CM announces Rs 1 lakh incentives to SC/ST IIT, NIIT, NEET rankers

Vijayawada, Aug 25 : Congratulating the students of social welfare residential educational institutions for achieving ranks in IIT, NIIT and NEET, Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu announced an incentive of Rs one lakh to each student.

The Chief Minister conducted a review on social welfare at the secretariat at Amaravati, near here, on Monday and interacted with the SC, ST students who got admissions in IIT, NIIT and NEET and advised the students to work hard to reach new heights in their lives.

Speaking on the occasion, the Chief Minister directed the officials to improve facilities in social welfare hostels to encourage students. He said there is no dearth of talent among students, and the fifty-five students who secured ranks itself is a better example for this. He asked the officials to strive to quadruple the number of rankers by next year. The Chief Minister advised the students to interact with the hostellers to encourage them.

These students from social welfare educational institutions received coaching at the Dr. B.R. Ambedkar IIT-NEET centres are located in Chinnaatekur (Kurnool district), Kuntamukkala (NTR district), and Adavi Takkellapadu (Guntur district). Out of the 176 students who received coaching for the JEE Mains and Advanced examinations, 129 qualified. Of the 180 students coached for the NEET examination, 143 qualified.

Ultimately, 12 students were selected for admission to IITs, 30 for NITs, and 13 secured MBBS admissions. Among the 55 top rankers, 20 were girls. Additionally, 14 students gained admission to BDS programs, and 19 are set to join GFTIs and Central Universities.

Welcoming the achievement of social welfare students, the Chief Minister directed officials to establish seven more IIT-NEET coaching centres this year, which will benefit 1,411 SC and ST students.

He assured that the government is ready to spend whatever is necessary for the welfare of students from the underprivileged and weaker sections.

At the end of the meeting, the Chief Minister personally handed over mementoes and cheques of Rs 1 lakh each to all 55 students, amounting to Rs 55 lakh in total, and posed for individual photographs with them.

Expressing happiness, he said it was heartening that students from humble backgrounds showcased such outstanding talent. He patted them on the back and wished them all the best. Faculty members and students also took a group photo with the Chief Minister. The students were overjoyed to have had this opportunity to interact with the Chief Minister and to be felicitated by him. Minister for Social Welfare Dola Balaveeranjaneya Swamy and officials were present on the occasion.

Indian Navy set to commission advanced stealth gmfrigates Udaygiri and Himgiri at Vizag today

Visakhapatnam, Aug 25 : Indian Navy is set to commission the latest state-of-the-art Project 17A multi-mission stealth frigates Udaygiri and Himgiri at Naval Base, Visakhapatnam, tomorrow.The ceremony will be presided over by Defence Minister Rajnath Singh, a defence release said here today.This will be the first occasion when two frontline surface combatants, constructed at two different shipyards, will be commissioned simultaneously, underscoring the growing maritime importance of India’s eastern seaboard.

Udaygiri and Himgiri are follow-on ships of the Project 17 (Shivalik) class frigates.Both these vessels incorporate significant improvements in design, stealth, weapon and sensor systems and are capable of executing full spectrum of maritime missions in Blue Water conditions.

Udaygiri, built by Mazagon Dock Shipbuilders Ltd. (MDL), Mumbai, and Himgiri, constructed by Garden Reach Shipbuilders & Engineers (GRSE), Kolkata, showcase the nation’s growing shipbuilding prowess, as well as, the synergy between India’s premier defence shipyards.

Udaygiri also holds the distinction of being the fastest ship of her class to be delivered post-launch, a result of the modular construction methodology adopted by Indian shipyards.

In keeping with the Navy’s tradition of reviving names of illustrious predecessors, both frigates are named after earlier INS Udaygiri (F35) and INS Himgiri (F34) that served the nation with distinction for over 30 years before being decommissioned. The commissioning of the new Udaygiri and Himgiri thus honours the legacy of their forebearers while ushering in a new era of capability.

Both frigates were designed in-house by the Indian Navy’s Warship Design Bureau (WDB), and notably, Udaygiri is the 100th ship designed by the WDB, marking a milestone in five decades of indigenous warship design. The ships feature modern Combined Diesel or Gas (CODOG) propulsion plants, state of the art Integrated Platform Management System and a suite of advanced weapons and sensors developed by Indian manufacturers.

The ships, with about 75 percent indigenous content, supported by hundreds of indigenous MSMEs, align with the Government’s vision of Aatmanirbhar Bharat in defence manufacturing.

AP to supply electricity to Ganesh Chaturdhi pandals, mandapams

Vijayawada, Aug 25 (UNI) : For the first time, the Andhra Pradesh Government has decided to supply electricity free of cost to the Ganesh Chaturthi pandals and mandapams across the state for 10 days.

Many organisers of the Ganesh Chaturthi event appealed to Minister for IT and HRD Nara Lokesh to supply free power to the Ganesh pandals, mandapams and makeshift tents across the State.

Minister Lokesh spoke to Energy Minister Gottipati Ravikumar on the issue.

There are over 15,000 Ganesh Chaturthi pandals and mandapams across the state, and the Government is to provide free power to them for 10 days, bearing expenses of about Rs 25 crore.

However, Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu has also responded favourably and directed the officials concerned to provide free power to the Ganesh Chaturthi pandals and mandapams as lakhs of devotees urged for the same, official sources said.

The Chief Minister directed the officials to issue a special ‘Government Order’ in this regard.

Interestingly, the AP Government has also decided to provide free power to the Goddess Durga Devi puja pandals during the Dasara festival across the State.It may be mentioned here that the Government has opened a ‘single window system’ by making a website available to apply for permissions and to get approvals from the police and municipal officials to erect pandals, mandapams and makeshift tents to install Ganesh idols during the Ganesh Chaturthi festival.

Aqua farmers will not incur losses with US’s Tariff hike: Union Minister assures

Bhimavaram, Aug 25 (UNI) : Union Minister of State for Heavy Industries and Steel Bhupatiraju Srinivasa Varma today affirmed that the Central Government is taking steps to ensure that the aqua farmers will not be affected by US President Donald Trump's tariff hike.

Member of Parliament Beeda Mastan Rao called on union Minister Srinivasa Varma here. The MP, accompanied by some aqua farmers, met the union Minister in his residence and discussed various issues being faced by the aqua farmers.

The MP also brought to the notice of the union Minister the apprehensions of aqua farmers in the wake of a huge hike in tariff by the US president on the aqua products.Responding to their apprehensions, union Minister Srinivasa Varma assured them that the Centre is taking all required steps to protect the interests of aqua farmers in the backdrop of the hike. He observed that there is no need for the aqua farmers to worry about the exports to the USA.

“I have discussed the aqua products exports to the USA with the Central government officials. Alternative ways are being found to create a market for the aqua products of India in some other countries,” the union Minister revealed and advised the aqua farmers to continue aqua farming without getting disheartened.

He also highlighted that the State government would reduce the power tariff of aqua farmers to Rs 1.50 per unit, adding that he has discussed the matter with Minister Nara Lokesh, who assured him of reducing the power tariff.MP Mastan Rao made it clear that he, accompanied by union Minister Srinivasa Varma, met union Ministers in New Delhi and appealed to them to take steps to protect the interests of aqua farmers in the wake of the steep tariff hike announced by the US Government.District shrimp farmer’s welfare association president Gottumukkala Subba Raju, BJP Narsapuram Parliamentary convener P Subhash Raju and BJP district general secretary Kalidindi Vinod Varma were among those present.

