IIT Bombay student jumps to death from hostel building

Mumbai Aug 2 (UNI) : An IIT student has died by suicide after jumping from a hostel building at IIT Bombay in Powai, Police official said.

The incident took place around midnight.

"According to preliminary information, the student was enrolled at IIT Bombay and is suspected to have taken the drastic step due to academic stress," police said in a statement.

Police said the "student ended his life by jumping from the hostel building late at night", adding , "The Powai police arrived at the scene and have launched an investigation".

The body has been taken into custody and sent for post-mortem. The identity of the student has not yet been disclosed.To determine the exact cause of the suicide, police are examining the student's mobile phone, notes found in his room, and other personal belongings.

Actor and mimicry artist Kalabhavan Navas found dead in hotel room

Kochi, Aug 2 (UNI) Actor and mimicry artist Kalabhavan Navas was found dead in a hotel room in Chottanikkara on Friday night, suspected to have suffered a heart attack.He was 51. He is survived by his wife, Rehana, a film and television actress, and their three children—Naharin, Rihan, and Ridwan.Navas had arrived in Chottanikkara for the shoot of the film Prakambanam. After completing the shoot, he returned to the hotel to pack his belongings. When one of the room keys was not returned for a long time, a room boy went to check and found him unresponsive. He was immediately taken to the hospital but was declared dead on arrival.

His father, Abubacker, was a noted theatre and film actor, and his brother, Niyas Bakker, is also a well-known actor in television and films.Navas started his career in the performing arts through mimicry, gaining recognition through Kalabhavan, a renowned arts troupe. He went on to act in numerous films and television serials, delivering notable performances in both lead and supporting roles.

As UP’s MP, I’m proud our BrahMos missiles will wipe out terrorists: PM

Varanasi, Aug 2 (UNI) : Prime Minister Narendra Modi today expressed happiness that BrahMos missiles will now be manufactured in Lucknow, and in a warning to Pakistan said that any future misadventure would be met with missiles made in UP.

Addressing a massive public meeting in Banauli village, Sevapuri (Varanasi) today, the PM expressed pride in the UP Defence Corridor, saying, "As an MP from UP, I am happy that BrahMos missiles will now be manufactured in Lucknow."He said weapons made in UP will bolster the Indian Army’s strength and asked the public if they felt proud of India’s self-reliant military power. Warning Pakistan, he declared that any future misadventure would be met with missiles made in UP.He also lauded the Yogi Adityanath government’s development work, and highlighted Kashi’s cultural and historical significance.

The Prime Minister highlighted Uttar Pradesh’s rapid industrial and social development, crediting the BJP government's policies

for attracting major national and international investments. He launched a sharp attack on the Samajwadi Party, accusing it of vote bank and appeasement politics. Contrasting it with the previous SP rule, he said criminals then operated fearlessly, deterring

investors. In today’s UP, under BJP rule, criminals fear the law and investors see a promising future.PM Modi highlighted key welfare achievements, stating that 2.5 crore UP farmers have received over Rs 90,000 crore under PM-Kisan, with Rs 900 crore reaching Kashi

alone. He also spoke of the Lakhpati Didi initiative, aimed at empowering three crore women nationwide—1.5 crore of whom have already achieved the milestone.

Taking a dig at SP, he said, “SP people will flee with their bicycles (party

symbol) after hearing these figures.”

Attacking the Samajwadi Party, the Prime Minister said that SP leaders had questioned in Parliament why the Pahalgam terrorists were killed now, sarcastically asking, “Should I call them to ask whether to kill terrorists or not? Should we wait for them to run away?”

He alleged that during SP’s rule, terrorists were given clean chits and cases against bomb blast accused were withdrawn. “They have a problem with terrorists being killed,” he said.

Declaring from the land of Kashi, the PM said, “This is New India—it worships Bholenath and becomes Kaal Bhairav before its enemies.”Speaking on Sewapuri’s development, PM Modi said it was a privilege to visit the doorstep of Maa Kalka Devi, adding that the temple has been grandly renovated. He highlighted key projects like the Chandpur–Bhadohi Road, which will boost connectivity and benefit both Banaras silk weavers and Bhadohi artisans.



Tejashwi slams EC over voter list, urges SC to intervene

Patna, Aug 2 (UNI) : Following the release of a revised draft electoral roll that reportedly excludes over 6.5 million voters from the state list, leader of opposition in the Bihar Assembly, Tejashwi Prasad Yadav, today demanded that the Supreme Court intervene and take suo motu cognisance of the issue.

While talking to newsmen here, he accused the Election Commission (EC) of losing its credibility. Yadav alleged that the Election Commission was no longer acting independently. It appears to be functioning under the influence of the country's top political leadership.

Dual nativity row hits medical admissions in Puducherry UT again

Puducherry, Aug 2 (IANS) The contentious issue of dual nativity has once again marred the medical admission process in Puducherry, with allegations surfacing over irregularities in the draft merit list released by the Centralised Admission Committee (CENTAC) for MBBS and other NEET-based courses under the government quota.

The Pondicherry State Students and Parents Welfare Association has raised an alarm over suspected misuse of nativity claims, with its president V. Balasubramanian revealing that at least two students were found to be listed in both Puducherry’s CENTAC merit list and the Tamil Nadu Health Department’s list.

This duplication, he said, points to potential fraud in the declaration of nativity, a critical factor in admissions under the Union Territory’s government quota.In a formal petition addressed to the Lieutenant Governor, Chief Minister and senior officials of the UT administration, the association has demanded an immediate probe and intervention.It has urged authorities to prevent candidates from other states from cornering seats meant exclusively for Puducherry natives.The association has also sought a thorough cross-verification of applicants’ NEET scores, rank numbers, and personal details against the merit lists released in Tamil Nadu, Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Karnataka, and Kerala.Balasubramanian expressed concern that multiple similar cases may have gone undetected due to insufficient scrutiny.Despite clear provisions in Puducherry’s admission guidelines — which disqualify any student claiming nativity in more than one state during the same academic year — the issue continues to recur annually.

The rules also mandate a parental declaration affirming the legitimacy of the nativity claim, but activists allege that enforcement remains weak.Last year, eight students were disqualified on dual nativity grounds.

However, the association criticised CENTAC and the Puducherry Health Department for not implementing the rules effectively.Balasubramanian alleged that the departments have failed to take proactive steps to detect and deter fraudulent claims.

Drawing attention to recent action taken by Tamil Nadu authorities, who disqualified over 23 students for submitting fake documents under the NRI and other quota categories, the association urged the Puducherry government to adopt similar strict punitive measures.

