10 red sander smugglers get 5 years imprisonment

Kadapa, July 31 (UNI) The RSSADJ court sentenced 10 red sander smugglers to five years imprisonment on Thursday. RSSADJ court Judge Narasimha Murthy convicted 10 red sander smugglers to five years rigorous imprisonment and also imposed Rs 6 lakh fine each on them. The red sander smugglers were arrested and a case was registered under Crime Number 59/2019. The convicted smugglers were apprehended when they were transporting red sander logs at Perumallapalli village under TAN Palem forest section in NVNV forest division. As the prosecution succeeded in proving the case in the court, the judge convicted the 10 red sander smugglers- C Viswanathan, D Sethu, D Ramesh, M Sampath, V Ratnam, M Boochayan, J Kumar, C Prabhu, M Suresh and C Ramar to five years imprisonment. All the convicted persons hailed from Tiruvannamalai and Veluru districts in Tamil Nadu. They were sent to the Nellore central prison. Red Sanders Task Force SP P Srinivas warned of stringent action against those who indulge in red sander log smuggling. The SP appreciated the police and the task force officials for ensuring the smugglers were punished in the court.

YSRCP demands fair conduct of local body by-polls

Vijayawada, July 31 (UNI): YSRCP has called on the State Election Commission (SEC) to ensure that the upcoming local body by-elections are conducted in a transparent and impartial manner.

A delegation of YSRCP leaders, including former Chief Whip Gadikota Srikanth Reddy, former MLA Malladi Vishnu, MLC Mondithoka Arun Kumar, and NTR District YSRCP President Devineni Avinash, met SEC Neelam Sawhney here on Thursday to submit a memorandum outlining their concerns. The delegation emphasized the need for a free and fair electoral process, citing a deteriorating law-and-order situation and intimidation tactics by the ruling coalition that threaten the democratic rights of voters and candidates.

The YSRCP leaders expressed alarm over the prevailing atmosphere of fear, which they claim prevents voters from exercising their franchise

freely. They highlighted specific instances of intimidation, including a reported threat by a leader named B.Tech Ravi in Pulivendula, YSR Kadapa district, who warned candidates against filing nominations.

“The Naidu headed ruling coalition is resorting to threats and violence to suppress opposition voices,” said Gadikota Srikanth Reddy. “We have urged the SEC to appoint honest and competent officials to oversee the elections and ensure online nomination processes to prevent coercion.”

The Commissioner responded positively, noting that software for online nominations is ready and can be implemented upon government approval.

The delegation demanded robust security measures, including police protection for candidates filing nominations and comprehensive CCTV surveillance from the nomination stage to vote

counting. Former MLA Malladi Vishnu criticized the coalition government for undermining democracy through what he described as a “Red Book Constitution” that enables attacks on political opponents.

MLC Mondithoka Arun Kumar accused the coalition government of orchestrating efforts to silence the opposition and prevent fair elections. “The government’s actions mock democracy by intimidating candidates and obstructing free voting,” he asserted.

“We have requested the Election Commission to intervene and ensure that the by-elections on August 10 are conducted transparently, with police protection for candidates and CCTV monitoring at every stage.” Devineni Avinash cited the recent Tiruvuru municipality chairman election, where YSRCP’s majority was allegedly undermined through inducements and abductions of councillors.

Rahul Gandhi backs Trump’s ‘dead economy’ remark, slams Modi and Sitharaman

New Delhi, July 31 (UNI): Leader of Opposition in Lok Sabha Rahul Gandhi today backed US President Donald Trump’s remark calling the Indian economy as “dead”, and said the whole world knows except for the Prime Minister and Finance Minister.

Notably, Trump on his social media platform said that a trade deal with Pakistan had just been concluded and both countries (India and Russia) could take their

“dead economies” down together.

Gandhi further alleged, “The main issue facing India today is that the government has completely destroyed our economic policy, our defence policy, and our foreign policy. Prime Minister Modi is working for only one person — Adani. Small businesses across the country have been

In a post on X immediately after the 2,393 kg was successfully injected in to the Polar Sun Synchronous Orbit by the heaviest rocket GSLV-F16 after a majestic lift off from the Second Launch Pad at SHAR Range here, the Minister of State (Independent Charge) said “Congratulations India!”. “Successful launch of

#GSLV-F16 carrying the world’s first dual-band radar satellite #NISAR...a game changer in precise management of disasters like cyclones, floods etc. Also, it’s capacity to penetrate through fogs, dense clouds, ice layers etc make it a pathbreaking enabler for aviation and shipping sectors”, Dr Jitendra, said, sharing a video of the satellite taking off from the Launch Pad.

“The inputs from NISAR will benefit the entire world community...in the true spirit of “Vishwabandhu””, he said. “Proud to be associated with the Department of Space at a time when Team @isro is registering one global milestone after the other under the supportive patronage of PM @narendramodi.

TTD warns against filming social media reels

Tirumala, July 31 (UNI) Tirumaka Tirupati Devasthanam (TTD) on Thursday warned against filming social media in Tirumala hills. In a release, the TTD said it has come to the notice of that some people have recently been filming videos (reels) of people performing mischievous acts in front of the Tirumala Temple and uploading them on social media. Congress asks whether govt will challenge Malegaon verdict in SC

Mumbai, July 31 (UNI) Stating that his party has always stood firmly against terrorism, the Maharashtra Pradesh Congress Committee (MPCC) chief Harshvardhan Sapkal today asked whether the state government would challenge the Malegaon bomb blast verdict in the Supreme Court. Hours after the Special National Investigation Agency (NIA) court here acquitted all seven accused in the 2008 Malegaon bomb blast case, Sapkal emphasised that terrorism has no religion or colour and a terrorist must be punished. Speaking to reporters at state Congress headquarters Tilak Bhavan here, Sapkal pointed out that the state government has decided to approach the apex judiciary over the Mumbai railway blasts verdict/ “The question is whether it will also do the same in the Malegaon bomb blast verdict,” he said.

