several issues like EVMs, Rafale, and China border disputes. Pradhan said, “Questioning India’s army and sovereignty is wrong. The Opposition should clarify whose side they are on.”

Maharashtra Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis and his two deputies Eknath Shinde and Ajit Pawar and Bombay High Court’s chief justice Alok Aradhya, will attend the function.

Man carries wife's body on motorcycle after fatal accident in Nagpur

Nagpur, Aug 11 (UNI) A man was forced to tie his deceased wife’s body to his motorcycle after she was killed in a hit-and-run accident on the Nagpur-Jabalpur National Highway today evening, following alleged apathy from

onlookers. According to police, the incident occurred near Morfata when Amit Yadav (35) and his wife, Gyarsi (31), were travelling from Lonara here to their native village in Madhya Pradesh. A speeding truck struck their motorcycle,

killing the woman on the spot. The truck driver fled the scene. Police said Yadav allegedly pleaded with passing motorists for help to transport his wife’s body, but no one stopped. Left with no other option, he tied the body to his motorcycle to take her home.

He was later intercepted by a police patrol van, which then transported the body to Mayo Hospital for a post-mortem examination. Meanwhile, a video showing Yadav riding with

Chirag calls for accountability over Bihar’s backwardness

Patna, Aug 11 (UNI) Lashing out at political opponents and holding them responsible for Bihar’s continued backwardness even 75 years after independence, Union Minister and Lok Janshakti

Party (Ram Vilas) National President Chirag Paswan today said that the accountability for the backwardness should be fixed. Addressing a meeting of his party at the Gandhi Maidan in Gaya during the Nav-Sankalp

Mahasabha, Paswan said it was time to fix accountability for those who denied Bihar its rightful share in development. Reiterating his “Bihar First, Bihari First” vision, Paswan said he aims to establish a system where the youth can get quality education and employment opportunities within the state itself.

“As long as I am alive, the Constitution will remain safe. If given the opportunity, I will transform Bihar into a developed state,” he declared.

Targeting the opposition, Paswan directly blamed the Rashtriya Janata Dal (RJD) and the Congress for Bihar’s economic lag and the large-scale migration of its people.

He asserted that his party’s political formula is based on “M-Y”, meaning Mahila (women) and Yuva (youth) rather than caste or religion.

Paswan also claimed that there have been conspiracies to weaken him, including threats to blow him up with bombs, but maintained that he neither fears nor bows down to such intimidation.

CM Mann dares Sukhbir Singh Badal to cite Akali's achievements

Chandigarh, Aug 11 (UNI) : Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Singh Mann launched a scathing attack on Shiromani Akali Dal (SAD) leader Sukhbir Singh Badal today, daring him to cite a single achievement from the party’s decade-long rule in the state from 2007 to 2017.

Addressing a gathering in Sangrur, Mann described this period as the “darkest chapter” in Punjab’s history, accusing the Badal-led government of fostering a nexus of transport, cable, sand, drug, and other mafias that plagued the state.

Mann alleged that the Akali regime prioritized personal business interests over public welfare, allowing the drug menace to take root and spread across Punjab. He challenged Sukhbir to defend his party’s record, asserting that the current government is holding accountable those

responsible for the state’s woes. “Leaders who committed grave offenses against Punjab are now facing justice, with key figures, including a notorious drug lord, behind bars in Nabha Jail,” Mann stated, emphasizing his administration’s resolve to combat crime.

The Chief Minister took aim at opposition leaders, accusing them of colluding to protect their vested interests. He singled out Congress leaders Charanjit Singh Channi, Partap Singh Bajwa, Sukhpal Singh Khaira, BJP’s Captain Amarinder Singh, and Ravneet Singh Bittu for allegedly supporting the jailed former Akali minister, exposing what he called a web of mutual cover-ups among traditional parties. Mann urged these leaders to clarify their stance to the people of Punjab: whether they stand with drug traffickers or against them.

He further criticized the

Akali Dal’s transformation from a party rooted in sacrifice to one “associated with drug smuggling”, and labeled Congress as a fragmented group obsessed with power struggles. Mann remarked that Sukhbir lacks understanding of Punjab’s culture, religion, and even the Punjabi language, yet remains desperate to reclaim power- a prediction he made earlier, foreseeing the Akali Dal’s decline since 2019.

Contrasting his approach with that of his predecessors, Mann asserted that while he may lack experience in exploiting public resources, he excels in addressing the common man’s struggles.

He vowed to continue serving Punjab with dedication, undeterred by what he called the “baseless venom” spewed by envious political rivals. Mann accused past leaders of neglecting the state for

personal gain, an attitude he said has harmed Punjab and its people.

Inauguration of Development Projects

On the same day, Mann dedicated several significant projects to the public. He upgraded the Freedom Fighter Jathedar Kartar Singh Daryesh Senior Secondary School in Sangrur to a School of Eminence, investing Rs. 3.40 crores in it. The revamped institution now features a modern auditorium, renovated classrooms, laboratories, a park, a mid-day meal kitchen, and improved water facilities, aimed at transforming the learning environment for students who have gained global recognition.

He also inaugurated the Government Nursing Training School in Sangrur, built at a cost of Rs. 7.81 crore. This state-of-the-art facility offers a three-year General Nursing and

Hyderabad, Aug 11 (UNI) : Union Cabinet Secretary T V Somanathan today held a video conference with Chief Secretaries of all states and union territories to review the progress of the deregulation and compliance reduction drive across the country. During the meeting, Telangana Chief Secretary K Ramakrishna Rao informed that out of the 23 priority areas identified for implementation, 12 have already been completed, 10 are in progress, and one falls under the “not willing to implement” category.

On the state’s Jan Vishwas Bill, Rao said a preliminary assessment had identified criminal provisions across various secretariat departments, and the findings have been shared with the respective departments. They have been instructed to submit their proposed list for inclusion in the draft Bill. He further directed all concerned departments to complete the priority tasks within the stipulated timelines. Senior officials, including Special Chief Secretary (TR&B) Vikas Raj, Special Chief Secretary (Industries) Sanjay Kumar, Principal Secretary (Labour) Danakishore, Additional DG (Fire Services) Nagireddy, and Principal Secretary (EFS&T) Ahmed Nadeem, attended the video conference, an official statement said.

Mumbai hosts 64-nation Astronomy Olympiad, PM Modi to address opening

Mumbai is set to welcome nearly 300 of the world's brightest high school students from a record 64 countries for the 18th International Olympiad on Astronomy and Astrophysics (IOAA 2025). The prestigious event, running from August 11 to August 21, marks the largest edition in the competition's 18-year history and signifies India's growing leadership in international science education and scientific networking.The Olympiad will commence with the opening ceremony scheduled for August 12 at the Lotus Ballroom, Jio World Convention Centre. Prime Minister Narendra Modi will address the gathering with a special message.

