"Ready to face bullets, won't step back" Manoj Jarange Patil warns govt

Mumbai, Aug 29 (UNI): Maratha reservation activist Manoj Jarange Patil today issued a stern warning to the state government, declaring he would not retreat from his ongoing agitation even if bullets were fired at him.

Speaking to reporters at the protest venue, Jarange Patil said he had taken to the battlefield to secure a better future for Maratha youth. He demanded that the government grant Kunbi caste certificates to Marathas, extend Other Backward Class (OBC) reservation benefits, implement the 'sage-soyare' ordinance, withdraw cases filed against protesters, and provide financial aid to families of deceased agitators.

Meanwhile, Mumbai Police granted Jarange Patil permission to continue his protest at Azad Maidan for one more day.

"If the government accepts our demand and grants OBC reservation to Marathas, we will celebrate with colours at the Chief Minister's residence.

But if not, we will not leave Mumbai. Put us in jail or fire bullets at us, we are ready. We will not surrender," Jarange Patil emphasised.

He accused the government of attempting to suppress the movement by

protesters wearing saffron caps and shawls reached Azad Maidan and as their numbers swelled, spilled over to the adjoining streets and even occupied the Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj Terminus railway station as well as the Churchgate railway station. Some Maratha protesters even managed to enter inside the Maharashtra state secretariat administrative building premises called Mantralaya and raised slogans demanding reservation for Marathas.

They have stated that their agitation will continue at Azad Maidan until their demands are fulfilled. They will take permission to protest from the Azad Maidan police station everyday.'

Earlier, the Marathas were permitted to protest till 6 pm on Friday, but the Mumbai Police has now extended the deadline by one more day, due to which the protest will

(August 30) as well. The extension has been given conditions, it is learnt.

Meanwhile, sources

said that union Home Minister Amit Shah will reach Mumbai on Friday night and visit Lalbaugcha Raja Ganesh pandal on Saturday afternoon, and it is unlikely that Maharashtra Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis will take any decision about Jarange-Patil's deemands, without discussing all issues with Shah. Amit Shah, who was born in Mumbai, is scheduled to visit Lalbaugcha Raja, which is one of the most famous Ganesh pandals in Mumbai, on Saturday, which he is known to do every year, along with his family. Sources said that Fadnavis will brief Shah about the political situation and the ongoing Maratha protests as well as the BJP's preparations for the local civic bodies elections to be held in Maharashtra.


Shah is expected to meet Deputy Chief Ministers Eknath Shinde and Ajit Pawar, though these meetings are not confirmed.He is also expected to visit the residence of state Cultural Affairs Minister Ashish Shelar. As things stand, it is clear that no immediate decision or breakthrough can be expected and Jarange-Patil's fast demanding reservations for Marathas will continue indefinitely.Earlier on Friday, Water Resources Minister and Maratha reservation sub-committee chairperson Radhakrishna Vikhe-Patil of the BJP and Revenue Minister Chandrashekhar Bawankule of the BJP said that the Maharashtra government is ready to talk with Maratha reservation quota agitation leader Manoj Jarange-Patil, adding that his demands are being considered "sympathetically".

One killed as wall collapses in Mumbai

Mumbai, Aug 29 (UNI): A 45 year-old woman was killed after a part of retaining wall of a ground-plus-one-storey structure of A1 Gulab-baba Society, located at Parera wadi, Saki Naka, area of Mumbai suburb collapsed today.

According to Fire Brigade sources, the incident occurred at 2.30 pm in afternoon. The woman, identified as Mangala Gaonkar, was declared dead before admission in a private hospital by locals.

The wall collapsed as heavy rains battered the city throughout Friday, with data showing that the heaviest showers were recorded in the western suburbs which received an average of 61.47 mm rain, followed by an average of 48 mm rain in the eastern suburbs



Ten people rescued from floodwaters

Latur, Aug 29 (UNI): Ten people have been successfully rescued from flood situations in the Shirur Anantpal and Ahmedpur talukas of Latur district through the combined efforts of the disaster management team and local citizens. The rescue operations were conducted under the immediate guidance and supervision of District Collector Varsha Thakur Ghuge, with all teams working efficiently to complete the missions successfully. Among those rescued were five people who had become trapped in a shed located on the riverbank in the Shirur Anantpal area, all of whom were brought to safety by the local rescue team.