BJP accuses Oppn of rejecting morality, advocating ‘Work from Jail’ model

New Delhi, Aug 25 (UNI) The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) today strongly criticised the Opposition for their protest against the Constitution Amendment Bill 2025, accusing them of rejecting morality in favour of “nirlajjita” (shamelessness).
“When the entire nation has embraced this instrument of morality and good governance, a small section of the Opposition is openly declaring that they stand not with morality but with shamelessness.

They proclaim, ‘hum toh nirlajjita ke saath hain,’” BJP spokesperson Shehzad Poonawalla told reporters here.He said Prime Minister Narendra Modi’s government has introduced the 130th Amendment Bill in Parliament to combat corruption and end the “criminalization of politics,” but the Opposition intend to promote corruption by adopting a “work from jail” model, similar to “work from home.”Poonawalla said that once this bill is implemented, if the Prime

Minister, Chief Minister, or any minister is imprisoned for a serious offence and does not receive bail within 30 days, they will have to resign from their post.
He added that this law supports morality and good governance. According to him, the biggest obstacle to good governance is the “criminalization of politics,” and this bill will be the greatest boon in eradicating it.
The BJP leader said that during the Covid-19 pandemic, everyone

worked from home. Now, for the first time in the country, the Opposition seeks the freedom to “work from jail.” He questioned whether it is practical for a Chief Minister to hold meetings from inside jail and asked where public hearings would take place. Although these leaders are cut off from the public, he asked if they expect separate rooms for public hearings inside jail and what kind of arrangement they desire. “Such a notion is neither moral nor practical,” he added.

130th Constitution Bill is unconstitutional, BJP will weaponise it to poach leaders: Aaditya

Mumbai, Aug 25 (IANS) : Shiv Sena UBT leader and former minister Aaditya Thackeray on Monday alleged that the bill, tabled in the parliament proposing the removal of Prime Minister, Chief Minister and Minister from office if they are arrested and detained for 30 days in relation to a criminal offence, is unconstitutional and it will be weaponised by the BJP to poach political parties and political leaders.
“Till now they were using ED and CBI, now they will use the bill which has been referred to the joint select committee.
The bill is anti-national and it must be taken back,” he said after visiting a slew of development works being carried out in the fishermen’s colony and in his Worli constituency.
On the Union Ministry of Sport’s announcement with India playing a cricket match with Pakistan in the Asia Cup cricket

tournament, Aaditya claimed, “Even though Operation Sindoor was announced, as of now, the BCCI is not going back on playing cricket with Pakistan.
They want to play cricket with Pakistan, that is, for TV and ad revenues and also for their own salaries.
It is very selfish of BCCI, and it should rethink playing with Pakistan.”
Aaditya taunted that the BJP, saying, instead of talking about the past, should talk about the present, as it has been their government in the last 11 years at the Centre.
Earlier, Shiv Sena UBT in the party mouthpiece Saamna editorial slammed the BJP-led government at the Centre for tabling three bills for the removal of PM, CMs and ministers arrested and detained on serious criminal charges, saying that it is an insult to Babasaheb Ambedkar’s constitution.

PM Modi, Fijian PM Sitiveni Rabuka hold delegation level talks

New Delhi, Aug 25 (UNI) Prime Minister Narendra Modi today welcomed visiting Fijian Prime Minister Sitiveni Rabuka at Hyderabad House, ahead of holding talks that are set to focus on climate resilience, renewable energy, digital transformation, health, education, and people-to-people ties.The MEA spokesperson said in a post on X:
“Welcoming an important Global South and FIPIC partner. “PM @narendramodi received PM Sitiveni Rabuka @slrabuka of Fiji at Hyderabad House for delegation level talks.”
Following the talks, the two sides are set to ink a number of Memorandum of Understandings, aimed at promoting economic cooperation between the two sides.
PM Modi will also host the Fijian delegation for lunch.
Earlier in the morning, the Fijian PM paid floral tributes at the Raj Ghat.
The Fijian PM arrived in the Indian capital yesterday on a three-day visit, accompanied by his wife, Sulueti Rabuka, and a high-level Fijian delegation that includes the Minister for Health and Medical Services, Ratu Atonio Lalabalavu, and senior government officials.
He is expected to pay a courtesy call on President Droupadi Murmu later in the day. President Murmu had visited Fiji in August 2024.
On Tuesday, the Fijian PM will deliver a keynote address on his vision for the Pacific as an “Ocean of Peace” at the Indian Council of World Affairs.
He is also expected to explore opportunities to enhance cultural and economic linkages between the two nations.
This is the first visit to India by Prime Minister Rabuka in his present capacity.Prime Minister Rabuka’s visit underscores the longstanding and enduring ties between India and Fiji. It reaffirms the continued commitment of both countries to further strengthen the bilateral relationship across all sectors and deepen our close people-to-people ties, the MEA said in a statement.Fiji is an island nation located in Melanesia in the South Pacific Ocean.

India, Japan strengthen energy cooperation through Ministerial Dialogue

New Delhi, Aug 25 (UNI) :India and Japan today reaffirmed commitment to Energy Security and Inclusive growth and agreed to expand cooperation on Carbon Capture, Utilization, and Storage green chemicals, biofuels and advanced technologies in Energy Sector.A Ministerial-level

India-Japan Energy Dialogue was held today through Video Conferencing, co-chaired by Minister of Power and Housing and Urban Affairs Manohar Lal and Mr. Muto Yoji, Japan’s Minister of Economy, Trade and Industry. The two sides welcomed progress in areas like Energy efficiency clean

hydrogen, ammonia, renewable energy.
The Ministers also emphasized that India–Japan partnership would continue to play a pivotal role in advancing secure, resilient, and sustainable energy systems in the Indo-Pacific region.
Both countries have been deepening their partnership in the energy

sector under the Japan-India Clean Energy Partnership, with a focus on energy security, clean energy transition and addressing climate change.The two sides have institutionalized this cooperation through the India-Japan Energy Dialogue and sectoral Joint Working Groups (JWGs).

Brainstorming is best way to resolve people' issues in democracy: Shah

New Delhi, Aug 25 (UNI): Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Sunday said that debate and discussion in the Parliament and Assemblies are the most effective means of addressing public issues in a democratic system, and it must be ensured that the House functions as per rules of the respective legislature.
Shah, while addressing the All India Speakers Conference 2025 held at the Delhi Vidhan Sabha said that debates, in Parliament and Assemblies should take place through healthy discussion, but disrupting their functioning for narrow political interests cannot be called a debate.
He said that the people of the country and the elected representatives should reflect upon the tradition that is being established by not allowing the Houses to function for the entire session, in the name of protest.

Shah underscored the need to work towards enhancing the dignity of the House and respect of the post of the Speaker, and added that it is the responsibility of every legislator to ensure that the functioning of the House is carried on according to the rules, and the discourse must be towards people and the nation’s interest.
He said that a democracy flourishes only when legislatures follow the basic mantra of

prudence, deliberation and legislation.
Hm stressed that when discussions in the House are stalled, the role of the legislature in the nation’s development is greatly diminished.
He highlighted that holding discussions rising above the party interest, and going as per the interest of the nation is the path which takes to the utmost heights of democracy.
The union Home Minister said that Vitthalbhai Patel laid the foundation for India’s legislative traditions, strengthening today’s democracy.
He said that if anyone established the framework for running the country democratically based on Indian values, it was undoubtedly the valiant Patel, as he established numerous traditions that continue to guide everyone, especially in legislative functions and the responsibilities of the Speaker, like a radiant beacon.
Shah said that during Patel’s tenure, the Legislative Department and the Legislative Assembly Secretariat were established in the Centre and all states.
He highlighted that Vitthalbhai’s remark at the time was significant: no legislative assembly can function under the control of elected governments.
The assembly must remain independent to

ensure the meaningfulness of debates held within it.
Shah said that the decision taken by Patel to establish an independent legislative department was also accepted by the nation’s constituent assembly.
Meanwhile, he also urged the Delhi assembly speaker Vijender Gupta to ensure that a compilation of the speeches delivered by all dignitaries in this historic House is made available in the libraries of every legislature across the country.
As the conference marks the centenary of Patel’s election as the first speaker of the Central Legislative Assembly, HM also said that as back then country’s freedom was important, it is equally essential to make sure that nation runs democratically following independence, and credited Patel for laying the foundation for establishing democratic governance based on Indian ideas.
Shah released a commemorative stamp honouring Patel, while he also inaugurated an exhibition specially organized at the assembly premises, showcasing archival records, photographs, and documents on the country’s first elected speaker and the evolution of the nation’s parliamentary institutions.