Professor Ajay Sood, Principal Scientific Adviser to the government of India, will be the chief guest, while Professor Ajit Kembhavi, former vice president of the International Astronomical Union (IAU), will be the guest of honour.

This diverse participation incudes significant representation and debut appearances from nations in the Global South.

Organised by the Homi Bhabha Centre for Science Education (HBCSE), a unit of the Tata Institute of Fundamental Research (TIFR), with support from the Prime Minister's Office (PMO) and the Department of Atomic Energy (DAE), IOAA 2025 heralds the return of an international science olympiad to Mumbai after a decade. The city last hosted the International Physics Olympiad in 2015.

The grand finale and closing ceremony will unfold on August 21 at the Nita Mukesh Ambani Cultural Centre in the Bandra-Kurla Complex (BKC). Dr. V. Narayanan, secretary of the Department of Space and chairman of the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO), will preside as chief guest, accompanied by Dr Anil Kakodkar, Chancellor of the Homi Bhabha National Institute (HBNI) and former secretary of the Department of Atomic Energy (DAE), as guest of honour.The academic heart of the Olympiad features a rigorous programme designed to challenge participants at the highest levels of high-school astronomy and astrophysics.Examinations encompass three core components: demanding theoretical assessments covering fundamental principles of celestial mechanics, stellar physics, galactic astronomy, and cosmology; observational rounds testing practical skills in night sky identification, telescope operations, and data analysis challenges requiring participants to interpret real astronomical datasets, perform error analysis, and employ statistical problem-solving.An innovative team competition will promote cross-cultural scientific teamwork and international collaboration among the young participants.Ensuring convenience and safety, especially during Mumbai's monsoon season, all student participants are accommodated at The Westin Powai Lake. This hotel also serves as the primary venue for all academic events, including the theory examinations, data analysis rounds, observational activities, and the team challenge.

Team leaders, mentors, and academic jury members are staying at the St. Regis Hotel in Worli, which hosts critical jury meetings, moderation sessions, and academic deliberations, maintaining the competition's strict integrity and international standards.

Beyond the intense competition, IOAA 2025 offers an extensive cultural and scientific exchange programme. This includes collaborative events, scientific workshops led by renowned Indian astronomers and astrophysicists, and educational field trips to premier scientific institutions.

Participants will visit the Nehru Science Centre, the Indian Institute of Technology Bombay (IIT Bombay), and the Giant Metrewave Radio Telescope (GMRT) facility near Pune. These activities are meticulously planned to foster scientific diplomacy, forge lasting international friendships among the next generation of astronomers, and expose participants to India's rich scientific heritage and cutting-edge research infrastructure.A significant legacy initiative involves the educational resources and materials specifically developed for IOAA 2025. These will be distributed across India through the newly established International Astronomical Union (IAU) Office of Astronomy Education, located in India.

This effort aims to enrich astronomy curricula in schools nationwide and inspire broader student engagement in the astronomical sciences, addressing the subject's traditional lower profile compared to mathematics and physics olympiads within the country.

This marks India's third time hosting the IOAA, following successful editions held in Mumbai in 2008 and Bhubaneswar in 2016, underscoring the nation's sustained commitment to international scientific cooperation and excellence in astronomy education.

The Olympiad itself demonstrates remarkable resilience, having navigated global challenges like the COVID-19 pandemic. It organised the first fully online Global e-Competition on Astronomy and Astrophysics in 2020 and successfully implemented hybrid formats combining in-person and remote participation in subsequent years.

India slams Pakistan Army Chief's "Nuclear Sabre-Rattling" from US soil

New Delhi, Aug 11 (UNI) India today reacted sharply to reported remarks made by Pakistan's Chief of Army Staff, Field Marshal Asim Munir, during a visit to the United States, calling them an example of "nuclear sabre-rattling" and warning that such statements highlight serious concerns over Islamabad's nuclear command and control.

In a statement, the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) said it was "regrettable" that the comments were made "from the soil of a friendly third country" and urged the international community to note "the irresponsibility inherent in such remarks" by a military "hand-in-glove with terrorist groups."

The statement said such remarks underscored doubts about the integrity of Pakistan's nuclear command and control, particularly in a state where the military is "hand-in-glove with terrorist groups." The ministry termed it "regrettable" that the comments were made from the soil of a friendly third country.

India's statement comes after Pakistan's army chief, Field Marshal Asim Munir, sparked outrage by threatening India with "nuclear war" during a speech on American soil, warning that Islamabad would "take half the world down" if faced with an existential threat.

The MEA reiterated India's position that it will not yield to nuclear blackmail and will take "all necessary steps" to safeguard national security.

"Our attention has been drawn to remarks reportedly made by the Pakistani Chief of Army Staff while on a visit to the United States. Nuclear sabre-rattling is Pakistan's stock-in-trade" Munir, speaking at a black-tie dinner in Tampa, Florida, hosted by businessman and honorary consul Adnan Asad, reportedly declared: "We are a nuclear nation. If we think we are going down, we'll take half the world down with us." According to reports, this marks the first time nuclear threats have been issued from US soil against a third country.The Pakistani army chief also threatened to destroy any Indian infrastructure on Indus River channels, warning that such projects could cut Pakistan's water supply. Referring to New Delhi's suspension of the Indus Water Treaty following the April 22 Pahalgam terror attack, he claimed the move could put 250 million Pakistanis at the risk of starvation.

"We will wait for India to build a dam, and when it does, phir 10 missile sey faarigh kar dengey (we will destroy it with 10 missiles)... The Indus River is not the Indians' family property. Humein missilon ki kami nahin hai, al-hamdulillah (we have no shortage of missiles, praise be to God)," he was quoted as saying.

Munir is in Tampa to attend the US Central Command (CENTCOM) change of command ceremony, his second trip to Washington in less than two months.

His previous visit to US was on on June 18 which included a White House luncheon with President Trump, where he proposed the US leader for a Nobel Peace Prize a suggestion he repeated in Florida.The Tampa event was attended by around 120 members of the Pakistani diaspora under tight restrictions. Following the Pahalgam terrorist attack on April 22, 2025, in which 26 civilians were killed, tensions between India and Pakistan swiftly escalated into a serious military crisis.India launched Operation Sindoor on May 7, 2025 carrying out missile and air strikes across nine terror bases in Pakistan and Pakistan occupied Kashmir.The four-day conflict between nuclear -armed rivals witnessed military engagements including drone warfare, artillery exchanges, and retaliatory attacks.