It also called for action against students, parents, and intermediaries involved in procuring bogus nativity certificates.With the admissions process underway, the association has warned that failure to address the issue promptly could deny deserving local candidates their rightful opportunity to pursue medical education.

Popular actor, comedian Madhan Bob no more

Chennai, Aug 2 (UNI) : Popular Tamil film actor and comedian Madhan Bob passed away today evening after battling cancer.

He was 71.

He breathed his last at his Adyar residence, where his body was kept for public to pay their last respects.

A well known actor, having shared screen space with leading actors like Kamal Haasan, Rajinikanth, Karthik, Surya, Vijay and Ajith, he had acted in more than 180 films in Tamil, Kannada,Malayalam and Hindi in multiple supporting roles.

He was an acclaimed comedian and was known for his roles in several films. Born as S. Krishnamoorthy on October 19, 1953, Madhan Bob was known for his amusing facial expressions, laughter and protruding eyeballs, which he took inspiration from yesteryear actor Kaka Radhakrishnan.A popular anchor, he has appeared in the popular Sun TV comedy show Asatha Povathu Yaaru? as one of the judges.The Tamil film industry mourned his death and several actors and artistes visited his residence and paid their last respects.A music director, he started his career in the 1984 hit film "Neengal Kettavai", starring Thiagarajan,

Banuchander, Silk Smitha and Archana, before venturing into acting and became popular among the audience and kept them spellbound with his timely wit and humour.

ISRO organizes Space Analog Mission in Tso Kar Valley, Ladakh

Chennai, Aug 2 (UNI) : Indian Human Spaceflight Programme is a national endeavor led by ISRO and aims to extend the human presence across solar system, starting with human spaceflight missions to Low Earth Orbit (LEO) and achieving Indian Crewed Lunar Landing by 2040.

This requires undertaking systematic studies to generate necessary Indian subject data for addressing various physiological, psychological and operational challenges associated with human space flight missions.

In this regard, ground based analog missions in environment simulating certain aspects of a typical human space mission provide an opportunity to understand the human health and performance risks.Human Space Flight Centre (HSFC) of ISRO is leading this endeavor for ISRO's upcoming human space missions. HSFC team led the Ladakh Human Analog Mission (LHAM) in November, 2024 as well as partnered in the recently concluded ten-day Isolation Study 'Anugami' involving ISRO's Gaganyatri in July, 2025.Continuing this endeavor, Dr V Narayanan, Secretary, Department of Space and Chairman, ISRO inaugurated the Himalayan Outpost for Planetary Exploration (HOPE) analog mission set up in Tso Kar Valley, Ladakh. In his inaugural address, Dr.

Narayanan said this analog mission is more than a simulation, rather it is a rehearsal for the future.He also noted that in line with Prime Minister Narendra Modi's vision, the space sector has been opened up to enable greater participation from Indian industry, ISRO said today.This analog mission with an industry partner showcases the new era of public-private synergy that is taking shape in Indian space ecosystem.

Post inauguration, industry partner will be organising 10-day (till August 10, 2025) HOPE analog mission with the shortlisted experiments from participating national institutions such as IIST and RGCB, Trivandrum; IIT Hyderabad; IIT, Bombay; and the Institute for Aerospace Medicine, Bangalore. Investigators from these institutes will examine epigenetic, genomic, physiological and psychological responses of two analog mission crew members and validate health-monitoring protocols, planetary surface operations, and refine sample collection and microbial analysis techniques.The valuable data generated through these Analog Missions organized by HSFC will form the basis for design of protocols and infrastructure for future Indian Human Exploration Missions by providing key insights into technology performance, crew workflows, and environmental adaptation.

BMC for an eco-friendly Ganesh festival Free distribution of colors to sculptors on experimental basis

(Standard Post Bureau) Mumbai, Aug 2 : To further strengthen the eco-friendly Shri Ganesh Festival, Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation provides free shadu clay to sculptors , ' first come, first served ' On this principle, facilities such as space for pavilions have been provided to create idols. In addition to these facilities, the Municipal Corporation will supply eco-friendly paints to sculptors on an experimental basis for this year's Shree Ganesh festival. A total of six eco-friendly paints are included in this. 7,800 liters of paint and 3,000

liters of eco-primer will be provided. Sculptors should use these paints to paint the idols of Shree Ganesh. So that it will help prevent water pollution. The Municipal Corporation is taking steps to provide services and facilities to celebrate the Ganesh festival. As per the directions of Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation Commissioner and Administrator Mr. Bhushan Gagrani and under the guidance of Additional Municipal Corporation Commissioner (Eastern Suburbs) Dr. Amit Saini, various civic services and

facilities are being provided by the administration. In order to encourage the creation of idols made of shadu clay in Mumbai Metropolitan City and to promote maximum eco-friendly idols, the Municipal Corporation has provided free shadu clay to sculptors this year as well, as every year. So far, 952 tons of clay have been provided. Along with this, 997 sculptors have also been given space for pavilions to create idols. The colors used to paint idols, especially chemical colors, can be harmful to the

environment. Therefore, during immersion, water sources can be polluted and public health can be adversely affected. Considering this possibility, the Municipal Corporation has appealed to the sculptors to use only eco-friendly colors as much as possible and avoid pollution of water bodies. In line with this, the Municipal Corporation administration will now provide eco-friendly colors to the sculptors on an experimental basis to paint the idols. In this, six eco-friendly colors namely white , orange , yellow , green , blue and red will be provided by the

Municipal Corporation to the sculptors. In this, white color will be provided in large quantities compared to other colors. Along with this, eco-friendly white primer will also be provided. Deputy Commissioner (Zone 2) and Coordinator of Shree Ganesh Festival Shri. Prashant Sapkale has appealed to the sculptors to contact the administrative division office (ward office) in their respective areas . Sculptors are also being appealed to use these eco-friendly colors and contribute to the eco-friendly festival .

Trump's Tariff policy adversely affecting US economy, Trump's Disapproval Rating goes up

New Delhi, Aug 2 (UNI) US President Donald Trump's Disapproval Rating has gone up to the year's highest level at 52.1 percent which is the worst net rating of his second term, according to a latest poll.

In the poll conducted by ActiVote between July 1 and 31, voters expressed concern at Trump's economic and Tariff policies and the Jeffery Epstein scandal that continues to cast a shadow over Trump and his administration.

Epstein, a wealthy financier and convicted child sex offender, committed suicide in jail in August 2019. Trump has acknowledged he knew Epstein in 1990s and early 2000s.

In another development Trump fired Erika McEntarfer, commissioner of the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) after BLS released weaker jobs data due to Trump's Tariff policy.

