Telangana cops nab eight suspects in countrywide raids

Hyderabad, Sept 24 (UNI) : The Telangana CID conducted raids at multiple locations across the country and arrested 8 suspect operators for running online betting operations through six betting apps, causing the public to lose large amounts of money.

The raids were conducted at six locations across Rajasthan, Gujarat, and Punjab by 6 teams, said CID ADGP Charu Sinha in a release here today.

The accused were operating the following online betting apps: Taj0077, Fairply.live, Andhra365, Vlbook, Telugu365, and Yes365, she said.During the raids, several hardware devices containing vast amounts of data were seized, she added. Investigation is ongoing to identify the main culprits, who are suspected to be based abroad.

Agreement with Zepto will increase job opportunities: Minister

New Delhi, Sep 24 (UNI) An MoU was signed between the Ministry of Labour and Employment and Zepto to enhance employment opportunities on the National Career Service Portal as well as youth employment.

In his address, union Minister for Labour & Employment Dr. Mansukh Mandaviya said, "The National Career Service has emerged as a unique bridge between employers and job seekers. With over 5.2 million registered employers and nearly 75 million vacancies covered since its inception, the NCS has established itself as a one-stop solution for all employment related services."The union Minister said that strengthening the NCS portal through Artificial Intelligence and other world class digital tools in the near future will enable job seekers to identify opportunities that suit their location requirements and relevant qualifications. Welcoming the collaboration between the Ministry and Zepto, Dr. Mandaviya emphasized that this partnership will open a new window of opportunity for the youth, while allowing Zepto to connect with the appropriate talent pool of human resources.

Leh protests turn violent, 4 reportedly killed, 20 injured

Leh/New Delhi, Sept 24 (UNI) : Four people were reportedly killed and more than 20 injured in violent demonstrations by students in Leh town demanding grant of statehood to the union Territory of Ladakh and inclusion of Ladakh into the Sixth Schedule of the Constitution.

The number of casualties, however, could not be officially confirmed.

Students clashed with police and resorted to stone pelting. The clashes took an ugly turn as the protestors torched a CRPF vehicle and the local BJP office. Police fired teargas shells and resorted to cane-charge to disperse the protestors.

Climate activist Sonam Wangchuk who has been on hunger strike since September 10 demanding statehood for the UT and inclusion of Ladakh in the Sixth Schedule, was supported by Youth wing of the Ladakh Apex Body (LAB). The LAB had given a call for protest and shutdown after the condition of two of the people on hunger strike deteriorated and were admitted to hospital last evening. Additional forces



were deployed to restore law and order.

Talks between the Centre and representatives of LBA and Kargil Democratic Alliance are scheduled to be held on October 6.

The LBA called for a shut down in support of the demands. People came out on the streets and marched through the streets. The protests turned violent after the students resorted to stone pelting.

The Sixth Schedule of the Constitution meant for the tribal population of four northeastern states Assam, Tripura, Meghalaya and

Mizoram, has special provisions for governance, powers of the President and Governor, type of local bodies, judicial mechanisms and financial powers to be exercised through autonomous councils.

In a related development, the closing ceremony of the four-day annual Ladakh festival was cancelled after the clashes. Lieutenant Governor Kavinder Gupta was scheduled to attend the closing ceremony.

"The administration of the union Territory of Ladakh has announced cancellation of the last day and closing ceremony of the ongoing Ladakh Festival due to unavoidable circumstances. The administration deeply regrets the inconvenience caused to all stakeholders, including local artists, cultural troupes, tourists, and the people of Ladakh who were eagerly looking forward to the event," the Department of Information and Public Relations said in a statement.The Ladakh festival has served as a platform for young and budding artists from the region to showcase their talent and develop their skills.

TGSRTC becomes 1st Public Transport Corporation in India to adopt AI Technology

Hyderabad, Sept 24 (UNI) : In a pioneering step towards leveraging advanced technology, the Telangana State Road Transport Corporation (TGSRTC) has become the first public transport corporation in India to adopt Artificial Intelligence (AI) in its operations across all depots in the state.This landmark initiative marks a new era in public transport management, focused on enhancing efficiency, reducing operational costs, ensuring commuter convenience, and improving employee welfare, the Corporation said in a release.

The state-owned Transport Corporation partnered with Hansa Equity Partners LLP to implement the AI project across all depots in the state.

The firm will provide technical expertise, strategic planning, and specialised training for TGSRTC's dedicated technology team, ensuring seamless execution.

Key Initiatives under AI Integration are -- employee Health Monitoring, AI-driven Scheduling; and Operational Efficiency.Under health monitoring, medical reports of over 40,000 employees are being analyzed using AI and Machine Learning to identify health risks and promote preventive care. A successful pilot in six depots is now being scaled up corporation-wide. This will help improve crew productivity significantly, the release said.

Utilizing AI, the corporation is preparing to introduce automated, demand-based scheduling of bus services besides to monitor employee performance, streamline operations, and minimize costs, while ensuring faster and commuter-friendly services.

A detailed presentation on AI implementation was recently made to Transport Minister Ponnam Prabhakar at Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Secretariat here attended by Vikas Raj, Special Chief Secretary, Transport and Roads and Buildings Department, TGSRTC Managing Diector V.C. Sajjanar and other senior officials.The Minister lauded TGSRTC's forward-looking approach, observing that AI is shaping the future across sectors worldwide.

He commended the Corporation's initiative and urged officials to ensure collaborative execution for long-term success.Sajjanar highlighted that AI adoption is a strategic leap to prepare TGSRTC for future challenges.He stated that AI integration will significantly enhance speed, transparency, and accuracy of services, while enabling smart scheduling to meet dynamic passenger needs.

Govt launches Rs 525 Cr project to mitigate Munneru river floods

Hyderabad, Sept 24 (UNI) : The government has launched a Rs 525.36 crore project to construct a retaining wall on both sides of the Munneru river in Khammam city to provide a permanent solution to recurring flood problems.

The initiative is part of the government's efforts to protect lives, property, farmlands, and public infrastructure from monsoon flooding, an official release said today.

Khammam, a rapidly growing city, has faced severe flooding every monsoon due to the overflowing Munneru stream. Sudden cloudbursts and changing weather patterns have caused extensive damage to infrastructure and residential areas.

In September 2024, a cloudburst resulted in flash floods, causing an estimated Rs 757 crore in damages and displacing hundreds of families. Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy visited the affected areas and assured families that the retaining wall work would be completed.The project involves constructing 17 km of retaining wall, with 8.5 km on each side of the river, with a height of 10-15 metres. The work also includes service roads and a modern drainage system.