Cultivating kindness in kids may promote healthy eating: Study

New Delhi, Aug 11 (UNI) Kids who were kind, helpful, and caring were more likely to eat healthy foods like fruits and vegetables when they became teenagers, says a new study that followed children from ages 5 to 17.

The researchers analysed data from the Millennium Cohort Study, a nationally representative study that followed children born in the United Kingdom for over 20 years, starting at birth. Parents reported how their children behaved at ages 5, 7, and 11. Then, the researchers checked if those children ate healthy foods at ages 14 and 17.

The findings in the American Journal of Preventive Medicine were heartwarming.

"Too often, we focus on what is going wrong in young people's lives, but what we hear from them time and time again is that they are tired of that narrative. They want us adults to pay

more attention to what is going right, including what they bring to their families and communities," said lead investigator Farah Qureshi, Department of Population, Family, and Reproductive Health, Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health.

Another researcher, Senior author Julia K. Boehm, PhD, Department of Psychology, Chapman University, added, "Prosocial behaviours, such as being considerate of others' feelings, sharing, helping if someone is hurt or upset, being kind, and volunteering to help others, can influence health by strengthening children's social ties and improving psychological functioning by promoting better mood, purpose, feelings of competence, and enhanced capacity to cope with stress.

"All of these, in turn, serve as resources that may inform health-related choices, as is evidenced by

our latest findings."

The study followed many children over time and looked at many different factors. Even with some limitations, the findings revealed that being kind and caring is a helpful trait that can lead to healthier habits for life.

Co-author Laura D. Kubzansky, Department of Social and Behavioral Sciences, Harvard T.H. Chan School of Public Health who leads a novel research programme on the long-term health impact of prosociality pointed out, "Asset-based interventions can open the door to new and creative health promotion strategies that engage youth in ways that speak to their inherent strengths, including shared values around kindness and cooperation. Supporting prosociality in childhood may be a promising health promotion strategy for future consideration."

LoP Suvendu writes to ECI raising 'arbitrary' replacement of BLOs in West Bengal

Kolkata, Aug 11 (UNI) : Leader of Opposition (LoP) in the West Bengal Legislative Assembly, Suvendu Adhikari has written to Chief Election Commissioner (CEC) Gyanesh Kumar, alleging the arbitrary replacement of Booth Level Officers (BLOs) in Uttar Dinajpur district by the state government.

Adhikari claimed that these BLOs had recently undergone specialised training in Delhi, organised by the Election Commission of India (ECI), to enhance their skills in maintaining accurate and transparent electoral rolls. However, he alleged, their appointments were cancelled without reasonable cause or due process.

Adhikari alleged in his letter to the country's top poll panel, "This seems like a deliberate interference with ECI's initiatives for

electoral reforms, potentially leading to irregularities in voter list management and compromising upcoming elections."

West Bengal is expected to hold its Assembly elections for 294 seats in April-May 2026.

"The WB Govt has canceled their appointments without any reasonable cause or due process. Over 50 hectares land cleared from encroachments along Assam-Nagaland border: CM

Guwahati, Aug 11 (UNI) Continuing it's ongoing eviction drives, the Assam Government has claimed to have clear illegal encroachment from over 50 acres of land at Nagheribil in Golaghat district in last three days.

Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma today said that the state government has reclaimed 50 acres of land in Nagheribil. The eviction drive was launched at Nagheribil on August 8.

“The WAR continues, the FIGHT continues, the EFFORT for reclaiming what belongs to us CONTINUES. 50+ Hectares of encroached land in Nagheribil, NOW FREED,” said the Assam

Chief minister on his X handle on Monday.

The chief minister said that a large-scale eviction drive was successfully carried out in Nagheribil and Merapani areas along the Assam–Nagaland border where approximately 320 illegal structures had been demolished.

These areas were under the Doyang Reserve Forest in Golaghat district, he said.

Although eviction drives have been a regular phenomenon, yet the government has intensified eviction drives in recent times and over 50000 people have been evicted in the last few months.

According to the government they have been able to clear 40 percent of the forest land from encroachment.

Mamata slams ‘distortion’ of Khudiram Bose’s legacy on his death anniversary

Kolkata, Aug 11 (UNI) : On the death anniversary of martyr Khudiram Bose, who embraced the gallows at the age of 18 while fighting the British colonial rule, West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee voiced strong criticism over what she described as “disrespect at the central level” towards Bengali luminaries.

Referring to a Hindi film Kesari 2, in which Khudiram is portrayed as “Singh” and shown as the son of Punjab, Banerjee questioned whether “language terrorists” would go so far as to distort the identity of one of India's pioneering immortal

revolutionaries.In a social media post, the Chief Minister wrote, “Recently, in a Hindi film, the revolutionary Khudiram has been referred to as ‘Singh.’ Why is there an attempt to insult those who sacrificed their lives for the country's independence? Our indomitable youth from Medinipur has been portrayed as a boy from Punjab. We have always paid our respects to this man, who stands as a symbol of patriotism and the highest self-sacrifice.”

Banerjee detailed the steps taken by her government to honour the teenage freedom fighter, who was hanged on

August 11, 1908, for his role in the Muzaffarpur Conspiracy Case.

“For the further development of Mohaboni and its surrounding areas — closely tied to Khudiram’s birth — we established the Mohaboni Development Authority,” she wrote.She further added, “In Mohaboni, we have installed a statue of the martyr, renovated the library, built a large auditorium, a conference room, and an open-air stage. We have also constructed modern cottages for visitors, revitalised the historic Khudiram Park, and decorated the entire area

with lights."Born on December 3, 1889, Khudiram Bose was a young revolutionary from the Bengal Presidency who took up arms against the British rule. Along with Prafulla Chaki, he attempted to assassinate British magistrate Douglas Kingsford by throwing bombs at a carriage they believed he was travelling in. Kingsford, however, was in a different carriage, and the attack tragically killed two British women instead.Bose was arrested, tried, and sentenced to death for his role in the plot, becoming one of the youngest martyrs of India's freedom movement.

BJP' clean sweep in district panchayat polls

Dehradun, Aug 11(UNI) : As Uttarakhand reels under state's worst natural disaster in last one decade, BJP got a big shot in its arm today as ruling party got its four district panchayat heads elected unopposed.

Party also managed to elect 11 Kshetra (Block) panchayats without any challenge.