Reports said US stock markets were affected yesterday and Inflation went up to 2.7 percent in June. Job growth slowed sharply in July, according to the BLS.

According to BLS US employers added just 73,000 jobs in July, far below the expected 109,000.

However, Trump claimed that "The US Economy is booming."

Heather Long, chief economist at the Navy Federal Credit Union, said the US labour market is deteriorating quickly because of uncertainty caused by Trump's Tariff policies.

Rs 353 cr transferred to accounts of 16.77 lakh farmers in Haryana

Chandigarh, Aug 2 (UNI) : Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Saturday released the 20th installment of the PM-Kisan Samman Nidhi from Varanasi, Uttar Pradesh, transferring Rs 20,500 crore to the bank accounts of 9.7 crore farmers across the country.

Out of this, Rs 353 crore has been credited to the accounts of 16.77 lakh farmers in Haryana.

To mark this occasion, a state-level PM-Kisan Utsav Diwas programme was organized in Panchkula, where Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini participated as the chief guest. Similar celebrations were held in other districts, where Cabinet and Ministers of State were present. Farmers across Haryana also listened to the Prime Minister's address live.

Addressing the gathering, the Chief Minister said that the release of the 20th installment is not just financial support but a testimony of the trust that the Prime Minister has placed in the farmers of the country. Youth brutally murdered by three persons, including two minors

Malegaon (Nashik), Aug 2 (UNI) A 25-year-old municipal contract worker was brutally murdered in a late-night attack that has sent shockwaves through the city.

Nitin Arjun Nikam, a resident of Jayabhimnagar in Aishanagar, was ambushed near a showroom on Old Agra Road around midnight Friday by three assailants allegedly seeking revenge for a previous altercation.

According to the police complaint filed by the victim's brother Vishal Nikam, the attackers – identified as Sachin Ahire

and two minors – first bludgeoned Nitin with wooden sticks before stabbing him repeatedly with a sharp knife.

The assailants then allegedly smashed the victim's face with stones in a final act of brutality. The entire incident was captured on CCTV cameras in the area.

Cantonment Police acted swiftly, arresting prime suspect Sachin Ahire within hours of the crime being discovered on Saturday morning. The two juvenile accomplices have also been taken into custody. Assistant Police

Inspector Patil is leading the ongoing investigation into what appears to be a premeditated attack stemming from an old dispute. This gruesome murder has intensified concerns about rising crime in Malegaon, with residents questioning police effectiveness as the city witnesses a spike in violent offenses including murders, burglaries and thefts in recent weeks. The brazen nature of this latest killing, committed in a public area and recorded on camera, has particularly alarmed the community.

BJP Mahila Morcha chief inspects children's home after scandal

Chhatrapati Sambhajanagar, Aug 2 (UNI) Chitra Wagh, State President of BJP's Mahila Morcha, conducted a surprise visit to the Bhagwan Baba Children's Home today to personally assess the conditions for relocated girls from the controversial Vidyadeep Children's Home.

High-achiever IAS officer Ashima Mittal takes charge as Jalna Collector

Jalna, Aug 2 (UNI) : Ashima Mittal, the accomplished civil servant credited with transformative educational reforms in Nashik, officially assumed charge as Jalna's new District Collector on August 1.

The IIT Mumbai alumnus brings an impressive track record to her new assignment, having most recently served as Nashik Zilla Parishad's Chief Executive Officer where she implemented groundbreaking initiatives for marginalized students.

A 2017 IAS officer who secured All India 12th rank without appearing for the mains examination, Mittal holds a civil engineering degree from IIT Mumbai where she earned the prestigious Shankar Dayal Sharma Gold Medal, along with a postgraduate degree in Anthropology.

Her administrative journey includes significant postings as ITDP Project Officer in Dahanu (Palghar) and as Trainee District Collector in Ahmednagar before her Nashik assignment.

During her Nashik tenure, Mittal's flagship 'Super 50' residential coaching program enabled 200 students from SC, ST, Divyang and other disadvantaged groups to prepare for JEE, CET and NEET exams, resulting in 22 JEE Main and 7 JEE Advanced qualifiers.

Her leadership saw Nashik district achieve top rankings in multiple state initiatives - first position in National Gram Swaraj Abhiyan and a statewide essay competition commemorating Lord Mahavira's 2550th Nirvana Kalyanak, third place in the Chief Minister's 100 Days Office Reforms Campaign, and consecutive Child Friendly Awards in 2023-24 for combating malnutrition.

POCSO court grants bail to WB doctor

Mumbai, Aug 2 (UNI) A special Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act court in Mumbai, granted conditional bail to a West Bengal-based doctor accused of assisting a former 40-year-old female teacher, Bipasha Kumar, in the alleged sexual exploitation of a 17-year-old male student at Bombay Scottish School in Mumbai, a lawyer said here today. While granting the bail, Special Judge Sabina A Malik, in her order directed the accused doctor to furnish a bail bond of Rs 50,000 and not to hamper and tamper with the evidence available against her and also prohibited her from contacting the survivor. The court in its order further asked her not to leave Mumbai without prior court approval. Any breach of these conditions, the court warned, would result in immediate cancellation of bail. Judge Malik in her order further noted that the doctor was not the prime accused, and her custodial interrogation had been completed, and keeping her in custody would not serve any additional purpose as the trial is yet to begin.

TN CM Stalin launches Nalam Kakkum Stalin Programme

Chennai, Aug 2 (UNI) : In yet another pioneering initiative aimed at providing quality and affordable healthcare to the people in rural areas on par with those urban populace, Tamil Nadu Chief Minister M K Stalin today launched 'Nalam Kakkum Stalin' programme in the city.

In a social media post, Mr. Stalin said a total of 1,256 camps will be organised on all Saturdays across Tamil Nadu. The results of the screening would be informed to the participants by SMS. They would be provided with

folders with results of their blood test, ECG, ECG, X-Ray, USG, mammogram, among others.

The 'Nalam Kakkum Stalin' programme, launched today would offer a range of services to those who visit the camps, Tamil Nadu government's spokesperson and Additional Chief Secretary Dr.J.Radhakrishnan told reporters. He said samples taken from beneficiaries would be identified using bar coding and the results would be made available by the end of the day.

A State-level monitoring committee headed by the Chief Secretary would review the programme, while Collectors would review their implementation at the district level.

--Has the farmer, who made this food that has come to my plate, made profits or is he loss-making? Is this food good for me? By the time this food has come to my plate, how much has it damaged this planet?, he said.