The project is being regularly monitored by Ministers Ponguleti

Srinivasa Reddy and Tummala Nageswara Rao, with construction quality ensured through inspections by Warangal NIT experts.

The government has also made progress with land acquisition and rehabilitation measures. Out of 245.12 acres required, 106.21 acres of government land and 69.12 acres of patta land have been acquired. A 139.27-acre layout in Polepalli village is being developed to provide housing plots for 1,666 displaced families. Once completed, the Munneru retaining wall will permanently protect Khammam from floods and serve as a milestone in urban development.

Congress betrays farmers, BJP betrays people: KTR

Hyderabad, Sept 24 (UNI) : BRS Working President K. T. Rama Rao (KTR) today charged at the two biggest national parties Congress and BJP.

He alleged that while the Congress government in Telangana is deceiving farmers, the BJP government at the Centre is breaking the back of the common man. He said subjecting farmers to "third-degree torture" for coming onto the streets demanding urea is proof of the shameless governance of Revanth Reddy.

He ridiculed Prime Minister Modi, saying it was laughable that after looting ?15 lakh crore from the people in the last 8 years under arbitrary GST slabs, he was now reducing slabs for the sake of the Bihar elections and asking people to celebrate.

Prominent Karimnagar doctors Ontela Rohit Reddy and Dr. Gogula Gautami Reddy (senior gynaecologist) joined BRS in the presence of KTR at Telangana Bhavan here.

Speaking on the occasion, KTR criticised that even after months in power, the Congress government in the state has not done a single meaningful thing.

Cabinet clears Rs 2,277 cr DSIR scheme to strengthen R&D in human capital

New Delhi, Sept 24 (UNI) The union Cabinet, chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, has approved the 'Capacity Building and Human Resource Development' scheme of the Department of Scientific and Industrial Research (DSIR), with a total outlay of Rs 2,277.397 crore for the 15th Finance Commission cycle (2021-22 to 2025-26).The scheme, to be implemented by the Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR), is designed to strengthen India's capabilities in Science, Technology & Engineering, Medical, and Mathematical Sciences (STEMM), through structured support for human capital development.Officials said the scheme will offer a platform for young

researchers to pursue careers in academia, industry, and public R&D, guided by leading scientists and academicians. It is expected to contribute meaningfully towards India's Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) by increasing the number of researchers per million population and nurturing scientific excellence.

The Cabinet's approval marks a significant milestone for CSIR, which is currently in its 84th year of service to the nation's scientific and industrial research. The scheme will be implemented under four major sub-components namely doctoral and postdoctoral fellowships, extramural research scheme, including the emeritus scientist and Bhatnagar Fellowship programmes,

awards scheme to recognise scientific excellence and travel and symposia grant scheme to promote global knowledge exchange.

According to DSIR, the initiative comes at a time when India is witnessing an upward trajectory in global scientific rankings. The country now ranks 39th in the Global Innovation Index (2024), as per WIPO data, and is among the top three globally in terms of scientific publication output, as reported by the National Science Foundation (USA).

The scheme is currently supporting thousands of research scholars and scientists whose work has contributed significantly to India's growing reputation in the global scientific landscape.

'Talks with centre on Delhi villagers' toll tax waiver demand reach no conclusion'

New Delhi, Sept 24 (UNI) : The talks between the Delhi villagers delegation led by Palam 360 Khap chief Surender Solanki and the Centre today, demanding toll waiver at UER 2 has not reached any conclusion, the Khap chief said.

Solanki has informed that the committee of villagers formed at the Mahapanchayat held on September 21, had met union Minister of State Harsh Malhotra and Delhi MPs today regarding their demand of toll tax waiver for the national capital's villages along UER-2.

The villagers sought a resolution regarding the issue from the centre. However, after the meeting, Solanki informed that the talks were not fruitful as the government has not agreed to waive toll tax for any of the Delhi villages for now, and are suggesting to opt for the monthly pass option. Palam 360 chief has now said that the movement of the villagers demanding levy waiver, which was put on hold for a couple of days after the Mahapanchayat on September 21, will now again resume and further intensify to push for the interest of the villagers.

On September 21, two local MLAs had met the villagers in the Mahapanchayat held at Bakkarwala village near the toll plaza, and it was decided that rural representatives appointed by Mahapanchayat will meet the concerned central minister of state and MPs today. Solanki now says that the villagers can again plan for Chakka Jam on the UER-2 Mundka Bakkarwala toll, and further step up the protests until their demands are met. The villagers delegation led by Solanki included Chaudhary Dhara Singh, from Bawana village, Anar Singh, Tikri village, Samundar Singh, Karala village, Mukhtyar Singh, Bakkarwala village and Surender Lakra from Mundka village.

US and European countries themselves trade with Russia : China

New Delhi/Beijing, Sep 24 (UNI) China today said most countries in the world including the US itself and Europe, continue to trade with Russia and Beijing would do whatever is necessary to safeguard its legitimate rights and interests.Rebuffing US President Donald Trump's statement in his UN General Assembly address yesterday that China and India are funding the war in Ukraine by buying Russian oil, Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesman Guo Jiakun said "Most countries in the world, including the U.S. and European countries, continue to trade with Russia."He said the normal exchanges and cooperation between Chinese and Russian companies are consistent with WTO rules and market

principles. They do not target any third party and should not be disrupted or affected. Commenting on President Trump's criticism of the United Nations in his address the spokesman said that over the past 80 years, the UN has played an irreplaceable role for safeguarding international peace and security and promoting global development.' 'China always believes that in a world as turbulent as ours, it is all the more important to uphold and defend the authority of the UN."He said China firmly supports the UN in playing a core role in international affairs. President Xi Jinping has put forward the Global Governance Initiative, which is China's latest proposal to strengthen and improve global governance.

"Deeply saddened by the passing of renowned Kannada novelist SL Bhyrappa Ji," Shah said.

Skilling of the homeless to re introduce them into the mainstream

New Delhi, Sept 24 (UNI) : Asian Paints has tied up with Non-Governmental Organisation (NGO) Aashray Adhikar Abhiyan (AAA) in the national capital for skilling homeless and rag pickers so that they can be gainfully employed and lead a life of dignity.

Aashray Adhikar Abhiyan (AAA) has been working for the homeless

people since 25 years. The NGO has been training the homeless in house painting work since 2018, after the 10-15 day course modules, the NGO finds them work in construction sites.