Bhiwandi, July 31 : Joint meeting of Administrator and Commissioner with Ganesh Mandal, Police Department and various agencies on the occasion of upcoming Ganeshotsav - Appeal for environmentally friendly Ganeshotsav and use of artificial lakes
Ganeshotsav festival will be celebrated from 27/ 08/2025 to 06/09/2025. For this, a joint meeting was organized under the chairmanship of Hon'ble Administrator and Commissioner Shri. Anmol Sagar (B.P.S.) with the officers of the Police Department, officers of the Torrent Department, Chairman and members of the Public Ganeshotsav Mahamandal, Bhiwandi and the officers of the concerned departments of the Municipal Corporation. In this meeting, the Chairman of the Public Ganeshotsav Mahamandal, Madan Bhoi and the members mentioned various matters in the meeting and requested to complete them before Ganeshotsav. These mainly include repair of the road on the Ganesh arrival and immersion route, repair of

the Ganesh immersion ghat, pond, safety insurance for lifeguards on the immersion ghat, giving proper remuneration and good food to the lifeguards on the immersion ghat, immediately issuing the necessary permits to the mandals, making electricity arrangements on the Ganesh arrival and immersion route, removing encroachments on the Ganesh arrival and immersion route, and providing rafts, cranes, lifters as per the demand of the Ganesh mandal on the immersion ghat.“
On behalf of the police department, Assistant Commissioner of Police Mr. Sachin Sangle informed about the action being taken by the department regarding law and order. He also appealed to the police to cooperate in celebrating Ganeshotsav peacefully and harmoniously.“
After that, Hon. Administrator and Commissioner Mr. Anmol Sagar while guiding the attendees said that the demands made by us will definitely be fulfilled through the Municipal Corporation and the police system. We have also started the road

work on the Ganesh arrival and immersion route and have deployed route officers at every place and the administration will be paying full attention to it. The work of repairing the immersion ghats is also underway, we will spray potassium permanganate in Varhaldevi Lake 10 days before Ganeshotsav to clean the water. It was also informed that the garbage of the immersion ghats will be collected daily and sprayed with disinfectant and deodorant there, arrangements of Nirmalya Kalash at all the immersion ghats and near the artificial lakes, and that care will be taken to ensure that the power supply in the city is not interrupted during the Ganeshotsav period. He also appealed to Ganesh devotees to use as many artificial lakes as possible for Ganapati immersion. The Commissioner stated that artificial lakes will be made available at various places for this.
At the same time, instructions have been given to all the Ganesh Mandals in the city that

they should celebrate Ganeshotsav in an environmentally friendly manner. Thermocol and plastic bags should not be used in the 20 to 30 meter area of the pavilion. Garbage from the pavilion will be collected daily and disinfectant and deodorant will be sprayed there through the Municipal Corporation.

Putin signs law allowing investigators to suspend bank transactions by suspects

Moscow, July 31 (UNI) : Russian President Vladimir Putin has signed a law granting investigators the right to suspend bank account transactions by suspects for up to 10 days if it is proven that the accounts were used for criminal purposes. The document published on the government's web portal of legal acts on Thursday supplements the Russian Criminal Procedure Code with a new Article 115.2. Under the law, investigators may suspend suspects' bank transactions with the consent of their senior officer, in case of an emergency, or if there is evidence that bank accounts, deposits, electronic money, and money paid for communication services are being used for criminal activities. The law supplements an article of the Russian Criminal Procedure Code, which stipulates that transaction and telecommunications operators must provide the information on transactions within three days since the date the money has been received or within the period stated in a request from law enforcement.

Two soldiers from Punjab martyred in Ladakh landslide; final farewell today

Chandigarh, July 31 (UNI) : In a tragic incident, two soldiers from Punjab, Lieutenant Colonel Bhanu Pratap Singh from Pathankot and Naik Daljit Singh from Gurdaspur, were martyred in a landslide in Ladakh while on duty. The incident occurred on Wednesday morning when a massive rock fell on their military vehicle as they were traveling from Durbuk to Chongtash in a convoy. Their vehicle was severely damaged.
Naik Daljit Singh had served in the Army for nearly 9 years and had been saving to build his dream home. In a tragic twist of fate, the news of his martyrdom reached the family on the very day they finalized a mason for the construction.
Three other Army officers: Major Mayank Shubham (14 Sind Horse), Major Amit Dixit, and Captain Gaurav (60 Armed) were also injured in the incident. They are currently undergoing treatment at the 153 General Hospital in Leh, where their condition is reported to be stable.

Grief descended over Pathankot and Shamsherpur village, the native places of the two martyrs. Naik Daljit Singh's family and villagers are inconsolable. Locals remember Daljit as a patriot from a young age who fulfilled his dream of serving the nation by joining the Army. He had been posted in Ladakh for several years.
Daljit's father, Gulzar Singh, said, “Around 3:30 pm, Army personnel came to our house and informed us about the incident. My son had returned to duty three months ago after leave. Just two days ago, he spoke to us about his plans to build a house and asked me to find a good mason. We finalized one yesterday, but today we received this tragic news. We're in shock. He had saved money for the house over 8-9 years of service.”
His mother, Gurjit Kaur, tearfully recounted, “He called two days ago, saying he was fine but busy. He was excited about building the house after the

monsoons and asked us to find a mason. We did, but now everything is left incomplete.”
Daljit was the primary support for his parents, two sisters, and a brother, who works in Dubai. The family's financial condition is modest, and their home is in poor condition. Daljit had been saving diligently to build a new house.
Pathankot's Bhanu Pratap Singh had recently been promoted to Lieutenant Colonel, a moment of pride for his family. His sudden martyrdom has left them shattered.
The mortal remains of both soldiers will be brought from Ladakh to Pathankot Airbase today.
Naik Daljit Singh's body will then be taken to his native village, Shamsherpur, while Lieutenant Colonel Bhanu Pratap Singh's remains will be taken to his residence in Pathankot. Both will be laid to rest with full military honors, including a guard of honour and floral tributes by the Army and district administration.