As elections for remaining eight district and 75 more block panchayat bodies are scheduled for the coming days, BJP's sweeping win in the first round came as a big shocker for the opposition Congress party as latter failed even to find candidates for contesting in three hill districts Uttarkashi, Pithoragarh and Champawat and Udhamsingh Nagar in plain Terai region of the state. All four BJP candidates were declared winners unopposed by the respective election officers on the absence of opposition Congress nominees.

Similar wins in 11 block panchayats of the state including Uttarkashi's disaster hit and frequent in-news block Bhatwari, Champawat, Kashipur, Sitarganj, Khatima,

Dunda, Jakhnidhar, Chamba, Vikasnagar, Pabau, and Takula.BJP leaders in Uttarakhand applauded Chief Minister Pushkar Singh Dhimi for party's victories and said his strategy of keeping command of local political equations with opposition having no inkling of the same helped them win easily.

"BJP's candidate selection maintaining caste and regional balance left the opposition clueless. On the other hand opposition Congress party was plagued by acute factionalism and weak organisational set up.

The Congress leadership failed to even find candidates to file nominations in four districts and 11 block panchayat polls that enabled us win without any opposition" stated the state BJP media incharge and senior spokesperson Manvir Singh Chauhan. Chauhan claimed that panchayat results are also clear indication that BJP's organisational strength at the grassroots is as robust as it's higher rung of leadership. This has also set the ball rolling for 2027 state election, said Chauhan.

AAP MPs Join Opposition protest against alleged voter fraud

New Delhi, Aug 11 (UNI) :Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) MPs, led by Rajya Sabha member Sanjay Singh, participated in a protest march from Parliament to the Election Commission of India (ECI) headquarters today, alongside other opposition lawmakers, to highlight allegations of large-scale voter fraud involving the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) and the ECI.

Protesters raised slogans and attempted to submit a memorandum to the ECI but were stopped by police. Several MPs were detained and later taken to a police station. Sanjay Singh described the detentions as “completely wrong” and alleged that the ECI avoided meeting the opposition.

Singh claimed that votes had been

manipulated to secure BJP victories in multiple states, calling the current administration “an illegal government” and accusing the ECI of being complicit. He referred to previous allegations made by AAP in Delhi, as well as similar claims from Maharashtra and Haryana, and cited what he called irregularities in Bihar's voter lists, including fake entries.

According to Singh, these alleged irregularities extended to the recent Lok Sabha elections. He accused the ECI of refusing to release certain data and video footage, and of not disclosing details to the Supreme Court.

The ECI has not issued a response to the latest claims. The BJP has previously rejected allegations of voter fraud, calling them baseless

Srinagar, Aug 11 (UNI) Kashmir's major political parties – ruling National Conference and Peoples Democratic Party- today termed the Centre's decision allowing the Lieutenant Governor to nominate five members to the Union Territory's Legislative Assembly without an elected government nod as an attack on democracy.

The Union Ministry of Home Affairs has submitted an affidavit in the Jammu and Kashmir High Court saying that the Lieutenant Governor of the Union Territory has the authority to nominate five members to the Legislative Assembly without requiring the “aid and advice” of the elected government.

The affidavit was submitted by the MHA on a petition filed in J&K High Court in October last year

Reacting to the affidavit that J&K LG can name 5 members to the assembly without government nod, former Jammu and Kashmir chief minister and Peoples Democratic Party president Mehbooba Mufti called it a "blatant subversion of democratic principles".

“GOIs decision to nominate 5 MLAs in J&K after holding elections is a blatant subversion of democratic principles. Nowhere else in the country does the Centre handpick legislators to override the public mandate.

In India's only Muslim-majority region, long marred by conflict, this move feels less like governance and more like control,” Mehbooba said in a post on X.

Chhattisgarh likely to pass stricter anti conversion law in winter session

Raipur. Aug 11(UNI) : The Chhattisgarh government is preparing to exclude those individuals from the Scheduled Tribes (ST) category who have converted to another religion.This provision for converts is currently applicable only to the Scheduled Castes (SC). Under the proposed amendment, converted tribals who have been receiving dual benefits—ST reservation and minority welfare schemes, will lose access to both. In a move set to trigger fresh political and social debate, the ruling BJP says the step is essential to stop “dual entitlements,” while the Opposition has denounced it as politically motivated.

Currently applicable only to the Scheduled Castes (SC), the provision will now cover converted tribals, effectively cutting them off from both ST reservation and minority welfare schemes.

Deputy Chief Minister and Law Minister Arun Sao said the existing law would be made “more effective and comprehensive” with inputs from legal experts, and that a proposal would be sent to the Centre for

necessary national-level changes.Over the past two years, over hundred cases of conversion have been recorded in the state, with 44 resulting in FIRs. The government intends to replace the Chhattisgarh Dharma Swatantrata Adhiniyam, 1968, with tougher legislation expanding the definitions of inducement and forced conversion, requiring 60 days’ advance notice to district authorities, and imposing prison terms of up to 10 years for unreported conversions.

The plan revives an unimplemented law from the year 2006, introduced during the BJP government under then Chief Minister Dr. Raman Singh, which prescribed a two year jail term and a ?10,000 fine for forced conversions of women, minors, Dalits, and tribals. Former Chief Minister Bhupesh Baghel has urged the BJP to enforce the earlier provision instead of “politicising” the issue. In sharp contrast, Arvind Netam, patron of the Sarva Adivasi Samaj, hailed the proposal as “critical for safeguarding tribal culture and traditions.”

Security heightened ahead of Independence day

Chandigarh, Aug 11 (UNI) : With Independence Day 2025 approaching, Punjab's Director General of Police (DGP) Gaurav Yadav has intensified security preparations across the state. On Monday, he conducted a series of high-level meetings and outreach programs in Amritsar, Jalandhar, and Ludhiana to review counter-terrorism strategies and ensure a peaceful celebration, following directives from Chief Minister Bhagwant Singh Mann.

DGP Yadav embarked on an extensive tour, chairing law and order review sessions and engaging with police personnel from various commissionerates and ranges, including Border areas, Jalandhar, Ludhiana, and Ropar. The focus was on strengthening security protocols, enhancing inter-district coordination, and maintaining round-the-clock vigilance to thwart any potential threats in this border state.

In a bid to maintain law and order, DGP Yadav issued strict instructions to all Commissioners of Police (CPs) and Senior Superintendents of Police (SSPs) to bolster security arrangements. This includes setting up high-visibility checkpoints, increasing night patrols, and conducting regular domination operations in crowded areas, snatching hotspots, and other sensitive locations. The aim is to prevent any disruptions and ensure public safety during the national festivities.