Speaking to UNI, Dev Kumar, Programme coordinator, said: "We teach them painting work on walls, wood and metal. After the training, we help

them find work. "Kumar himself was homeless for a while before joining AAA.

"I came to Delhi in 2004. After losing my job, I fell on hard times and was homeless. I began to live in an AAA night shelter. Later on, I became an employee of the NGO. The homeless often sever ties with their home and relatives due to embarrassment. I myself,

for about four years, cut off all ties with my family when I was homeless."Not having an ID is a big problem. Hence one of the earliest things that we at AAA did was get ID's of such people made. The homeless and the rag picker community are often targeted and harassed by the police, Hence we motivate them to learn a trade and join the

mainstream, that way they can earn more, live with dignity and not be unnecessarily targeted by the police."Fellow Program coordinator Rajni Singh says that initially, the homeless people have some inhibitions about coming to the night shelters and learning some craft and hence their counselling is very important.

Congress betrayed gig workers, alleges KTR

Hyderabad, Sept 24 (UNI) : BRS Working President K T Rama Rao today demanded that the Telangana government immediately implement the promises made to gig and platform workers.

He criticised the Congress party for ignoring the issue after coming to power, despite releasing a special declaration for gig workers during the election campaign.

The Telangana Gig and Platform Workers union (TGPWU) met with KTR at Telangana Bhavan and expressed their difficulties, stating that none of the promises have been fulfilled. KTR assured them that the BRS would stand by the workers and question the government until their problems are resolved.

KTR demanded that the government immediately establish the Gig Workers' Welfare Board, ensure social security including insurance, provide fair wages, and release compensation for deceased workers. He reminded Rahul Gandhi, who had promised to take responsibility for the implementation, to respond to the problems.

He also expressed anguish that the families of three gig workers who lost their lives have not yet received the Rs 5 lakh accidental insurance compensation, despite submitting all required documents.

He called it shameful that Congress is "betraying" gig workers who served the public during the Covid pandemic. KTR assured that if the government introduces a special law for the welfare of gig workers, the BRS party would offer its full support.

Covert CM ignoring Medigadda only to protect AP CM Naidu's interests, alleged BRS

Hyderabad, Sept 24 (UNI) : BRS Working President K. T. Rama Rao (KTR) today alleged that Revanth Reddy is acting as a covert CM, dancing to the tunes of Narendra Modi and Chandrababu (AP CM).

KTR further alleged “For the sake of Chandrababu’s interests, Revanth Reddy is delaying repairs to the Medigadda barrage.”

When the Congress government in Karnataka is spending Rs 70,000 crore to raise the Almatti dam height

by five metres, that is acceptable, but when former Chief Minister KCR built Kaleshwaram project to irrigate 40 lakh acres with Rs 93,000 crore, they maliciously spread lies of Rs one lakh crore corruption, KTR said while addressing at a meeting held in connection with the joining of prominent Karimnagar doctors in the BRS party at Telangana Bhavan here.

He candidly admitted that after the last elections, the people are not to be blamed, but leaders like

Cyberabad Cybercrime Police arrested 13 from across various states in one- week

Hyderabad, Sep 24 (UNI) The Cyberabad cyber crime police today claimed that they have arrested 13 people in connection with ten cybercrime cases detected between September 17 and 23, exposing a network of offenders operating across multiple states. The Investigation revealed the pan-India spread of cybercriminal networks, with offenders from different states.

Out of 13 arrests, nine were linked to Trading Fraud, which accounted for six of the cases investigated during the week, a police release said here.The remaining cases involved in Digital Arrest Fraud; Cheating by Impersonation; Job Fraud and Parttime Job Fraud.

Police seized 13 mobile Phones ad 14 SIM cards from the accused.

The Cyberabad Cyber Crime successfully processed and obtained 370 refund orders in 113 cases from the Court for an amount of about Rs.1.69 crore to be refunded to victims.

One important case of this week, the Cyberabad Police uncovers Major Online Trading Fraud - Victim Cheated of ?51.65 Lakhs: Cyberabad Cyber Crime Police have busted a large online trading fraud network and arrested multiple accused for their active involvement in facilitating fraudulent bank accounts used in cybercrimes.

Investigation revealed that several individuals had knowingly provided their bank accounts to criminals in exchange for hefty commissions.

These bank accounts were used to launder

money extorted from victims across India.

Notably, one bank account linked to the accused was found to be involved in 31 different cases, while another account was linked to 10 separate cases nationwide.

In this case Cyber Crimes, Cyberabad Police have arrested four accused this week.

Further investigation is ongoing to apprehend absconding accused and trace the wider fraud network.The arrested individuals confessed that they supplied multiple bank accounts for commissions, fully aware that these accounts would be misused for cyber fraud and online betting.They also assisted each other in contacting fraudsters, traveling to different states, and facilitating financial transactions.

Solapur Division of CR Ensures Passenger Safety and Support Amidst Heavy Rainfall and Flood-like Conditions

solutions that safeguard farmers against one of the most destructive groundnut diseases,” Dr. Pathak said.

“This study bridges the gap between gene discovery and practical resistance breeding.

"It was made possible by ICRISAT’s unique resources, from its vast Genebank to its genomics platforms and disease screening fields,” said Dr Stanford Blade, Deputy Director General – Research & Innovation, ICRISAT.The science behind the breakthrough: 13 genomic regions were identified across eight chromosomes linked to resistance. 145 candidate genes were found, many involved in detoxification, protective compound synthesis, and plant recovery.Three key genes

(AhSR001, AhSR002, AhSR003) were validated as markers, explaining nearly 60 percent of resistance.“With these markers, we can fast-track resistant groundnut varieties that save farmers money and build resilience against disease and climate shocks,” said Dr Manish Pandey, Principal Scientist at ICRISAT.

The study was conducted in partnership with the ICAR–Indian Institute of Groundnut Research (India), the Chinese Academy of Agricultural Sciences (China), and Acharya N.G. Ranga Agricultural University (India), with support from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation and the Indian Council of Agricultural Research.

Cardiovascular diseases behind 1 in 3 global deaths in 2023

Cardiovascular diseases (CVD) remain the leading cause of disease burden, causing one in three deaths worldwide in 2023, according to a study.

The study showed that the number of cardiovascular disease deaths worldwide has risen sharply, climbing to 19.2 million in 2023 from 13.1 million in 1990.

The heart-related mortality was driven by population growth, ageing, and exposure to a broad range of risks, including increasing rates of obesity and diabetes, as revealed by the report based on the Global Burden of Disease (GBD) Study, and published today in JACC.