Piyush Goyal's statement came a day after Trump described India as a "dead economy".
The US President had said on his social media platform that both India and Russia could take their "dead economies down together" and added that US had concluded a trade deal with Pakistan.

ITBP, Dept of Biotechnology join hands to boost health

New Delhi, July 31 (UNI) : In a major step towards improving the health and wellbeing of jawans posted in difficult high-altitude terrains, the Indo-Tibetan Border Police (ITBP) today signed an agreement with the Department of Biotechnology (DBT).
The Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was signed here in presence of Rajesh S Gokhale, Secretary, DBT, Rahul Rasgotra, Director General, ITBP and other senior officials, an official statement said.
This collaboration aims to use modern biotechnology to solve the unique health and environmental challenges faced by ITBP personnel serving in some of the world's toughest and coldest border areas.
Key areas of focus include better healthcare for jawans that include tackling problems like high-altitude sickness, low oxygen (hypoxia) and extreme cold conditions.
The other areas include advanced medical support such as bringing diagnostic tools and telemedicine to remote border posts; research into improved diets, stress relief methods and genetic studies for better adaptation to harsh climates. Through this partnership, both organisations will work together on studies to understand how high altitudes affect the body and mind, development of special nutrition packs and emergency medical kits and cold-weather health gear.

Four held in Rs 100 crore pan-India cyber fraud case

New Delhi, July 31 (UNI) A pan-India cyber fraud syndicate was busted and four key accused allegedly involved in duping people through fake online investment platforms were arrested by the Cyber Cell of Delhi Police's Crime Branch, officials said today.
According to police sources, the case was registered on the complaint of a businessman who was allegedly cheated of ₹48.35 lakh via a fraudulent trading website fxprovip.com. He was lured into investing through Facebook Messenger and WhatsApp. The arrested accused have been identified as Sunny Mishra (22), Kuldeep Kumar (25), Gaurav (20), and Sumit

Pradhan (27).
Police said the gang used multiple “mule” bank accounts opened in the names of vulnerable persons to transfer and withdraw defrauded money. Over 23 bank accounts linked to the group have been identified, and additional accounts are currently under verification.
"Investigation revealed that Gaurav arranged multiple fake bank accounts and handed over credentials to Sumit Pradhan, who is employed at a reputed Bank, and facilitated large-scale cash withdrawals, and bypassed all the verification proceedings during opening of account," police said.

Speaking on the occasion, Dr. Aftab Hussain, Coordinator for the PURSE grant for IIITH, said, "This will be a major boost for material science and VLSI research at IIITH and will provide a platform for external users in the region to have access to specialised tools. Justice Pinakini Ghosh Commission submits Kaleshwaram project inquiry report to Telangana Govt

The Commission, constituted by the Telangana government on March 14, 2024, probed the structural and operational issues in the Medigadda, Annaram, and Sundilla

The inquiry follows the sinking of piers at the Medigadda barrage in late 2023, along with seepage problems at the Annaram and Sundilla barrages. After the Congress government assumed office in December 2023, it ordered a vigilance probe and a study by the National Dam Safety Authority (NDSA). Dementia diagnosis delayed by average 3.5 yrs, early detection must

A new study led by researchers at University College London (UCL) has highlighted a worrying trend in dementia care globally: people with dementia are diagnosed, on average, 3.5 years after symptoms first emerge, and the delay is even longer—4.1 years — in cases of early-onset dementia.

The findings come at a time when dementia is poised to become one of the greatest health and social care challenges of the 21st century.

As populations age globally — including in India where approximately 8.8 million individuals aged 60 and above are currently affected by the condition -- the need for early detection, integrated care models, and policy-backed support systems has never been more urgent.

Published in the International Journal of Geriatric Psychiatry, this is the first global systematic review and meta-analysis examining the average time to diagnosis in dementia, based on data drawn from 13 studies conducted in Europe, the United States, Australia and China. Collectively, these studies covered 30,257 participants.

The review evaluated the time from the first noticeable symptoms — reported either by patients themselves or their caregivers — to a formal medical diagnosis of dementia. According to the findings, early diagnosis remains a significant unmet need in healthcare systems around the world.

“Timely diagnosis of dementia remains a major global challenge, shaped by a complex set of factors,” said Dr. Vasiliki Orgeta, lead author and researcher at UCL’s Division of Psychiatry. “Only 50-65% of dementia cases are diagnosed in high-income countries. In many other countries, the rate is even lower.”

The analysis further found that younger individuals and those with frontotemporal dementia are more likely to face longer delays in diagnosis. One of the reviewed studies also indicated a trend of longer diagnostic delays among Black patients, pointing towards possible racial or systemic disparities, although more robust data is needed.

Several contributing factors to the delay were identified. These included symptoms mistaken for normal ageing, fear and stigma associated with cognitive decline, lack of public awareness, inconsistent referral pathways in health systems, limited access to specialists and under-resourced memory clinics, cultural and linguistic barriers in clinical assessments.

“Symptoms of dementia are often dismissed or misunderstood, and the stigma attached to it prevents many from seeking help,” added Dr. Phuong Leung, co-author from UCL.

The authors have called for multi-pronged strategies to address the diagnostic gap, including public awareness campaigns to educate communities on early signs of dementia and reduce stigma, training for general practitioners and frontline clinicians to better recognise and refer dementia cases early, and improved access to memory clinics and culturally sensitive diagnostic tools

“Timely diagnosis is not merely a clinical milestone—it determines access to treatment, support services, and the possibility of maintaining quality of life for longer,” said Dr. Orgeta. “Delays come at a human cost.”

Dementia is not a single disease, but rather a syndrome — a group of symptoms affecting memory, thinking, behaviour, and the ability to perform everyday activities. It is caused by damage to brain cells, which interferes with their normal communication and function.

In India, the number of people afflicting with dementia is expected to nearly double, reaching an estimated 17 million by 2036, underscoring the urgent need for strengthened healthcare infrastructure and targeted interventions.