Mr. Manoj Kumar said "How do we ensure that everyone always eat quality food? We have tests to ensure that every food is safe and we should make it the normal. If we want the planet to be regenerated, like the cells in our body, that is the correct way to grow food. We have successfully implemented this in Araku Valley. The only way we can do all of this is if the country decides to go back to its roots."

Speaking about the 'Internship for Farmers' initiative launched during the conclave, former IPS Officer K. Annamalai, who is the Chief Mentor, We The Leaders Foundation,

said the 'Internship initiative will provide an exposure to those interested in agriculture.

Eight organic farmers have come forward to open their doors to youngsters interested in learning about agriculture.

The objective is to plant the seed of farming in the mind of youngsters while they are pursuing studies.

The benefits of such initiatives will be felt in the generations to come, he said. Lauding IIT-Madras Director Prof. V. Kamakoti for pursuing Organic Farming, Mr Annamalai said "the 'Internship for Farmers' will connect those interested in farming with the organic farmers."

"Today, we are growing economically with a prosperous middle class that actively searches for organic products. The success of organic farming can be gauged from the fact that coffee from

Araku Valley can be found as far as in France. They provide for end-to-end farming", he said.

This conclave will also see addresses by farmers whose family members faced cancer, following which they switched over to organic farming. Naandi Foundation has developed a Cosmic Calendar that will help farmers know of the nature's behaviour."

The event witnessed the launch of the Youth Farming Internship Program a pioneering initiative aimed at bridging rural wisdom with urban curiosity through immersive farm-based learning. It will begin with eight identified Lead Farmers across the Kongu region of Tamil Nadu, who have voluntarily offered their farms as living classrooms for youth. Speaking on how technology can play a role in agriculture, Prof. Kamakoti said, "We have started an Regenerative Agriculture Stack Architecture (RASA) at IIT Madras. We explored concepts like Automated farming, electrifying tractors and light weight agricultural devices, among others. Natural farming must be encouraged and particularly, the youngsters must take up to it."

Building borderless university the Marwadi way

During a recent two-day visit to the vibrant campus of Marwadi University in Rajkot, Gujarat, a team of journalists from Bengaluru found itself immersed not just in a place of learning, but in an institution determined to reshape the future of higher education in India.

With its bold Vision 2027 agenda, Marwadi University is chasing scale, quality, and impact, all while staying deeply rooted in the values of social uplift and academic integrity.

The story of the university is both personal and purposeful. Founded in 2008 as part of an educational trust and elevated to university status in 2016, its origin lies in the founders’ experiences. "Our family’s inclination to access higher education due to financial constraints became the catalyst for creating an institution that would remove such barriers for thousands," Marwadi University Trustee Dhruv Marwadi said.

What began with just 300 students has now grown into a thriving academic ecosystem of 15,000 students, including over 1,700 from 54 countries. The university now aims to raise this number to 25,000 by 2027, while entering the QS global rankings and India’s NIRF Top 100 — but not at the cost of quality, Dhruv said.

What sets Marwadi University apart is its commitment to personalized attention. "Using an integrated, in-house digital ERP system, the university tracks each student's progress, attendance, and even engagement metrics like library usage and skill-specific outcomes in assessments," Pro Vice Chancellor Dr Sanjeet Singh said.

"Exams are designed not just to grade, but to measure whether students have mastered outcomes like critical thinking, public speaking, or problem-solving. Those who underperform in specific skill areas are flagged for remedial sessions with expert mentors," he added.

Each faculty member mentors a group of 15 students, regularly checking on academic, emotional, and financial well-being. The mentorship is tracked digitally, creating a safety net where no student goes unnoticed. The university has also partnered with professional counseling services to provide mental health support when needed.

"Every student's journey is monitored not just for grades, but for growth," Singh said. "It’s not about pushing only the top students; we take pride in lifting the average student to excellence."

Marwadi University employs 758 full-time faculty members and 100 adjunct faculty from 12 countries, covering geographies from Europe and the US to Africa and Southeast Asia. Faculty are recruited from across India — from Jammu & Kashmir to Kerala — and trained rigorously through the in-house Teaching-Learning Center (TLC) in modern pedagogy.

The university insists that all faculty must either hold a PhD or be enrolled in one. "Even the best subject expert needs to know how to teach effectively," said University Executive Registrar Naresh Jadeja. "That’s what we invest in."

Faculty members are also engaged in active research. The university has invested ₹20 crore in research infrastructure, including high-end machines like 3D printers, SEM, XRD, and platforms in partnership with Nvidia, Jadeja said.

The Marwadi University Research Center houses 40 full-time research faculty, who work alongside students across undergraduate to doctoral levels, he said. The university’s publication output has tripled over the past three years, rising from 500 to 1,500 papers annually—many authored jointly by students and faculty in Quartile 1 and 2 journals. The goal, however, extends beyond numbers, Jadeja said.

In a unique collaboration, Marwadi has co-designed a Master’s in Forced Migration in partnership with universities from Vietnam, Italy, Greece, and Australia, with funding from the European Union. "One of the PhD scholars leading the program is from Syria, offering real-world insight into a subject that affects millions," Sanjeet Singh said.

"Education must reflect lived realities," he noted. "Our diverse international student base helps us design globally relevant programs."

The university has signed over 45 international MoUs, including with Webster University (USA), University of West Alabama (USA), IULM and Cattolica Universities (Italy), and Bloomsbury Institute (UK). These partnerships offer semester exchanges, dual degrees, and — most notably — paid internships abroad, often bundled with industry exposure in host countries.

At home, students also benefit from close industry ties. The university is currently in partnership talks with Bajaj to establish a ₹60 crore innovation lab, while collaborations with Nvidia, MG Hector, and Volvo are already active, Dr Sanjeet Singh said.

The Marwadi campus has become a melting pot of cultures and ideas, hosting students from Syria, Afghanistan, Malaysia, Indonesia, the UAE, and multiple African nations. The founders proudly note that international students are not only learning in Rajkot, they are also contributing to local industries and communities, University Provost Professor Rajendra Singh Jadeja said.

Trump's policy decisions continue to clash with India's core strategic interests: Report

US President Donald Trump's South Asian policy has been marked with strategic contradictions, straining its relationship with India. Though the US considers India a vital player in the Indo-Pacific and seeks its partnership in the region, several of Trump's policy decisions have clashed with India’s core strategic interests, a report cited on Saturday.

Such contradictions became apparent in several recent decisions, including hosting Pakistan's army chief, General Asim Munir, at the White House, supporting an IMF bailout to Pakistan during Operation Sindoor, and recurring gestures of praise towards Pakistani leadership, Imran Khurshid, an Associate Research Fellow at the International Centre for Peace Studies (ICPS) in New Delhi, wrote in the Eurasian Times.