Ischemic heart disease affected an estimated 240 million people in 2023, while lower extremity peripheral arterial disease impacted 122 million; stroke remained a leading cause of death and disability across all regions.

Men had higher cardiovascular mortality rates than women in most regions, and risk increased steeply after age 50.

High body mass index and high fasting plasma glucose were the fastest-growing metabolic contributors between 2018 and 2023, mirroring global trends in obesity and diabetes.

“The finding that CVD burden is substantially greater outside of the most developed settings, even after accounting for differences in population age, remains among the most important messages of this analysis,” said Gregory A. Roth, Professor in the Division of Cardiology, University of Washington.

“Our analysis shows wide geographic differences in CVD burden that can’t be explained by income level alone. Given this kind of variation, our findings offer the opportunity to tailor local health policies to target the most relevant risks for specific populations,” she added.

Researchers estimated the burden due to 376 diseases, including CVD, from 1990 to 2023 in 204 countries using all available data and statistical models.

CVD also remained the leading cause of disability-adjusted life years (DALYs) and deaths estimated in the GBD globally. There were 437 million CVD DALYs in 2023, with a 16-fold difference between the countries with the lowest and highest CVD DALY rates.

This is a 1.4-fold increase from the 320 million CVD DALYs in 1990.

Importantly, 79.6 per cent of all CVD DALYs globally in 2023 were attributable to modifiable risk factors, which have increased globally by 97.4 million since 1990, largely due to population growth and ageing.

The top risk factors include metabolic, such as high body mass index (BMI) and high fasting plasma glucose, followed by behavioral and environmental/occupational, like air pollution, lead exposure, and higher temperatures.

The Tragic Death of Zubin Garg: Assam Loses Its Musical Heart

Assam woke up to a devastating reality with the sudden and tragic death of Zubin Garg, one of its most beloved cultural icons. Known as the “Heartthrob of Assam,” Zubin was not only a singer of immense popularity but also a figure who bridged music, cinema, and social movements with unmatched passion. His death has triggered waves of grief that remind us of the loss of global icons like Michael Jackson, Princess Diana, or Whitney Houston — stars whose passing left a void that could never be filled.

An Icon for Generations, Especially Gen Z

For the younger generation, particularly Gen Z, Zubin was more than a singer. His romantic numbers, modern pop creations, and powerful stage presence connected deeply with the youth. Unlike many stars who remain aloof, Zubin embodied accessibility — he was down-to-earth, approachable, and always vocal about social causes. His songs gave voice to youthful energy, love, and defiance, making him an inseparable part of Assam’s modern cultural identity.“

Circumstances Around His Death

Yet, the circumstances of his demise remain shadowed by contradictory reports.



What appears consistent is the fact that Zubin had been physically weak, having only recently recovered from a hospital stay. A known epileptic, he required constant care and vigilance, especially during large public events. Many believe the event organizers failed to ensure his safety. With his celebrity stature, additional medical supervision and protective measures should have been mandatory. The absence of such precautions raises painful questions.

Beyond Music: A Humanitarian and Rebel Voice

Zubin’s popularity was not confined to his romantic ballads or film appearances. He was a humanitarian who extended help to the poor

and needy, often quietly without seeking publicity. Local accounts recall how he funded education for underprivileged children, supported artists in distress, and reached out to flood-affected families across Assam.

He was also a rebel voice who did not compromise with power for personal gain. He stood against the Citizenship Amendment Act (CAA), lending his voice and presence to people’s protests. When the Assam Government ordered the felling of centuries-old trees near Guwahati’s Dighali Pukhuri, Zubin openly opposed the move, standing firm with environmental activists. His integrity and courage made him more than an entertainer — he was a

conscience-keeper of society.“

The Mass Appeal and Comparisons with Legends

The outpouring of grief after his death is being compared to the extraordinary scenes following Bhupen Hazarika’s passing. Crowds that thronged to catch a last glimpse of Zubin surpassed earlier records, a testament to the emotional bond he shared with his people. In this, he joined a rare league of stars whose deaths trigger mass mourning: Michael Jackson, whose sudden end shocked global fans; Princess Diana, whose fatal accident evoked worldwide tears; and Kobe Bryant, whose death left millions shattered.

As the writer Albert Schweitzer once said: “The only thing of

importance, when we depart, will be the traces of love we have left behind.” Zubin’s traces are woven in the songs sung by college youth, the memories of rural concerts, and the ideals of protest and compassion he embodied.

Conspiracy Theories and Political Shadows

Not all accept his death as merely natural. Eminent intellectual Dr. Hiren Gohain has suggested there could be more beneath the surface. Given Zubin’s open criticism of the BJP and rumors of his possible entry into electoral politics, some whisper of a conspiracy to silence a rising political voice. While many see this angle as improbable, the suspicion reflects the unease of a society

unwilling to accept the sudden departure of such a vital figure.

Understanding Public Grief: The Psychology of Losing Icons

The collective grief following Zubin’s death highlights the psychology of societies when their cultural icons die. For many, stars like Zubin are not just artists but emotional anchors. They shape identity, provide solace, and symbolize hope. When such figures die, it feels like a part of one’s own life has ended. As John Lennon once reflected on Elvis Presley’s death: “Before Elvis, there was nothing.” Similarly, for thousands in Assam, life now feels incomplete without Zubin.“

The Final Note: A Legacy That Will Outlive Death“

Whatever the controversies or unanswered questions, one truth stands firm: Zubin Garg is no more. But his music, his ideals, and his humility have carved a permanent space in Assam’s cultural memory. His voice will continue to resonate in the hum of guitar strings, in protest rallies, and in the quiet hearts of young lovers.

Assam has lost a son, but generations will remember the singer who gave them words for their emotions and courage for their struggles. His death may have silenced his body, but his legacy will remain an eternal song.

TERI launches green budgeting Toolkit 2.0 to align fiscal policy with climate goals

New Delhi, Sep 24 (UNI) The Energy and Resources Institute (TERI) today launched Version 2.0 of its Green Budgeting Toolkit and an online portal aimed at helping governments, academia, and civil society integrate environmental considerations into fiscal planning.

The launch took place during a national webinar that drew registrations from over 50 countries and participation from stakeholders in Bihar, Assam, Puducherry, and Tamil Nadu.

The updated toolkit, which includes a playbook, pro-forma for departmental self-assessment, a Green Budget Statement structure, and presentation templates, seeks to mainstream sustainability in public finance.

TERI said the initiative builds on India’s tradition of issue-based budgeting, such as gender and child budgeting, and is designed to provide both conceptual clarity and practical instruments to embed green concerns in financial management.