In a separate incident at Mouje Kalegaon in Ahmedpur taluka, one person who was trapped in the tailings of a storage tank was immediately rescued by the responding team. Additionally, three labourers who were working on the construction of a bridge over the Gharani river in Shirur Anantpal found themselves trapped by rising water levels and were safely extracted with the assistance of the local rescue team. In another successful rescue operation at Mauje Makani village, local villagers rescued Daulat Gopal Dongargave, who had been swept away by water currents while attempting to cross a bridge near the village. The rescued individual, Daulat Gopal Dongargave, is currently receiving medical treatment at Sai Krupa Hospital in Shirur Tajband for minor injuries sustained during the incident, according to information provided by the District Disaster Management Cell.

One killed in lightning strike in Jalgaon

Jalgaon, Aug 29 (UNI): A 20-year-old shepherd died and two others were injured in a lightning strike during heavy rainfall here in Maharashtra. The incident occurred last night in Munjalwadi Shivara village in Raver taluka.

The deceased has been identified as Dada Kolpe, 20, a resident of Lalmati Padya. According to reports, heavy rains accompanied by thunder and lightning began around 8 pm in Raver taluka. Kolpe was staying at a pada (temporary shelter) with his family when lightning struck, causing him to collapse instantly.

Family members immediately rushed him to Raver Rural Hospital, where doctors declared him brought dead. Two other persons who sustained injuries in the lightning strike have been admitted to the hospital for treatment.

Mumbai to see moderate rains IMD

Mumbai, Aug 29 (UNI): The India Meteorological Department (IMD) today indicates that Mumbai is expected to witness spells of heavy rain through the day, with temperatures hovering between 26 and 30 degrees Celsius.

While the forecast for Mumbai suggests moderate rainfall, the broader Konkan region is on higher alert, with varying intensities of showers expected across multiple districts.

The IMD issued a yellow alert for all Konkan districts, excluding Mumbai, indicating the likelihood of heavy showers at isolated places. Within the Mumbai metropolitan area, moderate rainfall has been recorded since Thursday morning, ranging between 20 to 40 mm across different localities.Officials have clarified that while rains will continue intermittently in the city until Monday, they are unlikely to intensify to severe levels.

However, nearby districts such as Raigad, Ratnagiri and Sindhudurg may experience heavier spells in the coming days.

75-yr-old man dies, son injured in Nashik bus mishap

Nashik, Aug 29 (UNI): A 75-year-old man was killed on the spot, and his son was seriously injured when their two-wheeler was hit by a bus near Raje Sambhaji Stadium in CIDCO, Nashik, yesterday evening.

According to police, the deceased was identified as Suresh Dhondiba Anpat (75), a resident of CIDCO. He was riding the two wheeler when it was struck by a school bus whose brakes had failed. His son, Umesh Anpat (46), who was riding pillion, sustained serious injuries.

Police said the bus, belonging to engineering college, was carrying students from Pathardi Phata to Raje Sambhaji Stadium when the accident occurred. The driver, Dilip Gangadhar Gangurde (48), of Jail Road, reportedly lost control after the brakes failed. The bus rammed into the twowheeler, which in turn crashed into an Eicher truck ahead.

Suresh Anpat suffered serious injuries to his head and face and died on the spot due to excessive bleeding. His son Umesh sustained a fractured leg and was taken to a private hospital. The bus driver and five to six students inside the bus escaped unhurt. The motorcycle was badly damaged, while the bus and the truck sustained minor damage.

Eyewitnesses rushed to arrange an ambulance. However, it could not arrive on time, which angered the locals. The police team, which reached the spot promptly, shifted the injured in a police vehicle with the help of citizens. A panchnama was carried out, and the mishap also led to a traffic jam in the area.

Police registered a case against the bus driver at Ambad police station.

While Rahul protests, Priyanka engages - a strategy for **Congress revival?**

Amid the bitter tussle between the ruling NDA and the Congress-led Opposition in Parliament, a picture recently presented a much-needed pleasant scene between the politicians of the two fronts.

It was a rare display of bonhomie -- a completely unexpected moment that hinted at the possibility of normalcy, if only leaders were willing.

