Total number of 7.42 crores voters after SIR in Bihar

Patna, Sept 30 (UNI) : The Election Commission today released the final voters list of 7.42 crore electorate after Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls in Bihar before upcoming state assembly elections.

Election Commission sources said here that 7.42 crore voters were listed as eligible electorate in electoral rolls released after SIR, which had started on June 24 this year. The total number of voters was 7.89 crore on June 24 when SIR of electoral roll was initiated, sources added.

"In the draft electoral roll released after the first phase of SIR on August one, the total number of voters was 7.24 crore which witnessed removal of 65 lakhs names ", sources said adding that names of 3.66 lakh ineligible voters were removed from draft electoral roll. A total of 21.53 eligible voters were added in draft electoral rolls, which increased the figure from 7.24 crore voters of draft electoral votes to 7.42 crore in the final voters list.

Flood situation remains grim, several villages surrounded by flood water

Vijayawada, Sep 30 (UNI) : The flood situation of the rivers Krishna and Godavari remains grim and NDRF and SDRF teams were deployed to the affected areas.

As heavy inflow continues in the river Godavari, road connectivity to over 40 villages was cut off today.

Several causeways and roads were submerged in the Godavari flood water at various places. Villagers were seen using motorboats and boats to come out of the villages.

The NDRF and SDRF teams were deployed to food affected areas in Combined West Godavari, East Godavari and Krishna district to carry out relief operations. Aggravating the flood situation of Godavari, the tributaries Shabari and Pranahita are also in spate.

AP Disaster Management director Prakhar Jain said that the Prakasam barrage here across the Krishna river is receiving 6,69,188 cusecs of water and the same is being released to the downstream and danger signal two was issued at the barrage. He said that the inflow would increase to seven lakh cusecs by midnight.

The water level at the Polavaram project stood at 32.900 metres at the upstream and 24.500 metres at the downstream.

All the crest gates of the Polavaram project across the Godavari river were lifted to release 10,50,735 cusecs of water to the downstream Dowleswaram project.

Several villages including Dacharam, Bestagudem, Nimalipet Mcharam, Mutyalampadu in Kukkunuru mandal in Eluru district were surrounded by the Godavari flood water cut off from the outer world.

Official sources said that 16 villages including Rudramkota, Repakagomu, Tatkurugommu, Tirumalapuram, Narlavram, Yadavalli, Katkuru, Kasaram, Koida, Tokupalli, Kenkundukotta, Chigurumamidi, Kotturu and Gollapalli in Velerupadu mandal were surrounded by the Godavari flood water.

The Dowleswaram project is receiving 11,03,802 cusecs of water and the same is being discharged downstream into the sea. The inflow would increase to 12.20 lakh cusecs in the next one days, officials said.

Several island villages in Repalle mandal in Bapatla district were surrounded by the Krishna flood water and most of them were shifted to the relief camps. Eluru district Collector K Vetri Selvi reviewed the Godavari flood situation with the officials today.

She directed the officials to keep ready boats and expert swimmers to shift people from the low-lying areas. The pregnant women, elderly people and those who are suffering from comorbidities should be shifted to safer places on priority basis, she told the officials.

All needed steps should be taken to avoid loss of life and property due to floods, she instructed the officials

Lioness at zoo gives birth to two cubs

(Standard Post Bureau) Visakhapatnam, Sept 30 : A lioness gave birth to two cubs in the Indira Gandhi Zoological Park here on Tuesday.

Currently, both the cubs and mother are under the supervision of a veterinary team, G Mangamma, Curator, IGZP, told the media.

The successful birth of these cubs at IGZP reflects the Zoo's ongoing commitment to wildlife conservation, scientific management, and care, she said.

The birth of these cubs holds special significance as they belong to the Asiatic Lion (Panthera leo persica), a species that is listed as Endangered on the IUCN Red List under Schedule I of the Wildlife Protection Act, 1972. Once widespread across Asia and the Middle East, today the Asiatic lion survives only in the wild in and around the Gir National Park, Gujarat, India, she added.

Compared to their African relatives, Asiatic lions are slightly smaller in size, with a distinctive skin fold running along their belly. They are known for their majestic presence and are an important symbol of India's natural heritage.

Conservation breeding programs in zoological parks play a vital role in creating a healthy backup population of this rare species, supporting national and global efforts to secure their future, G Mangamma, Curator, IGZP, explained.

Annappasadam distributed to over 9.28 lakh devotees during Garuda seva day in Tirumala : Dy EO

AP CM, Naidu invites global investors to Visakhapatnam CII Partnership Summit

New Delhi, Sep 30 (UNI) : Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu, inviting global industry leaders to the CII Partnership Summit to be held in Visakhapatnam on November 14 and 15, today stated that the state is endowed with unique advantages, including a long coastline, an investment-friendly atmosphere with pro-industry policies, and a technologically skilled youth force.

Speaking as the chief guest at the curtain-raiser of the 30th CII Partnership Summit in Visakhapatnam held here this evening, the Chief Minister said he is hosting the summit for the seventh time.

Praising Prime Minister Narendra Modi as the right leader at the right time, he said India is experiencing rapid industrial growth.

Naidu asserted that with the vision of achieving a USD 2.4 million economy in Andhra Pradesh, the government has unveiled Swamandhra Vision 2047. As part of this plan, leveraging the 1,000 km-long coastline, ports or harbours will be developed at every 50 kilometres. "Priority areas include logistics, deep technology, product perfection, Space City, Electronics, Drones, and Aerospace hubs. A Quantum Valley will also be developed in Amaravati, where a quantum computer will begin functioning by January 2026, with full-scale production set to start within two years," the Chief Minister highlighted.

