

Boat festival on Krishna river canceled due to floods

Vijayawada, Oct 1 (UNI) : The boat raid, known locally as Teppotsavam, of the Goddess Durga temple here has been cancelled this year.This event, usually held on the Krishna river as part of the annual Navaratri celebrations at the Kanaka Durga Temple, is an important tradition that draws thousands of devotees each year.

The temple authorities attributed the cancellation of the boat festival to heavy flood water in the river Krishna at Prakasam barrage. As per the tradition, processional deities of Goddess Durga and Mallikharjuna Swamy are taken on a decorated and illuminated boat on the river Krishna. Over one lakh people throng the Prakasam barrage and the embankment of the river to witness the event.

The Krishna is in spate with over 6.50 lakh cusecs of inflow being discharged downstream into the sea by lifting 69 crest gates of barrage.

A danger signal two was issued at the Prakasam barrage.

Power tariff will not be hiked : CM

(Standard Post Bureau) Vizianagaram, Oct 1 : Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu today made it clear that power tariff will not be hiked and also promised to consider to reduce the power tariff, if possible.

The Chief Minister participated in NTR Bharosa social security pension disbursement programme at Datti village in the Gajapatinagar constituency of Vizianagaram district today. The Chief Minister personally handed over pensions to Ponturu Appalaraju, who is suffering from a kidney ailment, and his mother, by visiting their home.

He interacted with some of the beneficiaries of welfare schemes. Later addressing a public meeting, the Chief Minister announced that the power tariff would not be hiked and promised to consider reduction of existing power tariff in the future. “For the first time in the country’s history, power charges were reduced by 13 paise per unit starting November 13 in Andhra Pradesh,” the Chief Minister announced.

Naidu alleged that the previous YSRCP Government had imposed a burden of Rs 32,000 crore on power consumers by increasing tariffs nine times. The Chief Minister highlighted that the AP Government is providing free solar rooftops to farmers under the PM Kusum scheme, as well as to the SC and ST households. Additionally, the highest subsidy of Rs 98,000 is being provided for BC households, he observed.

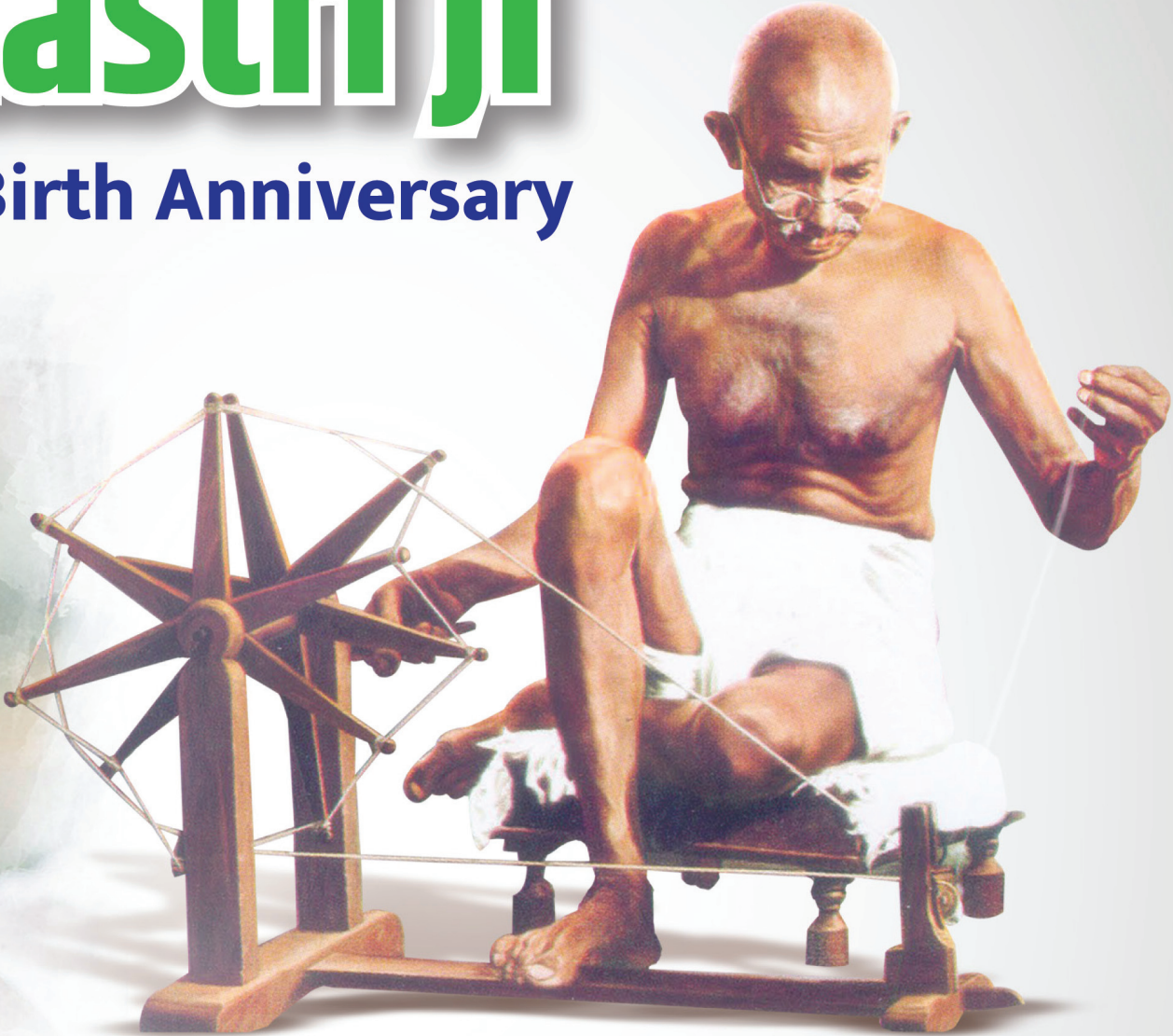
“The State Government has spent Rs 48,019 crore on social security pensions in the last 16 months. In Vizianagaram district alone, pensions worth Rs 117 crore have been distributed to 2,75,682 beneficiaries today. Andhra Pradesh is distributing the highest amount of pensions in the country, with 59 percent of pensioners being women,” the Chief Minister acknowledged.