“Public budget in most

states and countries is the largest source of expenditure in the economy. The purpose of the webinar is to heighten awareness of green budgeting and stimulate more thought and action,” said Dr. Prodipto Ghosh, Distinguished Fellow, TERI, in his opening remarks.

Dr. Shailly Kedia, Senior Fellow at TERI, described green budgeting as a self-assessment tool: “It helps in understanding who spends money on what activities, how much, and for which environmental goals. Green budgeting can evolve to be aligned with outcome budgets.”

Government officials and experts from Puducherry and Bihar shared their experiences of implementing green budgeting at the state level. Puducherry’s Environmental Engineer K. Kalamegam called it a “transformative framework” that ensures government decisions are viewed through a climate lens. Bihar’s State Green Budgeting Manual, developed with TERI’s

support, has already spurred expansion across sectors such as agriculture, animal husbandry, and solar energy, said Dr. Sunil Kumar Gupta of ADRI, Patna.

Data presented at the event showed states scaling up green budgeting significantly. Bihar increased its allocations more than 4.5 times between 2020–21 and 2025–26, Assam by 1.6 times in two years, and Puducherry by 3.6 times between 2022–23 and 2025–26.

Other states, including Kerala, Meghalaya, Odisha, and Rajasthan, have also introduced climate-focused budgeting exercises.

Globally, countries such as France, Indonesia, the Philippines, and members of the European union have adopted green budgeting frameworks, TERI noted.

TERI said wider adoption across departments, greater innovation within schemes, and joint ownership by finance and environment ministries will be key to embedding green budgeting in India’s fiscal system.

SC seeks dedicated portal under Home Ministry to trace missing children

New Delhi, Sept 24 (UNI) : The Supreme Court today directed the Centre to create a dedicated online portal under the aegis of the union Home Ministry to trace missing children and monitor investigations in such cases.

A Bench comprising Justice B.V. Nagarathna and Justice R. Mahadevan highlighted the lack of coordination among state and union territory police forces in tracing missing children.

The court said each state should designate a nodal officer to be in charge of missing complaints and dissemination of information through the portal.

The Bench stressed the need for a “coordinated effort” and asked Additional Solicitor General Aishwarya Bhati, appearing for the Centre, to seek instructions.

The court was hearing a petition filed by NGO Guria Swayam Sevi Sansthan, which raised concerns over unresolved cases of child kidnapping and trafficking despite the government’s existing “Khoya/Paya” portal. The plea cited five cases from Uttar Pradesh in which children were trafficked to Jharkhand, Madhya Pradesh, and Rajasthan.

SCBA president Vikas Singh urges CJI Gavai to reform Judicial appointments process

New Delhi, Sept 24 (UNI) : Senior Advocate Vikas Singh, President of the Supreme Court Bar Association (SCBA), has written to Chief Justice of India (CJI) B.R. Gavai, pressing for urgent reforms in the judicial appointments system and finalisation of the long-pending Memorandum of Procedure (MoP).

Calling for a “transparent, merit-driven, and equitable framework” to replace the existing collegium mechanism, Singh said the current system, though intended to safeguard judicial independence, suffers from “structural flaws” that have created serious challenges.

He highlighted three key concerns that Lawyers from the Supreme Court Bar are often overlooked for elevation to their parent High Courts despite their exposure to national jurisprudence, leading to what he termed a “systematic marginalisation of valuable judicial talent.”

Singh urged that women and under-represented groups continue to remain sidelined, with official data showing women constitute just 9.5 percent of High Court judges and 2.94 percent of Supreme Court judges as of February 2024.

He said that Informal networks and visibility in court allegedly outweigh analytical ability and courtroom preparation, leaving out deserving juniors and briefing counsel, described as the “unseen architects of courtroom success.”

Citing the Supreme Court Advocates-on-Record Association v. union of India (2016) judgment, the SCBA proposed four key reforms for incorporation into the MoP: creation of an independent secretariat in every High Court and the Supreme Court to manage records and vacancies, adoption of an application-based process to broaden the pool, publication of eligibility criteria to guide selections, and establishment of a grievance redressal mechanism to ensure accountability.

“The proposals are not a radical overhaul but institutional safeguards to strengthen the collegium system,” Singh stressed, adding that elevation “must no longer be a function of proximity or visibility, but of merit, integrity, and constitutional fidelity.”

Super typhoon Ragasa batters Macao, triggers top alert

Macao, Sept. 24 (UNI) Super typhoon Ragasa passed within 100 km of the Macao Special Administrative Region (SAR) on Wednesday morning, causing gale and heavy rain, said Macao's meteorological bureau, which hoisted the No. 10 tropical cyclone signal at 5:30 a.m. local time.

The Macao Meteorological and Geophysical Bureau noted that the wind in Macao has reached hurricane-level force 12 and will sustain in the next few hours, and therefore, the top-level typhoon signal will be in effect for a period of time.Storm surge brought rapidly rising water levels in low-lying areas, causing seawater to flood inland. The bureau forecast maximum flooding of 1.5 to 2.5 meters around noon.

According to information from the Civil Protection Operations Center, Macao's power utility Companhia de Electricidade de Macau (CEM) has implemented power suspensions in flood-affected areas to ensure public safety and protect power supply facilities.

The center also noted that when the water recedes, power restoration will be arranged as soon as possible.

The SAR's Social Welfare Bureau reported that as of 11 a.m. Wednesday, a total of 642 people have taken shelter at evacuation centers.

Russian Dy Foreign Minister speaks against oppression of Russian speakers in Baltics

Moscow, Sept 24 (UNI) : The oppression of Russian speakers in the Baltic countries violates all the norms of the old European "civilization," Russian Deputy Foreign Minister Dmitry Lyubinsky told Sputnik."In the same vein, I would like to mention the increasingly harsh oppression of Russian-speaking people in the Baltics in violation of all conceivable norms of the old European 'civilization,'" Lyubinsky said.Belarusian Foreign Minister Maxim Ryzhenkov said earlier this year that the Baltic states have no achievements in implementing any important, peaceful or development-oriented international initiatives.

The Baltic states want to show the European union that they are an outpost on the EU's eastern borders, holding back the Belarusians and the Russians, and mean at least something for the EU, Ryzhenkov said.

Russia to begin trials of mRNA cancer vaccine against melanoma

Moscow, Sept. 24 (UNI) : Russian scientists are ready to launch clinical trials of personalised mRNA cancer vaccines targeting melanoma within the next six weeks, according to media reports on Tuesday.

