

Telangana aims for Rs 1 lakh cr investment in life sciences by 2030: Sridhar Babu



Hyderabad/Melbourne, Oct 23 (UNI) : Telangana IT and Industries Minister Duddilla Sridhar Babu announced that the state government has set an ambitious target to attract new investments worth Rs 1 lakh crore in the life sciences sector by 2030, creating employment for five lakh people.

Delivering the keynote address at the "ASBiotech International Conference 2025" jointly organized by "AusBiotech" and the Victoria State Government in Melbourne on Thursday, Sridhar Babu highlighted the rapid growth of Telangana's life sciences ecosystem and outlined a roadmap to transform the state into a global hub for innovation

and biomanufacturing.

He said that despite being 11th in geographical size and 12th in population, Telangana contributes more than 5 per cent to India's GDP.

"The state's GSDP growth rate for 2024-25 stands at 8.2 percent, compared to the national average of 7.6 percent," he noted.

Over the past 20 months, the state has attracted investments worth Rs 3.2 lakh crore, of which the life sciences sector alone accounts for Rs 63,000 crore.

Between April and December last year, exports from the life sciences sector crossed Rs 26,000 crore.

The minister said the government's goal is to

expand the sector's valuation from the current USD 80 billion to USD 250 billion by 2030. To achieve this, a new "Comprehensive Life Sciences Policy" will soon be unveiled, providing a detailed framework for investment, innovation, and infrastructure development.

Sridhar Babu revealed that Hyderabad has been ranked among the top global life sciences clusters in the "Global Life Sciences Atlas 2025" prepared by CBRE — standing alongside Boston, San Francisco, Cambridge, Beijing, and Tokyo.

Hyderabad is the only Indian city to feature in the list.

"Office leasing in the life sciences sector grew from 0.6 million square feet in

2022 to 2.4 million square feet in 2024 — a fourfold increase," he said.

The minister emphasised that the Telangana government is actively building human capital for the coming "bio-digital era" in collaboration with Life Sciences University, Young India Skills University, the World Economic Forum, and other international partners.

"Our slogan is not "Made in India" but "Invent in Telangana," Sridhar Babu declared.

He cited Genome Valley, the Medical Devices Park, B-Hub, Bharat Future City, progressive industrial policies, plug-and-play parks, a single-window clearance system, and a stable, investor-friendly government as key strengths making Telangana a preferred global destination.

The minister urged Australian companies to invest in emerging areas such as cell and gene therapy, biologics, mRNA vaccines, contract research, diagnostics, medtech, AI-based drug discovery, green biomanufacturing, and agri-biotech.

Cabinet lifts two-child rule for contesting local body elections

Hyderabad, Oct 23 (UNI) : The Telangana Cabinet has approved the lifting of the two-child rule that barred individuals with more than two children from contesting in local body elections.

To implement this decision, the Cabinet resolved to remove Section 21(3) of the Telangana Panchayat Raj Act, 2018. The amendment to the Panchayat Raj and Municipal Acts will be made through an ordinance, Revenue, Information, and Public Relations Minister Ponguleti Srinivas Reddy informed the media.

Briefing newsmen after the Cabinet meeting held at the Secretariat, he said it was also decided to expedite the completion of the Srisailem Left Bank Canal (SLBC) tunnel — one of the largest in the world — by 2026-27, to bring Krishna waters to the drought-hit and fluoride-affected areas of Nalgonda district. Minister Srinivas

Reddy further said that the government is committed to providing 42 per cent reservation for Backward Classes (BCs) in local body elections. He added that the Cabinet will decide on conducting these elections after the Telangana High Court delivers its judgment on November 3. A final decision is expected in the next Cabinet meeting scheduled for November 7.

The Cabinet also resolved to complete four super-speciality hospitals — at LB Nagar, Sanathnagar, Alwal and Warangal — on a war footing to strengthen public healthcare services.

To meet the growing electricity demand for the next decade, the Cabinet will discuss and finalise new power generation proposals in the next meeting.

Ministers Ponnampallabharathi, Jupalli Krishna Rao, Danasari Anasuya (Seethakka), and Aduri Laxman Kumar, among others, were present at the press briefing.

Be cautious of cyber fraud in the name of government schemes: SP Upasana

In the digital age, while technology has made the lives of common people easier, cyber criminals are constantly trying to cheat people by adopting new methods. Recently, cyber fraudsters have now started cheating people by taking the help of various welfare schemes run by the government.

SP Upasana cautioned the general public and said that cyber fraudsters are misleading citizens by sending tempting messages and calls in the name of many government schemes like Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana, Ujjwala Yojana, Kisan Samman Nidhi, Pension Scheme, Gas Subsidy, Women Empowerment Scheme, Scholarship Scheme.

The criminals, posing as officers or agents of any government department, ask for bank details, OTP, Aadhaar number, PAN card or other confidential information in the name of updating the beneficiary's data, verifying the application or releasing the benefits of the scheme. As soon as the person shares the information, the amount disappears from his bank account.

The SP said that the benefits of any government scheme are given only through the official portal or government offices. No department asks for personal information through phone, email or WhatsApp. Citizens should not click on any unknown link and verify such messages with the local administration or cyber crime branch. She said that cyber security is the biggest responsibility today. By adopting a little caution, we can protect ourselves and our families from fraud. In case of any kind of cyber fraud, immediately call 1930 and lodge a complaint.

Labourer lynched in Amethi

Amethi, Oct 23 (UNI) A 60-year-old labourer returning home after a day's work was brutally beaten to death by three unidentified men with sticks and sharp weapons in Amethi tonight.

Following the attack, the three assailants fled the scene.

Police have launched an investigation into the incident, which has once again brought Gungwachh village into the spotlight.

Police officers, including Kotwali in-charge Ravi Kumar Singh, reached the spot soon after receiving the information. Initially, police treated the case as an accident, but after protests by the victim's relatives and villagers, they accepted a formal complaint

police station, earned his livelihood through daily labour. On Thursday, he went to work at the house of Abhishek Shukla in Tiwari Pur, a hamlet of Gungwachh village. Around 8 p.m., while returning home on his bicycle, three youths intercepted him near the 220 kVA power substation in Gungwachh.

Before Nirmal could react, the assailants attacked him with sticks and sharp weapons, leaving him severely injured.

Locals rushed injured Nirmal to the Community Health Center (CHC) by ambulance, where doctors declared him dead on arrival.

Police officers, including Kotwali in-charge Ravi Kumar Singh, reached the spot soon after receiving the information. Initially, police treated the case as an accident, but after protests by the victim's relatives and villagers, they accepted a formal complaint

from the family. According to Dharmaraj, his brother had no children and lived with him since the death of his wife 15 years ago.

The family alleged that Nirmal's sister and her relatives had been pressuring him over a property dispute and had threatened him several times. Villagers also confirmed that the deceased's sister often quarreled over land despite having received her share and built a separate house in Tikarmafi. They suspect property dispute behind the killing.

