BMC pulls up shops without Marathi signboards; nearly Rs 2 cr fine collected

(Standard Post Bureau) Mumbai Aug 5 The Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC) has intensified its campaign against shops that do not display signboards in the Marathi Devanagari script, a BMC release said today.

The civic body has collected nearly rupee 2 crore in fines so far, and several shopkeepers have been served notices. The drive has gained momentum amid the ongoing debate over the alleged imposition of Hindi.

As per Supreme Court directives, it is mandatory for shops to have signboards in the local language. Additionally, the Maharashtra Shops and Establishments (Regulation of Employment and Conditions of Service) Rules, 2018, and the amended Act of 2022 also clearly mandate that shops must display signboards in Marathi.

Although the rule has existed for some time, enforcement by the BMC was relatively lax. However, the recent uproar triggered by the Shiv Sena (Uddhav Thackeray faction) and Maharashtra Navnirman Sena (MNS) over Hindi imposition has led the civic body to ramp up action. Each BMC ward office has formed a team of 60 personnel to inspect shop signboards. The teams are tasked with inspecting approximately 3,000 shops daily. There are about 9 lakh shops and commercial establishments within Mumbai city limits. So far, more than 1.5 lakh signboards have been inspected.

New Delhi, Aug 5 (UNI) : The ruling National Democratic Alliance (NDA) today unanimously passed a resolution celebrating the success of Operation Sindoor and Operation Mahadev.

"The NDA Parliamentary Party salutes the unmatched courage and unwavering commitment of our armed forces, who showed heroic valour during Operation Sindoor and Operation Mahadev.

Their courage highlights their unflinching devotion to protecting our nation. We pay our deepest condolences and respect to those who lost their lives in the Pahalgam terror attack," the resolution stated.

The NDA Parliamentary Party also lauded the leadership displayed by Prime Minister Narendra Modi during these times.

"His unwavering resolve, visionary statesmanship, and resolute command have not only steered the nation with purpose but also ignited a renewed spirit of unity and pride in the hearts of all Indians," the resolution added.

Through military might and resolute leadership, justice was delivered, it said, reaffirming that "India does not forget nor forgives terror."

The resolution hailed

Operation Sindoor's decisive strike on Pakistan-based terror camps.

The US designating The Resistance Front (TRF), responsible for the Pahalgam attack, as a Foreign Terrorist Organisation (FTO) and Specially Designated Global Terrorist (SDGT), and the BRICS Joint Declaration condemning the Pahalgam attack while vowing to "ensure zero tolerance for terrorism and reject double standards in countering terrorism," reflect a diplomatic win for India and its rising clout on the global stage.

PM Modi was felicitated by NDA MPs for the success of Operations Sindoor and Mahadev during the NDA Parliamentary Party meeting in the national capital.

On April 22, the Pakistan-based terrorist group The Resistance Front (TRF), a proxy of the Lashkar-e-Taiba, carried out a brutal attack in Pahalgam, Jammu and Kashmir.

The attack resulted in the cold-blooded killing of 26 innocent tourists, who were segregated and targeted based on their religion.

The resolution recalled Prime Minister Modi's statement made on April 24 in Madhubani, Bihar: "Today, from the soil of Bihar, I say to the whole world: India will identify,

track, and punish every terrorist and their backers. We will pursue them to the end of the earth. India's spirit will never be broken by terrorism. Terrorism will not go unpunished. Every effort will be made to ensure that justice is done.

The entire nation is firm in this resolve. Everyone who believes in humanity is with us. I thank the people of various countries and their leaders, who have stood with us in these times."

India launched 'Operation Sindoor' on the intervening night of May 6-7 in response to the Pahalgam attack.

The operation involved precise and targeted strikes by the armed forces on terrorist training camps at various locations within Pakistan and Pakistan Occupied Kashmir.

The action reflected India's zero-tolerance approach towards terrorism and reaffirmed its commitment to uproot terrorist infrastructure.

The decisive action was in contrast to the situation before 2014, when terror attacks and bomb blasts were widespread across major Indian cities such as Patna, Bengaluru, Mumbai, Guwahati, Varanasi, Ahmedabad, Hyderabad, and Delhi.