The Chief Minister maintained that PM Modi has set a target of 500 GW in the renewable energy sector, while Andhra Pradesh has fixed its goal at 160 GW, adding the state, with its strong agricultural and aqua base, plans to establish advanced food processing units on a large scale. 1 BGP Dispensary and 19 Urban Health Centers are functioning under Bhiwandi Municipal Corporation

Bhiwandi, Sept 30 : Currently, 01 BGP Dispensary and 19 Urban Health Centers are functioning under the Medical Health Department of the Municipal Corporation from 09.00 AM to 05.00 PM (excluding weekly/public holidays). BGP Dispensary, Bazar, Mandai, Bhiwandi. are functioning here and outpatient examination and treatment is being done at these places and the Urban Health Centers of the Municipal Corporation are 1) Examination of pregnant mothers 2) Regular vaccination of pregnant mothers and young children 3) Daily OPD 4) Implementation of Pradhan Mantri Surakshith Matritva Yojana 5) Implementation of Janani Suraksha Yojana 6) Implementation of Family Planning Scheme 7) Surveillance and treatment of patients with infectious diseases 8) Malaria survey and preventive measures as well as medication 9) First aid for infectious and non-communicable diseases 10) Implementation of Pulse Polio Scheme and other national programs etc. The works are being done at the Urban Health Centers of the Municipal Corporation. Also, out of the 39 UHCs approved by the government under the National Urban Health Mission, 19 centers are functioning in various parts of the Municipal Corporation and outpatient examination and treatment are being provided at these places. Similarly, under the 15th Finance Commission, 10 Hindu Hriday Samrat Balasaheb Thackeray dispensaries are functioning in various parts of the Municipal Corporation under the jurisdiction of Bhiwandi Nizampur City Municipal Corporation under the government level and outpatient examination and treatment are being provided at these places.

Similarly, under the Bombay Nursing Home

Registration Act 1949, private hospitals/maternity homes within the jurisdiction of the Municipal Corporation are being registered at the Municipal level under the Maharashtra Nursing Home Registration (Amended) Rules-2021. In July, 2025, punitive action has been taken against 04 people under the said Act as they were found to be illegally delivering babies without registering with the Municipal Corporation. Also, a review committee has been formed at the municipal level as per the government directives to take action against bogus doctors practicing medicine illegally, and the Municipal Commissioner, Chairman and Municipal Medical Health Officer are working as members in this committee. Under the control of this review committee, the medical officers of 1 to 19 urban health centers are searching for bogus doctors practicing medicine illegally within the municipal jurisdiction or as per the complaints received, and a case is being registered against them as bogus doctors at the relevant police station under Sections 33, 36 of the Maharashtra Medical Practitioners Act 1961 and Section 318 (4) of the Indian Penal Code. A total of 74 bogus doctors, including 01 in July 2025 and 03 in September 2025, have been registered with the help of the police. However, it is a challenge to the citizens that as many citizens as possible should take advantage of the health services of the Municipal Corporation and should pass this message on to other citizens/friends/relatives. Also, citizens should not take any kind of medicine from people who are doing medical business illegally and if it is found that they are doing medical business illegally and running a hospital without registering with the Municipal Corporation, they should file a complaint with the Municipal Corporation.

Bihar to Receive the Gift of 3 New Amrit Bharat Trains and 4 Passenger Trains

Mumbai, Sept 30 : Bihar is set to receive another major boost in the field of modern rail connectivity. Union Minister for Railways, Information & Broadcasting, and Electronics & Information Technology Ashwini Vaishnaw and Bihar Deputy Chief Minister Samrat Choudhary will dedicate seven trains to the state from Patna Junction, which include three Amrit Bharat Express trains. Union Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw will join the program via video conferencing.

The Amrit Bharat Express, which has gained a distinct identity as a popular train among the middle class and common people, currently operates 12 services across the country, of which 10 run from Bihar. With the launch of three more Amrit Bharat Express trains, the total will

rise to 15, out of which 13 will operate from Bihar. This is a major gift from the Centre to the people of Bihar. The Railway Minister and Deputy CM will inaugurate three Amrit Bharat Express trains – from Muzaffarpur to Charlapalli (near Hyderabad), from Darbhanga to Madar Junction (near Ajmer), and from Chhapra to Anand Vihar Terminal (Delhi).

The Muzaffarpur–Charlapalli Amrit Bharat Express will be the first Amrit Bharat train from Muzaffarpur to South India, while the Chhapra–Anand Vihar Amrit Bharat Express will become the sixth Amrit Bharat train from Bihar to Delhi.

This state-of-the-art indigenous train will provide passengers with a fast, safe, and comfortable travel experience. These trains will strengthen

Bihar's connectivity with different parts of the country, particularly North and South India. Their operations will boost economic activities in the state and create new opportunities in tourism, trade, and employment.

Developed by Indian Railways, the Amrit Bharat Express has become a symbol of modernization in the country's railway system. The train is not just a fast and affordable travel option, but it also comes equipped with advanced features such as semi-automatic couplers, fire detection systems, sealed gangways, and talk-back units. For the first time, advanced technology has been introduced in non-AC coaches as well for passenger safety.

Previously, Bihar had 10 Amrit Bharat trains operational. With the launch of these three new

trains, the state's connectivity will further improve. This marks an important step towards realizing the vision of "Viksit Bihar Se Viksit Bharat" (Developed India through a Developed Bihar).

Brief Details of Amrit Bharat Express Trains:

1. Train No. 15293/15294 Muzaffarpur–Charlapalli–Muzaffarpur Amrit Bharat Express (Weekly):

This express will run via Hajipur, Patliputra, Ara, Buxar, Pt. Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Junction, Prayagraj Chheoki, Jabalpur, Itarsi, Nagpur, and Kazipet.