Congress stages protest outside Nagpur Municipal Corp over pothole menace

Nagpur, Aug 25 (UNI) Congress leaders and workers staged a protest today outside the Nagpur Municipal Corporation (NMC) office, demanding immediate action on the issue of pothole-ridden city roads.
The agitation was led by Maharashtra Pradesh Congress Committee (MPCC) General Secretary Ketan Thakre, who slammed the civic authorities for their alleged negligence.
“We are not able to understand whether there are potholes on Nagpur roads or roads in potholes,” Thakre remarked, accusing officials of ignoring the problem.

He warned that if the potholes are not filled within eight days, Congress workers would launch a symbolic protest by placing photographs of civic officials inside the potholes.
Thakre further said the demonstration was aimed at “opening the eyes” of the administration and ensuring that timely measures are taken to make Nagpur roads safer and more navigable.

Those alleging vote theft have lost their minds: Maha BJP

Mumbai, Aug 25 (UNI) : Maharashtra BJP State Media Chief Navneet Ban today accused Shiv Sena (UBT) MP Sanjay Raut and Congress leaders of making "baseless allegations of vote theft" and said they have "lost their minds."
Speaking at a press conference at the BJP state office here, Ban questioned the Opposition's silence during voter list preparation.
"Where were their booth agents and workers when the voter lists were being prepared? At that time, no one raised objections," he said.
Ban pointed to the contradiction in the Maha Vikas Aghadi's stance.
"When the MVA got

more votes in the Lok Sabha elections, Raut was silent. But as soon as MVA suffered a crushing defeat in the Assembly elections, they immediately started making accusations," he said.
The BJP leader accused Raut of spreading "fake narratives" through Saamana editorials without evidence. "Sanjay Raut is not the editor of Saamana, the mouthpiece of the Uddhav Sena, but of Daily Misguidance," Ban said, adding that Raut has "abandoned the ideals of Shiv Sena founder Balasaheb Thackeray."
Ban also criticised what he called Raut's "double standard" on voter list revision. "On one hand,

Priyanka slams police action on SSC students, calls it "inhumane and shameful"

New Delhi, Aug 25 (UNI) Congress general secretary Priyanka Gandhi Vadra today condemned the police action against SSC aspirants protesting at Delhi’s Ramlila Maidan, calling it “inhumane and shameful.”In a post on X, Gandhi slammed the central government for its handling of the recruitment system and the treatment of protesting students.
“The use of force by the police on SSC students protesting at Delhi’s Ramlila Maidan is inhumane and shameful,” she said.
She further alleged that under the BJP government, irregularities, scams, and paper leaks have become routine in examinations and recruitment drives, leaving millions of young aspirants depressed. “Irregularities in every exam, scams in every recruitment, and paper leaks have distressed the youth across the country. Under BJP rule, the rampant corruption in recruitment processes and examinations is ruining the future of the youth,” she said.Priyanka Gandhi also criticised the government’s approach of suppressing dissent rather than addressing the root causes of the problem.
“Instead of addressing these issues and listening to the concerns of the youth, it is unfortunate that they are being beaten with lathis. Rather than showing cruelty towards students, their voices should be heard,” she added.

Mumbai-Nanded Vande Bharat service begins August 26

Ch. Sambhajnagar, Aug 25 (UNI) :The Indian Railways has extended the Mumbai-Jalna Vande Bharat Express service to Nanded from tomorrow, fulfilling a long-standing demand of passengers from Mumbai and the Marathwada region.
The train will depart from Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj Terminus (CSMT) in Mumbai at 1:10 pm and arrive at Nanded at 10:50 pm, an official said.
The train will cover the 610-kilometre distance in 9 hours and 25 minutes.

The return journey will depart from H.S. Nanded Railway Station daily at 5:00 am, arriving at CSMT Mumbai at 2:25 pm.
The service will operate six days a week, remaining non-operational on Wednesdays.
The route includes stops at Dadar, Thane, Kalyan, Nashik Road, Manmad, Chhatrapati Sambhajnagar, Jalna, and Parbhani before terminating at Nanded.
The extension is expected to benefit passengers from Parbhani

and Nanded, particularly reducing travel time between Nanded and Chhatrapati Sambhajnagar to just three and a half hours.
Ticket prices have been set at Rs 1,750 for AC chair car and Rs 3,300 for executive chair car classes.
The service promises enhanced convenience, speed, and comfort for passengers, and is expected to strengthen transportation links between the Marathwada and Western Maharashtra regions.

Refund of Application Fee Clarified in New Bar Policy : Nishant Kumar

Amaravati, Aug 25 :Director of Excise and Prohibition, Nishant Kumar, has clarified that the application fee collected under the New Bar Policy 2025–28 will be refunded in cases where the draw of lots is not conducted due to fewer than four applications being received for a particular bar. The New Bar Policy 2025–28 and the A.P. Excise (Grant of Licence of Selling by Bar and Conditions of Licence) Rules, 2025 provide for disposal of 840 bars under the open category and 84 bars under the reserved category (Geethakulalu) through draw of lots. As per Rule 13(1)(a), applicants may file multiple applications, each accompanied by a non-



refundable application fee of Rs 5,00,000 and a processing fee of Rs10,000. Rule 13(8)(c) stipulates that no selection shall be made unless at least four

applications are received for a notified bar. In such cases, the last date for receipt of applications may be extended. However, ambiguity persisted

regarding refund of the non-refundable application fee if the minimum number of applications was not met and the draw was not conducted. Nishant Kumar stated that this grey area had led to apprehensions among prospective applicants and field-level officers sought clarity. “It is hereby clarified that if the draw of lots is not conducted due to fewer than four applications being received, the application fee will be refunded to the applicants,” he said. He also directed all field officers to widely communicate this clarification to prospective applicants in order to remove doubts and facilitate broad participation in the bar selection process.

21.34 lakh MT of fertilisers supplied to farmers: Minister

Vijayawada Aug 25 (UNI) : Minister for Agriculture K Atchannaidu has reiterated that there is no scarcity for fertilizers in the State and assured of providing the required quantity of fertilizers to the farmers. Talking to the media here today, the Agriculture Minister said that it is estimated that Andhra Pradesh needs 31.15 lakh Metric Tonnes of fertilisers for the Kharif season. “So far 21.34 lakh Metric Tonnes of fertilisers have been supplied to the farmers. Moreover, 6.22 laka Metric Tonnes fertilisers, including Urea, DAP, MOP, SSP and Complex fertilisers are available in the State now.