He highlighted that the US support for Pakistan has emboldened Islamabad's strategic confidence, providing it with a leeway to act aggressively against India — politically, militarily, and diplomatically — "especially at sensitive geopolitical moments".

"If the US wants India to be a serious and independent partner in the



Indo-Pacific, it must stop undermining India in South Asia and respect its sensitivities. It must abandon binary, fragmented regional frameworks and instead pursue an integrated strategy that strengthens India's position — not weakens it," Khurshid mentioned.

"If these contradictions continue, America may not just lose India — it may lose the very global leadership it once proudly commanded. Trump claims to want to 'Make America Great Again', but his actions might just ensure America becomes isolated, distrusted, and strategically irrelevant," he added.

The relationship between India and the US was once described as the "defining partnership of the

21st century". Previous US Presidents, including Bill Clinton in his second term, George W. Bush, and Barack Obama, made considerable efforts to establish mutual trust and followed the policy of de-hyphenation with India and Pakistan, "treating each country on its own merits".

"They largely respected India's red lines, particularly on sensitive issues like Kashmir and strategic autonomy, and avoided viewing India through a Pakistan-centric lens..."

Trump's transactional approach to foreign policy, he wrote, is driven by personal ego, unpredictable behaviour, fragmented thinking, and an obsession with trade deficits and tariffs which has made India uneasy.

The recent actions by Trump, reckoned the

author, have eroded the trust and warmth that once existed in the India–US relationship.

"This disregard escalated with Trump's unilateral decision to impose a 25 per cent tariff on Indian goods starting August 1, 2025, coupled with vague but punitive secondary sanctions linked to India's continued purchases of Russian oil and defence equipment," he stated.

Trump, he detailed, has not only damaged day-to-day diplomacy but also jeopardized America's long-term strategic vision. "Foundational documents such as the National Security Strategy and the Indo-Pacific Strategy have been weakened in practice, as his approach consistently diverges from their stated goals," he wrote.

Tejashwi slams EC over voter list, urges SC to intervene

Patna, Aug 2 (UNI) : Following the release of a revised draft electoral roll that reportedly excludes over 6.5 million voters from the state list, leader of opposition in the Bihar Assembly, Tejashwi Prasad Yadav, today demanded that the Supreme Court intervene and take suo motu cognisance of the issue.

While talking to newsmen here, he accused the Election Commission (EC) of losing its credibility. Yadav alleged that the Election Commission was no longer acting independently. It appears to be functioning under the influence of the country's top political leadership.

Yadav said that an average of 20,000 to 30,000 names have been removed from each constituency, without providing transparent information about which booths or individuals were affected.

“The ECI is disclosing the number of deletions per constituency, but not the voter card numbers, booth details, or the reasons for removal. This lack of transparency is alarming,” he quipped.

Yadav also criticised the behaviour of ECI officials, calling their response to an RJD delegation “non-cooperative” during a recent meeting.

He said the process failed to follow the Commission’s own guidelines, including rules that Booth Level Officers (BLOs) should visit each voter three times and provide receipts after collecting forms. “In reality, these procedures were barely followed, not even in one percent of cases,” he claimed.

The RJD leader raised serious concerns over the justification for the mass deletion of names, which the Commission attributes to deaths, migration, duplication, or missing persons.

Highlighting the scale of the issue, he pointed out that the dropped voters account for approximately 8.5 percent of Bihar’s electorate. He even claimed that his own name was missing from the draft list, despite having submitted the required forms. “If my name is gone, how can anyone trust the system?” he said, jokingly.

Yadav alleged that several high-profile individuals, including an IAS officer and other senior officials, have also found their names missing from the list.

Calling for the Election Commission to act in the interest of citizens rather than of the ruling establishment, Yadav said, “If the outcome of elections is predetermined, why not simply extend the term of the current government instead of going through the motions of democracy?”

Brent crude price may surge to \$80 amid US-Russia tensions: Report

(Standard Post Bureau) Brent crude oil prices are expected to rise to \$80-\$82 per barrel by the end of 2025, as tensions between the United States and Russia threaten to disrupt the global oil supply chain, analysts said on Saturday.

According to analysts, Brent Crude Oil October futures contract has a short-term target of \$76 from \$72.07. By the end of 2025, the Brent crude price could reach \$80-\$82 per barrel. The downside support and cap are at \$69. WTI Crude Oil September futures contract, now at \$69.65, has a short-term target of \$73. By the end of 2025, the WTI crude price could reach \$76-\$79. The downside support and cap are at \$65.

Earlier this week, US President Donald Trump gave Russia 10-12 day deadline to end the war in Ukraine, failing which could result in additional sanctions and secondary tariffs on countries that trade with Russia, pushing oil prices higher.

Trump had earlier announced that the secondary tariffs could be as high as 500 per cent. Countries dependent on crude oil imports from Russia should now make the trade-off between a discounted price and a high tariff on exports to the US.

“This could lead to a dramatic shift in the oil market by reducing spare production capacity and causing a supply shock, which would diminish the

surplus in the market until 2026,” said NS Ramaswamy Head of Commodities and CRM at Ventura Securities. India's crude oil imports from Russia have significantly increased since the start of the Ukraine war. Before the war, Russian crude accounted for just 0.2 per cent of India's oil purchases, which are now between 35 and 40 per cent, making Russia India's top oil supplier.

Although US President Donald Trump stated that he wants to see lower oil prices, any significant increases in supply from the US will take time to reach the market. Tapping the proved oil reserves involves labour, capital and infrastructure, Ramaswamy said. "Support from Saudi Arabia and select OPEC countries to fill this supply gap would also have a time lag, thus resulting in the near-term price rise. The impact of the oil balance would be significant and result in a deficit even if OPEC+ doesn't go for any additional tranches of supply cuts," he added.

While the US-European Union trade deal last week has aided the oil market, geopolitical tensions will continue to pose asymmetric upside risks to oil prices. Further, markets weighed on the potential build-up of US inventories and the upcoming interest rate decision, which saw strength in the US dollar putting some pressure on oil prices.

Iraqi PM inaugurates refinery post refurbishment after terrorist sabotage

Baghdad, Aug 2 (UNI) : Iraqi Prime Minister Mohammed Shia' al-Sudani on Saturday inaugurated the grease refinery unit in the country's largest refinery complex of Baiji Refinery in Saladin province, following the full rehabilitation of its production units previously damaged after terrorist sabotage. Al-Sudani emphasised that the refinery is a vital industrial facility that produces essential oils and asphalt in various grades, with an annual output of 250,000 tons of base oils and 600,000 tons of multi-grade asphalt, according to a statement by al-Sudani's media office.