2. Train No. 19623/19624 Madar–Darbhanga–Madar Amrit Bharat Express (Weekly):

This express will run via Kamtaul, Sitamarhi, Raxaul, Narkatiaganj, Gorakhpur, Gomti Nagar, Kanpur, Tundla, and Jaipur.

3. Train No. 15133/15134 Chhapra–Anand Vihar–

Urvashi Rautela joins ED's probe in Bet app case

New Delhi, Sept 30 (UNI) : Actress Urvashi Rautela today joined the investigation in a money laundering case linked to the illegal banned betting app '1XBet'.

Earlier, Bollywood actor Sonu Sood, former Indian Cricketer Yuvraj Singh and web series 'Gandi Baat' actress Anveshi Jain recorded their statements.

According to ED sources, these celebrities were utilized in promotional campaigns for 1xBet, which significantly helped the illegal platform build a substantial user base in India despite its prohibition.

The agency also issued a statement expressing concern about a new threat emerging from the recent ban on regulated money gaming apps. It warned of a potential rise in illegal betting platforms targeting users in India and emphasized the need for focused strategies to counter this challenge.

Officials provided staggering figures to illustrate the scale of the problem, noting that in the first quarter of this year alone, illegal betting websites received more than one billion hits. The total value of unregulated gambling activity is estimated to be approximately USD 100 billion.

This recent action is part of a wider crackdown, with the ED having already recorded statements from several other personalities. Bengali actor Ankush Hazra was questioned recently, while actress Urvashi Rautela has not yet complied with the probe.

Since June, the investigation has also involved former cricketers Suresh Raina and Shikhar Dhawan, as well as numerous actors from the Tollywood film industry, concerning their alleged endorsements of illegal gaming apps. Investigators highlighted that a common tactic used by these platforms is to disguise gambling activities as "skill-based games" to evade legal restrictions. They clarified that the outcomes are predominantly based on chance rather than actual skill, and that fantasy games involving monetary stakes operate with rigged algorithms.

Chhapra Amrit Bharat Express (Twice Weekly):

This express will run via Siwan, Thawe, Kaptanganj, Gorakhpur, Basti, Gonda, Aishbagh (Lucknow), and Kanpur.

Keeping in mind the needs of the common public in rail services, Union Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw and Deputy CM Samrat Choudhary will also flag off four passenger trains. The trains will run on the following routes:

Patna–Buxar, Jhajha–Danapur, Patna–Islampur, and Nawada–Patna via Sheikhpura–Barbigha. The commencement of passenger train services on the Sheikhpura–Barbigha–Bihar Sharif route from Nawada to Patna will fulfill the long-pending dream of people in the Barbigha–Asthawan–Bihar Sharif region, especially after the successful CRS inspection of this section. UP Govt is merely conducting aerial surveys and making superficial appearances: Akhilesh

Lucknow, Sept 30 (UNI) : Samajwadi Party National President Akhilesh Yadav has leveled serious allegations against the Yogi Adityanath government regarding the increasing attacks by wild animals and wolves in Uttar Pradesh.

He said that the government is merely conducting aerial surveys and making superficial appearances, while no concrete steps have been taken on the ground to prevent the continuous deaths of farmers and villagers.

Referring to the death of a farmer couple in Bahraich on Monday due

to a wolf attack, Akhilesh Yadav said that villagers of the state are living in an atmosphere of fear and terror. He said, "If the government had spent so much money on wolf tourism on the ground, the wolves would have been caught and lives would have been saved."

The SP president alleged that people across the state are suffering from wild animals, from wolves, leopards, pythons, and stray bulls. Farmers are afraid to go to their fields, and farming is being ruined. He said the BJP government is shrugging off the problem and often

claims, "No animal footprints were found."

Akhilesh Yadav blamed illegal felling of trees and destruction of forest areas for human-wildlife conflict. He said that when animals face a food and shelter crisis, they will enter human settlements, leading to conflicts that often prove fatal. He demanded assistance for the families of the deceased and concrete steps to protect villagers from wild animals. He also claimed that "the BJP government is in its final stages, and after 2027, the public will automatically be free from these problems."

Punjab CM meets Home Minister, seeks funds for flood relief efforts

New Delhi, Sept 30 (UNI) : Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann today met Home Minister Amit Shah and apprised him of the extent of damage in the State caused by floods during the Monsoon season. He also demanded additional funds for the state for disaster relief and restoration, a Home Ministry statement said.

During the meeting the Chief Minister was apprised that in the State Disaster Response Fund (SDRF), Punjab has sufficient funds to the tune of Rs 12,589.59 crore, which can be utilised for the relief and immediate restoration to the affected people as per Government of India norms.

The Home Minister said the Central Government has provided all possible

assistance from central agencies to the state administration, in search, rescue and immediate restoration during the recent floods in the State.

Shah said Modi government is standing shoulder-to-shoulder with the people of Punjab and is committed to providing all possible help to flood affected people of the state.

On September 9, Prime Minister Narendra Modi had visited Punjab and reviewed the flood situation and damages caused in state. Out of the financial assistance of Rs 1,600 crore announced by the Prime Minister, Rs 805 crore (including Rs 170 crore under sanction by NHAI) has already been released to the State Government and intended beneficiaries under various

schemes. The rest will be released on receipt of relevant information from the State.

An Inter-Ministerial Central Team (IMCT) was constituted on September one without waiting for the receipt of memorandum from the State of Punjab. The team visited the affected areas for an on-the-spot assessment of damages in the State from September 3-6. However, the State Government is yet to submit a detailed memorandum. After receipt of the memorandum, the same will be considered by the Central Government as per the Government of India approved norms.