Crackdown on Drugs and Organized Crime Reiterating the state's zero-tolerance policy against drug trafficking, DGP Yadav urged district police chiefs to enforce the NDPS Act with transparency and rigor. He reviewed the progress of the ongoing anti-drug initiative, 'Yudh Nashian Virudh,' and called for its further intensification to eradicate the drug menace.

Additionally, he directed officers to conduct financial probes under Section 68-F of the NDPS Act and target Hawala operators to dismantle the networks supporting drug trade and organized crime.

As part of his outreach, DGP Yadav held interactive sessions with officers of all ranks, including Station House Officers (SHOs). These discussions encouraged open dialogue, allowing field insights to inform strategies for better coordination and the disruption of drug supply chains across districts.

Key Attendees and Regional Focus The meetings saw participation from senior officials, including CP Jalandhar Range Dhanpreet Kaur, CP Amritsar Gurpreet Singh Bhullar, CP Ludhiana Swapan Sharma, DIG Jalandhar Range Naveen Singla, DIG Ropar Range Harcharan Singh Bhullar, DIG Border Range Nanak Singh, and various SSPs from districts like Amritsar Rural, Gurdaspur, Batala, Jalandhar Rural, Kapurthala, Hoshiarpur, Pathankot, SBS Nagar, Khanna, Jagraon, Rupnagar, SAS Nagar, and Fatehgarh Sahib. Orcas (Killer Whales like the famous ocean mammal celebrity, Shamu) are the most popular residents around Vancouver Island, joined in the migrating season by humpbacks and grey whales. Agile orcas have a range of interesting behaviours, which range from the frolic-and-shake to the-spray, the tail-slap, the jump-and-flop and the show-off-Shamu-leap, but they are always entertaining. Their smaller size means orcas are more playful than other whales and brave visitors can kayak amongst them, though be prepared to get

Of all the sights nature offers, whale watching never ceases to inspire and thrill us. The best whale watching experiences are worth travelling the world for, and can be enjoyed from land and from sea. The size of the whale, as well as its graceful movements and epic migrations, bewitch us. To watch their lively social interactions, intricate ways of communicating and agile play is to catch a glimpse of the natural world at work. You can view these gentle giants—and there are many species, from blue whales to humpback and minky whales (the Baleen species), to sperm, orca and pilot whales (the toothed whale species)—from locations in 40 countries as they migrate the globe to mate, calve and follow the blooming plankton that they feed on.

sprayed or splashed! Other harbour residents are the harbour seals, porpoises and sea lions.

Humpback whales in Madagascar

Between June and September Humpback whales grace the waters around Isle Sainte Marie to give birth to and raise their calves in the warm waters, and their booming, melodic calls permeate the oceans quiet. Whales surround the island and even travel through the narrow channel that separates Isle Sainte Marie from mainland Madagascar, so you can get an excellent view of their graceful, 30-ton passage, but you can also get closer by taking a boat trip out amongst the pods. When feeding, whales gather in groups to herd plankton together and trap blooms while animals feed individually. This is an awe inspiring sight to behold, as is the whales frolicking play and the mothers'

gentle direction as the calves continue their first migration. Orchids and lemur-covered mango and palm trees cover Isle Sainte Marie and its outlying reefs make it a fantastic place to dive and snorkel.

Whales of Antarctica

For animal lovers with an adventurous streak, this stark, angular backdrop of glaciers, icebergs, mountain peaks and unpredictable seas provides the perfect wilderness setting for whale and wildlife watching. Fin, sei, humpback, orca, and minke whales live in these chilly waters as well as several seal and dolphin species, penguin colonies and other hardy seabirds.

The humpbacks in Tonga

Jump into the sapphire waters of the South Pacific Ocean and swim with one of the most majestic and impressive creatures of the sea. Patience is the key to interacting with

the humpback; mothers protecting calves might avoid your path while curious juveniles will come out and investigate. Encounters can last a few minutes or a few hours but will prove to be unforgettable no matter the length. Don't forget to admire the coral reefs of these waters, which are equally as remarkable. Tours are available between July and October.

Wildlife of Canada's Arctic region

Polar bears, arctic foxes, caribou, snowshoe hare, beluga whales, wolves, moose and seals are just some of the animals that thrive in the freezing tundra and pack ice of northern Canada and the Arctic Circle. They have adapted to the seasonal environment and take advantage of both the winters, when much of the bay freezes and polar bears hunt on the ice, and the warmer weather when the ice melts revealing salt marshes that support huge water fowl nurseries. Visitors to the region will also be

wowed by the Northern Lights and impressed by the vast, silent, open, untouched spaces. Canada's polar bears are a dangerous lot and have been known to hunt the gentle beluga whale as well as seals and walruses. Much of this region is too far north and too frozen to have been seriously effected by logging or mining, so 90 percent of it remains in its virgin state. It is only in recent years that concerns about the bay being frozen for shorter periods have caused conservationists to worry about the habitat of these southern most polar bears and their animal contemporaries. The best times to see polar bears is between January and April, the best time for whale watching is between June and August, and the best time to see the Northern Lights is between September and October and January through May.

Bay of Fundy's whales

Bay of Fundy is a very natural, unspoilt location for whale watching. The islands and coastline surrounding the bay is a wilderness, and the tides are the world's most variable - in some places up to 14 metres difference (the literature says one hundred billion tonnes of sea water rolls in and out of the bay each day.) This constant churning of water creates excellent conditions for plankton blooms, and baleen whales especially find plenty to feed on. Scientists have seen fifteen different whale species in the Bay of Fundy, the largest (and I think the most unusual) are the Finbacks who are known for tall spouting. Lucky whale watchers will also see Humpbacks, Minkes, Sei Whales and North Atlantic Right Whales, which are one of the world's most endangered species and are known to mate in the bay. Other kinds of whales are known to drop in from time to time including the world's biggest animal, the Blue Whale. You can also see the occasional Basking Shark or Porpoise. The food is best during Summer.

Humpback migration in Hervey Ba

Hervey Bay calls itself the whale watching capital of the world, which may be an overstatement, but it is definitely one of the most popular whale watching spots. It's on the migration route for Humpbacks between the cold waters of the Antarctic and the warmer tropical waters off Queensland where they calve. Part of the spots popularity must be due to the calves and mums on their way home. Humpbacks are the whale world's most playful and most vocal, and this is one of a whale's most frisky times, so the frolicking, breaching and tail and fin slapping that people enjoy seeing happens here frequently. Humpbacks are also huge - the worlds fifth largest animal. I read statistics saying they're the size of twelve elephants. There are a lot of companies operating in this small area and the bay can be busy. The marine park is also home to dolphins, dugongs and sea turtles.