Housing market in tier-I cities witnessed strong surge in demand in H1 CY25

The Confederation of Real Estate Developers’ Associations of India (CREDAI), in collaboration with CRE Matrix, has unveiled the CREDAI India Housing Report July 2025, spotlighting a remarkable surge in India’s residential real estate market. The report records a record-breaking ₹3.6 lakh crore in primary housing sales across Tier-1 cities in the first half of Calendar Year 2025 (H1 CY25), marking a 9% increase from Rs 3.3 lakh crore in H1 CY24. Despite a 4% decline in units sold (from 2.7 lakh to 2.54 lakh), a 14% rise in average ticket size from Rs 1.24 crore to Rs 1.42 crore underscores a growing consumer preference for premium and luxury homes.

The report highlights significant regional variations, with the National Capital Region (NCR) leading the market with a 26% revenue share, fueled by a 21% increase in sales value and a 32% surge in average ticket size. Luxury flats priced above Rs 3 crore accounted for 73% of NCR’s sales value, despite a modest volume of 25,000 units sold. The Mumbai Metropolitan Region (MMR) followed closely with a 23% revenue share, recording a 9% growth in sales value and 75,000 units sold, with a 16% increase in average ticket size. The share of homes priced above ₹3.5 crore in MMR rose from

29% to 34%, reflecting a strong tilt toward ultra-premium housing.

In the south, Chennai emerged as a standout performer, achieving a 23% increase in sales value with 11,000 units sold and a 12% rise in average ticket size. New launches in Chennai grew from 14,000 to 19,000 units, though the market share of homes below ₹70 lakh dropped from 23% to 17%. Bengaluru maintained steady growth with a 4% increase in sales value and 30,000 units sold, supported by a 17% rise in ticket size. However, the share of homes priced between Rs 70 lakh and ₹1.5 crore declined from 38% to 32%. Hyderabad, while recording a modest 2% increase in sales value, saw 11% drop-in units sold (30,000 units) but a doubling of new launches from 23,000 to 42,000 units, indicating developer optimism despite slower absorption.

Ahmedabad matched NCR’s unit sales with approximately 25,000 units sold, posting a 10% increase in sales value and a 7% rise in ticket size. The city saw a sharp decline in new launches, from 31,000 to 11,000 units, yet affordable homes under Rs 70 lakh gained a 2% market share, rising from 27% to 29%. Kolkata reported a 17% growth in sales value with 10,000 units sold and a 19% increase in ticket size. The market share of homes above Rs 3 crore surged

from 14% to 26%, though 53% of the market remained below Rs 1.5 crore, reflecting a balanced buyer base. In contrast, Pune faced challenges, with an 8.5% decline in sales value and 14% drop-in units sold (45,000 units). New launches in Pune fell from 61,000 to 39,000 units, and the mid-market segment (Rs 50 lakh–Rs 1 crore) saw a 5% decline in share, though ticket sizes rose by 7%.

The decline in new launches across most cities, from 98,000 in H2 CY24 to 82,000 in H1 CY25, signals a cautious approach by developers amid rising costs. However, the robust growth in transaction values highlights the sector’s resilience and the increasing premiumisation of the market.

Commenting on the report and the evolving market, Shekhar Patel, President, CREDAI, said, “We are witnessing a decisive shift in homebuyer preferences across India. The demand is clearly moving towards larger, better-located, and more premium homes—reflecting rising aspirations and improved purchasing power. A 21% growth in NCR’s housing value, despite lower volumes, is a clear indicator that quality and location are now more important than quantity. This trend is visible in markets like Kolkata and Chennai as well, where value growth outpaces unit

sales. It marks a defining moment for Indian real estate—one shaped by ambition, confidence, and long-term vision. At CREDAI, we remain committed to working closely with policymakers, developers, and financial institutions to support this evolving market through greater transparency, sustainable practices, and inclusive growth.”

Philippines President Marcos to visit India on August 4-8

New Delhi, July 31 (UNI) President of the Republic of the Philippines, Ferdinand R Marcos Jr., will pay a state visit to India from August 4 to 8, 2025, at the invitation of Prime Minister Narendra Modi.This will be President Marcos’s first official visit to India since assuming office.The visit coincides with the 75th anniversary of the establishment of diplomatic relations between India and the Philippines, an important milestone that reflects the growing strategic and people-centric ties between the two nations.According to the Ministry of External Affairs, the President will be accompanied by First Lady Madame Louise Araneta Marcos, along with a high-level delegation that includes Cabinet Ministers, senior government officials, and leading representatives from the Philippine business sector. In addition to high-profile engagements in New Delhi, President Marcos will also visit Bengaluru before returning to the Philippines on August 8.

The visit is an "opportunity for both leaders to set the path for future bilateral cooperation, and to engage on regional and international issues of mutual interest".

President Marcos will hold bilateral talks with PM Modi in New Delhi on August 5 to discuss the full spectrum of India-Philippines relations, with a focus on defense cooperation, trade and investment, maritime security, and regional developments.The Ministry of External Affairs noted, “India’s relations with the Philippines are an integral pillar of our ‘Act East’ Policy, Vision MAHASAGAR, and our broader Indo-Pacific outlook.”Diplomatic relations between India and the Philippines were established in November 1949. Both countries have since developed a strong partnership across a wide spectrum of areas, including trade and investment, defence and security, maritime cooperation, agriculture, healthcare, pharmaceuticals and digital technologies. The two countries also engage closely at regional level, including through India’s Comprehensive Strategic Partnership with ASEAN.During the visit, President Marcos will also meet President Droupadi Murmu. TRAI Assesses Network Quality Across Visakhapatnam City and Coastal Corridor

The Telecom Regulatory Authority of India (TRAI) released its Independent Drive Test (IDT) findings for the Andhra Pradesh Licensed Service Area (LSA), covering extensive city routes of Visakhapatnam City and coastal corridor in the month of June 2025. The drive tests, conducted under the supervision of the TRAI Regional Office, Hyderabad, were designed to capture real-world mobile network performance across diverse usage environments- Urban Zones, Institutional Hotspots, Coastal and rural residential areas etc.

