#### CPI(M) state committee member Com. Subhash **Jadhav** passes away

Kolhapur, Sept 28 (UNI): Communist Party of India (Marxist) leader Prof. Com Subhash Atmaram Jadhav passed away this morning following a severe heart attack. He was 65 years old.Mr. Jadhav was admitted to a private hospital after suffering the heart attack but tragically passed away before receiving medical treatment.A senior member of the state CPI-M and secretary of the district CPI-M committee, Jadhav was widely recognized as a prominent labour leader and an expert on sugarcane cultivation.

He actively championed the rights of sugarcane workers. serving as the state secretary of CITU and heading the state sugarcane cutter and transport labour union.

Additionally, he was a member of the Sindhudurg district Asha workers union, advocating for worker welfare across sectors. His passing has left a deep void in the labour and political community. with leaders and party members mourning the loss of a committed activist.

#### **Tiger kills** woman in **Gondia** while asleep

## Sanjay Raut slams govt



## Naxalism to end by March 2026 as govt has adopted unified approach: Shah

New Delhi, Sept 28 (UNI): Union Home Minister Amit Shah today reiterated that India will be free from Naxalism by March 31, 2026 as the Modi government instead of a scattered approach, has adopted a unified and ruthless approach.

Addressing valedictory session of 'Bharat Manthan-2025: Naxal Mukt Bharat - Ending Red Terror Under Modi's Leadership' here, Shah added that the policy of the government is to roll out the red carpet and welcome those who wish to surrender by laying down their arms. But if anyone takes up arms to kill innocent tribals, the government's duty is to protect the innocent tribals and to confront the armed Naxalites, a Home Ministry statement said.

Shah said that for the first time, the Government of India adopted a clear policy without any confusion. The state police and central security forces were given freedom, and a practical bridge was built between the Government of India and the state governments for coordination intelligence, information sharing and operations.

Stating that strict control was imposed on the supply of arms and ammunition of Naxalites, Shah said, "After 2019, we have succeeded in blocking more than 90 per cent of their supply. The NIA and the ED have tightened the noose around those who finance the Naxalites, and that we have also fought against urban Naxal support, their legal aid networks, and the crafting of media narratives. We took targeted action against members of the central committee, and more than 18 central committee members have been neutralized from August 19

to this date". The Home Minister said the security vacuum has also been filled, and targeted operations such as Operation Octopus and Operation Double Bull were carried out. He added that joint training of the DRG, STF, CRPF and COBRA units has also been initiated. The four now carry out operations together and their chain of command is now clear.

Shah said, "We do not want to kill anyone. Compared to the 290 Naxalites neutralized, 1,090 were arrested, and 881 surrendered. This reflects government's approach. Every effort is made to give Naxalites the opportunity to surrender or be arrested. However, when Naxalites take up arms and set out to kill innocent Indian citizens, security forces have no choice but to respond with force".

Adding that in 2025, so far, 270 Naxalites have been neutralized, 680 arrested, 1,225 have surrendered, he said the number of surrenders and arrests exceeds the number of those neutralized. The high number of surrenders indicates that the time left for Naxalites is now very limited.He said that after 2019, emphasis was also placed on capacity building of states. Under the SRE SIS schemes, approximately Rs 3,331 crore was released, reflecting a 55 percent increase. Through this, fortified police stations were expanded, with around Rs 1,741 crore spent on them. He stated that over the last six years, the Modi government established 336 new CAPF camps to address the security vacuum.As a result, compared to the period of 2004–14, the period of

2014-24 saw a 73 percent

reduction in security

personnel deaths and a 74

percent reduction in civilian

deaths. Shah said that earlier, success was elusive in Chhattisgarh due to the opposition government there. However, in 2024, after our government came to power, the highest number of Naxalites— 290—were neutralized in a single year.

He said that Naxalites had established a large camp at Karregutaa Hills on Telangana-Chhattisgarh border, which housed a significant stockpile of weapons, two years' worth of rations, and factories for manufacturing weapons and IEDs, and was extremely difficult to access. On May 23, this camp was destroyed in Operation Black Forest, and 27 hardcore Naxalites were killed. Furthermore, 24 hardcore Naxalites were killed in Bijapur. Through operation, the backbone of the remaining Naxalites in Chhattisgarh was broken.

Shah dismissed the notion that the root cause of Left-Wing Extremism is lack of development and termed it as misleading. He said, "Prime Minister Modi has launched numerous schemes for 60 crore poor people, but in Naxalaffected areas, who prevents these schemes from reaching the people? He asked, if schools have not reached Sukma or Bijapur, who is responsible? Why have roads not been built in Left-Wing dominated areas? Because the Naxalites killed contractors".