The Chief Minister revealed that under the Talliki Vandanam scheme, Rs10,090 crore has been deposited into the accounts of mothers. “An amount of Rs 1,718 crore was spent on

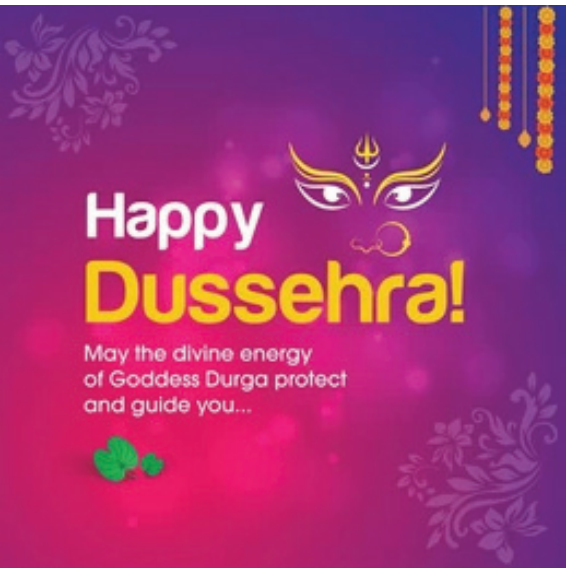

Mass Shramdaan
On the occasion of Pandit Deendayal

Upadhyay Jayanti on 25th September 2025, a mass-level Shramdaan was organised under the theme “Ek Din, Ek Ghanta, Ek Saath”. At Solapur Railway Station, Additional Divisional Railway Manager (ADRM) Shri Ansumali Kumar administered the Swachhata Shapath to about 200 volunteers, followed by cleanliness drives. Around 500 meters

of area was cleaned and 800 kg of garbage collected, later handed over to local bodies. Officers including Sr.DME, Sr.DCM, CMS along with staff, supervisors, passengers and depots across the division, with 1.5 tonnes of garbage collected by 550

Congress slams PM for backing Trump’s Gaza plan, accuses him of ignoring Palestinian rights

New Delhi, Oct 1 (UNI) : The Congress today hit out at Prime Minister Narendra Modi for supporting US President Donald Trump’s newly unveiled 20-point plan for Gaza, accusing the PM of sidelining crucial issues and displaying “moral cowardice”.
In a post on X, Congress general secretary Jairam Ramesh alleged that Modi’s support appears aimed at appeasing his “good friend” Trump and in solidarity with Israel’s Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu, while ignoring the fundamental rights and voices of the Palestinian people.
“To appease his good friend President Trump and in solidarity with his other good friend Bibi Netanyahu, Prime Minister Modi has welcomed President Trump’s new 20-point plan for Gaza. But fundamental and disturbing

questions on the plan remain,” Jairam Ramesh said.Highlighting flaws in the plan, Ramesh posed questions to the PM. “Where are the people of Gaza themselves in the system of governance proposed? Where is the roadmap for a full-fledged Palestinian state to come into being? How much longer will the US and Israel continue to ignore Palestinian statehood, which has already been recognised by 157 member-countries of the UN, with India having led the way in November 1988? Where is the accountability for the genocide that has been carried out in Gaza over the past twenty months?”
Condemning Modi’s “silence on atrocities on civilians of Gaza”, the Rajya Sabha MP said, “The PM has maintained a complete silence on the horrific atrocities that have

led to the killing of tens of thousands of civilians in Gaza. This is extreme moral cowardice and a total betrayal of all that India has stood for”.
Notably, Prime Minister Modi had welcomed President Trump’s announcement of a comprehensive plan to end the Gaza conflict, saying that the “plan provides a viable pathway to long-term and sustainable peace, security and development for the Palestinian and Israeli people, as well as for the larger West Asian region”.On Monday, at the White House, US President Trump and Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu announced a 20-point plan in Washington to end the Gaza war, secure the release of hostages within 72 hours, disarm Hamas, and establish a transitional governing body for the Strip.

State Women's Commission committed to protection of women: Rupali Chakankar

Kolhapur, Oct 1 (UNI) : The Maharashtra State Women’s Commission is committed to uplifting the status of women in society and fighting against injustice towards them,” Commission Chairperson Rupali Chakankar said today.
Addressing a training session on the Prevention of Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (POSH) Act, 2013 here she

stressed the need for a change in men’s mindset and urged women to show courage in coming forward to file complaints. Despite strict provisions made by the government for women’s safety, many women still hesitate to register complaints, she regretted. The event was jointly organised by the State Women’s Commission, the District Women and Child

Welfare Department, Kolhapur, and the Maharashtra Industrial Development Corporation (MIDC), Kolhapur.
Chakankar stressed that the POSH Act applies to every workplace and called for establishment of grievance redressal committees in all government, private establishments, and organisations.

Illegal constructions linked to gangster Andekar demolished in Pune

Pune, Oct 1 (UNI) The Pune Municipal Corporation’s encroachment department, under police protection, has demolished illegal structures linked to gangster Bandu Andekar and his family, said Deputy Commissioner of Police Krushikesh Rawale.
The houses, tin sheds, and toilets illegally built by Andekar and his family in front of and around his residence were razed during the operation.
In total, encroachments spread over 1,500 sq. ft. were removed.
Bandu Andekar, accused of murdering his own grandson Ayush Komkar to avenge the killing of former corporator Vanraj Andekar, has landed behind of his family behind bars.
Pune Police have vowed to uproot the Andekar gang entirely, squeezing their financial sources as well, he said.
The demolition drive was carried out as part of this larger crackdown, said Rawale.

