4 die in diesel can explosion in Nashik

Nashik, Oct 14 (UNI) Four members of a family who were injured in a diesel can explosion in Satpur's Mahadev Wadi area on October 8 succumbed to their injuries while undergoing treatment at a hospital in Mumbai yesterday.

The deceased have been identified as Sonali Gadekar (35), Durga Akash Dobade (22), Kailas Chhagan Dobade (57), and Pankaj Kailas Dobade (33).

The incident occurred when around six members of the same family were watching workers cut a tree branch using a machine. Diesel was being used to operate the cutter, and a diesel can had been kept by the roadside.

A four-wheeler passing through the area accidentally overturned the can, causing diesel to spill near the Borade family's house. At the same time, a person nearby was smoking a cigarette, which ignited the spilled diesel, leading to an explosion. Six people sustained serious burn injuries.

Police and the fire brigade responded to the scene, and the injured were initially admitted to Nashik Civil Hospital.

They were later shifted to a hospital in Mumbai for advanced treatment. Unfortunately, four of them died during the course of treatment yesterday.

Bombay HC mandates compensation for pothole-related deaths

The Bombay High Court has issued a landmark ruling BMC, MHADA, MSRDC, establishing a uniform and CIDCO.In its detailed compensation framework for accidents caused by poorly maintained roads and roads is a constitutional potholes across Maharashtra.

The court directed that families of victims who die due to pothole-related accidents will receive Rs 6 lakh, while those who sustain injuries will be entitled to compensation ranging from Rs 50,000 to Rs 2.5 lakh, depending on the severity of the injuries.

The ruling was delivered by a division bench of clarified Justices Revati Mohite Dere and Sandesh Patil while hearing a suo motu public interest litigation (PIL) concerning the growing number of pothole-related fatalities and injuries in Mumbai and other parts of the state. The PIL originated from a 2013 letter written by former Justice G.S. Patel, which highlighted the alarming deterioration of Mumbai's road infrastructure and the frequent loss of lives due to

civic negligenc The bench expressed serious concern that despite ongoing judicial oversight since 2015, the condition of roads continues to worsen annually during the reinforces monsoon season, exposing accountability in civic

reflected negligence by authorities across Maharashtra.

Mumbai, Oct 13 (UNI): responsible for road maintenance, including the order, the court declared that ensuring safe and motorable obligation of the government and municipal agencies under Article 21 of the Constitution, guarantees the right to life. Govt approves Rs 500 crore for Dr Ambedkar's **Educational Society**

Mumbai, Oct 14 (UNI) In a historic step towards educational empowerment and heritage preservation, the Maharashtra government has sanctioned Rs 500 crore for the development of The People's Education Society, representing the largest-ever investment in institutions founded by Dr Babasaheb Ambedkar.

The five-year scheme, approved by the state cabinet, aims to renovate, conserve, and modernise nine educational institutions and two hostels located in Mumbai and Chhatrapati Sambhajinagar.

The initiative is designed to upgrade essential infrastructure while preserving the historical and ideological significance of these learning centres, originally founded by the architect of the Indian Constitution.

Established on July 8, 1945, The People's Education Society operates on five guiding principles including knowledge, compassion, democracy, equality, and justice. It currently manages 12 colleges across Maharashtra and Karnataka, including six affiliated with the University of Mumbai, five with Dr Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University, and one with Savitribai Phule Pune University.

The cabinet-approved programme will address longpending infrastructure deficiencies, with several aging buildings requiring structural repair and technological advancement. The plan includes modernisation of classrooms, laboratories, libraries, and digital infrastructure, alongside enhanced hostel facilities to better serve students from Buddhist, Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribe, and Other Backward Class communities. The overall initiative will directly benefit over one lakh students across the society's network of colleges.

Among the prominent institutions operated by the society are Siddharth College of Arts, Science and Commerce, Dr Ambedkar College of Law in Mumbai, and several engineering and polytechnic institutes across the state. The Rs 500 crore allocation will be released in phased installments over five years, ensuring continuous progress and accountability in implementation.