Police officials confirmed that the complaint has been received and that all possible angles, including personal and property disputes, are being examined. Police have sent the body for post-mortem examination and deployed teams to trace the suspects.

Officials assured that those found responsible will face strict legal action.

MANUU Engages Journalism Students in Road Safety

Hyderabad, Oct 23 : The Department of Mass Communication and Journalism, Maulana Azad National Urdu University (MANUU), organized an interactive session on Road Safety Awareness with the students of the department. The session aimed to encourage young communicators to view road safety not merely as a matter of traffic discipline but as a broader issue of public health, civic responsibility, and ethical storytelling.

The session is part of MANUU's ongoing effort to connect classroom learning with real-world communication challenges. Faculty members, students, and guest speakers explored how the next generation of media professionals can shape a culture of safe mobility through responsible

journalism, social media campaigns, and community outreach.

Setting the tone for the discussion, Prof. Mohammad Fariyad, Dean, School of Journalism and Mass Communication, MANUU, said that communication students have an important role to play in translating data into awareness. "When students learn to frame stories around social responsibility, like road safety, they not only inform audiences but also save lives," he remarked.

Prof. Ehtesham Ahmad Khan, Head, Department of Journalism and Mass Communication, MANUU, announced that the Department will create a dedicated resource hub on Road Safety on its website.

Speaking on the health dimensions of road crashes, Dr. Syed Hubbe Ali, Health

Specialist, UNICEF India Country Office, emphasized that road traffic injuries are one of the leading causes of death among children and adolescents aged 5–19 years in India. "We must strengthen trauma care systems, empower communities with first-response knowledge, and ensure that child safety remains central to all mobility planning," he said. The discussion emphasized the need for safer school zones, slower vehicle speeds, and consistent use of helmets and seatbelts as simple, lifesaving measures.

The session concluded with an open discussion among students, faculty, and media representatives. Several students expressed interest in developing road safety features and digital campaigns as part of their coursework.

Will not rest till we break BJP: Dy CM face Mukesh Sahani

Patna, Oct 23 (UNI) Vikasheel Insaan Party (VIP) chief Mukesh Sahani, declared as the Deputy Chief Minister face of the INDIA bloc in Bihar, said today that he had been waiting for three-and-a-half years for this opportunity.

He accused the BJP of betraying his party and the Mallah community, vowing to defeat the saffron party in the upcoming Assembly elections.

"I have been waiting for three-and-a-half years for this moment. The BJP broke our MLAs and pushed the poor Mallah to the streets. We had vowed that until we break the BJP, we will not rest. The INDIA alliance is strong. We will form the government," Sahani said.

The announcement came as the INDIA bloc formally declared

Rashtriya Janata Dal (RJD) leader and former Deputy Chief Minister Tejashwi Yadav as its chief ministerial candidate for the Bihar Assembly elections.

Senior Congress leader Ashok Gehlot, addressing a joint press conference with alliance partners, said the decision had been made with the consent of Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge and senior leader Rahul Gandhi. Gehlot added that along with Sahani, another leader from the backward community would also be appointed deputy chief minister if the alliance forms the government.

Gehlot challenged the NDA to announce its own chief ministerial candidate, alleging that the BJP had betrayed its allies in Maharashtra and would do the same in Bihar.

"In Maharashtra, they

fought the elections under (Eknath) Shinde's leadership, and look at what they did later. Similarly, in Bihar too, they will not make Nitish Kumar the Chief Minister," he charged.

After being named the INDIA bloc's CM face, Tejashwi Yadav vowed to deliver a crime and corruption free administration and promised to unite Bihar beyond caste and religion. "Tejashwi will not compromise with corruption or crime. Even if Tejashwi's own shadow is involved in crime, it will be punished. We will build a new Bihar," he asserted.

Yadav said his government would achieve within 20 months what the NDA government could not in 20 years, reiterating key poll promises, including

one government job per family, regularisation of Jeevika Didis and contractual workers, Rs 2,500 per month to every woman under the 'Mai-Bahin Maan Yojana', and gas cylinders for Rs 500.

CPI-ML general secretary Dipankar Bhattacharya said the Bihar elections carried "two contexts," noting that the INDIA bloc narrowly missed forming the government last time but would bridge that gap now. He added that all eyes were on Bihar, and voters would ensure the state rejects the BJP's divisive agenda. "I assure everyone, just like Jharkhand, Bihar will also reject the BJP's agenda. Those concerned about protecting the Constitution can be assured, this time, there will be change," Bhattacharya said.

Tejaswi can be a CM candidate, but never Chief Minister: Nityanand Rai

Patna, Oct. 23 (UNI) union Minister of State for Home Affairs Nityanand Rai today dismissed the Grand Alliance's decision to project Rashtriya Janata Dal (RJD) leader Tejaswi Yadav as its chief ministerial candidate, asserting that while Yadav may be a candidate, the people of Bihar would "never allow him to become the Chief Minister."

Rai told news persons here that Tejashwi's selection as the GA's face was the result of "internal pressure and political coercion" among the alliance partners.

"Everyone in Bihar knows that the Grand Alliance accepted Tejaswi's candidature reluctantly

after days of internal tussle. But in a democracy, it is the people who decide the Chief Minister, and the people of Bihar trust the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Chief Minister Nitish Kumar," Rai said.

The senior BJP leader further stated that Nitish Kumar's governance over the last 20 years has been widely appreciated by the people.

For two decades, the people of Bihar have supported Nitish Kumar's leadership and the double-engine government and will continue to do so, he said adding that the NDA will once again form the government in Bihar with a clear majority.

Rai launched a fierce

personal attack on Tejaswi Yadav, alleging his involvement in multiple corruption cases.

"Tejaswi should be ready for action against himself, as both he and his family are deeply involved in corruption."

Rai said that if Yadav truly believes that even his shadow should not be spared if it commits corruption, then he should start by punishing himself and his family first.

He accused the RJD leadership of being responsible for a series of scandals, including the fodder scam, the bitumen scam, the uniform scam and the land-for-jobs scam.

Shimla, Oct 23 (UNI) : Chief Minister Thakur Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu, while presiding over a meeting to review tourism projects in the state today directed the preparation of an online portal for registration of Home Stay units within ten days.

He also directed the issuing of tenders for hiring competent software firms for preparation of user friendly online portals across all departments.

The Chief Minister said that it should be ensured that payments in all the HPTDC hotels, GAD guesthouses and rest houses of various departments, including food bills payments, be made online.

He issued directions for empanelling professional architects both for preparation of projects designs for ADB and Tourism Development Board Projects and said that the same should be advertised within ten days as well.