Former Home Minister contests attack case cosure, alleges cops submitted wrong report

Mumbai, Oct 1 (UNI) :Home Minister Anil Deshmukh said at a press conference that he plans to produce a forensic report and use it to challenge the closure of a police case that looked into an attack on him in 2024, before the Maharashtra assembly elections."The forensic report has clearly stated that my (Anil Deshmukh's) car was hit by a stone, especially a large stone weighing ten kilograms. Since the road had a big curve, the speed of the car was very low. The stone broke the glass and injured my forehead, it said. I will produce this forensic report soon and take appropriate action based on it. I have seen the forensic report. I was the Home Minister of Maharashtra. I got to see that report from the police department," Anil Deshmukh told media persons.
Deshmukh alleged that BJP leader Parinay Fuke called the incident "fake" and the then superintendent of police gave a statement before the investigation was complete, due to political pressure.
Maharashtra Chief

Minister Devendra Fadnavis dismissed the incident as a "Salim-Javed screenplay," Deshmukh said.Deshmukh said Nagpur rural police should have investigated and arrested the two who allegedly threw stones, but instead submitted a 'B Summary' report and closed the case, calling it "a fabricated attack.""They should have submitted the 'A Summary' report since the accused were not found by the police, but instead, they submitted a 'B Summary' report and closed the case. Hence, we will take appropriate steps based on the forensic report which has come out," Anil Deshmukh said.
Former Maharashtra Home Minister Anil Deshmukh held a press conference today after Nagpur rural police closed the case and sought court permission to prosecute the complainant.
The Nagpur rural police closed the investigation into the 2024 stone attack on Anil Deshmukh after declaring the case "false" through a 'B Summary' report filed in a local court.

Pune, Oct 1 (UNI) : Mahatma Gandhi’s behavior reflected respect for the views of others. Today, when we talk of “Ram Rajya”, a different interpretation is projected. However, when Gandhi talked of "Ram Rajya" he used “Ram” only as a symbol; he never meant a “Hindu state”, what he envisioned was an ideal state, said former Supreme Court Justice Abhay Oka.
Adopting a scientific outlook is very important in the 21st century. Science today has permeated our everyday life. A scientific outlook arises from curiosity and a spirit of reform, said former Justice Oka here today, while inaugurating Gandhi week.Having a scientific approach does not mean opposing religion. Just as times have changed, religion too has seen reforms from time to time. A scientific outlook is essential for human welfare and for living a cultured life, said Oka.Mahatma Gandhi’s birth anniversary on October 2 is celebrated as 'International Day of Non-Violence'. To mark the occasion, the Maharashtra Gandhi Smarak Nidhi and Yuvak Kranti Dal have jointly organized an eight-day ‘Gandhi Week’ at Gandhi Bhavan, Kothrud, from October 1 to October 8.Among the dignitaries present were Symbiosis founder-president Dr. Shantaram Balwant Mujumdar, president Dr. Kumar Saptarshi, senior litterateur Lakshmikant Deshmukh, trustees Anwar Rajan, Ulhas Pawar, Abhay Chhajed, M.S. Jadhav, Gopal Gunale, Buddhist monk Bhante Sudarshan, Muslim leader Isaq Sheikh, Jain representative Renuka Kankaria, Sikh leader Puneet Kaur, Christian priest Pradeep Chandekar, Jewish leader Yosef Nogavkar, and Hindu Guru Ghaisas.
In 1931, the Karachi Congress had passed a resolution against the death penalty. Having worked in the judiciary for years, I too believe there should be no death penalty, said former Justice Oka.
Fundamental duties in Article 51A of the Constitution are very important

because they call upon us to uphold the Constitution. The right to personal liberty and freedom of expression are enshrined in the Constitution. Expression through plays, cinema, and lectures is essential for meaningful freedom. But along with asserting one’s own freedom, one must respect the freedom of others, said Justice Oka.Gandhi emphasized harmony and brotherhood. Just as there is noise, air, and water pollution, there is also “thought pollution, he said. Last year we saw how river pollution occurred in the name of religion, though no religion teaches us to pollute rivers, he added.Dr. S.B. Mujumdar said, Many judges, after retirement, rest or travel. But Justice Oka has been engaging with people and understanding their feelings, which is noteworthy, he said.
Between 1920 and 1947, Gandhi was at the forefront of all major national events. By using truth, non-violence, fasting, and satyagraha as weapons, he secured freedom for the country. Gandhi was a visionary leader and skillfully “marketed” his ideas— by changing his attire, drinking goat’s milk, living in ashrams, spinning the charkha, and promoting Swadeshi, said Mazumdar.
Kumar Saptarshi said that Religion is what teaches a person to live for others; going against it is irreligion. Justice Oka is working to make the law understandable to the common man. Hinduism, at its core, stands for non-violence and love, but nationalism today is being distorted by blind devotion, he added.
Lakshmikant Deshmukh said after Gandhi’s assassination, national leaders decided to build Gandhi Bhavans across the country to spread his ideas. Pune’s Gandhi Bhavan has since become a cultural landmark.Today, Gandhi’s philosophy is being used to address contemporary issues. Sonam Wangchuk, a present-day leader working to spread Gandhian ideas, has been unlawfully arrested and should be released soon. Gandhi’s thoughts are eternal, and truth always triumphs, he said.

Constitution Satyagraha march enters Wardha, Congress ramps up attack on RSS

Mumbai, Oct 1 (UNI) : The Constitution has opened doors to every field by granting personal freedom, freedom of thought, and freedom of expression to people of all castes, religions, and to women.
But under the BJP regime, the Constitution is being trampled upon, said Maharashtra Pradesh Congress Committee President Harshvardhan Sapkal today.
“The BJP has created a system where the poor are made poorer while the rich become richer, and the root cause of this is the RSS. The Bahujan community is only being exploited. Their ideology is that both religious and political power should remain in the hands of a select few. We strongly condemn and denounce this ideology and the RSS’s dark and corrupt 100 years,” Sapkal said.
“Now that the RSS has completed a hundred years, just like Shishupal, they too have reached their limit. They must burn the Manusmriti and Bunch of Thoughts and dissolve the RSS,” he added.
The Constitution Satyagraha Padayatra entered Wardha district today. On its third day, the march began from Khadki and it will proceed through Lalwani to reach Wardha.
The march is receiving an overwhelming response from the people. On October 2, the march will arrive at Sevagram Ashram.
The padayatra, led in the presence of Mahatma Gandhi’s great-grandson Tushar Gandhi and Congress State President Harshvardhan Sapkal, saw participation from former minister Rajendra Mulak, Congress leader Charulata Tokas, Shekhar Shende, Wardha District Congress Committee President Manoj Chandurkar, Pradesh Congress General Secretary Anant Mohod, Rajendra Tidke, Sandesh Singhalakar, poet Gyanesh Wakudkar, Karale Guruji, Shailesh Agrawal, Feroz Mithiborwala, leaders of Shiv Sena (Uddhav faction), NCP (Sharad Pawar faction), and various social organizations.