To do away with the scarcity for fertilizer, 1.10 lakh Metric Tonnes of buffer stock have been kept ready to be supplied,” the Agriculture Minister acknowledged. The Centre has allocated 3.50 lakh metric tonnes of fertilisers to AP of which 1.30 lakh metric tonnes have reached the State, he mentioned, adding that 0.47 lakh metric tonnes of fertiliser stock will arrive soon.

To supply fertilisers to the farmers in a transparent way, the process is being supervised through the iFMS (Integrated Fertilizer Management System). The Minister warned the mediators of stringent action if fertilisers are sold on the black market and creating artificial scarcity.

Experts urge shots for elderly, children, chronic patients

India has aligned itself with the World Health Organisation’s (WHO) updated influenza vaccination guidelines for the Northern Hemisphere 2025–26 season, health experts said at a symposium here today.

The WHO has recommended removal of the B/Yamagata strain from quadrivalent influenza vaccines, citing the absence of naturally occurring cases since March 2020. The U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) excluded the strain last year, while India’s National Centre for Disease Control (NCDC) has also endorsed the move.

Despite influenza accounting for nearly 1.27 lakh deaths annually in India—65 per cent among people over 65 years and up to 20 per cent among children under five—flu vaccination coverage in the country remains less than 1.5 per cent. In contrast, nearly half of the population in the United States and Europe is immunised each year.

“Good health starts with prevention, and vaccines play a key role in protecting people and improving health. Vaccination reduces the spread of infection, lowers disease severity, and prevents complications, especially among high-risk groups,” said Dr. Sharvil Patel, Managing Director, Zydus Lifesciences Limited.

Experts pointed out that influenza in India follows year-round circulation, with peaks during the monsoon and winter, but estimating mortality is difficult due to weak surveillance, limited testing, and under-reporting.

They stressed that infants, the elderly and those with chronic conditions must be prioritised for annual vaccination.

Health specialists also noted that unvaccinated adults, especially with co-morbidities such as kidney, heart, lung or liver disease, are driving higher hospitalisations this season. “If you are unvaccinated, you don’t have immunity, and that is why high-risk patients are landing in hospitals more than others,” one physician said.

The surge, they added, coincides with the monsoon and school reopening, when children carry infections back home. Doctors said vaccination should ideally precede the rains, but regional variations—such as delayed peaks in southern cities like Chennai—pose challenges.

Due to financial limitations, a long-standing initiative to include influenza shots in the Universal Immunisation Programme (UIP) has not been successful. According to a senior immunization expert who has advocated for this change for ten years, the final decision rests with the Finance Ministry.

The expert pointed out that the current healthcare spending, which is only 1–1.6% of the GDP, is insufficient to support the program’s expansion.

Experts also noted that India tends to have a reactive rather than proactive approach to healthcare.

Experts further highlighted India’s reactive approach to healthcare. Despite free health camps, public response is low, with preventive care seen as a low priority. They said insurance coverage and awareness are critical to boosting vaccine uptake. “In Europe and the US, insurance makes vaccination affordable. Here, out-of-pocket expenses put it beyond reach for most middle and low-income families,” a doctor noted.

On whether vaccines should be made mandatory for healthcare workers or children, panellists warned against compulsion, citing global backlash. Instead, they favoured strong recommendations, targeted campaigns and prioritisation of high-risk groups.

Concluding the session, doctors called for insurers, policymakers and the public to act ahead of the next flu season. “One hospital admission costs more than vaccinating a thousand people,” a senior expert remarked, underlining the cost-effectiveness of prevention.

Similarly, Navi Mumbai has retained the highest 'Seven Star' rating for a waste-free city and the highest 'Water Plus' rating in the ODAC category. It has also won the title of 'Best City' in the country among cities with a population of more than 1 million in the 'Citizen Feedback' category.

The inclusion of our Navi Mumbai city in the 'Super Swachh League' of the cleanest cities in the country that maintain cleanliness is a matter of pride for every citizen, and every Navi Mumbaikar citizen and sanitation worker has contributed greatly to this, said Commissioner Dr. Kailash Shinde. Therefore, sanitation workers were also present at the award ceremony in New Delhi.

Navi Mumbai Municipal Corporation has always set a benchmark for other cities in India by implementing

innovative and comprehensive sanitation initiatives. While facing the 'Swachh Survekshan 2024', it was mandatory to maintain a score of more than 85 percent for inclusion in the 'Super Swachh League'. In this, Navi Mumbai Municipal Corporation, under the guidance of Municipal Commissioner Dr. Kailash Shinde, implemented many remarkable projects with emphasis on public participation, successfully organized activities and secured its inclusion in the highest category of 'Super Swachh League'. In this, notable projects were implemented on priority.

* Use of modern technology in waste classification, collection and transportation systems:

In addition to emphasizing waste segregation into three categories at the point of generation - wet, dry, and household hazardous - separate collection of sanitary waste has begun this year.

A waste collection and transportation (C&T) system has been implemented. A fleet of 206 vehicles including mini tippers, electric trucks and waste compactors is being deployed. RFID-enabled GPS is being used for real-time tracking and route monitoring and control.

Also, 7 mechanical vehicles are operational for cleaning the main roads, 5 of which are eco-friendly.

Similarly, 10 eco-friendly electric vehicles received under the United Nations Development Program are



being operated by women waste collectors from the local community.

* ICCC: Smart sanitation through information technology based cutting-edge system :

The Integrated Command and Control Centre (ICCC) at the NMC headquarters effectively monitors the sanitation operations in Navi Mumbai through various means such as GPS-enabled vehicles, CCTV feeds and citizen feedback. Real-time data analytics have made it easier to monitor and control vehicle availability, waste collection tracking and service compliance.

* Landmark project in the country that converts textile waste into opportunities:

Navi Mumbai Municipal Corporation has started implementing an innovative project 'Textile Recovery Facility (TRF)' to reduce the waste load at the solid waste project site and convert waste into recyclable resources in collaboration with the Textile Industry Committee under the Ministry of Textiles, Government of India. This is the first innovative project in the country to utilize textile waste to be implemented on a pilot scale.

* C&D Waste Project:

A 150 tonne per day construction and demolition waste (C&D) processing plant is operational at the Navi Mumbai Municipal Corporation's solid waste management project site, and the paver blocks made from it are used for

construction. Importantly, 85 percent of C&D waste is used in the production of these paver blocks.

* Fertilizer production from wet waste and recycling of dry waste (MRF & RDF):

Out of the approximately 750 tons of waste per day received at the project site, 350 tons of wet waste is processed into fertilizer, and 400 tons of dry waste is separated into plastic, glass, cloth, paper, etc. and recycled. The plastic in this is used for boilers in RDF cement industries, and plastic granules are used for coating during the construction of asphalt roads.

* Coconut waste processing project:

An innovative project is being implemented at the solid waste project site to process coconut waste with a capacity of 10 tons per day and separate the fibers from it, which is used to make coir and various idols and decorative items.

* Integrated Processing Center (ISWM) :

A project to process the leachate, the water produced in the process of solid waste, is also operational here. After purifying the leachate, the processed water is used to grow trees there. In this way, efforts are made at the solid waste management project site to make maximum use of all waste.

* Emphasis on waste disposal at the point of generation (BWG):

Societies, hotels, and institutions that generate more than 100 kg of wet



waste per day should dispose of their wet waste on their premises. Biogas production/fertilizer production projects from wet waste are being implemented at 38 locations, which has resulted in significant savings in the labor, cost, and time required by the Municipal Corporation to transport the waste to the project site and process it there.

* Zero Waste Slum Model: Local composting from waste, community empowerment, clean environment

Navi Mumbai Municipal Corporation has taken the initiative and implemented the innovative concept of the zero waste slum model.