"I want to ensure that there should be no administrative limitations as far as promotion of the tourism industry is concerned and the procedures to be made more simplified for ease of doing business," stated the Chief Minister. Sukhu also suggested making few changes in proposed rules of the Tourism Investment Promotion Council (TIPC), which was discussed at length.

Operation Red Hunt creates fear among criminals in Simdega, 104 red warrants executed in two months

Ranchi, Oct 23 (UNI) The ongoing special drive "Operation Red Hunt" in state's border district of Simdega has dealt a blow to criminal networks, instilling fear among offenders and fugitives.

Over the past two months, police have successfully executed 104 pending red warrants, marking a major achievement for the district police.

The operation was launched to apprehend long-absconding criminals against whom permanent warrants had been issued by various courts.

Conducted in 11 phases, the campaign involved multiple police teams carrying out consistent raids across the district. According to official data, 51 accused were arrested during the operation, while 6 others voluntarily surrendered before the court.

Police also confirmed that 19 red warrant holders were deceased, with necessary documents submitted to the court. Additionally, four warrants were returned as some accused were already in custody or had been granted bail earlier. Police officials said the campaign has enhanced

transparency and demonstrated proactive law enforcement.

The operation has created a visible deterrent among criminals, as several absconders have started surrendering voluntarily at local police stations. Even family members of some fugitives have begun cooperating with the police by sharing information about their whereabouts.

Before the operation, Simdega had a total of 309 pending red warrants. The number has now reduced to less than 205, reflecting the increasing efficiency and momentum of the district police in curbing criminal activity.

Simdega Superintendent of Police S. Arshi stated that the next target is to execute all remaining warrants by December.

He emphasized that no criminal, regardless of their location whether hiding in remote forests or outside the district will be able to evade the law. The success of Operation Red Hunt has strengthened public confidence in the police and reaffirmed the administration's commitment to establishing a crime-free Simdega.

KTR accuses Revanth Reddy Govt of corruption and anarchy across State

Hyderabad, Oct 23 (UNI) : BRS Working President K T Rama Rao (KTR) launched a blistering attack on the Congress government, alleging that corruption and chaos have become the hallmarks of Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy’s administration. Speaking to the media at Telangana Bhavan on Thursday, KTR said, “The stench of corruption in the Congress administration has spread across the entire state. Telangana, which we placed at the top of the agricultural ladder, is now being dragged into a culture of guns and mafia.” He described Revanth Reddy as “the weakest Chief Minister” he had seen in his political life, accusing him of having no control over his ministers or officials. “Even government officers are seeking voluntary retirement because they are harassed to do wrong things,” KTR claimed. Alleging that the state is being run by a “Dandupalyam gang” of corrupt ministers, KTR said that the Chief

Minister’s residence has turned into a “settlement center” where panchayats, commissions, and tender rigging take place. KTR further charged that officials and businesspeople were being threatened at gunpoint, and even the police were acting like “Congress workers” by shielding the guilty. He accused the Congress of turning Telangana into a “mafia kingdom” instead of Indiramma Rajyam, adding that “there is no administration in the state—only anarchy, corruption, and lawlessness.” KTR also criticized the BJP for remaining silent on the issue, alleging that a “BJP-Congress joint venture government” was running the state. Citing AICC president Mallikarjuna Kharge’s recent remarks, KTR said even Congress’s own senior leaders have admitted that the party’s rule in Telangana is anarchic and corrupt. “We thank him for speaking the truth on behalf of the people of Telangana,” he added.

Hyderabad, Oct 23 (UNI) : Union Minister of State for Home Affairs Bandi Sanjay Kumar on Thursday demanded an immediate apology from the state DGP and swift action in the case of Prashant Singh (also known as Sonu Singh), who was shot while allegedly trying to stop cows being taken for slaughter. Bandi Sanjay, accompanied by Rajya Sabha MP K Laxman, BJP deputy leader Payala Shankar, state leaders Gangidi Manohar Reddy and J Sangappa, visited

Yashoda Hospital in Secunderabad to inquire about Prashant Singh’s condition. Party leaders said the BJP would bear the injured man’s medical expenses and pledged full support. Addressing reporters, Bandi Sanjay accused AIMIM leader Ibrahim of possessing the revolver used in the attack and questioned how the weapon came into his hands. He said police failure to enforce the cow-slaughter law cannot justify blaming those who try to stop the practice, and

demanded the DGP withdraw remarks he described as unfair. “Cows are being taken to the slaughterhouse against the law. I strongly condemn the firing on Prashant Singh,” he said, alleging that under the Congress government “goons and rowdies” are being emboldened. Bandi Sanjay claimed past incidents during the BRS era showed a similar pattern and warned that if those who slaughter cows are not caught, Bajrang Dal activists “will not sit idly by.”K Laxman echoed

concerns over law and order, saying gun-related violence and attacks on police have increased and that governance in the state has suffered. He urged a fair probe into the shooting and accountability from the police. BJP leaders also rejected media reports that Singh had demanded money, calling such claims false and demanding action against officers they said were spreading misinformation. They pressed for clarity on who brought the revolver and called for interrogation of all involved.

FCRI develops improved germination technique for Givotia rottleriformis

Hyderabad, Oct 23 (UNI) : In a major scientific breakthrough, researchers at the Forest College and Research Institute (FCRI), Mulugu, Telangana, have successfully developed an improved germination technique for Givotia rottleriformis, a rare tree species crucial to the famous Nirmal handicraft industry. The innovation promises to revive dwindling population of the species and support the livelihoods of hundreds of artisan families, the college said in a release here today. Givotia rottleriformis, locally known as Poniki (used for Nirmal handicrafts), is renowned for its soft and lightweight wood, ideal for crafting toys, figurines, lacquered artefacts, and traditional art pieces that hold the Geographical Indication (GI) tag of Nirmal,

Telangana. However, its natural populations have sharply declined due to poor regeneration, seed dormancy, and habitat degradation, making the species increasingly difficult to cultivate. This pioneering germination method developed at FCRI opens new pathways for large-scale plantation, ecological restoration, and conservation of craft-based livelihoods. The institution plans to transfer this technology to forest departments and artisan clusters to ensure a sustainable supply of raw material for the well-known Nirmal toy industry. The breakthrough was achieved by Maloth Mounika, M.Sc. Research scholar, under the guidance of Dr. Reeja Sundaram, Assistant Professor, Department of Tree Breeding and Improvement at FCRI. The newly developed protocol, pending patent approval, has successfully enhanced

seed germination rates to 75-80 percent, overcoming long-standing challenges posed by the tree’s hard, water-impermeable seed coat and prolonged dormancy. Speaking about the achievement, the Dean of FCRI, Mr. V. Krishna, IFS, stated “This achievement reflects FCRI’s commitment to blending scientific innovation with cultural preservation for socio-economic development of forest-based industries and communities. Reviving Givotia rottleriformis is not just about protecting a native tree species, it is about sustaining the livelihoods of artisan communities and preserving Telangana’s unique heritage. We are proud that our young researchers are contributing solutions of national importance.” Givotia rottleriformis is native to dry deciduous forests of Telangana, Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, Tamil Nadu, Maharashtra, Kerala, and Sri Lanka, where it thrives in rocky and degraded landscapes.