Raj Thackeray likely to be invited to Sena's Dussehra rally

Mumbai, Oct 1 (UNI) : The Uddhav Thackeray-led Shiv Sena will hold its annual Dussehra rally at Shivaji Park, Dadar West, on October 2 at 5pm, following in the footsteps of late Shiv Sena founder Balasaheb Thackeray who began the tradition in 1966. According to Uddhav Thackeray-led Shiv Sena leaders, an invitation to the rally is likely to be extended to Maharashtra Navnirman Sena (MNS) founder Raj Thackeray.If Raj Thackeray

accepts the invitation, it could effectively signal the start of campaigning for the forthcoming local civic body polls in Maharashtra, and most significantly the battle to control the cash-rich Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC), Sena leaders said.
At the Dussehra rally, Uddhav is expected to blow the bugle for the upcoming local body elections, particularly the BMC polls expected to be held in January 2026. If Raj

Thackeray attends the Shiv Sena rally, it would indicate a Shiv Sena-MNS alliance taking on the BJP and the Eknath Shinde-led Shiv Sena.
Meanwhile, Deputy Chief Minister Shinde announced that his Shiv Sena will hold its Dussehra rally at NESCO Centre, Goregaon, at 6 pm (after the Uddhav-led Sena's rally begins at 5 pm), instead of Azad Maidan, as declared earlier.Shinde said the event will be attended only

by people from the Mumbai Metropolitan Region, while party workers from other areas have been directed to assist rain-affected farmers in the Marathwada region, Shinde-led Shiv Sena leaders said.
The Shinde Sena's strategy is to make this rally both a "show of strength" and a "public relations campaign." Senior party ministers and party workers will attend the rally. The Shinde Sena has also linked the Dussehra event to

helping flood victims and raising funds.Both Shiv Senas have intensified their campaigning ahead of their respective Dussehra events. The Uddhav Thackery-led Shiv Sena has released teasers focusing on tradition and the undivided Shiv Sena's legacy, attempting to project the image of the "original Shiv Sena."
Shinde's Shiv Sena has also released a large number of posters and videos to demonstrate its strength.

Tourism Minister flags off new flight service to Tirupati

Rajahmundry, Oct 1 (UNI) :Tourism Minister Kandula Durgesh flagged off the new Rajahmundry-Tirupati flight service at Madhurapudi airport on Wednesday. Union Civil Aviation Minister K Rammohan Naidu and MP Daggupati Purandeswari inaugurated the same service virtually from New Delhi. Alliance airlines launched the new Rajahmundry-Tirupati flight service. Tourism Minister Kandula Durgesh, flanked by MLAs Gorantla Buttechai Chowdary, Adireddy Srinivas, Battula Balaramakrishna and RUDA chairman Boddu Venkataramana Chowdary, flagged of the flight at the Madhurapudi airport.

Flights are scheduled

three days a week, on Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday, providing convenient travel options for passengers in the region. This new route adds to existing connections from Rajahmundry to other major cities and will benefit passengers traveling for religious, business, and personal reasons..

It is part of a broader government effort to boost regional air connectivity in Andhra Pradesh, making travel easier for residents and supporting economic growth. Speaking on the occasion, union Minister Rammohan Naidu said that flight services to Delhi and Mumbai from Rajahmundry were already started earlier, adding that now they have

become the most demanded air services in the country. They are now running at full occupancy, reflecting the capacity the Rajahmundry Airport has.

He described the launch of flight services from the cultural capital Rajahmundry to the spiritual capital Tirupati as a gift to all the residents of the two Godavari districts. As soon as the sale of flight tickets from Rajahmundry to Tirupati was launched, all tickets were booked immediately, he said.

“The 2nd terminal at Rajahmundry Airport is being constructed and the work is progressing briskly and it will be made available soon. In view of the public demand to start air services from Rajahmundry to

Shirdi, Goa, Ahmedabad, Varanasi and other places, steps will be taken to launch the services soon,” the Civil Aviation Minister said. Stating that the flight services from Rajahmundry to other important destinations are running with full occupancy, which is a very happy development, he emphasized the need of developing Rajahmundry city in the backdrop of the upcoming Godavari Pushkaralu and promised to develop the city. Tourism Minister Kandula Durgesh thanked union Minister K Rammohan Naidu and MP D Purandeswari for realizing the long pending dream of a direct flight service to Tirupati from Rajahmundry.

TTD EO inspects Ckkrasnanam arrangements in Tirumala

Tirumala, Oct 1 (UNI) : TTD Executive Officer Anil Kumar Singhal today inspected Srivari Pushkarini on the occasion of Chakrasnanam, scheduled to be held on the last day of the Srivari Salakatla Brahmotsavam on October 2.

Speaking on the occasion, along with JEO V. Veerabrahmam, District SP L. Subbaraidu and CVSO K.V. Muralikrishna, here, Anil Kumar said that gates have been set up to allow devotees to enter and exit the Pushkarini without any inconvenience.

TTD officials, vigilance

and police were asked to coordinate and make foolproof arrangements for the devotees, he said.

Meanwhile, Snapana Tirumanjanam and Chakrasnanam are performed for the ceremonial idols of Sridevi, Bhudevi, and Sri Malayappa Swamy, along with Chakrathalwar, between 6 am and 9 am.