Alexander Gintsburg, head of the Gamaleya National Center of Epidemiology and Microbiology, told TASS news agency that the necessary documents had already been submitted to the Russian Health Ministry pending approval.

The first batches of the vaccine will be produced once approval is granted, Gintsburg said, adding that patient groups have already been selected and their genetic data have been mapped for fully personalized treatment.Preclinical studies have shown that the vaccine can effectively suppress tumor growth and the possibility of metastases. The next mRNA vaccines will be developed for patients with non-small cell lung cancer, TASS reported.

EU Defence Commissioner Andrius Kubilius calls 'drone wall' unfeasible as Europe lacks drone detection capability

Brussels, Sept 24 (UNI) : Amid renewed calls from the European members of the NATO for the construction of a 'drone wall' – in light of Russian breaches into Lithuania, Estonia, and Poland – EU Defence Commissioner Andrius Kubilius said that Europe currently lacks the capability for drone detection, calling construction of any such wall now unrealistic.

Speaking to Euroactiv, he argued that the EU could significantly improve its drone detection capabilities within a year but it will take much longer to develop a full network across land and sea able to even track them, and maybe longer for neutralising targets.

The concept of a European "drone wall" gained rapidly massive traction following calls by European Commission President Ursula von der Leyen for its construction, making the proposal a centrepiece of her September State of the union speech, stressing the urgency of closing the gaps in Europe's air defences."We need to understand that we lack capabilities to detect drones," Andrius Kubilius said at the launch of Euractiv's new daily defence newsletter, Firepower, on Tuesday.

"Maybe we have good capability to detect air fighters and missiles, but drones have specificity – they are flying very low, they are small."

The first step is to "quickly" get detection systems, which he said can be done. Experts say such a system could be ready in "somewhere around a year" to be ready to fend off Russian attacks and "provocations", he said. Kubilius pointed to Ukraine's military – which he said should be used by the EU as a model for this purpose – calling to attention its use of acoustic sensors to identify incoming unmanned aerial vehicles that evade traditional radar.Lasers, he added, could offer a cost-effective means of destroying drones once detected, though a comprehensive system capable of tracking and neutralising them on the ground would take longer to develop.

Palestinian killed by Israeli settler in West Bank: Health Ministry

Ramallah, Sept.24 (UNI) A Palestinian man was killed on Tuesday evening by an Israeli settler in the village of Al-Mughayyir, east of Ramallah in the central West Bank, the Palestinian Health Ministry said.

In a press statement, the ministry identified the victim as 20-year-old Saeed Murad Nasan, who died of his wounds after being shot during the attack.

Earlier in the day, a medical source from the ministry said that at least five Palestinians were injured, including one seriously, during clashes in the village after settlers, backed by the Israeli army, stormed the area.

There was no immediate comment from the Israeli army on these incidents.

Zaporizhzhia nuclear plant loses all off-site power, risking safety

Vienna, Sept 24 (UNI) The Zaporizhzhia Nuclear Power Plant lost all off-site power on Tuesday, showcasing persistent risks to nuclear safety, according to a UN nuclear watchdog.

The power loss was the 10th time during the conflict between Russia and Ukraine, the International Atomic Energy Agency said Tuesday on social platform X, adding that its team is investigating the cause of the incident.

The agency's Director General Rafael Grossi said later that day that emergency diesel generators had started operating to supply the plant with power, citing its team at Zaporizhzhia.

Zaporizhzhia's six reactors have been in cold shutdown since 2024 but still require cooling water for their reactor cores and spent fuel pools. Before the conflict, it had 10 off-site power lines available.

Super typhoon Ragasa lashes Hong Kong, prompts top alert

Hong Kong, Sept. 24 (UNI) The Hong Kong Observatory issued the hurricane signal No. 10, the top level warning, at 2:40 a.m. local time on Wednesday as super typhoon Ragasa whirls by.

This was the second time the highest alert was activated this year after typhoon Wipha passed by on July 10. Hong Kong has not repeated the No. 10 signal in one year since 1964.

Ragasa lashed Hong Kong with torrential rains and winds with speeds of 118 km per hour or more.

Amid Ragasa's rampage, the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region government had received 169 reports of snapped trees and one report of mudslide by 8 a.m. on Wednesday. Public hospitals received 19 patients for typhoon-related injuries.By 8 a.m., 49 emergency shelters set up across Hong Kong had housed 747 occupants.

Trump claims Ukraine in position to "win all of Ukraine back"

Washington, Sept. 24 (UNI) U.S. President Donald Trump on Tuesday said on social media that he believes Ukraine, with support from Europe and NATO, "is in a position to fight and WIN all of Ukraine back in its original form."

The remarks signaled a sharp shift in the White House's position on the Russia-Ukraine conflict since Trump has for months pressed Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky to make concessions to reach a ceasefire deal with Russia, claiming Kiev "doesn't have the cards" in the negotiations.

"After getting to know and fully understand the Ukraine/Russia Military and Economic situation and, after seeing the Economic trouble it is causing Russia, I think Ukraine, with the support of the European Union, is in a position to fight and WIN all of Ukraine back in its original form," Trump wrote on Truth Social.

"With time, patience, and the financial support of Europe and, in particular, NATO, the original Borders from where this War started, is very much an option," Trump said.

"We will continue to supply weapons to NATO

for NATO to do what they want with them," said the president.

When meeting with Zelensky on the sidelines of the United Nations General Assembly in New York City earlier on Tuesday, Trump told reporters that NATO countries should shoot down Russian jets that violate their airspace.

In a letter dated Saturday and addressed to the president of the UN Security Council, Estonia claimed that three Russian MiG-31 fighters entered up to 10 km inside Estonia's airspace and stayed for 12 minutes on Friday.

Russia's first deputy permanent representative to the United Nations, Dmitry Polyanskiy, denied that Russian jets had violated Estonian airspace and accused European states of Russophobia.

Geng Shuang, China's deputy permanent representative to the United Nations, said Monday that China urges the parties concerned to remain calm and exercise restraint, clarify facts and dispel doubts through dialogue and communication, avoid misunderstanding and misjudgment, and prevent the situation from expanding or escalating.

Hungarian PM Viktor Orban warns EU on verge of slow

Budapest, Sept 24 (UNI) : Hungarian Prime Minister Viktor Orban in yet another jab at the European Union, warned that the body was in the throes of a slow and inevitable collapse if it fails to embrace radical change.