CM advocates balanced approach for Mumbai's pigeon houses

Mumbai, Aug 5 (UNI) : Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis today stated that the sudden closure of pigeon coops across Mumbai would be inappropriate.

Emphasizing the need for balanced measures, he advocated for alternative arrangements ensuring pigeon safety, ecological balance and public health protection. Speaking to reporters after a high-level meeting at the Secretariat, Fadnavis stressed the necessity of formulating a systematic code regulating pigeon feeding schedules. This, he explained, would safeguard both pigeon health and prevent adverse public health impacts.

The Chief Minister highlighted existing problems in several city areas, including respiratory diseases among citizens, pollution from pigeon waste and sanitation issues caused by the large pigeon population. Fadnavis announced plans for a comprehensive scientific study, prepared with expert assistance, to better understand the impact of pigeon coops. Effective

technical solutions for managing pigeon droppings and maintaining cleanliness will be prioritized. He also revealed consulting former Union Minister Maneka Gandhi on the matter.

Addressing the legal aspect, the Chief Minister noted a pending petition regarding pigeon houses in the Bombay High Court. He directed the state government and the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC) to present their stance before the court, adding that the government would consider approaching the Supreme Court, if necessary.

Fadnavis further instructed the BMC to construct and maintain an aviary. The meeting was attended by Deputy Chief Minister Ajit Pawar, Forest Minister Ganesh Naik, Water Resources Minister Girish Mahajan, Skill, Employment, Entrepreneurship and Innovation Minister Mangal Prabhat Lodha, MLA Kalidas Kolambkar, Municipal Commissioner Bhushan Gagrani, and Additional Chief Secretary (Forests) Milind Mhaikar.

Govt suspends festive ration scheme, and food thali, citing financial constraints

Mumbai, Aug 5 (UNI) The government has suspended the 'Anandacha Shidha' (Festival Ration Kit) scheme this year, citing financial constraints. This scheme was launched to help the underprivileged celebrate festivals with joy.

Additionally, significant budget cuts have been made to the popular 'Shiv Bhojan Thali' scheme. These developments signal that other welfare initiatives may also face setbacks due to the ongoing strain on the state treasury. The 'Anandacha Shidha' scheme was designed to provide essential food items (1 kg dal, 1 kg sugar, and 1 litre of oil) for just Rs 100 to families living below the poverty line during major festivals such as Dussehra, Diwali, Ganeshotsav, Ambedkar Jayanti, and Shiv Jayanti.

However, with the festive season beginning with Ganeshotsav, the government has confirmed it will not be able to implement the scheme this year due to financial limitations. Launched during the COVID-19 pandemic to ensure no one went hungry, the 'Shiv Bhojan Thali' scheme offers meals for just Rs 10 and continues to operate.

However, it too has been affected by budgetary cuts. While Rs 60 crore was required to run the scheme at full capacity, only Rs 20 crore has been allocated for it this year, potentially restricting its reach and efficiency.

Maharashtra State Election Commissioner wants complete prep-work ahead of local polls

Nashik, Aug 5 (UNI) Maharashtra State Election Commissioner Dinesh Waghmare today directed officials to make complete preparations and pre-planning of the number of voters, polling stations, facilities and manpower required to conduct the elections, as also the available electronic voting machines for the upcoming local body elections.

Waghmare was speaking while reviewing the pre-

election preparations of the local bodies in all the five districts of Nashik division at the Nashik Divisional Commissioner's Office here.

State Election Commission Secretary Suresh Kakani, Divisional Commissioner Dr. Praveen Gedam, along with the District Collectors of all the five districts, and Commissioners of Municipalities were present during the deliberations.

It is being planned to use

the voter list of the Legislative Assembly registered till July 1, 2025 for the upcoming local body elections. In this regard, the permission of the Election Commission of India will be received soon.

However, in this regard, Waghmare also reviewed in detail the manpower required by each district to conduct elections for the Zilla Parishad group and Panchayat Samiti constituency in their

jurisdiction, the availability of Returning Officers and Assistant Returning Officers, the availability of possible polling stations and the facilities there.

He reviewed the preparations made by the district administration and the municipal administration in connection with the elections to the Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samiti, Nagar Parishad and Nagar Panchayat as well as the Municipal Corporations

in each district. Waghmare said the voters' list prepared by the Election Commission of India is used for the elections to local self-government bodies. The State Election Commission has fixed the criteria for determining the polling stations through a separate order saying care should be taken to provide facilities at the polling stations by considering all the factors, including general voters and voters with disabilities.