The EO appealed to the devotees to take a holy bath in the Pushkarini at any time, as the sacred hours last throughout the day on the day of Chakrasnanam.

They should enter

through the designated gates in the Pushkarini area, in a phased manner with patience as per the rules prescribed by TTD.

During the Chakrasnanam, 1,000 police personnel, 1300 TTD Vigilance Department personnel, 140 personnel from NDRF, Fire, and other

departments have taken strong measures, the EO said. Swimmers and boats are also made available in Pushkarini to prevent any untoward incidents, he said.

LED screens have also been installed in the temple premises so that devotees can watch the Chakrasnanam live, he added.

Heavy rain likely in AP, says Met Dept

Amaravati, Oct 1 (UNI) : A well-marked low-pressure area over the west-central Bay of Bengal moved north-northwestwards and was centered over the same region at 0830 hours on Wednesday.

The associated cyclonic circulation extends up to 9.6 km above mean sea level, tilting southwestwards with height.

The system is likely to intensify into a depression over the region within the next 12 hours.

Continuing its north-northwestward movement, it may further strengthen into a deep depression and is expected to cross the South Odisha-North Andhra Pradesh coast during the early hours of October 3, according to the Meteorological Centre.

The Met department noted that the Southwest monsoon remains weak over Coastal Andhra Pradesh, Yanam, and

Rayalaseema.

Under its influence, heavy to very heavy rainfall is likely at isolated places in North Coastal Andhra Pradesh and Yanam over the next 48 hours, with heavy rain at isolated locations in Coastal Andhra Pradesh and Yanam during the same period.

Light to moderate rain or thundershowers are expected at a few to several places across Coastal Andhra Pradesh, Yanam, and Rayalaseema over the next seven days.

Thunderstorms accompanied by lightning and strong winds of 40-50 kmph are likely at isolated places in Coastal Andhra Pradesh and Yanam over the next five days, and in Rayalaseema on October 2 and 3.

In the last 24 hours, rainfall was recorded at a few places in Coastal Andhra Pradesh and Yanam, and at one or two locations in Rayalaseema, the report added.

distributing gas cylinders free of cost. In addition, the Stree Shakti scheme was launched to provide free travel for women in RTC buses, with an annual allocation of Rs 2,963 crore. Shift jobs linked to higher risk of kidney stones, study finds

Individuals engaged in shift-based jobs—particularly younger workers and those in less physically demanding roles—may face an elevated risk of developing kidney stones, according to new research published in Mayo Clinic Proceedings.

The study, which analysed data from over 220,000 individuals, found that shift workers are 15% more likely to experience kidney stone events, with lifestyle factors such as body mass index (BMI), hydration levels, and sleep patterns playing a mediating role.

The research, conducted by a team from Sun Yat-sen University in Guangzhou, China, sheds light on a largely overlooked health concern within the growing population of shift workers. It is the first large-scale, population-based cohort study to assess how different patterns of shift work—including night shifts, irregular schedules, and extended durations—are associated with the risk of kidney stones.

“Shift work disrupts circadian rhythms, alters hormone secretion, and is known to adversely affect metabolism and overall lifestyle. Our findings indicate a clear association between shift work and higher kidney stone risk, partially explained by behavioural and physiological changes,” said Dr. Yin Yang, lead author of the study.

Using data from the UK Biobank Study, the researchers tracked participants over a median period of 13.7 years. They found that individuals working night shifts or irregular hours had higher incidence rates of kidney stones compared to those working standard daytime hours. Interestingly, participants with a longer history of shift work appeared to have a slightly reduced risk—possibly reflecting the "healthy worker effect," wherein only those who can physiologically adapt remain in such roles long term.

Kidney stone disease, though preventable, continues to pose a significant public health burden. With global prevalence rates ranging between 1% and 13%, the condition is associated with severe pain, recurrent hospitalisations, and long-term complications including chronic kidney disease and cardiovascular problems.

Dr. Yang highlighted the urgency of proactive measures. “Supporting healthier lifestyle behaviours among shift workers—such as maintaining a healthy BMI, increasing fluid intake, avoiding smoking, and improving sleep quality—could significantly reduce their risk of developing kidney stones,” she said. With shift work becoming increasingly common across sectors such as healthcare, manufacturing, transport, and IT, experts believe these findings call for renewed focus on occupational health frameworks

At least 91 trapped after school building collapse in Indonesia

Jakarta, Oct 1 (UNI) : Indonesia's disaster management agency today said that at least 91 people were trapped after a school building collapsed on September 29 in the Sidoarjo district of East Java province.

Abdul Muhari, spokesperson for the National Disaster Management Agency (BNPB), said that as of last evening, the accident had left three people dead and more than 90 injured, with 26 still hospitalised.

Hundreds of rescuers from various agencies have been deployed to the site. Due to concerns that the use of heavy machinery could trigger further collapse, rescue workers have focused on manual excavation. They are delivering food and water to those trapped under the rubble.

Rescuers at the scene said signs of life have been detected in parts of the collapsed structure, and efforts are being concentrated there. Meanwhile, the BNPB is working with construction experts to draw up a safe debris-clearing plan so that heavy equipment can be used in later stages if necessary.

Qatar, Egypt, Turkey urge Hamas to accept Trump's Gaza plan: Reports

Moscow, Oct 1 (UNI/SPUTNIK) : Qatar, Egypt, and Turkey are urging Hamas to accept US President Donald Trump's plan to resolve the situation in the Gaza Strip, the Axios news portal reported, citing sources.On Monday, Trump unveiled a 20-point plan to resolve the Gaza conflict. The proposal calls, among other things, for an immediate ceasefire and the release of hostages within 72 hours. The plan also stipulates that Hamas and "other groups" must renounce their involvement in governing Gaza, both directly and indirectly.The enclave will be governed by a "technocratic, apolitical Palestinian committee" overseen by an international body headed by Trump.

On Monday night, Qatari Prime Minister Mohammed bin Abdulrahman Al Thani and Egyptian intelligence chief Hassan Rashad presented Trump's plan to Hamas leaders in Doha, the report said on Tuesday. Al-Thani reportedly stated that Hamas would not get a better deal and expressed confidence that Trump truly intends to end the war.