The facility will also supply engine oils, heavy oils, turbine oils, and more products that will benefit various government ministries, it said. "With the rehabilitation of this refinery and other refineries and facilities, Iraq will soon reach the stage of exporting after meeting local market needs," al-Sudani said. The Baiji Refinery complex was destroyed after witnessing heavy fighting when IS terrorists seized large parts of the province in 2014. The Iraqi government forces liberated the refinery and surrounding areas in April 2015.

Russian Defense Minister says 99 paratroopers named heroes of Russia since 2022

Moscow, Aug 2 (UNI) : Russian Defense Minister Andrei Belousov on Saturday congratulated serving and veteran paratroopers on Russian Airborne Troops Day, praising the 99 paratroopers who had been named Heroes of Russia since the special military operation began in 2022. "The heroism of the winged infantry was tempered in the battles of the Great Patriotic War, in Afghanistan, Yugoslavia, the North Caucasus, Syria and many other hot spots. In the times of the special military operation, the personnel of the Airborne Forces are acting skillfully and decisively in key areas and directions. For their courage and heroism, 99 people have been awarded the high title of the Hero of Russia," Belousov said in a statement.

Paratroopers' professionalism, amplified by the effective use of modern means of combat and their extensive experience, allows them to effectively solve the most difficult tasks and makes them a reliable reserve for Russia's supreme commander-in-chief, President Vladimir Putin, Belousov said.

"In the face of new challenges and threats, efforts to bolster the combat potential of the airborne forces as an effective tool for protecting Russia's interests and ensuring its security remains one of the priorities for the development of the Armed Forces of the Russian Federation," Belousov said.

Belousov thanked all generations of paratroopers for their impeccable, selfless service and readiness to defend the country. August 2 marks the 95th anniversary of the first jump by Russian paratroopers during drills in the Moscow Military District in 1930 when their detachment trained landing in the enemy's rear.

Putin to visit Malaysian King Sultan Ibrahim in Moscow on August 6

Moscow/Kuala Lumpur, Aug 2 (UNI) Russian President Vladimir Putin is scheduled to meet with Malaysian King Sultan Ibrahim on August 6 in Moscow, where the two leaders will discuss both bilateral relations and international issues, as per Russian state media TASS. "Talks between Russian President Vladimir Putin and Sultan Ibrahim are scheduled for August 6 in Moscow. The two leaders will discuss further developing Russian-Malaysian relations and current international and regional issues," the Kremlin press service reported. The Malaysian leader will visit Russia on August 5-10. On May 14, during a meeting in the Kremlin with Malaysian Prime Minister Anwar Ibrahim, Putin requested that he extend an invitation to the king to visit Russia, with Kremlin spokesperson Dmitry Peskov stating that Putin attaches great importance to Moscow's relations with Kuala Lumpur. Russia's ties with Malaysia have grown over the years, with the two countries enhancing their economic, security, diplomatic relations, despite the Southeast nation having officially condemned Russia's attack on Ukraine.

Iran planning to launch second version of Nahid-2 satellite

Tehran, Aug 2 (UNI) : In a bid to boost its space and missile technology, Iran is now planning to launch the second model of its Nahid-2 telecommunications satellite using its indigenously developed Simorgh rocket after last week's liftoff aboard a Russian Soyuz vehicle, the head of Iran's Space Agency said on Saturday. "The second Nahid-2 will be launched by the Simorgh rocket after final adjustments," Hassan Salarieh, head of the Iranian Space Agency, said. "We have the internal capacity to carry out the launch ourselves." The current version of Nahid-2 was launched into orbit last week from Russia's Vostochny Cosmodrome as part of a multi-payload mission. Iran confirmed it was one of the satellites onboard after Russian media referred only to a "foreign customer."

As per Iran International, the Iranian space chief, commenting on the rocket's abilities said that the Simorgh rocket can carry satellites of up to 300 kilograms into lower orbits, confirming that Tehran is also developing heavier launch vehicles, including the Sarir and Soroush classes, which are designed for larger payloads. The Qaem-100 launcher, also developed by Iran, can carry up to 100 kilograms and was used last year in the launch of the Soraya satellite, which drew immense condemnation from Western governments, who said it "uses technology essential for the development of a long-range ballistic missile system."

Germany ramps up militarisation, Bundeswehr reports 28 pec increase in recruits

Berlin, Aug 2 (UNI) : In an unprecedented move, Germany has considerably ramped up its militarisation, with the Bundeswehr (German Armed Forces) reporting a 28% increase in the number of recruits from January to July, reports RT.

Russia - which has repeatedly slammed Western countries and the NATO countries for using Moscow as their 'monster' for justifying the increased militarisation of Europe - has called the bloc's move a "reckless act." According to the German Defence Ministry, more than 13,700 people joined the Bundeswehr - the army, air force, navy, and other branches - since the start of 2025. Officials described it as the sharpest year-on-year rise in years, aimed at countering possible military "threat" from Russia. Moscow has dismissed the speculation that it plans to attack the rest of Europe or any NATO countries as "total nonsense." At present, the Bundeswehr counts around 182,000 active-duty soldiers and 81,000 civilian staff. However, the government wants to have 260,000 active-duty troops by 2035.

Despite Moscow's repeated assurance of having no intention on attacking Germany or the rest of Europe, Berlin has been mulling reintroduction of military conscription to fill up its desired numbers, with Chancellor Friedrich Merz having pledged to create Europe's "strongest conventional army" and increase defence spending to 3.5% of GDP by 2029.

In June, Kremlin spokesperson Dmitry Peskov condemned NATO's military buildup, accusing the bloc's European members of "firmly following the path of reckless militarisation."

He also said that "Germany is actively participating in whipping up hysterical Russophobia across the European continent," adding that "It is clearly not in the interest of the peoples of Europe."

UK Foreign Secretary David Lammy says regime change in Iran unlikely to replace IRGC

London, Aug 2 (UNI) UK Foreign Secretary David Lammy, speaking on the potential impact of a regime change in Iran, warned that it was unlikely that any administration change could guarantee in a better successor to the country's notorious paramilitary organisation - the Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC), reports Iran International.