Between 10th June 2025 to 13th June 2025, TRAI teams conducted detailed tests across 342.9 Kms of city drive test, 3.6Kms of walk test, 19Kms of coastal corridor drive test and 8 Hotspot locations. Technologies evaluated included 2G, 3G, 4G, and 5G, reflecting the service

experience of users across multiple handset capabilities. The findings of the IDT have been intimated to all the TSPs concerned.

Key Parameters Assessed:

a) **Voice Services:** Call Setup Success Rate (CSSR), Drop Call Rate (DCR), Call Setup Time, Call Silence Rate, Speech Quality (MOS), and Coverage.

The other areas include advanced medical support such as bringing diagnostic tools and telemedicine to remote border posts; research into improved diets,

stress relief methods and genetic studies for better adaptation to harsh climates. Through this partnership, both organisations will work together on studies to understand how high altitudes affect the body and mind, development of special nutrition packs and emergency medical kits and cold-weather health gear. This partnership marks a big leap towards ensuring that our brave jawans get the best possible support while guarding the nation's borders under the most challenging conditions.

Japan records highest temperature in Hyogo prefecture, crossing 41.2 Celsius

Kobe, July 31 (UNI) Japan recorded its highest ever temperature yesterday, in the western prefecture of Hyogo, according to the findings of the Japan Meteorological Agency (JMA) reported today.

The mercury hit the above-human temperature of 41.2 degrees Celsius in the city of Tamba in Hyogo Prefecture at 14:39 local time on Wednesday, beating the previous high of 41.1 degrees Celsius marked in Kumagaya City, Saitama Prefecture, in 2018 and in Hamamatsu City, Shizuoka Prefecture, in 2020, the JMA said.Meanwhile, Fukuchiyama City in Kyoto Prefecture and Maniwa City in Okayama Prefecture also logged extremely high temperatures of 40.6 degrees Celsius and 40.2 degrees Celsius on Wednesday, respectively.

As such, Wednesday marked the first day this year that temperatures of over 40 degrees Celsius were recorded in the country.Last year, Mino City in Gifu Prefecture hit that mark on Aug. 16.

The weather agency said the ongoing heat wave was likely to continue in much of Japan from Saturday through Monday, urging people to use air conditioners and cooling fans properly and take fluids frequently.

At least 6 killed, 52 injured in Russian raids on Ukrainian capital

Kiev, July 31 (UNI) : At least six people were killed and 52 injured in Russian missile and drone strikes on the Ukrainian capital early Thursday, said local authorities.

Tymur Tkachenko, head of the Kiev City Military Administration, wrote on Telegram that a six-year-old boy was among the victims.

The attack hit 27 locations in the city and destroyed part of a 9-story apartment building, he said.

Kiev Mayor Vitali Klitschko said that another apartment building was severely damaged in the western Solomianskyi district.Rescue operations at the sites of the strikes are going on and the number of victims may rise, according to Tkachenko.

Meanwhile, Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky wrote on Telegram that Russia launched more than 300 drones and eight missiles at Ukraine on Thursday, with most of them targeting Kiev.

Taiwan says reached consensus with US on tariffs : Reports

Beijing, July 31 (UNI) : The United States and Taiwan have completed technical consultations and reached consensus on tariffs and non-tariff trade barriers, Taiwan's Central News Agency (CNA) reported on Thursday, citing Taiwanese government spokeswoman Michelle Lee.

Lee said that both sides "have reached a certain level of consensus," among other things, on issues such as tariffs, non-tariff trade barriers, investment and procurement, supply chain resilience, and economic security, the news agency reported.

The government's position during the talks was to "protect national and industrial interests, and ensure food security and public health," the official said.

"We will firmly uphold our position," Lee said.

Negotiations between the parties on a joint statement are ongoing, and a public report will be submitted after the US government completes the decision-making process, CNA reported.

On April 2, US President Donald Trump signed an executive order imposing 10% reciprocal tariffs on imports, with higher rates for 57 countries starting April 9, based on US trade deficits. Taiwanese goods were set to be subject to a 32% tariff. After over 75 countries sought negotiations instead of retaliation, the 10% base rate was applied for 90 days until July 9. Two days before the deadline, Trump extended the suspension of higher tariffs to August 1, but notified several countries that increased rates would apply from that date.

Indonesia, Japan, Peru lift Tsunami warning after Kamchatka earthquake

Jakarta, July 31 (UNI) : Indonesian, Japanese and Peruvian meteorological agencies have lifted their tsunami warnings issued following the massive earthquake in Russia's Kamchatka, media reported on Thursday.

Indonesia's Agency for Meteorology, Climatology and Geophysics lifted the tsunami warning at 11 p.m. local time (16:00 GMT) on Wednesday. The magnitude 8.8 earthquake struck Russia's Kamchatka peninsula earlier that day, sending waves across the Indo-Pacific. Indonesian authorities responded by issuing a tsunami warning and giving evacuation orders to residents of coastal areas in five provinces.

The Japan Meteorological Agency lifted all effective tsunami warnings on the Pacific coast on Thursday, Japanese media reported. Its map now shows only a tsunami forecast, which means small changes in the sea level, the NHK broadcaster said.

Peru's navy said that after the analysis and assessment conducted by the National Tsunami Warning Center, the tsunami warning on the Peruvian coast had been canceled, adding that the agency would continue to monitor the situation.Meanwhile, Chile's National Service for Disaster Prevention and Response (SENAPRED) said that the height of the tsunami waves that had affected the country's coast near the town of Boyeruca reached 2.5 meters (8.2 feet) in one area. The service said earlier that Chile had began evacuation in the coastal zone of the continental part of the country due to the threat of a tsunami.