Whale watching in Tromso

This beautiful coastal region fringed with fjords, glaciers and arctic mountain scenery is a pristine whale watching setting. The ocean around Tromso is deep near the continental shelf, and the churning waters there create a breeding ground for whale food and herrings, which draws Humpbacks, Killer Whales, Minke, Orcas and Fin Whales. Regular operators have counted more than 600 Killer Whales in the waters around Lofoten and most pods travel in large groups, so you have a good chance of seeing twenty or more whales at a time. If you want to get close up, go with an operator with a zodiac. They're easy to manoeuvre, but you may get nudged around by a whale, so make sure they also provide waterproof suits. Whale watchers are also likely to come across dolphins, otters and seals. Top off your experience by seeing the truly magical Northern Lights in one of Norway's traditional west coast villages with wooden houses. If you stay in Tromso you can also visit the worlds most northern brewery.

Digby Neck's whale migration

Digby is a long narrow rocky peninsular on the tip of Canada, with the Atlantic Ocean on one side and a protected bay on the other, and is a great spot to watch the annual whale migrations. Many different types of whales pass along this coast and rest here to snack on the marine life teaming from the warmer waters of the bay. Digby Neck is on the route of minke, humpback, right, pilot and blue whales. Sea birds are also attracted to the peninsular by the abundance of food, and bird watchers will be impressed with the variety of bird life. The tides of Digby Neck's bay are some of the world's most dramatic, and when the icebergs on the bay have risen up higher than the level of the docks, it's a truly unique sight. Visitors brave the powerful swell through the mouth of the bay to the best whale watching spots on the tip of the peninsular or else take to the open seas to get up close to the whales. The best time to meet the whales at Digby Neck is between May and October when you will hopefully catch the boys at their most playful while they perform all kinds of leaping and splashing antics while trying to attract a mate.

Whale Sharks of Ningaloo Reef

Swim in clear, warm waters with the majestic, gentle giant, the Whale Shark. The Ningaloo Reef is one of the few places in the world where Whale Sharks regularly visit in large numbers. It is also close to the shore and shallow enough for people to snorkel safely. These spotted leviathans feed on the coral spawn which happens on mass during April and July, and aren't at all what you would anticipate from their name. Though up to 12 metres in length, Whale Sharks don't have the shark's signature sharp teeth and are generally good tempered around people. Other smaller and less friendly sharks are also common in the area, including the dangerous Tiger Shark and the well camouflaged, nocturnal Wobbegong.

Bai Yulu survives scare at World Games as carom champion Jaspers bows out

Chengdu, Aug 11 (UNI) Women's Snooker world champion Bai Yulu secured a thrilling victory to advance to the semifinals of the Six-red Snooker event at the Chengdu World Games, while Dutch veteran Dick Jaspers was eliminated in the men's Carom Three Cushion group stage today.

The women's Six-red Snooker event features eight players divided into two groups, with the top two from each group advancing to the knockout stage.

In a morning match, Bai Yulu lost to Thailand's Ploychompoo Laokiatphong, who secured her spot in the knockout round by winning all three of her round-robin matches.

With Bai's previous opponent, Fong Wai Wai from Hong Kong, China already eliminated, the evening match became a direct showdown between Bai Yulu and Mongolia's Naran TUYA Bayarsaikhan for the second qualifying spot.

Bai won the first frame 45-10 after a tactical exchange. She then sealed a 2-0 victory by winning the second frame after Bayarsaikhan missed an aggressive shot, allowing Bai to capitalize with a break of 18 points.

"I was actually prepared to be eliminated before the match," Bai said. "I felt a bit tense in the previous two matches and couldn't find my relaxed state."

Despite the challenge presented by the Six-red and best-of-three-frames format, Bai said she must adjust her mindset for the semifinals.

"I won't forget some of the good shots and great performances I've had, and I won't start doubting myself because of a few mistakes."

In the men's Carom Three Cushion, the decorated Jaspers finished with two group stage losses, falling to American Pedro Piedrabuena and South Korean Heo Jung-han. "It's hard to accept because I have a long history in The World Games, but this is the reality of sport sometimes," said Jaspers, a 60-year-old professional of 35 years.

"Unfortunately, I couldn't make a bigger impact in my event, and my opponents were stronger this time." Despite his result, Jaspers was deeply impressed by his experience in Chengdu.

"The trip to get here was long and the weather is very hot, but the organization and accommodation are the best I have experienced in my seven World Games appearances. China has done an excellent job hosting," he said.

Yuvraj Singh gives golden advice for India before CWC25

Mumbai, Aug 11 (UNI) : With just 50 days remaining until India hosts the ICC Women’s Cricket World Cup 2025, 2011 Men’s Cricket World Cup Player of the Tournament, Yuvraj Singh expressed confidence in the team’s chances. Reflecting on the special experience of playing a World Cup at home, Yuvraj stressed that while the occasion is significant, the key to success lies in the team staying true to their processes.

“I think the 50-over World Cup is the World Cup. It’s happening in India, and I think everybody should be really excited about it. These moments don't come often in your life, I believe,” Yuvraj said at the '50 days to go' event held in Mumbai. “I feel it's a great opportunity to create history. But that doesn't mean that from the start, you think you're winning it. You have to experience the whole enigma of it. You have to feel that you put in

the process, and the results will come,” he said.

“I think the women's team lost a couple of finals. We've been there. And it's really important that you enjoy this moment. Be in the moment rather than thinking ahead,” Yuvraj said. “We were supporting the boys. Now, it's time to support the girls,” he said.

A home World Cup comes with added pressure, something that the former Indian southpaw knows plenty about. He had some golden advice for the players, who will play in front of the home crowd at the upcoming tournament.

“The fans are always wanting fours and sixes, or like wickets. That's the game. They come to watch. They want entertainment. They want to be entertained,” he added.

"But the point is that if you want to win the World Cup, you have to be in the situation where you were at, I think. There will be times where they're going to feel that pressure,” Yuvraj said. “There will be

times when things are not going to go well. And that's the time when the experience, the self-belief, has to take over. The belief that I can be the player in this moment. I think every time you walk in the game, you have to believe that,” he said. Former skipper Mithali Raj was also alongside Yuvraj in the discussion panel and shared her experience on how women's cricket has grown, right from her early years to reaching the final \\\2017 World Cup, where India ended up as the runners-up.

“Coming under BCCI was a huge thing in 2006. The infrastructure and domestic setup were all taken care of, by the financial angle. Because before that there was hardly any international cricket. Now the girls play regularly, which helps a lot to keep the momentum,” Mithali said.