"There are lots of people in Iran who would like regime change," Lammy told The Guardian, in an interview published on Saturday. "But there are no guarantees that what would replace the current Iranian Revolutionary Guard Corps would not be as bad or worse." Regarding the US bombardment of Iran's nuclear facilities in June 22, he said that a regime

The handover took place two months ahead of schedule at the Airbus Defence and Space assembly line in Seville. "Ambassador Dinesh K Patnaik, along with senior officials from the Indian Air Force, received the last of the 16 Airbus C-295 military transport aircraft at the Airbus Defence and Space assembly line in Seville. The delivery, two months ahead of schedule, marks an important milestone in strengthening India's defense capabilities," the Embassy of India in Madrid posted on X.

US economy further rattled by AI and federal job cuts, amid growing economic uncertainty due to Trump tariffs

Washington, Aug 2 (UNI) Amidst the growing pressure on the US economy due to the Trump tariffs, the country's uncertain and rattled job market is further being affected by the increased adoption of AI, leading to a wave of federal cuts and layoffs across major sectors, reports CBS News.

According to a new report by outplacement firm Challenger, Gray & Christmas, over 10,000 job losses in July alone were directly linked to the growing adoption of generative AI technologies by private employers.

The firm now ranks AI among the top five causes of workforce reductions this year, a strong indicator of generative AI's expanding impact across the economy.

Exacerbating the situation, so far, over 806,000 job cuts have been

recorded between January and July this year - marking the highest in five years since 2020.

The pace of layoffs accelerated in July, when only 73,000 new jobs were added, falling well below the expected figure of 109,000, increasing concerns about the downward spiral in the hiring momentum.

In an ironic twist, the tech sector has borne the greatest brunt of these cuts, with over 89,000 layoffs being recorded so - a 36% increase over the same period in 2024.

Since early 2023, more than 27,000 positions have been eliminated specifically due to AI integration, the report states.

"The industry is being reshaped by the advancement of artificial intelligence and ongoing uncertainty surrounding work visas," the firm noted,

adding that these trends have pushed companies to restructure operations and trim workforce size.

Younger workers are being hit especially hard. Entry-level corporate job postings, once a mainstay for recent college graduates, have dropped 15% over the past year, according to Handshake, a career platform aimed at Gen Z.

Simultaneously, job listings that mention "AI" have surged by 400% in two years, underscoring how automation is increasingly central to hiring practices.

Yet AI is not the only factor weighing on the labour market. More than 292,000 job cuts this year have stemmed from the Department of Government Efficiency (DOGE), an initiative led by billionaire Elon Musk to curb federal spending. The ripple effects of DOGE have

reached beyond government employment, affecting healthcare and nonprofit sectors as well.

"We are seeing the federal budget cuts implemented by DOGE impact non-profits and health care in addition to the government," said Andrew Challenger, senior vice president at the firm.

Retail, another cornerstone of the U.S. economy, is also showing signs of strain. As tariffs drive up operating costs and consumer spending slows, the sector has slashed over 80,000 jobs this year - a staggering 250% increase compared to the same period in 2024.

With AI gaining ground, government austerity measures expanding, and economic headwinds intensifying, the American labour market appears headed for a period of prolonged volatility.

Hamas refutes Steve Witkoff's statement on disarmament

Gaza, Aug 2 (UNI) : Refuting a reported statement by the US Special Envoy to the Middle East Steve Witkoff, that Hamas had decided to lay down its arms in Gaza, the organisation said it would not disarm "as long as the occupation exists." The terror group vowed to continue its violent struggle, claiming its fight to deliver Palestine its "national rights" were realised and supported by international law, adding "foremost among them... the establishment of an independent Palestinian state with full sovereignty and Jerusalem as its capital."

Hamas went on to slam Witkoff's visit to the controversial Gaza Humanitarian Foundation run by Israel and the US, amid reports of starvation in the region, and that hundreds of Palestinian aid seekers had been killed near the agency's four distribution sites in the south and center of the enclave since they started operating in mid-May, reports Times of Israel. "The American administration is a full partner in the crime of starvation and genocide," said Hamas. It added that Witkoff's visit was "nothing more than a pre-arranged theatrical performance" to provide Israel with "political cover for managing starvation and continuing the systematic killing of children and unarmed civilians from our people." Condemning Washington, the terror group called on the White House "to bear its historical responsibility by lifting the cover from the crime of the century in Gaza and moving toward a ceasefire agreement that leads to ending the aggression."

Bangladesh interim government to announced 'July Declaration' on Aug 5, marking one year of July Uprising

Dhaka, Aug 2 (UNI) : The interim government of Bangladesh is moving towards the finalisation of its so-called 'July Declaration' on August 5, marking one year of its July Uprising which saw the ouster of Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina's Awami League led government.

The draft will be presented before the nation in the presence of all stakeholders involved in the mass uprising at 5:00pm local time, according to a statement issued by the CA Press Wing today, reports Daily Star.

The 'July Declaration' - made amid demands by the Students Against Discrimination Movement (SAD) members back in December - is currently being drafted by the government in consultation with all interested political parties, which include the BNP, NCP, BJI, among others; AL will be absent owing to it being barred. The July Declaration has been referred to as a critical document for Bangladesh, marking its transition to a new government, and a new political framework - shifting away from the ideology of Mujibism (core principles of Bangladesh's constitution formed by Sheikh Mujibur Rahman). The document has been met with a mixed reception, finding both supporters and detractors.

While its supporters argue that it is aimed at unifying the nation around the movement's core values of anti-fascism, democratic resurgence, and state reform, its detractors have expressed doubt over its political philosophy, and have argued against its constitutional recognition.

Caleta-Car becomes Real Sociedad's first signing of summer

Madrid, Aug 2 (UNI) Real Sociedad has made its first signing ahead of the new La Liga season with the arrival of Croatian defender Duje Caleta-Car.

Former B-team coach Sergio Francisco was named as Imanol's successor before the end of last season, while the club is still looking to sign a midfielder and a forward before starting the new La Liga season away to Valencia on August 16.

Jaiswal, Sundar, Akash Deep power India on Day 3

Bengaluru/London, (UNI) : India surged ahead on Day 3 of the fifth and final Test at The Oval, riding on Yashasvi Jaiswal’s century, a sparkling 53 from Washington Sundar, and a gritty fifty from nightwatchman Akash Deep to set England a daunting 374-run target.

At stumps, England were 50 for 1, losing Zak Crawley to a beauty from Mohammed Siraj of the final ball of the day.

Resuming at 75/2, India built their innings around a resilient 103-run stand between Jaiswal and Akash Deep. The left-hander, overnight on 51, brought up his century in 127 balls (11x4, 2x6), showcasing maturity and flair. Akash Deep, primarily known for his bowling, turned heads

with a stylish 66 off 94 balls, including 12 boundaries. Their partnership frustrated England through the first session, guiding India to 189/3 at lunch.