Shah asked why don't intellectuals who write lengthy articles advising the government write about the victimized tribals? Why is their empathy selective? He said that neither the supporters of the Naxalites want the development of the tribals, nor do they genuinely care for them. Instead, they are only concerned with keeping

alive their ideology, which has been rejected across the world. Shah stated that sole reason development has not reached these areas is the Leftist ideology.

He said that during Operation Black Forest, Leftist political parties wrote letters pleading to the campaign, "exposing their true face". He said that there will be no ceasefire with the Naxalites. If they want to surrender, there is no need for a ceasefire - they should simply lay down their arms. The police will not fire a single shot and will reintegrate them. As soon as Operation Black Forest began, all the covert sympathies of the Naxalites' supporters were exposed.

He stated that to curb the financial resources of Naxalites, the NIA, ED and state governments have seized properties worth crores of rupees. The Home Minister remarked that wherever Leftist ideology has taken root globally, it has had an inseparable link with violence, and this is the root of Naxalism.

He said that the fight against Naxalism will not end until Indian society understands those who provide ideological, legal, and financial support to Naxalism. He emphasized that internal security and the protection of the nation's borders have always been a core part of government's ideology. "Three key objectives

have been central to our party's mission: internal and external security of the country, cultural nationalism, and the revival of all aspects of Indian culture," he said.He also paid his respects to all those who sacrificed their lives, lost their loved ones, and endured physical and mental hardships due to Left-wing violence since

Dehradun, Sept 28 (UNI): A day after former Uttarakhand chief minister Trivendra Singh Rawat extended support for a CBI probe demand into the subordinate services exam question paper leak, his successor Pushkar Singh Dhami today said he was not averse to it if needed. Dhami alleged that some people were trying to do politics in the guise of protests by the students and unemployed youth.

"We are not averse to the idea of CBI probe in UKSSSC paper leak matter. If need be my government will not shy away from CBI investigation for we want to take every decision in the interest of the students. I will keep working for justice to the students till I am alive," said the Uttarakhand Chief Minister at the BJP state headquarters while answering a question.

Dhami however added "A SIT probe has already been instituted. Let there be some progress in this direction as even the higher agency will like to know the extent of investigation done by the state."

Without naming anyone the chief minister alleged "some people were trying to derive political mileage from the ongoing protests by the students as they failed in their conventional politics." Dhami had made similar allegations in the starting of the protests claiming that there was a move to create public unrest in the state and against his government.

It's notable that his predecessor and Haridwar Lok Sabha MP Trivendra Singh Rawat had yesterday extended his support for a CBI probe in the paper leak matter and demanded that the chief minister must assure the students of the same. Rawat had said "There is no harm in a CBI probe. I think the chief minister must assure the students of ordering a CBI probe if they are demanding it. There shouldn't be any probem in a higher agency probe in light of the extent of anger among students across the state."

CM Dhami further said "Many people have tried to mislead the students and unemployed youths protesting against the paper leak in the Uttarakhand Subordinate Services Selection Commission examination on September 21. They tried to abuse Sanatan as well. They must understand that more than 100 persons who worked for cheating and paper leak mafia were sent behind bars by us and no guilty persons will be spared in the present investigation as well."Dhami informed that the SIT probe will also reveal how the question paper was leaked only to one person from a particular centre. "Probe will also dig out the past records of the main accused and the chronology of his becoming a candidate for UKSSSC examination," said chief minister.

Dhami who was there to express his views on Atmnirbhar Bharat (self reliant India) said the country is moving ahead steadfastly towards self reliance in almost every field from making a needle to manufacturing defence weapons needed by the Indian armed forces.

## Rain intensity falls in Mumbai, Red Alert lifted but advisory remains Pune Univ to launch

Mumbai, Sept 28 (UNI) : Mumbai is set to experience moderate showers with isolated thunderstorms and gusty winds tommorow, following a weekend of exceptionally heavy rainfall that caused widespread waterlogging and transport disruptions, according to the India Meteorological Department(IMD).

The weather system is weakening as a lowpressure area moves inland and dissipates, prompting the IMD to lift the red alert issued for Mumbai and adjoining districts of Thane, Palghar, Raigad, Ratnagiri and Sindhudurg. The city

recorded 120.8 mm of rainfall at Colaba and 83.8 mm at Santacruz in the 24 hours ending at 0830 IST today.

Residents witnessed

clear skies today morning, though intermittent moderate rain is anticipated throughout the day, accompanied by thunder and lightning, particularly in south Mumbai, with wind gusts reaching 40–50 km per hour. Temperatures are likely to hover around 27 degrees Celsius, offering slight respite from the weekend's downpour. The monsoon withdrawal has been delayed this year, so while rain intensity will decline, occasional

showers may persist into early October.