Tharoor questions India's low-level representation at crucial **Gaza Peace summit**

New Delhi, Oct 14 (UNI) Congress leader Shashi Tharoor has raised concern over the government's decision to send a junior minister to the Gaza Peace Summit in Egypt, where over 20 heads of state, including US President Donald Trump, are meeting to seek an end to the Israel-Hamas conflict.

"India's presence at the Sharm el-Sheikh Gaza peace summit, represented only by a Minister of State, sharply contrasts with the heavyweight leaders attending. Is this strategic restraint or a missed diplomatic opportunity?" Tharoor questioned yesterday in a post on X.

Clarifying his stance, Tharoor stressed that his critique was not aimed at Minister of State for External Affairs Kirti Vardhan Singh's capabilities but rather at the message India's level of representation sends.

"With so many global leaders present, India's choice may signal an undesired strategic distance, which doesn't align with our public statements," he noted.

Tharoor also voiced concerns about the diminished influence India might face at the summit, particularly on critical discussions around reconstruction and regional stability. "Simply due to protocol and access, India's voice risks carrying less weight than it deserves," he said.

Delhi Police seize 725 kg banned firecrackers in two raids; two arrested

New Delhi, Oct 14 (UNI) Delhi Police seized 725 kg of banned firecrackers during two separate operations in Dwarka and Najafgarh and arrested two individuals for illegal stockpiling, an official said today.

Acting on a tip-off, a team raided a house in Uttam Nagar and arrested Gaurav Gupta, recovering 77 kg of firecrackers from his residence, the officer said.

Gupta, who previously sold firecrackers under a valid license until 2022, continued the trade despite the ban on the sale and use of prohibited fireworks, police said.

In a separate raid, the team arrested Rajeev Kumar (52), a resident of Najafgarh, and seized 648 kg of illegal firecrackers stored at a storage unit in Shyam Vihar. The police said the firecrackers were stored under the cover of a carton storage unit in a densely populated area, posing a significant risk to public safety. An officer added that further investigation is ongoing to trace the supply chain and identify other individuals involved.

South Asian University student sexually assaulted, police begin probe

New Delhi, Oct 14 (UNI) Delhi Police today registered an FIR in the alleged sexual assault of a student of South Asian University (SAU) in the city, an official said.

"A PCR call about the alleged assault was reported around 3 pm in Maidan Garhi police station on Monday, after which a team of officers reached the university campus," said Ankit Chauhan, Deputy Commissioner of Police (South).

The DCP said the call was made by someone known to the victim, who reported that she was missing and later was found injured in the premises, adding in his statement further that she was currently being counseled.

"Taking into account the victim's statement, we have registered an FIR under various sections. The investigation is being conducted with the sensitivity and priority," the officer noted.

While the student's formal statement is yet to be recorded, counseling is ongoing, officials noted. An FIR has been filed, and the matter is being examined, according to police.

The charges filed include attempted gang rape, sexual assault, and other related offenses. The identities of the accused have not been disclosed, as the investigation remains at a sensitive stage.



Following his initiation, Dr Ambedkar administered Deeksha to nearly five lakh followers who had gathered at Deekshabhoomi. He also led them in taking 22 vows, principles he had personally drafted ,which rejected caste-based discrimination and renounced Hindu rituals that perpetuated social hierarchy.

These vows, now engraved on a black stone monument at Deekshabhoomi, stand as lasting symbols of his reformist vision.

While some affirm commitment to Buddhist teachings, others explicitly reject the worship of Hindu deities such as Brahma, Vishnu, Mahesh, Ram, Krishna,

> Gauri and Ganapati and prohibit Brahmins from performing

religious rituals. Ambedkar's conversion was not merely a change of faith, it was a revolutionary assertion of human dignity

and equality.

His decision continues to inspire millions across India to this day, reaffirming the enduring power of his message against caste injustice.

Top Maoist leader surrenders in Gadchiroli with 60 other Maoists

Top Maoist leader, 70-yearold Mallojula Venugopal Rao, who has a bounty of more than Rs 10 crore on his head, is reported to have surrendered today along with 60 other Maoists, somewhere in the forests of Gadchiroli district of Maharashtra. However, the Maharashtra Home Affairs Department headed by Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis has not issued any official statement yet about the reported surrender.