MeeSeva brings Govt Data to Citizens’ Fingertips: IT Minister Sreedhar Babu

Hyderabad, Oct 23 (UNI) : Telangana has expanded its Open Data Telangana platform under MeeSeva, giving citizens, researchers, and startups access to over 300 datasets and 7,000 resource files from 40 government departments. The initiative aims to promote transparency, innovation, and smarter governance. “With Open Data Telangana, we are making government information easily accessible to everyone. When data reaches the people, governance becomes more accountable and inclusive,” said IT, Electronics & Communications Minister D. Sreedhar Babu on Thursday. The platform covers data across sectors such as transport, health, energy, environment, agriculture, and weather, he said that each dataset is cleaned, standardized, and regularly updated to ensure accuracy and ease of use for the public.

Some of the most-used datasets include anonymised vehicle registration data, Hyderabad Metro Rail’s GTFS data for real-time metro timings on Google Maps, and upcoming TSRTC bus transit data, he said. Environmental and public health data - including air and water quality, energy

consumption, and day-wise rainfall, temperature, and humidity - are also available for open use, said the Minister . More than 10,000 users - including startups, students, researchers, civil society groups, and think tanks- have already accessed the platform. These datasets have been used to develop AI-driven applications, conduct research, inform public policy, and create citizen-centric solutions across areas such as urban mobility, health diagnostics, energy optimization, environmental monitoring, and sustainable city planning, he said. “The next phase will focus on real-time and AI-ready datasets that support intelligent governance and data-driven policymaking,” Sreedhar Babu said. The platform also collaborates with the World Economic Forum (WEF), UNDP, J-PAL, Indian School of Business (ISB), and World Resources Institute (WRI), and contributes to AI Kosha, India’s national AI dataset repository. “By opening up data, Telangana is setting new standards in digital governance,” the Minister added.

Dr M Ram Mohan of CSIR-NGRI elected Fellow of National Academy of Sciences, India

Hyderabad, Oct 23 (UNI) : Dr M Ram Mohan, Chief Scientist at the CSIR–National Geophysical Research Institute (NGRI), Hyderabad, has been elected as a Fellow of the National Academy of Sciences, India (NASI) in recognition of his outstanding research in Archean geodynamics and crustal evolution. Dr Mohan’s work has provided valuable insights into the processes shaping the early Earth’s crust and has contributed significantly to understanding the planet’s geological evolution. Over his career, he has also received several prestigious accolades, including the National Geoscience Award, Bellur Rama Rao Birth Centenary Award, Krishnan Gold Medal, and Fellowship of the Telangana Academy of Sciences.

Cops bust interstate ganja racket

Hyderabad, Oct 23 (UNI) : In a major crackdown on narcotics trafficking, Hyderabad City police have busted an interstate ganja racket by arresting three suspects. Police seized 908.41 kg of Ganja, worth Rs 2.7 crore and four mobile phones. Acting on credible information, the Commissioner’s Task Force, South-East Zone Team, in coordination with Bandlaguda police, apprehended Mohammed Kaleem Uddin (32), Shaik Sohail (23), and Mohammed Afzal (25), all residents of Amberpet, Hyderabad, while they were transporting ganja from Malkangiri in Odisha to Maharashtra via Hyderabad. The interception took place near OS Palace Function Hall Main Road, Bandlaguda, a police statement said on Thursday. It said that the accused, childhood friends, were associates of the main transporter Rahman, brother of Kaleem Uddin. Rahman had coordinated with suppliers Jithu from Kalimela, Odisha, and Suresh from Srikakulam to deliver ganja to Mahesh in Sangamner, Nashik, Maharashtra.

Each trip offered them Rs 3–5 lakh, with Kaleem and his associates receiving Rs 50,000 per trip. During the interception, authorities found 28 HDPE bags of ganja concealed under cashew shells in a vehicle, covered with tarpaulin to evade detection. The contraband, sourced from Malkangiri forests in Odisha, was intended for large-scale distribution across Maharashtra. Four key individuals — Rahman (Hyderabad), Jithu (Odisha), Suresh (Srikakulam), and Mahesh (Maharashtra) — are absconding. Hyderabad Police Commissioner VC Sajjanar lauded the South-East Zone Task Force and Bandlaguda Police for their proactive action in intercepting the large-scale consignment. He reiterated that the police are committed to curbing the drug menace through sustained enforcement and public awareness campaigns. The operation was conducted under the supervision of ADCP Ande Srinivasa Rao and ACP A. Sudhakar, led by Inspector S. Saida Babu and SHO R. Devender, with support from sub-inspectors and constables of the Task Force and Bandlaguda police station.

BJP extends support to private colleges' statewide bandh on Nov 3

Hyderabad, Oct 23 (UNI) : The Telangana BJP on Thursday announced its support for the statewide bandh called by private college managements on November 3, demanding that the Congress government immediately release the pending fee reimbursement arrears. In a press release issued by N V Subhash, BJP Chief Spokesperson and Media Incharge, the party said that a delegation of private college representatives met State BJP President N Ramchander Rao at his residence and explained the financial distress they were facing due to the non-release of arrears. Expressing solidarity with their demands, Rao assured the delegation that the BJP would extend full support to the bandh. He strongly criticized the Congress government for failing to clear arrears despite repeated assurances. “The government should release the pending Rs 900 crore immediately,” Rao said, adding that many institutions are struggling to pay staff salaries, leading to job losses for teachers and disruptions in students’ education.

Yamuna cleaning to get a shot in the arm with deployment of advanced equipment

The ongoing process of cleaning Yamuna in the national capital is soon going to get a shot in the arm with the procurement and deployment of state-of-the art machinery from abroad, which is going to substantially boost the efficiency of the efforts. Starting from January, 2026 the Irrigation and Flood Control Department will be deploying the Amphibious Classic 4 Watermaster, an advanced dredger machine, initially on the critical stretches of the river.

Afterwards, the machinery will be deployed for cleaning operations on the Sahibi River basin (also known as Najafgarh Drain). This advanced machine is being procured from Finland, in a bid to undertake large scale dredging, desilting, and cleaning works in the Yamuna and Sahibi rivers, officials said. It is said that due to the machines' ability to handle multiple functions efficiently, the dredger will play a vital role in maintaining the city's water bodies and strengthening the national capital's resilience against flooding and pollution.

The officials of the I & FC department emphasized that this acquisition aligns with Delhi’s long-term vision to integrate modern technology into urban environmental management, setting new standards for sustainability and efficiency. Capable of operating on both land and water, the machine combines Finnish engineering with high-efficiency hydraulic systems and modular attachments that can perform multiple operations including dredging, backhoe excavation, raking, solid waste removal, and weed extraction with high precision, officials said.

