Ladakh administration orders magisterial probe into Leh violence

Srinagar, Oct 2 (UNI): The Ladakh Administration has ordered a magisterial inquiry into the September 24 violence in Leh, which left four people dead and over hundred injured. The inquiry report will be submitted within four weeks. An official statement today said District Magistrate Leh has appointed Sub-Divisional Magistrate Nubra Mukul Beniwal as the inquiry officer to probe the circumstances that led to the law and order breakdown and the subsequent police action resulting in casualties.

The inquiry will examine in detail the sequence of events and the police response that claimed the lives of four individuals — Jigmet Dorjey of Kharnak, Rinchen Dadul of Hanu, Stanzin Namgail of Igoo, and Tsewang Tharchin of Skurbuchan. One of the slain Tsewang Tharchin was a Kargil war veteran. The administration has appealed to the public to cooperate with the inquiry and submit any oral or written statements, along with supporting material such as photographs or videos, between October 4 and October 18 at the DC Office Conference Hall, Leh, or directly before the inquiry officer. The magisterial probe comes amid growing calls for accountability following last week's violence in Leh, which erupted on 15th day of a hunger strike led by climate activist Sonam Wangchuk, who has been booked under National Security Act and sent to Jodhpur jail in Rajasthan. After the violence officials blamed Wangchuk for inciting the protests.Ladakh's Leh Apex Body, spearheading the statehood and special status campaign, withdrew from the scheduled talks with the Centre and asked the union government to first order a judicial inquiry into the killing of civilians and release of all those detained last week.

Veteran Gandhian Leader Dr. GG Parikh passes away at 101 on Gandhi Jayanti

Veteran Gandhian, freedom fighter and socialist thinker Dr Gunvantrai Ganpatlal Parikh, popularly known as GG Parikh, passed away in Mumbai on Thursday at the age of 101. He breathed his last at his residence on Grant Road. His demise coincided with the 156th birth anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi, a leader deeply revered throughout his life.

Born in 1923, Dr Parikh turned 100 on December 30, 2023. He was among the last of the freedom fighters of his generation. A medical practitioner by education, he took part in India's freedom struggle, the Goa Liberation movement, the Samyukta Maharashtra movement, and also stood firmly against the Emergency. He was imprisoned twice, once during the Quit India

India condemns terror attack on **Manchester** synagogue, urges for united action to combat terrorism

New Delhi, Oct 2 (UNI): India today condemned the terror attack on a synagogue in Manchester in which two people were killed on Yom Kippur, the holiest day in the Jewish calendar.

India also said the fact that the attack took place on October 2, Mahatma Gandhi's birth anniversary which is observed as the International Day of Non-Violence is particularly saddening.

In a statement on X, the Ministry of External Affairs spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal said terrorism is a menace which the global community must combat and defeat through united and concerted action.

"We condemn the terror attack on the Heaton Park Synagogue in Manchester, during Yom Kippur services today. It is particularly saddening that this heinous act was committed on the International Day of Non-violence.

"This attack is yet another grim reminder of the challenge we face from the evil forces of terrorism, which the global community must combat and defeat through united and concerted action.

"Our thoughts and prayers are with the victims, their families, and the city of Manchester. We stand in solidarity with the people of the United Kingdom in this moment of grief," the post read.

Two people were killed and four were hospitalised after a man drove a car at people gathered outside the Heaton Park Hebrew Congregation Synagogue, and later also stabbed some people. The British Police have declared it as a terrorist incident.

The incident occurred on Yom Kippur, the holiest day in the Jewish calendar.

Police said that two people have died and a third person - believed to be the suspect - is also presumed dead. Three more people are in a serious condition.

Elderly woman saved by free surgery in Mumbai

Mumbai, Oct 2 (UNI): A 65-year-old woman has received a new lease of life after undergoing a complex surgical procedure at the Bharat Ratna Dr Babasaheb Ambedkar Municipal Corporation General Hospital in Kandivali, successfully addressing health complications that had persisted for 15 years.

The operation has provided significant relief to the patient who had been battling chronic health issues over this extended period.

According to hospital authorities, the woman had experiencing been persistent bleeding problems following which menopause, necessitated medical intervention.

After comprehensive diagnostic procedures including sonography and examinations, MRI physicians determined that surgical intervention was unavoidable.

The patient's preexisting conditions of diabetes and high blood pressure further complicated the medical situation, making the procedure particularly challenging from a clinical perspective.

A team of specialist doctors nevertheless accomplished operation successfully, maintaining effective control over bleeding throughout the surgical process.

His contribution to India's independence was great," said Bhagwat while addressing nearly 21,000 RSS volunteers who participated, making it one of the largest events in recent years.

Marking the centenary of the RSS, which was set up by its first Sarsanghchalak (chief) Dr Keshav Baliram Hedgewar on September 27, 1925, Bhagwat performed 'Shastra Puja' (worship of weapons) at the Reshimbagh ground of

"Anarchy allows foreign powers to play their games. The world is looking towards India for solutions to global problems. The universe wants India to lead by example and show the world a way," he added. Focusing on the

government's firm action on the extremist Naxalite movement, he said the movement has been largely brought under control due to the firm actions of the government and the realisation among people about the hollowness of their ideology.

Bhagwat said the frequency of natural calamities has increased. "The Himalayas are our security wall and a source of water for the entire

South Asia. If the existing patterns of development promote the calamities that we are seeing, then we will have to reconsider our decisions

The present situation in the Himalayas is a warning."