The photograph was of Union Minister for Health and Family Welfare and BJP President J.P. Nadda with Congress leader Priyanka Gandhi Vadra. The image has created a stir in political circles, showing the two leaders smiling, laughing, and talking.

The meeting took place in the Minister's office, where Priyanka Gandhi was accompanied by three representatives from her Wayanad Lok Sabha constituency. The agenda focused on improving healthcare facilities and renewing the request for an AIIMS in Kerala. After the August 21 meeting, Priyanka Gandhi even posted on X, which carried no bitterness, no political jibes -- only a patient request and genuine praise.

She wrote that she met J.P. Nadda "to request him to expedite some health projects in Wayanad and to apprise him of the severe difficulties being faced by the local population in the absence of the Medical College in Mananthavadi, which is yet far from functional."

She and her team also discussed the need for better healthcare for Wayanad's tribal population, their specific health challenges, pending NHM funds, and the requirement for a specialised trauma centre to deal with frequent animal attack cases in the area. They also reiterated the long-standing request for an AIIMS

Priyanka concluded her post with a warm note of appreciation for the Minister, saying, "He was kind enough to hear out all our demands and hold a frank discussion with us. I sincerely hope that these pressing issues will be given due consideration."

The image was a refreshing sight in today's political climate, where sharp attacks have replaced civil exchanges. The recently concluded Monsoon Session of Parliament saw one of the worst performances in recent years, especially from the Congress-led Opposition, which did not let either House function smoothly.

The session, which began on July 21 and adjourned sine die on August 21, witnessed disruptions almost every day, except for the discussion on Operation Sindoor. Out of 21 sittings over 32 days, Lok Sabha's productivity stood at just 31 per cent, while Rajya Sabha recorded 39 per cent. The presiding officers of both Houses expressed deep disappointment over the continuous and deliberate disruptions, leading to a complete washout of legislative business.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi, too, voiced dissatisfaction with the session's conduct, remarking that bright and young Congress MPs were being denied the opportunity to speak due to the "insecurity" of the party's leadership. Sources said the PM made these comments during the customary informal meeting in the Lok Sabha Speaker's office after adjournment -- a meeting that Rahul Gandhi-led Opposition leaders chose not to attend.

In such an atmosphere -- where even longstanding parliamentary courtesies are ignored for political signalling and scoring points -- the image of a warm, respectful exchange between two ideological opponents, one from the Nehru-Gandhi family, has naturally drawn attention.

Within the corridors of Parliament, Priyanka Gandhi is increasingly seen as a leader who engages warmly with everyone, including BJP leaders -- a sharp contrast to her brother, Rahul Gandhi, the Leader of the Opposition in the Lok Sabha, who is often described as "arrogant". The siblings' contrasting body language speaks volumes.

Back in August 2022, veteran Congress leader Ghulam Nabi Azad criticised Rahul Gandhi for his "immature" decision-making and even called him "childish". Many believe that these traits are still reflected in his behaviour, costing the Congress both politically and in public perception.

This raises an old but relevant question: Is it time for the Gandhi family, led by Sonia Gandhi, to consider giving Priyanka Gandhi Vadra a more central role in the party? The idea has surfaced multiple times over the years, but has always been dismissed.

But now isn't it the time to rethink, recalibrate, and try the other Nehru-Gandhi to save the dynasty and the party from its current decline before it is too late? Mother Sonia Gandhi needs to note the difference and nudge her daughter ahead. The question, however, is difficult, and Bihar may prove to be the key answer.

India, Japan strongly condemn Pahalgam terror attack, express concern over situation in East and South China Seas

India and Japan today strongly condemned the Pahalgam terrorist attack and called for its perpetrators to be brought to justice without delay. Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Japanese PM Shigeru Ishiba also expressed serious concern over the situation in the East and South China Seas.

The joint statement, titled 'Partnership for expressed serious concern Security and Prosperity of our Next Generation', issued after the 15th India-Japan Annual Summit held between the two sides today, also reiterated their commitment to advancing cooperation among likeminded countries through multilateral frameworks such as the Ouad.

The para on terrorism said: "The two Prime Ministers unequivocally and strongly condemned terrorism and violent extremism in all its forms manifestations, including cross-border terrorism. They condemned in the strongest terms the terrorist attack in Pahalgam, Jammu and Kashmir on 2 2 April 2025, and took note of the United Nations Security Council Monitoring Team Report of 29 July mentioning The Resistance Front (TRF).