The cost at which the advanced dredger is being procured is approximately Rs 8 crore, which comprises shipment, one-year warranty, six months of company-operated performance support, and 5 per cent GST. It is scheduled to arrive in India before December, while the operations on the Yamuna River will commence from January. The key features of the equipment include, dredging depth up to 6 meters, cutter pump discharge capacity of 600 cubic meters per hour, a hydraulically driven propulsion system for smooth navigation and control, quick-change modular tools such as suction dredging pump, backhoe bucket, and raker, and a fully amphibious design for both land and water operations.

This advanced equipment is expected to enhance I & FC department’s capacity to clean, desilt, and rejuvenate river channels while strengthening Delhi’s flood control and drainage systems. The design and the configuration of the machine allows continuous year-round work, be it pre-monsoon desilting, flood mitigation and post-monsoon restoration, officials said. According to the I & FC minister Parvesh Verma, who was in Finland, “This New Year will mark a new beginning for the Yamuna. The arrival of the Amphibious Classic 4 dredger is a major milestone in our mission to rejuvenate Delhi’s rivers and strengthen our flood management system."He has called the procurement of these machines by the state government, a conscious investment in advanced technology and environmental responsibility.

Shimla/Geneva, Oct 23 (UNI) :Anurag Singh Thakur, former union Cabinet Minister and Member of Parliament from Hamirpur Lok Sabha constituency and Chairman of the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Coal, Mines and Steel, presented India's position on the topic "Upholding Humanitarian Standards and Supporting Humanitarian Action in Times of Crisis" at the General Debate of the 151st Assembly of the Inter-Parliamentary union (IPU) in Geneva, Switzerland.

Anurag Singh Thakur represented India's parliamentary voice before parliamentarians from over 170 countries and reiterated India's civilizational commitment to global humanitarian action. Reaffirming India's principled stance, Anurag Singh Thakur underlined that India's humanitarian engagement is guided by sovereignty, non-

interference, and moral responsibility, and that India remains committed to the core humanitarian principles of humanity, neutrality, impartiality, and independence. Anurag Singh Thakur affirmed that India's participation in the 151st IPU Assembly reflects its contemporary commitment to its civilizational values and global solidarity, embodying the vision of "Sabka Saath, Sabka Vikas, Sabka Vishwas, Sabka Prayas."

Om Prakash Rajbhar party to contests 42 seats in Bihar, to campaign from Nov 1

Lucknow, Oct 23 (UNI) : Suheldev Bharatiya Samaj Party (SBSP) national president and Uttar Pradesh Panchayati Raj minister Om Prakash Rajbhar has said that his party is contesting 42 seats in the Bihar Assembly elections."We had filded 53 candidates but several nominations were rejected and now contesting 42 seats with the "stick" election symbol," he said while adding that he will personally campaign in

Bihar from November 1.

Talking to media here today, Om Prakash Rajbhar launched a scathing attack on the Samajwadi Party, saying, "SBSP is contesting elections in Bihar, but some SP supporters in Uttar Pradesh are crying (like puppies) about how we are contesting there."Rajbhar didn't stop there, saying that some "people living on the payroll" of the Samajwadi Party (SP) were making baseless comments.

"They don't have the right to speak in front of their leader. Those who are speaking nonsense will have their bail forfeited."

Rajbhar said that the SBSP has been continuously demanding a debate on the Social Justice Committee's report, but neither the ruling party nor the opposition parties have yet clarified their views on extending reservation benefits to the most backward classes.He said, "The 27 percent

reservation should be divided into 7, 9, and 11 percent, so that every category benefits."

Supporting Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath's statement on Halal certificates, Rajbhar said, "What the Chief Minister said is correct. The opposition always understands things late. Even during the NRC and CAA, these same people spread the misinformation that Muslims would be stripped of their citizenship.

Death toll up to 9 from explosion in Russia's Chelyabinsk

Moscow, Oct. 23 (UNI)The death toll has risen to nine from a factory explosion in Russia's Chelyabinsk region, with five others injured, the regional governor said Thursday.

Aleksei Teksler, governor of the Chelyabinsk region, said on Telegram that the blast occurred at a plant and that there was no confirmation at this stage that a drone attack was involved.

Preliminary investigations indicated that the explosion was caused by a violation of safety regulations, according to local authorities.

Season's 1st bird flu outbreak in Japan confirmed in Hokkaido

Tokyo, Oct. 23 (UNI) : Authorities in the Japanese northern prefecture of Hokkaido have confirmed the first outbreak of avian influenza in the country this season, local media reported.

At a poultry farm in the town of Shiraoi, where the case was found, local authorities on Wednesday started to kill and dispose of some 459,000 chickens and placed a ban on the transportation of 620,000 hens at four other farms inside a ten-kilometer radius, public broadcaster NHK reported.

Workers at the farm in question found several dead chickens on Tuesday, with preliminary testing detecting the bird flu virus, the report said.

The prefectural government convened an emergency meeting on Wednesday morning. It was reported that genetic tests revealed the birds were infected with the highly pathogenic H5 strain of the bird flu virus.Hokkaido officials plan to complete the cull by Oct. 30 and the disinfection of the henhouses by Nov. 2, the report said.

A bird flu expert said an outbreak can happen anywhere, as migratory birds possibly carrying the virus use various routes to reach Japan, noting that people around the nation should be on alert.

U.S. military strikes another alleged drug boat in Pacific, killing 3

Washington, Oct. 23 (UNI) : The U.S. military on Wednesday struck one more suspected drug-trafficking vessel in international waters in the eastern Pacific, killing all three people aboard, U.S. Defence Secretary Pete Hegseth said Wednesday night.

"Today ... the Department of War carried out yet another lethal kinetic strike on a vessel operated by a Designated Terrorist Organization (DTO). Yet again, the now-deceased terrorists were engaged in narco-trafficking in the Eastern Pacific," he wrote on social media platform X.Hegseth again accused the vessel of carrying narcotics, saying it was traveling along a known narco-trafficking transit route.

"These strikes will continue, day after day. These are not simply drug runners -- these are narco-terrorists bringing death and destruction to our cities ... We will find them and kill them, until the threat to the American people is extinguished," he said.

Colombian President Gustavo Petro slammed the U.S. strike as "murder".

"The attack on another boat in the Pacific, we don't know if it's Ecuadorean or Colombian, left some dead," Petro wrote on X. "It is still murder. Whether in the Caribbean or Pacific, the U.S. government strategy violates the norms of international law."Colombia's Foreign Ministry said in a separate statement that the United States must halt the attacks.The U.S. military previously carried out seven such operations in the Caribbean Sea from September, mainly against boats accused of trafficking drugs from Venezuela to the United States. The total death toll has risen to at least 37, including the deaths in the latest two strikes in the eastern Pacific, reportedly near Colombia's Pacific coast.