So far, only the Gadchiroli police made an informal statement to a section of the media about the reported surrender of the top CPI (Maoist) politburo member, who is also known by his aliases "Sonu" and "Bhupathi".

The major development is yet to be officially confirmed by the Maharashtra police or the home ministry, which is headed by CM Fadnavis.

"Please wait for an official statement which will be issued in due course," is all that a Maharashtra home ministry official said, without giving any details about its time or date.

However, according to the police, Mallojula Venugopal Rao and the 60 Maoists who surrendered along with him in Gadchiroli are presently under police protection. They have been assured of their safety under the government's surrender and rehabilitation scheme, the police stated. Police sources who spoke on Dandakaranya Special

Mumbai, Oct 14 (UNI) condition of anonymity said that the reason behind not issuing an official statement on the Maoist leader's reported surrender could be because he is scheduled to "officially lay down arms and surrender" on Thursday, October 16, in front of Maharashtra Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis.

> According to a police official who was formerly posted in Gadchiroli's Anti-Naxal squad, CPI (Maoist) leader's wife Vimala Chandra Sidam alias Tarakka had surrendered herself before Maharashtra Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis in Gadchiroli along with ten senior Maoists on January 1, 2025. "It is likely that an official statement could be issued only after CPI (Maoist) politburo member Mallojula Venugopal Rao formally lays down arms before Maharashtra CM Devendra Fadnavis himself on October 16. This was how Rao's wife Vimala Chandra Sidam surrendered as well. Of course, Rao must be already in the police net," the police official said. It may be recalled that on January 1, 2025, Maoist leader Mallojula Venugopal Rao's 62-year-old wife Vimala Chandra Sidam alias Tarakka, had formally surrendered in front of Maharashtra CM Fadnavis. Vimala was inducted into the Maoist movement as a local squad member in 1986 and had risen up the ranks over 38 years to become a

Zonal Committee member, participating in 35 encounters against security personnel.

At the time of surrender,

Mallojula Venugopal Rao's wife Vimala had carried Rs 25-lakh reward on her head. She turned herself in before Maharashtra Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis in Gadchiroli along with ten senior Maoists, on January 1, 2025.Maoist leader Mallojula Venugopal alias Bhupathi alias Sonu, who reportedly surrendered to the Gadchiroli police on Tuesday, was active in the Maoist insurgency for a long time and held posts in the Maoist party's politburo, which is its highest policy making body, as well as the party's central committee.

Reportedly, Venugopal surrendered to the Gadchiroli police along with 60 of his colleagues on the outskirts of the forest. Venugopal has a bounty of more than Rs 10 crore on his head in various states. According to the

the police said. police, Mallojula Venugopal Rao alias "Bhupathi" is considered an influential strategist of the Maoist insurgent organisation. He used to work as a platoon guide on the Maharashtra-Chhattisgarh border for several years. However, differences had grown between him and the top leadership of the Maoist party in the last few months. various recent statements, Venugopal had admitted that the armed appealed for a ceasefire. In these statements, Venugopal Rao had stated that since the mass following of the Maoist party had declined and hundreds of Maoists had died in police encounters, dialogue was the only option left.

Yet, Venugopal Rao's

stance was opposed by some Maoist leaders who took the stand that the armed struggle must continue under the leadership of the Maoist party's general secretary Thippari Tirupati alias "Devuji". Later, the Maoist party central committee exerted pressure on Venugopal and ordered him to lay down his arms. After development, Venugopal announced that he had resigned from the party and finally surrendered to the Gadchiroli police along with 50 of his Maoist colleagues, police sources said.According to the police, the surrender policy of the Maharashtra state government has weakened the Maoist party. In the last two decades, more than 700 Maoists surrendered in Gadchiroli district, which has been a hotbed of Maoism, and the surrender of a senior Maoist leader like Mallojula Venugopal Rao is expected to weaken the Maoist party further.

Police sources stated that the future of the 50year-old Maoist insurgency is extremely bleak and even remaining Maoists yet to surrender will be neutralised soon.

According to police, Ishwarlal was found dead in his hostel room on October 1, having reportedly died by hanging.