He appreciated the management of mega Maha Kumbh in Prayagraj early this year. "The Maha Kumbh Mela set a new world record, attracting unprecedented number of pilgrims from across India and surpassing all benchmarks for management excellence. 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

BIS conducts raid in Mumbai, seizes 47gm of unhallmarked gold jewellery

Mumbai, Oct 2 (UNI): Acting on information about violation of Hallmarking of Gold Jewellery and Gold Artefacts Order, 2020, a team of officials from Bureau of Indian Standards (BIS), Mumbai Branch Office, conducted an enforcement raid at a jewellery showroom in Sonapur, Mumbai.During the raid, it was found that the jewellery outlet had displayed gold jewellery for sale without the BIS hallmark. Around 47gm of such gold jewellery, without the BIS hallmark found during the raid, was seized, said a release from the Press Information Bureau (PIB) today.

The violation falls under Section 15(3) and 17(1)(a) of BIS Act 2016, which provides for imprisonment up to two years or a fine of minimum Rs. 2,00,000 or both. Action is being initiated to file a case in the court of law for the offence, said BIS official.BIS has urged consumers to use the BIS CARE App to find out the list of mandatory products which shall be BIS certified and are also to ascertain the genuineness of ISI Mark or Hallmark on the product before making purchase, by visiting BIS website, release added.

Panchgani

Deriving its name from the surrounding five hills that envelop it, Panchgani offers a window to the past. Located just about 38 metres below Mahabaleshwar, at an altitude of 1334 metres, the approach to this beautiful hill station is replete with lovely views of the Krishna River to one side, and the plains on the other. A quintessentially residential area, it exudes a charm that harks to a time gone by. Whether in the old colonial architecture, the Parsi homes, and century-old boarding lodges. The best vantage point to take in the world below can be found at Table Land, a flat mountain peak overlooking the plains. To mix things up, head to the local bazaar where business moves along at an unhurried pace, setting a leisurely tone for your time spent here.

As accounted in the Mahabharata, this is the place where Bheema killed Keechaka, the villain and threw him into the valley below. Taking its name from the incident, only hill resort in the area, and has the growing area in Maharashtra. This is even a great place for wild life enthusiasts to do some spotting as panthers, bears, sambar, wild boar, and wild dogs thrive here and it is neighboured by the famous Melghat Hurricane Point, Prospect Point, and Devi Point are all great vantage points to take in the views, and this is also a good starting point for excursions to Gavilgad and

Keechakadara

Keechakadara is also often referred to as Chikhaldara. Aside from its mythological roots, there's more to this beautiful hill station. Situated at an altitude of 1118 metres in the Vidarbha region, this is the added attraction of being the only coffee-Tiger Project which has 82 tigers.

5 hill stations in Maharashtra to get away to

Through the length of its state, Maharashtra encompasses a landscape ranging from the steeply rising Western Ghats, all the way down to the seashore of the Arabian Sea. Cradled within is carpeted green mountain walls, are the most stupping hill stations, each with a charm that's all their own. Take a break from the frenzied pace of the city and get away to these oases of calm.

Bhandardara, with its soaring mountain ranges, plunging waterfalls and carpet of green, attracts tourists all through the year. For a short hour-long journey, this hill station offers city dwellers a drastically contrasting landscape and stunning surroundings. Bright green paddy fields and clear blue skies punctuated with a labyrinth of gurgling streams, provide all the essential ingredients for a weekend away from the madding crowds. There's enough to keep you busy through the days. Built in 1910, Wilson Dam stands 150metres-high and has a beautiful garden at the base, of Wilson Dam there is a garden endowed with thick greenery, streams and gigantic trees, the silently serene Arthur lake which mirrors the beauty of its surroundings in its blue waters, Mount Kalsubai, which is Maharashtra's highest peak at 1646 metres and draws in serious trekkers to its summit, the Agasti Risha Ashram which has been mentioned in the Ramayan and the ancient Ratangad Fort which offers panoramic views from its ramparts.

Matheran

Discovered back in 1850 by Hugh Malet, collector for the Thane district, Matheran sits atop the Sahyadris Mountain range and is another hot weekend getaway for city slickers. This gorgeous and quaint hill station is best accessed via the slow-moving toy train which chugs along over a leisurely two-hour-long journey from the valley below. Sprawled across a lush green,

undulating hilltop, Matheran sits at a height of about 800 metres with drastic, steep cliffs offering the most stunning views of the plains below. Make your way up to Hart Point at night, and take in the dreamy, twinkling lights of Mumbai far below, meander through the winding ways and feast your eyes on the British-Parsi architecture of the local homes, walk up to Charlotte Lake, and do a spot of shopping in the market where you'll find lots of leather goodies, hats and ofcourse the famous sweet-sticky chikki best eaten hot and fresh.

Mahabaleshwar

Translating to mean 'God of Great Power' in Sanskrit, Mahabaleshwar is a favourite hill destination with Maharashtrians. Once the summer capital of the Bombay Presidency during the British Raj, it offers visitors a perfect blend of modernity with old-world charm. Aside from being abound with natural beauty, there's lots you can do here to keep entertained. All parts of the hill station are accessible by car, so getting around is no problem, and if you're feeling adventurous, just climb onto a horse and get going. Make your way to Malcolm Peth, the bazaar at the heart of Mahabaleshwar, which has a good mix of hotels, shops and restaurants. Visit Mount Malcolm which was built in 1829 and once served as the Governor's residence, Moraii Castle which was home to Mahatma Gandhi back in 1945, and wind down at the Mahabaleshwar Club in the evening over drinks. During the day you can take the short drive up to Venna Lake and go boating or fishing, and proceed a little further down to Panchgani, and walk through the strawberry