"Prime Minister Modi further explained that the had claimed responsibility for the attack. Prime Minister Ishiba noted this with concern. They called for the perpetrators, organizers, and financiers of this reprehensible act to be brought to justice without any delay.

"They also called for concerted actions against

all UN-listed terrorist groups and entities including Al Qaeda, ISIS/ Daesh, Lashkar-e-Tayyiba (LeT), Jaish-e-Mohammad (JeM) and their proxies, and to take resolute actions to root out terrorists' safe havens, eliminate terrorist financing channels and its nexus with transnational crime, and halt cross-border movement of terrorists."

The two PMs also over the situation in the East China Sea and the South China Sea "and reiterated their strong opposition to any unilateral actions that endanger the safety as well as freedom of navigation and overflight, and attempt to change the status quo by force or coercion.

"They shared their serious concern over the militarization of disputed features. They reaffirmed that maritime disputes must be resolved peacefully and in accordance with international law, in particular the UN Convention on the Law of the Sea (UNCLOS)."

The above para comes amid increasing friction between China and Japan over Beijing's hegemonistic actions in the East and South China Seas and their ongoing dispute over the Senkaku islands.

The two Prime Ministers expressed support for a just and lasting peace in Ukraine in accordance with international law and welcomed the ongoing diplomatic efforts by various countries to achieve a just and lasting

They reiterated their

commitment to peace and stability in the Middle East, calling on all parties concerned to show restraint, protect civilians, and expressed grave concern over the humanitarian situation in Gaza, and welcomed efforts to bring peace to the region.

The two Prime Ministers resolved to continue to work closely together for an urgent reform of the UN Security Council (UNSC) including through the expansion of both permanent and nonpermanent categories to better reflect the current geopolitical realities. They expressed their mutual support for each other's candidature for a permanent seat in a reformed UNSC.

The two Prime Ministers noted that the two nations are advancing together towards the 75th anniversary of India-Japan diplomatic relationship in 2027 which would be celebrated in a befitting manner.

They also reiterated their commitment to advancing cooperation like-minded among through countries multilateral frameworks such as Quad between Australia, India, Japan and the United States, to promote peace, stability, and prosperity in the region. In this regard, they welcomed the evolution of the Quad into a vital and enduring regional grouping, and looked forward to the next Quad Leaders' Summit hosted by India later this year.

Earlier, the joint statement noted, that the partnership significantly expanded over

the past decade into wideranging areas such as security, defense, trade, investment, commerce, science and technology, skills and mobility, and cultural and people-topeople links. The two PMs appreciated that India and Japan have more than seventy dialogue mechanisms and working groups across sectors.

In order to further advance the Special Strategic and Global Partnership, the two PMs made a series of announcements focusing on three priority areas: bolstering our defense and security cooperation, reinforcing our economic partnership and deepening our people-to-people exchanges.

Russia open to new Projects with China for joint car production

Beijing, Aug 29 (UNI): Russia is open to new projects with China for joint production of cars, Russian Ambassador to China Igor Morgulov said in an interview with Sputnik.

According to the ambassador, industrial cooperation between Russia and China in the field of automobile manufacturing is actively developing today, the Great Wall automobile plant in the Tula Region, which ranks second in Russia in terms of automobile output volumes, second only to AvtoVAZ, being a good example.

"We are open to new projects in this area, for the support of which the necessary regulatory instruments are being created in our country," Morgulov said.

US journalist Seymour Hersh added to Ukraine's myrotvorets blacklist

Moscow, Aug 29 (UNI): US journalist and Pulitzer Prize winner Seymour Hersh has been included in Ukraine's Myrotvorets (Peacemaker) database of "enemies of Ukraine," data from the Myrotvorets' website showed on Friday.

Hersh was added to the database under the pretext of allegedly "participating in acts of humanitarian aggression against Ukraine," among other reasons.

In 2023, Hersh published an investigation stating that explosive devices were placed under Russian gas pipelines in June 2022 during the Baltops exercises by US Navy divers with support from Norwegian specialists. The decision for the operation was made by then-US President Joe Biden, Hersh said, citing a source. The Pentagon later told RIA Novosti that the US was not involved in the sabotage of the pipelines.