In this, women garbage collectors have been brought together through the NGO Prasad Sakhi and assigned to their area-wise teams, each of which goes to 250 households and collects waste separately.

This work has created sustainable employment for them. This has improved their standard of living and contributed to the progress of their children's education.

* Advanced wastewater management

Navi Mumbai city has a 99.9% sewage management network. The remaining are only 42 septic tanks, which are also cleaned regularly by mechanical devices.

Modern infrastructure for sewage disposal - 100% of the wastewater is processed daily, amounting to 235 D.L.L. The total capacity of all the centers is much more than

454D.L.L.

7 sewage treatment plants are operational using cutting-edge technologies like SBR and C-Tech and have SCADA automation facilities.

More than 30% of treated wastewater is used for purposes other than drinking, such as irrigation of gardens and plantations, construction, and cleaning of public places and facilities.

Currently, there are 3 Tertiary Treatment Plants (TTPs) with a capacity of 45 D.L.L. and now a TTP with a capacity of 7.5 D.L.L. has been set up in Belapur.

To promote water reuse in industrialization, a Memorandum of Understanding was signed with MIDC in January 2024, through which recycled water is currently being provided to 54 industrial clusters for non-drinking purposes. This water is also being used for construction and gardening purposes.

Smart monitoring and control - KPI-based maintenance and repair (O&M) tracking system for efficiency, compliance and complaint resolution.

Implement a data-driven system that ensures transparency and drives continuous improvement.

All such unique projects and works have earned Navi Mumbai Municipal Corporation a place in the Super Clean League, a higher ranking than the Clean City ranking, and Navi Mumbai's cleanliness drive has become an inspiration for other cities.

India, Fiji resolve to cooperate for free, open Indo-Pacific, strongly condemn Pahalgam attack, terrorism

New Delhi, Aug 25 (UNI) : India and Fiji today underscored the importance of a free, open, secure and inclusive Indo-Pacific region and announced their intent to collaborate on strengthening regional maritime security, contributing to peace and stability in the Indo-Pacific.

A Joint Statement issued after delegation-level talks between Prime Minister Narendra Modi and his visiting Fiji counterpart Sitiveni Rabuka said the two countries reaffirmed commitment to supporting an “open, inclusive, stable and prosperous Indo-Pacific where sovereignty and territorial integrity are respected.”

Prime Minister Rabuka expressed Fiji’s interest in joining the Indo-Pacific Oceans Initiative (IPOI) and highlighted the concept of 'Ocean of Peace' in the Pacific Region which emphasizes building a

peaceful, stable, secure, and sustainable future and well-being for the region. Prime Minister Modi welcomed Fiji into this partnership which “seeks to manage, conserve and sustain the maritime domain.”The two Leaders agreed to strengthen cooperation against terrorism and condemned terrorism in all its forms and manifestations. They condemned in strongest terms the Pahalgam terrorist attack, reiterated zero tolerance against and rejected double standards on terrorism.Both countries acknowledged the need to counter radicalization, combat financing of terrorism, prevent the exploitation of new and emerging technologies for terrorist purposes and tackle terrorist recruitment and transnational organized crime through joint efforts and capacity building. They agreed to work together at the UN and other multilateral fora

to combat terrorism.

The Fiji Prime Minister who arrived here yesterday on a three-day official visit, held “comprehensive and forward-looking” discussions with Prime Minister Modi on “full spectrum” of bilateral matters, and regional and global issues of mutual interest.Both Leaders agreed on the urgent need for comprehensive reforms of the United Nations, including through the expansion of the UN Security Council in both categories of membership to better reflect contemporary geopolitical realities.

Acknowledging the steady growth in bilateral trade they recognized the substantial untapped potential for trade and investment between India and Fiji and expressed intent to deepen sectoral cooperation in areas of mutual interest to further

consolidate economic partnership, diversify trade portfolios and enhance resilience of supply chains.

Prime Minister Modi welcomed the grant of market access to Indian ghee by the Government of Fiji.Reiterating their shared vision for a robust, inclusive, and sustainable Indo-Pacific economic architecture, both Leaders committed to working closely to promote mutual prosperity.

Russian Ambassador Sees Serbia Protests as Early Attempt to Destabilize Country

Belgrade, Aug 25 (UNI) : The current protests in Serbia are only the "first roller" that should destabilize the country and the government, then the leaders of the protest movement will take the stage, Russian Ambassador to Belgrade Alexander Botsan-Kharchenko told Sputnik.

"As soon as the protest movement — the first roller in the plans [of the West], which should sweep away the government — immediately after it, some people appear who will promote the European Union. They will say that these are those who can be relied upon, who will lead Serbia to a 'happy European future,'" Botsan-Kharchenko said.

According to the ambassador's assumption, now these are some little-known people in Serbia, who have not previously shown themselves in any way.

"Most likely, few will know them. As, by the way, many leaders of other countries who are nearby," the diplomat predicts.Student and opposition protests began in Serbia after the collapse of a canopy at the railway station in the city of Novi Sad on November 1, 2024, which resulted in the death of 16 people.

Beijing, Aug 25 (UNI) :China's national observatory activated a yellow alert the third highest level in its four tier color coded weather warning system for Typhoon Kajiki today, forecasting gales and rainstorms in the nation's southern and southwestern regions through tommorow.

The National Meteorological Center (NMC) reported that as of today morning, Typhoon Kajiki was positioned in the southern Beibu Gulf waters, moving west northwest at 15-20 km/h with expected landfall in coastal Vietnam today night. Due to its impact, from 2 p.m. today to 2 p.m. tommorow, strong winds will affect the western part of the South China Sea and waters near Xisha Islands, Beibu Gulf and Qiongzhou Strait, as well as the coastal areas of Hainan, Guangxi and Guangdong. During the same period, Yunnan, Guangdong and Hainan provinces, as well as the Guangxi Zhuang Autonomous Region, will experience heavy rains and rainstorms, according to the NMC. The NMC urged the local authorities to implement emergency preparedness measures for the typhoon, and potential flooding and geological disasters triggered by the heavy rainfall.

US not placing more tariffs on China as existing ones Already High : Vance

Washington, Aug 25 (UNI) : The US is not introducing new import tariffs against China for its trade partnership with Russia, since the current rate on US imports of Chinese goods is already high, US Vice President JD Vance said on Sunday.

"Obviously, we have a 54% tariff on the PRC [People's Republic of China] right now, so we have already applied pretty hefty sanctions on the Chinese," Vance said in an interview with NBC News when asked about why Washington was not imposing secondary sanctions on Beijing as the largest buyer of Russian oil.The US authorities have had "a number of conversations at all levels of government" to try and persuade China to assist the US in resolving the Ukrainian crisis, the vice president added.

Hungary calls for Ukraine to not threaten it, tells it to stop disrupting its energy post attack on oil pipeline

Budapest, Aug 25 (UNI) In a sharp attack on Ukraine, Hungary has called on Kyiv to stop disrupting its energy supply following a targeted attack on the Soviet-era Druzhba (Friendship) oil pipeline to Central Europe, reports RT.The attack has sparked the ire of both Hungary and Slovakia, both of whom have taken the matter to the European Commission. Ukrainian drones have struck the Druzhba pipeline several times, most recently on August 2 and 13.

Hungarian Foreign Minister Peter Szijjarto told Ukraine not to threaten Budapest, and slammed the drone attacks on the Druzhba pipeline, which he said was critical to the country's energy supply.

Further calling it an attack on the country's sovereignty, he wrote on X: "In recent days, Ukraine has conducted serious attacks on our energy supply, while attacking a country's energy security is, in fact, an attack on that country's sovereignty."