Sitamarhi, Aug 5 (UNI) : Jan Suraaj Party leader Prashant Kishor has accused Union Home Minister Amit Shah of remaining silent on the atrocities faced by Biharis outside the state and asked him to answer during his upcoming visit to Sitamarhi, why he remained silent when Biharis were being assaulted in Maharashtra.

Speaking at a program in Sitamarhi, Kishor remarked that Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Home Minister Amit Shah, and Congress leader Rahul Gandhi never spent a night in Bihar.

“They only visit during elections,” he added.

He questioned, “Why does the Home Minister remain silent when atrocities were committed against Biharis in Maharashtra, even when the BJP was in power there?”

Referring to the disappearance of 65 lakh voters from the electoral draft list after the Special Summary Revision, Kishor said, “The Election Commission is responsible for preparing citizens' lists and issuing identity cards, not for determining citizenship.”

He assured that those whose names were missing from the draft list need not worry, as Jan Suraaj will fight for their rights.

Govt to seek return of elephant Mahadevi from Gujarat's Vantara rehab centre

Mumbai, Aug 5 (UNI) : The government will take the initiative to bring back the elephant Mahadevi, currently housed at the Vantara Wildlife Centre in Gujarat, to the Nandani Math in Kolhapur, assured Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis today.

The 36-year-old elephant Mahadevi, who had been a resident of Nandani Math for the past over 30 years, was recently relocated to Vantara as per the Supreme Court's order.

The decision sparked strong opposition from Kolhapur residents, who have voiced their dissent in various ways.

To address the emotional and cultural significance of the issue for the people of Kolhapur, a meeting was held under the chairmanship of Fadnavis.

Present at the meeting were Deputy CMAjit Pawar, ministers Chandrakant Patil, Hasan Mushrif, Prakash Abitkar, former MP Raju Shetti, MLAs Satej Patil, Prakash Awade, Sadabhau Khot, and representatives from Nandani Math.

Fadnavis clarified that the decision to move Mahadevi was made following the Supreme Court directive and not by the state government.

However, he suggested a path forward: Nandani Math should file a review petition in the Supreme Court, and the state government will also submit a supporting petition.

He further assured that the state will take full responsibility for Mahadevi's care. A team of veterinary experts will be appointed for her treatment, and the government will oversee her daily care, food, and well-being.

"We will present this assurance before the Supreme Court," Fadnavis stated.

The move is seen as a significant step by the Maharashtra government to address regional sentiments and ensure the well-being of an elephant deeply connected to the region's religious and cultural identity.

ED questions Anil Ambani, videographs his statement in money laundering case

Mumbai, Aug 5 (UNI) : Industrialist Anil Ambani was questioned by the Enforcement Directorate (ED) on Tuesday at its headquarters in New Delhi in an alleged money laundering case, linked to an alleged multi-crore bank loan diversion fraud.

No lawyer was present during the entire questioning session which was videographed after Anil Ambani reached the ED headquarters at 11 am on Tuesday to record his statement under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA), sources said.

Significantly, statements recorded under Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA) are admissible as evidence in court.

According to sources, ED officials asked Anil Ambani questions like,

"Were loans diverted to shell companies?" He also faced questions like, "Was any money given to political parties?" and "Did you bribe any officer?"

Before the ED summoned Anil Ambani for questioning on Tuesday at the ED's Delhi office, the agency had issued a lookout circular (LOC) against him in connection with the alleged Rs 3,000-crore loan fraud involving Yes Bank.

An LOC is issued to prevent individuals from leaving the country while they are under investigation. LOCs are circulated to all airports and seaports, alerting immigration officials to detain the individual under investigation, if they attempt to flee from India.

The ED is probing the alleged diversion of loans worth Rs 3,000 crore

disbursed to Reliance Group companies by Yes Bank between 2017 and 2019. Investigators suspect that payments were allegedly made to Yes Bank promoters before the loans were actually sanctioned, pointing to a possible quid pro quo. It may be recalled that the ED had raided several locations connected to the case on July 24. The searches which lasted for three days were carried out under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA).