In July 2025, Hersh said, citing sources, that the former commander-in-chief of the Ukrainian armed forces and current Ukrainian ambassador to London, Valerii Zaluzhnyi, could potentially replace President Volodymyr Zelenskyy within a few months.

The Myrotvorets website publishes the personal data of soldiers from the Donetsk People's Republic and Lugansk (Luhansk) People's Republic, as well as journalists and other civilians deemed "enemies of Ukraine." Those listed in the database are known to have received threats after their contact details were published on the website.

Russian Foreign Ministry spokeswoman Maria Zakharova has condemned the website owner's actions as "a direct call for the reprisal of journalists." A number of Russian cultural figures and foreign citizens have also been listed on the website.

3 killed, 2 injured in boat capsizes in N. Afghanistan

Kabul, Aug 29 (UNI): At least three people were killed and two others sustained injuries after a boat capsised in a river in northern Afghanistan's Badakhshan province, a local official announced late on Thursday. The accident occurred when the boat sank during a river crossing on the outskirts of the province's Yaftal district, said Ehsanullah Kamgar, provincial police spokesman.

One body has been recovered, while security personnel and local residents continue their search for the two missing bodies, Kamgar added. According to the official, the cause of the capsising remains under investigation, with authorities working to determine the circumstances that led to the disaster. Badakhshan, a remote and mountainous province in northern Afghanistan, is known for its rugged terrain and reliance on rivers for transportation in areas with limited infrastructure.

Sri Lanka launches survey to identify state lands for investment

Colombo, Aug. 29 (UNI): The Sri Lankan government has launched a survey to identify stateowned lands that can be allocated for investment, a senior official said Friday.

Commissioner General of Lands Chandana Ranaweera Arachchi said the survey is being carried out at the divisional secretariat level, the local administrative unit in Sri Lanka responsible for delivering a broad range of government services.

He said 5,300 hectares of land have already been identified, and the government's goal is to make investing in Sri Lanka easier. Sri Lanka is targeting 1.8 billion U.S. dollars in foreign direct investment in 2025.

Heidi Gardner bids farewell to **SNL** after 8 formative seasons

New York, Aug 29 (UNI): The ongoing cast shakeup at Saturday Night Live has escalated into an earthquake with Heidi Gardner, after eight seasons, becoming the latest performer to depart.

Gardner is the fourth SNL cast member to leave the show in the past three days, following Devon Walker, Emil Wakim and Michael Longfellow. She had been the longest-tenured female member of the show's current cast, reports The Hollywood Reporter.

Jewish Committee slams 'chorus of attacks on India by US officials'

Washington, Aug 29 (UNI): The American Jewish Committee has criticised the "chorus of attacks on India by U.S. officials", including a White House advisor's "scurrilous charge" that the Ukraine conflict is "Modi's war". The American Jewish Committee, the global advocacy organization for the Jewish people, said in a post on X that India is not responsible for the Ukraine conflict, and called for a reset of "this vital relationship".

"AJC is mystified, and deeply troubled, by the chorus of attacks on India by U.S. officials -- the latest being a White House advisor's scurrilous charge that Russia's brutal aggression against Ukraine is "Modi's war.'

"We regret energyhungry India's reliance on Russian oil -- but India isn't responsible for Putin's war crimes, is a sister democracy and an increasingly important strategic partner of the United States, and has a crucial role to play in Great Power competition. It's time to reset this vital relationship," it said.

The comments come in the aftermath of US Trade Adviser Peter Navarro describing the Ukraine conflict as "Modi's war", in a move to make New Delhi stop buying oil from Moscow.

Navarro's comments came hours after US tariffs of 50% on Indian goods kicked in on Wednesday. The tariffs, among the highest in the world, include a 25% penalty for purchase of weapons and oil from Russia which, the US claims, is a key source of funds for Moscow's war in Ukraine.

Kiev loses up to 2,735 soldiers in battles with Russia's Central Forces

Moscow, Aug 29 (UNI) : Russia's Tsentr (Center) group of forces has eliminated up to 2,735 Ukrainian soldiers over the past week, the Russian Defense Ministry said on

"The losses of the Ukrainian armed forces amounted to up to 2,735 servicepeople, a Germanmade Leopard tank, 34 armored fighting vehicles, including 11 NATO-made armored vehicles, 59 vehicles and 13 field artillery guns," the ministry said in a statement.