Shubman Gill fell early in the post-lunch session, given LBW on review (India’s last), while departed quickly.

Jaiswal kept the scoreboard ticking, but his eventual dismissal at 118 saw India wobble briefly. Ravindra Jadeja then steadied the innings with a fluent 53, his fifth fifty of the series, before edging to second slip.

Dhruv Jurel’s 34 and a T20-style blitz from Washington Sundar revived India's innings. Sundar smashed four sixes and four boundaries in his 53 off just 46 balls, reaching

his fifty with a thunderous strike over mid-wicket and celebrating with a punch to the air. He helped push India past 300 (reached in 70.4 overs), and ultimately to a formidable total.

The final wicket fell in the 88th over when Sundar miscued a flick off Josh Tongue, who completed his maiden five-wicket haul (5/103). Crawley and Pope collided under the skier, but Crawley held on at mid-wicket despite the scare.

England were left needing 374 for victory, but their reply was immediately pegged back. Crawley (14) was cleaned up by a superb yorker from Siraj off the final ball of the day – a double bluff after a barrage of short balls. Siraj roared in celebration as stumps were drawn with the hosts at 50/1 in 14 overs.

Newcastle boss Howe in the dark over Isak future

Seoul, Aug 2 (UNI) : Newcastle United coach Eddie Howe admits that he still doesn't know what the future holds for striker Alexander Isak.

Howe was speaking from Seoul, South Korea where his side plays Tottenham Hotspur in a pre-season friendly game on Sunday. Isak isn't with the squad after being left out due to a slight thigh injury and is currently working to get fit at the training ground of former club Real Sociedad in Spain.

Howe admitted he only learned Isak was in San Sebastian after seeing the story published online.

"I know where he is through the media, so I think from that perspective it's difficult for me to go into any detail," he commented.

Friday also saw the media report that Newcastle had rejected a bid of 110 million pounds (146 million U.S. dollars) for Isak from Liverpool, with Liverpool then reportedly ending interest in the striker, but Howe again insisted he is in the dark over events.

"I am very much removed from everything that is happening back home. I was made aware there was a bid yesterday. That bid was turned down before I heard about it. There are people back in England dealing with the situation," said the coach in a news conference.

Earlier in the week Howe had said that Isak's situation "wasn't fully" in the club's hands, although he wished to see the striker remain at St James' Park.

"I really don't know what is going to happen next but, from our perspective, we still support Alex in every way and my wish is still that we see him in a Newcastle shirt again."

"The situation is far from ideal. It is quite complex. I think that is all I have got to say," concluded the coach.

In Race-1 in the Girls category, Jagathishree started from P3, but fought her way to P1 while in the next outing, she “messed up” her pole-position start to drop to fifth but recovered to win ahead of two former champions Ryhana Bee (KYTHelmet ISBK Racing), who had started from P12, and Ann Jennifer (Motul Sparks Racing).Mad Rabbit

Racing enjoyed a profitable day as their riders, 18-year-old from Bengaluru Savion Sabu, Amit Prasad from Mysuru and Mohamed Mikail (Thiruvallur) won the Pro-Stock 165-200cc Open, Stock 165cc (Novice) race and Stock 301-400cc (Novice) races, respectively.Savion, starting from P4, won narrowly from Soorya PM (LGE Racing) in a tight finish while Amit Prasad moved up a spot when Vijayawada’s Jangam Akarsh (MAI Racing) dropped to P12 after receiving a 10-second penalty after winning the race and Mikail won easily in a race marked by a red flag stoppage followed by a restart.Coimbatore’s Raj Kumar (Motul Sparks Racing) topped the Super Stock 165cc Intermediate race in which he was virtually unchallenged.

Mohan Babu from Chennai and local rider Hari Haran won the Expert (RR 310) and Rookie (Apache RTR 200) respectively, in the Petronas TVS India One-Make Championship.

Central Railway's Mumbai Division registers record freight loading figures of 7.43 million tonnes

Mumbai, Aug 2 : Central Railway's Mumbai Division registered remarkable freight loading figures of 7.43 million tonnes for the FY 2025-26 (April to July-2025) as against 7.32 million tonnes during the corresponding period in FY-2024-25, which indicates a growth of 1.5%.

This is the highest ever

loading during the period in the last 15 years.

During the month of July-2025, freight loading figures of 2.04 million tonnes was done as against loading of 1.88 million tonnes during the corresponding month last year indicating a significant growth of 8.5 %.

This figure is the highest ever loading for the month of July in the last 15 years. It is also the first time that loading has crossed 2.00 million tonnes in a month during the current financial year for the period.

*Multiple Milestones in Container Loading

- Container loading from JNPT has been the highest ever recorded with 647 rakes in July-2025 as compared to the previous best loading of 641 rakes in January-2025

- *769 Container rakes have been loaded in Mumbai division including 647 - Port & 122 domestic containers, which is the best ever * as compared to

the previous best figures of 754 rakes including 637-Port & 117 domestic containers loaded in January-2025.

- 1048 Container Wagons loaded per day in July-2025 is the highest ever loading average compared to the previous best of 1029 Container Wagons loaded in January-2025.

- 1285 Container Wagons were loaded in a single day on 28.07.2025 with 30 Container Rakes as compared to the previous best of 1259 Container Wagons loaded on 23.11.2024.

Nadda sounds alarm on rising organ failures

New Delhi, Aug 2 (UNI) Union Health Minister JP Nadda today expressed concern over the increasing cases of organ failures, calling it a serious public health challenge that is putting immense pressure on the healthcare system.

"Every year, thousands of patients await life-saving organ transplants. Despite this urgent need, a

significant gap persists between those waiting for transplants and the number of available donors," he said here at an event held to mark the 15th Indian Organ Donation Day. The event was organized by the National Organ and Tissue Transplant Organization (NOTTO) under the aegis of Directorate General of Health Services, Union

Health Ministry. The Minister emphasized that this gap is not due to unwillingness but largely stems from lack of awareness and deep-rooted myths and misconceptions surrounding organ donation. "Today is a crucial day that offers us a platform to raise awareness, promote open

conversations, and honor the noble contributions of donors and their families," he added. Nadda also urged society to overcome hesitation and misconceptions to strengthen organ donation efforts and save countless lives. Highlighting the strides made by India in the direction of organ donation, Nadda stated

that India has achieved a remarkable milestone of performing over 18,900 organ transplants in 2024, the highest ever recorded in a single year. This is a significant leap from fewer than 5,000 transplants in 2013. India ranks third globally in the total number of organ transplants, behind only the United States of America and China.