The BRICS is a group formed by 11 countries: Brazil, Russia, India, China, South Africa, Saudi Arabia, Egypt, United Arab Emirates, Ethiopia, Indonesia, and Iran. The BRICS partner countries are: Belarus, Bolivia, Cuba, Kazakhstan, Malaysia, Nigeria, Thailand, Uganda, and Uzbekistan.

Since January this year, Brazil officially assumed the BRICS chairmanship for 2025. In its capacity as pro tempore BRICS Chair, the Government of Brazil announced the formal admission of Vietnam as a partner country of the group. Vietnam becomes the tenth BRICS partner country.

Earlier on July 26, the Consulate General of India in Shanghai launched its "India Impressions" film festival (with fully subtitled National Award winning

movies) with a vibrant screening of the acclaimed Indian film 'Hellaro' at the Consulate premises. Trump announces "Massive" oil partnership with Pak

Washington, July 31 (UNI) The United States and Pakistan have reached a new agreement aimed at reducing tariffs for Islamabad and launching a joint effort to develop Pakistan's untapped oil reserves, officials from both countries confirmed.

US President Donald Trump announced the deal in a post on his Truth Social platform, stating that his administration had finalized a new trade framework with Pakistan.

Although he offered few specifics, Trump announced that the agreement would involve the development of Pakistan's "massive oil reserves" in partnership with a yet-to-be-selected American oil company.

"We have just concluded a deal with the country of Pakistan, whereby Pakistan and the United States will work together on developing their massive oil reserves," Trump wrote. "We are in the process of choosing the oil company that will lead this partnership. Who knows, maybe they'll be selling oil to India some day!"

Finance Minister Mohammad Aurangzeb, who is currently in Washington for a final-stage negotiations on a tariff deal, also began meetings with senior US officials yesterday.

The Pakistani delegation is keeping the details of the talks under wraps, but one official said, "We hope to sign a deal before the (Aug 1) deadline expires," The Dawn reported.

"We hope to conclude a mutually beneficial trade agreement... hopefully in days, not in weeks," said Foreign Minister Ishaq Dar during a recent event at the Atlantic Council in Washington as reported by the Pakistani newspaper.

Dar, who was recently in New York to address the United Nations, said a committee had been formed to finalise the terms of the proposed deal. "As long as we are better than or equal to our peers, we should be fine," Dar said.

President Trump made the remarks on US-Pakistan deal after he announced a 25 percent tariff, along with additional penalties on Indian imports, set to take effect from August 1. He cited the US trade deficit with New Delhi and India's continued purchase of Russian oil as key reasons behind the move.

In his post, Trump also mentioned that he had held discussions on trade agreements with several world leaders, "all of whom," he said, "want to make the United States extremely happy."

Over 200 cultural figures urge German Chancellor to halt arms exports to Israel : Reports

Berlin, July 31 (UNI) Over 200 German cultural figures in an open letter called on the country's chancellor, Friedrich Merz, to halt arms exports to Israel amid the humanitarian crisis in the Gaza Strip, the Spiegel newspaper reported on Thursday.

The signatories stated that the chancellor had criticized the Israeli government in recent days, but "words alone do not save lives" and they have to be supported by action. The letter, which is titled "Don't let Gaza die, Mr. Merz," urges the chancellor to stop arms exports to Israel, suspend the EU-Israel Association Agreement and demand an immediate ceasefire and unhindered access to humanitarian aid.

Cultural figures "condemn in the strongest terms the heinous crimes of Hamas" but, at the same time, underscore that no crime justifies the collective punishment of millions of innocent people.

The open letter was signed by prominent actors and actresses such as Christiane Paul, Daniel Bruehl, Benno Furrmann, TV presenter Joko Winterscheidt, comedian Teddy Teklebranh, musicians Shirin David, Ski Aggu, Ebow and many others.

On Monday, after the German security cabinet's meeting, Chancellor Friedrich Merz announced plans to establish a joint airlift with Jordan to deliver aid to Gaza.

On October 7, 2023, Israel was subjected to an unprecedented rocket attack from the Gaza Strip. Hamas fighters also infiltrated border areas and took 200 hostages. Israeli authorities say that about 1,200 people were killed during the raid. Israel retaliated by launching

Operation Iron Swords in the Gaza Strip and announced a complete blockade of the enclave. The hostilities, which were interrupted by brief ceasefires, have also spread to Lebanon and Yemen and provoked an exchange of missile strikes between Israel and Iran.

World Health Organization (WHO) Director-General Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus stated on July 23 that the WHO is observing a rapid increase in malnutrition-related deaths in Gaza. He added that acute malnutrition affects over 10% of Gaza's population, with more than 20% of screened pregnant and breastfeeding women suffering from malnutrition, often severely. He emphasized that the hunger crisis is worsening due to halted humanitarian aid deliveries and access restrictions.

Trump not considering clemency for Ghislaine Maxwell : Reports

Washington, July 31 (UNI) US President Donald Trump is not considering clemency for Ghislaine Maxwell, a convicted associate of late sex trafficker Jeffrey Epstein, CNN reported on Thursday, citing a senior US official.

"No leniency is being given or discussed. That's just false. The President himself has said that clemency for Maxwell is not something he is even thinking about at this time," the official said.

On Monday, Trump said that he is allowed to pardon Maxwell, but has not been "approached" on the matter. Earlier in July, Maxwell's defense said she would welcome any form of relief, though had not sought it.

A New York court sentenced Maxwell to 20 years in prison in 2022 for her role in conspiring with Epstein to sexually exploit underage girls.

Last week, Maxwell appealed to the US Supreme Court to overturn her sex-trafficking conviction, saying that Epstein's plea deal with federal authorities sheltered her from being prosecuted.

US Deputy Attorney General Todd Blanche and other senior Justice Department officials held two days of interviews with Maxwell on July 24-25 at the federal courthouse in Tallahassee, Florida.

Canberra, July 31 (UNI) For Australia, the recognition of Palestine as a sovereign state is not a question of 'if' but rather of 'when', said Treasurer Jim Chalmers following Prime Minister Anthony Albanese's statement on Palestine's recognition being but a matter of time, reports Times of Israel.