Russia's Zapad (West) group has eliminated more than 1,580 Ukrainian military personnel, while the Yug (South) group has eliminated over 1,345

Ukrainian soldiers, the ministry said. Russia's Vostok (East) group of forces eliminated over 1,570 Ukrainian soldiers in the past week.

Kiev has also lost over 1,190 soldiers in battles with the Sever (North) group of forces, the ministry said, adding that Russia carried out seven mass strikes on Ukrainian military infrastructure and airbases in the past week.

Russia's Dnepr group of forces eliminated over 430 Ukrainian troops, three foreign-made armored vehicles, 75 vehicles, 10 field artillery guns, 42 electronic warfare stations and 23 ammunition, fuel and material depots over the past week, the ministry

added.In addition, Russian air defense systems shot down 1,377 Ukrainian drones, a Su-27 fighter jet, 18 guided aerial bombs, nine US-made HIMARS multiple launch rockets, and a Neptune long-range guided missile over the past week, the Defense Ministry said. Since the start of Russia's special military operation, Ukraine has lost a total of 666 aircraft, 283 helicopters, 80,367 unmanned aerial vehicles, 625 anti-aircraft missile systems, 24,856 tanks and other armored fighting vehicles, 1,588 MLRS combat vehicles, 29,041 field artillery guns and mortars, and 40,622 units of support military vehicles, the ministry added.

Ukraine blows up 2 key Russian bridges using Moscow's own mines & USD 600 drones

Ukraine has said it destroyed two bridges inside Russia by using a couple of cheap drones to hit stashes of mines and ammunition hidden there by Russian forces.

The Ukrainian military said the two bridges near the border with Ukraine's Kharkiv region were being used by the Russian military to resupply their troops. Because of their strategic importance, the bridges were mined – so that the Russian military had the option of blowing them up in case of a sudden Ukrainian advance, reports

It is not unusual for an army under attack to destroy bridges, roads and other key infrastructure on its own territory to prevent the enemy from advancing. Ukraine did this in the early days of the full-scale

Kyiv, Aug 29 (UNI): invasion in February 2022, destroying bridges on roads leading towards Kyiv. The move delayed the Russian advance and protected the Ukrainian capital.In the case of the two bridges in Russia, the Ukrainian military found out about the stashes of mines and used it to its own advantage.

> Ukraine's 58th Separate Motorized Infantry Brigade, which conducted the operation, told CNN that they decided have a closer look at the bridge after noticing unusual activity around it.

> "It became clear that something was going on there. We couldn't fly a regular reconnaissance drone under the bridge because the signal would simply disappear, so we flew in with a first-personview drone equipped with optics," fiber

representative of the brigade told CNN.

A video filmed by the shows drone approaching the bridge and discovering a large pile of anti-tank mines and other ammunition. A piece of fabric that appears to have been covering the stash is seen lying to the side.

"We saw the mines, and we struck," they added.

CNN has geolocated the bridge seen in the video to the Belgorod region in southern Russia, near the border with Ukraine."After that, we decided to check the other bridge. Australia's first Moon rover to be launched on NASA mission

Canberra, Aug 29 (UNI) Australia's first Moon rover will be launched around the end of the decade through NASA's Commercial Lunar Payload Services (CLPS) initiative, the Australian Space Agency (ASA) said on Friday.

The ASA announced that the rover, named Roover, will be carried to the lunar surface on NASA's CT-4 mission around the end of the 2020s.

The space agency said that the rover has been entrusted with "key research objectives" by NASA, including collecting new data about the lunar surface to support international space science and exploration goals.

"In time, Roo-ver's explorations will help global efforts to establish a possible sustainable human presence in space," the ASA said in a media release.The federal government in December

2024 announced that Australian-led consortium ELO2 had been chosen to design, build and operate the rover, which will weigh about 20 kilograms.

Tim Ayres, the Minister Industry Innovation and Minister for Science, said on Friday that the development and launch of the rover will inspire the STEM workforce needed for Australia's future.

"This is one of the most specialized robotics and advanced manufacturing projects in the country. It's accelerating development of Australia's advanced technical capabilities and deepening local manufacturing expertise," he said.