"Coming under ICC was a big moment as well. I remember in the 2009 T20 World Cup, my father saw

me on TV for the first time. Because there wasn't much in the women's game before that. I wanted to say goodbye to the sport because I was struggling with an injury since 2005," she said. "But when it was televised live by the ICC. My father watched it, those who wanted to be involved saw it. And that helped me continue in the game," Mithali said. "I remember I was watching a Champions Trophy game between India and Pakistan in 2017, and I was packing, and suddenly the commentators said that this [2017 Women's] World Cup is the next big ICC event. And there was a promo, and the captain's faces were there with the logo. And that really struck me," she said. "So it wasn't one moment, it's been a journey, and it was good to have been a part of it," Mithali added. The Women's World Cup will kick off on September 30, with India featuring in the tournament opener against Sri Lanka in Bengaluru.

Belgium, Israel ju-jitsukas defend World Games Ne-Waza titles

Chengdu, Aug 11 (UNI) : Belgium's Florian Bayili and Israel's Nimrod Ryeder both successfully defended their World Games Ne-Waza titles, while France's Estelle Gaspard dominated the women's 52kg Fighting division in ju-jitsu today.

Bayili retained his 69kg Ne-Waza crown with a win over the UAE's Mohamed Ali Alsuwaidi, the 2024 world silver medalist, in a rematch of the 2022 Birmingham World Games final. "The feeling is amazing. Mohamed keeps pushing me like I'm pushing him, so I'm very happy to have this final against him again," said Bayili. Israel's Ryeder also secured back-

to-back golds in the men's 77kg Ne-Waza, defeating the UAE's Mahdi Alawlaqi The victory extended Ryeder's unbeaten World Games record to eight matches since 2022. After two consecutive final defeats, the UAE claimed its first gold in Chengdu through Saeed Alkubaisi in the men's 85kg Ne-Waza.

The 2024 world bronze medalist overcame Portugal's Ramalho Pedro. In the newly established women's 52kg Fighting category, France's reigning world champion Estelle Gaspard defeated Italy's Antonella Farne. The two hugged tightly and cried after the match. "She's the

best. We are like sisters, Antonella and I, but we have to be opponents on the match," said Gaspard. "It's always special to fight against her." Germany's Sophie Buscher caused an upset in the women's 57kg Fighting, defeating two-time World Games medalist Rebekka Dahl of Denmark in the final after overcoming Dutch world champion Genevieve Bogers in the semifinal. Buscher paid tribute to the Danish legend afterwards.

"It's just amazing because Rebekka Dahl has always been my model when I was young.

I have never expected to defeat her in the final."

Canada, Mexico, China to host 2026-2027 Diving World Cup

Budapest, Aug 11 (UNI) : World Aquatics announced the host cities for the 2026 and 2027 editions of the World Aquatics Diving World Cup, which will kick off in Canada, Mexico and China.

The 2026 and 2027 World Aquatics Diving World Cup will feature three-stop events each year, including the Super Final, where athletes will compete at the highest level en route to the World Aquatics Championships scheduled for summer 2027

in Budapest, Hungary.

The three host cities and countries have a long history of staging major aquatics events and producing top divers.

Chen Yiwen, Olympic and world champion in the women's 3m springboard, expressed anticipation

to compete on home soil in front of the home crowds at China's National Aquatic Center.

Crystal Palace loses appeal over Europa League exclusion

London, Aug 11 (UNI) Crystal Palace has lost its appeal over the decision by UEFA to denote last season's FA Cup winners from this season's Europa League to the Conference League for a breach of UEFA's multi-club ownership rules. The Court of Arbitration for Sport (CAS) ruled that Nottingham Forest takes the spot Palace earned after beating Manchester City in last season's FA Cup final, and it is a blow to the club that beat Liverpool on Sunday in the Community Shield. The problem stems from the fact that American businessman John Textor held 43 percent of Palace's shares until June of this year, while he is also a majority shareholder in Olympique Lyon, which

has also qualified for the Europa League. Palace claimed Textor no longer influenced the club, but missed a March deadline to show UEFA the club no longer had issues with multi-club ownership.

"Regulations are clear and do not provide flexibility to clubs that are non-compliant on the assessment date, as Palace claimed."

"Textor still had decisive influence over both clubs at the time of UEFA's assessment date," ruled CAS. The decision means Palace will now play either Norwegian side Fredrikstad or Midtjylland of Denmark in the Conference League play-off round later this month, while Nottingham Forest goes directly to the Europa League group stage.

Manush flows, Anusha glows with gold medals

Vadodara, Aug 11 (UNI) The city proved a lucky venue for Manush Shah of RBI and Anusha Kutumbale of the Railways. Manush bagged his second men's singles crown at this venue of the first UTT National Ranking

Table Tennis Championships, and Anusha travelled far to earn her maiden women's singles title at the SAMA Indoor Stadium here tonight

Top seed and national champion Manush, the elegant left-hander, picked up from where he left off in the semifinals, brushing aside 11th seed Ronit Bhanja of the Railways in straight games. Ronit, undone by Manush's sharp placements and effortless rhythm, could only watch as the RBI paddler dictated every rally.

In the women's singles final, few would have predicted No. 12 seed Anusha Kutumbale's commanding triumph over Swastika Ghosh, especially given the speed with which she sealed the gold. The Railways paddler had been in imperious form all day, having dismantled reigning national champion and top seed Diya Chitale in the semifinals with the same authority.

Against Swastika, Anusha wobbled early, conceding the opening game, but quickly switched gears. Her sharp game awareness, clean winners, and relentless pace gradually broke down Diya's resistance, just as they had undone Diya's usually reliable counters and topspin game.

With composure and precision, Anusha closed out the contest to lift her maiden National Rankingsingles title—a breakthrough moment in her career.

Manush Shah and Ronit Bhanja booked their places in the men's singles final with hard-fought and identical semi final wins (4-1) over Payas Jain and SFR Snehit, respectively. In the women's singles, Anusha and Swastika overcame Diya Chitale and Yashaswini Ghorpade to set up the title clash. Though it was comparatively easy for Anusha, Swastika was forced to drop two games by her rival.

In the Youth Boys' singles final, Assam's Priyanuj Bhattacharyya delivered a performance that reflected both maturity and hunger. Up against Maharashtra's Kushala Chopda, Priyanuj dictated terms from the outset, blending power with consistency to keep his opponent under constant pressure.

It was a far cry from his earlier, less assured outings in major finals, and the one-sided result was proof of his growth. By the end, there was little doubt that the title had gone to the player who had worked harder, thought smarter, and executed better under the spotlight.