Later, the ED issued a statement on Monday that it has arrested Partha Sarathi Biswal, the managing director of Biswal Tradelink Pvt Ltd (BTPL) based in Odisha, on Saturday, for allegedly providing fake bank guarantees worth Rs 68.2 crore to Reliance Power Ltd for a Solar Energy

Corporation of India Ltd (SECI) tender.

The ED had stated that it plans to confront arrested Biswal face-to-face with Anil Ambani when Ambani will be questioned at the ED's Delhi headquarters in an alleged money laundering case, linked to an alleged multi-crore bank loan fraud committed by the Anil Ambani-led Reliance ADA group. "An investigation has revealed that BTPL had fraudulently arranged as well as submitted fake bank guarantees of Rs 68.2 crores along with forged SBI endorsements and fabricated confirmations for a Solar Energy Corporation of India Limited (SECI) tender. For providing this bank guarantee, Rs 5.40 crore was received by BTPL (as commission) from Reliance Power Ltd," according to the ED statement.

Bhiwandi auto driver held for abetting transgender partner's suicide

Mumbai, Aug 5 (UNI) : A 28-year-old autorickshaw driver was arrested in Bhiwandi town of neighbouring Thane district for allegedly abetting the suicide of his 23-year-old transgender partner, police confirmed today.

The accused faces charges under Section 108 (abetment of suicide) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita.

According to Assistant Police Inspector Shivaji Patil of Bhoiwada police, the victim ended their life by hanging from the ceiling of their residence on August one. Both individuals were residents of Bhiwandi and had been in a relationship.

Investigations revealed the accused persistently harassed the victim through frequent calls, creating severe distress. The victim's brother filed a formal complaint citing this pattern of harassment as the catalyst for the suicide.

Following the complaint, police apprehended the autorickshaw driver on Sunday. Authorities affirmed the ongoing legal proceedings in the case.

Police arrest murder convict who jumped parole from Punjab

Mumbai, Aug 5 (UNI) : Police has arrested a convicted murderer from Punjab, who was absconding for approximately four years after he was granted parole by the jail authorities, officials said here today.

Crime Branch Unit 2 of the Vasai-Virar Police which comes under Maharashtra police arrested convict, Shankar Jagdish Mukhiya alias Samosewala, from Shaheed Bhagat Singh Nagar district in Punjab after a sustained two-month manhunt.

Mukhiya, a resident of Dhaniv Baug Talav area in Nalasopara area of neighbouring Palghar district, was convicted for the 2016 murder of Dilip Raghunath Basnet.

The crime occurred on the evening of September 15, 2016, when a dispute erupted between Mukhiya and Basnet after Mukhiya made lewd remarks about Basnet's wife.

While serving his sentence at Thane Central Jail, Mukhiya was granted emergency parole and released on May 7, 2022, to his residence in Nalasopara East. However, after the parole period expired, Mukhiya failed to return to prison or a police station.

Consequently, a case under Section 224 (escape from lawful custody) of Indian Penal Code was registered at Pelhar Police Station by the jail authorities. Despite repeated summons, Mukhiya remained untraceable. He was believed to have changed his identity multiple times and avoided detection by frequently shifting locations. Initial investigations revealed he was not present either at his registered address or his native village in Bihar.

Acting on a tip off, a special police team was dispatched to Punjab. With support from local law enforcement, the team successfully arrested Shankar Jagdish Mukhiya from the jurisdiction of Banga Police Station.

The accused is now in police custody and will be handed over to the appropriate authorities for further legal proceedings.

Uddhav Sena, MNS to contest local bodies polls together, says Sanjay Raut

Mumbai, Aug 5 (UNI) : The Uddhav Thackeray-led Shiv Sena chief party spokesperson Sanjay Raut said today that his party as well as the Raj Thackeray-led Maharashtra Navnirman Sena (MNS) will contest the forthcoming Maharashtra local body and municipal elections together. "Definitely. Both the Thackerays will come together and discuss this soon," Sanjay Raut, Rajya Sabha MP, said in response, after media persons specifically asked him about a possible alliance with the MNS. "Our workers are confident that we will definitely get a majority in many municipal corporations including Mumbai, Thane, Kalyan-Dombivli, Navi Mumbai, Pune, Nashik and Chhatrapati Sambhajnagar. This alliance has increased the confidence of our workers and they will succeed in the municipal elections in various cities," Sanjay Raut said.