Waterlogging affected more than 30 low lying areas today morning, including Dadar, Andheri and Santa Cruz, but receding water levels in major subways such as Andheri and Kurla helped restore traffic flow on arterial roads by midafternoon. Local train services on Western and Central lines, which faced delays of up to 20 minutes due to water on the tracks, are expected to run normally tomorrow morning. BEST buses continued to operate without diversions, though commuters are urged to allow extra travel

time owing to wet roads and intermittent downpours. Harbour Line and Trans-Harbour services resumed full schedules after tracks were cleared of debris and

The Maharashtra State Road Transport Corporation reported no major disruptions on intercity routes but advised drivers to reduce speed on waterlogged stretches and avoid sudden braking. High tide conditions compounded flood risk over the weekend, with September 28 seeing high tides of 3.24 metres at 1455 hours and 3.42 metres at 0330 hours, slowing drainage

from coastal roads. With spring tides expected again tomorrow afternoon, the Brihanmumbai **Municipal Corporation** has deployed additional pumps at critical junctions in Malabar Hill and Worli to expedite water discharge into the sea.

cleared suspended particulates, with the Central Pollution Control Board's real-time AQI index showing a drop from poor to moderate levels and PM2.5 concentrations falling below 100 micrograms per cubic metre in most suburbs. Experts caution that accumulating dampness could promote mould and damp-air pollutants, urging ventilation in offices and homes. Reservoir levels supplying drinking water to Mumbai have risen to 99.5 per cent of capacity after the weekend downpour, securing adequate supply through the coming fortnight, and the BMC has announced that water cuts planned during drier months will remain suspended until at least October 15.

Amravati/Nagpur, Sept 28 (UNI): Kamaltai Gavai, mother of Chief Justice of India(CJI) B. R. Gavai, has categorically denied reports that she will attend the Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh's (RSS) Vijayadashami celebrations in Amravati.

In a statement issued today, Kamaltai Gavai labelled the circulating reports as "completely false" and a "conspiracy" attributed to the RSS. "I have not accepted any invitation nor given written consent to attend the programme. I will not be present at the Vijayadashami event of the RSS in Amravati," she said, adding that associating her with the event is "misleading and untrue."

Kamaltai emphasised that her family remains firmly committed to Ambedkarite ideology and constitutional values. She urged the public, particularly Ambedkarite followers, not to fall prey to what RSS said and described as "false propaganda".

Reflecting on the symbolism of October 5, the planned date of the RSS centenary Vijayadashami in Amravati, Kamaltai noted that while Vijayadashami may hold cultural importance for many, her community accords greater significance to Dhammachakra Pravartan Din, which commemorates Emperor Ashoka's conversion to Buddhism.

She extended greetings to the public on that occasion, reaffirming her family's alignment with social justice and principles enunciated by Dr. B. R. Ambedkar.

## Travel

#### Panchgani

Deriving its name from the surrounding five hills that envelop it, Panchgani offers a window to the past. Located just about 38 metres below Mahabaleshwar, at an altitude of 1334 metres, the approach to this beautiful hill station is replete with lovely views of the Krishna River to one side, and the plains on the other. A quintessentially residential area, it exudes a charm that harks to a time gone by. Whether in the old colonial architecture, the Parsi homes, and century-old boarding lodges. The best vantage point to take in the world below can be found at Table Land, a flat mountain peak overlooking the plains. To mix things up, head to the local bazaar where business moves along at an unhurried pace, setting a leisurely tone for your time spent here.

#### Keechakadara

As accounted in the Mahabharata, this is the place where Bheema killed Keechaka, the villain and threw him into the valley below. Taking its name from the incident, Keechakadara is also often referred to as Chikhaldara. Aside from its mythological roots, there's more to this beautiful hill station. Situated at an altitude of 1118 metres in the Vidarbha region, this is the only hill resort in the area, and has the added attraction of being the only coffeegrowing area in Maharashtra. This is even a great place for wild life enthusiasts to do some spotting as panthers, bears, sambar, wild boar, and wild dogs thrive here and it is neighboured by the famous Melghat Tiger Project which has 82 tigers. Hurricane Point, Prospect Point, and Devi Point are all great vantage points to take in the views, and this is also a good starting point for excursions to Gavilgad and Narnala Fort.

## 5 hill stations in Maharashtra to get away to

Through the length of its state, Maharashtra encompasses a landscape ranging from the steeply rising Western Ghats, all the way down to the seashore of the Arabian Sea. Cradled within is carpeted green mountain walls, are the most stupping hill stations, each with a charm that's all their own. Take a break from the frenzied pace of the city and get away to these oases of calm.