Lithuanian Defence Minister Dovile Sakaliene resigns

Vilnius, Oct 23 (UNI) : Lithuanian Defence Minister Dovile Sakaliene has resigned after a week-long dispute with Prime Minister Inga Ruginiene over the country's military budget, marking a rare public split within the Baltic nation's leadership.

The rift reportedly began after an off-the-record meeting on October 14, during which Defence Ministry officials urged journalists and social media influencers to pressure the government into increasing defence spending to 5 per cent of GDP - the target set by NATO.Prime Minister Ruginiene condemned the meeting as "sabotage" and said she had lost confidence in Sakaliene's leadership.

On Wednesday, Sakaliene announced her resignation on Facebook, citing "fundamentally different views" with the prime minister. "Just a month ago, I had hoped we could work together, but unfortunately, we cannot," she wrote.

Ruginiene later clarified that she was initiating the dismissal herself, not merely accepting the minister's resignation. "I cannot allow such misunderstandings and issues to occur in a field as important as defence," she said.Speaking to reporters, the outgoing minister defended her record, highlighting the government's growing defence budget, rising enlistment numbers, and what she called the "renewed trust" in Lithuania's armed forces. She expressed hope that her deputies would remain in their posts and that oversight of the defence industry would stay under the Defence Ministry's control.

The controversy centres on the informal meeting held earlier this month at the Defence Ministry, where attendees were reportedly told that Lithuania's 2026 defence budget would stand at 4.87% of GDP - below NATO's stated benchmark.

2 dead after being swept to sea by strong winds in southeast Melbourne

Melbourne, Oct. 23 (UNI) : Two men drowned after being swept into the ocean in southeast Melbourne amid severe winds that hit the Australian state of Victoria on Wednesday.

Police on Thursday said one of the two men was a British national who was surfing in extreme conditions, and the other was his friend who tried to rescue him.

Victoria Police said in a statement that emergency services were called to reports of two men in trouble in the water at Frankston Beach, 38 km southeast of central Melbourne, on Wednesday afternoon.

The two men were located unresponsive in the water by a police helicopter and winched back to shore, but could not be revived.

Australia's Bureau of Meteorology (BoM) on Wednesday morning issued a severe weather warning for destructive winds for almost the entirety of Victoria. Maximum wind speeds exceeded 120 km per hour in the state's southwest and 90 km per hour in Melbourne.The State Emergency Service said on Thursday that it responded to more than 1,400 requests for help on Wednesday, the majority of which related to trees that had fallen across roads and properties.

India will "sharply reduce" Russian oil imports by year-end: Donald Trump

Washington/ New Delhi , Oct 23 (UNI) : President Donald Trump has reiterated his claim that India will "sharply reduce" its imports of Russian oil by the end of this year, citing what he described as a personal assurance from Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

Speaking at the White House alongside NATO Secretary General Mark Rutte, President Trump said India currently sources nearly 40 percent of its crude oil from Russia but plans to phase it out in the coming months.

"India, as you know, told me that they would stop. It is a process; you can't just stop it. But by the end of the year, they will be down to almost nothing. That's a big thing," the President said.

The President added that the reduction would be gradual to maintain global market stability. "India has been great. I spoke to Prime Minister Modi yesterday, and they have been absolutely great," he told reporters.

Trump's remarks come days after he claimed that Prime Minister Modi had assured him New Delhi would halt its purchases of Russian oil. He also linked potential US tariffs to India's energy policy, warning that high import duties on Indian goods would remain in place until

the country ceased buying oil from Moscow.

"If they want to say that, then they'll just continue to pay massive tariffs, and they don't want to do that," Trump said during an earlier interaction aboard Air Force One.

Trump's statement shows continued pressure on New Delhi to align more closely with US sanctions against Moscow.

However, the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) has denied that any such assurance was made, emphasising that India's energy policy is driven by national interest, prioritising stable prices and secure supplies.

India has repeatedly stressed that its energy policy was focused on ensuring stable domestic prices amid a growing population.

The US has already imposed 50 per cent tariffs on certain Indian imports, of which 25 per cent was due to New Delhi's Russian crude imports.

The US leader said he plans to discuss Beijing's Russian energy and oil trade with Jinping, aiming to pressure Moscow into negotiating a peace agreement.

Trump also criticized his predecessors, Joe Biden and Barack Obama, blaming their policies for driving China and Russia closer together.

Russia condemns US attack on Venezuelan vessel in the Caribbean

Moscow, Oct 23 (UNI) : Russia has condemned the US' actions in the Caribbean against Venezuelan vessels, after its navy downed another ship which Washington alleged was carrying narcotics, killing 34 people.

Affirming its full support to Caracas, Russian Foreign Ministry spokeswoman Maria Zakharova said on Thursday that the priority is to avoid any further escalation, adding that missile strikes against civilian vessels in international waters, is a blatant violation of maritime navigation laws.

In recent months, the Pentagon has been increasing the number of naval, air and land assets deployed throughout the Caribbean, in the US Southern Command area of authority, in its battle against what President Donald Trump has labelled "narco-terrorism", which he alleged is emanating from the Latin American nation.

"The forceful actions of the American military (in the Caribbean Sea) are raising more and more questions. There is information about the deaths of Venezuelan, Colombian and Trinidadian citizens, although a number of sources claim that they could have simply been fishermen," Zakharova told Russian media.

US imposes sanctions on Russia's largest oil companies amid Ukraine conflict

Washington, Oct 23 (UNI) : US President Donald Trump announced new sanctions targeting Russia's two largest oil companies, Rosneft and Lukoil, aiming to pressure Moscow to end the ongoing war in Ukraine.

The announcement came after months of stalled diplomacy and increasing frustration with Russian President Vladimir Putin's actions.

"Today is a very big day. Look, these are tremendous sanctions. These are very big. Those are against their two big oil companies... We hope that the war will be settled. We

just answered having to do with the various forms of missiles and everything else that we're looking at. But we don't think that's going to be necessary,"Trump said during a White House interaction with journalists while hosting NATO Secretary General Mark Rutte.The US Department of the Treasury also imposed sanctions that freeze the assets of Rosneft and Lukoil in the United States and bar American entities from financial dealings with them.

All subsidiaries owned 50 pc or more by these companies are also

blocked. Trump criticized the ongoing conflict's toll, noting, "We would like to see them just take the line that has been formed over quite a long period of time and go home. Last week they had almost 8,000 soldiers killed. Many Russians and Ukrainians were killed last week. We think it's ridiculous and we'd like to have it end... I think they both want peace at this point. it's almost four years... If I were president, it never would have started."When asked why sanctions were intensified now, Trump replied, "I just felt it was time. We've waited a long time." NATO

Malaysia looks forward to Japanese role in semiconductor investment

Kuala Lumpur, Oct 23 (UNI) : Malaysia, as the current chairman of the ASEAN is looking forward to a greater role by Japan in advancing technology transfer and front-end semiconductor investment across the region, said Foreign Minister Datuk Seri Md Hasan.