Besides this, the state can prepare a recovery and reconstruction plan for restoration of livelihood and damaged infrastructure.

Delhi BJP leaders mourn Prof Vijay Malhotra

New Delhi, Sept 30 (UNI) : Delhi BJP leaders have expressed deep sorrow over the demise of veteran party leader Professor Vijay Kumar Malhotra, while state unit chief Virendra Sachdeva has said that Malhotra was not only the founding president of party's Delhi unit, but also a mentor to

party workers since the days of Jan Sangh.

Sachdeva said as a public representative, Malhotra dedicated a significant part of his life to the development of the national capital, and made an invaluable contribution to the growth of sports in the country.

The Delhi BJP chief said initiatives such as launching a shelter scheme for slum dwellers and the urban poor, or building Delhi's first flyover, are the testimony to his legacy as a true architect of development.

Delhi BJP general secretary (organization) Pawan Rana said Malhotra's life was one of struggle, service, and dedication.

His influence extended beyond Delhi, and the BJP workers from across the country, including from Himachal Pradesh, continue to draw inspiration from Malhotra's disciplined life.

Union Minister of State Harsh Malhotra stated that Malhotra was one of the most senior leaders in Indian politics, a founding member of the Bharatiya Jana Sangh, and the first president of Delhi BJP, and he lived his life fully committed to the principle of "Nation First."

He played a significant role in strengthening India's parliamentary democracy,

and his entire life was dedicated to the nation and society, the union minister added.

Andhra Pradesh conveyed that several aerospace corridors are being developed, with multiple siting options available to match Airbus program needs, vendor clustering, logistics access, and expansion pathways.

Shirish Chandra Murmu, currently serving as Executive Director, has been elevated to the post of Deputy Governor for the period of three years.

The statement said "Government of India, vide its notification dated today and in exercise of powers conferred by clause (a) of sub-section (1) of section 8 of the Reserve Bank of India Act 1934, read with sub-section (4) of section 8 thereof, has appointed Shri Shirish Chandra Murmu, Executive Director as Deputy Governor of Reserve Bank of India for a period of three years from the date of joining the post on or after October 09, 2025 or until further orders, whichever is earlier."

Murmu will replace M Rajeshwar Rao, whose extended tenure will be completed on October 8.

Couple killed as firecrackers explode

Amalapuram, Sept 30 (UNI) A couple was killed and two others were injured when firecrackers exploded at Vilasa village of Ainavilli mandal in Konaseema district on Tuesday.

P Gannavaram Circle Inspector Bhimaraju said the deceased couple, Kancharla Srinivas (55) and his wife Sita Mahalakshmi (50), were making firecrackers at the backyard of their house to supply to the traders for the Diwali festival. The firecrackers exploded suddenly, killing the couple.

The walls of the house collapsed under the impact of the explosion. Konaseema district Superintendent of police Rahul Meena visited the place of accident. The police registered a case and shifted the bodies to the GGH for postmortem.

Cyclonic circulation over Bay of Bengal, low pressure likely to form by Oct 1

Amaravati, Sept 30 (UNI) The upper air cyclonic circulation over north coastal Andhra Pradesh and its neighbourhood has now shifted to the west-central Bay of Bengal, off the north Andhra coast, between 3.1 km and 7.6 km above mean sea level, tilting southwards with height.

According to the Meteorological Centre here today, an upper air cyclonic circulation is likely to emerge over the north Andaman Sea today (September 30). Under its influence, a low-pressure area is expected to form over central parts of the Bay of Bengal around October one.

It is likely to move west-northwestwards and intensify into a depression over the west-central and adjoining northwest Bay of Bengal around October two. The system is expected to continue moving west-northwestwards and cross the south Odisha–north Andhra Pradesh coasts on the morning of October three.

The southwest monsoon has remained weak over Coastal Andhra Pradesh and Yanam, while it has been normal over Rayalaseema.

Under the system’s influence, heavy rainfall is likely at isolated places in Coastal Andhra Pradesh and Yanam over the next three days, and in Rayalaseema during the next 24 hours.

Light to moderate rain or thundershowers are also expected at a few places across Coastal Andhra Pradesh, Yanam, and Rayalaseema during the next seven days. T h u n d e r s t o r m s accompanied by lightning and gusty winds of 40–50 kmph are likely at isolated places in these regions over the next five days.

In the past 24 hours, heavy rainfall occurred in Parvathipuram Manyam district of Coastal Andhra Pradesh, while several other parts of Coastal Andhra Pradesh, Yanam, and Rayalaseema also recorded rain

CM meets Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman, seeks funds

New Delhi, Sept 30 (UNI) : Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu on Tuesday, visited the national capital and held a meeting with union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman. During the meeting, he submitted a detailed representation requesting the Centre to extend financial support to the state under the Purvodaya Scheme.

The Chief Minister highlighted that the Purvodaya Scheme, initiated by the Centre for the holistic development of eastern states, has already identified Bihar, Jharkhand, West Bengal, Odisha, and Andhra

Pradesh as key beneficiaries.

The scheme primarily aims to unlock the economic potential of eastern regions by promoting agriculture, industry, and infrastructure growth, thereby bridging regional disparities and boosting inclusive development.

Stressing the need for balanced growth, Chief Minister Chandrababu explained that the state government has prepared comprehensive plans to utilize the scheme’s funds effectively for regional progress.

Outlining his vision, the Chief Minister

informed Finance Minister Sitharaman that the state government aims to promote horticulture in Rayalaseema, expand coffee plantations, cashew and coconut farms in North Andhra, and strengthen aquaculture activities in coastal Andhra.

He asserted that targeted funding for these projects under Purvodaya would not only improve productivity but also generate employment and enhance income levels in rural areas.