In the U-19 girls final, Syndrela Das denied Divyanshi Bhowmick a dream finish, winning 4-2 in a gripping contest. After losing the opening game, the West Bengal paddler led 2-1, saw her opponent hit back, and then edged the sixth 13-11 to close out her second national title.

The U-19 boys' singles summit will feature Kushal Raut and Priyanuj Bhattacharyya after their straightforward victories. At the same time, Divyanshi Bhowmick and Syndrela Das advanced to the U-19 girls' singles final after battling through tense five-game encounters.

Ananya Muralidharan, despite leading 2-0, allowed Syndrela to claw her way back and wrap up the match, as did Divyanshi after trailing 0-2 against Ditsa Roy.

Regular Mock Drills Should be Conducted on Fire Safety Measures to Ensure Safety in Train Operations : Sanjay Kumar Srivastava, GM, SCR

Hyderabad, Aug 11 : Mr Sanjay Kumar Srivastava, General Manager, South Central Railway conducted a detailed review meeting on Safety of train operations across the Zone today i.e., 11th August, 2025 at Rail Nilayam, Secunderabad along with Shri Satya Prakash, Additional General Manager, SCR and Principal Heads of Departments. Divisional Railway Managers (DRMs) of all the six divisions viz., Vijayawada, Guntakal, Guntur, Secunderabad, Hyderabad and Nanded Divisions participated through video conference.

While addressing the meeting, the General Manager instructed the officials to conduct regular



mock drills on fire safety measures to ensure safety in train operations. He instructed officials to adhere all the safety precautions while stabling the empty coaches in the stabling yards. He also instructed to ensure proper

closure of doors, removal of batteries and secure all the electrical accessories in the condemned coaches while stabling in the yards and strengthen the surveillance. He instructed the officials to prepare appropriate action plan to identify the

gaps and rectify them on priority basis to prevent fire incidents. Further he instructed DRMs to make an action plan for quick disposal of condemned coaches.

Shri Sanjay Kumar Srivastava emphasized on

the safety of track, he instructed officials to conduct drives to cut the tree branches near the Over Head Equipment (OHE) in view of monsoons. He also instructed to intensify the drives to identify the water logging points near the

bridges, at ballast retaining walls and in-between tracks. Drainage system at vulnerable locations to be strengthened and it should be monitored regularly for proper flow of rain water, he added.

The General Manager also examined the safety action plans pertaining to different departments including Mechanical, Engineering, Electrical and Signal & Telecommunication and reviewed the availability of safety equipment such as fire extinguishers etc. While discussing on the crew working hours, he instructed officials to make thorough action plan focusing to provide proper rest to the on-duty crew at proper time and interval.

Joint teams for RPF and GRP crack high value theft cases, reassure public safety

Mumbai, Aug 11 : In a major success, joint teams of the Railway Protection Force (RPF) and Government Railway Police (GRP) have solved two high-value theft cases involving passenger belongings, reinforcing public confidence in railway security.

The cases relate to the theft of approximately 11

tolas of gold ornaments worth around ₹3,93,000/- from passengers travelling on Train No. 11087 (Veraval–Pune) and Train No. 11049 (Ahmedabad–Kolhapur).

Upon receiving the complaints, a dedicated joint task force was formed. Preliminary investigation identified members of the notorious Sansi gang as prime

suspects. The team conducted a detailed analysis of CCTV footage from Pune, Shivajinagar, Lonavala, and Miraj railway stations, which confirmed the gang's involvement.

Through coordinated and persistent efforts, the joint team successfully recovered the entire stolen property and apprehended all accused persons.

This operation was

executed with precision under the able guidance of IG/RPF, SrDSC/Pune, and SP Railways Pune.“

The RPF has appealed to passengers to remain vigilant and keep valuables, particularly gold ornaments, under close watch during their journey. Passenger alertness plays a crucial role in preventing such incidents and ensuring safe travel.

Nitish launches Rs 766.73 crore projects for Western Patna

Patna, Aug 11 (UNI) Bihar Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar today laid the foundation stones for six major infrastructure projects worth Rs 766.73 crore for development of the Western region of Patna, primarily focusing on road expansion and c o n n e c t i v i t y , transformation traffic conditions, reduction of

congestion and to support the region’s rapid urban growth.

While laying the foundation stones for the projects at various ceremonies held at AIIMS Golambar and near the Kothwan–Rupaspur Canal, Kumar said here that the development would directly benefit commuters and residents in one of Patna’s

fastest-growing corridors.

“These projects will make travel across western Patna faster and easier, reduce traffic jams, and provide smoother links from Nehru Path through Patlipath to JP Setu and AIIMS,” the Chief Minister stated.

The six projects foundation for which were laid include AIIMS

Golambar–Janipur–Panapur New Road (Two-lane widening and strengthening) at Rs 138.50 crore, flyover at Naubatpur Lakh on Naubatpur–Masaudhi Road at RS 73.06 crore, khagaul–Nehru Path four-lane upgrade via Ashok Raj Path–Rupaspur Canal Path at Rs 71.48 crore, connectivity link from Digha–AIIMS–

Patlipath to Nehru Path towards Danapur at Rs 143.86 crore, Nehru Path widening from Rupaspur Canal to Saguna turning with underground drainage at Rs 318.51 crore and widening and strengthening of Nehru Path to Gola Road at Rs 21.35 crore.

During the function, Kumar emphasised that the

works will integrate with the Bihta–Sarmera Highway (NH-139), improving access for areas such as Phulwarisharif, AIIMS, Danapur, and Naubatpur.

The Naubatpur flyover, he added, will eliminate chronic bottlenecks, easing travel for both residents and freight transporters heading towards Masaurhi, Bikram, and beyond.

Mahavitaran's customers affected by failure in Mahatransco's power line“Kalyan

Mumbai, Aug 11 : Mahavitaran's Padgha-Mohane 100 KV power line broke down between 10.30 am on Monday, 11.00 am and 10.30 am, causing about one lakh electricity customers of Mahavitaran to have to endure load management for eight hours. The wire in the tower of Mahatransco's Padgha-Mohane power line suddenly broke in the Galegaon area. As a result, one lakh electricity customers of Mahavitaran in Badlapur, Ambernath, Ulhasnagar were affected.

The sudden power supply disruption put

pressure on the Mahavitaran system. The officials of Mahavitaran were overwhelmed to maintain smooth power supply. As a result, Mahavitaran had to carry out load management in the Badlapur, Ambernath, Ulhasnagar areas from 11.00 am.

Finally, after the power supply of Mahatransco was restored around 6.15 pm, Mahavitaran gradually supplied power to electricity consumers in Ambernath, Ulhasnagar, Badlapur.“