Commenting on the EU's fragility and frictions within member states, he cautioned that unless the body refuses to act now, it will wane, and collapse much like the Roman Empire.Addressing parliament in Budapest, he said "I do not see in the European union the capacity for renewal we need. If the EU does not urgently make a sharp turn, its history will come to an end," reports RIA Novosti.

Orban stressed that this disintegration would be marked by a gradual erosion, as more and more member states will move to abandon Brussels' directives, whom he called akin to "bad GPS

navigator," due to what he alleged was its aimless wondering, continuous recalculation of every decision leading to greater indecision, and no ultimate destination.He cited Brussels' move of sanctions, its immigration policies, and focus on green transition as being emblematic of this failure, accusing its objectives of beingrootedmore in idealism than any kind of realism.

Drawing comparisons to the Roman Empire again, he said it was similar to how the ancient regime "long believed that it continued to exist in its former territories, although in fact it had long ceased to exist."

He praised Budapest's direction and his government's actions, stating that in comparison to the weakening EU states – specifically in the West - it had by contrast gained strength and knowledge, enough to develop at a

pace matching that of the US and the rise of Asia.

"I see the US and Asia moving forward alongside us. And I see Hungary's ability... to develop faster. Its pace of development matches that of the US and Asia, not the EU."

The Hungarian premier has repeatedly claimed that the bloc's current economic direction is unsustainable, warning that "its days are numbered." However, despite his contentions with the bloc, he ruled out exiting it, though claimed that the EU would collapse under its own weight unless sweeping reforms occur within two to three years.He argued that the only way to prevent Europe from "falling apart before our eyes" would be for the liberal establishment in Brussels to be replaced by governments grounded in patriotism, even calling for political "purges" similar to those in Washington.

Iran rebuilding missile production facilities crippled by Israeli offence in June, as per satellite imagery

Tehran, Sept 24 (UNI) : Satellite images show that Iran is back on course for rebuilding its missile production facilities destroyed during its 12-day war with Israel in June, though analysts say the programme remains crippled by the absence of a crucial component: the planetary mixers used to manufacture solid fuel, reports Times of Israel.

These large machines, with blades rotating around a central axis like orbiting

planets, provide the uniform mixture necessary for solid propellants, and as such are essential for Tehran's mission to rebuild its missile capabilities, which can't happen without the mixers.

For Tehran, restoring its missile capability is urgent, particularly as the war in June decimated its air defence systems, damaged military infrastructure, and has derailed its nuclear programme for some time - leaving missiles among the

few tools of deterrence it still possesses.Post the ceasefire, Iranian officials stated that they are more than convinced another war with Israel is only a matter of time, making the acquisition of mixers a priority, calling any peace temporary.With no capacity to build them domestically amid inadequacies in infrastructure – damaged further by the war - Iran is expected to turn to China, where it has previously sourced missile fuel

ingredients and other sensitive equipment.

The effort comes at a moment of acute vulnerability, as the E-3 nations had appealed to the UN for triggering the snapback mechanism, under which all international sanctions placed on Iran prior to the 2015 nuclear deal would be automatically restored.

The UK, France and Germany had threatened Iran several times that sanctions would be

Typhoon leaves 14 dead, 18 injured in Taiwan

Taipei, Sept. 24 (UNI) : Typhoon Ragasa left 14 dead and 18 injured in Taiwan as of 6 a.m. on Wednesday, said local authorities.

About 100 people remain trapped awaiting rescue, according to the island's emergency operation center.The typhoon's outer circulation continues to batter Taiwan's eastern, northern and southern coastal areas, bringing heavy rainfall. On Tuesday afternoon, a dam at a barrier lake in Hualien County overflowed, triggering flooding.

Russian Air Defence systems down 70 Ukrainian drones overnight: Defence Ministry

Moscow, Sept 24 (UNI) : Russian air defence systems destroyed 70 Ukrainian drones over five Russian regions and the Black Sea overnight, the Russian Defence Ministry said on Wednesday. "During the past night, from 23:00 Moscow time [20:00 GMT] to 07:00 Moscow time, 70 Ukrainian unmanned aerial vehicles were destroyed and intercepted by air defence systems on duty over the territories of the Belgorod, Kursk, Rostov, Volgograd regions, the Republic of Crimea and over the Black Sea," the ministry said in a statement.

POTUS affirms full support to Israel

New York, Sept 24 (UNI) : Meeting at the UN with French President Emmanuel Macron, US President Donald Trump affirmed his full support to Israel, telling reporters "I'm on the side of Israel. I've been on the side of Israel, really, my whole life, and we're going to get a solution, and it's going to be a solution that's good for everybody."

Macron, whose nation led the current wave of Palestinian recognition, told the POTUS that if he wanted to truly win the Nobel Peace Prize, he could do so only upon ending the IDF campaign in Gaza, as per Times of Israel.He made his comments at the onset of his meeting with leaders of the Muslim world, stating that all the parties will "see if we can do something about" ending the war in Gaza.Trump linked the effort to free the hostages seized during Hamas' 7 October 2023 assault, saying "We want to stop that. We want to get our hostages back, or their hostages back."Commenting on Paris' move to recognise Palestinian sovereignty, he echoed his statement from the UNGA, aligning with the Israeli position and said "I think it honours Hamas and you can't do that because of October 7. You just can't do that."

Macron replied that "nobody forgets the 7th of October," but asked, "after almost two years of war, what is the result?"

While he gave his support to Israel's targeting of Hamas leadership, and argued that Jerusalem's move for their elimination was indeed a "great achievement," there has been little reduction in the number of terrorists in the war-torn enclave.He added "you have as many Hamas fighters as you had the first day. So, it doesn't work to dismantle Hamas. This is not the right way to proceed. So, we need a full-fledged process."

reimposed, unless it fully resumes cooperation with the IAEA, which it had suspended after the war, and has even now only partially resumed, before formally appealing to the UN. While Iran had rubbished the threats, stating that Europe had no legal leverage to trigger the sanctions, the UN greenlit the E-3 request for snapback sanctions, and as such urged to resume full compliance with the 2015 nuclear deal.

Medal rounds to commence on today

New Delhi, Sept 24 (UNI) :The first medals of the ISSF Junior World Cup New Delhi 2025, will be decided on Thursday with the 50m Rifle Prone event for both men and women, set to start proceedings at the Dr. Karni Singh Shooting Range here.

The Olympic events will start on Friday, September 26, with the 10m Air pistol finals scheduled. A total of 208 shooters from 18 countries will be participating in 18 events, 15 Olympic and three Non-Olympic events, with a total of 54 medals to be earned.