Naidu specifically underlined that the scheme’s implementation would play a

transformative role in uplifting backward regions such as North Andhra and Rayalaseema, which have historically lagged in terms of industrial and economic development.Apart from his meeting with the Finance Minister, the Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister is also scheduled to participate in the CII’s curtain-raiser partnership summit, where he is expected to outline investment opportunities in the state and invite investors to participate in the CII grand summit slated to be held in November in Visakhapatnam.

Silence on Almatti project height proves Naidu’s betrayal: YSRCP

Vijayawada, Sept 30 (UNI) :YSRCP state general secretary SV Satish Reddy slammed the Chandrababu Naidu-led Andhra Pradesh government for neglecting Andhra Pradesh’s vital interests while resorting to diversionary politics and personal attacks in the Assembly.

He expressed concern over Chandrababu’s silence on Karnataka’s plans to raise the height of Almatti Dam, warning that it would deprive Andhra Pradesh of 100 TMCs of Krishna water, paralyze irrigation and drinking supply, intensify

drought in Rayalaseema, and halt inflows to Srisaillam and Nagarjuna Sagar.“As a coalition partner at the Centre, Chandrababu must stop this. His failure is nothing but a curse on the state,” Satish said.

The YSRCP leader warned that ignoring people’s problems will invite backlash. “Almatti is about survival. If the government fails, YSRCP will fight at the Centre to protect Andhra Pradesh’s rights,” he declared.

He noted that the Assembly has been

reduced to targeting YS Jagan Mohan Reddy instead of addressing real issues. Farmers are dumping crops for a lack of support price, pensioners have not received new pensions, and critical issues like the Visakhapatnam Steel Plant privatization are ignored.

“Delhi trips brought no benefit. Even promises like the Durga-Srisaillam seaplane remain hollow,” he said. Calling Chandrababu Naidu the architect of character assassination politics, Satish cited the Balakrishna-Chiranjeevi

episode, questioning why Balakrishna has not apologized and why Lokesh remains silent while the yellow media defends him.

He condemned the illegal arrests of social media activists, misuse of power, and shielding of leaders, reminding that courts had censured the government in the liquor case bail hearings. On the former Minister and Assembly Speaker Kodela Shiva Prasad suicide issue, Satish said it was falsely politicized, noting the Assembly only moved court over unreturned furniture.

EFTA, TEPA to come into effect tomorrow, provision for 100 bn USD investment, one mn jobs in 15 yrs

New Delhi, Sept 30 (UNI) :The India-European Free Trade Association (EFTA) and the Trade and Economic Partnership Agreement (TEPA) will

come into effect from tomorrow, an official statement said today.

TEPA offers binding commitment of 100 bn US Dollar investment and one million direct jobs in the next 15 years and will stimulate services exports in sectors like IT, business services, education, audio-visual etc. It also provides Mutual Recognition Agreements in Professional Services like nursing, chartered accountants, architects etc.

The agreement was signed on March 10, 2024. TEPA is a modern and ambitious agreement that incorporates, for the first

time in any Free Trade Agreement (FTA) signed by India, a commitment linked to investment and job creation.

The agreement comprises 14 chapters with main focus on market access related to goods, rules of origin, trade facilitation, trade remedies, sanitary and phytosanitary measures, technical barriers to trade, investment promotion, market access on services, intellectual property rights, trade and sustainable development and other legal and horizontal provisions.

The EFTA’s market access offer under TEPA covers 100 percent of non-agri products and tariff concession on Processed Agricultural Products (PAP). Sensitivity related to

PLI in sectors such as pharma, medical devices and processed food etc. have been taken while extending offers.

The agreement goes beyond goods and services and is committed to promoting investments with the aim of increasing the stock of foreign direct investments by USD 100 billion in India in the next 15 years, and to facilitate the generation of one million direct employment in India, through such investments, the statement said.

EFTA is an important regional group, with several growing opportunities for enhancing international trade in goods and services. EFTA is one important economic block out of the three (other two - EU & UK) in Europe. Among

EFTA countries, Switzerland is the largest trading partner of India followed by Norway.

The TEPA will empower India’s exporters by providing access to specialized inputs and create conducive trade and investment environment. This would boost exports of Indian made goods as well as provide opportunities for services sector to access more markets.As per Article 7.1 of TEPA , the EFTA States shall aim to increase foreign direct investment (FDI) from their investors into India by USD 50 billion within 10 years from the entry into force of the Agreement, and an additional USD 50 billion in the succeeding 5 years, amounting to a total of USD 100 billion over 15 years.

YSRCP SC Cell protests against privatisation of medical colleges

Vijayawada, Sept 30 (UNI) : The YSRCP SC Cell has launched statewide protests opposing the privatisation of government medical colleges in Andhra Pradesh. Party leaders and activists staged demonstrations across all district headquarters, raising slogans against the state government and demanding the immediate withdrawal of its decision.

The protests highlighted that medical education is a right and should remain accessible to poor and marginalized communities.

YSRCP SC Leaders said that privatising medical colleges will push education out of reach for students from weaker sections, particularly Dalits and backward classes. They strongly opposed the government’s move, calling it anti-people and anti-constitutional. At Ambedkar statues in various districts, the protesters gathered in large numbers and raised slogans, saying the government is trying to sell public assets for private profit. They reminded the government that Ambedkar envisioned education as a tool for social justice, and any attempt to privatise institutions is a betrayal of his vision.The YSRCP SC Cell President TJR Sudhakar Babu demanded that the government cancel its plan immediately and protect the future of thousands of students. He warned of intensified protests if the decision is not reversed.