He stressed: "We call on the President of Ukraine to stop his threats against our country and to end reckless attacks on Hungary's energy security."

The spat escalated into a war of words with Ukrainian Foreign Minister Andriy Sybiha retorting that Budapest has no right to tell Kyiv what to do.

"You don't need to tell the Ukrainian President what to do or say, and when. He is the President of Ukraine, not Hungary. Hungary's energy security is in your own hands. Diversify and become independent from Russia, like the rest of Europe," he wrote on X.

The Hungarian FM in turn simply wrote "Stop attacking our energy security! This is not our war!"

The Soviet era pipeline is one of the longest pipelines in the world, and has now become a flashpoint in the wider energy war between Kyiv and Moscow, with diplomatic skirmishes also resulting from other European states, which are heavily reliant on it for energy supply.

Canadian PM announces new military assistance for Ukraine

Ottawa, Aug 25 (IANS) : Visiting Canadian Prime Minister Mark Carney announced in the Ukrainian capital Kyiv new military assistance for Ukraine, according to a news release issued by the Prime Minister's Office.

The funding of 2 billion Canadian dollars (\$1.45 billion) was committed at the June G7 Summit held in Canada's Kananaskis, Xinhua news agency reported.

About 835 million Canadian dollars (\$603 million) of the total are planned to procure a range of critical equipment for Ukraine, including armored vehicles, medical equipment, spare parts, small arms, ammunition, and explosives, as well as additional drone capabilities and other urgently needed equipment and supplies for Ukraine, the release said.

About 680 million Canadian dollars (\$491

Russia's Pulkovo Airport Cancels 90 Flights During Airspace Restrictions

Moscow, Aug 25 (UNI) The Pulkovo international airport in the northwestern Russian city of St. Petersburg canceled 90 flights and delayed or diverted dozens others due to the recent airspace restrictions, the airport authority said on Sunday.

"The airport operated under restrictions for about 20 hours. During this time, 90 flights were canceled, about 80 were delayed for more than 2 hours, and 42 were diverted to spare airfields," the statement read.Earlier in the day, the Russian Federal Air Transport Agency reported that restrictions on takeoffs and landings at St. Petersburg's Pulkovo had been lifted.

The airport is operating in an enhanced mode. Airport and airline staff are making every effort to normalize the flight schedule as soon as possible, the airport administration said.

Death toll from Israeli airstrikes on Sanaa rises to 6

Cairo,Aug 25 (UNI) The death toll from Israeli airstrikes against the Yemeni capital of Sanaa has risen to six, with 86 people injured, the country's health ministry said on Monday.Earlier reports indicated that four people were killed and 67 were injured in the airstrikes.

"According to the final figures, the death toll from the Zionist aggression has risen to six and 86 people were injured," Houthi health ministry spokesman Anis Al-Asbahi said on X. On Sunday, a Yemeni source told Sputnik that Israel had carried out airstrikes on the Yemeni capital and its outskirts. The airstrikes targeted a military camp near the presidential palace in Sanaa, a power plant, and an oil company facility, the source said.



million) are for the purchase of military equipment sourced from the United States to strengthen Ukraine's air defence capabilities and provide other urgently needed military assistance, the release said.

About 220 million Canadian dollars (\$159 million) will be used to purchase drone, counter-drone, and electronic

warfare capabilities, including investments in joint ventures between Ukrainian and Canadian industry, it said.

Zelensky welcomed Canada's readiness to allocate \$500 million under the Prioritized Ukraine Requirements List initiative to help Ukraine procure US weapons.

He also proposed that Canada join major energy

projects in Ukraine.

"We have the necessary port infrastructure and storage capacities. Ukrainian storage facilities can be used for the supply of Canadian gas," Zelensky said.

He further expressed hope that Canada could play an active role in implementing security guarantees for Ukraine.

India informs Pakistan of possible flooding in Jammu, in first major contact since military standoff

Islamabad/New Delhi, Aug 25 (UNI) : India has informed Pakistan of possible flooding of the River Tawi in Jammu, though not via the mechanism of the Indus Waters Treaty (IWT).

This marks the first major communication between the two countries since the May 10 ceasefire following the Pahalgam terror attack.

The alert was sent by the Indian High Commission in Islamabad to the Pakistan Foreign Office, warning of a "significant flood situation".Islamabad issued warnings to residents following the

notification, as well as alerted its National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA), irrigation departments, and defence personnel to be ready, reports Geo News.

Torrential rainfalls have caused significant waterlogging and flooding in both Jammu & Kashmir and Pakistan Occupied Kashmir (POK).

India suspended the Indus Waters Treaty following the April 22 Pahalgam terror attack, with New Delhi no longer being obligated to inform Pakistani authorities of water discharges from dams or construction of any hydropower

infrastructure in India, or otherwise sharing any crucial data.

While Pakistan has objected to this several times and even taken up the issue in international forums, India has kept the treaty in abeyance, citing Islamabad's continued promotion of cross-border terrorism.

The Pahalgam terror attack also led to India launching cross-border attacks on terrorist camps in Pakistan and Pakistan occupied Kashmir on May 7 under Operation Sindoor, which led to a four-day military standoff between the two nations, ending in a ceasefire on May 10.

Donald Trump threatens to expand National Guard deployment to Baltimore

Washington, Aug 25 (UNI) : United States President Donald Trump yesterday threatened to expand the military deployment to Baltimore in a clash with Maryland Governor Wes Moore, who critici?ed the deployment of National Guard in Washington, D.C., and invited Trump to visit his state and discuss public safety.Trump said in a post on Truth Social, "Wes Moore's record on Crime is a very bad one, unless he fudges his figures on crime like many of the other 'Blue States' are doing." "But if Wes Moore needs help, like Gavin Newsom (Newsom) did in L.A., I will send in the 'troops,' which is being done in nearby DC, and quickly clean up the Crime," he added, Trump's remarks were in response to the

Maryland governor's recent offer that Trump could "walk the streets of Maryland" and discuss public safety, an offer Trump viewed as being delivered in a "nasty and provocative tone."

"The reason that I asked the president to come and join us is because he seems to enjoy living in this blissful ignorance, these tropes and these 1980s scare tactics," Moore said in an interview with CBS.

"While the President is spending his time from the Oval Office making jabs and attacks at us, there are people actually on the ground doing the work who know what supports would actually work to continue to bring down crime. But it's falling on deaf ears of the president of the United States," Moore said.

Australian greenhouse gas emissions down 1.4 pct in 12 months to March

Canberra, Aug 25 (UNI) : Australia's greenhouse gas emissions fell by 1.4 percent in the 12 month period to March 2025, according to a government report published today.

The quarterly report on emissions from the Department of Climate Change, Energy, the Environment and Water (DCCEEW) said that Australia produced 440.2 million tonnes of carbon dioxide equivalent emissions in the year to March, down from 446.7 million tonnes in the preceding 12 months.

WFP Chief Says World in Midst of Worst Humanitarian Crisis on Earth

Tokyo, Aug 25 (UNI) UN World Food Programme (WFP) Executive Director Cindy McCain said the world was in the midst of the worst humanitarian crisis on Earth and described the situation in the Gaza Strip as catastrophic, stressing that she feels intense anger over the inability to provide aid to people due to Israel's ongoing military operation.