Officers recovered a two-page purported suicide note addressed to the Prime Minister and Agriculture Minister, in which he made serious allegations against a woman named Gunjan, accusing her blackmailing him and inflicting severe mental torture.

In the note, Ishwarlal claimed that Gunjan had been extorting money from him and pressuring him to marry her, even though she knew he was already married.

He further stated that she had threatened to take legal action if he failed to comply with her demands.

Expressing despair, he wrote that certain laws were being misused, saying, "In India, the law is the same for everyone and it should be. But girls are misusing it. Those who wronged me must face justice. I still have faith in the judiciary."

In an emotional message to his friends, Ishwarlal appealed to them to look after his parents, writing, "Those whom I helped should now support my parents and make sure they don't feel my absence."

In another part of the note, he wrote, "Don't post sad status after my death.



More than 1 in 3 people worldwide live with brain disorders, 11 million die annually

One in three people worldwide is living with conditions that affect their brain, while 11 million lives are lost every year due to neurological disorders, according to a new report by the World Health Organization (WHO).

Stroke, neonatal encephalopathy, migraine, Alzheimer's disease and other dementias, diabetic neuropathy, meningitis, idiopathic epilepsy, neurological complications linked to preterm birth, autism spectrum disorders, and cancers of the nervous system were identified as the top 10 neurological conditions contributing to death and disability.

The report stated that while these neurological conditions now affect more than 40 per cent of the global population, less than one in three countries around the world has a national policy to address the growing burden of neurological disorders.

Alarmingly, low-income countries have more than 80 times fewer neurologists compared to high-income nations despite the high burden of these diseases.

Many low- and middle-income countries also lack national plans, budgets, and workforce.

"With more than 1 in 3 people in the world living with conditions affecting their brain, we must do all we can to improve the health care they need," said Dr Jeremy Farrar, WHO Assistant Director-General, Division of Health Promotion, Disease Prevention and

"Many of these neurological conditions can be prevented or effectively treated, yet services remain out of reach for most especially in rural and underserved areas – where people too often face stigma, social exclusion, and financial hardship. We must work together to ensure we put patients and their families first and that brain health is prioritised and properly invested in," Farrar said.

The report, based on data from 102 countries, showed that 63 countries have a national policy addressing neurological disorders, but only 34 reported having dedicated funding to address them.

Without strong policy frameworks, health systems remain fragmented, underresourced, and ill-equipped to meet the needs of patients and families.

Further, essential services were also found out of reach for most people, with only 49 countries including neurological disorders in their universal health coverage benefit packages.

Critical services such as stroke units, pediatric neurology, rehabilitation, and palliative care are frequently lacking or concentrated in urban areas, leaving rural and underserved populations without access to lifesaving and lifesustaining care.

The WHO has urged governments to make neurological disorders a policy priority through bold leadership and sustained investment; expand access to neurological care through universal health coverage and health system strengthening.

Union Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw Inaugurates Sonik Integrated Logistics Hub and Flags Off Two New Door-to-Door Freight and Parcel Services

'Door-to-door Services are Essential for the Country, As they Will Enhance Efficiency and Significantly Reduce Logistics Costs'

Mr Ashwini Vaishnaw, Union Minister for Railways, Information & Broadcasting, Electronics & Information Technology, virtually inaugurated the Sonik Integrated Logistics Hub and flagged off two new Door-to-Door Freight and Parcel Services today.

The Union Minister said that door-to-door services are essential for the country, as they will enhance efficiency and significantly reduce logistics costs. He highlighted that industries can now send a specific number of containers without the need to fill an entire rake to their destination. Shri Vaishnaw added that the logistical gap between factories and the loading/unloading points of trains will now be bridged by Indian Railways through comprehensive door-to-door services. He further said that goods sheds or logistics terminals will be equipped with facilities for stuffing and destuffing containers, allowing customers to fully benefit from the new service model. The Union Minister mentioned that Sonik has become the first integrated logistics hub offering this facility. Under the Gati Shakti Cargo Terminals initiative, 115 terminals have been developed to provide multimodal services, delivering substantial benefits to customers.