However, there has been no confirmation of a political alliance from MNS founder and president Raj Thackeray who held a meeting of his party workers on Monday, to prepare for the forthcoming Mumbai civic body elections.

When asked about a possible alliance with the Uddhav Thackeray-led Shiv Sena at the meeting on Monday, Raj Thackeray had said, "Leave it to me with whom to form an alliance. Appropriate instructions will be given at the right time. This time the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC) will be in our hands."

Meanwhile, the Maharashtra State Election Commissioner Dinesh Waghmare stated today that the process of holding elections to municipal corporations, zilla parishads and village councils in Maharashtra will be held in phases after Diwali, by the end of October.

A review of officers, staff and technical equipment required for the election was also taken up at a review meeting today which was attended by senior administrative officers from Nashik and North Maharashtra. After the review meeting, Waghmare held a press conference about pre-election preparations. He said that the Supreme Court has ordered that elections should be held within four months.

Amendment to boost Indian wind turbine manufacturers by promoting 'Make in India'

Centre's amendment to the Approved List of Models and Manufacturers (ALMM) (Wind) procedure is expected to benefit domestic wind turbine original equipment manufacturers by enhancing domestic sourcing of equipment, a report said. Indian and Chinese wind OEMs will now compete on more equal terms due to a new rule. Currently, Chinese wind OEMs operating in India import lots of lower-cost components from China, resulting in their products being 10–15 per cent cheaper than those of Indian manufacturers, according to a report by Crisil Ratings.

However, these Chinese wind OEMs will be forced to source their components from Indian manufacturers after the recent amendment, assuming Indian wind component makers are only added to the ALMM list. This will remove manufacturing cost disparities for Indian wind OEMs compared to Chinese firms and strengthen the local supply chain.

The move will also support the credit profiles of domestic wind OEMs. The Ministry of New and Renewable Energy (MNRE) amended the procedure for including wind turbine models in the ALMM list (Wind) on July 31. This list certifies wind turbine models eligible for installation in the country.

The new amendment mandated wind OEMs to source key components — blade, tower, gearbox, generator, and special bearings, which make up 65-70 percent of the total cost of a wind turbine — only from ALMM (Wind Turbine Components) listed suppliers. It also mandates wind turbine data and control systems to remain within India, using local data centres, servers, and R&D facilities, which, in turn, should improve data security and enhance the country's cybersecurity ecosystem.

The current amendments will encourage wind OEMs to 'Make in India.' Indian wind OEMs hold a market share of approximately 40–45 percent and source most mandated components domestically. In contrast, Chinese wind OEMs operating in India import a larger share of lower-cost components from China.

Ankit Hakhu, Director, Crisil Ratings said, “Chinese players have expanded their market share from just 10 per cent in fiscal 2019 to around 45 per cent in fiscal 2025, benefiting from low-cost imported components. Assuming largely Indian wind component makers get added to the ALMM, Chinese wind OEMs will need to source locally from them.” This could benefit India manufacturers who currently have underutilised manufacturing capacity for these components.

Due to this, the artificial ponds and mobile immersion system have been increased. Thane Municipal Corporation has informed that one and a half times more immersion arrangements are being made by the Municipal Corporation than last year.

Let's celebrate Ganeshotsav, which has been granted the status of a state festival, with the same enthusiasm as every year. Commissioner Saurabh Rao has also appealed to the citizens to celebrate the festival smoothly with the blessings of Ganpati Bappa, taking care that there is no inconvenience to the citizens.

On behalf of Thane Municipal Corporation, a meeting was organized on Tuesday at the Late Narendra Ballal Hall at the Municipal Headquarters to organize an environmentally friendly Ganeshotsav 2025. The meeting, chaired by Municipal Commissioner Saurabh Rao, was attended by representatives of



Ganeshotsav Mandals, vendors, Additional Commissioner of the Municipal Corporation Prashant Rode, Deputy Commissioner of Police Prashant Kadam, Deputy Commissioner of Police (Transport) Pankaj Shirsat, Deputy Commissioner of Municipal Corporation Manish Joshi, Shankar Patole, Madhukar Bodke, Dinesh Tayde, Sachin Sangle, Chief Environment Officer Manisha Pradhan, along with representatives of the Municipal Corporation, Mahavitaran, Torrent Power, and NGOs.