"It's a matter of when, not if, Australia recognises a Palestinian state... but I don't want to put a time frame on it," Chalmers told public broadcaster ABC, adding that the treatment of hostages and any involvement of Hamas terrorists in a future Palestinian state remained major obstacles for Canberra.

Albanese, making his stance clear said he had also held a call with his English counterpart Keir Starmer, strongly advocating a two-state solution for Israel and Palestine.

Following France's recognition and under much public duress, Starmer said that London will recognise a sovereign Palestine in September at the United Nations General Assembly — unless Israel ended the Gaza war and committed to peace — in response to growing public anger over the reports of starving children in Gaza. Israel denies that there is famine in the enclave and blames UN agencies for not

distributing aid supplies that are waiting at the border.

Australia has not yet made a formal decision to recognise Palestinian statehood, though Albanese supports Israel's right to exist within secure borders as well as demands for Palestinian sovereignty.

Currently, Canberra's stance includes calling for an immediate ceasefire, release of hostages by Hamas, and immediate distribution of aid to the devastated Gaza Strip.

"What we will continue to do is to put forward a principled position consistent with our unwavering commitment to the vision of the two-state solution," Albanese said at a press briefing. "In an immediate sense, we continue to call for a ceasefire. We continue to call for hostages to be released. We continue to say that Hamas can have no role in a future Palestinian state, and we continue to call for aid to be allowed to the people of Gaza."

Israel has heavily criticised the decision of France, Canada, and the UK to recognise Palestinian sovereignty, stating that their recognition serves only to reward Hamas' actions in 2023, which has led to the death of more a huge number of people so far, and put the whole region into turmoil.



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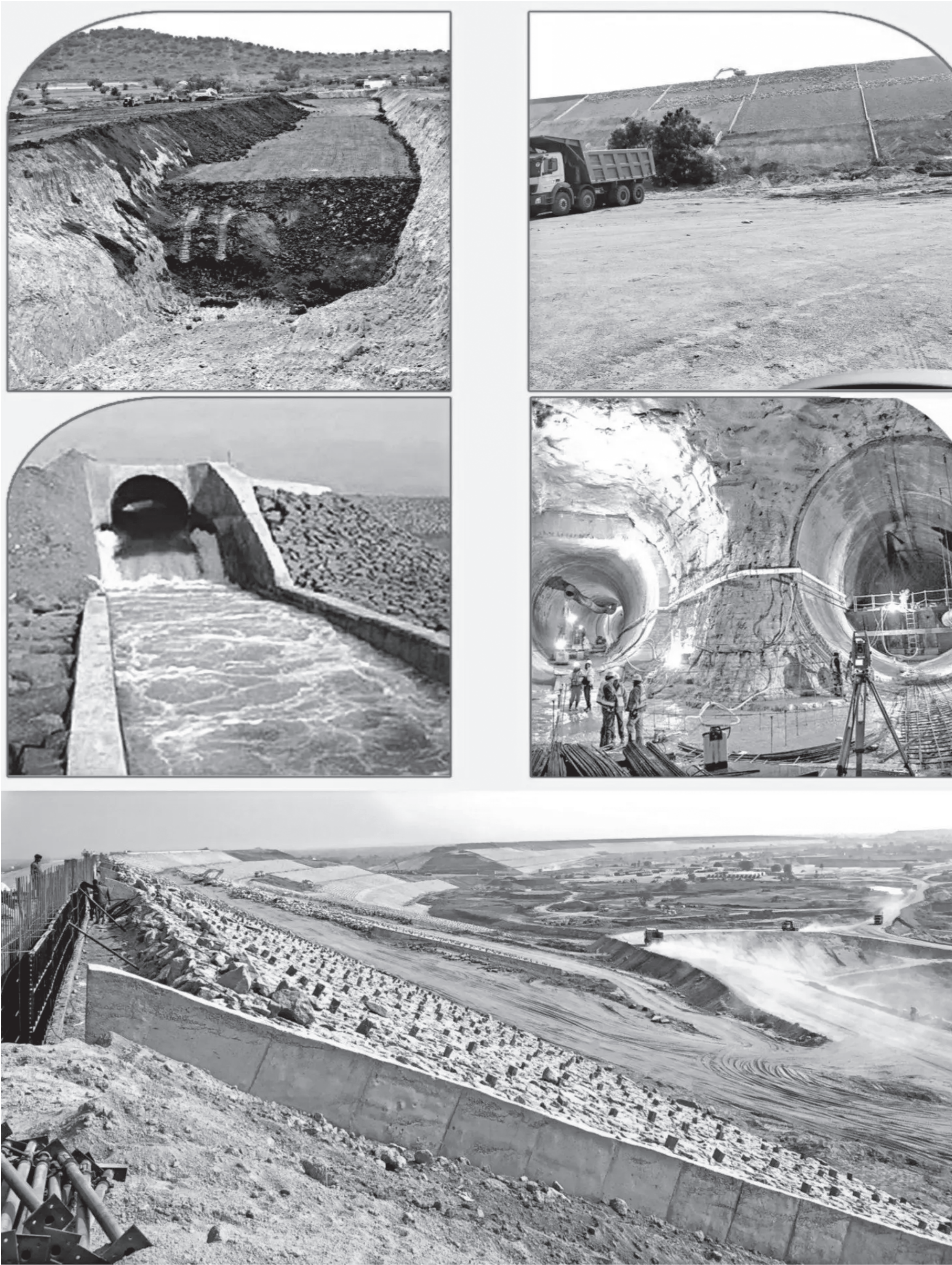
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152 entries for 2W National Racing championship this weekend

Coimbatore, July 31 (UNI) : With a card of 20 races across 11 categories and to be contested by

152 entrants, the three-day Rolon Round of the MRF MMSC-FMSCI Indian National Motorcycle Racing Championship 2025, commencing at the Kari Motor Speedway here tomorrow, offers a

highly competitive fare that will showcase the cream of country's talent.