AAP says Delhi has become 'crime capital', blames Amit Shah

New Delhi, Sept 30 (UNI) : The Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) today attacked the Centre, alleging a complete breakdown of law and order in the national capital.Senior AAP leader and Kondli MLA Kuldeep Kumar claimed that Delhi has become the "crime capital of India" under the watch of union Home Minister Amit Shah.

Citing the National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB) 2023 report, Kumar stated that crime in Delhi increased by 1% last year, with 3.23 lakh cases registered.He warned that if the current trend continues, 2025 is set to break all previous records. The AAP leader asserted that the Delhi Police has failed both in preventing crime and in filing chargesheets, making the city unsafe for women, children, and senior citizens."The law and order of Delhi is in the hands of union Home Minister Amit Shah. While he is Home Minister, every day incidents of stabbings, lootings, rapes and molestations are being reported," Kumar said.

He pointed to recent bomb threats received by schools and the Delhi High Court as evidence of deteriorating security, questioning the effectiveness of the central intelligence apparatus.

Yunus-led govt in Bangladesh shows no progress, thousands flee abroad

Although more than a year has passed since Bangladesh's Muhammad Yunus-led interim government presented itself as a progressive alternative, promising reforms, dignity, and international recognition, there has been no progress on the ground, a report cited. It added that neither have reforms been implemented, nor has the law and order situation improved; rather, a silent national crisis has emerged, driving thousands to leave the country.

"From India to Indonesia, Vietnam to Thailand — even Tajikistan, which once offered e-visas within one hour — governments are now making it difficult for Bangladeshis to enter foreign countries. Visa denials, delays, and bans have become the norm. The government blames human trafficking and the failures of the previous government. However, diplomats argue that the real reasons are diplomatic inaction, political instability, and the government's lack of legitimacy," a report in 'The Diplomat' detailed.

"In this conflict, Bangladeshi passports have fallen into a terrible crisis, causing suffering to millions of people. The Bangladeshi passport is no longer one that symbolises opportunity but has now become a reminder of crushed aspirations," it added.

According to the report, the first major failure of the Yunus-led interim government came in diplomacy.

Following the political change in August 2024, India stopped issuing tourist visas to Bangladeshis, and the ban remains in place a year later. Among nearly 10 million foreign tourists who visited India from April 2023 to March 2024, it said, over 2.1 million were Bangladeshis. "Indonesia has also stopped on-arrival visas for Bangladeshis on the pretext of human trafficking. The visit of Indonesia's deputy foreign minister to Dhaka in June made no progress on the issue. Thailand, which previously issued e-visas to Bangladeshis within a week, is now taking 40-50 days to process visas for Bangladeshi nationals," The Diplomat report stressed. "The UAE has reduced the number of visas it issues to Bangladeshis; on average, only 30 to 50 Bangladeshis are getting UAE visas per day. Vietnam has stopped issuing tourist visas to Bangladeshis. Italy has more than 60,000 Bangladeshi visa applications pending," it added. The report stressed that such instances underscored the declining global respect for the Bangladeshi passport. In 2025, it said, Yunus is leading a nation whose international dignity diminishes with every rejected visa.

"As the head of state, it is his duty to restore democratic practices and establish political stability, so that Bangladesh can move forward with its head held high, so that its citizens do not face humiliation at foreign immigration checkpoints, and the credibility of the passport does not continue to decline," the report noted.

Nutrition Key to Rourkela's Heart Health

With cardiovascular diseases emerging as a leading cause of mortality in India, lifestyle modifications, especially diet, are being recognised as the most effective means of prevention.

In Rourkela, a city known for its industrial pace and demanding work culture, health concerns linked to hypertension, obesity, and diabetes are rising. Doctors say that food habits play a direct role in this trend. Fast food outlets, processed snacks, and high-salt diets have become increasingly common. These eating patterns, when combined with a sedentary lifestyle and rising stress levels, are

putting enormous strain on the city's heart health.

Experts stress that prevention is not complicated — it begins with what goes on the plate. A diet rich in whole grains, seasonal fruits, vegetables, pulses, nuts, and seeds is proven to reduce cholesterol levels and improve circulation. Locally available options such as green leafy vegetables, millets, and lentils can easily be integrated into daily meals. At the same time, limiting deep-fried food, red meat, sugar-laden beverages, and excess salt is critical to preventing long-term damage to the arteries.

Dr. Millan Satapathy, Senior Interventional Cardiologist, Apollo Hospital Rourkela, explained:

"Nutrition is the first medicine for the heart. Every extra spoon of salt, every fried snack, every

sugary drink adds pressure on the arteries. People in Rourkela often lead stressful, busy lives, and food becomes a quick fix. But it is these shortcuts that silently damage the heart. By adopting simple practices — eating home-cooked meals, including green leafy vegetables, millets, and fruits in the daily diet, and avoiding excess salt and oil — we can prevent nearly half of heart-related illnesses.

A healthy plate today means a stronger heart tomorrow."

He further added that nutrition is not just about avoiding harmful foods but about embracing healthier traditions.

"Our grandparents relied on seasonal produce, home-cooked meals, and balanced diets. That wisdom is still relevant today. The problem is not a lack of awareness, but the inability to stay consistent. If every

family in Rourkela can make nutrition a priority, we can reduce the burden of heart disease significantly."

Doctors in Rourkela also recommend small, practical changes that individuals can adopt without drastically altering their lifestyle. Choosing whole wheat over refined flour, roasted snacks instead of fried, ensuring adequate hydration, and moderating alcohol intake are simple yet powerful steps. Community-level interventions, such as promoting healthy food options in schools and workplaces, can also help create an environment that supports better nutrition.