The government has committed 42 million Australian dollars (27.4 million U.S. dollars) in funding for development, design, build, and operation of the semiautonomous rover.

Eurasian Heads, UN, **ASEAN, CSTO, CIS** invited to SCO **Summit in Tianjin**

Beijing, Aug 29 (UNI)- The SCO leadership expects the participation of the heads of state of Eurasia, as well as representatives of international organizations, at the summit in China's Tianjin, SCO Secretary General Nurlan Yermekbayev."We expect the participation of the heads of a number of Eurasian countries, as well as the heads of the United Nations, ASEAN, CSTO, CIS and other multilateral organizations," Yermekbayev said.

Invitations have also been sent to observer countries, dialogue partners, as well as a number of other states and organizations, the official added. The SCO Summit will be held in Tianjin on August 31-September 1.

The Shanghai Cooperation Organization (SCO) is a tenmember multilateral organization, established on 15 June 2001 by the leaders of Kazakhstan, China, Kyrgyzstan, Russia, Tajikistan and Uzbekistan. These countries, except Uzbekistan, had been members of the Shanghai-5 group formed in April 1996. In 2001, Uzbekistan was admitted as a member (thus transforming it into the Shanghai-6). At the July 2005 Astana Summit, India, Iran and Pakistan were granted Observer status.

In July 2015 in Ufa, Russia, the SCO decided to admit India (and Pakistan) as full Member. In June 2017, at the Summit in Astana, India (and Pakistan) officially joined SCO as full-member. Iran was granted the status of a Member State at the SCO Summit hosted virtually by India on 4 July 2023. Belarus was admitted as a new member at the SCO Summit in Astana on 4 July 2024. Apart from the 10 Members, the SCO has 2 Observers (Afghanistan and Mongolia) and 14 Dialogue Partners (Azerbaijan, Armenia, Cambodia, Nepal, Turkey, Sri Lanka, United Arab Emirates, Kuwait, Maldives, Bahrain, Myanmar, Egypt, Saudi Arabia and Qatar). As per the SCO Charter, Russian and Chinese are the only two official languages of the SCO.

Sindhu bows out in quarter-finals of **BWF World Championships**

Paris, Aug 29 (UNI): Two-time Olympic medallist PV Sindhu put up a valiant fight but crashed out of the quarterfinals of the BWF World Championships 2025 here today, losing to Indonesia's Putri Kusuma Wardani in a hard-fought three-game battle.

Sindhu, ranked 15th in the women's singles, went down 21-14, 13-21, 21-16 to world No. 9 Wardani in an hour and four minutes at the Adidas Arena.

The Indian shuttler was slow off the blocks, trailing 11-7 at the interval before conceding the first game. She stormed back in the second, using her reach to control rallies while her Indonesian opponent faltered with unforced errors, forcing a decider.

The final game remained neck-and-neck until 17-16, but Sindhu conceded four consecutive points at the crunch stage, allowing Wardani to seal the contest. The defeat marked Sindhu's third loss in five encounters against Wardani.

A win would have made five-time medallist Sindhu the outright record-holder for most women's singles medals at the World Championships, ahead of China's Zhang Ning.

India's campaign also suffered another setback in mixed doubles, where Dhruv Kapila and Tanisha Crasto bowed out in the last eight. The Indian pair, after taking an early 8-3 lead, fell 21-15, 21-13 to Malaysia's fourth-seeded duo Chen Tang Jie and Toh Ee Wei in just 37 minutes.

India's hopes now rest on men's doubles stars Satwiksairaj Rankireddy and Chirag Shetty, seeded ninth, who will take on Malaysia's second seeds and twotime Olympic bronze medallists Aaron Chia and Soh Wooi Yik later in the day.

Kshitij Naveed Kaul snatches victory with late flourish at Kolar **Open 2025**

Pune's Udayan Mane, who set the course record of 67 in round two, carded a 74 in the fourth round to close the week in tied fourth at three-under 285. Honey Baisoya (72) of the DLF Golf & Country Club, Gurugram, also took a share of fourth place.

Nepal's Subash Tamang, who was playing at his home course this week, finished sixth at two-under 286.

Kshitij Naveed Kaul announced himself as a contender early in the day when he produced some fabulous drives and wedge-play to pick up four birdies on the first six holes.