"I think ASEAN's partnership with Japan has reached the level of a strategic comprehensive partnership.

We have no major issues with Japan, but we would like to see Tokyo take on a greater role in technology and artificial intelligence," the minister told reporters of the summit,

during a visit to the International Media Centre ahead of the 47th ASEAN Summit and Related Summits in Kuala Lumpur.

"In terms of trade between ASEAN and Japan, there are no concerns. What we want now is for Japan to contribute more in terms of technology transfer - especially as Malaysia chairs ASEAN this year,"he added.

The summits will also mark the diplomatic debut of Japan's first female prime minister, Sanae Takaichi, who recently assumed office in a historic moment in Japanese politics, following a coalition

agreement between her Liberal Democratic Party (LDP) and the Japan Innovation Party (JIP).

Hasan said that ASEAN hopes for Tokyo to take a more active approach, and go beyond its current capacity as a supporting party in the regional supply chain, investing directly in front-end sectors, particularly semiconductor manufacturing.

"We (Malaysia) have strong bilateral ties with Japan, and ASEAN has its own multilateral framework. That's why we've upgraded our engagement with Japan to a Strategic Comprehensive Partnership," he said.

Secretary General Mark Rutte praised Trump's efforts to "break the deadlock" with Russia and work toward peace.

"The next big thing is Ukraine-Russia. NATO wants to help deliver your vision of peace in Ukraine. Thank you for all you're doing, including initiating dialogue with Putin."

The sanctions aim to cut off critical funding to Russia's war machine and weaken its economy.

US Treasury Secretary Scott Bessent emphasized, "Now is the time to stop the killing and call for an immediate ceasefire. Given President Putin's refusal to

end this senseless war, Treasury is sanctioning Russia's two largest oil companies."Rosneft and Lukoil together export about 3.1 million barrels of oil per day, representing a significant source of revenue for Moscow.

The move follows similar sanctions imposed recently by the UK and is aligned with the European Union's latest 19th sanctions package against Russia.Trump has declined to provide Ukraine with Tomahawk missiles, citing the extensive training required, calling such assistance "too far out in the future."

Russia open to diplomacy for arms control with US: Deputy FM Sergey Ryabkov

Moscow, Oct 23 (UNI) : Russia remains open to political and diplomatic solutions in the field of arms control, despite its ever-growing tensions with the US and its allies in the NATO and the EU, Deputy Foreign Minister Sergey Ryabkov said on Wednesday.

"The clearest example is our withdrawal from the moratorium on deploying intermediate- and shorter-range ground-based missiles, given the ongoing US and Western efforts to position similar weapons in Europe and the Asia-Pacific," Ryabkov said at a meeting on the fundamentals of Russia's nuclear non-proliferation policy, reports state media.

"Nevertheless, we are keeping the door open for political and diplomatic solutions in the future."

Ryabkov warned that if Washington refuses Moscow's latest proposal regarding the New START Treaty, the result would be a "complete vacuum" in arms control and an "increased risk of nuclear escalation."

He noted, however, that no meaningful dialogue currently exists between the two sides on nuclear non-proliferation, nor is there any prospect of resuming data exchanges under the treaty.



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Bengaluru Bulls crush Gujarat Giants 54–26 to seal top-four spot



New Delhi, Oct 23 (IANS) :The Bengaluru Bulls were at their dominant best as they crushed the Gujarat Giants with a massive 54–26 victory at the Thyagaraj Indoor Stadium in New Delhi on Thursday. With this comprehensive win, the Bulls not only secured two crucial points but also confirmed their place in the top four of the standings. The Bulls outclassed their opponents in every department - from raiding to defence - and never allowed the Giants to settle into the contest.

Bengaluru Bulls made a flying start against Gujarat Giants despite conceding the first point of the match. The Giants opened the scoring through a successful raid by Himanshu Singh, but the Bulls quickly bounced back. Alireza Mirzaian produced a brilliant two-point raid to turn the game

in the Bulls’ favour at 2–1, and Deepak Sankar followed it up with a strong tackle to extend their lead.

The Bulls continued their aggressive play and completely dominated the early exchanges. Within the first three minutes, they inflicted an all out, taking a massive 9-point lead - the fastest all out of the season for the Bulls and second fastest of the season.

Gujarat Giants picked up a few points, but the Bengaluru Bulls were in total control. Their raiders and defenders worked in perfect coordination, keeping the Giants under pressure throughout. By the time the Strategic Time Out was called in the first half, the Bulls had built a commanding 17–4 lead, showing their all-round dominance.

The Bulls carried their momentum into the next phase of the match, starting the resumption with a

brilliant tackle that sent Aryavardhan Navale off the mat and added another point to their tally. Their defence looked sharp, and their coordination was spot-on. The Bulls continued to dominate every aspect of the game, and the highlight came soon after when they inflicted a second all out, extending their lead to 22–5. The team showed no signs of slowing down, maintaining relentless pressure on the Gujarat Giants. As the first half progressed, the Bulls’ raiders and defenders worked in perfect sync, not giving the Giants any room to recover. They went on to inflict a third all out of the half, stretching their lead to a massive 34–7. By the time the whistle blew for halftime, the Bengaluru Bulls were firmly in command with a 36–7 lead, showcasing complete dominance on both ends of the mat.

Pratika Rawal joins elite list with World Cup century

Navi Mumbai, Oct 23 (UNI) : Young opener Pratika Rawal struck her maiden World Cup century to etch her name in the record books, as India's opening duo produced a historic double hundred stand against New Zealand in their ICC Women's World Cup clash at the DY Patil Stadium here.

Rawal reached her milestone in the 39th over, guiding a full delivery from New Zealand's Rosemary Mair to point for a single in the ICC WWC match here today.

She removed her helmet, raised her bat in joy, and was warmly hugged by

partner Jemimah Rodrigues as head coach Amol Muzumdar stood applauding the landmark effort.

The hundred capped a composed and mature innings from the 22-year-old, who had earlier made promising starts in the tournament but finally converted one into a big score. Her effort came on the same day that senior opener Smriti Mandhana produced a record-breaking ton, making this only the third instance in Women's ODI World Cup history where both openers have scored centuries in the same innings. The previous

pairs to achieve this rare feat were England's Lynne Thomas and Enid Bakewell against International XI in 1973, and Australia's Lindsay Reeler and Ruth Buckstein versus the Netherlands in 1988.

Pratika's century was also the 41st individual WODI hundred of the year — well clear of the 29 recorded in 2024 — underscoring a prolific year for women's cricket. India Women now lead the list for most individual hundreds by a team in a calendar year with 10 in 2025, ahead of New Zealand's 8 in 2018 and South Africa's 8 this year.