On Tuesday, Al Thani and Rashad met again with Hamas members, this time along with Turkish intelligence chief Ebrahim Kalin, the report added.

Houthis confirm they attacked Minervagracht ship off Yemen

Sanaa, Oct 1 (UNI/SPUTNIK) : Yemen's Ansar Allah movement, also known as the Houthis, confirmed the attack on Dutch ship Minervagracht using a cruise missile for violating the ban on entering Israeli ports.

"The naval force of the Yemeni Armed Forces carried out a military operation targeting the ship (MINERVAGRACHT) owing to the violation of the entry ban to the ports of occupied Palestine by the company that owns the ship. The targeting operation took place in the Gulf of Aden with a cruise missile. The operation resulted in a direct hit on the ship, which caught fire and is now at risk of sinking," the movement said in a statement yesterday.

On Monday, the Dutch-flagged Minervagracht cargo ship was attacked off the coast of Yemen. The incident left two crew members injured.

The Houthis, who control northern Yemen and much of Yemen's Red Sea coast, declared support for Palestine in late 2023. They have launched hundreds of missiles and drones at Israel since the start of the conflict in the Gaza Strip in October 2023.

Most of these attacks were prevented by missile defense systems, but some hits on Israeli territory were recorded. In response, the IDF carried out several large-scale air operations against Houthi targets in Yemen, including ports, power plants, factories and the Sanaa airport.

US govt enters shutdown for first time in nearly 7 years

Washington, Oct 1 (UNI) : The US federal government entered a shutdown at the start of Wednesday as partisan divisions prevented Congress from passing a funding bill, which marks the first government shutdown in nearly seven years.

Hundreds of thousands of federal employees will be forced to take unpaid leave, with some public services potentially suspended or delayed, and the release of economic data possibly impacted as well.

The shutdown commenced hours after the US Senate failed to pass a short-term spending bill that would have temporarily kept the government running. The continuing resolution proposed by Senate Republicans was blocked by Democrats, falling short of the 60 votes required for passage.

In the latest negotiations, healthcare benefits have been one of the core sticking points between the two parties. Democrats are demanding stronger healthcare-related benefits, including an extension of the enhanced subsidies for Affordable Care Act set to expire at the end of the year, as well as restoring the act's coverage eligibility for certain immigrants who are legally present, including refugees and asylum seekers.Republicans, on the other hand, opposed these measures and have been pushing to temporarily maintain current government funding levels to allow more time for negotiations.

Earlier on Tuesday, Republicans and Democrats continued to trade blame, accusing each other of forcing the government into a "shutdown."

Vance blames Democrats for White House shutdown, accuses them of 'hostage takeover'

Washington, Oct 1 (UNI): US Vice President JD Vance placed the blame for the government shutdown squarely on the shoulder of Democrats, accusing them of "hostage taking" over health care demands in his first public remarks since the shutdown began at midnight.

In a Fox News interview Tuesday morning, Vance said Democrats had forced the shutdown to extract concessions on health care funding, a move he argued was reckless and unnecessary, reports CNN. "You don't take the government as a hostage because you want to engage in negotiation about health care costs," Vance said."Let's do that negotiation, but let's do it in the context of actually opening the government and ensuring those essential services are actually provided to the American people."

The VP singled out what he called a "far-left faction" of the Democratic Party, accusing it of holding up a short-term funding bill over Obamacare's premium

support program.

"What makes it extra preposterous is that the programme doesn't even expire until next year," Vance said. "So why are you shutting down the government on October 1?"

Vance insisted the White House remains open to talks on health care costs, but only if Democrats agree to reopen the government first. "We obviously care a lot about lowering health care costs for Americans," he said. "But we're not going to engage in negotiations with hostage takers, which is exactly what the Democrats have done."

He also suggested Democratic leadership would not be able to withstand the political fallout of a prolonged shutdown. "You're going to see more and more Democrats come to the side of reason and reopen government," Vance said.

Democrats have pushed back, accusing Republicans of failing to negotiate in good faith. They argue GOP leaders ignored their concerns

Munich's Oktoberfest opening delayed due to venue inspection after explosions

Munich, Oct 1 (UNI/SPUTNIK): The opening of the traditional German festival Oktoberfest in Munich was postponed today due to a venue inspection following explosions in the city, Munich police said.

Earlier in the day, Munich police said they had launched a large-scale operation following a fire in a residential building deliberately set off amid a family dispute, resulting in one death and one person missing.Booby traps were also discovered at the scene. The Bild tabloid reported, citing sources,

that a man had planted explosive devices in his parents' house. After that, he set it on fire and then committed suicide."We are currently investigating all leads. Possible connections to other locations in Munich are being examined, including Theresienwiese (festival venue). For this reason, the festival's opening is delayed," the police said on X.The police are conducting search operations at the Oktoberfest site and have asked all festival workers to leave the area, the statement added.The BR24

Qatar, Turkey, Egypt urge Hamas leaders to accept US peace proposal amid Trump ultimatum

Ankara, Oct 1 (UNI) : Qatar, Egypt and Turkey have reportedly urged Hamas to quickly accept the 20-point proposal presented by US President Donald Trump to end the war in Gaza, as per Axios.

The three countries – which have been the longest mediators between Israeli authorities and the terror outfit – have met several of the group's commanders in the past 24 hours.

Trump, on Monday unveiled his plan, and gave Hamas an ultimatum – giving them only "three to four days" to accept – or otherwise be destroyed.

Speaking before a gathering of Pentagon generals and admirals in Quantico, Virginia, he warned "We have one signature that we need, and that signature will pay in hell if they don't sign. I hope they sign for their own good and create something

really great."

Political-military officials in both Washington and Jerusalem have been cautiously optimistic, as they expect the headline group Hamas to agree, and most likely with reservations.

While Trump was presenting the plan in Washington, Qatari Prime Minister Md bin Abdulrahman al-Thani and Egyptian intelligence chief Hassan Rashad were briefing Hamas leaders in Doha.