India will field 10 athletes, five each in both the junior men’s and women’s categories for the 50m Rifle Prone event, a non-Olympic event which has 21 athletes in fray for the medals.

The Indian challenge will be spearheaded by Asian Championship bronze medallist Vedant Nitin Waghmare and 50m Rifle 3 Positions (3P) gold medalist in Shymkent, Anushka H. Thokur.

The other athletes in

the men’s section are Rohit Kanyan, Kushagra Singh Rajawat, Deependra Singh Shekhawat and Kunal Sharma while Nimrat Kaur Brar, Saniya Sapale, Aadhya Agrawal and Anshika will be in action in the women’s category.

The host nation, India, will lead the field with a strong contingent of 69 athletes, while other participating nations include the United States of America (20), Italy (10), Czechia (9), Islamic Republic of Iran (8), Croatia (7), Great Britain (6), United Arab Emirates (5), Slovakia (5), Qatar (4), Oman (4), Spain (8), Finland (3), Netherlands (3), Cyprus (3), New Zealand (2), Kingdom of Saudi Arabia (2), along with 40 Individual Neutral Athletes (AIN).

This will be the second and final World Cup for Juniors this year, following the first event hosted in Suhl, Germany, earlier this year in May, where India finished on top of the medals table with 11 medals, including 3 gold, 4 silver, and 4 bronze.

World Championship medal winning skaters felicitated by Sports Minister Mandaviya



New Delhi, Sept 24 (IANS) : Union Minister of Youth Affairs & Sports and Labour & Employment, Dr. Mansukh Mandaviya, on Wednesday honoured India’s medal-winning team from the recently-concluded 73rd Inline Speed Skating World Championships 2025 held in Beidaihe, China, from September 13 to 21.

Marking a watershed moment for Indian skating, the national team achieved its best-ever performance, securing five medals (three gold, two bronze) and placing 5th among more than 40 nations.

A series of firsts marked this historic outing: India’s first senior medal at a Speed Skating World Championship, its first gold in the junior category, and

the highest medal tally India has ever achieved at the Worlds.

These historic medals at the World Championships show that our youth are conquering new frontiers, be it in mainstream or emerging sports. I wholeheartedly congratulate our athletes, coaches, support staff, and the Roller-Skating Federation of India for bringing glory to Bharat with this remarkable performance,” Dr. Mandaviya said while felicitating the skaters.

At the championships, the 22-year-old Anandkumar Velkumar made history by becoming the first Indian to win a senior medal, claiming two gold medals. His first gold came in the 1000m sprint

event, while he secured his next in the 42,195 km marathon. Additionally, he added a bronze medal to his collection after finishing third in the 500m Sprint.

While 18-year-old Krish Sharma won India’s first-ever junior gold in the 1000m Sprint event, Anish Raj, 17, bagged a bronze in the Junior Men’s One Lap Sprint.

In all, 20 Indian athletes participated in the 73rd Inline Speed Skating World Championships 2025. The contingent included four senior men, four senior women, five junior men, and seven junior women competing in a championship with 42 events, covering both senior and junior categories, and featuring over 40 participating countries.

Prasidh Krishna injured in India-A match

Lucknow, Sept 24 (UNI) India A fast bowler Prasidh Krishna sustained a head injury during the second match against Australia A today, and was subsequently replaced by Yash Thakur as a concussion substitute for the remainder of the match.

The incident occurred on the second day of the contest, raising concerns ahead of the upcoming Test series against West Indies.

Krishna was struck on the helmet by Australia A pacer Henry Thornton in the 39th over of India A’s innings while attempting to pull a bouncer.Following the blow, Krishna underwent the mandatory concussion assessment and initially continued his innings. However, after the 42nd over, he walked back to the dressing room and was replaced at the crease by Mohammed Siraj.

As India A’s innings progressed, Gurnoor Brar came in at No. 11 after Siraj’s dismissal. When Sai Sudharsan was dismissed, Yash Thakur was introduced as the last man, officially replacing Krishna in the playing XI under concussion substitute rules.

India A were bowled out for 194 in the first innings, trailing Australia A’s imposing total of 420. At stumps on the second day, Australia A were 16 for 3 in their second innings, maintaining a strong position in the match.

The severity of Krishna’s injury has not yet been confirmed. India’s selectors are scheduled to meet today to finalise the Test squad for the upcoming two-match series against West Indies, starting October 2.

Krishna is among the contenders for the pace department, along with Jasprit Bumrah, Siraj, and Akash Deep. These bowlers had formed the core of India’s pace attack during the five-Test tour of England earlier this year, where Krishna claimed 14 wickets in three matches at an average of 37.07.

The current India A-Australia A series marks Krishna’s first competitive outing since the conclusion of the England tour in the first week of August. He was wicketless in the first game, conceding 90 runs in 21 overs, and had taken 1 for 76 in 17 overs in the first innings of the ongoing second match.

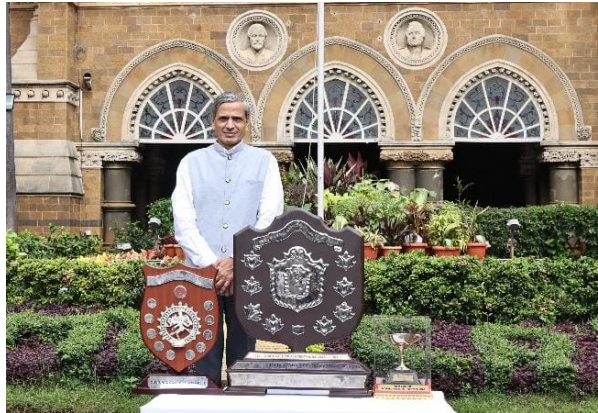

local bodies would be increased from 20 percent to 30 percent if Grand Alliance was voted to power in upcoming state assembly elections", Gandhi said adding that Nitish Kumar government, in last twenty years of regime, had done nothing for EBCs in Bihar. His party was committed to demolish the wall of 50 percent reservation limit to ensure its benefits to more people belonging to backward and deprived, he added.

National Workshop on Capacity Building for Working Urdu Journalists

Dr. Fazil Hussain Pervez, Editor-in-Chief, Urdu Weekly Gawah, Hyderabad, spoke on the Prospects for Urdu Media in the second session of the workshop. He reflected on the growing digital

footprint of Urdu, the rise of online mushairas, the importance of comparative perspectives on education and development, and the role of technology in enriching Urdu journalism.
Mr. M.A. Majid, Senior Journalist from Hyderabad addressed the third session on the theme of Health, Education & Development Reporting in Urdu Media.