The enthusiasm of Ganesh devotees is increasing and at the same time, environmental awareness is also increasing. Citizens welcomed the mobile immersion arrangement made last year. Therefore, this year the number of teams has been increased to 15, Commissioner Rao also said.

This year, immersion arrangements will be made at a total of 132 places, including 24 artificial ponds, 74 tank immersion arrangements, 15 mobile immersion arrangements, 09 ghat immersion arrangements and 10 idol acceptance centers. Last year, there were a total of 88 immersion arrangements.

Separate manpower in

two sessions

There was a demand to increase the manpower at the immersion places. Keeping that in mind, the manpower will be increased. Also, manpower arrangements will be made in two sessions. Commissioner Rao expressed confidence that this will improve efficiency. The Ganeshotsav Coordination Committee and the police have suggested that cranes and additional barges should be installed at the ghat immersion site. Commissioner Rao also assured to consider the matter.

Coordination Officer A WhatsApp group is being created to resolve any issues that the Ganeshotsav Mandal and police need from the Municipal Corporation or if there are any errors in the system. Deputy Commissioner

(Encroachment) Shankar Patole will act as the coordination officer for the Municipal Corporation in this regard, Commissioner Rao also said in the meeting. Local police, board officials and municipal officials should jointly inspect the immersion system in their respective areas. Commissioner Rao also directed that the local assistant commissioners should take note of the issues noticed and take action.

Decentralization of immersion system

The Municipal Corporation has planned additional artificial lakes to avoid crowding at one place for immersion. Also, the boards have raised the issue of inconvenience during the Navratri festival and the municipal administration will be vigilant in this regard,

explained Additional Commissioner Prashant Rode.

The administration and the Ganesh Mandal will celebrate the festival in coordination. The activists are the ears, nose and eyes of the administration. When the local police station holds meetings of the boards, local officers of all the agencies will also be present there, explained Deputy Commissioner of Police Prashant Kadam.

At the beginning of the meeting, Chief Environment Officer Manisha Pradhan gave detailed information about the order of the Hon'ble High Court to celebrate the eco-friendly festival, and the procedure announced by the state government accordingly. Also, Thane Municipal Corporation has prepared a green immersion app that provides information about the entire immersion system. Pradhan also said that it will soon be available on all mobile platforms for the citizens.

In the meeting, various issues were raised by Thane District Ganeshotsav Coordination Committee Vice President Ravindra Palve, Ulhas Barde, Vinayak Surve, Vasudev Alguj, Vicky Chacko, Vishal Mahadik etc. regarding immersion arrangements on behalf of the mandals.

No one can stop PDA Pathshala: Akhilesh Yadav

Lucknow, Aug 5 (UNI) :Samajwadi Party President Akhilesh Yadav has challenged the BJP government to stop the PDA pathshala started by his party after closure of several primary schools by the Uttar Pradesh government on the name of merger.

"Police cannot stop PDA Pathshala. CM Yogi himself should come to the Pathshala and see the situation. The government itself has accepted that it has closed many schools while some have been merged. SP workers will continue to teach students until new teachers are recruited in those schools," he announced.

SP president was talking to media after paying his tribute to late Janeshwar Mishra on his birth anniversary at the Janeshwar Mishra Park here on Tuesday.

"The sad thing is that even the Britishers did not

register an FIR against anyone for studies. This government thinks that it will shut down our PDA school with the help of police. We socialists take a pledge that until the government sends a teacher-principal there, the PDA school will continue to run," he said.

SP President said, "CM Yogi needs to visit schools as well. At least he should visit schools and see the condition of schools. The roof of a school collapsed in his own district, in which children were injured. We opened Abhinay, Sanskriti School in this Lucknow city. Sanskriti School is the best school in the country and the world, but they against education. Those who are against education are the biggest mafia".

Akhilesh Yadav said that, "who is the biggest mafia in

the state? Everyone knows this. One does not become anything by changing clothes. Today they are talking about land. You should find out, all the ponds in Lucknow have been occupied by the BJP and all the wetlands have been occupied by the BJP people."