According to a source of the media platform, both had pressed Hamas's senior command to accept the proposal, with al-Thani telling the group the proposal was the best deal he could secure — and that Trump appeared personally committed to seeing it through.

Hamas leaders had not immediately issued a response post the proposal,

about protecting health care subsidies for low-income families and instead allowed the government to close.The standoff marks the first shutdown since President Donald Trump's return to office in January, and it threatens to furlough hundreds of thousands of federal workers, disrupt military pay, and halt a wide range of government services.Both parties are betting the public will blame the other side — a familiar dynamic in Washington, but one with high political stakes.

For Vance, the crisis has become a high-profile test of his role as Trump's deputy and chief negotiator on Capitol Hill.His sharp rhetoric Tuesday reflected both the administration's confidence that Democrats will eventually fold and its determination not to give ground on the shutdown itself.

As the impasse enters its first day, neither party is showing any signs of a compromise, thus compounding fears of a prolonged shutdown with no immediate resolution in sight.

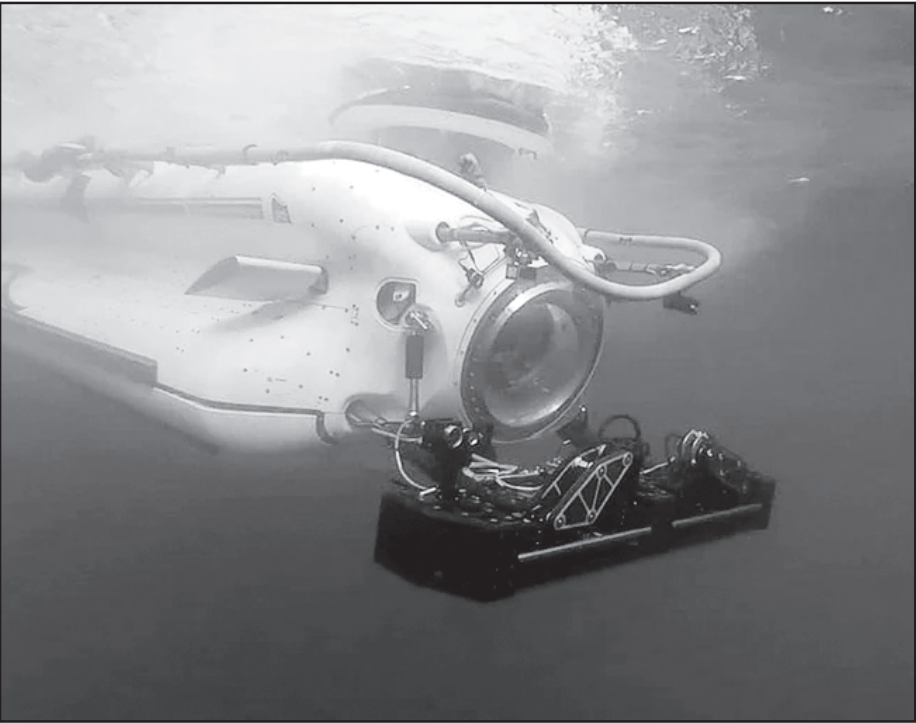

He stressed that Hamas needed to coordinate with other Palestinian factions in Gaza before issuing a formal response, but stressed that Trump's framework "achieves the main goal of ending the war, though some issues in it need clarification and negotiation."Trump's 20-point proposal contains several major concessions to Hamas, including the release of 2,000 Palestinian prisoners and a sharp increase in humanitarian aid.

US govt goes dark as vast swathes of bureaucracy get laid off amid collapse of federal funding

Washington, Oct 1 (UNI) The US government has for the most part gone dark as much of the bureaucracy was laid off on Wednesday, after Congress failed to reach a deal to approve new funding.

The ruling Republicans had proposed extending government funding at current levels until Nov. 21 to allow for members to continue working on full-year appropriations bills.

Democrats had countered this with a shorter extension until the end of October, but tied their offer to health care provisions and new limits on President Donald Trump's ability to withhold funds — conditions Republicans rejected outright.Talks at the White House on Monday between congressional leaders and Trump failed to produce any compromise, leaving both sides entrenched and the government without money to operate, resulting in the shutdown, reports CNN.

A shutdown occurs when Congress fails to pass funding bills, leaving agencies unable to spend money not explicitly approved by lawmakers. Since 1980, there have been 14 such shutdowns, including the record 34-day standoff in 2018.

A shutdown has drastic effects on all but the most essential of federal services. Essential services like Social Security, Medicare, and Medicaid benefits remain intact, but a wide swathe of federal functions have ground to a halt.Air traffic controllers and TSA agents continue to work without pay, keeping flights operational. The National Weather Service, Veterans Affairs medical services, and passport and visa processing remain active, though strained.

The disruption comes against the backdrop of Trump's push earlier this year to shrink the federal workforce. In February, he signed an executive order directing agencies to draw up plans for large-scale staff reductions, citing costs to taxpayers and poor performance.

Some agencies cut deeply, others reversed course, and still others quietly asked laid-off workers to return.

Death toll in strong quake in Philippines rises to 69

Manila, Oct 1 (UNI) : The death toll in the 6.9-magnitude earthquake that struck Cebu province in the central Philippines last night climbed to 69, the Philippines' Office of Civil Defense (OCD) said today.

Assistant Secretary Bernardo Rafaelito Alejandro, deputy administrator for the OCD, told a public briefing that 30 died in Bogo City, the epicenter of the earthquake, 10 in Medellin town, 22 in San Remigio town, five in Tabogon town, and one each in the municipalities of Sogod and Tabuelan.

He said the victims died after they were crushed by the collapsed walls of houses and buildings.

The National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (NDRRMC) initially reported that at least 147 people were injured.

Alejandro did not give the latest figures on injuries and the missing people.

The death toll is expected to climb as emergency workers continue search and rescue operations for survivors

trapped in the debris and collapsed buildings.