Bhandardara, with its soaring mountain ranges, plunging waterfalls and carpet of green, attracts tourists all through the year. For a short hour-long journey, this hill station offers city dwellers a drastically contrasting landscape and stunning surroundings. Bright green paddy fields and clear blue skies punctuated with a labyrinth of gurgling streams, provide all the essential ingredients for a weekend away from the madding crowds. There's enough to keep you busy through the days. Built in 1910, Wilson Dam stands 150metres-high and has a beautiful garden at the base. of Wilson Dam there is a garden endowed with thick greenery, streams and gigantic trees, the silently serene Arthur lake which mirrors the beauty of its surroundings in its blue waters, Mount Kalsubai, which is Maharashtra's highest peak at 1646 metres and draws in serious trekkers to its summit, the Agasti Risha Ashram which has been mentioned in the Ramayan and the ancient Ratangad Fort which offers panoramic views from its ramparts.

#### Matheran

Discovered back in 1850 by Hugh Malet, collector for the Thane district, Matheran sits atop the Sahyadris Mountain range and is another hot weekend getaway for city slickers. This gorgeous and quaint hill station is best accessed via the slow-moving toy train which chugs along over a leisurely two-hour-long journey from the valley below. Sprawled across a lush green, undulating hilltop, Matheran sits at a height of about 800 metres with drastic, steep cliffs offering the most stunning views of the plains below. Make your way up to Hart Point at night, and take in the dreamy, twinkling lights of Mumbai far below, meander through the winding ways and feast your eyes on the British-Parsi architecture of the local homes, walk up to Charlotte Lake, and do a spot of shopping in the market where you'll find lots of leather goodies, hats and ofcourse the famous sweet-sticky chikki best eaten hot and fresh.

#### Mahabaleshwar

Translating to mean 'God of Great Power' in Sanskrit, Mahabaleshwar is a favourite hill destination with Maharashtrians. Once the summer capital of the Bombay Presidency during the British Raj, it offers visitors a perfect blend of modernity with old-world charm. Aside from being abound with natural beauty, there's lots you can do here to keep entertained. All parts of the hill station are accessible by car, so getting around is no problem, and if you're feeling adventurous, just climb onto a horse and get going. Make your way to Malcolm Peth, the bazaar at the heart of Mahabaleshwar, which has a good mix of hotels, shops and restaurants. Visit Mount Malcolm which was built in 1829 and once served as the Governor's residence, Moraji Castle which was home to Mahatma Gandhi back in 1945, and wind down at the Mahabaleshwar Club in the evening over drinks. During the day you can take the short drive up to Venna Lake and go boating or fishing, and proceed a little further down to Panchgani, and walk through the strawberry



Earlier this month, a complaint was lodged by the minor's father that she had been lured away.



#### Internally displaced teenager commits suicide in Manipur

Imphal, Sept 28 (UNI) A thirteen-year-old boy was found dead by hanging at Jiribam Higher Secondary School relief camp in Jiribam of Imphal today.

The boy, a Meitei who fled attack from another community, had been living in a relief camp for more than two years. His house was completely burnt down.Over 60000 people displaced by the conflict, began which Churachandpur district on May 3, 2023, are still languishing in relief camps in pathetic conditions. Over a hundred persons Moreh Churachandpur have died due to unnatural deaths like shock, anxiety and depression. Most of the relief camps have seen large numbers of deaths by suicide.

Keisam Pradipkumar, Chairperson of the Manipur Commission for Protection of Child Rights (MCPCR), expressed concern over the large number of suicide cases among teenagers in relief camps and other cases. He said last July a 13 -year-old displaced boy died by committing suicide at a school hostel and in August, a 15-year-old boy was found hanging, and a girl committed suicide after a case of harassment was reported. According to a person living in a relief camp in Imphal East, the news of the deaths of any displaced persons sent shockwaves among all the displaced persons as they live in pitiable conditions.

## **Union MoS Tokhan** Sahu reviews urban development projects in Arunachal

Earlier this year, Central Railway had become the first Zonal Railway to award the tenders for provision of KAVACH on its entire Rail Network of approximately 4000 Route Kilometres, spreading over five divisions (Mumbai, Bhusawal, Nagpur, Pune and Solapur),"

In addition, this system provides protection against Signal Passing at Danger (SPAD), by automatically applying breaks if the loco pilot fails to reduce the speed while approaching a Red signal.

It has other features like onboard display of signal aspect/speed limit/ movement authority, autowhistling at level crossing gates, controlling speed of trains at locations with speed restrictions, SOS feature etc.

Indian Railways is implementing KAVACH in Mission Mode as part of its commitment to enhanced safety and automation.

The Railway Board has sanctioned provision of KAVACH in 730 locomotives of Central Railway in the first phase and fitment work is progressing across Central Railway's loco sheds, ensuring that all locomotives will eventually be equipped with this advanced safety system.