Starting with the Mumbai-Kolkata corridor, more services will soon be operational to ensure the smooth movement of goods and expand connectivity to more cities. The Minister added that another experiment has also successful transporting equipment such as tractors at affordable rates to benefit farmers. Bhubaneswar, Oct 14 (UNI) Odisha Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi today announced that the state's second Regional Plant Resource Centre (RPRC) will be established at Sanaghagara in Keonjhar district.

The proposed centre, a brainchild of the Chief Minister, will be developed over approximately 134 acres and will focus on biodiversity conservation, eco-tourism, research, and education. It will serve as a community hub promoting environmental awareness and nature-based learning.

Visitors will experience a variety of natural and thematic gardens showcasing orchids native to Odisha, as well as roses, bamboo, cactus, and wild fruits, adding to the area's scenic beauty. Majhi reviewed the project plans during a meeting with officials of the Forest, Environment, and Climate Change Department and the Keonjhar District Administration at the Lok Seva Bhavan. He directed that the centre remain open to tourists and the public yearround, transforming Sanaghagara into a major tourism destination. Given the region's frequent elephant movements, the Chief Minister instructed officials to adopt preventive measures such as constructing deep trenches to reduce human-elephant conflicts. He also emphasized maintaining a steady water flow in the Machkandana River, which passes through the project area, to preserve ecological balance. The proposed centre will feature an Orchid Conservation and Display Unit, Lotus Garden, Wild Edible Fruit Garden, Fern Garden, Medicinal Plant Garden, Flower Market, and a children's play area. All structures will use locally sourced stone and wood. The project is expected to be completed by 2027, officials said.

In a pulsating encounter that swung both ways, India fought back from a two-goal deficit to take the lead, only for Pakistan to strike late and ensure the points were shared. The result also means that India are still undefeated in the tournament.

For India, Araijeet Singh Hundal (43'), Sourabh Anand Kushwaha (47'), Manmeet Singh (53') netted goals, while for Pakistan, Hannan Shahid (5') and Sufyan Khan (39', 55') were on the scoresheet.

The Indian colts made a bright start, dominating possession and making several early circle penetrations that kept Pakistan on the back foot. Their early pressure earned them a penalty

corner in just the third minute, but the opportunity went begging.

Against the run of play, Pakistan hit back through a quick counterattack and earned a penalty stroke soon after. Captain Hannan Shahid (5') made no mistake, slotting the ball low to the goalkeeper's right to give his team an early lead. Buoyed by the breakthrough, Pakistan began to find their rhythm, stringing together quick passes and launching a few threatening raids into the Indian circle. They came close again through a penalty corner in the 10th minute but failed to extend their advantage.

India, meanwhile, continued to press hard for the equaliser, testing Pakistan's defence with pace and precision and even came close to scoring on multiple occasions but couldn't as the opening quarter ended 1–0 in Pakistan's favour.Pakistan began the second quarter on the front foot, launching an early attack that earned them another penalty corner.

However, the Indian defence stood tall, denying them any chance to extend their lead. Moments later, India faced a setback when Anmol Ekka was shown a yellow card for a sliding tackle in the 20th minute, forcing the team to play a man short for the remaining 10 minutes of the second quarter. Despite the numerical disadvantage, the Indian colts displayed admirable discipline and composure. They not only kept Pakistan from capitalising on the situation but also continued to test their opponents' defence with quick transitions and clever passing. Yet, the equaliser remained elusive, as Pakistan maintained their slender 1-0 lead going into half-time.

Determined to fight their way back into the contest, India began the third quarter with renewed intent, focusing on maintaining possession and building patient attacks.

Germany, France, Belgium stay on course for World Cup qualification

Berlin, Oct 14 (UNI) Nick Woltemade scored his first international goal as Germany maintained their push toward the 2026 FIFA World Cup with 1-0 away victory over Northern Ireland.

The hosts entered the match full of confidence after their win over Slovakia, but coach Michael O'Neill was forced to make one change as Conor Bradley missed out through suspension on Monday

Germany coach Julian Nagelsmann kept faith with the same lineup from the 4-0 triumph over Luxembourg.

Northern Ireland started brightly and thought they had taken an early lead when Paddy McNair bundled the ball over the line, only for VAR to rule it out for offside.