"There's very serious malnutrition. You've seen people die of hunger there," she said in an interview with the Japanese broadcaster NHK.McCain added that she was extremely angry that aid efforts were being hampered by ongoing Israeli military attacks, which were exacerbating food shortages."It's very difficult when they're pointing guns at us or tanks or anything else. There's been aid stoppage

because all of a sudden that road is blocked. We can't get in," McCain added.The WFP chief noted that other regions facing disastrous humanitarian crises included Sudan and South Sudan, DRC Congo and the Sahel.On Friday, the UN Food and Agriculture Organization declared a state of catastrophic famine in the Palestinian semi-exclave for the first time.

The UN's Integrated Food Security Phase Classification (IPC) distinguishes five stages of food insecurity, with levels three through five representing severe food insecurity.

The final stage, stage five, represents catastrophic famine. It estimates that by the end of September, more than 640,000 people in Gaza will face catastrophic levels of food insecurity, classified as phase five on the IPC.

South Korean president's approval rating falls to 64.2 pct says poll

Seoul, Aug 25 (UNI) South Korean President Lee Jae myung's approval rating fell 3.8 percentage points from a week earlier to 64.2 percent last week, a weekly poll showed today. The negative assessment on Lee's conduct of state affairs rose 3.4 percentage points to 34.3 percent, according to the computer assisted telephone interviewing (CATI) by local pollster Flower Research.

The ruling liberal Democratic Party's support decreased 4.3 percentage points to 49.7 percent, while the conservative opposition People Power Party's approval score gained 4.1 percentage points to 28.6 percent. Support rate for the minor left-leaning Rebuilding Korea Party and the minor rightist New Reform Party logged 4.6 percent and 3.2 percent each last week.

The pollster's separate survey of automated response system (ARS) showed that Lee's approval rating retreated 2.2 percentage points to 56.4 percent last week compared to the previous week. The CATI and the ARS surveyed 1,005 and 1,007 voters each from Friday to Saturday. They had plus and minus 3.1 percentage points in margin of error with a 95 percent confidence level.

Australian greenhouse gas emissions down 1.4 pct in 12 months to March

Australia's emissions in the year to March were 28 percent lower than in the calendar year 2005. Under the Paris Agreement, Australia has committed to cutting its emissions by at least 43 percent from 2005 levels by 2030.

"We are on track to achieve our emissions reduction goals if we stay the course and continue to lift our efforts," Chris Bowen, the minister for climate change and energy, said in a statement today.

The DCCEEW report said that emissions from the electricity, industrial processes and stationary

energy sectors were lower in the year to March than in the preceding 12 months, attributing the fall to technology improvements, changes in production, and a decline in residential gas demand.

Preliminary data for the second quarter of 2025, also contained in the report, showed that emissions dropped further in the 12 months to June 2025 to 436 million tonnes of carbon dioxide equivalent, which would represent a fall of 2.1 percent from the preceding 12 months and of 29 percent from 2005 levels.

SL tightens security for former president Wickremesinghe remanded in hospital

Colombo, Aug 25 (Xinhua) :A special security detail has been assigned to the Colombo National hospital, where former President Ranil Wickremesinghe was receiving medical treatment after being remanded on Friday, a spokesperson for the Department of Prisons

said today. According to prison spokesperson Jagath Weerasinghe, seven jailors and four prison guards have been deployed to ensure Wickremesinghe's security.

Wickremesinghe was arrested and remanded on charges of misusing state funds. He was initially

admitted to the prison hospital and transferred to the Colombo National hospital later. This marks the first time in Sri Lanka's history that a former executive president has been arrested and remanded. His case is scheduled to be heard again tomorrow.

Turns out a simple dose of salt can solve a whole slew of home disasters, like cracked egg messes and spills. And not only are the fixes incredibly easy, but they're also usually cheaper than using other fancy cleaning products. Here are a few of our favourite ways to let salt save the day.

Get sticky gunk off your iron

Turn your iron on high, and sprinkle a generous amount of salt onto a piece of wax paper. Move the hot iron over the paper, and watch the salt cause your gunk to fall right off.

Get rid of mildew

To banish mildew stains and smells from clothes or towels, make a paste from salt and lemon juice. Rub the paste on the stain, then let dry (ideally in the sun). Run clothes through the washing machine for good measure.

Clean a grime-covered sponge

Get rid of caked-on pan grease

Cover the greasy residue with a layer of salt, then add some water and wait 10 minutes. The solution will dissolve the grease, allowing you to easily wipe it away.

Clean a grimy wood cutting board

You shouldn't put wood cutting boards in the dishwasher, but you can disinfect them with hot water, salt and lemon juice.

Clean up a cracked egg

There's no need for wads of paper towels. Cover the mess with salt, and wait 10 to 15 minutes. The salt will turn the egggy goo into a crumbly sand that's easy to wipe up.

Clear up a red wine stain

Sprinkle salt on the fresh stain, and wait 5 minutes. Splash with cold water, and rub until the stain disappears.

Clear up a hair clog in the drain

Make a natural drain cleaning mix by mixing 1/4 cup of baking soda and 1/4 cup of salt. Remove as much hair from the drain as you can with your (gloved!) hands, and then pour the mixture down the drain. Follow with 1/2 cup of white vinegar, and let sit for 15 minutes. Rinse everything down with a pot of boiling water. Voila!

in the context of current India and Pakistan relations such engagements should not be prioritized over national interest," Gogoi said in his letter to the BCCI Secretary.

"The cross - border tensions still persist and we all are aware of the sacrifices of our armed forces. In such circumstances playing bilateral cricket with Pakistan appears contrary to the national interest," he said

"We had sent our delegation across the globe in order to spread the fact that Pakistan is behind the Pahalgam terrorist attack. We have also been taking certain steps to avoid any sort of engagement with Pakistan at international level. Even our Honourable Prime Minister mentioned that water and blood cannot flow together. Engaging with Pakistan at this stage sends out a message that undermines the sentiments of the people of India who stand firmly against any compromise on national security," said the chief of Assam Pradesh Congress Committee.

Gogoi further said that Pakistan had backed out of playing Hockey in India, mentioning the security concerns.

"Resuming cricket ties under the present circumstances may dilute the seriousness of our national concerns regarding security and diplomacy," he said while requesting that the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) must take a clear stand to avoid cricketing engagements with Pakistan until conditions are favourable and conducive to the nation's interest.

Prospective host cities can express their interest in staging the first-ever FIFaE Festival next year or the editions in 2027 and 2028 by emailing FIFaEITT@fifa.org, according to FIFA media statement. The tender process will conclude on October 31, 2025, while the deadline to express an interest is September 12.

Top coaches see KIWSF as springboard for global success

Srinagar, Aug 25 (UNI) : The sun may have set on the Khelo India Water Sports Festival 2025, but the first-ever consolidated, national-level, Open-age competition featuring kayaking, coaching and rowing has set a new chapter in the history of water sports in the country.

The Games, hosted by the Jammu and Kashmir Sports Council under the supervision of the Sports Authority of India, has lifted the enthusiasm of water sports athletes and their coaches as they eye qualification for Los Angeles Olympics 2028 and aim to win medals in other global competitions.

All the 24 gold medals, 10 were in rowing, decided at Dal Lake from August 21-23 were Olympic events.

Madhya Pradesh, Odisha and Kerala emerged the top three states in the Khelo India Water Sports Festival. An iconic lake in Bhopal, a water sports training centre alongside the Bay of Bengal and a SAI Centre of Excellence in the

lap of Kerala's enchanting backwaters in Alappuzha gained headlines after athletes from these facilities made a big splash at the Dal.