He said that those who used to accuse others, did they not have any connection with the underworld. However, he did not name anyone.

Talking about the flood condition in UP, Akhilesh Yadav said, "More than Rs 20,000 crores were spent in Prayagraj. But what is the condition today? People are not able to leave their homes on a large scale. Necessary things are not available during the floods. Children are not going to school and there is no drinking water. If someone falls sick, there is no arrangement."

Use the right makeup

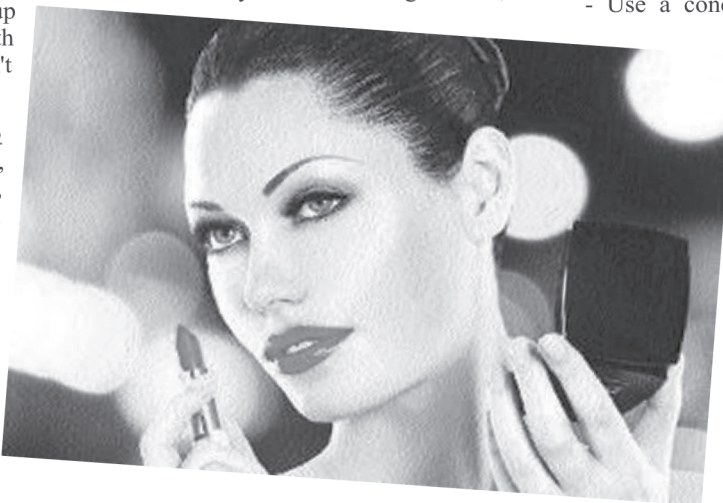

B. Tighten abs and bend arms, bringing chest toward the floor. Keep upper arms close to your sides and back straight. Elbows should point behind, not out.

Mumbai, Aug 5 : In order to ensure hassle-free, comfortable travel & better services to all bonafide passengers over Western Railway, intensive ticket checking drives are being carried out continuously over Mumbai suburban local services, Mail/Express as well as passenger trains & holiday special trains so as to curb the menace of ticketless/irregular passengers. The highly motivated ticket checking team under the supervision of senior commercial officers of Western Railway organized several ticket checking drives during the period from April to July 2025, thereby recovering an amount to the tune of ? 70.98 crore, which is almost 24% higher than the

corresponding period last year as well as 11% higher over the target set by Railway Board. This also includes ? 19.55 crore from Mumbai suburban section.

Srinagar, Aug 5 (UNI) Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha today said that Article 370 had fueled terrorism and emboldened the terror ecosystem in Jammu and Kashmir. He asserted that the process of dismantling this ecosystem began on August 5, 2019.

Lieutenant Governor Sinha was addressing a function after handing over the appointment letters to 158 Next of Kins (NoKs) of Kashmiri civilians killed by Pakistan-backed terrorists.

On the occasion, the Lieutenant Governor spoke on the transformative journey of new Jammu Kashmir post abrogation of Article 370.

"On 5 August 2019, a new Jammu Kashmir was born. A new Jammu Kashmir that had dreams of a golden future in its eyes. A new Jammu Kashmir, which treated all its citizens as equal and removed discrimination that was prevalent for seven decades," he said.

"People ask me what is new Jammu Kashmir. I want to tell them that the new Jammu Kashmir is one where jobs are not given to terrorists but to the real martyrs of this UT. The new Jammu Kashmir is one where tears are not shed on the death of terrorists but the tears of common Kashmiris are wiped away.

"The new Jammu and Kashmir is one where the terrorist elements sitting in the government system are being cleaned out one by one and the decades-old wounds of terror victim families are being healed. The new Jammu Kashmir is one where common Kashmiris are being embraced and not the separatists. The new Jammu Kashmir is one where children have pens in their hands and not stones," the Lieutenant Governor said.

The Lieutenant Governor called upon every section of the society to rise against terrorism.

He said under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, India has drawn a new redline against terrorism and equal punishment will be given to terrorists and their sponsors.

"India has made it clear that if terror is state policy, it will be met with a visible and forceful response. Peace is a prerequisite for progress. There is no place for terrorism in a civilized society. Many generations of J&K have suffered the brunt of terrorism perpetrated by the neighbouring country. Every person has to take a pledge that they will not allow this to happen again," the Lieutenant Governor said.