"We are waiting for our assessment team to complete their rapid assessment," Alejandro said in an earlier media briefing.The province of Cebu has declared a state of calamity, enabling the government, particularly local government units, to quickly access emergency funds (calamity funds) to provide relief and rehabilitation, as well as to impose measures such as price freezes on essential goods to protect affected residents.

The Philippine Institute of Volcanology and Seismology initially reported that a 6.7-magnitude offshore earthquake struck Cebu province at 9:59 pm local time yesterday. The institute later revised the magnitude to 6.9, adding that the quake struck at a depth of 5 km, approximately 19 km northeast of Bogo City.The tremor was also felt in many neighboring provinces in the central Philippines, as well as some regions in the southern Philippines.

Flotilla aid mission to Gaza rejects calls by Israel to stop

Jerusalem, Oct 1 (UNI) : The large flotilla aid mission to Gaza rejected all calls late Tuesday by Israeli authorities to halt its advance, as it sought to break through its naval blockade saying it was nearing a "critical zone" and bracing for an Israeli intervention.

The 47-boat 'Global Sumud Flotilla' is carrying more than 500 activists, including the Swedish campaigner Greta Thunberg, parliamentarians and lawyers.

The convoy is expected to reach the Strip this week, coinciding with Yom Kippur, the holiest day in the Jewish calendar, which begins Wednesday evening, reports Times of Israel.

Jerusalem – which had earlier slammed the mission calling it a needless 'publicity stunt – had recently accused some personnel among the flotilla of having direct links to Hamas terrorists and the Muslim Brotherhood, due to the mission being organised by the Hamas-affiliated outfit, the Palestinian Conference for Palestinians (PCPA).

The Israeli Navy was set to intercept the all incoming ships – having done so in the past to success – before they approached the shores of Gaza, and has preparing operations for interception, detention, and deportation of the activists, once they are brought to Ashdod Port.

As per Haaretz, security officials had recommended seeking an alternative option, earlier, recommending a more diplomatic approach to the matter by Jerusalem rather than direct military intervention. While some still believe that political leaders did not adequately explore this option, the organisers had likewise rejected all calls for halting, leading to direct naval interception.

Some flotilla members later took to social media and posted several posts on Telegram and X, claiming that there was increased drone activity over the boats and that several of its boats were approached by unidentified vessels, some navigating without lights.

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Australia clinch massive win against NZ in CWC25

Indore, Oct 1 (UNI) : Defending champions Australia began their ICC Women's Cricket World Cup 2025 campaign with a commanding 89-run win over New Zealand, bowling them out for 237.

New Zealand never found momentum in the chase despite a valiant effort from Sophie Devine, who struck a fighting 112 off 112 balls. Once she departed, Australia's bowlers wrapped things up quickly with Sophie Molineux (25-3) and Annabel Sutherland (26-3) sharing the last five wickets to seal a comprehensive victory while Alana King (44-2) also bagged crucial

wickets. Sutherland turned the tide decisively in Australia's favour, claiming three wickets in a single over. Along with Devine, she also removed Jess Kerr and Eden Carson, leaving New Zealand with little resistance in the closing stages. New Zealand's struggles deepened when Maddy Green was run out after another mix-up, the second such dismissal of the innings. The setback came soon after King had struck twice, removing Amelia Kerr and Brooke Halliday to break crucial partnerships, leaving Sophie Devine short of support at the other end.

New Zealand's chase of

327 began on a disastrous note as they lost two wickets inside the first two overs with Georgie Plimmer and Suzie Bates out for ducks. After winning the toss and opting to bat, Ashleigh Gardner (115 of 83 balls) steered Australia past the 300 mark after a shaky start against New Zealand with her second ODI ton which arrived at a crucial stage when wickets were tumbling regularly. The defending champions eventually closed their innings with 326 runs on the board. Earlier in the first innings, New Zealand had Australia reeling thanks to Leah Tahuhu (42-3). She dismissed Alyssa Healy

and Beth Mooney before removing Tahlia McGrath, breaking a 64-run partnership with Gardner. Amelia Kerr (54-2) added to the pressure, claiming the wickets of Annabel Sutherland and Phoebe Litchfield. Jess Kerr (59-3) claimed the last three wickets for New Zealand while Breearne struck with two wickets, including that of Gardner. Litchfield's wicket was a milestone moment for Kerr, as it brought up her 100th in Women's ODIs, making her only the third New Zealand bowler to reach the landmark.

Earlier, playing in her first Cricket World Cup,

Bree Illing removed Australia captain Alyssa Healy early on in New Zealand's opening game of the tournament.

Looking to drive the ball through the covers against the left-arm pacer, Healy would find Suzie Bates inside the circle as the White Ferns opened their account in the powerplay.

Western Railway continues to redefine norms and foster inclusivity by empowering women in critical technical roles that keep Mumbai's suburban rail network running safely and efficiently. From maintaining cutting-edge EMU rakes to managing high-voltage traction systems, women technicians are stepping into roles once considered the domain of men, proving that expertise and dedication transcend gender. According to a

press release issued by the Chief Public Relations Officer of Western Railway, Shri Vineet Abhishek, EMU carsheds located at Mumbai Central, Kandivali and Virar form the backbone of maintenance for Mumbai's lifeline. These carsheds operate round the clock to ensure safe and reliable functioning of EMU rakes as per traffic demands, with both scheduled and unscheduled maintenance being carried out on 112 rakes. The state-of-the-art

3-phase AC (25 kV Alternating Current) technology rakes undergo two major maintenance schedules, IA and IC, at intervals of 60 and 240 days respectively. A total of 45 activities are undertaken during these schedules, out of which three key tasks include measurement of safety clearances, oiling, and battery checks. A notable highlight is the deployment of dedicated women's teams at these major hubs. Almost

across the EMU carsheds at Mumbai Central, Kandivali and Virar are entrusted with these crucial responsibilities. These teams ensure that all safety parameters are within the permissible limits prescribed by RDSO and that all lubrication and battery-related activities are carried out with precision and efficiency. Skilled, meticulous and committed to achieving zero failures, they exemplify Western Railway's pursuit of operational excellence.