The performance of water sports exponents like Rasmita Sahoo, Bidya Devi Oinam and Shruti Tanaji Chougule, who train at SAI's Jagatpur centre in Odisha; Dally Bishnoi, Shikha Chauhan and Pallavi Jagtab of MP and, Vishal Dangi of Uttarakhand have given the kayaking and canoeing fraternity great hope. Shikha and Pallavi were part of an Indian trioka that recently won a historic silver in the Asian Canoe Slalom Championship in Guizhou, China.

The performance of kayakers and canoeists who train at the five SAI centres across India were noteworthy. Forty-seven SAI athletes won five golds, seven silvers and three bronze medals. Jagatpur, which had 15 athletes at KIWSF 2025, was the best with three golds and five silvers.

Under the new sports

policy (Khelo Bharat Niti) aimed at upliftment and exposure, the KIWSF festival aims to be a gamechanger. The Dal Games have already motivated the water sports fraternity and given government's support through its TOPS (Target Olympic Podium Scheme) and TAGG (Target Asian Games Group) schemes, the impact could be seen in the Asian Games in Japan next year. More than 30 gold medals each are at stake in the Olympics and Asian Games in kayaking and canoeing alone and India can certainly think of winning a medal at these global meets, feel experts. Coaches associated with SAI's National Centres of Excellence in Odisha and Kerala sound motivated already. Team champions Madhya Pradesh, which won 10 of the 24 gold medals in KIWSF, are equally bolstered.

The powerhouse performance Madhya Pradesh displayed in Srinagar wasn't by chance.

Madrid, Aug 25 (UNI) : Kylian Mbappe scored twice as Real Madrid maintained its perfect start to the season with a 3-0 win away to newly promoted Oviedo.

The home side pushed Madrid hard in front of a packed Carlos Tartiere Stadium but was undone by a controversial call and missed chances at key moments on Sunday.

Mbappe opened the scoring in the 38th minute after a pass from Aurelien Tchouameni, although Oviedo players protested that the referee had failed to call a foul in the buildup.

Oviedo nearly equalized in the 83rd minute when Kwasi Sibbo struck the post. Moments later, Mbappe

netted his second after receiving a pass from substitute Vinicius Jr., who then added Madrid's third deep into stoppage time.

Villarreal cruised to a 5-0 home win over Girona after racing to a 4-0 lead inside 28 minutes. Nicolas Pepe struck in the seventh minute before Tajon Buchanan scored twice and Rafa Marin added another.

Buchanan completed his hat trick in the second half as Villarreal claimed its first victory of the campaign, while Girona has conceded eight goals in just two games.

Ante Budimir's powerful early header gave Osasuna a 1-0 win at home to Valencia, which played most of the match with 10

men after Jose Gaya was sent off midway through the first half. Valencia pressed late but saw a potential equalizer ruled out for offside.

Espanyol squandered a 2-0 lead away to Real Sociedad. Pere Milla scored in the 10th minute and Javi Puado converted a stoppage-time penalty to put Espanyol 2-0 ahead at the break, but Ander Barrenetxea and Orri Oskarsson struck in the 61st and 69th minutes to salvage a draw for Sociedad.

On Saturday, FC Barcelona came down to 2-0 down to win 3-2 away to newly promoted Levante. Ivan Romero and Jose Luis Morales, from the penalty

spot, gave Levante a halftime lead before Pedri's long-range strike and Ferran Torres' goal quickly pulled Barcelona level.

In stoppage time, Lamine Yamal's cross was deflected into his own net by Unai Elgezabal to complete the comeback. Atletico Madrid struggled again, drawing 1-1 at home to Elche. Alexander Sorloth scored in the eighth minute for Atletico, but Rafa Mir equalized seven minutes later. Atletico pressed hard after the break but could not find a winner.

Elsewhere, Mallorca needed a late goal to draw 1-1 at home to Celta Vigo, while Betis edged Deportivo Alaves 1-0 on Friday night.

Harmanpreet Singh-led India optimistic about retaining Asia No.1 spot

employees to be more vigilant and work sincerely to ensure safe in train operations.

Mr Sanjay Kumar Srivastava held a detailed review on the safety protocols to be strictly followed in executing the station redevelopment works taken up over the zone as a part of Amrit Bharat Station scheme (ABSS). He instructed the DRMs to reiterate the safety rules connected to redevelop works to ensure more safety of passenger’s while boarding the trains and dispatching from station premises. He also

directed the officials to be more vigilant during monsoon and instructed to take all safety measures in construction activity including movement of vehicles carrying heavy materials and cranes working in the station premises.

During the meeting, Shri Sanjay Kumar reviewed the safety precautions being followed at Level crossing (LC) gates across the zone. The 20706 CSMT-Jalna Vande Bharat Express will be extended to run upto Hazur Sahib Nanded with effect from 27.08.2025.*

The 20705 Jalna-CSMT Vande Bharat Express will be extended to run from Hazur Sahib Nanded with effect from 28.08.2025.*

The train will now connect Nanded in the Marathwada region with the State capital i.e., Mumbai, and cover districts of Nanded & Parbhani apart from the already connected districts enroute, strengthening the ties between Nanded and Mumbai.

The train will cover the distance of 610 Kms between Nanded and Mumbai within a short span of 9 hours 25 mins. Presently the fastest train between Mumbai and Nanded is the Devgiri Express which takes 11 hrs, 20 mins. The CSMT-

The doubling of the 65 km Mahesana–Palanpur Rail Line has been executed at a cost of ?537 crore, while the 37 km Kalol–Kadi–Katosan Road Rail Line has been converted to broad gauge at a cost of ?347 crore. Similarly, the 40 km Bechraji–Ranuj Rail Line has also been converted to broad gauge at a cost of ?520 crore. The completion of these projects have ensured smoother, safer and more seamless connectivity, especially for Mahesana, Banaskantha and Patan districts. They have significantly eased travel for daily commuters, tourists and businesses, while promoting regional economic integration.

The doubling of tracks

has enhanced line capacity, making it possible to run higher-speed trains on the Ahmedabad–Delhi corridor. The completion of this project has eased out traffic congestions and unnecessary passenger train detentions due to crossing, ensuring punctuality in train movement.

Power supply to public Ganesh Mandals at domestic rates

Mumbai, Aug 25 : Public Ganesh Mandals are provided with temporary and immediate electricity connection facility by Mahavitaran. Domestic electricity rate will be charged for this connection. However, Chief Engineer of Mahavitaran Bhandup Circle, Shri. Sanjay Patil has appealed that public Ganesh Mandals should take advantage of this facility and use electricity only after taking official electricity connection.

For temporary electricity connection to Ganesh Mandals, registration certificate, pavilion permission of local self-government body, police station license, certificate that the electricity supply is safe from the electricity inspector, electricity demand application, electricity supply layout test report and nationalized bank account passbook photocopy etc.

Documents are required. Ganesh Mandals should contact the nearest Mahavitaran office with the necessary documents.

For temporary electricity connection, Ganesh Mandals are required to pay a deposit amount as per the approved electricity charge. If this amount is paid online, the remaining amount, excluding the electricity bill, will be refunded without delay after the end of Ganeshotsav.

Therefore, Mahavitaran has also appealed to Ganesh Mandals to pay the deposit amount online only.“

To avoid any kind of electrical accident during Ganeshotsav, while erecting the pavilion, lighting and displays, a safe distance should be maintained from low and high voltage power lines, distribution transformers, etc. systems.

Electrical safety rules should be strictly followed while arranging the power supply in the pavilion. The power supply in the pavilion should be arranged by approved electrical contractors.

Ganesh Mandals should not compromise on electrical safety measures.

For emergency situations, the mobile numbers of Mahavitaran branch engineers in the area should be recorded.