Headlining the card is the double-header in the premium Pro-Stock 301-400cc class that, in the previous round in June at the Madras International Circuit, dished out thrilling races.

Pune's 18-year-old Sarthak Chavan (Petronas TVS Racing), currently third in the Idemitsu FIM Asia Road Racing Championship (TVS Asia) and Hyderabad's Rahil Pillarisetty (RACR Castrol Power1), who at 27 has

found fresh wind in his sails on his favoured Yamaha R3 after a few up-and-down seasons astride a KTM, won a race apiece.

The pair will have to reckon with fierce competition from Petronas TVS Racing duo, Bengaluru's Chiranth Vishwanath and Alwin Sundar from Chennai. Also in the fray is another Chennai rider,

45-year-old multiple National champion Rajini Krishnan (RACR Castrol Power1), a perennial podium contender.

The Pro-Stock 165-300cc class, which made its Championship debut with a grid of 12 Petronas

TVS Racing's factory-supported GP 200R machines based on Apache RTR 200 4V bikes, also created a buzz. Bengaluru teenager Savion Sabu (Mad Rabbit Racing) won the lone race (the scheduled second race was cancelled

due to rains) holding off a bunch of experienced riders.

Joining the championship for the second round is the Super Stock 165cc Intermediate class introduced this season. The rest of the grids remain unchanged with the two Novice classes.Stock 301-400cc and Stock 165cc, both with large grids – besides the Girls (Stock 165cc) which has Chennai's Ann Jennifer (Motul Sparks Racing) bidding to reclaim national title that she last won in 2020.

Ann Jennifer won both races in Round-1 ahead of defending champion Jagathishree Kumaresan (One Racing). Also on the grid are two other former National champions, Puducherry's Lani Zena Fernandez (RACR Castrol Power1) and Chennai's Ryhana Bee (KYT Helmet ISBK Racing) who missed

the first round.

The two One-Make Championships, Petronas TVS India (Expert, Rookie, Women, Electric RTE) and Idemitsu Honda India Talent Cup (CB 300F), complete the card. Both these categories for which the grids were finalised after a selection process, have proven to be nurseries of talent while providing a well-curated programme to race at the National level and gain recognition.

Chairman of the Event and Race Director Manoj Dalal said: "The first round of the championship in June was a huge success in terms of the quality of racing and young riders with big dreams. We can expect more of the same this weekend with a total of 152 entries. Bangladesh and Scotland have earned automatic spots in the Qualifier by virtue of their participation in the ICC Women's T20 World Cup 2024.

Thailand and Nepal qualified through the Asia regional pathway, while the USA secured their place from the Americas region.

The remaining five spots will be filled by two teams each from Africa and Europe and one from the East Asia-Pacific region, following the completion of their respective regional Qualifiers.

The Qualifier in Nepal will see the 10 teams divided into two groups of five, followed by a Super Six stage and a Final. The full fixture for the tournament will be announced in due course.

Meanwhile, the schedule for the ICC Women's T20 World Cup 2026 in England and Wales has already been confirmed, an ICC report said.

The marquee tournament will run from June 12 to July 5 2026, with 33 matches played across 24 days at seven venues, including Old Trafford, Headingley, Hampshire Bowl and Bristol County Ground.The grand finale will be held at the iconic Lord's Cricket Ground.

But the pressure told three minutes later when Wellyster's long ball from the Karbi Anglong half caught the BDFC defence off guard. Olaleye latched onto it, beat the last defender, and drilled a powerful low strike into the near post to put KAMSFC ahead in the 25th minute.

Bodoland FC found the equaliser in the 37th minute through winger Gwngwsar

Gayary. A long diagonal ball from midfield found Gayary on the left, who headed into the danger area. A failed clearance by KAMSFC captain Harbamon Timung gave Gayary a second chance, and he made no mistake in firing it past Wellyster Mendes to make it 1-1.

BDFC nearly took the lead in first-half stoppage time when Robinson left a defender on the turf with a clever run but missed the target. Another teasing free-kick from Pedro found Robinson again, but he failed to convert from close range as the half ended 1-1.

The second half resumed with both teams trying to take control. Haokip (KAMSFC) and Pedro (BDFC) traded tame free kicks in the opening five minutes, both collected comfortably by the respective goalkeepers.

The best opportunity of the second half for Karbi Anglong came in the 56th minute when Sujit Singh broke free, but his shot lacked placement and went straight to Diamary.

Mumbai, July 31 : The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs, chaired by Hon'ble Prime Minister has approved the 4th Rail line project between Nagpur and Itarsi on 31.07.2025. “ The Nagpur-Itarsi 4th Rail line project is part of the Delhi-Chennai High Density Network with a project cost of Rs.5,451 crore.The Nagpur-Itarsi 4th Rail line with 297 km route & 339 km track length has 37 stations enroute with 36 major bridges, 415 minor bridges, 2 Road Over Bridges, 74 Road Under Bridges, 4 Tunnels and 2 Rail Over Bridges.

Connecting the 2 states of Maharashtra & Madhya Pradesh the Nagpur-Itarsi 4th Rail line will benefit the district of Nagpur in Maharashtra and districts of Narmadapuram, Betul and Pandhurna in Madhya

Pradesh.Intersecting the Mumbai-Howrah High Density Network at Nagpur, it will also enable faster and efficient movement of passenger and goods traffic, facilitating transport of 10 million tons of additional cargo and saving Rs.1206 crore in logistics cost.

Providing connectivity to 4 Jyotirlinga temples viz. Mahakaleshwar and Omkareshwar in Madhya Pradesh, Srisailem in Andhra Pradesh and Rameshwaram in Tamil Nadu, it will not only benefit a great number of devotees but will also give a boost to the tourism industry in these places. In addition it will also greatly benefit regular passengers, students, businessmen etc.

The Nagpur-Itarsi 4th Rail line is part of the approval given by the Cabinet for 4 projects of