Meghalaya Karate Championship begins

Shillong, Oct 23 (UNI) : The 31st State Karate Championship 2025 began today at the JN Indoor Stadium here in Meghalaya with a flurry of action from the bright young talents of the martial art form.

Ministry sets draft rules for Sports bodies, boards and tribunals

New Delhi, Oct 23 (UNI) : The Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports has drafted three sets of draft Rules, namely, Draft National Sports Governance (National Sports Bodies) Rules, Draft National Sports Governance (National Sports Board) Rules, and Draft National Sports Governance (National Sports Tribunal) Rules.

These Rules have been formulated to facilitate the implementation of the National Sports Governance Act, 2025. The National Sports Governance Act, 2025, was passed by the Lok Sabha on August 11, 2025 and Rajya Sabha on August 12, 2025, and received Presidential assent on August 18, 2025.

The Act aims to address the challenges and impediments in the governance of sports bodies and to establish a comprehensive framework for the governance and promotion of sports in India.

The Act seeks to ensure ethical practices, fair play across all levels of sport, safeguard the interests of sportspersons as the primary stakeholders, and create a robust ecosystem for sports in the country.

Draft National Sports Governance (National Sports Bodies) Rules provide the framework for the inclusion of Sportspersons of Outstanding Merit, composition of the General Body and Executive Committee, election procedures, and disqualification criteria for members of National Sports Bodies and Regional Sports Federations.

They also outline provisions for the National Sports Election Panel and specify procedures for registration and periodic updating of affiliate units with the National Sports Board.

Draft National Sports Governance (National Sports Board) Rules prescribe the structure, functions and composition of the National Sports Board, including the constitution of the Search-cum-Selection Committee, manner of appointment of the Chairperson and Members, staffing arrangements (as per government procedure), and provision for relaxation by the Central Government where applicable.

Draft National Sports Governance (National Sports Tribunal) Rules define the institutional framework of the National Sports Tribunal, governing the appointment, tenure, and service conditions of the Chairperson, Members, and staff (as per government procedure).

Ministry of Railways Sanctions Upgradation of Electric Traction System Between Medchal – Mudkhed & Mahbubnagar – Dhone Sections

Hyderabad, Oct 23 : The project between Medchal – Mudkhed section is estimated to cost around Rs 193.26 Crores and between Mahbubnagar – Dhone section to cost around Rs 122.81 Crore.

Ministry of Railways has sanctioned the proposal for upgradation of electric traction system between Medchal – Mudkhed & Mahbubnagar – Dhone sections. The estimated cost for this upgradation project between Medchal – Mudkhed is around Rs. 193.26 crores and between Mahbubnagar – Dhone is around Rs 122.81 Crore. At present, the electric traction is available with the capacity of 1X 25 KV, while the proposal for upgradation of this system to 2 X 25KV electric traction system has now been sanctioned by the Rail Ministry. The Upgradation of electric traction system mainly involves modification of circuit breakers, switching stations and installing additional conductors in the existing system.

These Projects fall majorly in the State of Telangana & small portions in the states of Andhra Pradesh & Maharashtra. Medchal – Mudkhed section stretched for a distance of 225 Route Kms and Mahbubnagar – Dhone section for a distance of 184 Route kms are single line sections connecting Northern and Southern parts of the country with capital city region of Telangana. The electrification of these crucial sections along with Dhone bypass line has been sanctioned by Ministry of Railways in August, 2023 and the works have already started and are progressing well. The doubling of the section between Secunderabad – Mahbubnagar was

BJP's slams Omar Abdullah-led govt for 'betraying people's trust'

General Manager, Western Railway, Vivek Kumar Gupta, visits Bandra terminus

Mumbai, Oct 23 : In view of the heavy passenger traffic during the ongoing festive season of Diwali and Chhath Puja, General Manager, Western Railway, Shri Vivek Kumar Gupta, visited Bandra Terminus Station on 21st October 2025 and conducted a detailed inspection of the passenger facilities, crowd management arrangements and special train operations to ensure smooth handling of the increased passenger traffic. He was accompanied by senior officers from Western Railway Headquarters and Mumbai Central Division. During the visit, the General Manager inspected various areas of Bandra Terminus including the concourse, holding areas, ticket counters, waiting halls and circulating area, and reviewed the preparedness of the station to handle the festive rush effectively.

Following the inspection, Shri Vivek Kumar Gupta addressed the media and briefed them regarding the extensive arrangements made by the

Railways' to manage the festive rush and provide comfortable travel to passengers.

According to a press release issued by Mr Vineet Abhishek, Chief Public Relations Officer of Western Railway, during the press briefing the General Manager shared that Indian Railways is operating more than 12,000 trips of holiday special trains during the current festive season. Holding areas, extra ticket counters, drinking water facilities and other amenities are being provided at major stations across the country, while over 12 lakh railway employees are working round-the-clock to ensure smooth and safe travel for passengers during this period.

He further added that, Western Railway is running more than 2,400 trips with nearly 80 pairs of special trains to cater to the festive rush of Diwali and Chhath Puja, most of which are north-bound. Of these, 1,586 trips originate from Gujarat, 738 from Maharashtra and 90 from Madhya Pradesh. These

include almost 50 trips of unreserved special trains.

Mr Gupta said that, to provide ease of ticketing, a Mobile UTS facility has been introduced, through which booking staff directly approach passengers for issuing tickets. To manage the additional inflow of passengers, extra personnel from the Railway Protection Force (RPF) and Government Railway Police (GRP) have been deployed at stations to guide passengers and ensure safe, orderly movement in queues. Trains, including both regular and special services, are being escorted by RPF personnel for enhanced safety.

Mr Gupta stated that keeping in mind the safety of passengers, CCTV systems are being monitored 24x7 to avoid any untoward incident. War Rooms have been set up for crowd management at all sensitive stations and are manned round-the-clock by Western Railway officers and staff. He further added that, Free drinking water and adequate toilet facilities are being provided

at all major stations for the convenience of passengers.

At Bandra Terminus, specific measures have been implemented to handle the exceptionally high festive rush. During the period from 15th to 21st October 2025, approximately 70,000 passengers were able to travel to their destinations from Bandra Terminus. During this period to cater to passenger demand, 466 trips were run from Udhna/ Surat, 468 from Mumbai Terminus, 254 from Mumbai Central and 72 from Valsad.

Mr Gupta further said that to ensure smooth crowd flow and passenger comfort, a temporary holding area of 350 square metres with a capacity of 450 passengers and a permanent holding area of 702 square metres with a capacity of 1,000 passengers have been created at Bandra Terminus. Both holding areas are equipped with adequate lighting, fans and a public announcement system to keep passengers informed about train movements. A total of 70 licensed