This World Heart Day, the message resonates strongly — medicine can treat, but nutrition prevents. For a city like Rourkela, where modern lifestyles are taking a toll on health, food choices can be the most effective safeguard.

Top 10 fundamentals for first-time Job seekers

Some of the most successful people started off peeling stacks (and stacks) of potatoes, skinning chickens, washing dishes and clearing tables. They didn't get disheartened by the work required, as they knew that it was just a stepping-stone onto bigger and better things. As a start, here are the top ten fundamentals that all recruiters want fresh grads to know:

- It's never too early to start researching the company companies you want to work with and for the position you want. Do your background research regarding the company and the requirements for the position you want when you graduate (size, global presence, \$ value, any recent news, follow them on social media, etc.). If possible, try and talk to someone who already works there; they will be able to give you a much more accurate picture on the company's culture, work environment, etc. so that you have all the information required to make an informed decision.
- Have a professional resume and cover letter. Just ensure that both your resume and cover letter portray an accurate image of you and tell the story that you want them to tell (in the best possible way). Ensure the resume is crisp and highlights the points you want the recruiter to notice. Get second opinions when possible.
- Manage your social media effectively. Think of yourself as a brand and all your social media as advertising your "personal brand". Just as you are going to be researching the companies/employees where you are applying, they will be doing the same to you. Ensure there isn't anything online that you aren't comfortable sharing with a room full of strangers (aka employers). Where possible have restricted profile access or screen the information you share online. Ensure you have a LinkedIn profile. Even if you don't have any prior work experience, try and highlight internships, leadership positions, how you ranked in your school and your technical skills.
- When you do manage to get an interview with the company/companies that you want, apart from ensuring that your background research on the company itself is updated and accurate, try and gather as much information about the recruiters and the selection criteria process as possible. This will be invaluable in ensuring that you appear well informed and are adequately prepared at the time of the interview.
- Practice, practice, practice. Practice mock interviews with a friend/mentor where they ask you potential interview questions, ranging from predictable ones like, "Tell us about yourself" or "Why do you think you are the right person for this job" to slightly unique ones like "What classes were your favorite



Graduating from a professional college can be an exciting yet daunting experience. You've been inside a protected environment the past few years and are ready to forge out to change the world. Just a gentle reminder though, that the best in the business didn't start at the top and unfortunately neither will you.

and why" or "What's your favorite website" or "Who's your real life hero?" Try and make these mock interview sessions as realistic as possible with quiet locations, appropriate attire and timing the entire process.

- Prior to the interview day, get enough rest (it's not time to celebrate yet). Ensure that you are relaxed and plan to get to the venue a minimum of 30-45 minutes prior to the scheduled time (always allowing for last minute emergencies). Lay out your attire and check that you have all required paperwork, directions to the location and extra copies of your resume handy.
- First impressions matter. When introducing yourself ensure you have the right attitude, smile and a firm handshake. Expect to be evaluated (on body language, grooming, confidence and effective communication skills). Don't hand out your resume or give out all the personal details (place of birth, family background, etc., unless specifically asked).
- During the interview, be prepared with a few relevant questions when given the opportunity to ask them. Expect most interviews to last between 30 to 45 minutes and when possible try and touch upon your internship project or the various organizations that you might have worked for. Also, add the responsibilities you handled and some achievements you had over those roles. Remember to keep the answers brief, to the point and avoid winding answers. Be prepared for them to ask you to stay back longer to meet others in the company.
- Maintain eye contact always (depending upon the number of people in the panels). Prior to leaving, thank them for their time; ask them for their business card as well as the next steps in the interview process. Ensure that you are prompt and respectful in your follow up.
- As a summary, while the hiring criteria may vary depending on company, industry, etc., recruiters are typically looking for graduates who exhibit confidence (not over confidence). They are looking for consistency in your "personal brand". Do your communication skills, overall appearance, attitude and personality match your resume? They're also asking themselves if you really want to work in their company or is it just one of the many open positions that you are applying for? Does your intellect and previous success record match what they envision for this role?

Dos and don'ts for your Job application

HR professionals point out common mistakes made by those applying for their job, providing a list of dos and don'ts.



Many argue that academics fails to prepare fresh graduates in communication etiquette, necessary in the corporate world. It is thus a task for some of them to even get employed as job interviews require one to present his or her skills, while conducting oneself in a certain manner. To address these concerns, we list mistakes made my first-time job aspirants and how they can be corrected.

-Email etiquette
So, you've heard about a suitable job, managed to procure the employer's email id and decided to shoot off your resume for consideration. But when you're a fresher, your resume may not be your biggest strength. So what do you do?
"A mistake freshers make in their resume is, since there's little to speak of in terms of

professional achievement, they litter it with details about their family and their hobbies,"says Srinivas Rao Katkoor, Director Human Resources - South Asia, SAS Institute (India) Pvt Ltd. Rao adds that freshers need to highlight their educational qualifications, technical skills and their college projects in their resume. "If you've done an internship, you need to mention your exact role and learning from it in your resume," adds Rao, who feels that grammar and punctuation cannot be compromised in one's CV. "A cover letter is also a must and it should briefly summarize the candidate's skills and the kind of role they're looking for, along with a reason for applying for the role and choice of company," says Rao. How one addresses the person receiving the resume is vital too. A "Hi" followed by the

person's name is seen in poor light. "It would be advisable that the candidate figures out who he is applying to and address the mail to the concerned person, making the application personalized. And one should never make the mistake of applying to multiple companies by adding several email ids in the BCC as it's seen as unprofessional," says Rao. A suitable salutation in such emails could be 'Dear Sir', 'Dear HR Manager' or 'Dear Hiring Manager'.
On a different note, the email id created to send your resume could also affect your chances of getting short-listed. "If an employer receives a resume from an id like serialkisser01@gmail.com, the reaction it would receive is obvious," laughs Ashish Arora, Managing Director, HR Anexi Pvt Ltd, who recommends short and straightforward email ids with a subject line clearly drawing attention to the role being applied for.