Germany gradually found their rhythm, and after Aleksandar Pavlovic tested the goalkeeper from distance, opened the scoring in the 31st minute when Woltemade headed in David Raum corner.

After the break, Germany came close to doubling its advantage as Serge Gnabry's solo run ended with shot that went wide. The hosts refused to surrender and created several dangerous moments, while goalkeeper Oliver Baumann twice denied efforts from Shea Charles and Ethan Galbraith.In the dying minutes, substitute Callum Marshall nearly snatched an equalizer, but Baumann's reflexes preserved the clean sheet.

The result keeps Germany top of Group A, level on points with Slovakia but ahead on goal difference. Nagelsmann's side will next travel to Luxembourg before hosting Slovakia in Leipzig next month.

"It wasn't our most beautiful performance. The setpiece goal was coming, we have been working hard on those in training and got our reward. [Karim] Adeyemi should have made it 2-0, but today the three points were what mattered most, and we got them," said Nagelsmann.

In the group's other game, Slovakia claimed 2-0 victory over bottom side Luxembourg.France was held to 2-2 draw in Iceland in Group D, missing the chance to secure direct qualification to the World Cup. Ukraine edged Azerbaijan 2-1, three points adrift of leaders France.In Group J, Kevin De Bruyne converted two penalties as Belgium beat Wales 4-2, keeping the Red Devils on track to qualify as Wales faces playoff battle. North Macedonia drew 1-1 with Kazakhstan, sitting second behind Belgium.Meanwhile in Group B, Kosovo stunned Sweden 1-0, and Switzerland drew 0-0 with Slovenia to remain unbeaten.

Chinese Taipei's Shu-Yu Wen fought back from a game down to beat 12-15, 15-7, 15-8 in 34 minutes.BWF Khunying president Patama Leeswadtrakul also visited the National Centre

with the Badminton Association of India officials and watched some exciting matches on Tuesday.In the boys' singles category, 11th seed Rounak Chouhan defeated Sri Lanka's Thisath Rupathunga 15-3, 15-6, 15th seed Suryaksh Rawat beat Yigitcan Erol of Turkiye 15-5, 15-8 while Lalthazuala Hmar got the better of Rylan Tan of USA 15-11, 15-5. A few hours later, Gnana Dattu TT joined his teammates in the round of 32, beating Brazil's Joaquim Mendonca 15-10, 15-13.

In the next round, Gnana Dattu will face Suryaksh for a place in the prequarterfinals. Highlighting a journey that spanned nearly five decades, Ramesh paid tribute to Ambedkar's deep and enduring engagement with Buddhist philosophy, which culminated in a bold

"Dr. Ambedkar's fascination with the life of the Buddha was almost half a century old, but it was only in 1950 that he began speaking regularly about his conversion in public forums," Ramesh shared in a heartfelt post on X.

The landmark day, October 14, 1956, saw Dr Ambedkar and his wife Savita Ambedkar formally initiated into Buddhism by

Burmese monk Bhikku Chandiramani in Nagpur. The event, held at Deekshabhumi — a site that has since become a symbol of social and spiritual emancipation witnessed Dr Ambedkar administering revolutionary oaths to nearly half a million followers.

These oaths were a solemn pledge to reject caste discrimination and

embrace the egalitarian ideals of Buddhism. Deekshabhumi

remains etched in history as the place where Ambedkar's vision of social justice took a spiritual form, inspiring generations to challenge deep-rooted inequalities.

Jairam Ramesh also highlighted Ambedkar's seminal work Buddhism, published posthumously in January 1957, which continues to illuminate his profound understanding of the religion's principles.

In addition, Ramesh drew attention to Ashok Gopal's biography, A Part Apart: The Life and Thought of BRAmbedkar, which offers fresh perspectives on this epochal event.

The choice of Nagpur as the site for the mass

conversion was accident, thanks largely to the efforts of Wamanrao Godbole, whose role in this historic decision is often overlooked.

As India reflects on this anniversary, the legacy of Dr. Ambedkar's embrace of Buddhism serves as a powerful reminder of the quest for equality, dignity, and human rights — a journey that continues to inspire the nation today.