-Telephonic skills
You may have been talking on the phone for decades, but that doesn't necessarily mean that you're prepared for a telephonic interview. Usually the first filter in most interviews, this is the stage when employers connect employees to validate the claims made on their resume. "First-time job applicants aren't aware of etiquette to be followed in telephonic interviews. You rarely come across candidates who begin a call with a greeting like 'good morning' or 'good afternoon' based on the time of the day," says Rao, who feels that one should be frank, using this as a chance to talk about specialized skills. Doubts about the exact role can be clarified along the way.

- Face to face interview
The way to approach the final interview where one meets one's prospective employer to pitch one's skills has been much debated. What to wear, how to conduct oneself or even what to prepare for, are all grey for most freshers who make the common mistake of going ill-prepared and end up being rejected. A firm shake hand and constant eye contact during the interview are known to convey confidence and honesty but there's plenty else to learn.
"Shabby attire, reaching late for an inter view, laid-back posture communicate that the candidate is unenthusiastic," says Arora. He advises that candidates speak slowly and clearly, responding to questions honestly, after having heard the entire question. "Another common mistake is asking how much one will be finally paid, early on in the interview. This is a stage when the candidate's employment has not been confirmed and it is looked at in poor taste," adds Arora.

Lenovo India relaxes dress code for employees

Following in the footsteps of Infosys and Hindustan Unilever, Lenovo India is the latest to relax its employee dress code. Business attire favoured at the firm so far will give way to a more casual style of dressing. Lenovo will announce the change in a mail to be sent to all employees on Friday, titled, 'Now everyday is Friday.' Employees at Lenovo offices across the country will now be allowed to wear business casuals including but not limited to shirts, T-shirts with collars, jeans for men and dresses, skirts and casual trousers for women. The mail defines business casuals as "a midpoint between the informality of casual wear and the strictness of formal business attire". Employees will be expected to use their discretion to dress professionally. Apparel with rips or tears, workout attire and clothing with graphics are to be avoided. Those in frontline roles will be expected to wear formals for meetings with clients and business partners. "We've been thinking of instituting a change in our dress code for some time now," said Rohit Sandal, director HR at Lenovo India. "Employees need to feel comfortable in what they're wearing, in order to be at their most productive. This change is part of our recent brand transformation 'Never Stand Still' to deepen our engagement with millennials in India," he added. The company, he said, trusts its employees to be appropriately attired within the parameters of business casuals. "No longer will ties and formal suits be

advocated, but we won't encourage shorts and flip-flops either." The updated clothing policy is one of the many changes that Sandal who joined the firm in April hopes to bring into effect. The new dress code will be applicable for



also be allowed to wear business casuals, thereby promoting it as a perk of working with the firm. Corporate image and luxury brand consultant Manjusha Maheshwari advocates formal dressing at the workplace, but admits that things are changing to address the needs of millennial workers. "It's a good idea to put employees through group sessions before instituting such changes, to help them understand the nuances of business casuals and to help define what works and what doesn't. Sloppiness in attire, if allowed to creep in, can affect the mood at the workplace."

Flick gives Lamine homework ahead of PSG clash

Madrid, Sept 30 (UNI) : FC Barcelona coach Hansi Flick gave a message to Lamine Yamal that he needs more than just talent to be considered one of the all-time greats of the game.

That is something that every player needs to do - not just him.""He is a great player with the ball and that is what makes a different," commented Flick.

Reorganization of customer service offices in Mahavitaran starts on a pilot basis from today

Mumbai, Sept 30 : Sub-divisions and branch offices providing direct customer service under Mahavitaran have been restructured. This restructuring is starting on a pilot basis from Wednesday (1st). The draft of the restructuring will be finalized after reviewing the work within the next month and this restructuring will be implemented from 1st November. Meanwhile, the Chief Engineers of the circles have been given full authority to take necessary measures to ensure that there is no inconvenience to the electricity consumers during the implementation period of this restructuring.
Under Mahavitaran, there are 147 departments, 652 sub-departments and 3274 branch offices in 16 circles and about 44 thousand engineers and technical staff working in 4,188 sub-centres. In this, mainly new electricity connections, monthly electricity bills, regular maintenance of the electricity system for smooth power supply, repair of technical faults, recovery of electricity bill arrears, reduction of electricity losses, etc. are done through sub-departments and branch offices. Therefore, engineers and technical staff have to do 10 to 12 types of work at the same

time. This structure is about 25 years old and was made according to the number of customers at that time. "The previous structure has also had an impact on the efficiency of employees and customer service in the last few years. Therefore, the demand for reducing the burden of general work and giving responsibility for selected works was being made by the engineers and employees' organizations for the last 10 years. The management has formed a special committee for this purpose and has discussed the employee organizations from time to time and prepared a restructuring draft.
The main emphasis has been on the restructuring of the sub-divisions and branch offices that provide direct customer service. In particular, the relevant sub-divisions and branch offices have been restructured according to the number of customers. Due to this, 2 more divisional offices, 37 sub-divisions and 30 branch offices have been newly created in the state. Due to these offices, the number of posts of 876 engineers and technical staff has also

Delhi's Tughalakabad to Kolkata's Shalimar, via Agra & Kanpur, offers assured 120hr transit time

The first service will commence on 1st October 2025, operating from ICD Tughlakabad Terminal (TICD), Delhi to CTCs Kolkata via Agra and Kanpur terminals of Container Corporation of India Limited (CONCOR).
